Reference DGDE letter of even number dated 18.07.2013.

2. DOP&T vide O.M. No.14014/02/2012-Estt(D) dated 25.02.2015 has since modified its instructions regarding whether 'married son' can be considered for compassionate appointment. Accordingly, Sr. No.12 of the Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs) circulated vide letter under reference is hereby amended as under:-

Sr. No.	Question	Answer
12.	Whether 'married son' can be considered for compassionate appointment?	<ul> <li>Yes, if he otherwise fulfils all the other requirements of the scheme i.e. he is otherwise eligible &amp; fulfils the criteria laid down in the consolidated instructions circulated vide DGDE letter of even number dated 18.07.2013 and subject to the following conditions:</li> <li>(i) That he was wholly dependent on the Cantonment Board employee at the time of his/her death in harness or retirement on medical grounds.</li> <li>(ii) He must support other dependents members of the family.</li> <li>(iii) This would be effective from the date of issue of this letter and the cases of compassionate appointment already settled may not be reopened.</li> </ul>
