Challenges faced during data validation process at GP level

- 1. Lack of cooperation by Line departments.
- 2. Lack of authentic data
- 3. Indicator Percentage of currently married women (15-49 years) who use any modern family planning methods (In theme no.9 Indicator No. 3)

In this indicator age start should start from 18 years.

4. Indicator - Percentage of households in poor category as per updated NFSA - Priority Households & AAY category [1] (In theme no. 1 Double entry of Indicator no. 1).

Challenges faced during data validation process at GP level

Without a data sharing policy at the panchayat level- lot of time in explaining the need.

Multiple data sources for same set of data

Capacity building and handholding support required for some time, till the process

As Punjab has data in independent data portals (like Smart Ration Card Scheme) and other govt. websites, need for fixing the source.

Reluctant to share data by other departments (Spl. Police Dept.)



Institutional Mechanism for Validation

- Convergence with Line Departments.
- Need to have State and district level meetings for designating suitable officers for the validation process.
- Need to build capacities of the all the validating officers of all level officers (Nodal Officers).
- All line department need to be sensitised.



Feedback on PDI Portal

- 1. As the number of indicators are more, it should allow for part saving and continuing. Theme wise data entry even for one takes a long time
- 2. Entry of data on PDI portal requires expertise.
- 3. Present manpower not sufficient so additional manpower should be deployed.
- 4. Facilitator –remuneration should be based on number and type of entries.
- 5 PDI portal may be regional language.



Plan of Action for Rolling out PDI in the State/UT



A state level meeting follow up has been conducted and has made the Principal Secretary,/Commissioner RD&PR – Training as PDI State nodal officer with a G.O.



Steering committee constituted with P&D playing an important role will be convened and the responsibilities for the 9 themes will be fixed on the different departments



Data available at panchayat level at State level through different sources will be auto populated to avoid errors of entry



Block level validation committee will be constituted
