Plan of Action for Rolling out PDI in the State/UT

1. Notification of State PDI Nodal Officer
2. Constitution of State level PDI committee consisting of Joint Director Level officers of all participating line departments and State NIC, UNOCEF, UNDP
3. Consultative workshop for onboarding of members of State level PDI committee.
 1. Identification of Optional Indicators as per the consent of the concerned Line department
 2. Review of Data points
 3. Identification of Field Offices that own data and shall provide the data, Identification of source Register
 4. Identification of Block level Data Verification office of line department for each Data point
 5. Asking the State Departments to issue formal orders for providing data to the field offices



Plan of Action for Rolling out PDI in the State/UT

1. Configuration of PDI portal as per MP State
2. State level training / orientation workshop of District-level master trainers.
3. Formation of District and Block level committee consisting of District heads of line departments and NIC.
4. Orientation program of all District and Block level offices by VC, representatives of MoPR, Line departments to attend
5. Training of GP secretaries, Field offices, facilitator at Block level by District Team and DIO.

Challenges faced during data validation process at GP level

1. Lack of coordination/Interest between line departments.
2. It is found that GP level functionaries are overloaded with existing liabilities. So it is suggested to depute outsource agencies for data collection process.
3. It is difficult to find-out correct data for the year 2022-23 (31 March 23)



Suggestions in respect of Local Indicators & its data Points

(in respect of revision, modification & addition (if any))

- Internship students/ (MBA/PhD/MSW)/institutions/NGOs may be allowed to conduct the survey and data collection.
- This portal should be integrated with other GOI and State level portal.
- Weightage for the different indicators must be based on its importance.
