# INTRODUCTION

Government of India is a signatory to the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) 2030 agenda and committed to achieve the same. Around 2.6 lakh Gram Panchayats (GPs), with 31.65 elected representatives, are key stake-holders for achieving this agenda for which it is imperative that they adopt 'Localization of Sustainable Development Goals' (LSDGs) thematic approach initiated by Ministry of Panchayati Raj for planning through 'Gram Panchayat Development Plan' and its implementation in a saturation-cum-phased manner.

Under this approach, Ministry of Panchayati Raj (MoPR) has aggregated 17 SDGs into 9 LSDG themes and accordingly, revamped the National Panchayat Awards under following 9 award themes:

1. Poverty free and enhanced livelihoods Panchayat
2. Healthy Panchayat
3. Child friendly Panchayat
4. Water sufficient Panchayat
5. Clean and Green Panchayat
6. Self-sufficient infrastructure in Panchayat
7. Socially Secured Panchayat
8. Panchayat with Good Governance
9. Women-friendly Panchayat



National Panchayat Awards, which are a strong source of motivation for Panchayats, are usually conferred by MoPR annually on 24th April, celebrated as National Panchayati Raj Day. This day commemorates the 73rd Amendment Act, 1992 of the Constitution which came into effect in the year 1993 and conferred Constitutional status to Panchayats as institution of local self-governance.

It is an unprecedented milestone that around 2.41 lakh out of 2.6 lakh Gram Panchayats/Equivalent Bodies successfully participating under the National Panchayat Awards 2023. This achievement reflects the remarkable and integrated efforts of states/UTs and Panchayats and also the awareness created on the LSDGs among them. This inculcates an aspiration that the country is on the right path to achieve the 2030 Agenda of SDGs through rural local bodies via a thematic approach (Additionally, around 6 lakh panchayats also participated but could not successfully submit applications).

## UNDER THE NATIONAL PANCHAYAT AWARDS 2023, AWARDS HAVE BEEN CONFERRED UNDER THE FOLLOWING CATEGORIES:

► Deen Dayal Upadhyay Panchayat Satat Vikas Puraskar: This award is for top-3 ranking GPs/Equivalent bodies for their outstanding performance under each of the abovementioned 9 award themes. This year, total 27 awards will be conferred under this category.

*A total of 42 Panchayats (36 Gram Panchayats, 3 Block Panchayats and 3 District Panchayats) are selected for National Panchayat Awards 2023*

► Nanaji Deshmukh Sarvottam Panchayat Satat Vikas Puraskar: This award is for top 3 Gram, Block and District Panchayats each for their aggregate performance under all the 9 award themes. This year, total 9 awards will be conferred under this category.

► Special categories of Awards conferred this year (2023):

a) Gram Urja Swaraj Vishesh Panchayat Puraskar is for top 3 GPs/Equivalent Bodies for their performance in adoption and usage of renewable sources of energy. This year, total 3 awards will be conferred under this category.

b) Carbon Neutral Vishesh Panchayat Puraskar is for top 3 GPs/Equivalent Bodies for their towards achieving Net-Zero carbon emissions.

This e-book reflects the best practices and outstanding achievements of all awardee Panchayats/Equivalent Bodies conferred with National Panchayat Awards 2023 and will serve as a guidemap and inspiration for other Panchayats/Equivalent Bodies.

- ▶ Sanitization of Public Places, Mass Cleaning of villages, awareness through posters, awareness through leaflets etc.
- ▶ Distribution of Mask and Sanitizers.
- ▶ The practice of Yogasana was developed among the villagers.
- ▶ "Nikshay Mitra" i.e. distribution of supplementary nutrition kits along with free medicine distributions among TB Patients.



## SUPPORT RECEIVED

- ▶ The women of the GP have benefitted from Mamta Yojana and Biju Swasthya Kalyan Yojana (Health Insurance Scheme).



## ROADMAP FOR SUSTAINABILITY

- ▶ Rooftop Water Harvesting Structures and plantation activities have been taken up in Kanchuru PHC under MGNREGA to make the PHC clean, Green and Healthy.

- ▶ Special Gram Sabha conducted with CoVID 19 safety protocol to discuss approach for dealing with the pandemic.
- ▶ Face masks were distributed, vaccination drives were conducted, and streets were sanitized to combat the pandemic.
- ▶ Events like Mahila Sabha and Bal Sabha, supplemented by IEC activities, helped Gram Panchayat with immunization.
- ▶ Door-to-door awareness campaigns for all the residents.



## SUPPORT RECEIVED

- ▶ Leveraging resources such as Central funds from 15<sup>th</sup> Finance Commission and State funds from initiatives such as Moolbhut, The GP Saankra was successful in tackling the CoVID19 pandemic.
- ▶ Collaboration with ASHA worker, Green army and team of Health Department helped GP to provide health facilities to its residents.



## ROADMAP FOR SUSTAINABILITY

- ▶ The GP has focussed more on health-related activities in its GPDP.
- ▶ Free health check-ups and medicines are being distributed to people through Hatbazar Yojna of Health Department of Chhattisgarh.
