

**Launching of “Court Case Monitoring System (CCMS) 2.0” of NIC, Odisha under 5T (Technology, Transparency, Team Work, Transformation and Time) Charter of Government of Odisha.**

Government of Odisha has devised 5T Mantra for providing good governance to the public. Revenue Administration being the basic service provider to the citizens relating their landed assets is a primary department among others. It plays major role for hassle free land transaction and record updation for titling. As Land titling is a complex process, in many cases disputes are cropped out. To resolve these cases, 39 Revisional Courts are functioning in Odisha State under the aegis of Board of Revenue. The CCMS 2.0 with enhanced features like e-Filing directly by citizens or through Advocates, court fee payment using IFMS and electronic case execution system from filing, case hearing, interim order to final order has been revamped for smooth execution of the work flow. The system has been integrated with Land record database eliminating huge amount of paper works.



This application was launched by Sri Raj Kumar Sharma, IAS, Hon'ble Member, Board of Revenue, Odisha on 4<sup>th</sup> July 2023 at 5<sup>th</sup> Floor Conference Hall of BoR, Cuttack. Sri Suresh Kumar Vashishth, IAS, Commissioner, Land Records & Settlements, Dr. Bijay Ketan Upadhyaya, IAS, Secretary, BoR, DLRS, Standing Counsel, Advocates and senior officers were also present. 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# BoR launches Court Case Monitoring System 2.0

**THE CCMS 2.0 HAS ALSO BEEN INTEGRATED WITH BHULEKH TO HELP OFFICIALS EASILY FETCH RECORD OF RIGHTS FROM THE LAND RECORDS DATABASE. EVERYTHING HAS BEEN AUTOMATED AND MADE ONLINE, A BoR MEMBER SAID**

**Cuttack, July 4:** State Board of Revenue (BoR) launched the Court Case Monitoring System (CCMS), version 2.0, here Tuesday. Inaugurating the system, BoR member Raj Kumar Sharma directed the Board to work closely with the National Informatics Center (NIC) to move towards paperless functioning.

Sharma emphasised that paperless functioning would immensely help litigants approaching Revenue Courts for land records and other matters relating to 'record of rights.' He also directed the presiding officers of Revisional Courts to maintain transparency and always give priority to public service.

In the upgraded version 2.0, the entire process for filing of

Revision Cases till their disposal has been made online, marking a step towards making the process entirely paperless. "A Petitioner can file a Revision Case himself or herself online or through his or her advocate, pay the requisite court fee and other fees as prescribed online, as the Integrated Financial Management System (IFMS) has been incorporated into the software in collaboration with the Finance department and the Directorate of Treasury," informed a BoR member.

The CCMS 2.0 has also been integrated with Bhulekh to help officials easily fetch Record of Rights from the land records database. Once the petitioner files a case, a unique ID and password will be provided to him or her for future login and

to check the status of the case when required. Starting from generation of case number to the final order, everything has been automated and made online, added the member.

The Board of Revenue, currently with 39 Revision Courts, deals with disposal of cases relating to land issues. In the past year in the courts, a total of 91,409 cases have been heard and 14,285 cases have been disposed of, the highest record of the last five years.

Land Records and Settlement commissioner and chairperson of sub-committee on CCMS Suresh Kumar Vashisth, Board of Revenue secretary Bijay Ketan Upadhyaya and NIC senior technical director Pabitra Pattnaik were present at the inaugural event with other officers.

The NIC team led by Dr. Pabitranda Patnaik, Scientist-F under the guidance of Dr. Ashok Kumar Hota, DDG & SIO has completed the assignment in time. The praiseworthy contribution and timely execution of work by Smt. Choudhury Swarna Prava Panda, Scientist-F, Smt. Ambika Mohanty, Scientist-E and other team members made the complex, voluminous and sensitive work easy and implementable.

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
