This initiative, spearheaded by the District Legal Services Authorities (DLSAs), aims to raise awareness and provide legal assistance to workers in the unorganized sector. In accordance with the NALSA (Legal Services to the Workers in the Unorganized Sector) Scheme, 2015, and with a special focus on The Building and Other Construction Workers (Regulation of

Employment and Conditions of Service) Act, 1996, the campaign will run from February 1st to August 19th, 2024 in the State of Haryana.

That apart, in collaboration with the Labour Department, the DLSAs will conduct a series of awareness programs and registration drives for workers throughout the campaign period. These activities will empower workers with knowledge about their rights and entitlements under the law, ensuring they have access to legal assistance when needed.

AWARENESS CAMPS ON THE AMENDED PROVISIONS OF THE MOTOR VEHICLES ACT



NATIONAL LOK ADALAT

Under the Chairmanship of Hon'ble Mr. Justice Arun Palli, Judge, Punjab and Haryana High Court-cum-Executive Chairperson, HALSA, the Haryana State Legal Services Authority through the District Legal Services Authorities across the state orchestrated a remarkable achievement through the successful execution of the 1st National Lok Adalat on 9th March, 2024. With unwavering dedication, they navigated through the backlog of legal cases, resolving over 2 lakh pending and pre-litigative matters through amicable settlements. The District Legal Services Authorities demonstrated exemplary commitment by conducting numerous pre-LokAdalat sittings, engaging in extensive consultations with stakeholders like bank managers, managers of insurance companies and establishing help desks within court complexes to provide essential assistance to litigants.













JUDGMENT CORNER

Case titled: S. Rajaseekaran Vs. Union of India I.A. No. 71387 of 2023 in Writ Petition (C) No. 295 of 2012

Order dated January 12, 2024 passed by Hon'ble Supreme Court of India

While hearing a writ petition seeking directions for effective implementation of the provisions of the Motor Vehicles Act, 1988 relating to the grant of compensation in the case of hit and run motor accidents and the scheme framed in terms of sub-section (3) of Section 161 of the Act namely the Compensation of Victims of Hit and Run Motor Accidents Scheme, 2022, the Hon'ble Supreme Court issued the following directions:

"10) Sub-section (2) of Section 161 of MV Act provides that in case of death of any person resulting from hit and run motor accident, a compensation of Rs. 2 lakhs or such higher amount as may be prescribed by the Central Government shall be paid. In case of grievous injury, the compensation amount is Rs. 50 thousand. The value of money diminishes with time. We direct the Central Government to consider whether the compensation amounts can be gradually enhanced annually. The Central Government shall take an appropriate decision on this issue within eight weeks from today".



Case titled: In RE- Inhuman Conditions in 1382 Prisons Writ Petition(s) (Civil) No (s). 406 of 2013

Order dated January 30, 2024 passed by the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India

Having its genesis in the letter dated 13.06.2013 written by former Chief Justice R.C. Lahoti which

Was treated as PIL by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in the year 2013, several directions have been issued by Hon'ble Supreme Court from time to time to address the concern of overcrowding in jails and to ameliorate the conditions of jail inmates. As part of this ongoing exercise, the Hon'ble Supreme Court vide order dated 30.01.2024 has directed constitution of Committees at District Level having its object and constitution as detailed in the order, the relevant portion of which is as under:

- "6. On carefully examining the information furnished in the compilations and recommendations made by the learned Amicus Curiae, we are of the opinion that it would be appropriate to issue directions to constitute a Committee in each District of the States/Union Territories to do the following:
- (i) Assess the available infrastructure in jails and take a decision on the number of additional jails to be constructed in the Districts;
- (ii) to assess the current capacity of the existing jails and requirement of constructing more jails or enhancing the capacity of existing jails to meet the standard laid down in the Model Prison Manual, 2016.
- (iii) Besides the above, the Committees shall also keep in mind the requirement of incorporating Artificial Intelligence and introducing video conferencing for conducting Mulakaats and tele-medicine facilities for the ease of the inmates.
- 7. Each State Government/Union Territory is directed to set up a Committee comprising of (i) Principal/District Judge (Chairperson of the District Legal Services Authority), (ii) District Magistrate (Incharge Administrative Head of the District on Executive Side), (iii) Senior Superintendent/Superintendent of Police, (iv) Secretary of the District Legal Services Authority and (v) Superintendent(s) of Jail. The said Committee shall be notified by the State Governments/Union Territories within one week from the date of receipt of this order. The Secretary of the DLSA shall be the convenor of the Committee. The Committees shall convene the first meeting within two weeks from the date of their constitution.
- 8. The Committees shall initiate steps to examine the requirement of expanding the existing jails and acquiring land to set up new jails within the District, depending on the current capacity, occupancy and future demands of the District and come up with firm proposals. The Committees will also take an update on the status of all

the ongoing projects/proposals that are pending in the Districts and ensure that milestones are set down for completing the ongoing projects. Wherever a project has yet to take off for want of land, steps be taken identify the land for the purposes of acquisition and the report be tabled before the Chief Secretary, of the State Government/Union Territory for obtaining necessary approvals and fast tracking the process. The Committees are permitted to examine the needs of the respective Districts and make proposals over and above of those that have been laid down the Model Prison Manual. However, the minimum requirements prescribed under the said Manual shall not be compromised. Future projections shall span over in a period of at least 50 years for implementation.

9. A Fresh Status Reports shall be filed by all the State Governments/Union Territories on or before 05 th April, 2024. An affidavit shall be filed by Chief Secretary of each State/Union Territory with all the requisite information as directed ordered above, within the same time line".



Case titled: Pohlu @ Polu Ram Vs. State of Haryana and others

CRWP N0. 8232 of 2022 (O & M)

Date of Decision: 05.02.2024 Passed by Hon'ble Punjab and Haryana High Court, Chandigarh

While hearing petitions seeking premature release of convicts/ petitioners, the Hon'ble Punjab and Haryana High Court issued the following directions:

17. Having heard learned counsel for the parties and after perusing the record with their able assistance, grounds on which the cases of the petitioner(s) were rejected, are categorized as under:-

"(I) Involvement in other cases or jail offences

In view of the law laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India in Lila Singh's case, Subhash's case and Kamal Kant Tiwari's case (supra), involvement of the convict in other cases or jail offences cannot be a ground to deny the concession of premature release.

(ii) Premature release of convicts would pose threat to security

In case, the convict has been periodically released on furlough/parole and during his release, he did not indulge in any such activity which disturbed the public peace or posed a threat to the society, rejection of his application for premature release on the ground that same would pose to be a serious threat to the society, is not sustainable.

(iii) Deferred in the absence of any specific provision in the applicable policy or rejected/deferred on the ground of offences being grave and serious in nature.

In the absence of any specific provision in the applicable policy at the time of conviction of the convict, the competent authority cannot act arbitrarily and defer the cases of prisoners for premature release especially by applying the rigours of change of policy, in view of the law laid down in **Rajkumar's case** (supra).

(iv) Opinion of Presiding Officers.

The concession of premature release cannot be denied because the case was not recommended by the Presiding Officer as his opinion is not binding. The Presiding Officers are required to scrupulously follow the instructions issued by the Registrar vide letter bearing No.622/Spl/Gnz 11.17, with regard to rendering the opinion in terms of Section 432(2) of the Cr.P.C.

- 18. In view of the fact that every day this Court comes across numerous petitions seeking premature release of the convicts/petitioners in terms of applicable policy whose cases have been rejected on the grounds mentioned above, the following directions are issued:-
 - (a) Secretaries, District Legal Services Authority across the States of Punjab and Haryana and the Union Territory of Chandigarh are directed to visit the jail premises falling under their jurisdiction periodically and identify such convicts undergoing life imprisonment, who are eligible for premature release in terms of applicable policy at the time of their conviction, but their cases were rejected on the grounds listed in paragraph No.17.

- (b) Thereafter, family members of the convicts, who are eligible for premature release, will be called upon by the Secretaries, District Legal Services Authorities and would be informed about the directions issued by this Court and provide legal assistance in filing appropriate applications for expeditious disposal their cases for premature release.
- (c) If the case of any convict is pending consideration with the competent authority for more than six months, he is required to be released on interim bail, in view of the direction issued by this Court in Pawan Kumar Vs. D.K. Tiwari and another, COCP No. 2020 of 2022 decided on 30.01.2023".
