

LAYING OF FOUNDATION STONE OF HARYANA'S SEVENTH DISTRICT ALTERNATIVE DISPUTE RESOLUTION (ADR) CENTRE AT KAITHAL

Hon'ble Mr. Justice Satish Kumar Mittal, Judge, Punjab and Haryana High Court-cum-Executive Chairman, Haryana State Legal Services Authority, Chandigarh laid the foundation stone of seventh District Alternative Dispute Resolution (ADR) Centre at Kaithal on 8.9.2012 in the District Court Complex in the august presence of Hon'ble Mr. Justice M.S.Sullar, Judge, Punjab and Haryana High Court-cum-



Administrative Judge, Sessions Division, Kaithal and other esteemed dignitaries. Their Lordships also glanced the building plan of the proposed building of ADR Centre. They paid a visit to the District Bar Association, Kaithal and addressed members of the Bar. Later, in the press conference held in Conference Hall of Judicial Complex Hon'ble Mr. Justice Satish Kumar Mittal explained the different activities being carried out by the Haryana State Legal Services Authority in the



entire state. His lordship emphasized upon the necessity of setting up of District ADR Centres, wherein all ADR facilities like Mediation, Conciliation, Lok Adalats & Arbitration etc. shall be provided under one roof. He told that the ADR Centre is the need of the day,

which is being developed as a supplementary means to the already existing judicial process. His Lordship then held interactive session with panel Advocates and Para Legal Volunteers of District Legal Services Authority, Kaithal and Sub-Division, Guhla in Conference Hall of Mini Secretariat, Kaithal. Their Lordships visited the office of Protection Officer; Kaithal and inspected the Legal Aid Clinic being run there.

Later in the day, Hon'ble Mr. Justice S.K.Mittal inaugurated a Legal Aid Clinic in the campus of Sanatan Dharam Mandir, Kaithal and visited the old age home being run by the said institute. While addressing the gathering, his Lordship explained at length the concept of 'Legal Aid Clinics'.

LEGAL AID CLINIC (SLUM AREA) AT SECTOR 17-18, JHUGGIES, OPP. KISAN MAZDOOR COLONY, FARIDABAD

Hon'ble Mr. Justice Satish Kumar Mittal, Judge, Punjab and Haryana High Court-cum-Executive Chairman, Haryana State Legal Services Authority, Chandigarh inaugurated the Legal Aid Clinic at Sector 17-18, Jhuggies (slum area), Opposite Kisan Mazdoor Colony, Faridabad on 8.9.2012, in the presence of Shri Darshan Singh, District & Sessions Judge-cum-Chairman, District Legal Services Authority, Faridabad, Sh. Deepak Gupta, Additional District & Sessions Judge-





cum-Member Secretary, Haryana State Legal Services Authority and other dignitaries including Shri Shatruect Kapoor, Commissioner of Police, Shri Balraj Singh, Deputy Commissioner, all judicial officers and officers of District Administration. The function was also attended by Panel Advocates, Para Legal Volunteers, Anganwari

workers, Law Students, Senior Citizens, Sarpanches & Panches.

Later in a function organized in the hall of DAV School, his Lordship explained that the thrust of judiciary is on speedy justice and to make the legal system and justice available at the doorstep of masses. His Lordship further apprised that HALSA has already opened about 600 Legal Aid Clinics in the State, which are manned by Empanelled Advocates and Para Legal Volunteers. He further emphasized that the objective behind the opening of such clinics is to make available first aid in legal services to the poor man and to make aware the common man of his legal rights in order enable him to seek justice.

Mr. Ravinder Gupta, Coordinator, District Legal Services Authority reported that in Faridabad, 20 Legal Aid Clinics had been established in villages, 4 in urban areas, 3 in slum areas, 1 each in District Jail, Observation Home and specially for women in the D.C. Office and that 2398 persons have been benefited so far in this year, which is double the number in comparison to the previous year.

The applications made by inmates for legal aid were forwarded to the concerned Secretaries of Districts Legal Services Authorities. The Director, Women and Child Development Department, Haryana was asked to take necessary steps for notification of separate Observation Home for the inmates, who were stated to have completed of the age of 18 years. The Deputy Commissioner of Police (Urban), Ambala was also asked to issue appropriate instructions for providing adequate security at the time of any Medical emergency for taking inmates to the Civil Hospital, Ambala City/PGI Chandigarh.

मुख्य न्यायिक दंडाधिकारी एवं जिला विधिक सेवा प्राधिकरण के सचिव हरीश गुप्ता ने बताया कि लोक अदालत में कुल 109 केसों की सुनवाई की गई, जिसमें सिविल के तीन, 138 एनआई एक्ट के 64, मोटर चालान के 38, एक्सट्रेस एक्ट के 3, फैमली सेटलमेंट के एक केस थे, जिनमें से सिविल के दो, 138 एनआई एक्ट के 9, मोटर चालान के 32, एक्सट्रेस एक्ट के तीन, फैमली सेटलमेंट के एक केस आयोजित लोक अदालत में कुल 47 केसों का भौके पर ही निपटारा किया गया। इस अवसर पर एडवोकेट अभित सोनी, संदीप भादिया, विनय शर्मा, गुनरान बुनोना तथा अन्य एडवोकेट उपस्थित थे। वहीं, गांधी बहलपुर में भी लोक अदालत लगाई गई, जिसमें कुल 11 केस सुनवाई हेतु रखे गए, जिनमें से 5 केसों का निपटारा वकीलों के सहयोग तथा दोनो पक्षों के आपसी सहमति से करवाया गया।
