Lok Adalat vis-à-vis Permanent Lok Adalat

Two institutions. One goal – Amicable settlement of disputes.

National Lok Adalat (NLA)	KEY DIFFERENCES	Permanent Lok Adalat (PLA)
Held on a particular day (e.g., National Lok Adalat, State Lok Adalats, etc.) throughout the country	 NATURE & DURATION	Constituted as a permanent body on a continuous basis for a particular area.
Resolves pending and pre-litigation disputes through compromise or settlement.	 SCOPE OF DISPUTES	Deals only with disputes relating to Public Utility Services that are compoundable and involve a dispute value of less than ₹1 crore.
Held at regular intervals on a notified date.	 SITTINGS	Sits regularly throughout the year.
Presided over by a panel comprising a serving or retired Judicial officer and other persons as notified.	 PRESIDING OFFICER	Presided over by the Chairman and two members.
Awards passed are final, binding on the parties as a decree of Civil Court and non-appealable.	 AWARD / SETTLEMENT	Awards passed are final and binding on the parties as a decree of Civil Court.
If no settlement could be arrived at between the parties, the record of the case is returned back to the court.	 WHAT IF SETTLEMENT COULD NOT BE ARRIVED AT?	If no settlement could be arrived at between the parties and the dispute does not relate to any offence, the PLA decide the dispute on merits.
