- State Government has adopted Manipur Vision 2030 and 98 Indicators of 15 goals as State indicators.
- Manipur has developed 'State Vision 2030 Document' as a roadmap for inclusive growth and sustainable development'.
- Manipur vision document 2030 is prepared to address all the basic needs and wants of the grass root community by incorporating their voices from the ground level.
- Document is designed and developed by incorporating 15 SDGs goals and 98 state specific indicators based on inputs given by various stakeholders.

North Eastern Region SDG – Manipur

- In the NER Region SDG 2021 brought out by NITI Aayog, district ranking of 103 districts on SDG performance was carried out.
- In respect of Manipur, 9 districts were included, since segregated data for newly created 7 districts was not available.
- Manipur score was between 62.67 and 71.73- front runner for all districts and performer -Tamenglong District.

- Planning Department is the nodal department for implementation of SDGs in the state.
- Three Committees have been constituted at state and district level for implementation of SDGs:
- State Level Committee on SDGs
- 2. Inter-Departmental Working Group
- 3. District level Working Group

- State level committee is chaired by the chief secretary with all the administrative secretaries as member.
- The committee will monitor targets and goals and achievements bi-annually.
- Inter-departmental working group is chaired by Principal Secretary (Planning) and all the administrative secretaries as member.
- Function of the working group is to carry out state mapping and re-align targets of the various CSS in the line with goals and targets of SDGs and to develop a suitable state indicator in the line of national indicator.
- District level working group is chaired by Deputy Commissioner (DC) of the each district with all the district level officers (DLOs) as a member.
- Function of this working group is to set or re-align targets and monitor achievements of the targets and Goals set under SDGs at the field level.

- Beside these, State Govt. is proposing to set up a district SDG Cell/Unit in the district on pilot basis with the following composition:
- Deputy Commissioner (DC)
- DPO/ SRO/ RO of the Planning Dept.
- District Level Officer of the Line Dept.
- District Statistics Officer
- CEO/ BDO of the Panchayat, ULBs and ADC (for Hill districts)

- PGPs were advised to adopt any one or more of the nine themes of LSDGs in the meeting of the Gram Sabha organized on the occasion of National Panchayati Raj Day, 24th April 2022 and also in the subsequent years.
- Eventually, all GPs will need to adopt and realize all the nine themes of LSDGs so as to attain SDG targets of the country by year 2030.
- The government of Manipur as per the directions of MoPR, is issuing the instructions to help the gram panchayats localize the SDGs by adapting the nine themes to their Gram Panchayat Development Plans (GPDP).
- By linking Panchayat plans to all nine themes of LSDGs, Country can achieve SDG targets at the grassroot level.

- In plan preparation, each PRI has to start with a situation analysis on the existing available data in the GP such as MA, SECC, ICDS, SHG plans, and data of agriculture, animal husbandry, social welfare, education etc. from the block offices/District Offices.
- GPs can also use the SHG demand plans to understand the needs of women.
- The output of this experience should be a status report showing the overall development status of the GP.
- > The report will also indicate the status of the SDG themes in the GP.
