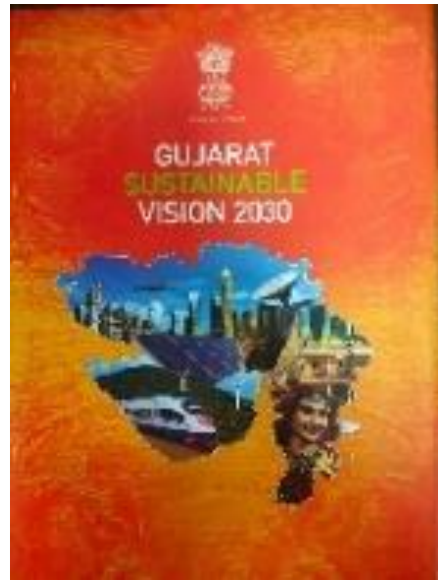
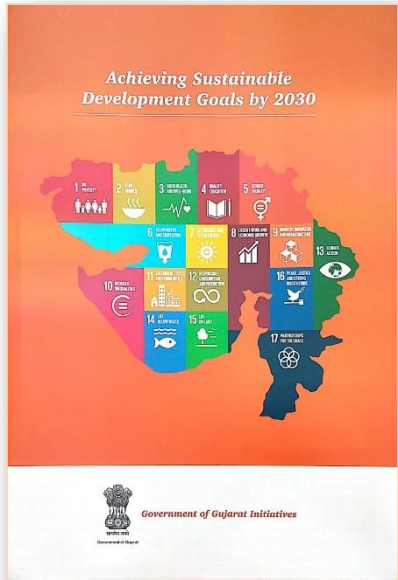

- Government of Gujarat formed **7 thematic working groups**
- Monitored by **High Power Committee** Chaired By Chief Secretary
- **Nodal departments** were responsible for specific theme, goal & indicators.
- Based on thematic reports, Planning Division developed **Gujarat Vision 2030 Document** aligned with SDGs (July 2018).
- The report customized state specific **328 indicators with 2030 targets**
- Also given **Strategies and Action Plan**
- These indicators are being called **State Indicators framework (SIF)**.

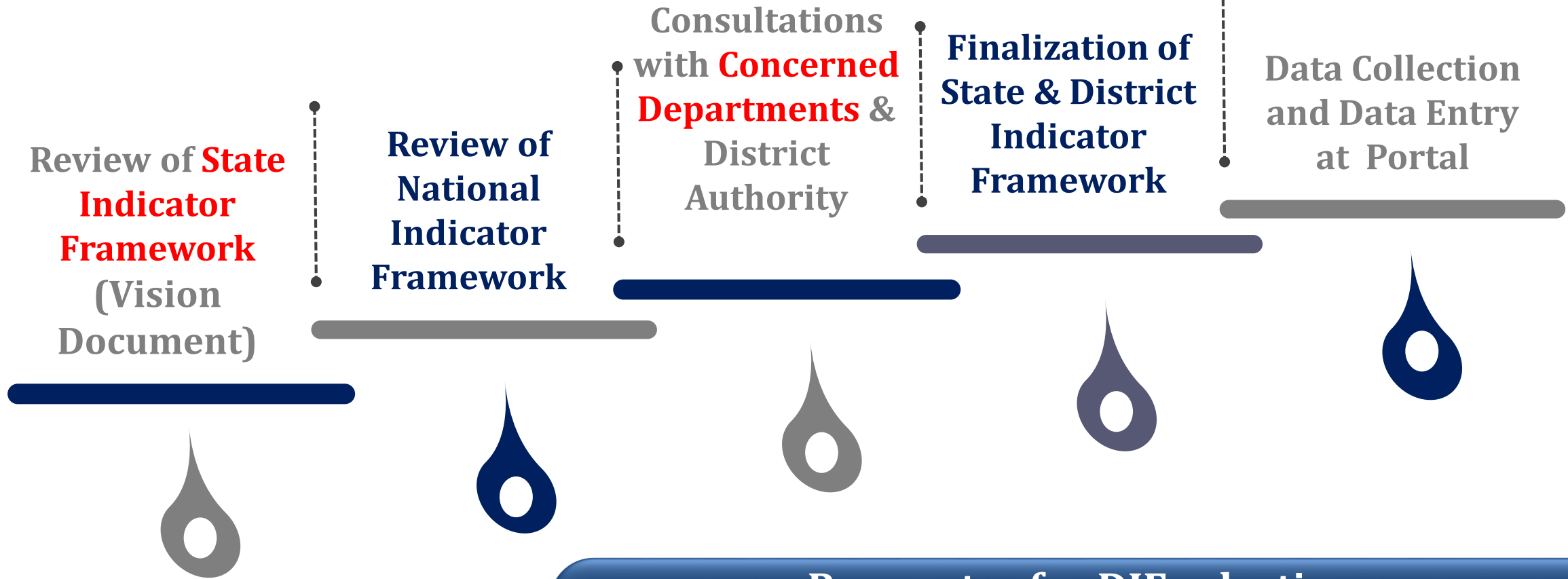

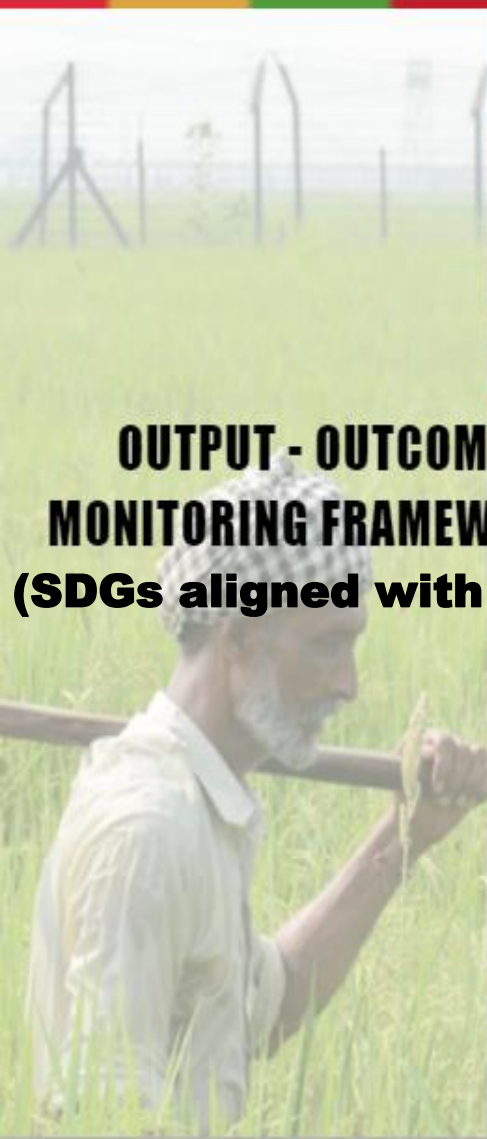

## Composite Index Score



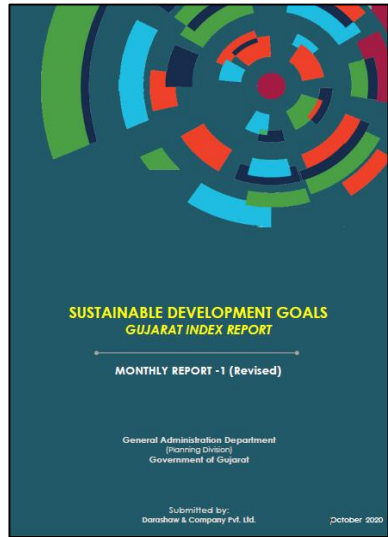

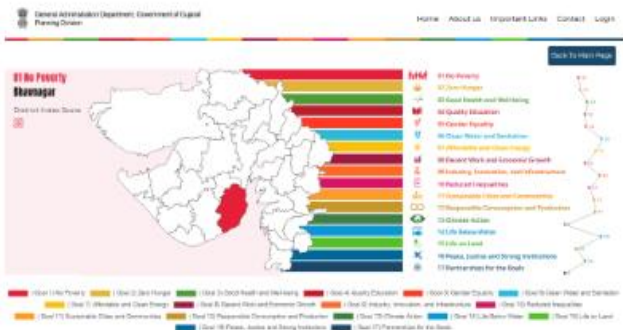

## Performance of Goal 1 in Bhavnagar District

The objective of SDG is to end poverty in all its forms everywhere. Eradicating poverty in all its forms remains one of the greatest challenges faced by humanity. While the number of people living in extreme poverty dropped by more than half between 1990 and 2015, too many are still struggling for the most basic human needs. The progress made during the Millennium Development Goals (MDG) period has to be carried forward to Sustainable Development Agenda 2030, ensuring that the most vulnerable are not left behind. As per the State SDG Index, the Score of Gujarat is 54 while the score of Bhavnagar district is 35.

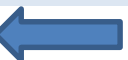

- Generating more livelihood opportunities for inclusive growth
- Ensuring at-least one employable skill for all youth and adults
- Strengthening eco-system for promoting skill development and entrepreneurship at Village level
- Ensuring housing, drinking water and sanitation to all for improving quality of life at every village
- Social protection for poor and vulnerable population
- Capacity building of village communities for development activities
- Enhancing mobility of poor

## Theme 2: Healthy village

- Eliminating all forms of corruption and bribery
- Speedy justice to all through panchayat
- IEC programme for awareness generations

- Ensuring good services through Common Service Centres (CSCs)
- Sub Centres availability at every villages or minimum distance
- Ensuring all weather roads at every villages
- Providing 24X7 quality and affordable power to all



## Theme 9: Engendered Development in Village

- Safeguarding birth of girl child
- Providing equal access to health care, education and development
- Ensuring equal economic opportunities and engagement
- Strengthening women cooperatives and SHGs
- Encouraging women participation in decision making & leadership at GPs
- Spreading awareness on legal support aid available for women
- Comprehensive life cycle approach for improving reproductive, maternal and child healthcare through ASHA worker
