Q.4 How- much reimbursement is allowed for the full Denture?

Ans. A sum of Rs. 2,000/- is allowed(uploaded).

Q.5 Who is the competent authority to change the Option?

Ans. The HOD of the concerned department is competent to change the Option As per State Govt. Instructions dated.....31-1-06..... (uploaded).

Q.6 When will the Option of Chronic disease be changed?

Ans. The Option can be changed by the HOD of concerned department after obtaining chronic disease certificate by the claimant.

Q. 7 What is the time period required to submit the bill?

Ans. The Bills can be submitted within one year after the completion of the treatment vide State Govt. letter no. 2/160/03-1HB3 dated 11-12-2003. (uploaded).

Q. 8 Is sister dependent on the claimant?

Ans. Yes. vide State Govt. letter dated 14-12-2007 (uploaded)..

Q-9 What is the Income of the dependent on the claimant for the reimbursement of their bills?

Ans. It should not be more than Rs. 3500/- per month.

Q-10 Is income clause applicable of the spouse for the reimbursement of the bills?

Ans. NO, the expenditure incurred on the treatment of the spouse is allowed irrespective of the source of income as per the State Govt. letter dated 14-12-2007.

Q. 11. What is validity of Chronic Disease Certificate?

Ans. 2 years. It Should be renewed after 2 years.

Q.12 Is travelling allowance allowed to the claimant for the treatment taken in the Govt./Approved hospitals?

Ans. Yes, as per entitlement once for the treatment. It is not allowed for the follow up of the treatment.

Q.13 Is travelling allowance allowed to the attendant of the patient?

Ans. Yes, as per entitlement of the patient for the treatment. It is not allowed for the follow up of the treatment.

Q. 14. Is referral from the Civil Surgeon is required?

Ans. No, vide State letter Govt. letter dated. 12-11-2007.

Q. 15. How many chronic diseases are listed by the Govt.?

Ans. The list of Chronic diseases approved by the State Govt. for the purpose of Medical Reimbursement (uploaded)

Q.16. Is treatment taken from an approved private hospital as indoor patient reimbursable?

Ans. The treatment taken from unapproved private Hospital as indoor patient is reimbursable only in case of emergency when emergency certificate is issued by the concerned Civil Surgeon of the District and approval is given by Government for working out of medical bills, Medical bills as per PGI/AIIMS rate list on granting relaxation as mentioned in para 4 of policy dated 06-05-2005.

Q. 17 For advance payment to regular employees, how many persons are required to submit the guarantee?

Ans. For advance payment is given as per State Govt. vide instructions dated 06-05-2005 and.... 25-8-14

Q. 18 If the advance is taken for the treatment of disease, how many days of treatment money should be utilized?

Ans. Within 3 months of treatment. The claimant should submit medical bills.

Q. 19 Who issues Essential Certificate (EC) for medical reimbursement after treatment?

Ans. Medical Superintendent of concerned Hospital issues EC after treatment.

Q. 20 Whose counter signatures are required on essentially certificate (EC)?

Ans. Treating Doctor and Medical Superintendent of the concerned hospital shall counter signed the EC.

Q. 21 Is the admission charges, Diet Charges and telephone charges reimbursable?

Ans. No.

Q. 22 When was the power given to concerned Head of Govt. Dept. for working out of Medical Bilis?

Ans. On 31-10-2003.

Q.23. What is the requirement for advance payment for the treatment of disease and how much advance payment is allowed?

Ans. The advance is allowed as per instructions dated 06-05-2005 and dated ~~25/8/13~~

Q.24. Is there any facility of advance payment to adhoc /Contractual employees?

Ans. No, as mentioned in policy dated 06-05-2005.

Q.25. Is the treatment taken from a Govt. Hospital outside the State reimbursed?

Ans. Yes, as per policy dated 6.5.2005 vide clause no. 2 (ii) and (iii)

Q. 29. What is the system of reimbursement of package rates /Implants.

Ans. Full reimbursement is allowed for package rates as mentioned para ..... of the instructions dated 21-01-2015 (uploaded).

Q. 30. How is the reimbursement done for treatment which is not under package rates specified by the State Govt.

Ans. It will be done as per the instructions applicable to the treating hospital.

Q. 31. Will 75% of balance amount be given for stents/implants .

Ans. No, they are maximum permissible rates .

Subject: Health Care and Medical Allowance for Haryana Govt. employees - Reimbursement of outdoor expenses of chronic diseases.

Sir,

I am directed to address you on the subject noted above and to say that the matter regarding reimbursement of outdoor expenses of allopathic treatment of chronic diseases to Haryana Govt. employees/pensioners/family pensioners had been engaging the attention of the Govt. for some time past. It has now been decided to reimburse the expenses of chronic diseases (listed at annexure-A) to Haryana Govt. employees/pensioners/family pensioners and their dependants who undergo allopathic treatment as outdoor patients on the following conditions:

- a) That the certificate of chronic diseases will be issued by the Board constituted under the chairmanship of Civil Surgeon of the District in which a specialist of the chronic disease will be the Member.
- b) The employees residing in Chandigarh and Panchkula will be examined by the Medical Board constituted under the Chairmanship of Civil Surgeon, Ambala.
- c) The medical certificate issued by the P.G.I authority and General Hospital Sector 16 will be valid and the employees having this certificate will not be required to be examined by Medical Board, Ambala.
- d) The Medical Certificate will be reviewed after a period of two years.
- e) The Medical Boards constituted at District Headquarters can refer the cases for detailed examination to Medical college, Rohtak and P.G.I.

These instructions would also be applicable to the employees of Universities, Municipal Committees, Market Committees, State Boards, Corporations and other autonomous bodies. These instructions will also be applicable to all the retired/retiring Govt. employees/



family pensioners.

3. Persons claiming reimbursement on chronic diseases will not be entitled to any other medical allowances either at fixed rate or at the rate of Rs.100/- P.M as out-door patient. No employee claiming reimbursement on account of out-door treatment or chronic diseases will be entitled reimbursement of more than Rs.500/- p.m.

Instructions issued vide Govt. Letter No.2/59/88-1HB-III dated 17.7.1992 for reimbursement of expenses incurred on the treatment of ten chronic diseases as out-door patient may be treated amended to this extent.

4. The Board would issue certificates to all employees of the  
Government/Private Sectors requesting medical examination by the Board for the first  
entry into the service, in case of commutation of pension on request of the Department,  
issue of chronic disease certificate.

5. The applicant shall submit his request to the president of the Board of  
the District where he is residing. In case the applicant is not residing in the State of  
Haryana then he can get his medical examination to the nearest District of his place of  
residence.

6. The Board shall send the Medical Report directly to the concerned  
department and a copy to the office of Director General Health Services, Haryana  
through registered post.

7. Fee would be charged as prescribed by State Government time to time.
8. If any applicant want his medical examination to be conducted by the special medical board (Medical Board sits on any day except first and third Friday of the month), the permission will be granted by the Civil Surgeon on the request of applicant.

Note:- If any person aggrieved by the decision of the Board may request Director General Health Services Haryana for re-examination by the Medical Board constituted at PGIMS, Rohtak. The Director General Health Services, Haryana will forward the request to the PGIMS, Rohtak alongwith a copy of the certificate issued by the Board for re-examination. The report of PGIMS, Rohtak would be final and no further re-examination shall be allowed.

**Subject: Liberalization of delegation of powers with respect to advance and reimbursement of medical claims of Haryana Government Employees/pensions and their dependants.**

Kindly refer on the subject cited above.

2. The Government of Haryana is providing facility of medical advance and medical reimbursement on expenditure incurred on the treatment of the Government Employees/Pensions and their dependants but they are finding difficulty in getting the medical advance and reimbursement of medical bills in time.

3. I am directed and to say that the State Government has reviewed the medical policy in order to facilitate the medical treatment of the beneficiary, and decided to liberalize the delegation of powers with respect to advance and reimbursement of medical claims of Haryana Government Employees/Pensioners/family pensioners & their dependants which is explained as under:-

a. Reimbursement of Medical Claim.

Sr. No.	Name of Office	Powers for Medical Reimbursement
1	Head of Office	Rs.1,00,000/- (Rs. One Lac)
2	Head of Department	Rs.5,00,000/- (Rs. Five Lacs)
3	Administrative Department	Full Power

b. Medical Advance

Sr. No.	Name of Office	Powers for Medical Advance
1	Head of Office	Rs.100000/- (Rs. One Lac)
2	Head of Department	Rs.500000/- (Rs. Five Lacs)
3	Administrative Department	Full Power




The instructions for sanction of medical advance is as under:-


- i. In case of Government Hospital, an advance of 90% of the estimate will be allowed.
- ii. In case of Government approved Private Hospitals which are allowed at PGI Chd. Rates+75% of the balance amount, an advance of 75% of the estimate on non-package rate/s, however, 90% of the estimate on the identified Package rates notified by the State Government time to time will be allowed.
- iii. In case of Government approved private hospitals which are allowed at PGI Chd. Rates, an advance of 50% will be allowed, however, 90% of the amount will be allowed as advance in case of identified package rate/s notified by the State Government.
- iv. Other terms & conditions related to the advance mentioned in para 10 of the reimbursement policy dated 06.05.2005 shall remain applicable. Other instructions related to the advance except medical reimbursement policy issued dated 06.05.2005 will be superseded.

I am directed to invite your attention to the Haryana Government letter No. 2/289/1HBIII-89, dated 4.9.89 vide which the benefit of reimbursement of medical charges in connection with fixing of dentures was allowed to its Government employees and their dependents as well as to the State Government's pensioners and their spouses. The State Government on re-consideration have now decided to revise the rates of fixing dentures as under:-

Subject: Medical Treatment Reimbursement- Time Limit for preferring claims.

Sir,  
 I am directed to invite your attention to this office circular No. 2/401-1113-111-80, dated 6.3.1980 on the subject cited above.

2. The matter regarding time limit for preferring claims for reimbursement of medical expenses incurred by the government employees/officers on their own treatment or on the treatment of their dependants has been further considered by the Government and it has been decided that the Secretary of the Administrative Department concerned shall be competent to sanction medical claims submitted after 6 months but within a period of 12 months from the date of completion of treatment without referring the same to the Health Department. The medical claims submitted after a period of 12 months from the date of completion of treatment shall be referred to the Health Department in order to curb the tendency of unnecessary delay in submission of medical claims. The Health Department will entertain such medical claims only after strict scrutiny and in such exceptional cases where there are genuine mitigating circumstances i.e. like the death of the employee resulting in delay in submitting claims etc. These instructions shall come into force with immediate effect.

Sir,

I am directed to invite your kind attention towards Haryana Govt. letter No. 1069-USFP-Cell-69 dated 26.2.1969 on the subject cited above and to say that the condition of dependency or wholly dependent in case of spouse was dispensed with and these instructions were modified vide Haryana Government letter No. 4197-USFP-Cell70/24708, dated 11<sup>th</sup> September, 1970 to this extent that the State Government employees are entitled to claim reimbursement of medical expenses of spouse irrespective of his/her source of income. Subsequently some confusion arose in this matter on the issuance of letter-dated 29.8.85 (that ceiling of the income i.e Rs.750/-per month is also applicable for spouse) though the letter-dated 11.9.1970 is still in operation. However now, it is again clarified that letter dated 11.9.70 is still in operation and State Govt. employees are eligible to claim medical reimbursement of spouse irrespective of his/her source of income.


2. State Govt. has also decided to include fully dependent sisters residing with the Govt. Employees in the definition of family for the purpose of medical reimbursement.

3. It has also been decided to increase the ceiling of income of dependents from Rs.750/- to Rs.3500/- per month for the purpose of medical reimbursement.

4. The decision mentioned in Para No 2 and 3 above will be affected with immediate effect.





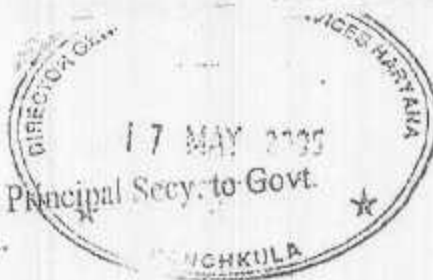

Subject: Review of Reimbursement Policy.

Sir,

I have been directed to invite your attention to the subject mentioned above and to state that in the light of orders of the Hon'ble High Court dated 21.8.2003 given in bunch cases pending in the court, it was felt by the Government that the present Reimbursement Policy of the State Govt. needs certain changes in view of the court orders, issuance of large number of instructions with the passage of time and to avoid the unnecessary delay in clearing the medical claims of serving and retired employees of State Government. The matter was under active consideration of the Govt. and now in consultation with the Finance Department, Government have decided to formulate a new Reimbursement Policy which will be applicable to all Haryana Government Employees /Pensioners /Dependents. The salient features of the new policy are as under:-

1. It will be governed by the Punjab Medical Attendance Rules, 1940 and regulations/instructions issued from time to time by the State Government.

2. Government Hospitals:

- (i) Full reimbursement will be allowed for treatment in all the Government Hospitals in the State of Haryana, U.T. Chandigarh ( i.e.PGI Chandigarh, General Hospital Sector-16, Medical College, Sector-32 and Dispensaries etc.) and AIIMS , New Delhi.
- (ii) Full reimbursement will be allowed for treatment in all the Government Hospitals located outside the State of Haryana subject to the condition that the claimant would produce a certificate from the Medical Superintendent/Head of that Institution

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declaring it as a Government run hospital/  
institution.

(iii) Full reimbursement will be allowed for treatment in all the Government Medical Colleges located in the country subject to the condition that the claimant would produce certificate duly signed by the Medical Superintendent of that institution declaring that it is a Government run Medical College/ Hospital.

(iv) Lab Tests/Investigations

If the Lab Tests/Investigations for Indoor /Chronic disease patients are not available in the Government Hospitals in the state of Haryana and out side the State of Haryana, then the reimbursement will be allowed equal to PGI, Chandigarh rates after obtaining the non-availability certificate. The instructions issued by the State Government vide letter No. 2/73/87-1HBIII dated 23.5.1988 stands superceded.

Note Admission charges, diet charges, Telephone Charges and other items not covered under medicines would not be reimbursable.

3. Approved Hospitals

a. The reimbursement on the expenditure incurred for treatment in any of the non govt. hospital out of the 20 hospitals approved vide govt. letter No.2/296/86-1HBIII, dated 19<sup>th</sup> November, 1986 with the concurrence of Finance Department vide their U.O.No. 56/80/86-6FD-II/4309/4588, dated 22<sup>nd</sup> October, 1986 and also for the expenditure incurred for treatment in any of the non govt. hospital out of the 7 hospitals approved vide govt. letter No. 2/206/2002-1HUII, dated 8.1.2003 shall be made at the rate equal to P.G.I., Chandigarh rates. A list of these 27 hospitals is annexed as Annexure 'A' for ready reference. It is clarified that for expenditure on treatment in any of the govt. hospitals out of these 27 hospitals reimbursement shall be governed by the provision in para 2 (ii) and 2(iii) above.



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b. The reimbursement on expenditure incurred on treatment taken in the remaining approved hospitals shall be on such terms and conditions as were mentioned in the instructions of the Govt. issued at the time of grant of approval to such hospitals.

A list of the names of such approved hospitals alongwith the date of grant of approval is enclosed as Annexure 'B' for ready reference.

c. For the purpose of entitlement of General/Private Ward, the basic pay below Rs. 10,500/- for general ward and above 10,500 for private ward will be allowed as per PGI, Chandigarh rates list and reimbursement will be allowed for general ward/private ward treatments accordingly

d. The patients taking treatment in the above mentioned approved hospitals should take permission from the Civil Surgeon concerned.

e. Expenditure on the treatment taken in the branches of the approved hospitals will not be reimbursed unless separate approval is given by the State Government.

f. The Cost of hearing aid is reimbursable as per State Government letter No. 2/185/2000-1HBIII dated 18.12.2001 irrespective of the options of the claimant.

g. The Cost of denture is reimbursable as per State Government letter No. 2/6/28/2003-1HBIII dated 7.7.2004 irrespective of the options of the claimant.

h. The cost of various artificial appliances are reimbursable as per the State Government letter No. 2526-1HBII-80 dated 15.7.1985 irrespective of the options of the claimant.

- i. The actual cost of the intraocular lenses is reimbursable and instructions dated 8.2.1994 stand superceded.

#### 4. Un approved Hospitals

- a). The reimbursement for the treatment taken in an emergency in an un approved hospital will be allowed equal to PGI, Chandigarh rates with the approval of the Finance Department.
- b) Head of the department in consultation with concerned Civil Surgeon is competent to certify an emergency.

#### 5. Kidney Donors:

The reimbursement on the expenditure for operating upon the donor is permissible only if the treatment has been taken in a Government/approved hospital as it is a planned procedure.

#### 6. Expenditure on Medicines:

The reimbursement of the expenditure incurred on the purchase of medicines for a period of seven days after discharge from the hospital will also be allowed.

#### 7. Physiotherapy

The expenditure incurred on the Physiotherapy, while the patient remained indoor is reimbursed fully for treatment taken at Government Hospitals/approved hospitals.

#### 8. Counter Signatures:

To expedite reimbursement, the OPD bills related to the chronic diseases will be counter signed by the Civil Surgeon/Medical Superintendent and there would be no need to come to the office of Director General, Health Services, Haryana, Panchkula for this purpose.

#### 9. Vaccination:

The reimbursement of the charges on the treatment for immunization and prophylactic purposes for Hepatitis, Rabies and Meningitis is allowed irrespective of the option of the claimant after obtaining the non availability of certificate and physician should certify an essential certificate that the vaccine has been administered in the Government hospital.

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**10. Advance:**

**Employees:**

a) Utilization certificate should be obtained by the Administrative Department/Head of Department within three months of the sanction of the advance for the treatment failing which penal interest shall be charged.

b) No advance shall be admissible to the adhoc /contractual employees.

c) Advance to temporary employees shall be given subject to the submission of one surety of any regular State Government Employee.

**Pensioners:**

An affidavit alongwith two sureties of permanent State Government Employees should be taken before sanction of the advance for the treatment.

A utilization certificate should be submitted by the pensioner within three months of the sanction of the advance for the treatment failing which penal interest shall be charged.



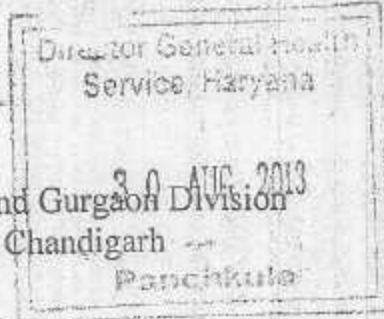

Subject:- Regarding implementation of package rates in the empanelled hospitals.

Sir

I have been directed to invite your attention to the subject mentioned above and to state that the Government has decided to implement of package rates for providing treatment to the Haryana Government employees/pensioners and their dependents in the Approved Private Hospitals. The package rates have been worked out for a few common procedures in consultation with various empanelled hospitals. This has been done for convenience of the employees as well as Private Health Institutions. This measure also seeks to rationalise the charges across the various institutions. Under these new guidelines, 21 package major procedure have been fixed. The details are given as under:-

**Guidelines for implementing of Package rates.**

All the empanelled Hospitals will charge the employees as per the fixed package charges and these will be fully reimbursable to the employees/ pensioners and their dependents.

2. Definitions.

- i) "Hospital": A Private Hospital approved by the State Govt.
- ii) "Package Rate": A lump sum amount charged by the approved hospitals for packages/procedures.
- iii) "Day Care": Day Care means indoor stay in the Hospital duly certified by the concerned hospital.
- iv) 1, 3, 5, and 10 days package rate means the number of days a patient remain in hospital for a particular surgery normally without any complication.

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- v) "ICU/CCU charges": This is meant for Packages only that includes all charges like ventilator, monitoring, nursing, gas, drugs, etc. during the post operative period in normal situations.

The guidelines for the implementations of the package rates as under:

- a. The empanelled hospitals shall charge at package rates from employees/pensioners and their dependents to provide treatment on these 21 procedures listed in the table below. It is not applicable to procedures, which are not covered under packages rates.
- b. "The Package rate" shall mean and include lump sum cost of inpatient treatment/day care/ diagnosis procedures for which a patient goes to hospital. This includes all charges pertaining to a particular treatment/ procedure including admission charges, visit fee/consultation fee, patient's diet, monitoring charges, preoperative investigation charges, investigation charges, operation charges, anesthesia charges, operation theater charges, procedural charges / surgeon's fee, cost of surgical disposals and all sundries used during hospitalization, consumables, gas charges, surgical charges, cost of medicine used during hospitalization/ physiotherapy charges, Nursing care charges for its services, cost of implants except where mentioned against each rate etc.
- c. The cost of coronary stents shall be allowed up to a maximum of three stents.
- d. The Package rates, mentioned in column No. 3 of the table are same both for General ward and Private ward entitlement.
- e. In addition to the chargeable amount mentioned at column No. 3 against the package rate, the cost of Room Rent/ ICU/CCU including ventilator Charges including consumables/drugs etc. shall be added with Package rates according to the number of days a patient stays in the hospital e.g. 1,3,5, days etc.
- f. The cost of implants, valves etc are either included in the package rate or shown separately with package rate. Stickers/batch No. etc should be pasted on the bills for the items like implants, stents, valves etc.
- g. The cost of implant shall be charged by the approved Hospital as per actual rates or as per rates fixed by the Govt. time to time whichever is less.

Room rent will include charges for occupation of Bed, diet for the patient charges for water and electricity supply, linen charges, nursing charges, heater charges, A.C charges and routine up keeping etc. Room rent rate is applicable only for 21 package treatments.

- i. Day Care Room rent charges are admissible upto Rs. 500/-
- j. During the treatment in ICCU/ICU, no separate room rent will be admissible.
- k. Semi private ward will be treated as General Ward for the purpose of room rent.
- l. In case of complication resulting in over stay in the hospital that means more than the required number of days for a particular surgery then additional expenditure of additional day incurred on room rent drugs and consumable, the cost of investigation and minor procedures performed during the over stay shall be reimbursed as per the instructions applicable to the hospital from where the patient had taken treatment i.e. PGI Chandigarh rate or PGI Chandigarh + 75% of the balance. A separate bill shall be issued for the period of over stay.

Sir,

I am directed to invite your attention to this office circular No. 2/44/97-1 HBIII dated 10.10.97 and to say that the instructions were issued by this office vide above mentioned letter dated 10.10.97 vide which it was advised that the medical bills submitted by the government employees for treatment in the hospitals approved by the State Government would be referred to the DGHS Haryana for work out before the reimbursement of the medical bills. This matter has been reconsidered and in order to cut down the avoidable delay in this regard and to expedite the reimbursement of medical claims the government has now decided that in future HODs concerned will be competent to get such medical bills worked out at their own level and the medical bill need not be referred to the DGHS Haryana for work out. In case any HOD wants any clarification on any specific point/procedure, only such cases be referred to the DGHS for advice/clarification.

Government has also reconsidered the matter regarding grant of ex-post facto sanction for the treatment in government/approved hospitals without being referred to such hospitals by the civil surgeon concerned. It has now been decided that now onwards HOD concerned will be fully competent to grant ex-post facto approval for treatment by the government employees/their dependant(s) in government/approved hospitals. Therefore, no cases for ex-post facto approval in this regard need be referred to DGHS Haryana. These instructions will supersede all

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previous instructions issued by the government in this regard and will come into force with immediate effect.



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

Under these new guidelines, 152 (Which includes already notified 21 packages/implants) packages major procedures including implants have been fixed. The details are given as under:-

**Guidelines for Implementation of Package/Implant rates**

1. The State Government has categorized the approved private hospitals for the purpose of implementing package rates, which are explained as under:-
  - a. There are three types of rates applicable to different types of hospitals which are categorized on the basis of accreditation of hospitals namely Non-NABH/Non-JCI, NABH & JCI.
  - b. All the State Government empanelled private hospitals will charge from the employees as per the fixed package/implant rates mentioned in Annexure-I&II and these will be fully reimbursable to the employees/pensioners and their dependents except on few JCI package rates (Annexure-I) wherein the reimbursement on some of the amount will be borne by the beneficiary as mentioned against the package rates.
2. Definitions.
  - i) "Hospital": A Private Hospital approved by the State Govt.
  - ii) "Package Rate": A lump sum amount charged by the approved hospitals for packages/procedures.
  - iii) "Day Care": Day Care means indoor stay in the Hospital duly certified by the concerned hospital.
  - iv) "NABH": means hospitals possessing certificate of National Accreditation Board for Hospitals & Healthcare Providers.
  - v) "JCI": means hospitals possessing certificate of Joint Commission International.
  - vi) 1, 2, 3,4, 5, 7,10 and 14 days package rate means the number of days a patient remain in hospital for a particular surgery normally without any complication.
  - vii) "ICU/CCU charges": This is meant for Packages only that includes all charges like ventilator, monitoring, nursing, gas, drugs, etc. during the post operative period in normal situations.
3. The guidelines for the implementations of the package rates are as under:



- a. The empanelled hospitals shall provide treatment on 152 procedures listed in the table below at the prescribed package rates and implants and charge accordingly from the employees/pensioners and their dependents. These package rates are applicable only for given procedures.
- b. A list of fixed 152 package rates/Implants (which includes already notified 21 package/implant) applicable to non NABH/Non JCI Hospitals, NABH accredited and JCI accredited hospitals is attached at **Annexure-I**.
- c. A list of fixed cost of implant applicable to all Government/ empanelled private hospitals is attached at **Annexure-II**. Wherever the cost is not fixed, the actual cost of the implant is fully reimbursable.
- d. "The Package rate" shall mean and include lump sum cost of inpatient treatment/day care/ diagnosis procedures for which a patient goes to hospital. This includes all charges pertaining to a particular treatment/ procedure including admission charges, visit fee/consultation fee, patient's diet, monitoring charges, preoperative investigation charges, investigation charges, operation charges, anesthesia charges, operation theater charges, procedural charges/ surgeon's fee, cost of surgical disposals and all sundries used during hospitalization, consumables, gas charges, surgical charges, cost of medicine used during hospitalization/ physiotherapy charges, nursing care charges for its services etc.
- e. The cost of coronary stents shall be allowed up to a maximum of three stents at a time.
- f. The Package rates mentioned in column no. 3, 4, 5 in table (**Annexure-I**) are same both for General ward and Private wards entitlement.
- g. In addition to the chargeable amount mentioned against the package rate, the cost of Room Rent/ ICU/CCU including ventilator Charges shall be charged separately as mentioned in column no. 7 of **Annexure-I**. No extra cost of consumables/ drugs etc. will be allowed during the stay in ICU/CCU or in the room because these are part of the package rates as mentioned para-d above. The room rent/ICU/CCU charges are according to the number of days a patient stays in the hospital e.g. 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 7, 10 and 14 days etc as per the prescribed package. If the number of days exceed the numbers of days stays in package rates then the instruction at Para-m shall be applicable.
- h. The cost of implant shall be charged by the approved Hospital separately as per the rates fixed by the Govt. time to time or whichever is less. The cost of implants/ valves etc has been shown separately in column number 6 in **Annexure-I** and also in **Annexure-II**. Stickers/batch No. etc related to items like implants, stents, and valves should be pasted/indicated on the bills of the hospital.
- i. The entitlement for Room Rent for indoor treatment would be as under:-

Room rent will include charges for occupation of bed, diet for the patient, charges for water and electricity supply, linen charges, nursing charges, heater charges, A.C. charges and routine up housekeeping etc.

- j. Day Care Room rent charges are admissible up to Rs. 500/-
- k. During the treatment in ICU/CCU, no separate room rent will be admissible.
- l. Semi private ward will be treated as General Ward for the purpose of room rent.

- m. In case of complication resulting in over stay in the hospital that means more than the required number of days for a particular surgery then additional expenditure incurred on room rent shall be reimbursed as mentioned above. drugs and consumables are fully reimbursable, the hospital charges of investigation, procedures etc performed during the over stay shall be reimbursed as per the rates under the instructions applicable to the hospital from where the patient has taken treatment i.e. PGI Chandigarh rate or PGI Chandigarh + 75% of the balance as the case may be. The hospital shall issue separate bill for the period of over stay.
- n. The following table shall be the part of the bill of the hospitals in case of package rates:-

**Note:-** In case of over stay due to complication as mentioned in para-m above, the charges shall be indicated separately in the main bill.

- o. It will be the responsibility of the beneficiary to produce identity card of the Department to the concerned hospital in order to establish the fact that he/she is employee/pensioner of State Government of Haryana
- p. It will be the responsibility of the concerned hospital to ask for ID card from the employee/pensioner and to explain to them is procedure covered under the package rates or non-package. In case the hospital charges over and above the package rate, when there is no complication and patient discharged within the stipulated numbers of days mentioned against each package rate, the balance amount over and above the package rate shall be refunded to the beneficiary and amended bill be issued immediately. In case this is not done within month the hospital will be liable for de-empament.
- q. It will be the responsibility of the hospital to provide accreditation certificate and further renewal certificate well before the expiry date otherwise it will be considered as non-NABH /non-JCI as the case may be for the purpose of charging lump-sum rate charging from patient for the package rate.
- r. **Fixed ICU & ICU+ Ventilator Charges applicable to Non-Package treatment:-** The per day charges related to the ICU and ICU + Ventilator have been fixed as mentioned at Sr. No. 153 & 154 of the Annexure-I, which are applicable for non package treatment i.e. Medical and Surgical Emergencies. 75% of the balance amount will not be allowed for ICU & ICU+ Ventilator charges even the hospital is approved.

- 5. All earlier instructions related to fixed package/implant rates stand superseded; however, the notification for 21 packages/implants rates shall remain applicable till this policy will come into force from June 1<sup>st</sup>, 2015. These Rates may be Downloaded from the Health Department Web Site (<http://harvanahealth.nic.in>).
