# Challenges faced during data validation process at GP level

- 1. Secretary is in-charge of more than 10 GPs so it will be tough for them to collect all the information
- 2. Revenue village wise Data available regarding Agriculture and forest with patwari / lekhpal and agriculture department is overlapping. Similarly Data with ASHA and AWW is overlapping
- 3. Documents where facility wise or revenue village wise data is collected need to be aggregated manually it is a humongous task
- 4. Many data points need survey which is not available in any document, which requires human resources and financial resources
- 5. Service area of some functionaries is not according to Revenue village wise or GP wise their data again need to be segregated or aggregated according to GP wise



#### **Suggestions**

- 1. Standardisaton of records
- 2. Meeting with Chief Secretaries to underline importance of PDI
- 3.LGD Seeding of different portals
- 4. Joint advisory from different Ministries
- 5.Mandatory monitoring of development (District, Block, GP, Legislative constituency, Parliamentary constituency wise) through PDI portal
- 6.Ranking of States and Districts based on PDI report, SIF & DIF should include (bottom up approach)
- 7.Census app



#### **Institutional Mechanism for Validation**

- 1. Compilation of data from all departments
- 2. Validation of data at Gram Sabha level.
- 3. Validation of data through designated officials at Block and District level.
- 5. Publication of the information in public domain



#### Plan of Action for Rolling out PDI in the State/UT

- Piloting of PDI at least 5 GPs
- Setting up Steering committee in the chairpersonship of CS and presentation of findings
- State level workshop with all stakeholders
- Finalisation of Indicators
- Organise the workshops at District/Block/Gram Panchayat Level
- Necessary data collection
- Data validation in Gram Sabha during GPDP meetings
