## Sensitisation of District Informatics Officers on Interoperable Criminal Justice System (ICJS)

A State-level Workshop on the Interoperable Criminal Justice System (ICJS) was organised on 18 December 2025 at the State Crime Records Bureau (SCRB), Bhubaneswar, for the District Informatics Officers (DIOs) of the National Informatics Centre (NIC), Odisha. The workshop witnessed active participation from officers of both SCRB and NIC. The primary objective of the programme was to sensitise DIOs on the various components and modules of ICJS, thereby strengthening their understanding and engagement with the platform.

ICJS is a flagship initiative of the Ministry of Home Affairs, Government of India, implemented by NIC, aimed at integrating the core IT systems of Police (CCTNS), e-Courts, e-Prisons, e-Forensics and e-Prosecution. The initiative facilitates seamless data exchange and improved coordination across the criminal justice delivery system.



The conference was inaugurated by Shri Awinash Kumar, IPS, Inspector General of Police & Director, SCRB. In his keynote address, he underscored the critical role of DIOs in ensuring efficient, transparent and timely delivery of legal services through effective use of Information and Communication Technology (ICT). He emphasised the importance of digital transformation in justice delivery and the need for strong technical support at the grassroots level.

Dr. Ashok Kumar Hota, DDG & State Informatics Officer (SIO), NIC Odisha, welcomed the participants and highlighted NIC Odisha's initiatives to integrate Artificial Intelligence (AI) into applications related to the legal and judicial domains. Describing DIOs as the backbone of digital governance at the grassroots, he noted that their sensitisation on ICJS would accelerate adoption, facilitate troubleshooting and strengthen implementation across the State. He assured full technical support from NIC for the successful rollout of ICJS in Odisha.

The NIC ICJS Team from the Ministry of Home Affairs Informatics Division—Shri Deepak Kumar, Sr. Director (IT) & HoD, and Shri Ranjan Kumar, Jt. Director (IT) —joined the conference as resource persons. Shri Deepak Kumar provided an overview of ICJS and the central initiatives undertaken for the implementation of the new criminal laws. He briefed participants on key central applications such as eSakshya, eSummons, NyayShruti and the NCL Dashboard, highlighting their impact and the use of modern technologies to ensure end-to-end digital data integrity.

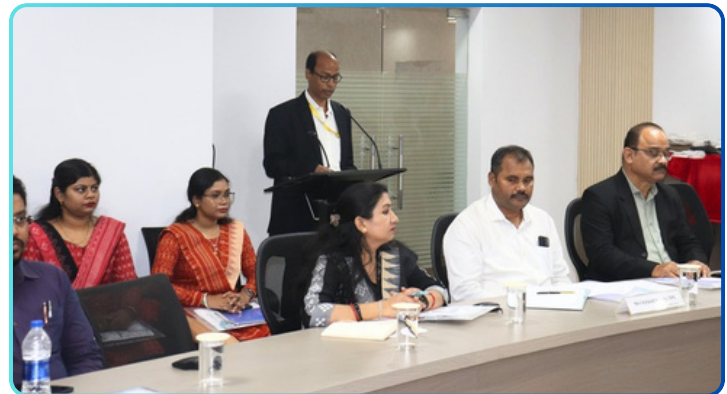


## Sensitisation of District Informatics Officers on Interoperable Criminal Justice System (ICJS)

Shri Ranjan Kumar delivered a detailed presentation on the workflows of these applications and elaborated on the crucial role of DIOs in their successful implementation in Odisha. He also explained the significance of other initiatives under the new criminal laws, including NyayShruti, e-Forensics, e-Prosecution and e-Prison, enabling the DIOs to gain a holistic understanding of the ICJS ecosystem and its ground-level implementation.

Key highlights of the conference included:-

- Technical sessions on ICJS architecture, data flow and integration protocols
- Live demonstrations of ICJS modules and dashboards
- Interactive Q&A sessions with domain experts and NIC officials
- Discussions on implementation challenges and best practices



Ms. Parul Gupta, IPS, DIG (Computer), SCRB, delivered the vote of thanks, appreciating the collaborative efforts in organising the workshop and expressing confidence in the active involvement of DIOs for the effective rollout of ICJS. The event was attended by Shri Malay Kumar Das, Sr. Director (IT) & Additional SIO; Shri Siba Prasad Dash, Sr. Director (IT) & State Coordinator (ICJS); Shri Jayanta Kumar Mishra, Sr. Director (IT) & GM, NICSI; and Shri Akshyaya Kumar Mishra, Director (IT) (e-Prison), from NIC Odisha State Centre. From SCRB, Shri Chintamani Patra, OPS(S), SP (Computer), Ms. Akanshya Roy, Inspector (Computer), along with the CCTNS team, were present.

Interactions with police officials indicated satisfactory performance of the associated web and mobile applications, with no major technical issues observed.

## ICJS Workshop Enhances Justice Delivery

Bhubaneswar: A state-level workshop focusing on the Interoperable Criminal Justice System (ICJS) was conducted on December 18, 2025, at the State Crime Research Bureau (SCRB) in Bhubaneswar. The event was specifically organized for District Informatics Officers (DIOs) from the National Informatics Centre (NIC) Odisha, drawing active participation from both SCRB and NIC officials. The primary goal of the session was to educate these officers on the various modules of the ICJS platform to improve technical engagement at the local level.

The ICJS is a major initiative by the Ministry of Home Affairs aimed at integrating the information technology systems of the police, courts, prisons, forensics, and prosecution. This integration allows for seamless data sharing and better coordination throughout the criminal justice process.

Shri Awinash Kumar, Inspector General of Police and Director of SCRB, inaugurated the conference. During his keynote address, he emphasized the vital role informatics officers play in ensuring that legal services are delivered in an efficient and transparent manner. He stressed the importance of digital transformation and the necessity of providing robust technical support at the grassroots level.

Dr. Ashok Kumar Hota, State Informatics Officer for NIC Odisha, welcomed the attendees and spoke about new initiatives to integrate artificial intelligence into legal and judicial applications. He referred to the District Informatics Officers as the backbone of digital governance, noting that their training would speed up the implementation and troubleshooting of the ICJS across the state.



The workshop featured resource persons from the Ministry of Home Affairs Informatics Division, including Shri Deepak Kumar and Shri Ranjan Kumar. They provided a comprehensive overview of the system and discussed new central applications such as eSakshya, eSummons, and NyayShruti. These tools are designed to maintain digital data integrity under new criminal laws. Detailed presentations were given on workflows and the specific responsibilities of informatics officers in making these systems successful.

The event included technical sessions on system architecture, live demonstrations of various dashboards, and interactive question-and-answer periods. Participants also discussed potential implementation challenges and shared best practices for the rollout.

Ms. Parul Gupta, DIG (Computer) at SCRB, concluded the event with a vote of thanks, expressing confidence that the collaborative efforts between the police and technical officers would lead to an effective rollout of the system. Several senior scientists and officials from both NIC and SCRB were in attendance to support the initiative.

As part of the program, central and state teams conducted field visits to three police stations. They assessed the practical application of the eSummons and eSakshya tools and interacted with local police officials. The visit confirmed that the mobile and web applications are performing well without significant technical issues. The workshop ended with a collective commitment to use these digital tools to create a faster and more efficient justice delivery system.
