Report on Continuing Nursing Education (CNE) Programme

Title: “Enhancing Quality of Life through Holistic Care Pathway in Limb Amputation – A Patient-Centered Approach”

Venue: National Institute for Locomotor Disabilities (NILD), Kolkata

Date: 6th–7th August 2026.

A two-day Continuing Nursing Education (CNE) programme on “**Enhancing Quality of Life through Holistic Care Pathway in Limb Amputation – A Patient-Centered Approach**” was organized at NILD, Kolkata, on **6th and 7th August 2026**. The programme focused on strengthening the knowledge and practical skills of healthcare professionals and nursing students in providing holistic and patient-centered care to individuals with limb amputation.

The programme commenced with registration, pre-test, and an inaugural ceremony. The academic sessions covered important aspects of amputation care, including **epidemiology and indications of amputation, pre-operative and post-operative nursing care, patient-centered care, pain and phantom limb management, rehabilitation, psychological support, and prosthetic and orthotic interventions**.

Practical sessions and skill demonstrations were also conducted on **stump assessment and care, stump bandaging, desensitization, patient transfer, early mobilization, crutch walking, and wheelchair maneuvering**. Participants also visited the **Prosthesis & Orthosis Department** to gain practical exposure to rehabilitation services and assistive interventions.

The programme concluded with a **post-test, participant feedback, valedictory session, and distribution of certificates**, followed by a vote of thanks. Overall, the CNE programme provided participants with valuable theoretical knowledge and practical skills for delivering comprehensive and holistic care to individuals with limb amputation.

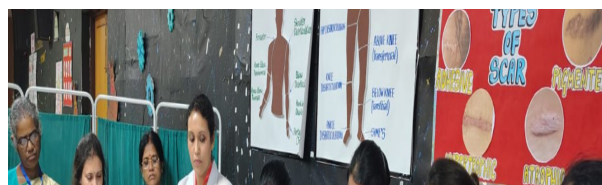
