The Annual Action Plan of 7 States/UT namely Andhra Pradesh, Himachal Pradesh, Haryana, Madhya Pradesh, Manipur, Ladakh & Uttarakhand and Central Agenda regarding Continuation of project for Creating 250 Model GP Clusters during 2024-25 were considered in the meeting.

**Minutes of the 7th Central Empowered Committee (CEC) meeting of
Revamped Rashtriya Gram Swaraj Abhiyan (RGSA) held on 31st July, 2024**

The 7th meeting of Central Empowered Committee (CEC) of Revamped Rashtriya Gram Swaraj Abhiyan (RGSA) for the year 2024-25 was held on 31st July, 2024 under the Chairmanship of Secretary, Ministry of Panchayati Raj at New Delhi. The list of Participants is at **Annexure-A**.

2. Welcoming the Secretary, MoPR/Chairman of the CEC, Members of CEC and the representatives from States/UTs, Joint Secretary (CB), MoPR/Member Secretary, initiated the agenda of the meeting with the permission of the Chair.

3. **State Agenda:**

3.1 The CEC considered the Annual Action Plans of Andhra Pradesh, Himachal Pradesh, Haryana, Ladakh, Madhya Pradesh, Manipur and Uttarakhand. The general observations to strengthen Panchayats and to improve the implementation and effectiveness of the scheme, as mentioned in the 2nd CEC meeting by the Secretary, MoPR/Chairman of the CEC were reiterated by Joint Secretary (CB), MoPR, which are as under:

- i. The States/UTs were advised to adopt innovative initiatives taken by the other States/UTs to strengthen Panchayati Raj Institutions.
- ii. States to consider prioritizing functional literacy while providing training to elected representatives on the lines of the Karnataka Model.
- iii. The States to utilize available facilities of other departments at District and Block level for imparting training of PRIs, following the Maharashtra model.
- iv. The quality of training of PRIs needs to be enhanced. A mechanism for regular evaluation of training to be devised.
- v. States to incorporate special trainings viz. procurement norms, budgeting & accounting, training on legal provisions etc. for Elected Women Representatives in their AAP for checking the culture of "SarpanchPati".
- vi. The faculty / trainers / resources person of the PRI training institutes also needs to be adequately trained to impart quality training. The practice followed by the State of Karnataka for

evaluation of training and faculty development may be explored to be implemented suitably in other States also.

- vii. At present the focus of training is on ERs of Gram Panchayats. It is required to give focus on the training of the ERs and Functionaries of Block and District Panchayats also. Accordingly, suitable mechanism to be developed for adequate training of ERs and Functionaries of Block and District Panchayats.
- viii. State to develop a robust mechanism for feedback and grading of the trainers in collaboration with eminent training institutes and Universities.
- ix. The State to expedite the process of setting up of District Panchayat Resource Centres (DPRCs) and Block Panchayat Resource Centres (BPRCs). 100% DPRC and at least 50% BPRCs to be made functional during 2024-25.
- x. The State to prepare strategy for timely utilisation of available funds to ensure timely release of funds during the current financial year.
- xi. States/UTs are advised to examine Karnataka Asset Monetization Model for adoption.
- xii. CEC advised the States to coordinate with other State Departments to avoid duplication of training efforts.
- xiii. Training programmes should start with an inaugural session & end with a valedictory session. Local dignitaries should be invited to the same.
- xiv. States to conduct extensive trainings on OSR and Panchayat Finances. The States/UTs with PESA Panchayats to conduct the trainings on PESA related issues.
- xv. It was observed that Exposure visits within or outside the State/UT is very important component of RGSA and it was suggested to increase the number of participants for exposure visits and these visits should be planned in a structured manner. During the visit good practices to be showcased, field visit and feedback from participants on lesson learnt along with possibilities and strategy to replicate the same in their own Panchayats. It was also suggested to include officials along with Elected Representatives in such visits as provisioned in the scheme. Chairman also instructed officials of the MoPR to prepare SOP on exposure visit for smooth conduct of exposure visits within and outside of the States/UTs and also to consult with the States/UTs for hosting the exposure visits from other States/UTs.
- xvi. States/UTs to work on increasing the online services being provided by the GPs.

- xvii. States/UTs to resolve the issues in sharing of revenue with the GPs in case of Economic Development and Income Enhancement Projects.

3.2 Andhra Pradesh: -Annual Action Plan 2024-25

3.2.1 The Secretary, MoPR/ Chairman of the CEC, expressed displeasure on the slow progress in CB&T activities. The State trained only 1,65,001 participants against the target of 13,50,480 participants during 2023-24. Further, it was observed that an amount of Rs. 40.79 crore was lying unspent with the State as on 29.07.2024.

3.2.2. The Committee praised the State for developing a robust Own Source Revenue (OSR) system in the Gram Panchayats, enabling them to be financially self-sufficient by special focus on innovative activities like developing Fishery Tanks, Shopping Complexes, Cattle Shelters, Vermi composting pits etc.

3.2.3. The State of Andhra Pradesh proposed an Annual Action Plan of Rs. 273.80 crores for the FY 2024-25 under Revamped Rashtriya Gram Swaraj Abhiyan (RGSA). The Central Empowered Committee reviewed the proposal submitted by the State and approved the Annual Action Plan amounting to Rs. 215.80 crores with the following observations:

(i) **Capacity Building & Training (CB&T):** The Committee observed that majority of the trainings were conducted during 2023-24 under the category of Panchayat Development Plan (PDP), hence, the proposed training under this component was reduced to 68,814 from 1,37,629 with subsequent reduction in the amount proposed by the state of Rs 18.46 cr to 9.23cr.

(ii) **Panchayat Infrastructure:** The State proposed 200 new construction of Panchayat Bhawan in PESA and Aspirational Districts. The proposal amounting to Rs. 40.00 cr was approved by the Committee. Besides this, CEC also gave in-principle approval for the Panchayat Bhawans alongwith the CSC co-location in the 18 GPs included in the list of Sansad Adarsh Gram Yojna furnished by MoSJE which have significant population of Scheduled castes and reported unavailability of Panchayat Bhawan on eGramSwaraj, subject to verification by the State that the GPs do not have their own office buildings (list attached at **Annexure-B**).

(iii) **E-enablement (Carry over Activities):** The State proposed purchase of 500 computers & accessories, setting-up of one studio at State level and establishment of District Learning Facility (as Alternative mode of Technology).

The Committee considered and approved the proposal with the observation that the State shall complete the same within the current FY 2024-25.

The budget summary of Annual Action Plan of the State of Andhra Pradesh is at **Annexure- I**.

3.3 Himachal Pradesh: Annual Action Plan 2024-25

3.3.1 The representative of Himachal Pradesh made a detailed presentation on institutional infrastructure developed by State under Revamped Rashtriya Gram Swaraj Abhiyan (viz. SPRC, DPRC constructed and Computer Lab, Panchayat Learning Centre). State also showcased the Model Panchayat Bhawan constructed by the Panchayati Raj Department in convergence with other line Department @ 1.00 cr. Support of Rs. 20 lakh is being given from the RGSA.

3.3.2. Himachal Pradesh has proposed an Annual Action Plan of Rs 101.284 crore for the FY 2024-25 under Revamped Rashtriya Gram Swaraj Abhiyan (RGSA). The Central Empowered Committee considered the same and approved the Annual Action Plan amounting to Rs. 100.42 crores with the following observations: -

(i) Economic Development & Income Enhancement: The Committee lauded the progress of the Ecotourism Project and advised that Gram Panchayats should also be involved to provide employment opportunities to the citizens through this special project. The GPs should get a share of the revenue generated & if there is a need to modify the eco-tourism policy the same should be considered. The Ministry shall also formally write to the State Government in the matter.

(ii) Capacity Building & Training: The Committee appreciated the quality of infrastructure provided at DPRCs. The State proposed training for 78,775 participants under the CB&T component. However, the Committee observed that the State had performed well in FY 2023-24 and trained around 92 thousands participant. The Committee therefore suggested to increase the number of Participants. State may send a supplementary proposal in this regard. It approved the total training proposed by the State.

(iii) The Committee reviewed the availability of Gram Panchayat Bhawans in Himachal Pradesh and observed that 5 Panchayat are in the category where Panchayat Bhawans are reported to be not available as per the SAGY record of MoSJE. The Committee additionally, gave in-principle approval for the construction of 5 Panchayat Bhawans and co-location of 5 CSCs in

Panchayat Bhawans subject to verification by the State that the GPs does not have their own Bhawans (List attached at **Annexure-B**).

(iv) **Block Programme Management Units (BPMUs):** State has proposed manpower support for 81 BPMUs with financial implication of Rs 5.91 cr. However, while approving 81 BPMUs the CEC restricted the sanctioned amount to Rs.3.88 crores as per RGSA norms @Rs.4.80 lakhs/ BPMU.

(v) **Distance learning facility through SATCOM or IP based technology:** The State proposed VC facility for 1584 GPs amounting to Rs 23.76 cr. The Committee considered the proposal and approved the same.

(vi) **Online Citizen Services:** The State shall provide a list of online services provided at the GP level through the Panchayats. The State was advised to increase the number of such services. Further releases shall be conditional on its performance.

The budget summary of Annual Action Plan of the State of Himachal Pradesh is at **Annexure- II**.

3.4. Haryana: Annual Action Plan 2024-25

3.4.1. The Director General, Development and Panchayats Department, Haryana made a detailed presentation of the Annual Action Plan and institutional infrastructure available for the Capacity Building & Training in the State. Further, State representative informed that due to agitation/strike in the State, training of the Elected Representatives could not be taken up and funds could not be utilized during 2022-23 and 2023-24.

3.4.2. The Committee discussed about the essential services being provided by the Panchayats to the citizens in the rural area. It was informed by the State that services viz. death/ birth certificate, residential certificate etc. are currently being provided through Common Service Centers (CSCs). The Chairman advised that the State should endeavour to empower the Panchayats for delivery of services at the grassroots and also to transform the service delivery mode to online. The CEC accorded in-principle approval to the Annual Action Plan, with the condition that the State must make efforts to facilitate the provision of services directly by the Panchayats and, wherever necessary, issue a Government Order to this effect.

3.4.3. The State of Haryana proposed an Annual Action Plan of Rs 44.758 crore for the FY 2024-25 under Revamped Rashtriya Gram Swaraj Abhiyan (RGSA). The Central Empowered Committee reviewed the proposal submitted by the

State and approved the Annual Action Plan amounting to Rs. 37.023 crores with the following observations: -

(i) The State has proposed handholding support for all of its 6225 Gram Panchayat. However, in view of the fact that during the FY 2023-24 handholding support for 330 GPs (15 GPs per District) was approved by the CEC for Haryana but no progress has been reported in this regard by the State, the CEC approved the handholding support for only 330 GPs for the FY 2024-25.

(ii) The State proposed 36 Satellite Interactive Terminals (SITs) in 36 location amounting to Rs. 4 Lakh/SITs. The Committee considered and approved the proposal for 36 SITs amounting to Rs. 0.54 cr. (i.e.1.50 Lakh/SITs.)

(iii) The Committee suggested the State to send a separate proposal for construction of DPRCs to strengthen the Institutional Infrastructure.

(iv) The Committee reviewed the availability of Gram Panchayat Bhawans in the State of Haryana and observed that 9 Panchayat are in the category where Panchayat Bhawans are reported to be not available as per the SAGY record of MoSJE. The Committee additionally, gave in-principle approval for the construction of 9 Panchayat Bhawans and Co-location of 9 CSCs in Panchayat Bhawans subject to verification by the State that the GPs do not have their own office buildings (List attached at **Annexure-B**).

The budget summary of Annual Action Plan of the State of Haryana is at **Annexure- III**

3.5 Ladakh: Annual Action Plan 2024-25

3.5.1 The Secretary (Panchayati Raj Department of UT)attended the meeting virtually due to unavoidable circumstances and made a detailed presentation on the different components of Capacity Building & Training. UT has informed that during 2023-24 1070 participants were trained against the target of 13,464 participants. However, it was observed that same are not being reflected on the Training Management Portal. The Committee expressed displeasure on the slow progress in CB&T activities during 2023-24.

3.5.2 The UT of Ladakh proposed an Annual Action Plan of Rs. 19.36 crores for the FY 2024-25 under Revamped Rashtriya Gram SwarajAbhiyan (RGSA). The Central Empowered Committee reviewed the proposal submitted by the State and approved the Annual Action Plan amounting to Rs 16.09 crores with the following observations:

(i) **Capacity Building & Training (CB&T):** The Committee observed that elections of PRIs are pending in the UT since November 2023. Hence, the

proposal for 13,966 participants has been reduced to 6,983 numbers, with subsequent reduction in the amount from 9.87 cr. to 4.93 cr. Further, UT was advised to submit the proposal for additional trainings after the finalization of the dates for the election of PRIs.

(ii) **Institutional Infrastructure:** The UT proposed construction of two (2) DPRCs in Leh and Kargil, respectively. However, the Committee approved for the construction of one DPRC at Kargil initially and based on the progress, other will be considered in the next financial year.

The budget summary of Annual Action Plan of the UT of Ladakh is at **Annexure-IV**.

3.6 **Madhya Pradesh: Annual Action Plan 2024-25**

3.6.1. The representative of Panchayati Raj Department, Govt. of Madhya Pradesh made a detailed presentation about the achievements, training infrastructure and training material available, in printed form and soft material as well as the learning videos developed in the State, alongwith progress on other components of RGSA and the proposal for the AAP 2024-25.

3.6.2. Madhya Pradesh proposed an Annual Action Plan of Rs 710.34 crores for the F.Y 2024- 25 under Revamped Rashtriya Gram Swaraj Abhiyan (RGSA). The Central Empowered Committee considered the same and approved the Annual Action Plan amounting to Rs. 263.76 crore with the following observations:-

(i) **Capacity Building & Training:-** The State informed that the PESA rules have been implemented successfully in the State. Further, an MoU has been signed between SIRD and Jan Abhiyan Parishad for evaluation of training programmes for quality and effectiveness of PESA trainings. Additionally, the State has also developed and rolled out PESA Training Module & Material under the initiative of the Ministry of Panchayati Raj, Government of India. The Chairman appreciated the material prepared & the efforts made by the State. The Chairman also advised the State that SIRD&PR can carryout research studies in various areas of Panchayati Raj in PESA GPs.

(ii) **Aatmnirbhar Panchayat Samridha:-**The State informed that a three day Aatmnirbhar Panchayat Samridha of ERs and functionaries was held in the State wherein, working group discussions were held on the utilization of 15thFC, Self-sufficient GPs, Good Governance, implementation of PESA, etc. The Committee requested that the working group papers be shared for cross State learning.

(iii) **Economic Development & Income Enhancement:** The Chairman appreciated the Home Stay project undertaken by Government in rural areas.

The Committee observed that various projects have been approved to the State under the innovative and Economic Development component of RGSA during previous years. However, in the Annual Action Plan for 2024-25, no carry over projects have been proposed by the State. Hence, it was suggested to provide the details of approved project so far under the scheme. Further, the it was advised that all the Projects approved till F.Y. 2022-23 but yet not started should be dropped by the State.

(iv) **Institutional Infrastructure:** The Committee noted that there was no progress on the construction of DPRCs previously sanctioned. The State Government was advised to expedite construction and report progress.

(v) **Construction of Panchayat Bhawan:** The State proposed construction of 289 Panchayat Bhawan in Gram Panchayats in difficult areas. The Committee considered and approved the component. Besides this, CEC also gave in-principle approval for the Panchayat Bhawans alongwith the CSC co-location in the 58 GPs included in the list of Sansad Adarsh Gram Yojna furnished by MoSJE which have significant population of Scheduled Castes and reported unavailability of Panchayat Bhawan on eGramSwaraj, subject to verification by the State that the GPs does not have their own Bhawans (list attached at **Annexure-B**).

The budget summary of Annual Action Plan of the State of Madhya Pradesh is at **Annexure- V**.

3.7 **Manipur: Annual Action Plan 2024-25**

3.7.1 The representative of Panchayati Raj Department, Government of Manipur made a detailed presentation about the achievements, training infrastructure and training material developed by the State, alongwith progress on other components of RGSA and the proposal for the AAP 2024-25.

3.7.2 Manipur proposed an Annual Action Plan of Rs. 68.64 crore for the FY 2024-25 under Revamped Rashtriya Gram Swaraj Abhiyan (RGSA). The Central Empowered Committee reviewed the proposal submitted by the State and approved the Annual Action Plan amounting to Rs. 30.265 crores with the following observations: -

(i) **Capacity Building & Training (CB&T):** -The Committee noted that Panchayat elections have been pending since October 2022. Additionally, the State has not been preparing the Gram Panchayat Development Plan (GPDP). Consequently, the proposal for Capacity Building & Training (CB&T) was put on hold until the elections are conducted. The State informed that elections are

expected to be held in October 2024. Therefore, the Committee decided to review the CB&T proposal again in November 2024.

(ii) **Handholding support for GPDP/ Leadership Management Development Program (MDP):** The Committee also decided that handholding support for GPDP, MDP and any other trainings will be considered during the review of CB&T proposal in the month of November, 2024 after the Panchayat elections in the State.

(iii) **E-Enablement of Panchayats:** The State submitted a proposal for replacement of 81 old computers. The Committee considered and approved the same amounting to Rs. 0.405 cr.

(iv) **Construction of Panchayat Bhawans:** The Committee approved carry forward of 11 GP buildings. However, it was noted that work orders for the same had not been issued till date. It was decided that the new proposal shall be considered after work order is issued for the previous 11 GP buildings.

The budget summary of Annual Action Plan of the State of Manipur is at **Annexure- VI.**

3.8 **Uttarakhand: Annual Action Plan 2024-25**

3.8.1 The Secretary, Panchayati Raj Department, Government of Uttarakhand made a detailed presentation about the different components of capacity building & training conducted for PRIs & other stakeholders and other achievements of FY 2023-24 including the construction of Panchayat Bhawans, Co-location of CSCs and development of PLCs in the State. It was informed that 12 Online Citizen's services are being rendered through GPs in the State.

3.8.2. Uttarakhand proposed an Annual Action Plan of Rs.213.62 crores for the FY 2024-25 under Revamped Rashtriya Gram Swaraj Abhiyan(RGSA). The Central Empowered Committee reviewed the proposal submitted by the State and approved the Annual Action Plan amounting to Rs.190.40 cr. with the following observations:

(i) **Specialized Training under CB&T:** The State proposed Specialized Training for 9832 participants during the F.Y. 2024-25. However, Committee observed that during the year 2023-24, under the said component only 5% participant were trained against the approved target. Hence, the proposal for 9832 participants was reduced to 4916 participants, with subsequent deduction in the amount from 2.38 cr to 1.19 cr.

(ii) Evaluation of Training: The State proposed Evaluation of Training. It was not approved by the CEC since this activity had been approved during FY 2023-24 and fund has been utilized for the same. As per Revamped RGSA norms, support under this component can be provided once in two years only.

(iii) Construction of Panchayat Bhawans: The State proposed construction of 100 Panchayat Bhawan in Gram Panchayats in difficult areas. The Committee considered and approved the component. Besides this, CEC also gave in-principle approval for the Panchayat Bhawans along with the CSC co-location in the 12 GPs included in the list of Sansad Adarsh Gram Yojana furnished by MoSJE which have significant population of Scheduled castes and reported unavailability of Panchayat Bhawan on eGramSwaraj, subject to verification by the State that the GPs does not have their own Bhawans (list attached at **Annexure-B**).

(iv) The State requested for the payment of liability amount of Rs. 14.27 Cr. that was spent by the State for CB&T in 2022-23 but was not included in the expenditure details for the year submitted to MoPR. In this regard, CEC was apprised that the information requested by the MoPR in the matter has not been furnished by the State till now. The State Government vide letter dated 29th July 2024 has expressed its inability to furnish the information so requested by MoPR. It was informed by the State Government that the High Court has issued an order in the matter. The representative of the State Government was requested to share the order so that necessary action could be taken.

(v) The Secretary, Panchayat Department informed that recruitment for Gram Panchayats is in its last stage. Elections to the Panchayats are expected in October, 2024. The Committee noted that collection of OSR is minimal. The State was requested to finalise their OSR Rules.

The budget summary of Annual Action Plan of the State of Uttarakhand is at **Annexure- VII**.

3.9 Additional Agenda: Central Agenda regarding Continuation of project for Creating 250 Model GP Clusters during 2024-25

3.9.1. It was informed that a project was approved under RGSA for 2020-21 and 2021-22 to create 250 Model GP Clusters covering 1100 GPs across India with the annual financial implication of Rs.15.54 crore for implementation through NIRD&PR. The objective of the project is to create 250 successful models of GP clusters through technical guidance and handholding support by trained Young Fellows (YFs) for preparation of SDG-focused quality GPDP and implementing

their plans in true spirit to achieve holistic and sustainable development. It was also envisaged under the project that the YFs will provide support for institutional strengthening of GPs to inspire and motivate other GPs to follow.

3.9.2 Subsequently, under revamped RGSA, the said project continued with annual financial implication of Rs.15.54 crore during 2022-23 and 2023-24. Further, it was also mentioned that in-principle approval was also accorded during 2022-23 for the extension of the project for 4 years from 2022-23 to 2025-26 with the condition that budgetary support for subsequent years under the project will be considered based on the progress, actual requirements and availability of funds.

3.9.3. The CEC was also apprised that the project was reviewed by the Secretary, Ministry of Panchayati Raj in the meeting held on 22nd May, 2024. As per the direction in the review meeting, a dashboard along with measurable KPIs for the Young Fellows were prepared by NIRD&PR and demonstrated to Additional Secretary, MoPR in the meeting held on 20.06.2024. Subsequently, based on the request received from NIRD&PR, approval for the continuation of the project during 2024-25 was accorded by the Secretary, MoPR / the Chairman of the CEC in view of the fact that the persons engaged under the project were not getting salaries. Accordingly, proposal for the continuation of ex post facto approval was placed before CEC.

3.9.4. CEC considered the proposal and accorded ex post facto approval for the continuation of the project in 2024-25 to be implemented through NIRD&PR with the financial implication of Rs.13.29 crore for the following components:

3.9.5. The CEC also directed that the project for Creating 250 Model GP Clusters will be part of School of Excellence for Panchayati Raj (SoEPR) for effective execution and monitoring. The outcome of the Young Fellows will be monitored on the portal based KPIs. NIRD&PR to submit monthly analytical progress report of YFs and provide access of the monitoring dashboard to the Ministry. The actual release of funds will be based on the progress, actual requirements and availability of funds.
