Subject :- Instruction regarding elections to the offices of President and Vice-President of Municipalities.

Sir/Madam,

I am directed to refer to the State Election Commission's letter No.SEC/1ME/2003/3728-48, dated 17.04.2003 on the subject noted above vide which the instructions for elections to the offices of President and Vice President of Municipalities were issued. On reconsideration, I have been directed to substitute the sub para (ix) of the para 2 of the letter as under:-

(ix) "That the ballot papers shall be signed by the Deputy Commissioner or the officer appointed by him and one ballot paper each shall be handed over to each member present for each election, who shall be required to vote by writing "Yes" or "No" on the ballot paper against the name of the candidate for whom he wishes to vote. If a member is unable due to illiteracy, blindness or other physical infirmity to record his vote, the Deputy Commissioner or the officer appointed by him for the meeting shall record the vote on ballot paper in accordance with the wishes of such member. The ballot paper shall not be signed by the member nor be marked in any other way that could reveal his identity. If the ballot paper is so signed or marked or mutilated, the vote shall be void."

The other instructions issued by the State Election Commission vide its above referred letter shall remain unchanged.
