Our Strengths

1.Panchayats are **endowed** with powers & Functions under relevant Law.

2.**Village Secretariats** established with a functionary support of 11 employees drawn from line Departments ,whose activrelated to SDGs.

3. All flagship programmes of the Govt. are channelled throguh "**Nava Ratnalu**", which is implemented through village Secretaries. Good number of SDGs are adressed through Nava Ratnalu.

4. Vibrant SHGs - 3 decades old movement. CBOs are strong, CRP system in place.

5. Panchayats gained experience in GPDP - over **7 years** Andhra Pradesh is the **First State** to get approval of GPDPs and under RGSA support.

- 6. ETCs (3) and DPRcs (13) are supporting the CB & T needs of PRIs
- 7. A resource pool of 1300 RPs is available to train 1,50,000 ERs from PRIs.

8. Rich experience in rolling out Solid Waste Management (SWM) by Gram Panchayats.

Defecencies /weaknesses

1.Participation of **Elected Representatives(ERs)** in the decision making process is not commensurate.

2. Lack of awareness and skillset on the local Governance

3.PRI - SHG interface is missing. VPDPs are not integrated into GPDP.

4.Labour budget under MGNREGS is not a part of GPDP

5.GPDP preparation exercise is still evolving - due to lack of people's participation.

Sailent Features of SDGs in Andhra Pradesh

- □ Standard Operating Procedures have been developed for all indicators and shared with Departments/Districts
- Departmental **Nodal officers** have been identified
- □ The departments advised to identify the related activities/initiatives that push up the SDG performance
- □ GOs(4) have been released by the Chief Secretary for seamless data entry, monitoring through Portal and Capacity Building
- □ A State Level Coordination Committee has been established
- District Collectors to prepare action plans for improving performance under indicators of concern
- □ AP SIRD and AP HRD institutes are undertaking capacity building exercise for functionaries at all levels including about 5 lakh PRI level functionaries.
- □ The SDG progress is being monitored by Hon"ble Chief Minister and the Chief Secretary on a monthly basis.

- 1. Consultation with UNICEF / UNDP & IIM Visakhapatnam
- 2. APSIRD & PR Developed Training **Modules** for online Training of functionaries on 9 thematic subjects.
- 3.**Online training** is imparted through Microsoft teams on poverty free village and child friendly panchayats.
- 4. Training on "Heathly village" is in progress now, (for all Anganwadi, Asha workers and Medical & health staff, Panchayat Secretaries)
- 5.However, the training for ERs on 9 thematic areas is yet to commence.

Points for consideration by Govt of AP (Towards Localisation of SDGs in PRIs)

1. Prioritisation of SDGs by PRIs.

Flexible Hybrid model depending on the maturity levels of PRIs.

2-4 SDGs at a time every year

Primary Focus on SDGs related to basic civic amenities .

- Water Sufficient Village
- Clean and Green Village
- Self sufficient infrastructutre Village.
- 2. Time lines :
- 3-5 years for iniating activities and reach reasonable progress.
- Coterminous with the tenure of existing elected bodies .

3. Date disaggregation at Panchayat level :

• Line Departments will be instructed to collect and supply data Panchayat wise .

4.SHG -PRI convergence:

• Operational Guidelines to foster activity convergence for synergy.

5.Seamless integartion of SDGs into GPDP frame work:

6. Conveying the true spirit of localization to all line depts.

Instructions to involve ERs in understanding and implementing SDG activities.

7. Augmentation of Resource envelop in PRIs for GPDP, SDGs implementations.

11. CB & T strategy.

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Training **modules** will be finalized in accordance with MoPR guidelines and Niti Ayog indicators.

- **Resource pool of 1300 Resource Persons** will be enganged continusly with periodic orientation.

- Employees will be trained mostly through **online mode** with online test .
- Elected Representatives will be trained in class room as well as in field situations.
- **Exposure visits** will be conducted to best practice /Beacon Panchayats.

12. Functional Committees & Standing Committeess of PRIs:

- These Committees will drive SDG targets.
- Govt will devise a system to improve functioning of Committees
 - ✓ Sitting Fee provision
 - ✓ Community Resource Persons(**CRPs**) to support the Committees.

13.Man power Supprt :

- ✓ Adequate manpower to be positioned at SPRC, DPRCs & BPRCs under Revamped RGSA guidelines -2022.
- ✓ **SDG cells** will be created at SPRC, DPRCs & BPRCs for monitoring & coordination.

14.Incentives /Awards to PRIs:

- As per Revamped Incentivization scheme prescribed by MoPR
- Emphasis and additional weightage will be given to incentivise performance in

core basic functions of Panchayats .(Drinking Water ,Sanitation & Infrastructure
