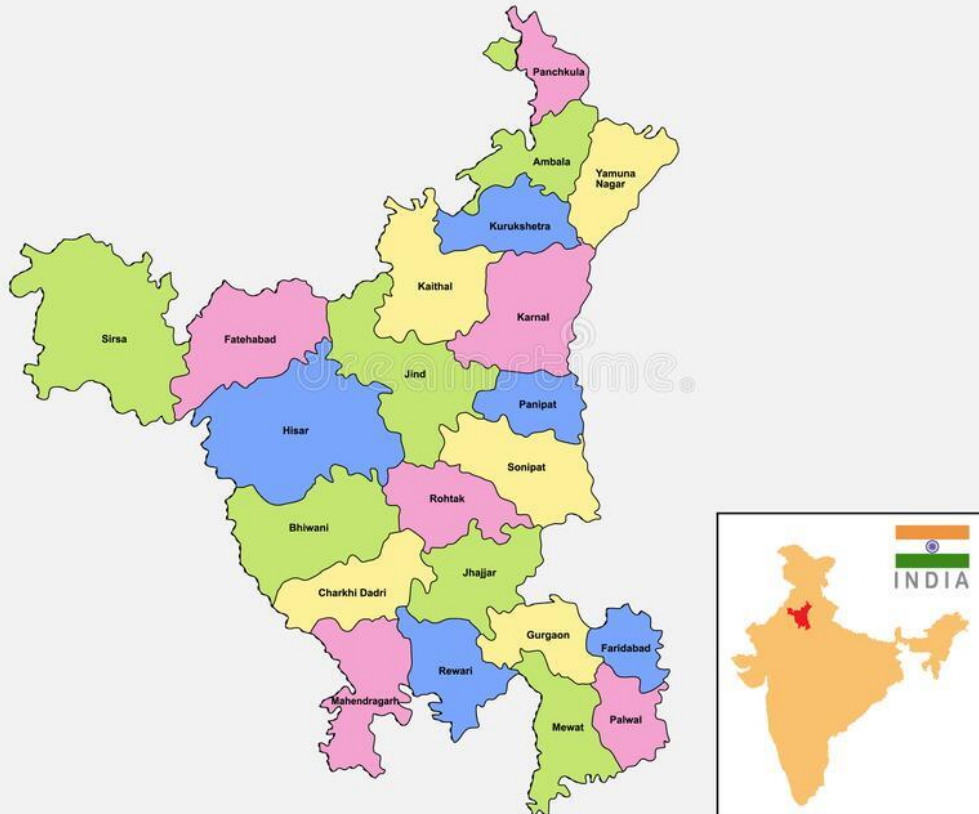

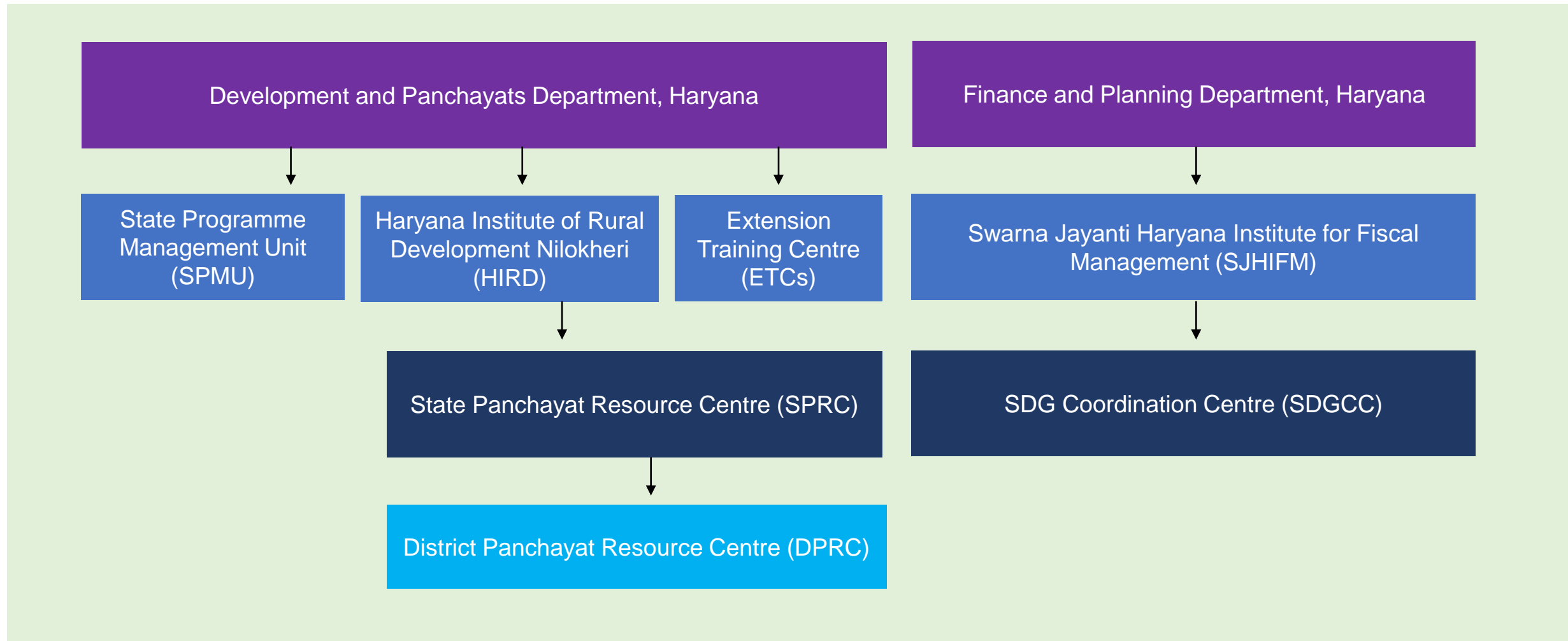

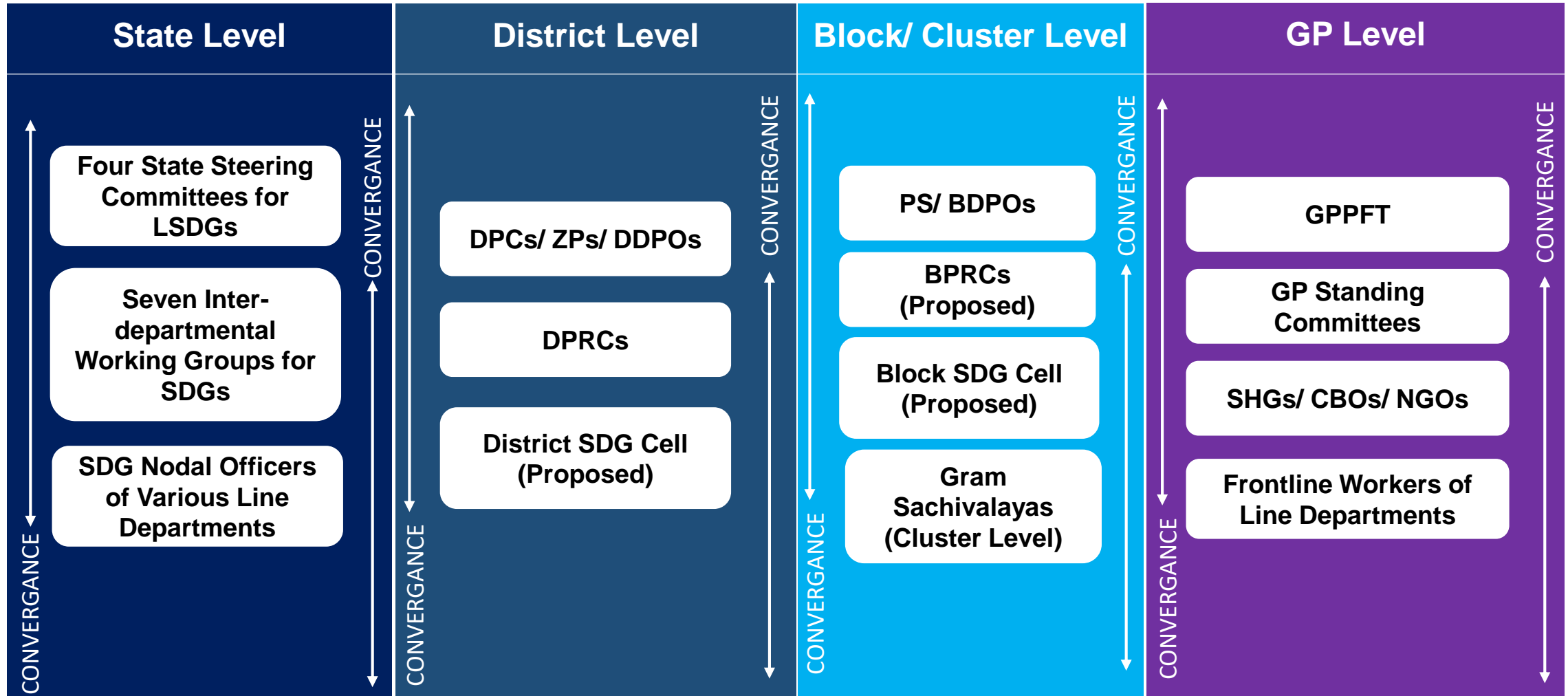
# Guiding Policy Framework

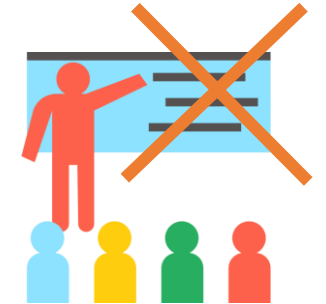

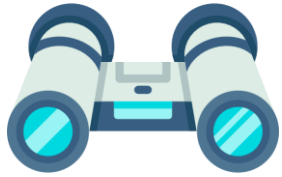

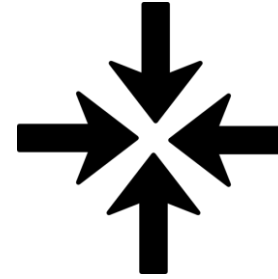
Resource Mapping of State Budget and State and Central Schemes for funding opportunities

Integrating the thematic SDGs into GPDP through thematic gram sabhas, strengthening of sectoral GP standing committees, handholding support through GPPFT and SHGs/ CBOs, Training ERs and Panchayat Functionaries on LSDGs etc.

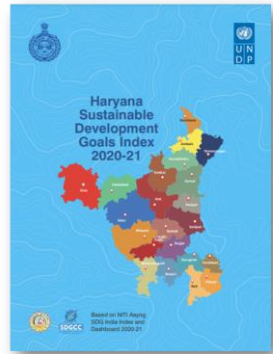
Total Number of Women enrolled in SHGs :- 542090

- Strengthen community-based monitoring and social audits



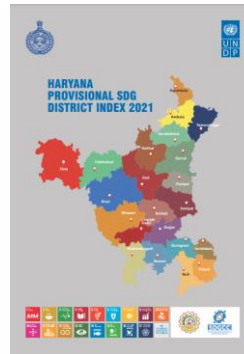

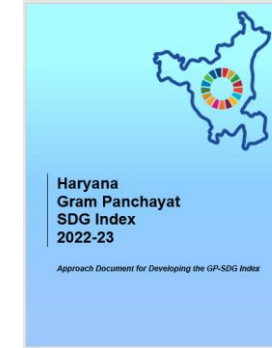

Special recognition to high performing officers, trainers and master trainers of line departments for progress on thematic SDGs

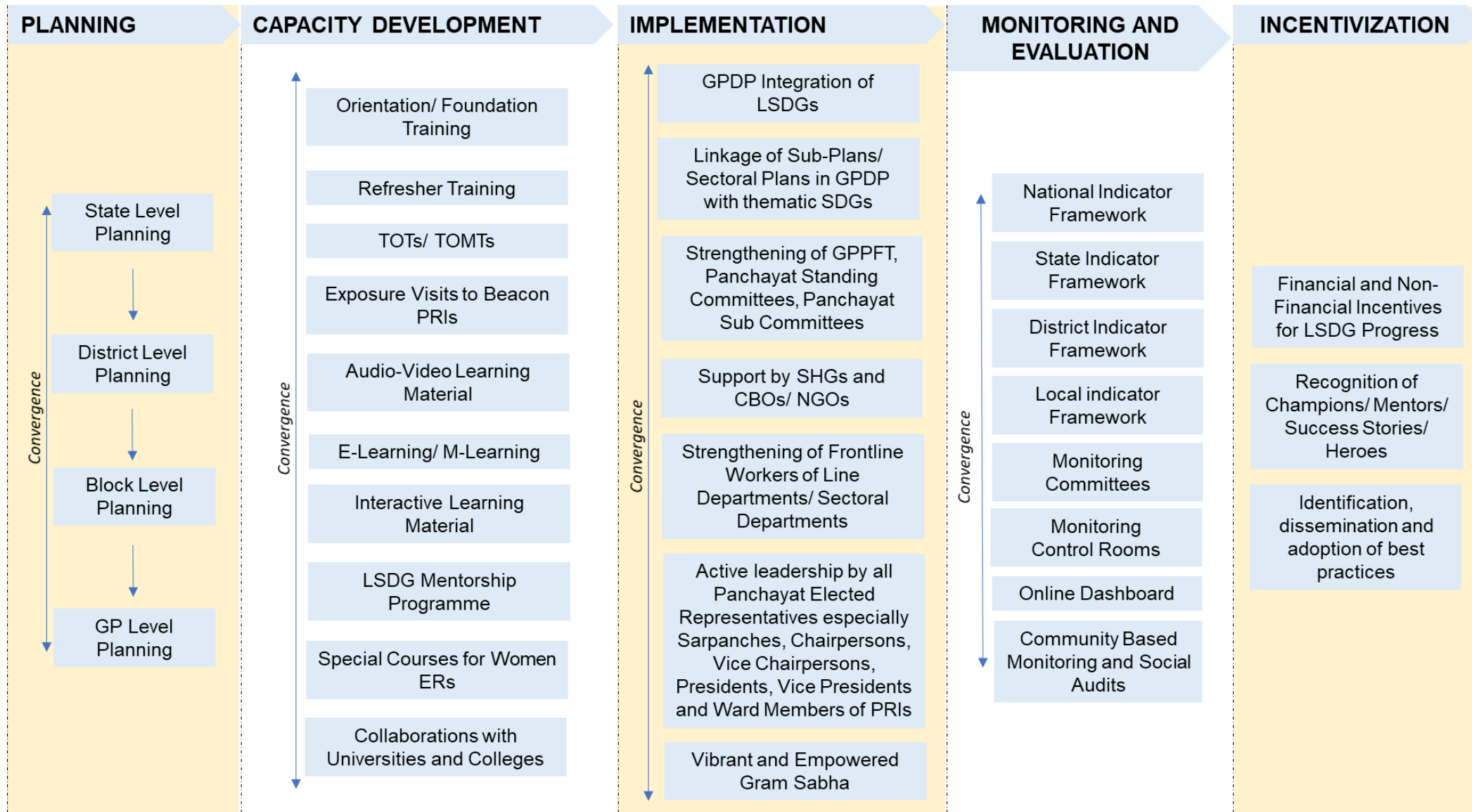


Designing financial rewards for high rating on Panchayat Indices
