Minutes of the 1st Central Empowered Committee (CEC) meeting of Revamped Rashtriya Gram Swaraj Abhiyan (RGSA) held on 29th February, 2024

- 1. The 1st Meeting of Central Empowered Committee (CEC) of Revamped Rashtriya Gram Swaraj Abhiyan (RGSA) for the year 2024-25 was held on 29th February, 2024 under the chairmanship of Secretary, Ministry of Panchayati Raj at New Delhi. The list of Participants is at Annexure-A.
- 2. Welcoming the Secretary, MoPR/Chairman of the CEC, Members of CEC and the representatives from State/UT, Joint Secretary (CB), MoPR/Member Secretary briefly shared the agenda of Annual Action Plan received from the UT of Jammu & Kashmir and West Bengal. The observations and decision of the CEC on the Annual Action Plans of State/UT under consideration is as follows.

3. Agenda-I: Annual Action Plan of Jammu & Kashmir 2024-25

The CEC approved the AAP of UT of J&K for the FY 2024-25 with the following observations.

- i. **Other activities under CB&T-** Under other activities of CB&T, all the components proposed by the UT have been approved as proposed except in Training Need Assessment and Evaluation of CB&T (Upto 10 lakh per State/ once in 2 year) where Rs. 0.0975 crore has been approved for each component, as during FY 2023-24, an amount of Rs. 25,000/- has been spent by UT on each components.
- ii. **Institutional Support:** CEC approved the DPRCs and BPRCs as proposed by the UT with the condition that the services of channel partner will be phased out by August, 2024 in the Districts and Blocks where DPRC and BPRCs have been sanctioned.

iii. Panchayat Infrastructure-

- a. **Construction of Panchayat Bhawans (Carry Over):** An amount of Rs. 85.63 crore approved for construction of 470 carry over Panchayat Bhawans with the condition that the State shall complete the construction of these Panchayat Bhawans within the FY 2024-25.
- b. **Construction of New PB**: In principle approval given for construction of 500 PB, amounting to Rs. 100.00 crore, subject to condition that State will complete the preliminary activities needed for starting the work and then approach the MoPR to for enhancement in the budget summary for executing the work. The CEC also authorized the Chairman of the Committee to approve such proposal as and when received from the State.
- c. **Co-location of CSC with Panchayat Bhawans (Carry forward):** An amount of Rs. 54.30 crore approved for Co-location of CSC of 1106 as carry over activity with the condition that the State shall complete this activity within the FY 2024-25.
- d. **Co-location of CSC with Panchayat Bhawan (New)**: In principle approval given for 500 Co-location of CSC amounting to Rs. 25.00 crore, subject to condition that State

will complete the preliminary activities needed for starting the work and then approach the MoPR for enhancement in the budget summary for executing the work. The CEC also authorized the Chairman of the Committee to approve such proposal as and when received from the State.

e. **E.enablement of Panchayats:** An amount of Rs. 2.36 crore approved for providing internet connectivity in 1000 GPs as carry over activity. Further, in view of the plea of the UT that delay in completing the activity occurred due to non-availability of BSNL services, Committee suggested that State can avail the services of other service providers, subject to the condition that the rates are not more than the BSNL rates.

Based on the decisions taken by CEC, the detailed budget summary of approved Annual Action Plan of the UT of Jammu & Kashmir is at **Annexure – I**.

4. Agenda-II: Annual Action Plan: West Bengal 2024-25

The CEC approved the AAP of State of West Bengal for the FY 2024-25 with the following observations.

- i. **Other activities under CB&T-** The revision in costs in the following components of the other activities of CB&T:
 - a. **Training need Assessment** During the F.Y. 2023-24, State has spent an amount of Rs. 9.60 lakh. Accordingly, an amount of Rs. 0.40 lakh has been proposed by the State and same has been approved by the Committee.
- b. **Development of Training Modules** During the F.Y. 2023-24, State has spent an amount of Rs. 5.00 lakh, accordingly, an amount of Rs. 5.00 lakh has been proposed by the State and same was approved by the Committee.
- c. **Development of Training Material-** During the F.Y. 2023-24, State has spent an amount of Rs. 5.00 lakh, accordingly, an amount of Rs. 5.00 lakh has been proposed by the State and same was approved by the Committee.
- d. Any alternative mode of technology IP Based Technology for Distance learning facilities for CB&T of ERs in the State (Carry Forward): Installation of 251 IP based VC system (One Unit at BRAIPRD, One Unit at North 24 Parganas District & 249 Units at Block level) proposed by the State as carry over in the FY 2024-25 was approved by CEC with the condition that the State shall complete the activity within the FY 2024-25.
- ii. **Panchayat Infrastructure: Construction of Panchayat Bhawan (Carry Over):** CEC approved an amount of Rs. 3.50 crore approved for construction of 35 carry over Panchayat Bhawan as proposed by the State with the condition that the State shall complete the construction of these Panchayat Bhawans within the FY 2024-25.

iii. **Computer and Accessories (Printer, Scanner and UPS)**: An amount of Rs. 0.56 crore approved for procurement of 112 computers for GTA GPs.

iv. **Innovative & Economic Development Projects**:

- a. While approving the proposal for carry over Projects, the Committee decided that the Projects approved in previous financial years but not taken up yet need to be dropped by the State. State shall furnish the status of Projects approved during the previous year.
- b. **New Proposals**: Will be considered separately in the meeting of the Committee constituted for considering Innovative & Economic Development Projects.
