Dear Sir/malow,

As you are aware, various commemorative activities were planned to be carried out by Panchayati Raj Institutions across the Nation upto 15th August 2022 (India @ 75) as part of Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav to celebrate Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav as a *Jan-Utsav* in the spirit of *Jan-Bhagidari* through outreach initiatives like *Jan-Samvaad* and *Jan-Jagran* about Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav. The activities suggested for 75-weeks included (i) 29 awareness campaigns in 29 weeks on 29 subjects/ matters listed under Eleventh Schedule of the Constitution of India, (ii) 6 awareness campaigns in 6 weeks on localisation of six key goals under Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) with critical Roles of PRIs, (iii) 5 regional/zonal conferences of Sarpanches on Jan Samvaad in 5 weeks, (iv) Commemoration of National Panchayati Raj Day falling on 24th April of 2021 and 2022, (v) 6 Special Gram Sabhas in 6 weeks, (vi) 8 exposure visits in 8 weeks by the identified beacon PRIs, (vii) 3 Exhibitions in 3 weeks and (viii) 10 other miscellaneous activities in 10 weeks like wall painting, essay competitions, debates, heritage walk/tour/study tour, Swachhta activities etc.

- 2. Ministry has been sending advisories with suggestive activities to be carried out on weekly basis and also consistently been requesting States/UTs to provide reports on activities undertaken so far. Since reports have not been received from most of the States, it is presumed that due to spell of second wave of COVID-19 pandemic in most parts of the country, States/UTs appear to have not organised the events during the thirteen weeks or even if they did so are yet to send their reports. Details are as per Annexure-I.
- 3. A report on commemoration of National Panchayati Raj Day on 24th April 2021 as part of Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav is also yet to be received as many award distribution functions / ceremonies were organised at State/District Headquarters level on 24th April, 2021 across the country after conclusion of the virtual national event addressed by Hon'ble Prime Minister.
- 4. Ministry has already shared week-wise suggestive activities upto 18th week. But, it appears that majority of activities could not be organized owing to sudden increase in the intensity of the COVID-19 pandemic. In view of the above, it is suggested to organise the events during the ensuing week (Week No. 15) and forthcoming weeks upto 18th Week as already advised *vide* D.O. letter of even no. dated 10/6/2021 (Annexure-II), and beyond that the some major activities skipped up to 13th week may please be reorganised from the 19th Week as per Annexure-III.

- 5. Further, I would like to reiterate that activities suggested by the Ministry can be revised/customized according to their suitability/ convenience/ local circumstances. With regard to weekwise activities to be carried out by Panchayati Raj Institutions under guidance of States/UTs, the roles of the key stakeholders have been formulated and the same is at **Annexure-IV**.
- 6. I would like to request to involve and activate the Beacon Panchayats [75 Gram Panchayats, 75 Block Panchayats and 75 District Panchayats across the country from amongst Awardee (well-performing) Panchayats / Mission Antyodaya scores identified as "Agents of Change" or "Beacon Panchayats" to mark the 75th years of Indian Independence] in the awareness campaigns on India@75. The Ministry is contemplating to extend token financial support to these Beacon Panchayats for carrying out several activities in connection with India@75. The objectives behind selection of the Beacon Panchayats / Role of Beacon Panchayats is also given at Annexure-V.
- 7. All the suggested themes/ activities may be customised and activities may be carried out with strict adherence to the COVID-19 protocols/ guidelines/ appropriate behaviours, after taking into account the prevailing scenario arising out of the second wave of COVID-19 pandemic in the respective State/ UT/ District/ Block/ Gram Panchayat/ Villages. States/UTs may also like to conduct an intensive awareness campaigns on various aspects of **Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav** and integrate ongoing activities / initiatives with **Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav**.
- 8. In this regard, I would like to request all the State/UT Departments of Panchayati Raj and State Institutes of Rural Development & Panchayati Raj to (i) designate an Officer / Faculty-Member as Nodal Officer for India@75 for better and smooth coordination with MoPR and PRIs for implementation of week-wise activities and provide their names and contact-details to the Ministry, (ii) call upon Panchayati Raj Institutions to integrate observance of Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav with an amplified collective effort and renewed vigour & optimism to accelerate the pace of COVID-19 vaccination in rural areas, and (iii) provide the report regarding the activities undertaken on the occasion of National Panchayati Raj Day on 24th April 2021 (including award distribution ceremonies / functions organised on 24th April 2021 at different locations to hand over the National Panchayat Awards under different categories).
