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REVIEW REPORT

The Annual Administration Reports 2015-2016 in respect of 62 Cantonment Boards have been prepared by the Director General Defence Estates. The facts and figures given in the reports have been certified by the Principal Directors, Defence Estates of Commands. The Annual Consolidated Accounts have been audited by Local Audit Officers of CGDA. The Government is in agreement with these Reports and hence "No Review" is being laid before the Parliament.

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FOREWORD

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Cantonments are unique institutions established for quartering and training of troops. Over a period of time, civilians also came to reside in cantonments. Cantonment Boards are urban local bodies, incorporated under the Cantonments Act, 2006 (earlier the Cantonments Act, 1924), to administer cantonments in India. There are 62 Cantonments Boards in the country. These Boards are responsible for providing municipal services to residents of these cantonments.

2. Annual administration reports for 2015-16 of these Boards are furnished under section 50 of the Cantonments Act, 2006. These are compiled and published by the Directorate General of Defence Estates.

3. Cantonment Boards are mandated to undertake not only municipal functions, but also developmental activities. For undertaking all these activities substantial fund is required. However, the scope for augmentation of internal resources is limited in cantonments due to restrictions on usage of land and buildings. A majority of the buildings situated in cantonments belong to the Government on which no tax can be levied. Further, even the statutory demand of service charges levied on Government properties is also not met in full. Arrears on account of service charges on Government properties amount to more than Rs. 12,000 crore. State Governments also do not share their net revenue proceeds with Cantonment Boards (Only Delhi and Secunderabad Cantonment Board get funds from respective State Governments) So it is a challenging task to meet the expectations of the people with limited funds.

4. Ministry of Defence sanctions ordinary grant-in-aid to deficit Cantonment Boards to balance their budgets; the Boards also get special grant-in-aid for specific projects. During 2015-16, ordinary grant-in-aid of Rs. 258.75 crore was given to 49 Cantonment Boards to meet their budgetary deficit. Further, grants for creation of capital assets of Rs. 19.73 crore were given to 4 Cantonment Boards for undertaking various infrastructural projects (School/Sewage Treatment Plants/Electricity/Water supply). The Boards continue to make their efforts to obtain funds to implement Centrally Sponsored Schemes, share of net revenue proceeds of State Governments and MPs/MLAs Local Area Development Fund etc.

5. The Cantonments are proposed to be developed in the lines of smart cities and therefore, it is for consideration if the Cantonment Boards can be considered as a special category Union Territory/ State so that central funds can flow to these Cantonment Boards.

6. Despite financial constraints, cantonments continue to remain lung spaces in cities with efficient services and better maintenance. Cantonment Boards maintain 88 hospitals and dispensaries. The facilities provided include labour rooms, minor surgery OTs, diagnostic services, X-Ray, ambulances etc. Specialized services by way of opening a dialysis unit and a Neo-Natal intensive care unit (NICU) at Kirkee and Pune Cantonment General Hospitals respectively have been introduced with funds given by philanthropists The Boards also maintain 202 schools having about 57000 students. Separate toilets are provided for girls and boys in all co-educational schools. The facilities provided include computer education, scholarships, free books and uniforms, sports and cultural meets etc. The Boards have established 46 skill development centres which have benefited more than 32000 persons by imparting training in tailoring, embroidery, beautician courses, stenography, sewing, computer application, automobile repairing, electrical & electronics and IT application. The Boards have also established 36 centres for differently abled children to address their special needs like medical examination, counselling, physiotherapy and special education. All Cantonments Boards are also actively implementing the Swachh Bharat Abhiyan and a number of activities including those associated with solid and liquid waste management have been started.

7. "Samadhan" – an on-line public grievances redressal system has been implemented by all Cantonment Boards to make their administration more responsive to the public. "Suvidha"- a software to address the grievances of the staff has also been installed by the Boards.

8. In e-governance initiatives, Cantonment Boards have been continually automating their office processes. Now, e-tendering and e-procurement are implemented by all Cantonment Boards. Scanning and digitization of important records, particularly land records, and inventorisation of records has been completed in all Cantonment Boards. Raksha Bhoomi software for computerization of land records has been installed in all Cantonment Boards. Most Cantonment Boards have their own web-sites.

9. As a part of celebration of our Defence Estates Day in 2015, the 3rd Defence Estates Day lecture was delivered on 13th Dec 2015 by Shri Bibek Debroi, a Member of the Niti Aayog on "Effective Governance". Raksha Mantri's awards for excellence in the fields of (a) Centre for differently-abled children (b) Management of land records (c) Defence land survey (d) Functioning of Cantonment Board schools; and (e) Swachh Chhavni – Swasth Chhavni were also given to selected officers and staff on the occasion of Defence Estates Day, 2015.

10. Continued efforts are being made by all agencies involved in Cantonment Board administration to take cantonments forward in the developmental process. Cantonment Boards have made concerted efforts during the year to improve the quality of life of cantonment residents.

OVERVIEW

1. There are 62 Cantonments in the Country which are located in 19 States. Cantonment Boards are statutorily constituted local bodies and comprise elected representatives besides ex-officio and nominated members. The Station Commander, a military officer, is the Ex-officio President of the Cantonment Board. An officer of the Indian Defence Estates Service (IDES) is posted as Chief Executive Officer in each Cantonment to perform the executive functions of the Board. The CEO also functions as the membersecretary of the Board.

2. Cantonment Boards are constituted under the provisions of the Cantonments Act, 2006. These are under the administrative control of Ministry of Defence, Government of India. Section 50 of the Cantonments Act, 2006 provides that every Board shall, as soon as may be, after the close of the year, submit to the Central Government, through the Officer Commanding-in-Chief, the Command, a report on the administration of the Cantonment Boards. Accordingly, reports for 2015-2016 are being tabled.

3. GOC-in-Chief of the Army Command concerned acts as the overseeing authority for the administration of the Cantonments situated within the respective Command. Principal Director, Defence Estates, from the Indian Defence Estates Service, is posted for each Army Command, who apart from being advisor to the GOC-in-C, is answerable to the Director General Defence Estates, Ministry of Defence.

4. The basic data indicating the year of establishment of each Cantonment, its population, classification and financial assistance by way of grant-in-aid by the Government is indicated in Annexure-I. A table showing the number of meetings held by the Cantonment Boards during 2015-2016 is given in Annexure-II. Details of income and expenditure of the Cantonment Boards are furnished in Annexure-III and IV respectively. Data regarding the schools, hospitals and dispensaries maintained by the Cantonment Boards is given in Annexure-V.

2. ELECTIONS

No election was held during the year.

3. **REVENUE**

(i) Measures Taken to Augment Revenue

- Rights for collection of license fee for entry of commercial vehicles was given through auction for Rs.5,94,93,324/- (Rs. Five crore ninety four lakhs ninety three thousand three hundred and twenty four only) per year. A contract for display of hoardings in cantonment area was awarded for Rs.54,54,000/- (RS. Fifty four lakhs fifty four thousand only) for 2 years.
- (ii) Comparison of Tax Rates with Neighbouring Municipality Tax Rates Taxes levied by the Board are similar to those levied in the adjoining municipality.
- (iii) Percentage of Recovery of Property Tax against Total Demand during the Year
 - 22.05%.

4. WATER SUPPLY

The Board maintains 11 tube wells, 5 overhead tanks and 4 underground tanks. The source of water supply is Jal Sansthan as well as tube wells of the Board. During the year new pipe lines were laid from Chhipitola over head tank to Nai Basti which provided additional water to nearly 17,500 people. Per capita water supply was about 95 litres per day.

6. EDUCATION

(i) Schools

The Board maintains one inter college, one junior high school and three primary schools having 1491 students. The Board also maintains an English medium school from playgroup to class IV.

(ii) School Management Committee

School management committees have been constituted in all schools.

(iii) Vocational Training

Vocational training for English speaking skills, basic computer course and English shorthand course was conducted.

(iv) **Promotion of Education**

Free books have been provided to students of class I to VIII. Scholarships are being provided by the State Government to students belonging to SC/ST, OBC, minorities and economically weaker sections.

(v) Any Other Initiative to Promote Education

Computer education is being provided in the schools. An Elementary Education Centre (Literacy Mission) for women is also being run in Cantonment Board School at Sadar.

7. SPECIAL MEASURES FOR CHILDREN

(i) Differently-abled Children

The Board maintains "Chirag"- a special school having 50 differently-abled children.

8. ENVIRONMENT AND SANITATION

(i) General Sanitation

General sanitation in the cantonment remained satisfactory.

(ii) Ban on use of Polythene

Use of polythene has been banned in the cantonment area.

(iii) Efforts Made For Improvement of Solid Waste Management Door to door collection of garbage is being done in the civil area. Segregation of waste is being done at the trenching ground.

(iv) Tree Plantation

540 saplings were planted. The survival rate was about 55%.

(v) Other Initiatives

Taj Mahotsav, a Government of Uttar Pradesh Tourism Department's annual fair, was held at Sadar Bazar for 15 days in association with the district administration and tourism department to attract tourists to Agra.

9. PUBLIC HEALTH

(i) Hospital and Dispensaries

Construction of a new hospital building is in progress. The hospital is presently functioning in a school building. 51,714 outdoor patients and 1374 indoor patients were treated during the year. The Board also maintains a physiotherapy unit with all modern equipment. 3522 children were immunized against various communicable diseases.

(ii) Special Measures Taken for Senior Citizens

Health cards were distributed to 594 senior citizens.

(iii) Kishori Clinic

A special OPD for adolescent girls is being conducted regularly on every Tuesday & Friday for their health check-up and providing medicines as well as educating them on basic health problems.

(iv) Janani Suraksha Yojna

Janani Suraksha Yojna has been implemented.

(v) Special Medical Camps

A medical camp was organised for pensioners. A special medical camp was organized on Defence Estates Day.

(vi) Health Care Measures for Cantonment Board Employees and their Dependents

Cantonment Board employees and their dependents are provided treatment, health check up and medicines.

10. GENERAL ADMINISTRATION

- (i) Status of Implementation of New Pension Scheme New Pension Scheme has been implemented.
- (ii) Public Grievance Redressal Mechanism
 "Samadhan" a public grievance redressal system and "Suvidha" a grievance redressal system for employees have been implemented.
- (iii) Audit of Accounts Audit of accounts has been carried out up to September, 2015.

The Board also maintains a public library in Sardar Patel Udayan. Development works costing about Rs.5 crores were executed in the cantonment area through Agra Development Authority out of their funds.

(i) Creation of IT Section

A computer programmer has been appointed in IT Section.

(ii) Status of Raksha Bhoomi Implementation Infrastructure for accessing Raksha Bhoomi version 5.0 has been made.

(iii) Document Management System

All files of the office have been uploaded in Document Management System software.

(iv) Steps taken to Automatize Office Processes

Pay bills of employees are computerized. All sections of the Board are equipped with computers and connected with main server with internet facilities.

12. MARKETS

The Board maintains 8 markets having 322 shops.

13. FIRE FIGHTING

The Board does not have its own fire fighting arrangements. Fire fighting services of the State Government are availed as and when required.

14. BIRTHS AND DEATHS

1008 births and 401 deaths were registered during this year.

3. **REVENUE**

(i) Measures Taken to Augment Revenue

- Recovery of taxes has increased by Rs. 39.74 lacs compared to previous year.

6. EDUCATION

(i) Schools

The Board is maintaining one Gujrati Medium school & one English medium school upto VIIIth Standard and one High School upto Xth Standard. In English medium school, classes have been added upto VIIIthstandard. One pre-primary 'Bal-Mandir' has been started within the school premises.

(ii) Schools Management Committee The Board has constituted a School Management Com

The Board has constituted a School Management Committee.

(iii) Vocational Training

The Board is running a vocational training centre with 6 month course on the trade of cutting, sewing and tailoring for women. 37 candidates were awarded the certificate for successfully completing the course.

(iv) **Promotion of Education**

The Board has provided a modern computer lab with 20 computers, LCD TV, and projector with Internet connectivity. A indoor sports room, science lab and a library have been added to the existing facilities. Scholarships to girl child, free uniform, school bags, school shoes and books were distributed for promoting enrolment & higher attendance.

(v) Any Other Initiative to Promote Education

An NGO has been engaged for imparting free education to the children of weaker sections of society. In addition to mid-day meal, fruits are also provided to school children. Two Aanganwadis are running in Sadar Bazar. Board has renovated public reading hall.

7. SPECIAL MEASURES FOR CHILDREN

(i) Differently-abled Children

The Board provides infrastructural assistance to Asha School, a special school for differently abled children run by AWWA.

(ii) Children of Migrant Labourers

The Board has tied up with the Aanganwadis located in Sadar Bazar to accommodate the children of migrant labourers.

8. ENVIRONMENT AND SANITATION

(i) General sanitation

General sanitation in the cantonment remained satisfactory.

- (ii) Ban on Use of Polythene Use of polythene bags has been banned within the cantonment.
- (iii) Efforts Made for Improvement of Solid Waste Management Door to door garbage collection is being done in cantonment.

(iv) Tree Plantation

650 saplings / plants were planted during the year and survival rate is 75%. 'Nakshatra Van' a herbal garden has been developed by the Board.

9. PUBLIC HEALTH

(i) Hospital and Dispensaries

The Board is maintaining one dispensary. The dispensary has ENT specialist, pediatrician, gynecologist, dermatologist and homeopath. 35,690 patients were treated in OPD during the year.

(ii) Special Measures taken for Senior Citizen

Health cards have been issued to senior citizens. Health checkups are carried out on regular basis. Medicines are being provided free of cost.

(iii) Kishori Clinic

Kishori clinic is being maintained by the Board. Consultancy services and medicines are provided free of cost.

(iv) Janani Suraksha Yojna

This programme is being conducted with the help of Gujarat Government.

(v) HIV Testing Facilities

Facility is provided by the Board with the help of pathological lab, engaged by board where people can get themselves tested, and the expenditure is borne by the Board.

(vi) Special Medical Camps

Homeopathy medical camp, bone densitometry camp, gynecology check-up camp and eye check-up camp were conducted. General health checkup of school children was carried out.

(iv) Health Care Measures for Cantonment Board Employees & Their Dependents

Employees have been issued health cards and health checkup is carried out every six months. Laboratory tests and medicines are provided free of cost to the employees and their family/dependents.

3. **REVENUE**

(i) Measures Taken to Augment Revenue

Efforts have been made to recover Rs.66,27,694- which includes arrears of Consolidated Property Tax for the year 2014-2015 and current demand for the year 2015-2016 from which the Board have recovered Rs. 45,43, 716/-. VET is the major source of income of this Board & Rs.3,54,90,432/- has been received. Rs. 8,32,334/- damage charges against demand of Rs.10,00,000/- against encroachments, stacking of material etc. has been recovered. Rs. 3,98,769/- has been recovered towards fines and process fees on sanctioning of bulding plans.

- (ii) Comparision Of Tax Rates With Neighbouring Municipality Tax Rates The tax rates are comparatively lower in Cantonment and some taxes levied by Ahmednagar Corporation are not levied.

6. EDUCATION

(i) Schools

There are three primary schools, out of which two are Marathi and one Urdu Medium School and one High School together having 916 students. There are 35 teachers.

(ii) School Management Committee

School management committees have been constituted and regular meetings of the committee were held.

(iii) Vocational Training

Started 'Swyampdeep'Vocational Training Centre in association with Jan Shikshan Sansthan, Ahmednagar (authorised by Ministry of Labour and welfare).

Two Batches of Cutting Tailoring Course and Beauty Parlour Course completed. The Board has given basic computer knowledge to the Cantonment Board School children through computer lab through Jyoti Computer, Bhingar and others through local NGO-Snehalaya.

(iv) **Promotion of Education**

The students of the Cantonment schools participated in State Govt. Scholarship, Pradnyashodh, Manthan, Olympiad and ITS examination and they are in merit list. Seating mats, school uniforms, note books, text books have been distributed to the school children. Also school building is maintained for digitals classes.

(v) Any Other Initiative to Promote Education

The Board has been awarded Excellence Award-2015 in Education by the Ministry of Defence. Warli Paintings made by 8 Student of 10th Std Nutan Madhymik School were exhibited on the occasion of 16th December 2015 'Defence Estate Day' at Manekshawa Centre New Delhi. Inter school sports competitions have been conducted for all Cantonment area schools. The students have participated in sports meets at District, Regional and State Level held at Ahmednagar, Pune and Solapur. Students of the cantonment school participated in Olympiad exam. In Scout Guide event 7 students got a prize in state level competition. Conducted district level Kho-Kho tournament in association with Dig-Vijay krida mandal, Bhingar. Chess and Mini Marathon Competitions organized in the year 2015-16 under Swachh Bharat Abhiyan. Digital E-learning and smart classes are being conducted in all Cantonment Board Schools. Vocational MSCIT Course has been started in Dr. B.R. Ambedkar Cantonment Board School. Also, organized Drawings exhibition in school.

7. SPECIAL MEASURES FOR CHILDREN

(i) Differently abled children

'UMANG', a centre for differently abled children has indentified 45 children. Special care given to 17 childrens under guidance of JANARTH (NGO).

8. ENVIRONMENTAL & SANITATION

(i) General Sanitation

The Board provides day to day basic facilities such as sweeping/cleaning of public roads, drains, public group latrines, dustbins etc. Door to Door garbage collection in civil area is outsourced. Spraying & fogging are done from time to time as preventive measures against the outbreak of epidemics.

(ii) Ban on use of Polythene

Use of polythene bags is banned in the Cantonment limits. Surprise checking and seizing of bags is carried out in Bazaar area and violaters are being fined.

(iii) Effort Made for Improvement of Solid Waste Management

The Board has installed a turnkey project for disposal of solid wasters.

(iv) Tree Plantation

The Board has planted 126 plants in Cantonment area and the survival rate is 60 %. The Board maintains three public gardens where lot of greenery is maintained for eco-friendly environment.

(v) Other Initiative

The Board have developed the Gautam Buddha jogging park having 850 mtr. track. Gymnastic equipments were fixed in gardens. The Board have also developed Bhingar Tekdi Hill by making pathway, plants, benches, M.S. Gate for the use of public. The Board have installed bio digester tank for one community

group latrine and also converted one old community group latrine with new technology of Sulabh International. The Board have carried out theme based cleanliness drive under Swachha Bharat Abhiyan giving specific attention on untouched area and made general awareness among public through various events like, erecting flex, coloring group latrines, dustbins, using local news media, distributing pamphlets, involving school children march, rally etc. New concept of Soak Pits with RCC pre-cast pipes connected to the septic tank was made during the year.

9. PUBLIC HEALTH

(i) Hospital & Dispensaries

The Board maintains one indoor hospital with 36 beds. 34,379 outdoor patients and 1566 indoor patients were treated.

- (ii) Special Measures Taken for Senior Citizens Monthly visits conducted. Treatment and medicines given free of cost to 195 Sr. Citizens.
- (iii) Kishori Clinic During the year, 168 girls were counselled.

(iv) Janani Suraksha Yojna

Counselling and advice is being given in Cantonment Hospital as per direction of Zilla Parishad, Ahmednagar.

(v) HIV Testing Facilities

ICTC is functioning for HIV testing & counselling free of cost for 401 patients including pregnant women.

(vi) Mobile dispensary

The Board is running a mobile dispensary once a month in Cantonment area. One doctor with one assistant are visiting slum areas and 347 patients were treated.

(vii) Special Medical Camps

Mission Indradhanush Immunization, H. B. Camp, O. R. I. (Outbreak response Immunization), Women's day camp (Gynecology) and ANC checkup camps were organized.

(viii) Health Care Measures for Cantonment Board Employees & their dependents

Employees of the Board and their dependents are getting free medicines from the Cantt General Hospital.

10. GENERAL ADMINISTRATION

(i) Status of Implementation of New Pension Scheme New Pension Scheme has been implemented.

Revenue from Ellora Lawns is derived up to Rs.725000/- p.a. and from Ajanta Bhavan is revised from Rs.3000/- to Rs.3500/- per booking. Water charges are also revised from Rs. 1728/- to Rs. 2000/- per annum for each connection. Auction of various markets for the year 2015-16 fetched Rs. 2610806/- Triennial Assessment of properties for the period 2015-18 has been taken in hand. Revenue derived out of auction of temporary occupation of land for Dasshera Festival 2015 was Rs. 29, 25,000/-.

(ii) Percentage of Recovery of Property Tax Against Total Demand During the Year

50.17 %.

4. WATER SUPPLY

The Board receives treated bulk water from Jaikwadi Water Reservoir through Aurangabad Municipal Corporation. The Board maintains its own pump & sump house, overhead tanks & distribution system. The per capita water supply per day is 80 lit. The Board also maintains public stand posts for weaker sections of the society. The Board has also constructed two overhead tanks of 5 lakh litres capacity due to which water storage each capacity has increased substantially. The express pipe line work has been completed and connected to the existing water tanks resulting in improvement in water supply in the Cantonment area.

7. SPECIAL MEASURES FOR CHILDREN

(i) Differently abled children

519 Differently abled children have been registered with 'Udaan'- rehabilitation centre. The centre runs from Monday to Friday. 2 Paramedical health workers in the field of speech therapy and mental retardation are rendering their services for care and treatment of children at the centre. Physiotherapist and Pediatric Neurologist visit the centre once in a month. Few special children participated in the Cultural Meet - SPANDAN at Deolali Cantonment.

(ii) Children of Migrant Labourers

No such children identified in the territorial jurisdiction of the Cantonment Board.

8. ENVIRONMENT AND SANITATION

(i) General Sanitation

General Sanitation in Cantonment area remained satisfactory. Periodical cleaning of drains, spraying of disinfectants, pesticide and fogging is done to prevent spread of Dengue, Chikengunia & Malaria in the Cantonment area.

(ii) Ban on use of Polythene:-

The use of polythene in the Cantonment has been banned. Surprise checking by sanitary staff is carried out to prevent use of polythene bags. The message of Swatch Bharat Mission in the Cantonment was spread and a Swachhata Doot (Charlie) was hired to spread awareness amongst public about cleanliness. Fine of Rs. 50/- per offence was imposed on offenders for throwing garbage and for open defecation with effect from January 2016.

(iii) Efforts Made for Improvement of Solid Waste Management:-

Door to door garbage collection was started in civil area through auto rickshaws carrying garbage bins. Vermi composting pits have been constructed at two places in civil area. Approval for land-fill site for dumping garbage and solid waste at trenching ground has been received from Pollution Control Board. Bio-culture treatment of solid waste for existing and day to day garbage has been started at trenching ground. Bio-medical waste management and incineration facility for disposal of bio-medical waste has been started for Cantonment General Hospital through a private agency.

(iv) Tree Plantation

1500 saplings were planted. Survival rate was 60 %.

9. **PUBLIC HEALTH**

(i) Hospital and Dispensaries

The Board maintains a 20 bedded hospital and maternity ward. A new OPD & OT complex is functioning. 52800 outdoor and 1651 indoor patients were treated during the year. Free medicines are supplied to patients. Few generic medicines are being purchased from GMSD Mumbai and other generic medicines by tendering process. Specialists such as Pediatrician, General Physician, ENT Surgeon, Dermatologist and Dentist have been engaged. Dentist and Physician render their services at the Hospital whereas other specialist visit once a week.

(ii) Special Measures taken for Senior Citizens

Priority is given to senior citizens in treatment and free medicines are provided to them.

(iii) Kishori Clinic

Kishori Clinics are held and guidance and treatment are given to adolescent girls during OPD hrs by the Medical Suprintendant.

(iv) Janani Suraksha Yojna

Facilities under Janani Suraksha Yojana are being provided/extended to patients of Cantonment General Hospital. During the year, 50 normal delivery cases and 07 caesarean delivery cases were undertaken and patients were paid Rs. 600/- & Rs.2100/- per case respectively under Janani Suraksha Yojna.

(v) HIV Testing Facilities

Cantonment General Hospital has HIV testing facility.

(vi) Special Medical Camps

A medical camp for students in Cantonment area regarding deworming was held.

(iv) Health Care Measures for Cantonment Board Employees & their Dependents The Board employees and their dependents are treated free of cost at Cantonment General Hospital. Medical checkup of Cantt employees was held during the year.

7. SPECIAL MEASURES FOR CHILDREN

(i) Differently-abled Children

Board is running centre for differently-abled children at Cantonment General Hospital, Dehuroad named as "DISHA". 135 children have registered with the centre. Every day 32 differently-abled children are being given minor treatment and counseling etc. The Board has also purchased play equipments for 'DISHA' centre. Craft, Music and Drawing is also taught at the centre.

8. ENVIRONMENT AND SANITATION

(i) General Sanitation

General sanitation in the cantonment remained satisfactory.

(ii) Ban on Use of Polythene:

The use of polythene has been banned in the cantonment area. Measures are taken by giving public notice in local Newspapers and distributing pamphlets for prohibition of manufacturing/ supplying/ usage of polythene and plastic bags. Raids were carried out for confiscating plastic bags.

(iii) Efforts Made for Improvement of Solid Waste Management

Solid Waste Management programme has been undertaken. Door to door collection of bio degradable and non bio degradable garbage with ghanta gadi has been introduced in Military area and in some parts of civil area for implementation of Municipal Solid Waste (Management and Handling) Rules, 2000. Science and Technology Park, Pune University has been engaged by this office for commissioning of small scale sewage treatment plants at Shelarwadi & Chincholi STP /ETP, composting project and also for Control of pollution to river water.

(iv) Tree Plantation

200 saplings were planted by the Board during the year. The survival rate was 80% under report. The children of Cantonment Board schools were encouraged to plant and adopt trees for further maintenance.

(v) Swachchh Bharat Mission

Swachh Bharat Abhiyan" was implemented in cantonment area on a large scale. A five year plan has been drawn up to undertake various improvements. Special drive was arranged for cleaning of all the cantonment areas by detailing garbage vehicles, tippers, gantta gadis, garbage compactors for collection of waste papers, garbage and grass cutting etc. Special cleanliness drive was also conducted at Shelarwadi cremation ground. Entire cremation ground premises was cleaned. Cleanliness drive was also conducted at cremation ground of Kinhai village during the above mentioned period. Private JCB, Excavator and Dumper was also hired for collection and disposal of road side garbage and to spread carbo phenol,

powder for mosquito and fly nuisances. For house to house segregation of domestic garbage, pamphlets were distributed in different schools, house hold, shops etc. in Cantonment area.

9. **PUBLIC HEALTH**

(i) Hospital and Dispensaries

The Board maintains a 50 bedded Cantonment General Hospital. 48,078 outdoor and 1,497 indoor patients were treated during the year. The Board has purchased latest X-ray machine by replacing old X-ray machine. The Board has also started Primary Health Centre at Chincholi village under NUHM, Govt. of Maharashtra, wherein free medical checkup as well as free medicines are being provided to the poor and needy patients. NUHM has appointed various staff and entire expenditure of the centre is made by the NUHM. The Board has also appointed various specialist Doctors such as MD physician, Eye specialist, Gynaecologist, Orthopadic surgeon etc. on weekly visit basis.

(ii) Special Measures Taken for Senior Citizens

Senior citizens are given free OPD treatment & medicines.

- (iii) Kishori Clinic
 - Kishori Clinic is functioning.

(iv) HIV Testing Facilities

State Govt. has provided ICTC with counselor & Lab Technician once in a week for free investigation and counseling. Patients are referred to neighboring municipal hospital for further treatment.

(v) Special Medical Camps

Medical check up camp was carried out during Shree Sant Tukaram Palkhi procession and free medical treatment was provided to about 7,000 pilgrims. Blood donation camp was organized on 05/03/2016 in which 52 bottles of blood was collected. Free eye checkup camp with cataract operation camp was organized on 19/02/2016. Total 92 patients were examined and 24 cataract operations were carried out in Civil Hospital, Aundh Pune. Pulse Polio Immunization Programme was undertaken during 2015-2016. Almost 100% of target children are immunized. Special drive for deworming and supply of Vitamin A liquid to the children of slum area was taken up.

(vi) Health Care Measures for Cantonment Board Employees & their Dependents Free medical facilities and medicine were provided to employees and their dependents by Cantonment Hospital. The treatment which was not available in Cantonment Hospital was provided as per CSMA Rules.

10. GENERAL ADMINISTRATION

(i) Status of Implementation of New Pension Scheme New Pension Scheme has been implemented.

(ii) Public Redressal Mechanism

Complaints of the public are heard by the CEO and disposed off. 'Samadhan', a public grievance redressal system, and 'Suvidha', an employees grievances redressal system, have been started and working satisfactorily.

(iii) Audit of Accounts

Audit of accounts has been carried out up to March 2015.

(iv) Any Other Initiative(s) in Public Interest

Birth & death registration is computerized through CRS software. CCTV cameras have also been installed in office, hospital & all the octroi posts.

11. LAND RECORDS MANAGEMENT AND MODERNIZATION

(i) Creation of IT Section

One computer programmer has been appointed in the IT section.

(ii) Status of Raksha Bhoomi Implementation

GLR extract in respect of civil area under the management of Dehuroad Cantonment has been uploaded in Raksha Bhoomi 3.1.

(iii) **Document Management System** DMS is successfully installed and updated.

(iv) Steps Taken to Automatise Office Processes Property tax bills, establishment, administration, Pay roll, GPF and CPF software has been implemented.

(v) Digitization of Office Records

The work of scanning and digitization of office records of 1st & 2nd phase has been completed. One record room has been created and compactor installed in which all the important records and files stored. The Board has also purchased fire proof box for preservation of important records.

(vi) DGDE MPLS VPN Project

Installation of 2 mbps lease line on OFC has been completed. The office has been connected to NIC NET by using 2 mbps leased line and all the online services will be accessed through it.

12. MARKETS

The Board maintains one market consisting of 32 stalls/shops in civil area and one Low Income Group (LIG) market consisting of 11 stalls/shops outside the Civil Area and one Shopping Complex in the Main Bazar consisting of 36 shops & one big hall of 8800 sqft.

13. FIRE FIGHTING

Fire fighting services of neighbouring municipalities, Ordnance Factory & Ammunition Depot are utilized as and when required.

14. BIRTHS AND DEATHS

315 births and 125 deaths were reported during the year.

3. **REVENUE**

(i) Comparison of Tax Rates with Neighboring Municipality Tax Rates

- The property tax rate structure in neighboring municipalities i.e. MCD & NDMC is on self assessment basis divided in various categories whereas in Cantonment area the property tax is imposed on Annual Rateable Value basis. The Cantonment Board is imposing profession tax on various trades whereas adjoining municipalities are not levying profession tax. Triennial assessment for the year 2013-2016 has been completed.

86.23%.

4. WATER SUPPLY

The Board receives bulk water supply from Delhi Jal Board for Naraina village. However, the distribution is done through Board's infrastructure comprising of an overhead tank and an underground sump. For other areas, the Board is supplying water through its own tube wells and infrastructure. The Board is presently maintaining 43 deep tube wells for drinking water, 7 over-head tanks, 9 underground reservoirs and 52 pump houses. Per capita water supply per day is around 160 litres.

6. EDUCATION

(i) Schools

The Board is maintaining six senior secondary and one English medium secondary school. All schools follow CBSE curriculum. Computer education is compulsory from Class III and 180 computers have been installed in computer labs in all schools. 100 smart class rooms (interactive class rooms) have also been provided, Separate toilet facilities for girls and boys are available in every school. Teacher training programs are also conducted annually. Sports and extracurricular activities

are also promoted in the schools. Mr. Rishabh Pant, a student of Dr. APJ Abdul Kalam Senior Secondary School, Shastri Bazar was selected in the Under 19 National Cricket Team and also played in IPL 2016 from Delhi Daredevils team.

(ii) School Management Committee

School management committees have been formed for all seven schools. Their meetings are held regularly and their recommendations are also implemented.

(iii) **Promotion of Education**

The Board gives cash rewards to meritorious students. 'Dakhila Abhiyan' rallies are conducted every year to promote enrollment. Free education, uniform, shoes, books and mid-day meals are provided.

(iv) Any Other Initiative to Promote Education

An open sports stadium for inter schools competitions was inaugurated on 24.01.2016. Construction of additional class rooms and other facilities is in progress at Uri Enclave, Shastri Bazar and Silver Oak Model schools. A mini sports stadium is also being developed at Dr. APJ Abdul Kalam Senior Secondary School, Gopi Nath Bazar. Career counseling is provided to students. All State sponsored schemes are being implemented. 'Ladli Scheme' for promoting girl education is being implemented successfully.

7. SPECIAL MEASURES FOR CHILDREN

(i) Differently-abled Children

'Kripa', a school for differently-abled children in which 126 children are enrolled is maintained by the Board. Pharmacological intervention, special diet, occupational therapy, sensory integration, behavioral therapy, speech or language therapy, dance and music therapy, yoga and physiotherapy is provided to them. Free facilities include education, uniform, medical counseling, mid day meal and transport facility. Extra-curricular activities e.g. cultural programs, inter school competitions, special olympiad, celebration of festivals, excursion trips etc are part of curriculum. Additional class rooms and facilities are also being constituted.

(ii) Children of Migrant Labour

'Shradha Path' a centre for providing education to children of construction and migrant labourers is run by the Board. The Board has also approved establishment of another center.

8. ENVIRONMENT AND SANITATION

(i) General Sanitation

General sanitation in the cantonment remained satisfactory.

(ii) Ban on Use of Polythene

Use of polythene has been banned in the cantonment.

(iii) Efforts Made To Improve Solid Waste Management

Door to door collection of garbage is done. Special drives are being undertaken to create awareness for its segregation of into biodegradable and non-biodegradable wastes at household level. Weekly cleaning drives were undertaken ward wise to educate public on the importance of solid waste management under Swachh Bharat Mission.

(iv) Other Initiatives

Waste recycling plants for conversion of waste to organic compost/ energy, Conversion of plastic waste to fuel and conversion of horticulture waste to bio fuel

have been approved. Rain water harvesting systems have been installed along major public roads and Cantonment Board buildings. Roof top solar grid power plants of about 100 Kwp capacity are being installed at Cantonment General Hospital and Cantonment Board Office. Conventional light fittings are being replaced with LED systems. Comprehensive improvement to sewerage and drainage system and rejuvenation of water bodies is being done.

9. PUBLIC HEALTH

(i) Hospitals and Dispensaries

The Board maintains a 100 bedded hospital. During the year 3, 10,406 outdoor patients were treated. Services of medical specialists in gynecology, pediatrics, anesthesia, medicine, surgery, ophthalmology, orthopedics, radiology, ENT, dermatology, pathology & psychiatry are available. Emergency services are available round the clock. Support / diagnostic services like ultrasound, X-ray, ECG, micro biology lab, hematology lab, bio chemistry labs are also available. One minor OT & One Major OT is presently functioning. IPD facilities are available round the clock. A physiotherapy department equipped with latest equipments is available. Health checkup of school students is done twice a year. A DOT center, family health care center, ayush clinic and homeopathic clinic are also maintained. Free medicines are provided to all patients. A hearse van and a critical care ambulance are also available. All Central Government/ State Government sponsored health programs are run in the hospital.

(ii) Special Measures Taken for Senior Citizens

World Elderly Day was celebrated on 01.10.2015. A geriatric clinic is being run and senior citizens are exempted from OPD charges, senior citizens clinic is functioning daily from 2 PM to 4 PM and during the year 22,682 patients were treated.

- (iii) Kishori Clinic Kishori Clinic is functioning in the hospital satisfactorily. During the year 23,991 girls were treated/counseled:
- (iv) Janani Suraksha Yojna

The Scheme has been implemented and 28 women benefited during the year.

(v) Mobile Dispensary

Two mobile dispensaries are maintained and 15597 patients were treated through these services.

(vi) Special Medical Camps

Cancer detection camps, cataract screening camp, sterilization camp, Kripa school camp (02 Nos.) and school dental camp were organized.

(vii) Health Care Measures for Cantonment Board Employees and their Dependents

Board employees and their dependents are provided free medical facilities at the Cantonment General Hospital. The Board has also empanelled renowned hospitals in Delhi for treatment of employees and their dependents.

10. GENERAL ADMINISTRATION

- (i) Status of Implementation of New Pension Scheme New pension scheme has already been implemented.
- (ii) Public Redressal Mechanism

Samadhan, a public grievances redressal system and Suvidha, an employees grievances redressal system have been implemented. General public is also being given hearing for redressal of their grievances.

(iv) Any Other Initiative(s) in Public Interest

A public information & facilitation centre has been established where all public facilities viz birth & death registration, suvidha, samadhan, tax/revenue counter, enquiry counter and cash collection counters have been provided under one roof. An android friendly Samadhan App has also developed.

(i) Creation of IT Section

A computer programmer has been engaged.

(ii) Status of Raksha Bhoomi Implementation

Raksha Bhoomi software has been installed. Verification and authentication of GLR entries has been completed.

(iii) Document Management System

DMS has been installed on a dedicated system and digitally signed files have been uploaded in DMS.

(iv) Steps taken to Automatize Office Process

Birth & death registration processes have been computerized. Every branch has been provided with computers and connected through LAN. DAK management software is provided in the dispatch section.

(v) Digitization of Office Record

Scanning of about 15 lakh documents of the office has been completed. Quality check, renaming and digital signing of files is in progress & 22,000 files have been inventorised in the file management system.

12. MARKETS

6. EDUCATION

(i) Schools

The Board maintains one high school and five (03 Marathi, 01 Urdu, 01 Hindi and 01 English medium) primary schools. The Board also maintains 08 Balwadis with 190 students. New school building has been recently completed under Capital Asset Project. Mid-day meal was provided to all the students from Std. I to VIII. Computer Laboratory having 21 computers was functional at Cantt Board High

School and a separate Computer Laboratory has also been provided by the Directorate of Education. The Board provided e-classes (Audio-Visual Class Room) from Class Vth to Xth. The Board implemented a project of Information Communication Technology (ICT).

(ii) School Management Committee

School Management Committees have been constituted for all schools and meetings were held regularly. The School Management Committees have been delegated with all necessary powers and duties as per Right to Education Act and bye-laws adopted by the Board.

(iii) **Promotion of Education**

Merit Scholarship & Savitribai Phule Backward Scholorship was given to the meritorious girls & SC/ST students. Extra Coaching classes for NTS, STS, 10th Exams., Spoken English, Soft Skills etc. were conducted regularly. Summer Camp and Science Exhibition were organized.

(iv) Any Other Initiative to Promote Education

Free text books, exercise books, writing & study material, uniform, socks & shoes, school bags, sports kits were provided to all the students of Cantt Board schools.

7. SPECIAL MEASURES FOR CHILDREN

(i) Differently-abled Children

A training and therapy centre named 'Ankur' was set up by the Board for "Divyang" special children which has been working very well. Video CD, Taperecorder, large print books and special teaching aids and play equipments have been provided. Additional space for playing activities has been developed/added and a 24 seater bus has also been provided.

(ii) Children of Migrant Labours

An informal school for these children, has already been started, at a big construction site in co-operation with private persons with satisfactory results which is running for the last four years.

(i) General Sanitation

General sanitation in the cantonment remained satisfactory. Due to increase in the population over the past few years, the Board has renovated old and constructed new public toilets and urinals in all the eight wards of the cantonment.

Mini Marathon of 05 KMs was organized by the Board on 24.01.2016 in association with Inner-wheel Club, Rotary Club & NGOs in which approx 2300

persons of different age groups, including Senior citizens, participated. The Board maintains 02 Public Parks.

(i) Hospital and Dispensaries

The Board maintains one indoor hospital having 75 beds. 4762 Indoor and 79378 Outdoor patients were treated. There are 05 permanent and 19 visiting specialist doctors providing services to patients. The hospital also caters to the population of neighbouring areas. The recently established Physiotherapy Centre has been found quite helpful to needy patients. An Ambulance with 5 ANMs has been provided for out-reach area. Immunization & health survey was routinely conducted and National Health programmes were implemented. City Urban Health Dispensary i.e. Urban Public Health Centre, which started on 19.02.2015 under National Urban Health Mission (NUHM), is functioning properly.

(ii) Special Measures Taken for Senior Citizen

Free medical check-up of senior citizens was carried out. They were also provided with free medicines as prescribed.

(iii) Kishori Clinic

135 girls were counseled and treated .

(iv) Janani Suraksha Yojana

114 patients have been benefitted from this scheme.

(v) HIV Testing Facilities

Integrated Counseling & Testing Centre (I.C.T.C.) has been established and tests were conducted for ANC and VCTC cases.

(vi) Special Medical Camp

Special medical camps including awareness programmes viz; Pulmonary Function Test, 'Swacchta Abhiyan' in Cantonment. Hospital Campus, Squint Diagnostic Camp, Skin Grafting Camp, Mahila Arogya Abhiyan and Tuberculosis Day were conducted during the year.

(iv) Health Care Measures for Cantonment Board Employees & their Dependents Health check up of Cantonment Board employees was carried out from 03.12.2015 to 01.01.2016.

The Board is maintains one senior secondary, one English medium high school and three elementary schools. K.G classes have been introduced in all the schools. Free uniform and books are provided to all students. The result of matriculation was 100%.

All five Schools have school management committees which have been delegated with adequate powers to take certain decisions on the day to day functioning of the schools.

6. EDUCATION

(i) Schools

The Board maintains 8 schools including 2 primary schools, 4 junior high schools and 2 high schools. Students are provided with mid-day meals, free text books and scholarships sponsored by the Govt. of Uttar Pradesh.

(ii) School Management Committee

School management committees have been constituted in all schools and 87 meetings were held during the year.

iii) Vocational Training

The Board has conducted vocational training in tailoring, stenography (Hindi/English), and mobile repairing. 189 trainees were imparted training.

(iv) **Promotion of Education**

Free uniforms were provided to students upto class VI. Text books and scholarships were provided to the students by UP State Government. Meritorious students were given cash prizes and students having high attendance were given scholarship. Activity teachers have been engaged for music, tabla and dance. Taekwondo and yoga classes are also being run in the schools. A computer lab having 10 computers was provided in Silver Oak School (Kakori School). 2 computers were provided in each of the remaining schools.

(v) Any Other Initiative to Promote Education

Survey and canvassing drive was carried out for improving enrolment and checking dropout rate. During vacation, summer camps were conducted for children including activities of sports, yoga, music, dance, painting and other hobby classes. These camps were also open to children who are not the students of Cantonment Board schools.

were organized to provide free medical services to the residents. One full time Dental Doctor (BDS) and Physiotherapist engaged on contract basis.

The revised Triennial Assessment for the block year 2015 to 2018 has shown an increase of 76% approx. over the past assessment. Two Vocational courses for a period of one year comprising training in cutting, tailoring, embroidery and soft toys making and Art and Craft were completed during the year. Total strength in the Vocational Training Centre was 15. Board has also organized five days exhibition cum sale every month to encourage market skills amongst the participants.

(iii) Any Other Initiative to Promote Education

Board has sponsored scholarship of Rs. 150/- per month to one girl children having poor financial background.

(i) Differently-abled Children

"ULLAS" - a centre for differently-abled children has been opened. The centre also provides free health checkup, physiotherapy services and house visits by the special educator. Teaching learning aids have also been provided.

(i) General Sanitation

General Sanitation in the Cantonment remained satisfactory. The sanction of sewerage line phase-III has been received, which is under progress.

(ii) Ban on use of Polythene

Use of polythene is banned in Cantonment area.

(iii) Efforts Made for Improvement of Solid Waste Management

Covered vehicle is used for collection and transportation of garbage. Bio degradable refuse is being disposed off through the land fill method and non-biodegradable refuse is being disposed off in an incinerator.

(iv) Tree Plantation

500 saplings of different species were planted. The survival rate is approximately 60%.

(v) Other Initiatives

Sign Boards promoting sanitation have been placed. Portable dust bins have been provided within the narrow lanes to control the blockages of drains. Chronic problem of stray cattle was addressed effectively by duly transferring the stray cattle to Goshala at Pinjore as the Board does not have a cattle pound.

6. EDUCATION

(i) Schools

The Board maintains one junior high school, two primary schools and one English medium school. 1032 children are enrolled in the schools.

(ii) School Management Committee

School management committees have been constituted and functioning.

(iii) Vocational Training Centre

The Board conducted training courses of embroidery, tailoring, beautician, mehandi and computer through its vocational training centre, in association with an NGO. 217 students were given training during the year. A Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) was also signed with M/s Kherwadi

Social Welfare Association (Yuva Parivartan), Mumbai, an accredited vocational training provider under Modular Employable Scheme (MES) of Labour Employable and Manpower (LEM), Government of India, National Skill Development Centre (NSDC), to provide skill development training to deprived, unskilled, dropouts and unemployed youths of cantonment and surrounding area, so that after completing their training they can earn their livelihood. Training of one batch is under progress.

(iv) **Promotion of Education**

Free education, distribution of books, mid-day meal, awards for meritorious students, scholarships to SC/ST/OBC students through Government of U.P., free uniforms to all students were provided to promote education. Judo-Karate training is imparted to students and a district level competition was organized. Smart class was commenced during the year. Energy requirements of one Primary school are met through solar energy.

7. SPECIAL MEASURES FOR CHILDREN

(i) Differently-abled Children

The Board is running a school named "SANKALP" for differently-abled children.

(ii) Children of Migrant Labourers

80 children of migrant labourers are enrolled in regular classes and are provided mid-day meal and free school kits.

8. ENVIRONMENT AND SANITATION

(i) General Sanitation

General sanitation of cantonment remained satisfactory.

(ii) Ban on use of Polythene

Use of polythene has been banned in the cantonment.

(iii) Efforts Made for Improvement of Solid Waste Management

Door to door collection of garbage is done both in civil area and army area. Segregation is being done at source as well as at the disposal point. Composting is being done. Separate portable dustbins for biodegradable and non-biodegradable waste have been provided.

(iv) Tree Plantation

100 saplings were planted and protected with RCC tree guards. The survival rate was about 60%.

9. PUBLIC HEALTH

(i) Hospital and Dispensaries

The Board maintains a 18 bedded hospital. Services of specialists like gynaecologist, ortho-surgeon, ENT specialist, opthalmologist, chest specialist, physiotherapist, dermatologist, dentist, surgeon and a homeopathic doctor are available on part time basis. Facility of ayurvedic, naturopathy and unani treatment are also available. 61,412 outdoor patients and 86 indoor patients were treated during the year.

(ii) Special Measures Taken for Senior Citizens

Apart from regular services, special camps for blood sugar detection, asthma detection, spirometry etc. are organized for senior citizens every month. Medicines are provided free of cost.

(iii) Kishori Clinic

Health checkup of adolescent girls is done by lady doctor on every Thursday. 200 girls were examined and necessary medicines/advice were given to them.

(iv) Janani Suraksha Yojna

Janani Suraksha Yojna is implemented through State Government.

(v) HIV Testing Facilities

HIV kit is available in the hospital. 20 tests were conducted.

(vi) Special Medical Camps

Free medical camps were organized for detection of blood sugar, anemia, skin ailments and maternal problems, orthopedic checkup, dental check up and asthma.

(vii) Health Care Measures for Cantonment Board Employees and their Dependents

Free medical facilities are provided to Cantonment Board employees and their dependents.

An annual increase of Rs.4.48 lakhs was there due to completion of Triennial Revision of Assessments for the block year 2014-2017. Various fee/charges levied by the Board has been revised.

6. EDUCATION

(i) Schools

The Board manages one high school in Tamil Medium following State Board syllabus and one English Medium school following CBSE syllabus.

(ii) School Management Committee

The school management committee held 3 meetings during the year.

(iii) Vocational Training

Free computer class, Tailoring, Typewriting and Hand work cum toy making are being run by the Board. 36 students were enrolled in these courses.-

(iv) **Promotion of Education**

The Board received (from state govt.) an annual scholarship of Rs.24,050/- for 13 students whose parents are doing sanitary/menial jobs. Minority scholarships were sanctioned for 30 students during the academic year 2015-16.

(v) Any Other Initiatives to Promote Education

The Cantonment Board issued free Note books for the students of classes from 1st to 10th of High School during the academic year. Cantonment School Students were granted free bus passes for the academic year from the State Government. Apart from this, free transport has also been arranged by the Board. The State Government Noon Meal Scheme is prevalent in the High School (Primary/Secondary Sections) for 243 students during the academic year. The Board organized free medical check-up, and a special Eye Camp in collaboration with the "Eye Foundation" Ooty. Health awareness camp on Dengu and Chikungunya was also held. A special general medical check-up was carried out by the Primary Health Centre, Yedapalli during the academic year for the students. In order to improve the standard of education, smart classes were introduced at our Secondary school. Sarva Siksha Abhiyan (SSA), Coonoor provided special training of 12 sessions for the Teachers of High school (Tamil Medium). Free computer education was being provided to the students of Board Schools by the Cantonment Board.

7. SPECIAL MEASURES FOR CHILDREN

(i) Differently-abled children

A Special Centre named "ABHAY" for differently-abled children was established by the Board, and thirteen children were admitted. Regular Medical checkup is provided by the Board and State Government.

8. ENVIRONMENT AND SANITATION

(i) General Sanitation

The standard of sanitation in the Cantonment was found satisfactory. Implementation of 5 year plans under Swachh Bharat is in progress to improve it further.

(ii) Ban on use of Polythene

The Board has resolved to ban polythene and also to impose fine on every occasion of default.

(iii) Efforts made for improvement of Solid Waste Management

Under Municipal Solid Waste (Management and Handling) Rules 2000, the Board, embarked on a novel venture named Mission – Zero Garbage in July, 2004, with an objective of transforming Wellington into a Zero Garbage Model Cantonment by envisaging door-to door collection of Garbage with segregation into degradable and non-degradable waste, followed by vermi– composting process of degradable waste and for sale of recycled waste to recycling industries. It also started organic farming in the vacant places of compost yard on sharing of revenue arrived out of sale of products.

(iv) Tree Plantation

Nearly 1500 Shola tree saplings were planted and the survival rate is 75%.

(v) Other initiatives

All the public group toilet blocks of each ward were renovated with water supply, electricity, tiled floor etc. Spraying of insecticide and fogging against the vectors like mosquitoes in all the breeding places were carried out periodically. Grass cutting machines were also being used in the areas for trimming of grass periodically. Erection of e-toilet with Bio-degrader at Boys Company bus stand was initiated.

9. **PUBLIC HEALTH**

(i) Hospital and Dispensaries

The Board has a 30 bedded hospital. The Hospital runs a daily OPD. Emergencies are treated round the clock. There is a fully equipped laboratory with Semi Auto Analyser, ECG and X-ray facility. The Hospital also has an ICU and Labour room. A three probe Ultra Sound Machine for which PNDT LICENCE has been obtained, was started. A full fledged Eye Care Centre is held on every Wednesday with the assistance of Eye foundation, Ooty. A Dental care unit is also functioning in the Hospital thrice a week.

(ii) Special Measures for senior citizens

The Board evaluated all the senior citizens residing in area and identified the patients who are bed ridden and suffering from chronic ailments. There are 84 such patients in the area and they are visited at their residences once a month and given all treatments free of cost. In case of any emergencies in between, they are shifted to the hospital in ambulance.

(iii) Kishori Clinic

Counselling is given to all adolescent girls with the help of our visiting gynecologist.

(iv) Janani Suraksha Yojna

The State Government of Tamilnadu is providing assistance of Rs.12,000/- to all Maternity cases in the area. This scheme is provided by the Yedapalli PHC who is covering the cantonment area.

(v) HIV testing facility

This facility is available.

(vi) Mobile Dispensary

Mobile dispensary services are given to deserving senior citizens at their residence. The ambulance is used to shift very sick patients from their residence to the Cantonment Board's hospital.

(vii) Special medical camps

Special camp was conducted for Diabetes and Hypertension detection and was utilized by 136 patients. Regular medical camps are conducted by the Primary Health Centre covering Cantonment area. An ENT Specialty camp with the assistance of Y Men's Club of Wellington and Vikram ENT Hospital, Coimbatore was conducted.

(vii) Health care measures for Cantonment Board employees and their dependants

Annual master health check up of employees is done in the hospital and their health cards are maintained. Dependents of the employees are given treatment free of cost.

An IT section with one qualified Junior Programmer is functioning in the Cantonment Board office.

(ii) STATUS OF RAKSHA BHOOMI IMPLEMENTATION

At present the Raksha Bhoomi software has migrated into online version (RB 5.0). The Board has started using the online version through VPN connections.

(iii) DOCUMENT MANAGEMENT SYSTEM

The Board has installed Alfresco DMS and the steps are on to establish the DMS in all sections. Uploading the scanned files in Alfresco scanner as well as in AU & RC server has been completed

(iv) STEPS TAKEN TO AUTOMATIZE OFFICE PROCESSES

All the sections in Board office such as Accounts Section, Revenue Section, Health Section, Engineering Section and Hospital are computerized. Nearly 95 % of the Office and Hospital routine work are computerized and updation work is in progress as per user requirements.

(v) DIGITIZATION OF OFFICE RECORDS

The digitization of office records has been completed on 30.06.2015 in two phases and the scanned P DF files have been forwarded to AU & RC




