- CSS convergence with GPDP.

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
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
# **INTERNAL MONITORING**

# Most targets and indicators of the SDGs are to be achieved at the local level

- Consultative Workshops on LIF was organized at every **District with Village Council members**
- Followed by Technical Meeting with Line Departments & **SIRD&PR**
- The indicators were finalized to form the Local Indicator Framework (LIF)

# Local Indicator Framework

- LIF is composed of 112 indicators.
- Indicators are differentiated into two Data Sets
  - 1. Regular/Core data set to be obtained form Departments (57 indicators).
  - 2. Community Driven data set to be obtained from Village **Development Committees through District Planning Committees** (55 indicators).
- Indicators mapped with CSS.
- •Community Driven data set's additional purpose is to induce community engagement in the attainment of SDG.
