- Highly dispersed low population settlements



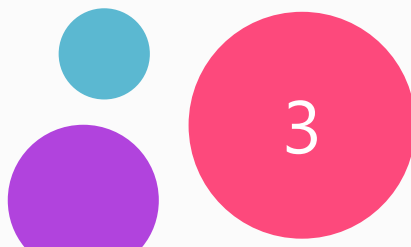
Local Government

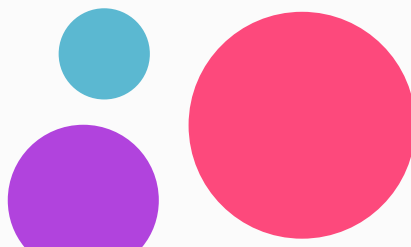




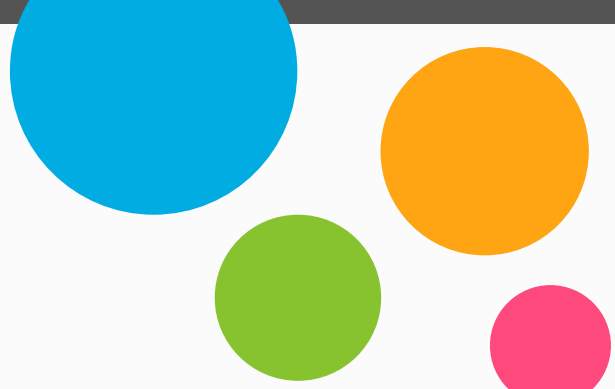
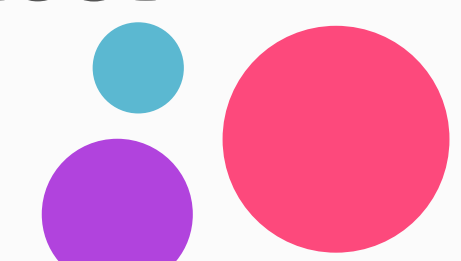
LOCALIZING SDG AT LOCAL/VILLAGE LEVEL

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- **Most targets and indicators of the SDGs are to be achieved at the local level**
 - **Consultative Workshops on LIF was organized at every District with Village Council members**
 - **Followed by Technical Meeting with Line Departments & SIRD&PR**
 - **The indicators were finalized to form the Local Indicator Framework (LIF)**
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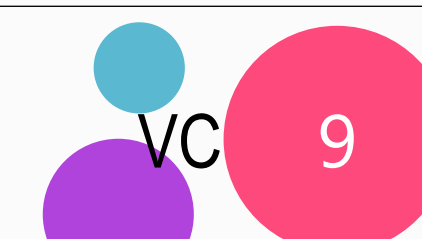


Local Indicator Framework

- LIF is composed of 112 indicators.
- Indicators are differentiated into two Data Sets –
 1. Regular/Core data set to be obtained from Departments (57 indicators).
 2. Community Driven data set to be obtained from Village Development Committees through District Planning Committees (55 indicators).
- Indicators mapped with CSS.
- Community Driven data set's additional purpose is to induce community engagement in the attainment of SDG.

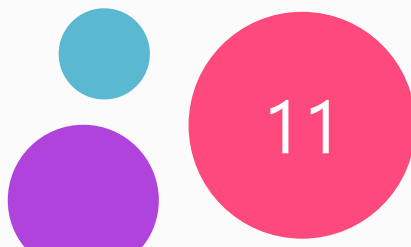

Roadmap

July 1st half

- Convene meeting of State Level Monitoring Committee
 - 1.Sensitizing stakeholder Departments on the importance and implication of SDG reports.
 - 2.Discuss SDG integration avenues.
 - 3.Onboarding all stakeholder Departments for LIF and reform action plan arising out of LIF.

July 2nd half up to September

- Commence collection of SDG LIF data as per data sources:-
 - 1.Core data set from line Departments.
 - 2.Community driven/engagement data set from Village Councils/Village Development Committees.
- SDG training for villages through SIRD&PR module (SDG, CSS, 160 MT)
- SDG thematic application & activities through colleges and university using R&D Cell, EK Cell etc.
- Initiate low cost, no cost activities.

October	<ul style="list-style-type: none">● Gram Sabha will prepare/approve GPDP integrated with local SDG and thematic village plan.
November	<ul style="list-style-type: none">● DPC will attempt convergence of Village, Block & District Level Plans GPDP with CSS.
December	<ul style="list-style-type: none">● Convene SLMC on SDG and MPI for policy implication, reform action plan, CSS convergence and CSR matchmaking.
January 2023	<ul style="list-style-type: none">● Incentives to good performing villages in SDG ranking. Funding through P&PID. Technical assistance from line Dept.● Specific intervention based on reform action plan for low performing villages.● Budgeting for SDG integration and reform action plan for next FY.● Updation of e-Gram Swaraj



Suggestions

- Integration of SDG in the GPDP chapterization.
- GPDP format should be in line with e-gramswaraj
- Support required from other relevant ministries of Government of India Gram Panchayat/Village Council should be mandated the implementing agency in all the CSS.
- GPPFT should be manded to prepare AAP under MGNREGS in line with GPDP.
