Guidelines for Prescription of Anti Haemophilia Factor

- 1. Anti Haemophilia factor is to be given only after prescription of a Physician / Paediatrician of Civil Hospital.
- 2. The patient is to be given Anti Haemophilia factor injection only in the hospital as an IPD patient.
- 3. Injections are not to be issued to any patients for use at home / outside the Civil Hospital.
- 4. It is desirable that level of factor VIII / IX be got done [from private laboratory where there is no facility in Government sector reimbursement to the patient for testing fee may be given from Swasthya Kalyan Samiti (SKS) funds], before starting treatment.
- 5. Management by Cryoprecipitate wherever there are Blood Component Separation Units (BCSU's) may be considered in case of in-availability of Anti Haemophilia factor.
