







- Government of Gujarat formed thematic working groups

The progress made during the Millennium Development Goals (MDG) period has to carry forward to Sustainable DevelopmentAgenda2030, ensuring that the most vulnerable are not leftbehind. As per the State SDG Index, the Score of Gujarat is 54 while score of Bhavnagar district is 35


