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## **PREFACE**

It gives me immense satisfaction to present the report on the 5<sup>th</sup> Municipal General Elections, 2016-18 which will enter as a golden chapter in the history of grass-root level democracy in Haryana. Embellished with many firsts and path-breaking decisions, the elections will be remembered not only for record turn-out; use of photo-electoral rolls; but also for the fact that the young generation took lead in contesting and voting. The trends would indicate that the poor, particularly the women and amongst them the Scheduled Caste Women are ready to provide their leadership in the arena of urban democracy. The females have been able to occupy seats beyond their 'quotas'.

The enthusiasm that marked the peaceful 5<sup>th</sup> Municipal General Elections got reflected 67.0 per cent turn-out. The educational qualification norms for those wanting to contest the Urban Local Bodies elections, fixed by the state government and resulted in educated youth coming forward lowering the average age of successful Urban Local Bodies to 31 to 40 years

The State Election Commission, Haryana, a constitutional body responsible for the conduct and supervision of elections to the Urban Local Bodies, took several steps to conduct free, fair and peaceful elections so as to inspire the confidence among general public, the political parties and contesting candidates in the state. Information Technology tools were used extensively with a view to injecting transparency and fairness in the conduct of elections. The use of e-Dashboard played a vital role of fast-pacing dissemination of information and completing the process in record time.

This report on the fifth edition of Urban Local Bodies General Elections, brought out by the State Election Commission, contains statistics relating to several attributes of elected members, such as age, gender, educational qualification and gender-wise number of votes polled and total number of electors. All statistics have been presented in an easy-to-read-and digest format, i.e tabular and graphical form.

For successful conduct of the 5<sup>th</sup> Urban Local Bodies General Election, 2016-18, I would like to put on record my appreciation of the assistance rendered by all the field officers, especially Inspectors General of Police, Police Commissioners, Deputy Commissioners, Superintendents of Police and Sub-Divisional Magistrate. But for their help and involvement, this feat, packed with records and initiatives, could not

have been accomplished. The officers and staff of the State Election Commission who worked tirelessly throughout the day and night certainly merit a word of appreciation.

I hope that the present report would prove to be a valuable asset for the field officers, especially Deputy Commissioners, Revising Authorities, Inspectors General of Police, Police Commissioners, District Superintendents of Police and other officers, as important guidelines. The report shall also be of interest and useful for scholars of universities, colleges and research institutions, who may be interested in observing the unique grass-root democratic processes in urban areas.

For the benefit of the public, the report has also been hosted on the Commission's website, [www.secharyana.gov.in](http://www.secharyana.gov.in).

This unique document could not have been prepared without the whole hearted assistance and hard work of the officers and staff of the State Election Commission.

The Commission would welcome feedback from readers and users of the report for making improvements while bringing out similar reports in future.

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## Chapter-1

### INTRODUCTION

- 1.1 Elections play an important role in a democratic set up and are its lifeline. It is only through the elections that the true wishes and the will of the people in the matter of choosing their representatives is reflected and the aims of democracy realized. The conduct of elections in a free, fair, transparent and impartial manner is, therefore, imperative and assumes significance especially in the context of proper functioning of grass root local bodies.
- 1.2 In Article-40 of Constitution of India, under Part IV-Directive Principles of State Policy, there is a special provision relating to 'Panchayats', which provides that the State shall take steps to organize 'Village Panchayats' and endow them with such powers and authorities as may be necessary to enable them to function as units of self-government. In pursuance of this constitutional provision, the State Governments had enacted laws for establishing 'Village Panchayats' and Panchayati Raj Institutions at the Block and District level.
- 1.3 In view of several defects in the legal framework and shortcomings in their functioning, the "Panchayats" were not able to live up to the expectations of the people as well as the founding fathers of the Constitution. It was, therefore, felt that the basic and essential features of the Panchayati Raj Institutions, such as certainty of tenure, continuity and, financial and administrative authority, should be provided Constitutional safeguards. For this purpose, the Constitution was amended by the Constitution (Seventy Third) Amendment Act, 1992. After the ractification by the requisite number of State Legislatures, it came into force with effect from April 24, 1993.
- 1.4 Like Panchayati Raj Institutions, municipal committees, councils and corporations had also become weak and ineffective as institutions of local self government in towns, cities and metropolitan areas. Elections of municipal bodies were not held on a regular basis and several municipalities were superseded and remained in the administrative control of bureaucracy for a very long period. Neither proper devolution of funds was made available to them, nor the required administrative and financial powers delegated to them.



- 1.5 Therefore, along with the Constitution (Seventy Third) Amendment Act, 1992 relating to the 'Panchayats', the Constitution (Seventy Fourth) Amendment Act was also passed in the year 1992 for providing similar constitutional guarantees in relation to the functioning of Municipalities on the lines provided for the 'Panchayats' in the Seventy Third Constitutional Amendment. This Act came into force on June 1, 1993.
- 1.6 One of the most significant features of the Constitution (Seventy Third) Amendment Act, 1992 and the Constitution (Seventy Fourth) Amendment Act, 1992 is constitution of an autonomous body "State Election Commission" in various States for conducting elections to the Panchayati Raj Institutions (PRIs) and Urban Local Bodies (ULBs), identical to the Election Commission of India.
- 1.7 In pursuance of the provisions of Article 243K and 243ZA of the Constitution of India, the superintendence, direction and control of the preparation of electoral rolls for, and the conduct of, elections to municipalities has been vested in the State Election Commission. Holding of regular elections to the urban local bodies at an interval of every five years without break is also one of the important features of the Seventy Fourth Constitution Amendment. Another important feature of this Constitutional amendment is "reservation of seats and offices" including those of Chairpersons of such bodies for the weaker sections; such as the Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and Women, especially that of reserving not less than 33% seats and offices for the Women. After the Constitution (Seventy Fourth) Amendment Act, 1992, it is not possible for the State Governments now to enhance the life of the elected bodies beyond the period of five years even by enacting any law and also to postpone their elections.
- 1.8 Pursuant to the Constitution (Seventy Fourth) Amendment Act, 1992, the State amended the Haryana Municipal Act, 1973 by Act 3 of 1994, relating to the municipal councils and municipal committees to make it compatible with the Constitution (Seventy Fourth) Amendment Act, 1992, be that in terms of representation of weaker sections in the respective bodies and their

Chairpersons, or be it for completion of election before the expiry of their term.

- 1.9 The State Election Commission in the State of Haryana was constituted with effect from November 18, 1993, vide State Government's Notification No.SO.101/Const/Art.243K/243ZA/93 dated 18.11.1993. Since then, the Commission has conducted fifth municipal general elections in the years 1994, 2000, 2005, 2010 and 2016. This report is on the Fifth General Elections held in the year 2016 to 2018.

#### **Fifth Municipal General Elections**

- 1.10 The Fifth Municipal General Elections were held in six phases to 7 Municipal Corporations, 17 Municipal Councils and 50 Municipal Committees. In First Phase, elections were held on May 22, 2016 to 15 Municipal Councils and 28 Municipal Committees, in Second Phase, election was held on September 25, 2016 to Municipal Council, Sirsa, in third Phase, election was held on January 8, 2017 to Municipal Corporation, Faridabad and Municipal Council, Bhiwani, in fourth phase election was held on September 24, 2017 to Municipal Corporation, Gurugram and two newly constituted Municipal Committees, Barara & Radaur, in fifth phase election was held on May 13, 2018 to 18 Municipal Committees and in Sixth phase election was held on December 16, 2018 to 5 Municipal Corporation and 2 Municipal Committees. A list of Municipalities for which elections were held, is given in Table 7.1 of Chapter 7.
- 1.11 As stated above, this report relates to the Municipal General Elections held in the year 2016 to 2018.

## Chapter-2

### STATE ELECTION COMMISSION, HARYANA

- 2.1 As mentioned in Para 1.9, the State Election Commission was constituted in the State of Haryana with effect from November 18, 1993, vide the State Government's Notification No.SO.101/Const/Art.243K/ 243ZA/93, dated 18.11.1993.
- 2.2 The provisions relating to the status and powers of the State Election Commission in Article 243K and 243ZA are analogous to that of the Election Commission of India provided under Article 324 (1) of the Constitution of India. The only difference in the two provisions is that the State Election Commission has been entrusted with the responsibility for the preparation of electoral rolls for, and the conduct of, all elections to the Panchayati Raj Institutions and Municipalities under Articles 243K and 243ZA, whereas the Election Commission of India has been assigned the responsibility for the preparation of electoral rolls for, and the conduct of, all elections to Parliament and to the Legislatures of every State and of elections to the offices of President and Vice President of India. In order to ensure that the State Election Commission functions as an independent Constitutional body outside the control of executive to enable it to conduct the elections to the panchayats and municipalities in a free, fair and peaceful manner, the concept of independence has been made explicit in the provisions of Article 243K(2), which provides that the State Election Commissioner shall not be removed from his office except in the like manner and on the like grounds as the Judge of a High Court and the conditions of service of the State Election Commissioner shall not be varied to his disadvantage after his appointment. The State Election Commission, unlike the Election Commission of India, is a Commission headed by the State Election Commissioner, who is appointed by the Governor of the State under clause (2) of Article 243K of the Constitution of India. Clause (3) of Article 243K explicitly provides that the Governor of the State shall, when so requested by the State Election Commission, make available to the State Election Commission such staff as

may be necessary for the discharge of functions conferred on the State Election Commission by clause (1).

- 2.3 In pursuance of the provisions of Article 243K and 243ZA of Constitution of India, the Legislature of the State of Haryana has made provisions in Section 212 of the Haryana Panchayati Raj Act, 1994, Section 3A of the Haryana Municipal Act, 1973 and Section 9 of the Haryana Municipal Corporation Act, 1994, for the conduct of elections to Panchayati Raj Institutions and Municipalities.

#### **Terms and Conditions of Service of State Election Commissioner**

- 2.4 **Rules** - In pursuance of the provisions contained in clause (2) of Article 243K, the State Government has prescribed vide Notification no. G.S.R.37/Const./Art-243K/94, dated 05.05.1994, the conditions of service and tenure of the office of the State Election Commissioner in “The State Election Commissioner (Conditions of Service) Rules, 1994”, hereinafter referred as to Rules. The State Election Commissioner has been defined as the State Election Commissioner appointed under clause (1) of Article 243K of the Constitution of India, meaning thereby that the State Election Commissioner shall be appointed by the Governor of the State.
- 2.5 **Qualifications** – A person, who is or has been a Judge of a High Court, or a person who has served the Government in the rank of Commissioner for a minimum period of five years or is serving the State Government in a higher rank namely Financial Commissioner. The minimum age for the State Election Commissioner has been prescribed as 55 years.
- 2.6 **Tenure** - The tenure of the State Election Commissioner is five years from the date he assumes office subject to that where the State Election Commissioner attains the age of sixty five years before the expiry of the said term of five years, he shall vacate his office on the date on which he attains the said age, provided further that on expiry of the said term, he shall continue to hold office until his successor is appointed and enters upon his office, but this period shall not in any case, exceed six months. The Commissioner may, at any time, by writing under his hand addressed to the Governor, resign his office. A person, who on the date of his appointment as

State Election Commissioner was in the service of the Central or State Government, shall be deemed to have retired from such service with effect from the date of his appointment as State Election Commissioner.

- 2.7 **Salary** - The State Election Commissioner is entitled to a salary equal to the salary of the Chief Secretary to Government of Haryana subject to the condition that if a person who immediately before the date of assuming office as the State Election Commissioner was in receipt of, or, being eligible so to do, had opted to draw a pension in respect of any previous service under the Government of India or under the State Government or any other service, his salary in respect of service as the State Election Commissioner shall be reduced (a) by the amount of that pension, (b) by the amount of the commuted value in respect of previous if he had, before assuming office, received, in lieu of a portion of the pension due to him.
- 2.8 **Allowances** - The State Election Commissioner shall be entitled to travelling allowance, rent free accommodation and exemption from liability to pay income tax on the value of such rent free accommodation, conveyance facility, sumptuary allowance and such other conditions of service as are, for the time being applicable to a Judge of the High Court, were applicable to him at the time of retirement or at the time of his appointment as State Election Commissioner, so far as may be applicable to the State Election Commissioner.
- 2.9 **Leave** – According to Rules, the State Election Commissioner may be granted leave by Governor in accordance with such rules as are for the time being applicable to the members of the service to which he/she earlier belonged. The Governor of the State is vested with the power to grant or refuse leave to the State Election Commissioner and to revoke or curtail leave granted to him.
- 2.10 On ceasing to hold office, the State Election Commissioner, shall not be eligible for any further appointment under the Government, except with the approval of the Governor. A person, if he is of unsound mind or if he is an undischarged insolvent or if he has been convicted of an offence involving moral

turpitude, shall be disqualified for being appointed or for being as the State Election Commissioner.

2.11 **Pension** - According to the Haryana Govt. Notification No.G.S.R.21/Const./Art.243/2009, dated 26.08.2009, pension admissible to the State Election Commissioner is as under:-

2.11.1 Where the State Election Commissioner demits his office either by resignation or is deemed to have demitted his office as per sub rule (2), he shall on such demission be entitled to a pension at the rate of rupees sixteen thousand twenty per annum for each completed year of service in the Commission.

Provided that the aggregate amount of the pension payable under this rule together with the amount of any pension including commuted portion of pension, if any, drawn or entitled to be drawn while holding office as State Election Commissioner shall not exceed the maximum amount of pension for the Chief Secretary of the State.

2.11.2 Except where the State Election Commissioner demits office by resignation, he shall be deemed, for the purposes of these rules, to have demitted his office, if, --

- (a) he has completed the term of office specified in rule 6; or
- (b) he has attained the age of 65 years; or
- (c) his demission of office is medically certified to be necessitated by ill health.

2.12 **Status** - The State Election Commissioner, Haryana has been given the status equivalent to the Judge of the High Court under Article 20 of the State Order of Precedence issued vide Government Notification No.50/215/99-5PP dated 25.05.2000.

2.13 **Powers Delegated** - Vide orders issued under No.20/18/94-4(2P)(i)/(ii), dated 28.3.1995, the State Election Commissioner, Haryana has also been delegated all the financial and administrative powers available to the Administrative Secretary to Government of Haryana, so far as the work relating to the State Election Commission is concerned.

### **Incumbency Position of State Election Commissioners**

- 2.14 Shri J.K.Duggal, an IAS (Retd) officer of 1963 batch of Haryana Cadre, from July 15, 1994 to July 14, 1999. During his tenure, the First General Elections to Urban Local Bodies were conducted in the year 1994.
- 2.15 Shri T.D.Jogpal, an IAS (Retd.) officer of 1968 batch of Haryana Cadre, from July 14, 1999 to July 14, 2004. During his tenure, the Second General Elections to Urban Local Bodies were held in the year 2000, 2003 and 2004.
- 2.16 Shri Chander Singh, an IAS (Retd.) officer of 1973 batch of Haryana Cadre, from September 14, 2004 to November 7, 2009. During his tenure, the Third General Elections to Urban Local Bodies were held in the year 2005, 2007, 2008 & 2009.
- 2.17 Shri Dharam Vir, an IAS (Retd.) officer of 1973 batch of Haryana Cadre, from November 9, 2009 onwards. Prior to this assignment he was Chief Secretary to the Govt. of Haryana. During his tenure, the Fourth Municipal General Elections, 2010 to the Urban Local Bodies were held in May and December, 2010.
- 2.18 Shri Rajeev Sharma, an IAS (Retd.) officer of 1989 batch of Haryana Cadre, from May 5, 2015 to July 12, 2016. During his tenure, the Fifth General Elections, 2016 to the Urban Local Bodies were held in May, 2016.
- 2.19 Shri Dalip Singh, an IAS (Retd.) officer of 1982 batch of Haryana Cadre assumed the charge as State Election Commissioner, Haryana on July 12, 2016. During his tenure, the Fifth General Elections, 2016 to the Urban Local Bodies were held in September, 2016, January & September, 2017 and May & December, 2018.
- 2.20 The State Election Commission is functioning in its newly constructed office building Nirvachan Sadan, Plot No.2, Sector-17, Panchkula.
- 2.21 The State Election Commissioner is supported by a team of 50 officers/officials including Secretary at the Headquarter and 9 officials at district level. A list of officers/officials working as on April 15, 2019 is given as *Annexure 2.1*.

## Chapter-3

### DE-LIMITATION AND RESERVATION

3.1 In pursuance of the provisions of Article 243K and 243ZA of the Constitution of India, a new Section 3A was inserted in the Haryana Municipal Act, 1973 vide Act 3 of 1994 providing that the superintendence, direction and control of the preparation of electoral rolls for, and the conduct of, all elections to the municipalities shall vest in the State Election Commission. Similar provisions in respect of municipal corporations have been provided vide Act No. 16 of 1994 in Section 9 of the Haryana Municipal Corporation Act, 1994.

#### A. Delimitation

3.2 The delimitation and reservation of wards is the first requisite for holding any election of a municipal body. This function has been assigned to the State authorities in accordance with provisions of Sections 9 and 10 of the Haryana Municipal Act, 1973 and Rule 3 of the Haryana Municipal De-limitation of Ward Rules, 1977, in respect of municipal councils and municipal committees and Sections 6 and 11 of the Haryana Municipal Corporation Act and Rule 3 of the Haryana Municipal Corporation De-limitation of Ward Rules, 1994, in respect of municipal corporations.

3.3 Section 9 of the Haryana Municipal Act, 1973 provides that the number of elected members of a municipal council and municipal committee shall not be less than 11 and more than 31, as may be prescribed by rules. Rule 3 of the Haryana Municipal De-limitation of Ward Rules, 1977, provides that after every Census, the total number of seats of each such body shall be fixed by the Government on the basis of the latest Census figures. The number of seats to be filled by election of each body shall be fixed/re-fixed in accordance with the following formula –

#### **Number of Seats fixed in the Municipalities according to Population**

The number of seats for members belonging to the Scheduled Castes shall be fixed in proportion to their population in each body in accordance with the following formula -

$$\frac{\text{Total number of seats} \times \text{Population of Scheduled Castes}}{\text{Total Population}}$$

- 3.4 The Haryana Municipal Delimitation of Ward Rules, 1977 provide that the State Government shall constitute an Ad-hoc Body comprising Director, Urban Development, Haryana or his representative as Chairman and Deputy Commissioner of the district concerned or his representative, President or Administrator and the Executive Officer or Secretary for such body as members. The Ad-hoc Body shall also associate with itself not more than five members belonging to various interests / groups out of the sitting members of the committee or out of the members of the dissolved committee, as the case may be.
- 3.5 It also provides that wards shall, as far as practicable, be geographically compact areas, and having regard to physical features, existing boundaries of administrative units, if any, facilities of communication and public convenience and the population of each ward as far as practicable should be the same throughout the committee with a variation up to ten percent above or below the average population per ward. It also provides that the wards reserved for members of the Scheduled Castes and Backward Classes shall, as far as practicable, be located in those areas where the proportion of their population to the total population of the committee is the largest.
- 3.6 The proposal for delimitation of wards of the committee or council prepared by the Ad-hoc Body is submitted to the government for consideration, and after the government's approval, it is published in the Official Gazette for eliciting objections or suggestions from the public. After considering all

objections and suggestions that are received, the final order made by the government for the delimitation of wards of the committee or council, is published, which shall have the force of law.

- 3.7 Almost similar provisions are contained in the Haryana Municipal Corporation Delimitation of Ward Rules, 1994 for the de-limitation of wards of municipal corporations. The Government of Haryana, Urban Local Bodies Department has amended the Haryana Municipal Corporation Delimitation of Ward Rules, 1994 vide notification No. 15/2/2004-3C-II, dated 16.06.2015 and these rules may be called the Haryana Municipal Corporation Delimitation of Ward (Amendment) Rules, 2015.

In the Haryana Municipal Corporation Delimitation of Ward Rules, 1994, in rule 3, for sub-rule (1) the following sub-rule shall be substituted, namely:—

“(1) after every census, the total number of seats of each Corporation shall be fixed by the Government on the basis of the latest census figures. In case certain area is included within, or excluded from the limits of a Municipal area, the population shall be ascertained on the spot in respect of such area and shall be added to, or excluded from the latest census figures of that Corporation for the purpose of refixation of seats of the Corporation. The number of seats to be filled by the election of each Corporation shall be fixed or refixed in accordance with the formula given below:—

3.8 After section 6A, the sections 6A & 6B, in the Haryana Municipal Corporation Act, 1994, and after section 7, section 7A in the Haryana Municipal Act, 1973 shall be inserted by the Government vide notification no. Leg. 20&21/2018, dated 19<sup>th</sup> April,2018 namely:—

**6A. Bar to Interference by Courts.**—notwithstanding anything contained in this Act, the validity of any law relating to the delimitation of constituencies and the allotment of seats to such constituencies, made or purporting to be made under this Act or the rules framed there under, shall not be called in question in any court.

**6B&7A. Time limit for delimitation and reservation of wards.** – The work relating to the delimitation and reservation of wards of the Corporation shall be completed six months before the completion of the tenure of the Corporation, failing which the State Election Commission shall go ahead with the process of preparation of electoral rolls and conduct of elections on the basis of existing delimitation and reservation of wards.

In pursuance of the provision of Rule 10 of the Haryana Municipal Corporation Delimitation of Ward Rules, 1994 and Haryana Municipal Delimitation of Ward Rules, 1977 the Governor of Haryana publish the delimitation of wards of the municipalities on the basis of 2011 census figure in the Haryana Government Extraordinary Gazette on the dates mentioned in the table 3.1 given below:-

## B. Reservations - Legal Provisions

### Municipal Councils and Committees

3.9 **Seats** - Section 10 of the Haryana Municipal Act, 1973 provides that

- i. The seats in a municipality shall be reserved for the Scheduled Castes in proportion to their population in the municipal area to the total population of the municipal area and such seats shall be allotted to such wards having maximum population of persons belonging to the Scheduled Castes,
- ii. One third of the seats reserved for the Scheduled Castes shall be reserved for Women belonging to the Scheduled Castes,

- iii. Not less than one third of the total number of seats in a municipality shall be reserved for Women (including women belonging to the Scheduled Castes), and
- iv. Two seats in each municipality shall be reserved for the Backward Classes which shall be allotted to the wards having maximum population of persons belonging to the Backward Classes.

3.10 **Presidents** - Section 10 of the Haryana Municipal Act, 1973 read with Rule 70 of the Haryana Municipal Election Rules, 1978 further provides that (i) the offices of the Chairpersons i.e. Presidents of the municipal councils and municipal committees, shall be reserved for the Scheduled Castes and Backward Classes in proportion to their population in the State to the total population of the State; (ii) not less than one third of the total number of offices of Presidents in the municipal councils and municipal committees shall be reserved for Women (including the offices reserved for Women belonging to the Scheduled Castes and Backward Classes).

#### **Municipal Corporations**

3.11 **Seats** - The provision regarding the reservation of seats in the municipal corporations as provided under Section 11 of the Haryana Municipal Corporation Act, 1994 and Rule 71 of the Haryana Municipal Corporation Election Rules, 1994 are similar to the provision made in the Haryana Municipal Act, 1973 and the Haryana Municipal Election Rules, 1978 for the municipal councils and municipal committees.

3.12 **Mayor** - Section 11 of the Haryana Municipal Corporation Act, 1994 read with sub-rule (7) of Rule 71 of the Haryana Municipal Corporation Election Rules, 1994 provides that the offices of the Mayor in the corporations shall be filled through direct election by the electors from amongst the persons belonging to the General Category, Scheduled Castes, Backward Classes and Women by rotation which shall be determined in the manner that the number of offices of the Mayor reserved for the Scheduled Castes and Backward Classes in the State shall bear as may be the same proportion to the total number of such the offices of the Corporation as the population of Scheduled and Backward Classes in the state bears to the total population of the State. Provided that

not less than one third of the total number offices or the Mayor in the Corporation shall be reserved for Women including the offices reserved for Scheduled Castes and Backward Women. The reservation of offices for women shall rotate to different Corporations, which shall be determined by draw of lots, by a Committee consisting of Director, Urban Local Bodies Department, Divisional Commissioner and Commissioner of the concerned Corporation: Provided further that number of offices of the Mayor for Scheduled Castes and Backward Classes shall be determined on the basis of their population and shall rotate to different remaining Corporation firstly, having largest population of Scheduled Castes, secondly, from the remaining Corporations having largest population of Backward Classes, and they rotate in the subsequent terms of offices of the Corporation having their next largest population and so on. In case of percentage of population of two Corporations as regards Backward Classes and Scheduled Castes is the same, the reservation shall be determined by draw of lots to be conducted by a Committee referred in the above proviso.

- 3.13 Number of seats reserved for different categories of municipalities is given in Table 3.2.

## Chapter-4

### ELECTORAL ROLLS

- 4.1 In accordance with Article 243ZA of the Constitution of India, the superintendence, direction and control for preparation of electoral rolls of the municipalities and for conduct of elections of the municipalities in the State vests in the State Election Commission.
- 4.2 Electoral rolls commonly known as voters list are the basic document on which the entire electoral process rests. When the constituencies of the municipalities are called upon to elect their representatives to the municipalities, it, in fact, means calling upon the persons residing in these municipalities and enrolled in the electoral rolls of the municipalities to elect their representatives. Therefore, the preparation of electoral rolls as accurate and defect-free as is humanly possible is extremely important for conduct of fair and free elections. For doing so, it needs to be ensured that the names of all eligible electors i.e. voters are included in the electoral rolls of municipalities and the names of all ineligible persons excluded there-from. The revision/updating of electoral rolls of the municipalities from time to time allows the younger persons on attaining the minimum prescribed age to get their names included in the rolls and all other eligible persons shifting or migrate to the municipal areas, after the last revision, to get their names included in the rolls. In the intensive revision of the rolls, door to door surveys are undertaken to delete from the rolls, the names of all the persons who had expired and also of those who have shifted or migrated out of the municipal limits and also to include the names of all eligible persons whose names could not be included during the last revision. It has nevertheless to be conceded that no electoral roll can ever be perfect and totally error free at all times. Therefore, some marginal errors cannot be ruled out. Even the Supreme Court in the case of Lakshmi Charan Sen V/s AKM Hassan Uzzman and others (known as West Bengal Electoral Rolls) had observed that the perfect roll is not possible. But this does not mean that at the time of updating and revising the rolls, efforts should not to be made to remove the shortcomings in the electoral rolls. It was mainly for realizing the importance



of preparing defect-free electoral rolls that it has been provided in the Constitution that not only the conduct of election but also the preparation of electoral rolls is entrusted to an independent body like the Election Commission.

- 4.3 Before March, 2017, the electoral rolls of the municipalities were being prepared on the basis of the electoral rolls of the respective Legislative Assembly Constituencies prepared by the Election Commission of India. The State Election Commission, while preparing the electoral rolls of the municipalities, used to include new voters or delete voters in the electoral rolls prepared by the Election Commission of India. But, as per the amendment made by the Government in the Haryana Municipal Corporation Election Rules, 1994 vide Notifications No. 4/4/2017-R-II dated 14th March, 2017, and Haryana Municipal Election Rules, 1978 vide Notifications No. 4/4/2017-R-II dated 22 May, 2017 *such practice has been discontinued*. As per new amendment, only the electors existing in the respective area of the Legislative Assembly Constituency shall be distributed in the wards of the municipalities. It is also clarified that if any person intends to get his name included in the electoral roll of municipalities, he shall have to first get his name included in the electoral rolls of respective Legislative Assembly Constituency; otherwise his name shall not be included in the electoral rolls of the municipalities.
- 4.4 **Legal Provisions** - Rules 3 to 17 of the Haryana Municipal Election Rules, 1978 and Rule 3 to 19 of the Haryana Municipal Corporation Election Rules, 1994 lay down procedure for the preparation/revision, correction, custody and preservation of the electoral rolls of municipalities.
- 4.5 The 1978 Rules provide that the Deputy Commissioner shall, under the superintendence, direction and control of the State Election Commission, cause to prepare the electoral rolls for each constituency of the committee in accordance with these rules. For this purpose the Deputy Commissioner may appoint any Gazetted Officer to be Revising Authority for the purpose of hearing claims and objections relating to the rolls. The rules provide that the rolls are to be prepared in Hindi or in such other language(s) and in such form

as the State Election Commission may direct. The Commission has decided that electoral rolls should be prepared in Hindi language.

- 4.6 **Inclusion, deletion and correction of names in the ward wise electoral roll finally published:** - Any person whose name is not included in the ward wise electoral roll finally published may apply to the Deputy Commissioner for addition/deletion/correction of his name in the ward wise electoral roll. Provided that the addition/deletion or correction of any name in the ward wise electoral roll of a Municipalities shall only be made, if the name of claimant/applicant exists in the relevant part of assembly electoral roll till the first day of filing nomination papers for the elections of Municipalities
- 4.7 As soon as the wardbandi work is completed by the Govt., the Commission prepared the wardwise and boothwise electoral rolls of all wards of the seven municipal corporations, 17 municipal councils and 50 municipal committees w.r.t. January 1<sup>st</sup>, as the qualifying date on the basis of Assembly Electoral rolls and final publication of the electoral rolls as given in Table 4.1

4.8 On the basis of past experience, it was decided to make the process of preparing electoral rolls more efficient, transparent and people friendly the following directions were given to the Revising Authorities:-

(i) The Deputy Commissioner shall give wide publicity to the above programme. He shall issue press notes and also paid advertisements in two local newspapers. He shall also make publicity through local cable network.

(ii) The Deputy Commissioner shall publish, on the date prescribed in sub-para (ii) of para 2 above, the draft electoral rolls along with a notice including the dates by and the places where the claims and objections with reference to the draft rolls may be presented to the Revising Authority/Authorities.

(iii) One copy of the draft electoral roll, published for inviting claims and objections, shall be kept for inspection of the public free of cost at the following places:-

1. Office of the Municipalities.
2. Office of Revising Authority/Authorities and
3. Voter Information and Collection Centers (VICCs)

(iv) After the draft publication of the ward-wise electoral rolls, the same should also be hosted on the website of the District Administration, with search facility on the date of its publication.

(v) A copy of the draft and final rolls alongwith database in compact disc duly signed by the Revising Authority/Authorities shall be kept in a sealed cover in the Treasury within 24 hours from the date of the publication of draft and final electoral rolls respectively.

(vi) In order to facilitate the electors and the public to obtain information regarding electoral rolls and to file claims and objections, the concerned Deputy Commissioner shall set-up sufficient number of Voters Information and Collection Centers (VICC) within the territorial limits of the Municipalities. These Centers shall be fully equipped with computers and broadband internet connection. The Centers will be set up with the help of the National Informatics Center.

- (vii) Every claim and objection regarding distribution of electors ward wise shall be addressed and presented to the Revising Authority in the prescribed Form A and B or may be sent by registered post to him.
- (viii) Claim in Form-A shall be filed by those applicants, who intend to include their name, make correction in their entry or transposing of their name in another ward in the electoral roll.
- (ix) Objections in Form-B shall be filed by those applicants who intend to object inclusion of name or seek deletion of a name from the electoral roll.
- (x) Only those persons shall file their claim for inclusion of their name in the electoral roll of Municipalities, whose name appear in the respective electoral roll of legislative assembly, but do not appear in the draft electoral rolls published under rule 4 (3) of the Haryana Municipal Corporation Election Rules, 1994 and Haryana Municipal Election Rules, 1978.
- (xi) The VICC will make available the prescribed forms, on demand free of cost, for filing claims and objections and receive the same for the consideration of and decision by the concerned Revising Authority or the officers authorized for this purpose. The forms shall also be hosted on the website of the District Administration for downloading and filing claims and objections.
- (xii) As and when any person files claim and objection, he shall be given a receipt in the prescribed format given in the form. An entry shall also be made in internet based monitoring system and manual registers.
- (xiii) The Deputy Commissioner shall appoint one Authorized Officer not below Group-B for maximum up to three wards and sufficient number of supporting staff and other officials of Municipality, to assist the Revising Authority/Authorities to discharge his/their duty.
- (xiv) The Revising Authority/Authorities shall, after holding such enquiry into the claims or objections as he/they think(s) fit, record his/their decision in writing and shall make available forthwith a copy of such decision to the objector or the claimant free of charge. The decision of the Revising Authorities shall also be hosted on the website for the information of the public. Number of claims/objections accepted and rejected shall also be hosted on the website of the District Administration.

(xv) The Revising Authority/Authorities after disposal of all the claims and objections in terms of under Rule 4 (4) (vii) of the Haryana Municipal Corporation Election Rules, 1994 and Haryana Municipal Election Rules, 1978 shall forward a list of such claims and objections along with his/their orders thereon to the concerned Deputy Commissioner. Any person aggrieved of any such order of the Revising Authority/Authorities may, within prescribed period, file an appeal to the Deputy Commissioner. The Deputy Commissioner shall within the specified time decide the appeal. The decision of the Deputy Commissioner on appeal shall be final. The rolls so amended shall be final and two copies thereof duly signed by the Deputy Commissioner and Revising Authority shall be kept in their offices together with list of additions and corrections.

4.9 In the Fifth Municipal General Elections, 2016-18, on an average there were 16,046 voters per ward in the municipal corporation, 2,711 voters in municipal councils and 1,083 voters in municipal committees. The total number of voters and average number of voters per wards, in respect of the municipalities which went to the general elections during 2016-18 are given in Table 4.2

## Chapter-5

### PRINTING OF BALLOT PAPERS AND ELECTORAL ROLLS

5.1 Under the traditional system, voting takes place by means of ballot papers and ballot boxes. In this system, counting of votes is a very complex, laborious and time consuming process, which sometimes leads to chaos and law and order problems. All such problems were totally eliminated, as the State Election Commission decided to hold all the municipal elections with electronic voting machine. The use of EVMs is allowed under Sub-section 1A of Section 275 of the Act, 1973 and Section 23A of the Act, 1994.

5.2 **Printing of Ballot Papers** – In case of Municipal Corporation, as per provision contained in Rule 70F and 70L of the Haryana Municipal Corporation Elections Rules, 1994 and also as per Notification No. SEC/2ME/2010/1634, dated 06.05.2010 and Rule 69F and 69L of the Haryana Municipal Elections Rules, 1978 and also as per Notification No. SEC/2ME/2007/1432, dated 13.02.2007, in case of municipal councils and municipal committees, the State Election Commission, Haryana, directed to the concerned Deputy Commissioners that the ballot papers for election to the municipal corporation, municipal councils and municipal committees would be prepared and printed in *devnagri* script as per the design so specified for Electronic Voting Machine from the Controller, Printing and Stationery Department, Haryana.

The State Government vide its notification No.Leg.33.2018, dated 4<sup>th</sup> October, 2018, has amended the Haryana Municipal Corporation Act, 1994, according to which Mayor in all Municipal Corporations shall be chosen through the direct election by the electors of all wards of concerned Municipal Corporation. And in view of this, guidelines for the printing of ballot paper for the election of Municipal Corporation issued by the Commission vide notification no. SEC/2ME/2010/1634, dated 06.05.2010 has been amended vide Commission notification no.SEC/2ME/2018/6625 dated 29<sup>th</sup> November, 2018 as under:-

- (i) Ballot paper for the post of Mayor of Municipal Corporation shall be printed on pink paper with black ink.
- (ii) Ballot paper for the post of Member, Municipal Corporation shall be printed on white paper with black ink.
- (iii) The remaining instructions issued vide notification referred above shall remain unchanged.

5.3 **Printing of photograph on ballot paper** – In some cases where more than one contesting candidates having similar names in the contest and due to alphabetical arrangements of names on the ballot paper, names and symbols of such candidates are printed one after the other which creates confusion in the mind of the voters coming to cast their votes at a polling station and in view of this the Commission vide its order no. SEC/1ME/2016/3730-3781, dated 23<sup>rd</sup> December, 2016, has ordered to print the photograph of the contesting candidate on the ballot paper along with other particulars to be displayed on the ballot unit of EVM and the tendered ballot papers in addition to the existing particulars, the photograph of the candidate to be printed in the panel for the name of the candidates and to appear on the right side of the name in between of the name and symbol of the candidate. The size of the photograph to be printed on the ballot paper shall be 2.0cm x 2.5cm.

5.4 There were 185 wards of Municipal Corporations, 447 wards of municipal councils and 734 wards of municipal committees in which the elections were held. A total of 4,730 polling stations were established but the elections were held at 4,683 polling stations as 9 members of municipal councils and 24 of municipal committees were elected unopposed. The ballot papers for these municipalities were got printed from the Controller, Printing & Stationery Department, Haryana. Two ballot papers for each Electronic Voting Machine and eight tendered ballot papers for each polling station were also printed.

5.5 **Implementation of NOTA** – In first time the Commission had implemented the NOTA (None of the above) to enable a voter to press button on EVM against this panel to show that he/she does not wish to vote to any of the above contesting candidates vide order no. SEC/1ME/2016/3653-3659, dated 14<sup>th</sup> December, 2016 in compliance with the order dated 27.09.2013 passed

by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in the Writ Petition (Civil) No. 161 of 2004 in People's Union for Civil Liberties Vs Union of India, in the elections of Municipal Corporation, Faridabad and Municipal Council, Bhiwani which were held in the third phase on 08.01.2017 and further above order has been amended by the Commission vide order no. SEC/1ME/2018/5833-5880, dated 22<sup>nd</sup> November, 2018 and has ordered that

(i) NOTA shall be treated as a 'Fictional Electoral Candidate' while declaring the election results,

(ii) In case, a contesting candidate and the "Fictional Electoral Candidate" i.e. NOTA receive highest equal number valid votes then the contesting candidate (not NOTA) shall be declared as elected.

(iii) If in any election, all the contesting candidates individually receive lesser votes than the 'Fictional Electoral Candidate' i.e. NOTA then none of the contesting candidates will be declared as elected.

(iv) In case of situation arising under sub-section (iii) above, re-election shall be held for the seat. Further all such contesting candidates who secured less votes than NOTA shall not be eligible to re-file the nomination/contest the re-election.

(v) In re-election, if NOTA again get highest votes then further election will not be conducted and contesting candidate with highest votes (excluding NOTA) shall be declared as elected.

The following procedure shall be followed in such circumstances,

(i) If a Returning Officer, upon completion of counting but before declaration of result, finds that NOTA has received higher valid votes than all other contesting candidates individually; then Returning Officer shall not declare the result for that particular seat/s and shall immediately send his report to State Election Commission in this regard.

ii) Upon receipt of such report, the State Election Commission shall after satisfaction, declare the fresh election programme for the said seat/s.

These orders applicable to the general and bye-elections to all the Urban Local Bodies and their after general election of five Municipal Corporation namely Hisar, Karnal, Panipat, Rohtak, Yamuna Nagar and two



Municipal Committee Jakhal Mandi and Pundri were held on 16.12.2018. The detail of total voters, votes polled and votes polled for NOTA and percentage of voted polled to the total votes and percentage of votes polled to NOTA to the votes polled are given below in table 5.1.

5.6 **Printing of Voters List/Electoral Rolls** – The State Election Commission vide its letter no. SEC/2ME/2015/693, dated 2.7.2015 directed all the Deputy Commissioners in the State that master copy of voters list/electoral rolls of Panchayati Raj Institutions and Municipalities shall be prepared at district level.

5.7 For printing of 30 copies of voters list/ electoral rolls in respect of Panchayati Raj Institutions/Municipalities, the State Election Commission took on panel the same firms (list given below) and the printing rates as approved and fixed by the Chief Electoral Officer, Haryana. The printing rate approved was Rs 0.70 (Seventy paisa) on the terms and conditions prescribed by the Commission. List of the firms is as under:-

The Commission has also direct the Deputy Commissioner, Faridabad to print the voter list on the same rate and conditions as prescribed by the Chief

Electoral Officer, Haryana @ 71Paisa per leaf and the Deputy Commissioner, Faridabad was got printed the voter list of Municipal Corporation, Faridabad from M/s D.I.P.S.Technologis(P) Ltd., Delhi @ 71 paisa per leaf.

- 5.9 The Commission also advised the deputy commissioners that if some local printer was ready to do this job at the rate lower than above mentioned rate on both sides of the printing page for 30 copies on A4 size of 80 GSM paper on the basis of terms and conditions prescribed by the Commission, the same may be got done at district level keeping in view the quality and time-bound nature of the work.
- 5.10 However, as per provisions contained in sub rule (2) of the Haryana Municipal Election Rules, 1978, one complete copy of the electoral roll for each constituency duly authenticated by the Deputy Commissioner or by any other officer authorized by him shall be kept in his office or as such place as the State Election Commission for a period of six years from the date of its final publication.

## Chapter-6

### POLLING STATIONS AND POLL PERSONNEL

#### Polling Stations

- 6.1 **Legal Provisions** – According to Rule-34 of the Haryana Municipal Election Rules, 1978, the Returning Officer shall provide such number of polling stations as he may deem necessary and shall on the dates specified under Rule-19 in this behalf, post at his office and at the office of the committee, a list showing the polling stations so provided, the polling area or the group of voters for which they have respectively been provided and the hours during which they shall remain open for the poll. It also provides that the Returning Officer shall appoint a Presiding Officer for each polling station and such number of Polling Officers, as are considered necessary. In the booklet of instructions for the Returning Officers regarding conduct of elections, it has been provided that a list of proposed polling stations would be sent to the Commission and after approval of the Commission, the Returning Officer shall post the list at his office and at the office of the concerned municipality and such other conspicuous place as he may deem necessary. Accordingly, when the programme for election is issued, the Returning Officers are simultaneously requested to send a list of proposed polling stations. Normally one polling station is provided for about 1,000 voters.
- 6.2 Instructions were also issued by the Commission that the polling stations should be set up in such a manner that ordinarily, no voter is required to travel more than two Kilometers to reach the polling station and also that no polling station should be located in a Police Station, Hospital or a building having religious significance. The Deputy Commissioners were advised that the polling stations should preferably be located in the buildings of Government schools, Government aided recognized schools, Government offices and Semi-Government offices, as the furniture and equipments required in the polling station would be available there and can be used without any extra cost. The Deputy Commissioners were also advised that locating the polling station in private buildings and premises should, as far as possible be avoided. However, if no suitable Government building, Semi-

Government building/office, Government school and Government aided recognized school is available, then the polling station may be located in private buildings also but in that case, it should be ensured that there is no undue influence on the voters because of locating the polling station in the private building.

**6.3 Drafting of Polling Personnel for Election Duty – Randomization of Polling Personnel** – Since the duties discharged by the polling personnel are vital in the conduct of elections, sufficient care is needed to draft and deploy such personnel in the interest of free and fair election and accordingly, the Commission issued the following directions for the formation of polling parties:-

- (i) A district database, Deputy Commissioner-wise of all eligible poll personnel shall be maintained in an electronic form, which can facilitate computerized randomization. All relevant particulars like Name, Sex, Place of Residence (Municipality), Work Place, Home Municipality, Designation, Office and Department/Institution should be entered.
- (ii) Presiding Officers and Polling Officers are to be classified on the basis of scale of their pay, post and rank. As far as practicable Gazetted Officers will be deployed as Presiding Officers and failing that, officials who are working in supervisory capacity only should be deployed as Presiding Officers. The Presiding Officer should be of higher scale / grade in comparison to other Polling Officers of that formation.
- (iii) No person will be assigned polling duties in the ward of municipality in which he is posted or in which he resides.
- (iv) In order to avoid any allegation of collusion among the polling personnel in favour of any candidate or political party and to instill confidence in the minds of political parties and candidates about free and fair elections, proper mix of polling personnel drawn from different offices and departments at the time of formation of a polling party should be ensured. Two officials of the same serial group/category should not be put together. Further, two members of the polling party

should not be from the same department. In case of school teachers, they should not be from the same school.

- (v) Polling personnel should be drawn both from the State Government departments as well as the Central Government offices. As far as practicable Central Government employees should be drawn to the extent possible and may be posted at relatively more sensitive polling stations. The Central Government employees should be mixed with State employees on 50:50 bases, if available.
- (vi) Deputy Commissioner/Returning Officer should obtain a complete database of officers eligible for polling party duties from respective authorities. All relevant information should be entered into a electronic database of the computerized randomization application software approved already available with NIC which was used in General Elections of Vidhan Sabha.
- (vii) From this database of officers, a list of twice required number of polling persons should be generated (including reserve) randomly, using the software. This is the first of the three-stage randomization process. Presence of observers is not required at this stage. It should be noted that this randomized list is Deputy Commissioner-wise and not at any other level like subdivision, teshil, block, municipality etc. This is only to identify and select the officials that would be given training for poll duties as Presiding and Polling Officers in whichever municipality of that district. In no case, at this stage, the identity of the municipality to which the polling personnel are likely to be deployed will be known. All that the polling personnel will know at this stage is whether he (or she) is a Presiding Officer or a Polling Officer and the venue and time of trainings.
- (viii) The second stage of randomization exercise should be done in the presence of the Observer concerned. At this stage actual polling parties shall be formed on random basis using the randomization software. The Observer must be present at this stage. At this stage though the actual polling station will not be known, however, the

municipality may be known. The randomization should not take place before 4 or 5 days from the day of poll. For the purpose of serving the appointment letters, the Deputy Commissioner / Returning Officer can use the services of the sponsoring departments / authority and/or organize a training programme of poll personnel on that date when final briefing can be given and appointment letters issued to them.

- (ix) The third stage of randomization exercise shall take place at the time of dispersal of polling parties when the allocation of polling stations to the polling parties will be done. This third stage randomization for final allocation of polling stations to each polling party should also be done in the presence of Observers. The actual polling station allotted to individual polling personnel is to be disclosed just before the polling party actually leaves the dispersal centre.
- (x) In order to ensure that above instructions are complied with strictly, the Commission directs that the Deputy Commissioner/ Returning Officer shall furnish to the Election Commission through the Observers and separately to the State Election Commission, Haryana a certificate to the following effect immediately after the polling parties have been formed for an election –

Certified that –

- (I) The polling parties have been formed by a proper mix of officials drawn from different offices and departments, in presence of Observers and
  - (II) The officers have been drawn from the State Government departments as well as from the Central Government Offices, PSUs, etc. as far as practicable.
  - (III) For the purpose of making polling parties, complete data base of all eligible employees in the district has been used.
- (xi) It is clarified that the entire randomization exercise except the first stage must invariably be done in the presence of the Observers sent to the municipality. If, by any chance, the forming of the polling parties through randomization (second stage) has been done in the absence

of the Observers, then the 2<sup>nd</sup> stage randomization exercise should be done afresh in the presence of Observers and compliance report should be submitted in this regard. The Observers should make a special reference to the randomization exercise observed by them in their municipalities while submitting the report.

- (xii) All the Deputy Commissioners are requested to make available all copies of instructions to all the Observers of their district.

6.4 Rule 69N of Haryana Municipal Election Rules 1978 provides for voting by officers on election duty, which is as under:-

- (iv) An electoral who has been put on election duty as a Presiding Officer, a Polling Officer or in any other capacity in a polling station of a ward other than the one in which he is entitled to vote, and wishes to vote in the polling station in which he is on election duty, he shall send an application in Form 11 to the Returning Officer to allow him to vote at the polling station at which he is on duty, at least ten days before the days fixed for poll, and if the Returning Officer is satisfied that the applicant is a public servant and voter on election duty, he shall –
  - (a) Issue to the applicant an Election Duty Certificate in Form-13;
  - (b) Mark Election Duty Certificate against his name in the marked copy of the electoral roll to indicate that an Election Duty Certificate has been issued to him; and
  - (c) Ensure that he is not allowed to vote at the polling station where he shall otherwise have been entitled to vote.
- (v) On production of such certificate, the Presiding Officer shall –
  - (a) Obtain thereon, the signature of the person producing it;
  - (b) Have the person's name and electoral roll number and part number, along with name of polling station as mentioned in the certificate, entered at the end of the marked copy of the electoral roll; and
  - (c) Permit him to cast his vote in the same manner as for a voter entitled to vote at that polling station.



- (vi) After recording the vote under sub-rule (2), the certificate referred to in sub-rule (1) shall be placed in an envelope and sealed by the Presiding Officer.
- (vii) An elector who has been put in election duty as a Presiding Officer, a Polling Officer or in any other capacity in a ward other than the one of which he is voter, who wishes to vote by post at an election, shall send an application in Form 10 to the Returning Officer of the Constituency (Ward) in which he is enrolled for supply of postal ballot paper at least ten days before the days fixed for poll, and if the Returning Officer is satisfied that the applicant is on election duty in a ward other than of which he is a voter, he shall issue a postal ballot paper of such ward to him by post, under postal certificate, together with—
  - (a) a declaration in Form 14;
  - (b) a cover in Form 15;
  - (c) a larger cover in Form 16; and
  - (d) instructions for the voter in Form 17;

Provided that the Returning Officer shall at the same time –

- (a) record on the counterfoil of the postal ballot paper the electoral roll number of the voter entered in the marked copy of the electoral roll;
- (b) mark the name of voter in the marked copy of electoral roll to indicate that a postal ballot paper has been issued to him, without however recording therein the serial number of postal ballot paper issued to that voter; and
- (c) ensure that voter is not allowed to vote at a polling station:

Provided further that every postal ballot paper shall have a counterfoil attached thereto, and the postal ballot paper and the counterfoil shall be of such design as the State Election Commission may direct;

Provided further that the Returning Officer may, in the case of an elector on election duty who is entitled to vote by post,

deliver the ballot papers and forms or cause them to be delivered to such elector personally.

- (viii) The Returning Officer shall seal up in a separate packet the counterfoils of the postal ballot papers issued to voters.
- (ix)
  - (a) The voter referred to in sub-rule (4) shall record his vote on the postal ballot paper in accordance with the directions contained in Form 17 and then enclose it in the cover in Form 15.
  - (b) The voter shall sign the declaration in Form 14 in the presence of, and the signature attested by any Gazetted Officer or by the Presiding Officer of the polling station at which he is on election duty.
  - © After the voter has recorded his vote and made a declaration in Form 14, he shall return the postal ballot paper and declaration to the Returning Officer in accordance with the directions contained in Form 17 so as to reach the Returning Officer before the time fixed for the commencement of counting of votes.
- (7) In relation of voting by postal ballot paper referred to in sub-rule (4) such procedure, subject to provisions of this rule, shall be adopted as may be specified by the State Election Commission.

#### **Fifth Municipal General Elections, 2016-18**

- 6.5 In the Fifth Municipal General Elections, 2016-18, on an average there were 1,097 voters per polling stations for the election to the municipal corporation, 1,046 for election to the municipal councils and 915 voters for election to the municipal committees. The number of polling stations established, total number of voters and average number of voters per polling station, in respect of the municipalities which went to the general elections during 2016-18 are given in Table 6.1.

**Poll Personnel**

- 6.6 **Legal Provisions** - Under rule 34 of the Haryana Municipal Election Rules, 1978, it is the duty of the Returning Officer to appoint polling personnel namely a Presiding Officer, one or more Polling Officers for each polling station.
- 6.7 As only one vote was to be polled by a voter, the personnel required for a polling station was one Presiding Officer and three Polling Officers. Their duties in brief are given below:-
- (a) 1<sup>st</sup> Polling Officer: Incharge of identification of electors and marked copy of electoral roll.
  - (b) 2<sup>nd</sup> Polling Officer: Incharge of application of indelible ink and maintenance of register of voters. He will be incharge of voter slip also.
  - (c) 3<sup>rd</sup> Polling Officer: Incharge of control unit of voting machine.
- 6.8 The number of policemen for each polling station was deployed for election duty in consultation with the Director General of Police.
- 6.9 Detailed instructions for making poll arrangements were issued by the Commission to the Deputy Commissioners urging them to ensure that the appointment of Presiding Officers, Polling Officers and Other Polling Staff should be made in time and proper arrangements for transporting the polling parties, poll material etc. should also be made.

- 6.10 While appointing Presiding Officers and Polling Officers, the Deputy Commissioners were advised to take care that the persons having political leaning towards any candidate should be avoided for appointing them as poll personnel. The instructions for the Returning Officers also provide for proper training to the poll personnel.
- 6.11 Engineers from Bharat Electronic Limited, Bangalore were deputed in each municipality during the election for checking/inspection of the Electronic Voting Machines.
- 6.12 The Municipality-wise details of the polling stations established and the polling personnel deployed in the Fifth Municipal General Elections, 2016-18 are given in table 6.2 and detail information given in *Annexure 6.1*.

## Chapter-7

### ELECTION PROGRAMME

- 7.1 **Legal Provisions** - Clause (3) of Article 243U of the Constitution of India and Section 12(2) of the Haryana Municipal Act, 1973 provide that the election to constitute a municipal council/municipal committee shall be completed before the expiry of its duration which has been specified as five years from the date appointed for its first meeting and if a municipality is dissolved before the completion of its term, the elections are required to be completed before the expiration of a period of six months from the date of its dissolution. Similar provisions for municipal corporations exist in Section 5(2) of the Haryana Municipal Corporation Act, 1994.
- 7.2 Rule 19 of the Haryana Municipal Election Rules, 1978 and Rule 21 of the Haryana Municipal Corporation Elections Rules, 1994 provides that the State Election Commission shall frame election programme of a committee which shall be published at least five clear days from the date fixed for making nominations and shall specify the date or dates, by, on or within which the nomination papers shall be presented, list of nomination papers shall be posted, candidate may withdraw his candidature, list of contesting candidates shall be posted, list of polling stations shall be posted, poll shall be held, votes shall be counted and the result shall be declared. It also provides that a period of not less than five days shall be prescribed for the presentation of nomination papers and the last date of making nominations, their scrutiny and withdrawal shall not be a public holiday and if any of the last dates for these purposes happens to be a public holiday, such nomination, scrutiny or withdrawal shall take place the next succeeding day, which is not a holiday. It also provides that the date of poll shall not be earlier than tenth day after the last date fixed for withdrawal of candidatures.

#### **Fifth Municipal General Elections, 2016-18**

- 7.3 The election programme for the Fifth Municipal General Elections of 7 Municipal Corporation, 17 Municipal Councils and 50 Municipal Committees issued under clause (1) of the Article 243ZA of the Constitution of India, Section 9 of the Haryana Municipal Corporation Act, 1994 and Rule 21(1) of

the Haryana Municipal Corporation Elections Rules, 1994 and Section 3A of the Haryana Municipal Act, 1973 and Rule 19(1) of the Haryana Municipal Election Rules, 1978 has been issued by the Commission in six phase as given in Table 7.1.

## Chapter-8

### NOMINATIONS

- 8.1 **Legal Provisions** - Under Rule 20, the Returning Officer, on the dates specified under Rule 19 by notices posted at his office and at the office of the committee, and such other places as he may determine, (i) invite nomination papers of candidates for elections, (ii) fix the date, time and place where and how the nomination paper shall be delivered, (iii) specify the authority to whom nomination papers are delivered and (iv) fix the date, time and place for the scrutiny of nomination papers of the candidates.
- 8.2 The last date for making nomination papers, their scrutiny and withdrawal should not be public holidays and if it so happens, such nominations, scrutiny or withdrawal shall take place on the next succeeding day which is not a public holiday. This is, however, subject to the provisions that the State Election Commissioner, Haryana by an order amend, vary or modify the election programme at any time and no such order is deemed to invalidate any proceedings already taken before the date of the order.
- 8.3 No person is eligible to propose a candidate who is ineligible for election as a member of that municipality.
- 8.4 **Nominations** - Rule 23 of the Haryana Municipal Election Rules, 1978 provides that the nomination paper completed in Form-1 (*Annexure-8.1*) appended to the Rules and subscribed by the candidate himself as assenting to the nomination and by an elector as proposer, shall be presented either in person or by his proposer or by his agent between 11.00 AM and 3.00 PM or such hours as the Returning Officer may fix to suit the local requirements, on or before the date specified for presenting the nominations under Rule 20. Similar provisions also list in Rule 24 of the Haryana Municipal Corporation Election Rules, 1994 that the nomination paper completed in Form-1 (*Annexure-8.2*).
- 8.4.1 The contesting candidates are required to furnish the information with regard to their offence(s), conviction, Movable assets, immovable assets, liabilities/dues to the public financial institution and Government, detail of profession or occupation etc. in an

affidavit i.e. in form 1-C attached with the nomination paper of Municipal Council or Committee and Municipal Corporation.

8.4.2 The contesting candidates are also required to furnish the information with regard to the charges, if any, framed against them in a criminal case punishable with imprisonment for not less than ten years, arrears of any kind due, educational qualification etc. in an affidavit i.e. in Form 1-D attached with the nomination paper of Municipal Council or Committee and Municipal Corporation.

8.5 No nomination papers are to be received after the appointed time. The Returning Officers are further required to go out of the room a minute before the closing time and announce that they are going to close the door on the specified time and that no one will be allowed to enter the room, thereafter.

8.6 **Deposits** - The amount of deposits to be made by the candidates along with the nomination papers, which is required to be deposited with the Returning Officer in cash or in the Government Treasury, as prescribed in the Rules is given in Table 8.1.

8.7 **Scrutiny** - The Returning Officer or the Assistant Returning Officer, as the case may be, is required to acknowledge the receipt of the nomination paper in the printed form as prescribed in rule 25 of Haryana Municipal Election Rules, 1978 and rule 26 of the Haryana Municipal Corporation Rules, 1994. In addition, a notice to the candidate, of the date and time for

scrutiny of the nomination is also required to be given to as a token of receipt of nomination and notice of scrutiny. The Returning Officer or Assistant Returning Officer, as the case may be, shall at every stage prepare the notices of nomination containing descriptions similar to those contained in the nomination papers both of the candidates and the proposers and affix the same at the notice board of their office and the office of the municipality concerned.

- 8.8 **List of Validly Nominated Candidates** - Immediately after the nomination papers are scrutinized and decision regarding acceptance or rejection of the same is recorded, the Returning Officer prepares a list of validly nominated candidates and affixes it to the notice board of his office. After this exercise, any candidate can withdraw his candidature by notice in writing and by delivering it to the Returning Officer before 3.0 o'clock in the afternoon or such other hours as the Returning Officer may fix to suit the local requirements, on before the date specified in election programme.
- 8.9 **Final List of Contesting Candidates** - Immediately after the expiry of the time period within which candidatures may be withdrawn, the Returning Officer shall prepare (in Hindi and such other language or languages as may be prescribed by the State Election Commission) a list of contesting candidates, that is to say, candidates who were included in the list of validly nominated candidates and who have not withdrawn their candidatures within the prescribed period and cause it to be posted at some conspicuous place in his office and at the Municipal Office.
- 8.10 The said list shall contain the names in Hindi alphabetical order and address of the contesting candidates as given in the nomination papers together with the symbols assigned to each candidate.
- 8.11 **Analysis Relating to Nominations** - A detailed analysis of the number of nominations received, rejected, withdrawn, accepted etc. in the General Elections, 2016-18 has been made corporation-wise/ council-wise/committee-wise. The salient features of the analysis are as under:-
- 8.12 **Municipal Corporations** - During the Municipal General Elections, 2016-18, elections were held for 185 seats of member of seven Municipal

Corporations against which 1,334 nominations were received. Out of which, 29 nominations were rejected and 178 withdrawn. The remaining 1,127 nominations were accepted. Nominations rejected, withdrawn and accepted were 2.2, 13.3 and 84.5 percent respectively of the total number of nominations received (*Annexure 8.3*) as shown in Table 8.2.

8.13 The average number of nominations received and accepted per seat was 7.2 and 6.1 respectively. Out of the 942 candidates, who lost the election, security was refunded to 332 candidates and in respect of the remaining 610 candidates, it was forfeited (*Annexure 8.4*).

8.14 **Municipal Councils** - During the Municipal General Elections, 2016-17, elections were held for 447 seats of 17 municipal councils, against which 2614 nominations were received. Out of which, 74 nominations were rejected and 302 withdrawn. The remaining 2238 nominations were accepted. Nominations rejected, withdrawn and accepted were 2.8, 11.6 and 85.6 percent respectively of the total number of nominations received as shown in Table 8.3.

- 8.15 The average number of nominations received and accepted per seat was 5.8 and 5.0 respectively. The highest average number of nominations accepted per seat was 7.0 in Municipal Council, Bhiwani and the lowest average number of nominations accepted per seat was 3.2 in Municipal Council, Fatehabad (*Annexure 8.3*).
- 8.16 Out of total 447 seats of the municipal councils, 438 were contested and 9 members were elected unopposed. The percentage of number of members elected unopposed and through election of the total number of seats worked out to 2.0 and 98.0 respectively. From Municipal Council, Hansi, 2 members were elected unopposed and from each of Municipal Councils of Sohna, Jind, Narwana, Thanesar, Narnaul, palwal and Gohana one member was elected unopposed. No member was elected unopposed from the remaining municipal councils. Out of the 1,791 candidates, who lost the election, security was refunded to 787 candidates, whereas the security of the remaining 1004 candidates was forfeited (*Annexure 8.4*).
- 8.17 **Municipal Committees** - Elections were held for 734 seats of 50 municipal committees. Against these seats, 3,473 nominations were received, out of these, 85 nominations were rejected, 711 withdrawn and the remaining 2,677 nominations were accepted. Nominations rejected, withdrawn and accepted were 2.4, 20.5 and 77.1 percent respectively of the total number of nominations received as shown in Table 8.4.

- 8.18 The average number of nominations received and accepted per seat was 4.7 and 3.6 respectively. The highest average number of nominations accepted per seat was 5.4 in Municipal Committee, Barwala, whereas the lowest average number of nominations accepted per seat was 2.5 in Municipal Committee, Nissing (*Annexure 8.5*).
- 8.19 Out of total 734 seats of all municipal committees, 710 were contested and 24 members elected unopposed. In percentage terms, the number of members elected unopposed and through election was 3.3 and 96.7 respectively of the total number of seats. Out of the 1,943 candidates who lost the election, security was refunded to 1,121 candidates, whereas in respect of the remaining 822 candidates, it was forfeited (*Annexure 8.6*).

## Chapter-9

### DISQUALIFICATIONS

#### Legal Provisions

- 9.1 **Municipal Councils and Committees** – Section 13A of the Haryana Municipal Act, 1973 provides that (1) A person shall be disqualified for being chosen as and for being a member of a municipality: -
- (a) if he is so disqualified by or under any law for the time being in force for the purposes of election to the Legislature of the State of Haryana: Provided that no person shall be disqualified on the ground that he is less than twenty- five years of age if he had attained the age of twenty one years;
  - (b) if he is so disqualified by or under any law made by the Legislature of the State of Haryana ;
  - (c) Omitted.
  - (d) if he is convicted or has been convicted of an offence punishable under section 29, 30 and 31 of the Haryana Municipal Corporation Act, 1994 (16 of 1994), the Prevention of Corruption Act, 1988 (49 of 1988) or the Prevention of Terrorism Act, 2002 (15 of 2002)[;or]
  - (e) if he has been convicted or charges have been framed against him by a court in a criminal case for an offence, punishable with imprisonment for not less than ten years; or
  - (f) if he fails to pay an arrear of any kind due to him to any Primary Agriculture Cooperative Society, District Central Co-operative Bank and District Primary Co-operative Agriculture Rural Development Bank; or
  - (g) if he fails to pay arrears of electricity bills; or
  - (h) if he has not passed matriculation examination or its equivalent examination from any recognized institution/board: Provided that in case of a woman candidate or a candidate belonging to Scheduled Caste, the minimum qualification shall be middle pass Provided further that in case of a woman candidate belonging to Scheduled Caste, the minimum qualification shall be 5th pass; or
  - (i) if he fails to submit a self declaration to the effect that he has a functional toilet at his place of residence; or

(j) if he makes expenditure beyond the prescribed limit on his election or fails to submit his election expenditure statement.

(2) If any question arises as to whether a member of a municipality has become subject to any of the disqualifications mentioned in sub-section (1), the question shall be referred for the decision of such authority and in such manner as may be prescribed by rules.

(3) If any person furnishes a false caste certificate at the time of filing nomination, he shall be disqualified for a period of six years from contesting the election to the municipality.

9.2 If any question arises as to whether a member of municipality has become subject to any of the disqualifications mentioned in Sub-Section (1), the question shall be referred for decision of such authority and in such manner as may be prescribed by rule. As per sub-rule (4) of rule 21 of the Rules, 1978, the State Election Commissioner is the prescribed authority to decide the disqualification of a member and his decision shall be final.

9.3 Rule 21 of the Haryana Municipal Election Rules, 1978 also provides that no person shall be eligible for election as a member of a committee, who-

(a) is not an elector, that is a qualified voter for any constituency of that committee under these rules; and has not attained the age of twenty one years; or

(b) in the case of a seat reserved for the Scheduled Castes and Backward Classes is not a member of any of Scheduled Castes and Backward Classes in relation to the State of Haryana; or

(c) is under contract for work to be done for or goods to be supplied to the committee; or

(d) receives any remuneration out of the municipal fund for services rendered to the committee:

Provided that nothing contained in this clause shall debar a person, who receives as President, salary sanctioned by the State Government under Section 58 from standing for election or re-election as a member of the committee; or



- (e) has, within five years from the date fixed for the nomination of candidates under the provision of rule 20 been proscribed from Government employment; or
- (f) has at any time within five years from the date specified for the nomination of candidates under the provisions of rule 20 been serving a sentence of imprisonment for not less than two years; or
- (g) has at any time within five years from the date specified for the nomination of candidates under the provisions of rule 20 been convicted under the Protection of Civil Rights Act, 1955; or
- (h) is an un-discharged insolvent; or is in arrears of any kind exceeding rupees one hundred due from him (otherwise than as a trustee) to the committee when a special demand in this behalf has been served upon him by the committee; or
- (i) is a whole time salaried official in the service of any Panchayat Samiti, Gram Panchayat, Municipal Committee, Notified Area Committee or Cantonment Board, Improvement Trust or holds any office of profit under the Government of India or the Government of any State other than an office declared by the Legislature of the State of Haryana by law not to disqualify its holder for being chosen as and for being a member of the Legislative Assembly of the State; or
- (j) who is disqualified for such membership as a result of his election having been set aside under these rules; or
- (k) is disqualified for membership of any Panchayat Samiti or Gram Panchayat, Municipal Committee, Notified Area Committee or Cantonment Board, Improvement Trust as a result of his election for membership of such Samiti or Panchayat or Board or Trust or Committee having been declared void for corrupt practices; or
- (l) has at any time within five years from the date fixed for the nomination of candidates under the provisions of rule 20 been convicted of an offence under Section 171-E or 171-F of the Indian Penal Code (Act 45 of 1860), or having been disqualified from exercising any electoral right for a period of not less than five years in connection with an

election of the State Legislature is, on the said date of nomination, still subject to the disqualification.

9.3.1 The State Government may, for reasons to be recorded, except, any person or class of persons from the disqualifications contained in clauses (c) to (h) and clause (j).

9.3.2 No person shall be eligible to propose a candidate who is ineligible for elections as a member of that committee.

9.3.3 If any question arises as to whether a member of the committee has become subject to any of the disqualifications mentioned in the Act and the Rules, the question shall be referred by the Deputy Commissioner to the State Election Commissioner, Haryana whose decision shall be final.

9.4 **Municipal Corporation** – Almost similar provisions about the disqualification are contained for the Mayor or members of the municipal Corporation in Section 8 of the Haryana Municipal Corporation Act, 1994 and Rule 23 of the Haryana Municipal Corporation Election Rules, 1994.

9.5 **Removal of an elected member** – The State Government vide notification no. Leg.20/2018, dated 19<sup>th</sup> April, 2018 has inserted new sections after section 13H in the Haryana Municipal Act, 1978 regarding removal of an elected member as given below:-

**13 I. Removal of an elected member having any disqualification at time of election.**- The State Election Commission may, after such enquiry, as it may deem fit and after giving an opportunity of being heard, by order, remove a member, if he was having any disqualification mentioned in section 13A or rules framed under this Act at the time of his election. The office of the member so disqualified shall become vacant immediately.

**13 J. Removal of an elected member who fails to lodge election expenditure statement.**- If an elected member who fails to follow the provisions of sections 13F or 13H, he shall be removed by the State Election Commission after giving him an opportunity of being heard. The office of the member so disqualified shall become vacant immediately.

**13 K. Review.** - A member so disqualified under section 13 I or 13 J may file an application for review of order before the State Election Commission within a period of forty-five days from the receipt of the order. The order passed by the State Election Commission under this section shall be final and no civil court shall have jurisdiction to entertain a petition against such order.

9.6 Almost similar provisions about removal were inserted after section 34A in the Haryana Municipal Corporation Act, 1994 by inserting section 34B to 34D by the State Government vide notification no. Leg.33/2018, dated 4<sup>th</sup> October, 2018.

## Chapter-10

### POLITICAL PARTIES AND ELECTION SYMBOLS

- 10.1 **Legal Provisions** - No separate registration and recognition of the political parties is done by the State Election Commission, Haryana at its own level. Rather the registration and recognition of national parties and state level parties in Haryana State made by the Election Commission of India is adopted by the State Election Commission, Haryana for which the list is maintained and updated as and when any changes are notified by the Election Commission of India.
- 10.2 Rule 18 of the Haryana Municipal Election Rules, 1978 provides that the State Election Commission shall, by notification in the Official Gazette, publish list of symbols along with restrictions, if any, subject to which those may be chosen by a candidate at the election and may in the manner, add to or vary such list. Rule 23 provides that every nomination paper on Form-1 shall contain a declaration specifying the particular symbols which the candidate has chosen as his first, second and third preferences out of the list of symbols for the time being in force.
- 10.3 In the year 1996, in exercise of the powers vested under Rule 18 of the Haryana Municipal Election Rules, 1978, the State Election Commission, vide its Notification No.SEC/ME/96/6639 dated 14.05.1996, notified the Haryana Municipal Election Symbol (Reservation and Allotment) Order, 1996. The 1996 Order provides that the State Election Commission shall notify from time to time a list of recognized political parties and symbols reserved for them, a list of registered un-recognized political parties and also a list of free symbols. The Order also provides for allotment of symbols in the election held on party basis and for the allotment of symbols in election not held on party basis.
- 10.4 In pursuance of the Election Commission of India's Notification No. 56/2016/PPS-III, dated 13.12.2016 and sub rule (i) of Rule 18 of the Haryana Municipal Election Rules, 1978 read with Para 5 of the Haryana Municipal Election Symbols (Reservation and Allotment) Order, 2014 issued vide No.SEC/3ME/2014/609, dated 12.03.2014, the State Election Commission,

Haryana, vide its Notification No.SEC/3ME/2017/175, dated 18.01.2017 in supersession of its earlier Notification No. SEC/3ME/2014/897, dated 06.05.2014, published the following list of symbols for the candidates contesting election to municipal councils/municipal committees in the Haryana State:-

- 10.5 In Municipal Corporations, Bhartiya Janta Party contest the election on their symbol in 169 wards, Bahujan Samaj Party contest in 27 wards, Indian National Lok Dal contest in 11 wards out of 185 wards and one candidates of Communist Party of India (Marxist) contest the election of Municipal Corporation, Faridabad held in 2017. Out of which 104 candidates of Bhartiya Janta Party and one candidates of Indian National Lok Dal were elected and remaining 80 candidates were elected independent. Detail information is available in the (Annexure 10.1 and 10.2)
- 10.6 In Municipal Councils Elections held in 2016-18, Only Bhartiya Janta Party contest the election on their symbol in 29 wards out of 31 wards of Municipal Council, Sirsa and their 15 candidates were elected. Detail information is available in the (Annexure 10.1 and 10.2)
- 10.7 However, there was no response from the political parties to contest the Municipal Committees General Elections, on their symbols in the elections held in, 2016-18.

## Chapter-11

### ELECTRONIC VOTING MACHINES

- 11.1 **Legal Provisions** - Sub-section 1A of Section 275 of the Act, 1973 and Section 23A of the Act, 1994 states, “Notwithstanding anything contained in this Act or the Rules made there under, the casting and recording of votes by voting machines may be adopted in such a manner as may be prescribed, in such municipality or municipalities as the State Election Commission may, having regard to the circumstances of each case, specify”.
- 11.2 For the purpose of above section/sub-section “Voting Machine” has been defined as the machine or apparatus whether operated electronically or otherwise used for casting or recording of votes and any reference to a ballot box or ballot paper in this Act or the rules made there under shall, save as otherwise provided, be construed as including a reference to such voting machine wherever such voting machine is used at any election.
- 11.3 For the first time, the State Election Commission decided that Electronic Voting Machines (EVMs) shall be used for all the municipal general and bye elections in the State. Accordingly, the general and bye elections have been conducted with the help of EVM of the Commission.
- 11.4 The municipality-wise details of number of Electronic Voting Machines used for the Fifth Municipal General Elections, 2016-18 are shown in Table 11.1.

## Chapter-12

### MODEL CODE OF CONDUCT

- 12.1 In exercise of powers conferred upon it under Article 243ZA of the Constitution of India, the State Election Commission, Haryana issued the Model Code of Conduct for election to Urban Local Bodies to ensure free, fair and peaceful elections. The Model Code of Conduct is required to be observed by all the political parties, contesting candidates, ministers, employees of the State Government and local bodies and other public servants related with the local body elections. The Model Code of Conduct was enforced from the date of announcement of the elections till the date of declaration of result of the local bodies concerned.
- 12.2 As per provisions of the Model Code of Conduct, the campaigning was stopped 48 hours before the hours fixed for the close of poll. The State Election Commission issued separate instructions requesting the Financial Commissioner & Principal Secretary to Government of Haryana, Prohibition and Excise & Taxation Department to notify 'dry days' under the relevant laws for such period during the municipal elections, as were appropriate at or around the area where the municipal elections were to be held. It was further clarified that such period of dry days declared and notified must include the period of two days before the polling days, i.e. the polling and counting days and the day immediately thereafter. He was further requested to issue directions that: -
- (i) No liquor shops, hotels, restaurants, clubs and other establishments selling/serving liquor shall be permitted to sell/serve liquor whatsoever on the aforesaid dates.
  - (ii) No proprietary clubs, star hotels, restaurants etc. and hotels run by anyone even if they are issued different categories of licenses for possessions and supply of liquor should also be permitted to serve liquors on these days.
  - (iii) The storage of liquor by individuals shall be curtailed during the above period and the restrictions provided in the Excise Laws on the storage in unlicensed premises shall be vigorously enforced.

- (iv) Steps should also be taken to prohibit sale of liquor in adjoining areas where elections were held, so that there were no chances of clandestine movement of liquor from those areas where the restriction not been in operation.

In response to the above request, the Excise and Taxation Commissioner, Haryana issued necessary orders imposing ban to sell, serve and storage of liquor within the jurisdiction of the areas where the municipal general elections were to be held as per the details given in the election programme, and areas adjoining the jurisdiction thereof during the above said period.

- 12.3 Simultaneously, the Chief Secretary to Government of Haryana was also requested to declare a holiday under Section 25 of the Negotiable Instruments Act, 1881 on election days at the places where the elections were to be held, so that the workers engaged in various factories and commercial establishments located in the above areas could exercise their votes. Accordingly, the Chief Secretary to Government of Haryana notified holiday on the election days under the above said Act.
- 12.4 The Commission also issued orders imposing ban on transfer of officers and officials connected with process of election in the municipalities and also imposing ban on recruitment, appointment and promotion during the period when the Model Code of Conduct is in force. The Commission also issued directions that during the period when the Model Code of Conduct is in force, the Ministers will not give any grant from the Government funds and no foundation stone will be laid down for any new project or scheme.
- 12.5 Instructions were also issued by the State Election Commission to the Deputy Commissioners about preventing misuse of vehicles on the poll day, deployment of police force at the counting centers, law and order situation during the elections, prohibition on sale of liquor, declaration of holiday on poll day. The copies of the above instructions along with copy of Model Code of Conduct are available at State Election Commission's website.

## Chapter-13

### APPOINTMENT OF OBSERVERS

- 13.1 The State Election Commissioner, in exercise of powers conferred on him under Article 243ZA of the Constitution of India, had appointed IAS officers as Observer (Election) and officers of the Finance Department & Excise and Taxation Department as Observer (Expenditure).
- 13.2 The Commission had directed to the concerned Deputy Commissioners to provide following facilities to the Observers: -
- i. Free accommodation in Rest House during their stay in the district.
  - ii. Vehicle with wireless set so that in emergency, they can immediately contact the nearest police station or the concerned officer.
  - iii. Security Officer/Security Guards and a Revenue Officer (as a Guide) who is well conversant with the roads/areas of the district.
  - iv. Telephone facility at the District Headquarter so that they can contact the State Election Commission or officers of the District/Block Headquarters, when necessary.
  - v. When needed by them, the services of steno-typists should be provided to them.
- 13.3 The Deputy Commissioners were also advised that the information regarding arrival of the Observers (along with their place of stay and telephone numbers) should be given to all the recognized political parties and it should also be published in the local newspapers for the information of the contesting candidates. The Deputy Commissioners were also advised to contact the Observers on their arrival in the district and to provide necessary information and assistance required by them.

#### **Fifth Municipal General Elections, 2016-18**

- 13.4 During the Fifth Municipal General Elections, 2016-18, seven municipal corporations, 17 municipal councils, and 50 municipal committees, 27 IAS and 10 HCS Officers were appointed as Observers (Election). In addition, 36 Deputy Excise and Taxation Commissioners of Excise and Taxation Department were appointed as Observers (Expenditure). The details of the

officers appointed as Observer (Election) and Observer (Expenditure) are as under.

13.5 **Election Observers** – The following IAS and HCS officers were appointed as Observers (Election) for Municipal General Elections, 2016-18.

- 13.6 The Observers (Election) were advised to go in the area two or three days before the date of poll and were advised to perform the following functions : -
1. to paste a sticker on their vehicle clearly showing that it is being used by Election Observer.
  2. that during their stay in the district they should not hesitate to meet and listen the complaints of the representatives of the recognized political parties, candidates and general public etc. and solve on the spot so that the elections could be conducted in a free and fair atmosphere.
  3. that during their stay if they receive any kind of complaint regarding threat to the voters or the voters had been deprived of their right to exercise their franchise by threats, observers should go to the troubled spot and analyse the factual position and if they find some truth in these complaints, they should immediately contact the concerned Deputy Commissioner and Police Officers so that suitable legal measures could be taken.
  4. that if the State Election Commission directs them to go to a particular area to find out genuineness of a complaint, they should immediately visit the spot and send independent report to the State Election Commission through fax or wireless.
  5. that as soon as the election process is finished and the votes have been counted, they were required to send a detailed report on all the points to the State Election Commission.

13.8 The Observers (Expenditure) were directed to perform the following functions-

1. that each contesting candidate has maintained day to day account of the expenditure from the date of withdrawal onwards;
2. that account is maintained along with supporting documents/ vouchers and the failure to produce proper accounts by these contesting candidates is to be considered as major default; and
3. to see that all types of expenditures incurred by the candidates such as petrol, postage, printing of pamphlets/ election campaigning material, advertisement in the newspapers, stationery items and any other such

expenditure which might have been directly incurred in connection with the election is accounted for.

- 13.9 **Police Observers** – The Commission had appointed the Police Observers in first time in the municipal general elections held in the year of 2017 of municipal corporation Faridabad, Gurugram and in the municipal council, Bhiwani and also in the municipal general elections held in the year of 2018 of municipal corporation, Hisar, Karnal, Panipat, Rohtak and Yamuna Nagar. Names of the officers appointed as Police Observers for Municipal General Elections, 2016-18 are given in Table 13.3.

- 13.10 The Observers (Police) were advised to perform the following duties : -
- (i) They will start interacting with District police authorities regarding overall review of law and order from the date of notification of election programme. Your visit immediately after the date of allotment of symbols by the Returning Officer and shall remain there till the end of the poll
  - (ii) They will immediately attend meetings holding the Deputy Commissioner, Police Commissioner / Deputy Commissioner of Police. Observers (Elections and Expenditure) and the officers concerned to review the arrangements made for the smooth conduct of the elections.
  - (iii) They will visit all the polling stations, particularly the sensitive and hyper-sensitive polling stations and to review the adequate police arrangements made by the district administration.



- (iv) They will keep a strict vigil on the law and order situation.
- (v) They will also keep strict vigil about distribution of cash or liquor and keep the Commission informed about remedial measures taken by you.
- (vi) They will also keep a vigil over excessive movement of illegal arms, ammunition, liquor, or anti social elements etc. and to ensure that the person from whom seizure is affected, is given proper acknowledgement.
- (vii) They will ensure that proper counter check is put to keep a watch on the officials engaged in checking of vehicles.
- (viii) They will ensure that all the complaints in respect of law and order are promptly acted upon effectively.
- (ix) They will initiate preventive measures to ensure that intimidation/obstruction/allurements do not really happen on the poll day and undertake tours and meet the communities and explain the arrangements. Complaints about obstructions/threat shall be enquired into immediately and necessary legal action taken.
- (x) They are advised to meet the contesting candidates, representatives of political parties and the public and hear their complaints and suggestions. It is expected from you that you will spare maximum time for such meetings.

## Chapter-14

### LAW AND ORDER

14.1 The request was made to the Additional Chief Secretary to Government, Haryana, Home Department vide Commission's letter No.SEC/1ME/2016/465 dated 28/04/2016 to ensure free and fair Municipal General Elections in the respective Municipal Councils/Committees. It was further enunciated to take following steps immediately in letter spirit to maintain law and order in the respective municipalities:

- (I) The police should be asked to be vigilant and start the mopping up operation of the areas infested with known goondas and bad elements about 10 days prior of the poll. During such mopping operation, special attention should be paid to unearth and seize unlicensed arms and ammunitions right from now.
- (II) No new arms licenses be issued with effect from 28/04/2016 date on which model code of Conduct has come into force with the announcement of Election Programme.
- (III) An order is issued prohibiting carrying of all licensed fire arms and lethal weapons with effect from 28/04/2016. Further effective steps may also be taken to unearth the un-licensed weapons and seize the same.
- (IV) Arrangement is made for deployment of police at each polling station and near each polling station and also in sensitive areas.
- (V) Adequate wireless sets are provided to improve communication for meeting any Law and Order problem of emergent nature.
- (VI) Strict vigil may be kept over movement of un-desirable elements and vigorous check may be carried out to prevent men and vehicles moving with arms and ammunition.
- (VII) Thorough checking of Lorries, trucks and other vehicles be carried out for three days before poll and on the poll day etc. to ensure that no undesirable elements or arms ammunition are infiltrated into and around the polling areas.

- (VIII) Restriction on movement of vehicles on poll days may be imposed and instructions may be issued to regulate vehicular traffic and playing of vehicles on poll days.
- (IX) Sale and consumption of liquor should be stopped on 21.05.2016 and 22.05.2016 otherwise penal action should be taken.

14.2 The Principal Secretary to Government, Haryana, Prohibition Excise and Taxation Department was also requested vide letter No. SEC/1ME/2016/471 dated 28.04.2016 to create and preserve the atmosphere conducive for holding free, fair and peaceful elections reflective of the true choice of the electorate. For meeting this objective, the State Election Commission had declared the polling day, day before polling and counting days as 'dry days' in the respective areas, where the elections were to be held. To maintain proper law and order, it was further directed that:-

- (I) No liquor shops, hotels, restaurants, clubs and other establishments' selling/serving liquor shall be permitted to sell/serve liquor to any person who so ever may be on the aforesaid dates.
- (II) No proprietary clubs, star hotels, restaurants etc. and hotels run by anyone even if they are issued different categories of licenses for possession and supply of liquor, should be permitted to serve liquors on these days.
- (III) The storage of liquors by individuals shall be curtailed during the above period and the restrictions provided in the Excise laws on the storage in unlicensed premises shall be vigorously enforced.
- (IV) Steps shall also be taken to prohibit the sale of liquor in adjoining areas of above mentioned Municipal Corporation/ Council/ Committee, so that there are no chances of clandestine movement of liquor from those areas, whereas the restriction has not been in operation.

14.3 The State Election Commissioner also mentioned that all the Deputy Commissioners may be requested to provide medical facilities with Mobile Dispensary and Ambulance in case of emergency.

- 14.4 Similer request was also made to the Additional Chief Secretary to Government, Haryana, Home Department to ensure free and fair General Elections of Municipal Corporations, Faridabad, Gurugram, Municipal Council, Bhiwani and Municipal Committees Barara and Radaur to further enunciated and take steps mentioned above immediately in letter spirit to maintain law and order. The Commission was also requested to the Additional Chief Secretary to Government, Haryana, Power and Renewal Energy and Public health Engineering Departments vide Commission's letter No.SEC/1ME/2016/3698-99 dated 21/12/2016 to facilitates the uninterrupted supply of electricity and drinking water to the voters and the staff on duty during the election of the municipalities.
- 14.4 The Superintendents of Police were also directed to send daily law and order report of their districts and copy of the order for deployment of police force for the conduct of elections.

## Chapter-15

### GENDER-WISE ANALYSIS OF CANDIDATES AND VOTERS

15.1 An analysis showing Gender-wise number of contesting candidates, elected members, total number of voters and voters who polled their votes, has been done for the 7 municipal corporations, 17 municipal councils and 50 municipal committees where the elections were held during the Fifth Municipal General Elections, 2016 - 18. The analysis has been given in the subsequent paragraphs.

#### **Municipal Corporations**

15.2 **Candidates** - In the Municipal Corporations, 1,127 candidates contested the election, out of which 654 were males and 473 females. The male and female candidates were in the ratio of 58.0 and 42.0 respectively of the total number of candidates (Annexure 15.1). 185 members were elected, out of which 111 males and 74 females. The percentage of male and female members elected was 60.0 and 40.0 respectively (*Annexure 15.2*) as shown in Table 15.1.

15.3 **Voters** - A total of 2,704 polling stations were set up in all the 185 wards for polling of votes. There were 29, 68,666 voters in the municipal Corporations, comprising 16, 02,564 males and 13, 66,102 females. The male and female voters constituted 54.0 and 46.0 percent respectively of the total number of voters (Annexure 15.3). 17, 53,645 voters comprising 9, 73,739 males and 7, 79,906 females, polled their votes. The percentage of male and female voters who cast their votes was 55.5 and 44.5 respectively (*Annexure 15.4*). The overall percentage of votes polled to total number of votes in the municipal corporation was 59.1 as shown in Table 15.2.

**Municipal Councils**

- 15.4 **Candidates** - During the Fifth Municipal General Elections, 2016-18, 2,238 candidates contested elections for 17 municipal councils, out of whom 1,280 candidates were male and 958 female. In percentage terms, male and female candidates were 57.2 and 42.8 percent respectively of the total number of candidates (*Annexure 15.1*). 447 members, 239 males and 208 females, were elected. The percentage of male and female members elected was 53.5 and 46.5 respectively (*Annexure 15.2*). It also shows that the success rate of females is higher as compared to males as given in Table 15.3.

- 15.5 **Voters** - A total of 1158 polling stations were set up for polling of votes for all the 447 seats of member of 17 municipal councils. As the members from 9 wards were elected unopposed, the polling took place at 1139 polling stations for 438 seats. There were a total of 12, 11,869 voters, comprising of 6, 41,838 males and 5, 70,031 females. Male and female voters constituted

53.0 and 47.0 percent respectively of the total number of voters (*Annexure 15.3*). Out of these, 11,90,448 voters comprising of 6,30,548(53.0%) males and 5,59,900(47.0%) females, were the voters of the municipal councils where elections were actually held i.e. these voters do not include the voters of those wards where the members were elected unopposed. 9,00,202 voters comprising 4,81,310 males and 4,18,892 females, polled their votes. The percentage of male and female voters who cast their votes was 53.5 and 46.5 respectively (*Annexure 15.4*). The male and female voters have polled their votes almost in the same ratio as of their respective share in total votes as shown in Table 15.4.

15.6 The overall percentage of votes polled to total number of votes in the municipal councils was 75.6. It was 76.3 for males and 74.8 for females. The overall percentage of votes polled to total votes is almost the same for both males and females (*Annexure 15.4*).

15.7 The polling percentage was highest of 82.0 in Municipal Council, Sohna and lowest of 68.7 in Municipal Council, Bahadurgarh. It varied from 70.5 to 81.0 in the remaining municipal councils (*Annexure 15.4*).

### **Municipal Committees**

15.8 **Candidates** - A total of 2,677 candidates contested election for 50 municipal committees during the Fifth Municipal General Elections, 2016-18, out of whom 1,447 candidates were male and 1,230 female. Male and female candidates constituted 54.1 and 45.9 percent respectively of the total number

of candidates (*Annexure 15.5*). 734 members comprising 389 males and 345 females were elected. The percentage of male and female members elected was 53.0 and 47.0 respectively (*Annexure 15.6*). The success rate of females, in case of municipal committees, is also higher as compared to males as given in Table 15.5.

**15.9 Voters** - A total of 868 polling stations were set up for polling of votes during the Fifth Municipal General Elections, 2016-18, in which elections were held for all the 734 seats of member of 50 municipal committees. But the polling could take place at 840 polling stations only as the members from 24 wards were elected unopposed. There were a total of 7, 95,064 voters in these municipal committees comprising of 4, 19,559 males and 3, 75,505 females. Male and female voters constituted 52.8 and 47.2 percent respectively of the total number of voters (*Annexure 15.7*). Out of these, 7, 70,018 voters comprising of 4, 06,312(52.8%) males and 3, 63,706(47.2%) females, were the voters of the municipal committees where elections were actually held i.e. these voters do not include the voters of those wards where the members were elected unopposed. 6, 46,687 voters comprising of 3, 43,343 males and 3, 03,344 females, polled their votes. The percentage of male and female voters who polled their votes was 53.1 and 46.9 respectively (*Annexure 15.8*). Based on the data, it turns out that male and female voters have polled their votes almost in the same ratio as of their respective share in total votes as shown in Table 15.6.

15.10 The overall percentage of votes polled to total number of votes in the municipal committees was 84.0. It was 84.5 for males and 83.4 for females. Here also the overall percentage of votes polled to total votes was almost the same for both males and females (*Annexure 15.8*).

15.11 The polling percentage was highest of 89.9 in Municipal Committee, Bawal and lowest of 75.4 in Municipal Committee, Naraingarh. It was between 76.6 to 89.5 percent in for the remaining municipal committees. The poll percentage of female voters was more then the male voters in 13 municipal committee namely Barara, Bawani Khera, Siwani, Loharu, Narnaund, Beri, Kalayat, Indri, Nilokheri, Nangal Choudhary, Samalkha, Ganaur and Kharkhoda (*Annexure 15.8*).

## Chapter-16

### COUNTING OF VOTES AND DECLARATION OF RESULT

16.1 Counting of votes is the most important stage in the process of election. Under the traditional system of voting by means of ballot papers and ballot boxes, the counting of votes used to be a very complex, laborious and time consuming process. The validity of each and every ballot paper polled at an election was to be decided after proper scrutiny and examination of each such ballot paper. Very often, there were disputes and controversies with regard to the availability or otherwise of a ballot paper and the Returning Officers were to resolve such disputes in respect of large number of ballot papers. All such disputes get totally eliminated by the use of electronic voting machines. The machine records correctly each vote polled by a voter by means of the voting machine and keeps an exact and up-to-date account candidate-wise of each vote so polled. All votes polled by means of voting machines are valid votes and as such there will be no invalid or rejected vote in respect of any polling station where the voting machines have been used. Thus, with the use of electronic voting machines, the process of counting has become accurate, simple, easier and quicker. Besides, it has enhanced the confidence of voters and general public in the election system and the number of disputes has come down significantly.

#### **System of Counting and Compilation of Results and Practice followed**

- 16.2 The counting of votes at an election where voting machines are used is regulated by the provisions of rule 70U of the Rules, 1994 or rule 69U of the Rules, 1978 as the case may be.
- 16.3 Rule 70T of the Rules, 1994 or rule 69T of the Rules, 1978, as the case may be, provides for scrutiny and inspection of voting machines before the counting, actual counting of votes recorded in the voting machines and declaration of result and sealing of voting machines after counting.
- 16.4 **Checking Seals on Control Units** - Before the votes recorded in any control unit of a voting machine are counted, the candidates or their election agents or their counting agents present at the counting table are allowed to inspect the outer strip seal, the special tag, the papers seals and such other vital

seals as may have been affixed on the carrying case and the control unit and to satisfy themselves that the seals are intact. The Returning Officer also satisfies himself that none of the voting machines is tampered with. If he is satisfied that any voting machine has in fact been tampered with, he shall not count the votes recorded in that machine and follow the procedure laid down in rule 70S of the Rules, 1994 or rule 69S of the Rules, 1978 as the case may be, applicable in respect of the polling station where that machine was used.

- 16.5 **Ascertaining the Result** - After satisfying that the paper seal is intact, the control unit is the same as was supplied at the polling station and there is no tampering with the same, the votes recorded therein are counted. For the result, I button is pressed and the total number of votes recorded for each candidate of the polling station is displayed automatically on the Display Panels of the control unit. The counting supervisor records the number of such votes separately in respect of each candidate in Part II – Result of counting in Form 17 in case of Municipal Corporations and in Form 18 in case of Municipal Councils/Committees.
- 16.6 **Resealing of Voting Machines after Counting** - After the result of voting recorded in a control unit has been ascertained, the same is entered candidate-wise in Part II - Result of Form 17 and in the Final Result sheet in Form 8, for municipal corporation and in Form 18 & 8 for municipal councils/committees. After counting of votes, the control unit is required, under rule 70V of the Rules, 1994 or rule 69V of the Rules, 1978 as the case may be, to be resealed with the seal of the Returning Officer and the seals of such of the candidates or their election agents who may desire to affix their seals thereon. The resealing has however to be done in such a manner that the result of voting recorded in the control unit is not obliterated and the unit retains the memory of such result.
- 16.7 **Safe Custody of Voting Machines** - Under sub-rule (I) of rule 70V of the Rules, 1994 or rule 69V of the Rules, 1978 as the case may be, the voting machines sealed as above are kept in the safe custody of the Deputy Commissioner as per rule 70X of the Rules, 1994 or rule 69X of the Rules,

1978 as the case may be and they are not to be opened or inspected by or produced before any person or authority except under the orders of a competent court. The machines so sealed are retained intact for such period as the SEC may direct and are not to be used for next election without the prior approval of the SEC under sub-rule(1) of rule 70Y of the Rules, 1994 or rule 69Y of the Rules, 1978 as the case may be.

**16.8 Sealing of other Election Papers for ensuring Safe Custody** - Apart from the voting machines, there are several other important election papers which require be sealing and securing for safe custody and storage. Under rule 70X(1) of the Rules, 1994 or rule 69X(1) of the Rules, 1978 as the case may be, the packets of election papers specified therein are not to be opened and their contents are not to be inspected by, or produced before, any person or authority except under the order of a competent court. Special care has to be taken for the safe custody of these papers. In view of their importance, the papers are also required to be sealed with the seal of the Returning Officer.

**16.9 Safe Custody of Election Records by Deputy Commissioner** - Immediately after the declaration of result of the election, on the same day and, in any case not later than the noon of the following day, all the voting machines and the sealed trunk(s) containing the packets mentioned in above paragraph are dispatched to the Deputy Commissioner or the Officer authorized by him at his headquarters and on receipt of the voting machines and the sealed trunk(s), the Deputy Commissioner forthwith arrange to deposit them for safe custody in the Treasury/Sub-treasury under double lock. The key of one of the locks of each trunk is entrusted to the Treasury Officer or an Officer in the Treasury/Sub-treasury authorized under the Treasury Code and the key of the other lock of each trunk is kept by the Deputy Commissioner himself or a senior officer nominated for the purpose by the Deputy Commissioner.

**16.10** The above mentioned procedure for counting of votes and declaration of result was followed for each and every ward of the municipalities where elections were held during the Municipal General Elections, 2016-18.

## Chapter-17

### RESERVATION STATUS

- 17.1 As has been discussed earlier in Chapter-3 on “Delimitation and Reservation,” Section 10 of Haryana Municipal Act, 1973, provides reservation for Scheduled Castes, Women belonging to Scheduled Castes, Women and Backward Classes in the Municipal Councils and Municipal Committees. Similarly, Section 11 of the Haryana Municipal Corporation Act, 1994, provides reservation for the above categories in the Municipal Corporation. In the Fifth Municipal General Elections, 2016-18, reservation of seats in the Municipal Corporation /Councils / Committees for the above categories has been made by the Government as per the rules made under the above mentioned Acts.
- 17.2 **Reservation of Seats in Municipal Corporations** - The ward numbers reserved for the Scheduled Castes, Women belonging to Scheduled Castes, Women and Backward Classes in the Municipal Corporations as given at Annexure 17.1, were notified by the State Government under the Haryana Municipal Corporation Act, 1994, before the election programmed was issued. The number of seats reserved for various categories, contesting candidates and the elected members are given in Table 17.1.

- 17.3 Out of 185 wards for which the elections were held, 17 wards were reserved for SCs, 13 for SC (Women), 14 for BCs and 52 for Women. Remaining 89 wards were unreserved. Please see *Annexure 17.2* for details. In percentage terms, the share of SCs, SC (Women), BCs are 9.2, 7.0, and 7.6 percent for each and Women were 28.1 percent of the total number of wards. 48.1

percent of the wards were unreserved. Against these seats, 142, 119, 214, 290 and 362 nominations were accepted against SC, SC (Women), BC, Women and Unreserved seats respectively. For details, please see *Annexure 15.1*.

17.4 16 members belonging to SC category, 15 SC (Women), 42 BC and 45 Women were elected against 17, 13, 14 and 52 seats reserved for them respectively. 67 members belonging to unreserved categories were elected against 89 unreserved seats as given in Annexure 15.2. The following inferences can be drawn from the data given in Table 17.1 : -

1. No SC members were elected against the unreserved seats.
2. 1 SC (Women) members were elected against the seats reserved for SCs and 1 SC (Women) members were also elected against unreserved seats.
3. 11, 2 and 1 i.e. total 14 BC (Women) members were elected against the seats reserved for Women, BC and Unreserved seats. 16 BC members were elected against unreserved Category seats.
4. 4 Women member were elected against the unreserved seats.
5. In all 22 members from different categories were elected against the unreserved seats.

17.5 **Reservation of Seats in Municipal Councils and Committees** - The State Government, vide its various notifications, notified the wards reserved for the Scheduled Castes, Women belonging to the Scheduled Castes, Backward Classes, Women and Unreserved Categories in the municipal councils and municipal committees in the State before initiating the election process for the general elections which were held in 2016-18. The details are given in *Annexure 17.1*.

17.6 **Municipal Councils** - During the Fifth General Elections, 2016-18, elections were held for 447 seats of member of 17 municipal councils. Out of 447 wards for which the elections were held, 53 wards were reserved for SCs, 36 for SC (Women), 34 for BCs and 120 for Women. Remaining 204 wards were unreserved. Please see *Annexure 17.2* for details. In percentage terms, the share of SCs, SC (Women), BCs and Women was 11.9, 8.1, 7.6 and 26.8

percent respectively of the total number of wards. 45.6 percent of the wards were unreserved. Against these seats, 309, 280, 524, 500 and 625 nominations were accepted against SC, SC (Women), BC, Women and Unreserved seats respectively. For details, please see *Annexure 15.1*. The position has been summarized in Table 17.2.

17.7 51 members belonging to SC category, 50 SC (Women), 102 BC and 119 Women were elected against 53, 36, 34 and 120 seats reserved for them respectively. 125 members belonging to unreserved categories were elected against 204 unreserved seats. 79 members of reserved categories were elected against unreserved seats as given in Annexure 15.2. The following inferences can be drawn from the data given in Table 17.2 :-

1. 5 SC members were elected against the unreserved seats.
2. 7 SC (Women) members were elected against the seats reserved for SCs. In addition, 7 SC (Women) members were also elected against the seats reserved for Women.
3. 29, 7 & 3 i.e. total 39, BC (Women) members were elected against the seats reserved for Women, BC and Unreserved seats. 36 BC members were elected against Unreserved Category seats.
4. 35 Women members were elected against the unreserved seats.
5. In all 79 members from different categories were elected against the unreserved seats.

17.8 **Municipal Committees** - Elections were held for 734 seats of member of 50 municipal committees during the Fifth Municipal General Elections, 2016-18.

Out of 734 wards for which the elections were held, 91 wards were reserved for SCs, 72 for SC (Women) and 100 for BCs. In addition, 191 wards were reserved for Women. Remaining 280 wards were unreserved. Please see *Annexure 17.3* for details. On this basis, in percentage terms, the share of SCs, SC (Women), BCs and Women was 12.4, 9.8, 13.6 and 26.0 percent respectively. 38.1 percent of the wards were unreserved. Against these seats, the number of nominations accepted from SC, SC (Women), BC, Women and Unreserved Category candidates were 344, 414, 693, 622 and 604 respectively. Please see *Annexure 15.5*.

17.9 The category-wise break of the wards reserved, contesting candidates and elected members are given in Table 17.3.

17.10 76 members belonging to SC category, 102 SC (Women), 182 BC and 193 Women were elected against 91, 72, 100 and 191 seats reserved for them respectively. 181 members belonging to unreserved categories were elected against 280 unreserved seats. 99 members of reserved categories were elected against unreserved seats as given in Annexure 15.6.

17.11 An analysis of the members elected against seats reserved for other categories can be drawn from the data given in Table 17.3, is as under:-

1. 8 SC members were elected against the unreserved seat.
2. 23 SC (Women) members were elected against the seats reserved for SCs, 6 SC (Women) members were elected against the seats reserved for Women and one SC(Women) member was elected against unreserved seat



3. 33, 5 & 12 i.e total 50, BC (Women) members were elected against the seats reserved for Women, Unreserved & BC. 44 BC members were elected against unreserved seats.
4. 41 Women were elected against the unreserved seats.
5. In all 99 members from different categories were elected against the unreserved seats.

## Chapter-18

### SOCIO-ECONOMIC PROFILE OF CANDIDATES

18.1 The State Election Commission had collected statistics relating to socio-economic profile of the contesting candidates and the elected members. The age related data was collected in respect of all the candidates, who contested the elections as well as elected members. However, information relating to educational qualification and occupation could be made available in respect of the elected members only. The statistics so received have been analyzed to generate some useful information in this chapter.

#### Municipal Corporation

18.2 **Age** - In Municipal Corporation, out of 1,127 contesting candidates, 242 (21.5%) were in the age group of 21-30 years, 406 (36.0%) in the age group of 31-40 years, 330 (29.3%) in the age group of 41-50 years, 100 (8.9%) in the age group of 51-60 years and only 49 (4.3%) candidates were of the age above 60 years (*Annexure 18.1*). The number of contesting candidates and the elected members in various age groups and their percentages are given in Table 18.1.

18.3 In respect of 185 elected members, 29 (15.7%) were in the age group of 21-30 years, 68 (36.8%) in the age group of 31-40 years, 63 (34.1%) in the age group of 41-50 years, 22 (11.9%) in the age group of 51-60 years and only three (1.6%) members were of the age above 60 years. It is interesting to

note that the age of more than 86.5% of the elected members was up to 50 years. Nearly three-fourth (70.9%) of the elected members was in the age group of 31-50 years. Only 1.6 percent of the elected members were of the age above 60 years. Percentage of elected members in different age groups according to sex shows that 80.1 percent of the male elected members and 95.9 percent of the female elected members were up to the age of 50 years (*Annexure 18.2*).

18.4 It is also interesting to note that all the SC (Women) elected members were of age up to 50 years and 95.2 percent elected members against BC categories and 93.3 percent of Women were of age up to 50 years. In respect of unreserved categories 77.6 percent of elected members were in this age group (*Annexure 18.3*).

18.5 **Educational Qualification** - All the 185 elected members of the Corporations have also been categorized in different groups based on their educational qualification and results have been summarized in the Table 18.2. The member-wise educational profile is given in *Annexure 18.4*.

18.6 It is significant to note that all the elected members were educated. 9.2 percent members have obtained professional degrees, e.g. Law and Engineering. 8.6 percent members were Post Graduates and above. 17.8 percent members were Graduates. 41.2 percent of the elected members were Matriculate and 17.3 intermediate and only 5.9 percent was below Matriculate.

18.7 **Occupation** - All the 185 elected members have also been categorized in different groups based on their occupation/profession. The member-wise

profile is given in *Annexure 18.5*. The number of elected members in various professions / occupation and their percentages are given in Table 18.3.

18.8 It may be observed from above that the highest number of elected members were businessmen (42.7%) and house wives (28.1%), followed by social workers constituting 9.7 percent. Advocates, Servicemen/ESM, Unemployment/Students and farmer constituted 4.9, 7.0, 2.7 and 4.3 percent respectively of the total number of elected members.

### **Municipal Councils**

18.9 Age - The age-wise analysis of all the 2,238 candidates, who contested election for 447 seats of the 17 municipal councils, has also been carried out. The details are given in Table 18.4.

18.10 From the data given in the Table 18.4, it may be noticed that the maximum number 830(37.1%) of candidates were in the age group of 31-40 years, followed by 627(28.0%) candidates in the age group 21-30 years. Thus, nearly two-third (65.1%) candidates were in the age group of 21-40 years. Please see *Annexure 18.1* for details.

- 18.11 In respect of the elected members, two age groups, i.e. 31-40 and 41-50 put together had contributed 306(68.5%) out of the total 447 elected members. The maximum number 187(41.8%) was in the age group of 31-40 years. 34(7.6%) members were in the lowest age group of 51-60 years. Only 3.1 percent of the elected members were of the age above 60 years. Percentage of elected members in different age groups according to Gender shows that 88.7 percent of the male elected members and 89.8 percent of the female elected members were up to the age of 50 years (*Annexure 18.2*).
- 18.12 Among the municipal councils, it is found that in Municipal Council Tohana all the elected members were upto the age of 50 years and in the Municipal Councils of Charkhi dadri, Bhiwani, Fatehabad, Narwana, Kaithal, and Narnaul, all the elected members were up to the age of 60 years and in each of the Municipal Councils of Sohna, Bahadurgarh, Thanesar, Palwal, Hodal, Sirsa and Mandi dabwali, only one member was above 60 years (*Annexure 18.2*).
- 18.13 In respect of the reserve categories, 98.0 percent of SC, 96.0 percent of SC (Women), 94.1 percent of BC, 85.7 percent of Women and 82.4 percent of General elected members were of age up to 50 years. Overall 89.3 percent elected members were up to this age and 62.6 percent elected members were up to the age of 40 years. Please see *Annexure 18.3* for details.
- 18.14 **Educational Qualification** - The elected members have also been categorized in different groups based on their educational qualifications. The number of elected members with different educational qualifications and their percentages are given in Table 18.5.

18.15 It is the first time in Haryana that no elected members in the councils were illiterate. From the above table, it turns out that 4.2 percent of the total number of elected members has obtained professional degrees such as Law and Engineering. 17.2 percent members were Graduates whereas 7.6 percent members were Post Graduates and above. The members who have passed Matriculation were 38.7 percent and 18.3 percent were Intermediate and remaining 13.9 percent members were 5<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> class passed. 18.16 **Occupation** - All the 447 elected members of the 17 municipal councils have been categorized in different groups based on their profession/ occupation. The details are given in Table 18.6.

18.17 The maximum number (38.7%) of elected members was house wives, followed by businessmen (31.1%). 9.8 percent of the total number of elected members was farmers. Servicemen/ESM and Labourer constituted 6.5 and 6.0 percent respectively. Social Worker and Advocates constituted 2.7 and 2.5 percent respectively. Unemployed/Students and Doctors constituted 2.2 and 0.4 percent respectively. Please see Annexure 18.5.

#### **Municipal Committees**

18.18 **Age** - In all 2,677 candidates contested election for 734 seats of the 50 municipal committees. Out of which 823 (30.7%) candidates were in the age group of 21-30 years, 934 (34.9%) in the group of 31-40 years, 581 (21.7%) in the age group of 41-50 years, 205(7.7%) in the age group of 51-60 years and 134(5.0%) candidates above 60 years. 18.19 Out of total 734 elected members, 202 (27.5%) members were in the age group of 21-30 years, 263 (35.8%) in the age group of 31-40 years, 162 (22.1%) in the age group of 41-50 years, 63 (8.6%) in the age group of 51-60 years and only 44 (6.0%) members were of the age above 60 years. It is interesting to see that 63.3 percent of elected members were of age up to 40 years. More than two-third (85.4%) of the elected members was in the age group of 21-50 years. Only 6.0 percent of the elected members were of the age above 60 years. 79.7 percent of the male elected members and 91.9 percent of the female elected members were up to the age of 50 years. Please see *Annexure 18.7*.

18.20 In 7 Municipal Committees, Uchana, Rajound, Assandh Nissing, Jakhal Mandi, Kalanaur and Nuh, all the elected members were up to the age of 50 years whereas in the 17 Municipal Committees, Barara, Bhuna, Haily Mandi Barwala, Julana, Cheeka, Kalayat, Nilokheri, Pehowa, Mahindergarh, Ateli Mandi, Taoru, Samalkha, Hathin, Meham, Rania and Ganaur, all the elected members were up to the age of 60 years. In Municipal Committee Uchana and Nuh 8 elected members (61.5%) out of total 13 were upto the age of 21-30 years. Please see *Annexure 18.7*.

18.21 In the reserve categories, 86.8 percent of SC, 98.0 percent of SC (Women), 85.7 percent of BC and 88.6 percent of Women elected members were of age up to 50 years. In respect of the unreserved seats, this percentage for elected members is 74 percent. Please see *Annexure 18.8*.

18.22 **Educational Qualification** – All the elected members have been categorized in different groups based on their educational qualifications. The number of elected members with different educational qualifications and their percentages are given in Table 18.8.

18.23 It is observed that only 2.6 percent of the total elected members have obtained professional degrees such as medical, law and engineering. 14.2 percent members were Graduates whereas only 3.8 percent members were Post Graduates and above. The members who have passed Matriculation were 49.5 percent and 18.1 percent were Intermediate. 8.9 and 3.0 percent members were 8<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> class passed respectively (*Annexure 18.9*).

18.24 **Occupation** - All the elected members have also been categorized in different groups based on their occupation. The details are given in Table 18.9.

18.25 It is observed that the highest number of members elected (41.3%) was of house wives followed by businessmen (28.5%) and farmers (10.1%) of the total number of elected members. Doctors, Advocates, Social workers, Servicemen/ESM, Labourers and Unemployed/Students constituted 0.7, 0.7, 2.2, 6.8, 7.8 and 2.0 percent respectively of the total number of elected members (*Annexure 18.10*).



## Chapter-19

### ELECTION OF CHAIRPERSONS

#### Legal Provisions

19.1 **Municipal Corporation** - Under Section 36 of the Haryana Municipal Corporation Act, 1994 read with Rule 71 of the Haryana Municipal Corporation Elections Rules, 1994, one of the elected members of the municipal corporation is elected as Mayor for a period of five years or the residue of the term of his office, whichever is less and the member so elected becomes Mayor of the Corporation.

19.2 Similarly, two of the elected members of the corporation are elected as Senior Deputy Mayor and Deputy Mayor for a period of five years or the residue of the term of their office as a member, whichever is less.

The election of the Mayor, Senior Deputy Mayor and Deputy Mayor of Municipal Corporation Faridabad and Gurugram were held according to these provisions provided in the Section 36 of the Haryana Municipal Corporation Act, 1994 read with Rule 71 of the Haryana Municipal Corporation Elections Rules, 1994.

But, as per the amendment made by the Government of Haryana in Section 4 of the Haryana Municipal Corporation Act, 1994 vide Notifications No. Leg. 33/2018 dated 4<sup>th</sup> November, 2018 and in Rule 71 of the Haryana Municipal Corporation Election Rules, 1994 vide Notifications No. 2/10/2018-R-II dated 14<sup>th</sup> November, 2018, such practice has been discontinued and as per new amendment in Section 4 of the Haryana Municipal Corporation Act, 1994 the election of all seats in the Corporation including a Mayor has been filled by persons chosen by direct election held on 16.12.2018 of five Municipal Corporation Hisar, Karnal, Panipat, Rohtak and Yamuna Nagar.

19.3 **Municipal Councils and Committees** – Section 18 (1) of the Haryana Municipal Act, 1973 provides that every municipal council or municipal committee shall, from time to time, elect one of its elected members to be the President and the member so elected shall become President of the municipal council or municipal committee.

- 19.4 Sub-Section (2) of Section 18 also provides that every municipal council or municipal committee shall also, from time to time, elect one of its elected members to be the Vice-President.
- 19.5 Sub-section (3) of Section 18 also provides that the term of the office of the President and Vice-President shall be for a period of five years or for the residue period of his office as a member, whichever is less.
- 19.6 Under rule 70 of the Haryana Municipal Election Rules, 1978, the Deputy Commissioner or any Gazetted Officer appointed by him in this behalf, within thirty days of the publication of notification of the names of elected members, is required to convene first meeting of the newly constituted committee/council for administering oath of allegiance and conducting election of President and Vice-President.

#### **Fifth Municipal General Elections, 2016-18**

- 19.7 **Reservation of Office of Mayor** - The Government, vide its Notification No.18/2/2017-3C1, dated 09.01.2017, notified that the office of the Mayor of Municipal Corporations shall be filled-up from amongst the members belonging to General Category, Scheduled Castes, Women and Backward Classes.
- 19.8 As per provision of Rule 71 of the Haryana Municipal Corporation Election Rules, 1994, the Divisional Commissioner within a period of thirty days of the publication of the notification of the names of the members elected to the Corporation, convene the first meeting of the newly constituted Corporation. The names of the elected members of Municipal Corporations, was notified by the Commission The Divisional Commissioner accordingly convened the first meeting of the newly constituted Municipal Corporation and administered oath of allegiance to the members present. He held the election of Senior Deputy Mayor and Deputy Mayor. The following were elected as Mayor in the seven municipal corporations:-

19.9 **Reservation of Offices of Presidents** - The State Government, vide its Notifications No.18/30/12-3CI dated 11.02.2016, Notification No. 18/2/2017-3C1 dated 09.01.2017 and Notification No. 18/136/2017-3C1 dated 25.10.2017 has notified the names of the municipalities in which the offices of President were reserved for the Scheduled Castes, Women belonging to the Scheduled Castes, Backward Classes, Women belonging to Backward Classes and Women. 19.10 After the names of the members elected in the elections, the Deputy Commissioners or the officers authorized in this behalf, convened the first meeting of the Corporation/councils/committees and the election for the Senior Deputy Mayor and Deputy Mayor of Municipal Corporation and President and Vice-President of Municipal Council & Committee were held. The Commission had earlier issued guidelines vide its letter No.SEC/1ME/2003/3728-48 dated 17.04.2003 for the conduct of elections to the offices of Presidents of the municipalities. The names of the Mayor of Municipal Corporation and Presidents of municipal councils and municipal committees so elected are available at Commission's website. Notifications of the names of the members, who were elected Presidents and Vice Presidents, were issued separately for each municipal council and municipal committee.

19.11 The statistics relating to nominations, socio-economic profile and age of the contesting candidates and the elected Mayors of five Municipal Corporations where direct election of Mayor was held on 16.12.2018 were collected and analyzed. However, information relating to educational qualification and occupation could be made available in respect of the elected members only which gave above in table 19.1. The statistics so received have been analyzed to generate some useful information in this chapter. In direct elections of Mayor of five Municipal Corporations, 76 nominations were

received. Out of which, 5 nominations were rejected and 12 withdrawn. The remaining 59 nominations were accepted. Nominations rejected, withdrawn and accepted were 6.6, 15.8 and 77.6 percent respectively of the total number of nominations received as shown in Table 19.4.

## Chapter-20

### ACCOUNT OF ELECTION EXPENDITURE FOR THE CONTESTING CANDIDATES

20.1 **Legal Provisions** - Section 13E of the Haryana Municipal Act, 1973 provides the following:-

- (i) Every candidate at an election shall, either himself or by his election agent, keep a separate and correct account of all expenditure in connection with the election incurred or authorised by him or by his election agent from the date of filing of nomination\_papers to the date of declaration of the result thereof, both dates inclusive.
- (ii) The account shall contain such particulars, as may be notified by the State Election Commission in this behalf.
- (iii) The total of the expenditure shall not exceed such amount as may be notified by the State Election Commission from time to time.

20.2 The following limits of expenditure for the contesting candidates for election to members of the municipalities were prescribed by the Commission vide Notification No.127/SEC/E-IV/94 dated 02.11.1994 for municipal corporation and No.361/SEC/M/94 dated 21.11.1994 for municipal councils and municipal committees, before the first Municipal General Elections held in November/ December, 1994.

20.3 The Commission has also issued the Haryana Municipal Election Expenditure (Maintenance and Submission of Account) Order, 1996 vide Notification No.SEC/ME/96/7470, dated 31.05.1996, revised in 2006 in supersession of order 1996 vide Notification No.SEC/4ME/2006/9706, dated 19.12.2006, providing that the State Election Commission shall notify from time to time the Election Expenditure limit at election to be incurred by the candidate or authorized election agent. The order also provides that every contesting candidate at election shall have to maintain the day to day election expenditure account in accordance with the procedure as laid down in the



order and shall within 30 days from the date of declaration of result of the election lodged with the Deputy Commissioner or any other officer specified by the Commission in duplicate the account of election expenditure which shall be true copy of the account maintained by him or his election agent. The Deputy Commissioner is required to cause a notice to be fixed to the notice board of his office within two days from the date of which account of election expenses have been lodged.

20.4 Section 13D also provides that the Section 10A of the Representation of People Act, 1951 shall mutatis mutandis apply to the municipal elections.

Section 10A provides that in case a candidate

(a) has failed to lodge an account of election expenses within the time and in the manner required by or any Act; and

(b) has no good reason or jurisdiction for the failure, the State Election Commission shall, by order published in the Official Gazette, declare him to be disqualified and any person shall be disqualified for a period of three years from the date of the order.

20.5 Before the Second Municipal General Elections, which were held on April 2, 2000, the election expenditure limits were revised vide Commission's Notification No.SEC/2000/2ME/3102 dated 17.02.2000 for members of municipal corporation and No.SEC/2000/2ME/2998 dated 17.02.2000 for members of municipal councils and municipal committees.

20.6 Keeping in view the increased cost of election expenses, the election expenditure limits were further enhanced by the Commission in its Notification No.SEC/3ME/2003/10307 dated 24.10.2003 for members of municipal corporation and No.SEC/3ME/2003/10216 dated 24.10.2003 for members of municipal councils and municipal committees. The details of the limits of expenditure prescribed and enhanced from time to time are given in Table 20.1.

- 20.7 Before the Fifth Municipal General Elections, 2016, the election expenditure limits were further enhanced by the Commission vide notification dated June 03, 2015.
- 20.8 After the fifth Municipal General Elections, 2016, the election expenditure limits were further enhanced by the Commission, keeping in view the increased cost of election expenses, vide Notification dated 18.05.2017 for members of municipal corporation, councils and committees.
- 20.9 State Government on the recommendation of State Election Commission has inserted Section 8E, 8F and 8G in the Haryana Municipal Corporation Act, 1994 and Section 13F, 13G and 13H in the Haryana Municipal Act, 1973 vide Gazette notification dated 17<sup>th</sup> April, 2017 as under:-

**Sections inserted in Haryana Municipal Corporation Act, 1994**

**8E. Disqualification for failure to lodge account of election expenses.** If the State Election Commission is satisfied that a person has failed to lodge an account of election expenses within the time and manner, as prescribed by the State Election Commission and has no reason or justification thereof, the State Election Commission shall by order published in the official Gazette, declare him to be disqualified for contesting an election for a period of five years from the date of the order under this Act.

**8F. Removal or reduction of period of disqualification.**- The State Election Commission may, for reasons to be recorded in writing, remove or reduce the period of disqualification under Section 8E.

**8G. Lodging of account with the Deputy Commissioner** - Every contesting candidate or his election agent shall, lodge account of election expenditure within thirty days from the date of declaration of election result with the Deputy Commissioner or an officer authorized by the State Election Commission. \*The deputy Commissioner or such officer shall, send a list of those candidates who contested but fail to lodge the account of election expenditure or made expenditure beyond the limit prescribed by the State Election Commission immediately after the completion of a period of thirty days from the declaration of election result. The State Election Commission shall accordingly pass an order of their disqualification under section 8E.

**Section inserted in Haryana Municipal Act, 1973**

**13F. Disqualification for failure to lodge account of election expenses.** If the State Election Commission is satisfied that a person has failed to lodge an account of election expenses within the time and manner, as prescribed by the State Election Commission and has no reason or justification thereof, the State Election Commission shall by order published in the official Gazette, declare him to be disqualified for contesting an election for a period of five years from the date of the order under this Act.

**13G. Removal or reduction of period of disqualification.** - The State Election Commission may, for reasons to be recorded in writing, remove or reduce the period of disqualification under Section 13F.

**13H. Lodging of account with the Deputy Commissioner.**- Every contesting candidate or his election agent shall, lodge account of election expenditure within thirty days from the date of declaration of election result with the Deputy Commissioner or an officer authorized by the State Election Commission. \*The Deputy Commissioner or such officer shall, send a list of those candidates who contested but fail to lodge the

account of election expenditure or made expenditure beyond the limit prescribed by the State Election Commission immediately after the completion of a period of thirty days from the declaration of election result. The State Election Commission shall accordingly pass an order of their disqualification under section 13F.

20.10 The State Election Commission has issued the Order of Municipal Corporation Election Expenditure (Maintenance & Submission of Accounts) Order, 2018 as per above Sections inserted by the State Government in Haryana Municipal Corporation Act, 1994, after amendment in the Haryana Municipal Corporation Expenditure (Maintenance & Submission of Accounts) Order, 2007 vide notification No. SEC/3ME/2018/5536 dated 14.11.2018(Annexure 20.1). Similarly issued the Order of Haryana Municipal Election Expenditure (Maintenance & Submission of Accounts) Order, 2017 as per above Sections inserted by the State Government in Haryana Municipal Act, 1973, after amendment in the Haryana Municipal Expenditure (Maintenance & Submission of Accounts) Order, 2006 vide notification No. SEC/3ME/2017/771 dated 18.05.2017(Annexure 20.2).

20.11 The Government of Haryana vide its notification no. Leg.33/2018 dated 4<sup>th</sup> October, 2018 has amended the Haryana Municipal Corporation Act, 1994, according to which Mayor in the State shall be chosen through the direct election by the electors of all wards of the concerned Municipal Corporation.

In view of above and provision made in section 8B the Haryana Municipal Corporation Act, 1994, the State Election Commission, hereby prescribe Rs.20.00 Lakhs (Rupees twenty lakhs only) as limit of expenditure for the candidates contesting the election of Mayor of Municipal Corporation.

## Chapter-22

### COMPARATIVE STUDY

- 22.1 The analysis of Voters and Votes percentage, Reservation, Nominations, Category-wise elected Members, Education, Age and Occupation of the elected Members in the fourth and fifth general elections of the Municipal Bodies held in the year of 2010 to 2015 and 2016 to 2018 are given in this chapter.
- 22.2 The average number of contestants per seat in fourth general elections was 6.1 and it decrease 1.7 candidates per seat and remains 4.4 in fifth general elections whereas the percentage of the Un-opposed elected members was increased in fifth general elections as compare to fourth general elections. The percentage of Votes Polled to the total number of Voters was also increased in the case of Municipal Councils and Committees in fifth general elections as compare to fourth general elections, but it was decreased in the case of Municipal Corporations in fifth general elections as compare to fourth general elections. The detail information was given below in table 22.1 and 22.2.

The Schedule Cast, Backward Class and Women members elected in fifth general elections were increased 3.1, 5.5 and 4.7 percent respectively as compare to fourth general election as shown in table 22.4.

22.7 The elected members have also been categorized in different groups based on their educational qualifications. It is the first time in Haryana that no elected members were illiterate in fifth general elections whereas in fourth general elections the 8.0 percent elected members were illiterate. The members passed 5<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> class in fifth general elections were decreased (11.7 %) as compare to fourth general elections (26.9 %), whereas the members passed 10<sup>th</sup> to 12<sup>th</sup> class in fifth general elections were increased (62.9 %) as compare to fourth general elections (40.3 %). The members passed Graduate and above in fifth general elections (25.4 %) were almost same as compare to fourth general elections (24.8 %). 2 The Returning Officer shall publish the above election programme on 29.04.2016 by notices posted at their office, at the office of the Deputy Commissioner, at the offices of the Municipal Council/Committee and at such other conspicuous places in the municipal area of the Municipal Council/Committee in which the election would be held as may be determined by him in this behalf under Rule 20 of the Haryana Municipal Election Rules, 1978.

3. It is also made clear that no nominations shall be filed on 08.05.2016 and 09.05.2016 being gazette holidays declared by the Govt under section 25 of the Negotiable Instruments Act, 1881.

4. In addition, every candidate shall have to submit an undertaking alongwith nomination paper and an affidavit/declaration on the following points as per new amendment made by the Govt., that he/she:-

(a) has not been convicted and no charges have been framed in a criminal case for an offence, punishable with imprisonment for not less than ten years; or

(b) fails to pay any arrear of any kind due to him to any Primary Agriculture Co-operative Society, District Central Co-operative Bank and District Primary Co-operative Agriculture Rural Development Bank; or

(c) has no pending arrears of electricity bills; or

(d) has passed matriculation examination or its equivalent examination from any recognised institution/board.

Provided that in case of women candidate or a candidate belongs to Scheduled Caste, the minimum qualification shall be middle pass.

Provided further that in case of a women candidate belongs to Scheduled Caste, the minimum qualification shall be 5<sup>th</sup> pass

(e) has to submit self declaration to the effect that he has a functional toilet at his place of residence.

5. The State Election Commission further directs that immediately after the expiry of the period within which candidatures may be withdrawn under Rule 28 of the Haryana Municipal Elections Rules, 1978, the concerned Returning Officer shall prepare in Hindi the list of contesting candidates, that is to say, list of candidates who have been included in the list of validly nominated candidates, and those who have not withdrawn

their candidatures within the prescribed period. The list shall be caused to be posted at the some conspicuous place, in the office of the Returning Officer or at the Municipal Committee office.

6. The State Election Commission further directs that the concerned Returning Officer or the Assistant Returning Officer as the case may be, shall at every stage prepare the notices of the nominations containing descriptions similar to those contained in the nomination papers both of the candidates and the proposers, the list of candidates whose nomination papers have been rejected, the list of validly nominated candidates, the notices of withdrawal of candidatures and the lists of contesting candidates, and affix the same at some conspicuous places, at the notice board of their offices and at the office of the Municipal Council/Committee and shall submit one copy thereof to the State Election Commission directly at every stage and one copy through the Deputy Commissioner.

7. The State Election Commission further directs that the counting of votes polled at the elections to the seat of Member of Municipal Council/Committee shall be taken up after the close of poll on the same day at the polling stations. The details (Accounts) of votes polled at each polling station shall be prepared in Part-II of Form 18 by the Presiding Officer and forwarded to the Returning Officer for consolidation of counting votes on Form 8 mentioning therein the total number of valid votes polled in favour of each candidates on each polling station and declare the candidate, who is found to have obtained the largest number of votes, elected as Member from the ward.

8. The State Election Commission further directs that after the declaration of result of elections under Rule 62, the Returning Officers shall forthwith post a copy of return (i.e. Form 8- Consolidation of account of the counted ballot papers) in a conspicuous place at his office and send a copy thereof to the Deputy Commissioner, who shall immediately forward the names of the candidates elected to the State Election Commissioner, Haryana for notifying the same in official gazette. The Deputy Commissioners shall ensure that the names and other particulars of the elected candidates should be the same as are recorded in the nomination paper.

## **NOTIFICATION Dated 17<sup>th</sup> May, 2016**

No. SEC/1ME/2016/1076- Whereas, the State Election Commission, Haryana, has prescribed an election programme for the conduct of general election in 15 Municipal Councils and 28 Municipal Committees in the State of Haryana including the Municipal Council, Thanesar vide its notification No.SEC/1ME/2016/414, dated 28.04.2016.

2. Whereas, Smt. Suman Lata has filed a CWP No. 9328 of 2016 in the Hon'ble Punjab and Haryana High Court, in which the petitioner seeks a direction to the respondents to allow her to file nomination papers and contest election for the post of Municipal Councilor for ward No.19, Thanesar. The petitioner alleged that her name was removed from the electoral roll for the said ward at the last moment to keep her out of fray. Hon'ble Punjab and Haryana High Court has disposed the said writ petition on dated 12.05.2016 with the direction to invite fresh objections against deletion of names from the electoral roll by giving one day opportunity to the affected voters and thereafter re-schedule the election programme including the date of filing nomination papers to enable the affected persons like the petitioners to file nominations, if so desired and that the authorities shall be at liberty to hold the election as per the final date of election already notified.

3. Whereas, in view of order of the Hon'ble Punjab and Haryana High Court referred above, the State Election Commission, Haryana vide its Notification No.SEC/1ME/2016/852, dated 13/05/2016 had ordered that all activities pursuant to its notification No.SEC/1ME/2016/414, dated 28/04/2016 with regard election of Municipal Council, Thanesar, District Kurukshetra shall be put on hold till further orders.

4. Whereas, order of the Hon'ble High Court were also challenged by the State Election Commission, Haryana in the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India through SLP(civil) No.14730 of 2016. Hon'ble Supreme Court of India has passed the following interim order on dated 17.05.2016:-

“Heard learned counsel for the petitioner on the question of grant of stay.

In the meantime, operation of the impugned order dated 12.05.2016 passed in CWP No.9328 of 2016 (O&M) by High Court of Punjab and Haryana at Chandigarh shall remained stayed.



List the matter for further orders after summer vacation and on service to the respondent before appropriate Bench as per Roster.”

- iv. The District Administration shall launch a drive for checking the vehicles immediately upon the announcement of the elections and shall continue the drive till the completion of the process of elections.
- v. All recognized National/State Political Parties in the State of Haryana immediately and to each contesting candidates, or an agent authorized by him be intimated in this respect.
- vi. Permit in this respect shall be issued in the Performa given here as under:-

The Commission further directs that the counting of votes polled at the elections to the seat of Member of Municipal Council/Committee shall be taken up after the close of poll at all polling stations of the Municipality on the same day. In case of an odd elector, who does not have any of the above cards, he would be allowed to vote, if he/she is able to establish his/her identity to the satisfaction of the

Presiding Officer and such other Polling Officer authorized by the Presiding Officer in this behalf.

8. It is further directed to make the following security arrangements for the conduct of free, fare and peaceful elections:-

- vi. Adequate police personnel shall be deployed at the polling stations, counting centers for security and maintenance of law and order to ensure peaceful, smooth and fair election.
- vii. Daily law and order report shall be sent to the State Election Commission till the election process is completed.
- viii. A copy of the plan for deployment of Executive Magistrates and police personnel be also sent to this Commission well in time.
- ix. Provide security to the contesting candidates, if they desire so.
- x. It shall be ensured that no untoward incident takes place during elections.

9. In order to curb undesirable and illegal activities, the Commission hereby imposes restriction to hire or procure not more than 2 vehicles or vessels whether on payment or otherwise for use by a contesting candidate himself or his agents or his supporters on the day of poll during the Municipal Election. It is also stated that :-

- xiii. The expression "Vehicle" means any vehicle used or capable of being used for the purpose of road transport whether propelled by mechanical power or otherwise, and whether used for drawing other vehicle or otherwise.
- xiv. The contesting candidates should be issued permits as per proforma prescribed by the Commission appended herewith. The permits should be issued to the contesting candidates at least 2 days before the day of poll.
- xv. The District Administration shall keep a close watch on the vehicles used by persons accompanying the contesting candidates and their supporters to prevent possible mischief, including criminal activities like carrying of illegal arms and weapons. If any of these vehicles, either of a contesting candidate or a private owner, is found to be involved in any such act or for carting anti-social elements with a view to intimidating or creating terror in the minds of the voters, it shall be the duty of the local administration to



impound such vehicles and not to release them till the process of elections is completed. In addition, accordingly action against the owner, the occupant/occupants and the candidate who is involved in such illegal activities shall also be taken as per law.

- xvi. The District Administration shall launch a drive for checking the vehicles immediately upon the announcement of the elections and shall continue the drive till the completion of the process of elections.
- xvii. All recognized National/State Political Parties in the State of Haryana immediately and to each contesting candidates, or an agent authorized by him be intimated in this respect.
- xviii. Permit in this respect shall be issued in the Performa given here as under:-

The Commission further directs that the counting of votes polled at the elections to the seat of Members of Municipal Corporation shall be taken up after the close of poll at all polling stations of the Municipal Corporation on the same day. The details (Accounts) of votes polled at each polling station shall be prepared in Part-II of Form 17 by the Presiding Officer and forwarded to the Returning Officer for consolidation of counting votes on Form 8 mentioning therein the total number of valid votes polled in favour of each candidates on each polling station and declare the candidate, who is found to have obtained the largest number of votes, as elected Member from the ward.

11. The Commission further directs that after the declaration of result of elections under Rule 63, the Returning Officer shall forthwith post a copy of return (i.e. Form 8- Consolidation of account of the counted ballot papers) at a conspicuous place in his office and send a copy thereof to the Deputy Commissioner, who shall forward

immediately but not later than three days, the names of the elected candidates to the State Election Commission, Haryana for notification in the official gazette. The Deputy Commissioner shall ensure that the names and other particulars of the elected candidates should be the same as are recorded in the nomination paper.

12. The Commission under Section 23A of the Haryana Municipal Corporation Act, 1994 read with Rule 50 of the Haryana Municipal Corporation Election Rules, 1994, hereby specifies that the voting shall be casted by and recording of votes by voting machines [Electronic Voting Machines (EVMs)] in the General elections of the seat of Mayor and Members of all the wards of Municipal Corporation, Hisar, Rohtak, Yamuna Nagar, Panipat and Karnal.

6. The Commission further directs to implement the option "None of above (NOTA)" on EVMs/Ballot papers" in these Elections. The directions in this respect given in Commission's order issued under Endst. No. SEC/1ME/2016/3653-3659 dated 14<sup>th</sup> December, 2016 and further modification No.SEC/1ME/2018/5833-5880 dated

22.11.2018 be followed meticulously. However, the salient features of the NOTA are as under:

- (i) NOTA shall be treated as a 'Fictional Electoral Candidate' while declaring the election results.
- (ii) In case, a contesting candidate and the "Fictional Electoral Candidate' i.e. NOTA securing highest and equal number of valid votes; then the contesting candidate (not NOTA) shall be declared as elected.
- (iii) If in any election, all the contesting candidates individually receive lesser votes than the 'Fictional Electoral Candidate' i.e. NOTA, then none of the contesting candidates will be declared as elected.
- (iv) In case of situation arising under sub-section (iii) above, fresh election shall be held for that seat. Further all such contesting candidates who secured less votes than NOTA shall not be eligible to re-file the nomination/contest the re-election for which they were declared ineligible.
- (v) However, if in re-election, NOTA again gets highest votes, then re-election will not be taken for second time and contesting candidate with highest votes (excluding NOTA) shall be declared as elected.

**The following procedure shall be followed in such circumstances,**

- i) If a Returning Officer, upon completion of counting of votes but before declaration of result, finds that NOTA has received higher valid votes than all other contesting candidates individually; then he (i.e. Returning Officer) shall not declare the result for that particular seat/s and shall immediately send his report to State Election Commission.
- ii) Upon receipt of such report, the State Election Commission shall after satisfaction, declare the fresh election programme for the said seat/s.

7. The Commission further directs to print photographs of the contesting candidates on the ballot papers alongwith other particulars to be displayed on the balloting unit of EVMs and in the tender ballot papers in addition to the existing particulars. The photograph of the candidate shall be printed in the panel for the name of the candidate and appear on the right side of the name in between the name and symbol of the



candidate. The size of the photograph to be printed on the ballot paper shall be 2 cm x 2.5 cm (2 cm in breadth and 2.5 cm in height). The ballot paper for Mayor shall be of Pink colour and for member it shall be of white colour.

8. It is further directed that all voters of the respective area who have been issued the Electoral Photo Identity Cards for Assembly and Lok Sabha Elections and whose Electoral Photo Identity Card Numbers have been mentioned in case of the Municipal Voters list also, shall have to produce these cards to exercise their franchise when coming to the polling stations for voting, the polling for which is scheduled to take place on **16.12.2018**. If any elector has not been issued Electoral Photo Identity Cards by the Election Commission of India, he/she will have to produce any one out of the following documentary evidence to establish his/her identity:--

i)	Driving License,
ii)	Income Tax Identity (PAN) Card,
iii)	Service Identity Card issued to employees by Central/State Government Offices, Public Sector Undertakings, Local Bodies or other public Limited Company,
iv)	Pass Book of accounts, having photograph, opened in a scheduled bank or post office,
v)	Freedom Fighter Identity Card having photograph,
vi)	SC/ST/OBC certificate having photograph, issued by competent authority,
vii)	Certificate of Physical Handicap having photograph issued by the Competent Authority,
viii)	Arms License having photograph,
ix)	Job Cards with photograph issued under the National Rural Employment Guarantee Scheme,
x)	Property documents with photographs such as Pattas, Registered Deeds etc,
xi)	Pension Documents such as Ex-Servicemen Pension Book/Pension Payment Order, Ex-Servicemen's Widow/Dependent Certificate, Old Age Pension Order, Widow Pension Order, with photograph,
xii)	Health Insurance Scheme Smart Cards with Photograph,
xiii)	Ration Cards or any other similar documents establishing the identity of the electors to the satisfaction of the Presiding Officer, having photograph.
xiv)	Aadhar Card issued by UIDAI
xv)	Passport

In case of an odd elector, who does not possess any of the above cards, he would be allowed to vote, if he/she is able to establish his/her identity to the satisfaction

of the Presiding Officer and such other Polling Officer authorized by the Presiding Officer in this behalf.

9. It is further directed to make the following security arrangements for the conduct of free, fare and peaceful elections:-

- xi. Adequate police personnel shall be deployed at the polling stations, counting centers for security and maintenance of law and order to ensure peaceful, smooth and fair election.
- xii. Daily law and order report shall be sent to the State Election Commission till the election process is complete.
- xiii. A copy of the plan for deployment of Executive Magistrates and police personnel be also sent to this Commission well in time.
- xiv. Provide security to the contesting candidates, if they desire so.
- xv. It shall be ensured that no untoward incident takes place during elections.

10. In order to curb undesirable and illegal activities, the Commission hereby imposes restriction to hire or procure not more than 05 vehicles or vessels by the candidate contesting for the post of Mayor and 02 by the contesting candidate for contesting of Member Municipal Corporation whether on payment or otherwise, for use by himself or his agents or supporters on the day of poll during the Election. It is also stated that :-

- xix. The expression "Vehicle" means any vehicle used or capable of being used for the purpose of road transport whether propelled by mechanical power or otherwise, and whether used for drawing other vehicle or otherwise.
- xx. The contesting candidates shall be issued permits as per proforma prescribed by the Commission appended herewith. The permits shall be issued to the contesting candidates at least 2 days before the day of poll.
- xxi. The District Administration shall keep a close watch on the vehicles used by persons accompanying the contesting candidates and their supporters to prevent possible mischief, including criminal activities like carrying of illegal arms and weapons. If any of these vehicles, either of a contesting candidate or a private owner, is found to be involved in any such act or for carting anti-social elements

with a view to intimidating or creating terror in the minds of the voters, it shall be the duty of the local administration to impound such vehicles and not to release them till the process of elections is completed. In addition, accordingly action against the owner, the occupant/occupants and the candidate who is involved in such illegal activities shall also be taken as per law.

- xxii. The District Administration shall launch a drive for checking the vehicles immediately upon the announcement of the elections and shall continue the drive till the completion of the process of elections.
- xxiii. All recognized National/State Political Parties in the State of Haryana immediately and to each contesting candidates, or an agent authorized by him be intimated in this respect.
- xxiv. Permit in this respect shall be issued in the Performa given here as under:-

11. The Commission further directs that if any re-poll is required, the same shall be conducted on **18.12.2018** and counting of votes shall be held on **19.12.2018** at **8.00 A.M.** at the place(s) specified by the Deputy Commissioner concerned. The details (Accounts) of votes polled at each polling station shall be prepared in Part-II of Form 17 by the Presiding Officer and forwarded to the Returning Officer for consolidation of counting votes on Form 8 mentioning therein the total number of valid votes polled in favour of each candidate on each polling station and declare the candidate, who is found to have obtained the largest number of votes, as elected Mayor and Member from the ward.

12. The Commission further directs that after the declaration of result of elections under Rule 63, the Returning Officer shall forthwith post a copy of return (i.e. Form 8- Consolidation of account of the counted ballot papers) at a conspicuous place in his

office and send a copy thereof to the Deputy Commissioner, who shall forward immediately but not later than three days, the names of the elected candidates to the State Election Commission, Haryana for notification in the official gazette. The Deputy Commissioner shall ensure that the names and other particulars of the elected candidate(s) should be the same as are recorded in the nomination paper.

13. The Commission further directs that the information pertaining to the criminal antecedents of the contesting candidates obtained in the prescribed forms alongwith nomination paper be hosted on the officials website of district administration and the same shall remain hosted on the website till the completion of next general election of that municipal institution. The directions in this respect given in Commission's letter No. SEC/1ME/2017/1117-38 dated 2<sup>nd</sup> June, 2017 be followed meticulously.

14. The Commission further directs to bring the following expenditure limit into the notice of all the contesting candidates, to be incurred by the contesting candidate or his authorized election agent(s) in the election of Mayor and Member of the Corporation:-

The Commission further directs that all contesting candidates are required to maintain account of election expenditure and submit the same within 30 days from the date of declaration of the result of the election to the Deputy Commissioner or an officer authorized by the State Election Commission, failing which the defaulting candidate shall be liable to be disqualified under Section 8E of the Haryana Municipal Corporation Act, 1994 and Haryana Municipal Corporation Election Expenditure (Maintenance and submission of accounts), Order, 2018, for a period of five years from the date of issue of such order. The Deputy Commissioner or an officer authorized by the State Election Commission shall check account of election expenses and send a list of contesting candidates who have filed and not filed the election expenditure statement, to the Commission within a period of 7 days from the completion of prescribed time limit of 30 days.

Whereas, the Superintendence, direction and control of all elections to Municipalities in the State of Haryana are vested in the State Election Commission under article 243ZA of Constitution of India and the Haryana Municipal Corporation Act, 1994.

Whereas, the State Election Commission is deeply aware of the increasingly vitiate role of unaccounted financial resources in election and the fragility of existing Law in curbing such vitiation, and to render the accounts of election expenses, it is necessary and expedient to provide, in the interest of purity of elections to the Municipalities in the State of Haryana and in the interest of conduct of such elections in fair and efficient manner and ways and means to render the accounts of expenditure at an elections by the contesting candidate in relation thereto and for matters connected therewith.

Whereas, the Government of Haryana vide notification no. Leg.33/2018 dated 4<sup>th</sup> October, 2018 has amended the Haryana Municipal Corporation Act, 1994, according to which Mayor in all Municipal Corporations of the State shall be chosen through the direct election by the electors of all wards of the concerned Municipal Corporation.

In view of above, State Election Commission, Haryana in exercise of the powers conferred under Article 243ZA of the Constitution of India, Section 8B & 9 of the Haryana Municipal Corporation Act, 1994 and all other powers enabling in this behalf, hereby order to supersede the Haryana Municipal Corporation Election Expenditure (Maintenance and submission of accounts) Order, 2017, notified vide notification No.SEC/3ME/2017/879 dated 18.05.2017 and further to make the following order:-

**1. Short title, extent, application and commencement:-**

(1) These orders may be called the Haryana Municipal Corporation Election Expenditure (Maintenance and submission of accounts) Order, 2018.

(2) It shall extend to the whole of Haryana State in relation to elections in Municipal Corporation.

(3) It shall come into force on the date of its publication in the Haryana Government Gazette which date is hereinafter referred to the commencement of this order.

**2. Definition and Interpretation:-**

(1) In this order unless the context otherwise required:-

(a) "ACT" means the Haryana Municipal Corporation Act, 1994;

(b) "ELECTION EXPENDITURE" means any expenditure incurred or authorized by a candidate or his election agent in connection with the election between the dates on which he has filled his/her nomination and the date of declaration of results thereof both days inclusive;

(c) "CORPORATION" means the Municipal Corporation declared and constituted under Section 3 and 4 of the Haryana Municipal Corporation Act, 1994;

(d) "RULE" means the Haryana Municipal Corporation Election Rule, 1994 ;

(e) "SECTION" means the Section of the Haryana Municipal Corporation Act, 1994;

(f) "STATE ELECTION COMMISSION" means the State Election Commission, Haryana constituted under Article 243K and 243ZA of the Constitution read with and Section 9 of the Act; and

(g) "SUB-PARAGRAPH" means a sub paragraph of the paragraph in which the word occurs.

(2) Words and expressions used but not defined in this Order but defined in the Representation of the People Act, 1950 or Rules made there under or in the Representation of the People Act, 1951 or the Rules made there under or the Haryana Municipal Corporation Act, 1994 or the Rules made there under shall have meaning respectively assigned to them in these Acts and Rules.

(3) In the absence of such definition the Punjab General Clauses Act, 1898, (Punjab Act No.1 of 1898) shall as far as may be, apply in relation to the interpretation of this Order as it applies in relation to the interpretation of a Haryana Act.

**3. Notification by State Election Commission to prescribe the election expenditure limit:-** For the purpose of this Order the State Election Commission shall notify under sub section (3) and section 8B of the Act from time to time the election expenditure limit at an election to be incurred by a candidate or his authorized election agent.

**4. Maintenance of election expenditure account:-** For the purpose of this Order every contesting candidate at an election shall have to maintain the day to day election expenditure account in accordance with the procedure laid down in Para 5 of this Order. The Returning Officer shall in writing as given in Annexure-I give a notice to the contesting candidate regarding maintenance of Election Expenditure account in the manner prescribed therewith.

**5. The election expenditure shall be maintained in accordance with the procedure laid down below:-**

(1) A register in a standard proforma as shown in Annexure II to this order shall be issued to each candidate by the Returning Officer immediately after his nomination for keeping the day to day record of expenditure.

(2) The register shall be duly authenticated by the Returning Officer at the time of issue.

(3) All day to day account shall be faithfully recorded in this register and in no other document by the candidate or his agent authorised by him in this behalf.

(4) All documents such as vouchers, receipts, acknowledgements etc. in support of the expenditure incurred shall be obtained from day to day as the expenditure is incurred and maintained in the correct chronological order alongwith the aforesaid register.

(5) (a) The day to day account maintained in the aforesaid register together with the supporting documents shall be made available for inspection at any time during the process of election by the Deputy Commissioner, Returning Officer, Election Expenditure Observer appointed by the Commission or any other such authority nominated by the Commission in this behalf

(b) Failure to produce this register on demand by the authority mentioned in (a) above will be considered as a major default.

(6) (a) Each contesting candidate shall also maintain account of election expenditure in the proforma as per Annexure III to this Order for showing the total expenditure on various items listed therein and shall within 30 days from the date of declaration of the result of the election lodged with the Deputy Commissioner or any other officer, in duplicate, as authorised by the state election commission by his election agent in the proforma at Annexure-III. The Deputy Commissioner or any other officer as authorised by the State Election Commission shall check account of election expenses and a copy of Election Expenditure Statement submitted by the candidates shall be sent to this Commission within seven days from the date of filing such account and the list of contesting candidates who had not submitted his account of election expenses in time and who has made excess expenditure beyond of expenditure limit fixed by the State Election Commission.

(b) The Deputy Commissioner or the Officer authorised in sub-para (a) above shall, within two days from the date on which the account of election expenses have been lodged by a candidate under sub-para (a) above, cause a notice to be affixed to the notice board of his office specifying—

- (i) the date on which the account has been lodged;
- (ii) the name of the candidate ; and
- (iii) the time and place at which such accounts can be inspected.

(c) Any person shall on payment of a fee of Rs. Five be entitled to inspect any such account and on payment of such fee as may be fixed by the State Election Commission in this behalf be entitled to obtain attested copies of such account or of any part thereof.

(7) (a) While lodging the account of election expenditure the candidate shall file the prescribed register as a part of the record.

(b) Each candidate while lodging the returns of his election expenditure shall also file an affidavit on oath as in Annexure-IV that the expenditure shown as nil, if any, on items listed in the proforma or left blank therein, has not been incurred by him, the affidavit will also clearly state that all election expenditure on listed items relating thereto has been completely and unexceptionally included in the return and there is nothing that has not been disclosed.

(8) A register in a standard proforma as shown in Annexure-II, Proforma as at Annexure-III and specimen of affidavit on oath as in Annexure-IV to this Order shall be issued to each candidate by Returning Officer after filling his nomination for keeping the day to day account of expenditure and for showing the total expenditure on various items.

(9) Since the return of election expenditure filed by a candidate has to reflect “correct” account of “all” election expenses the Deputy Commissioner or the officer

specified in sub-para (a) of para 6 above before accepting the account of the candidate as being in accordance with the manner prescribed, shall conduct such enquiry as he deems necessary and at the time of communicating his report to the Commission, certify to the Commission with reference to the documents filed before him and as verified by him through an appropriate enquiry that the statement of accounts is in the manner prescribed.

(10) The Commission intends to super-check the authenticity of the returns filed through the above procedure and shall hold the candidate personally responsible for any lapse or misrepresentation.

(11) Disqualification for failure to lodge account of election expenses.  
If the State Election Commission is satisfied that a person:-

(a) has failed to lodge an account of election expenses within the time and in the manner required under this order ; and

(b) has no good reason or justification for the failure, the State Election Commission shall by order published in the Official Gazette, declare him to be disqualified and may such person shall be disqualified for a period of five years from the date of the order under Section 8E of the said Act.

(12) These directions are absolutely mandatory and cannot be locally ordered or modified in any manner without prior written approval of the Commission. The Deputy Commissioner will not be competent to permit any relaxation.

(13) Power of State Election Commission to issue instructions and directions :- The State Election Commission, Haryana has been authorized under sub-section (2) of Section 8B of the said Act to notify the particulars of the account to be maintained by the contesting candidate and has power to issue instructions and directions:-

(a) in relation to any matter with respect to maintenance and submission of election expenditure return, by the contesting candidates, for which this order makes no provision or make, insufficient provision, and provision is in the opinion of the State Election Commission necessary for the smooth and orderly conduct of elections.

(14) A copy of this order may be made available to the local unit of all recognized National and State Political Parties immediately, and a copy letter in Annexure-I to each candidate or the agent authorized by him at the time of his nomination (repeat nomination and not scrutiny of nominations) under acknowledgement.

(15) This order may be given to the widest possible publicity through the quickest and all possible means.

Your attention is invited to Section 8B of the Haryana Municipal Corporation Act, 1994 which stipulates that every candidate at an election shall, either himself or by his election agent, keep a separate and correct account of all expenditure in connection with the election between the date on which he has been nominated and the date of declaration of the result thereof, both dates inclusive and such account shall be submitted to the Deputy Commissioner concerned or an officer authorized by the State Election Commission within 30 days from the date of declaration of result. **ABSTRACT OF SECTION 8B AND 8D TO 8G OF THE HARYANA MUNICIPAL CORPORATION ACT, 1994.**

**8B Disqualified for failure to keep account of election expenses and maximum thereof.-**

(1) Every candidate at an election shall, either himself or by his election agent, keep a separate and correct account of all expenditure in connection with the election incurred or authorized by him by his election agent from the date of filing of nomination papers to the date of declaration of the result thereof, both dates inclusive.

(2) The account shall contain such particulars, as may be notified by the State Election Commission in this behalf.

(3) The total of the said expenditure shall not exceed such amount as may be notified by the State Election Commission from time to time.

**8D Application of certain sections of Central Act 43 of 1951 to Haryana Act 16 of 1994.-**

The provisions of sections 20B, 33A, 33B, 125A, 134A, 134B, 135B and 135C of the Representation of People Act, 1951 (Central Act 43 of 1951), shall mutatis mutandis apply to the provisions of the Act.

**8E Disqualification for failure to lodge account of election expenses.-**

If the State Election Commission is satisfied that a person has failed to lodge an account of election expenses within the time and manner, as prescribed by the State Election Commission and has no reason or justification thereof, the State Election Commission shall, by order published in the Official Gazette, declare him to be disqualified for contesting an election for a period of five years from the date of the order under this Act.

**8F. Removal or reduction of period of disqualification.** - The State Election Commission may, for reasons to be recorded in writing, remove or reduce the period of disqualification under Section 8E.

**8G. Lodging of account with the Deputy Commissioner.-** Every contesting candidate or his election agent shall, lodge account of election expenditure within thirty days from the date of declaration of election result with the Deputy Commissioner or an officer authorized by the State Election Commission. The deputy Commissioner or such officer shall, send a list of those candidates who contested but fail to lodge the account of election expenditure or made expenditure beyond the limit prescribed by the State Election Commission immediately after the completion of a period of thirty days from the declaration of election result. The State Election Commission shall accordingly pass an order of their disqualification under section 8E.

**1. Short title, extent, application and commencement:-**

- (l) "SECTION" means the Section of the Haryana Municipal Act, 1973;
- (m) "STATE ELECTION COMMISSION" means the State Election Commission, Haryana constituted under Article 243K and 243ZA of the Constitution read with and Section 3A of the Acts.;
- (n) "SUB-PARAGRAPH" means a sub paragraph of the paragraph in which the word occurs; and

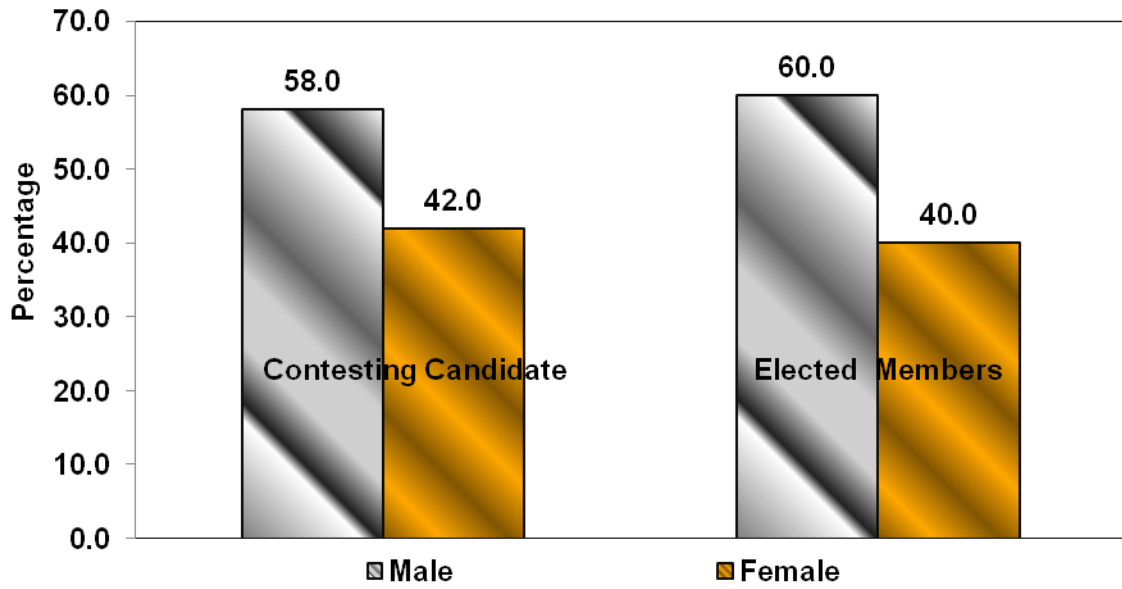

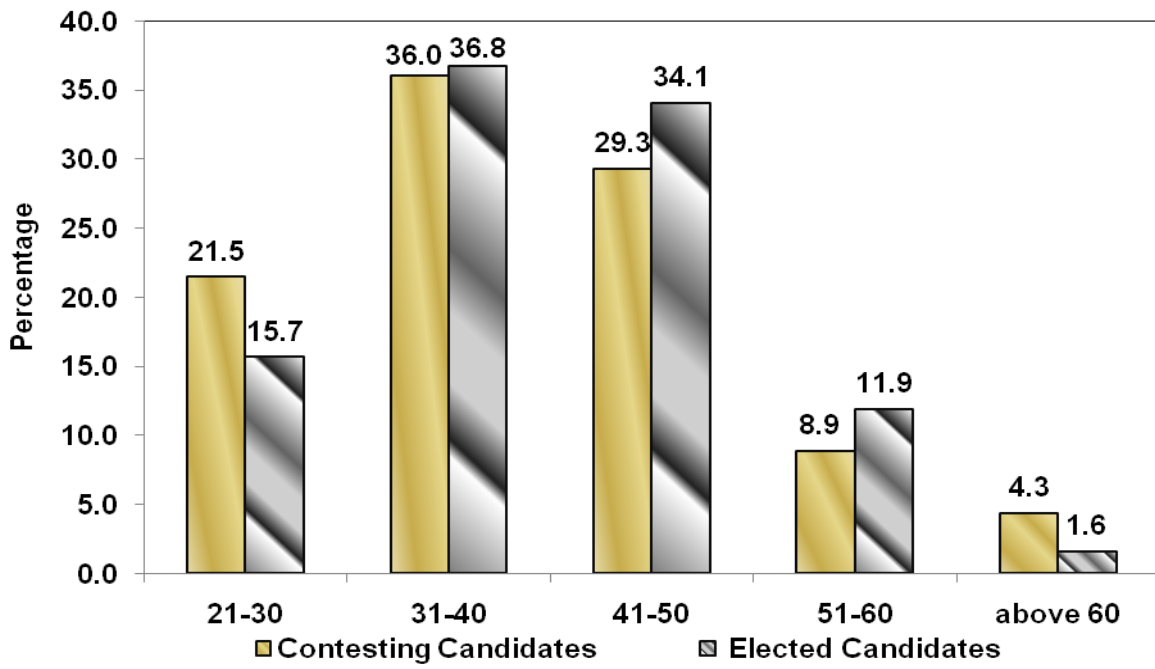

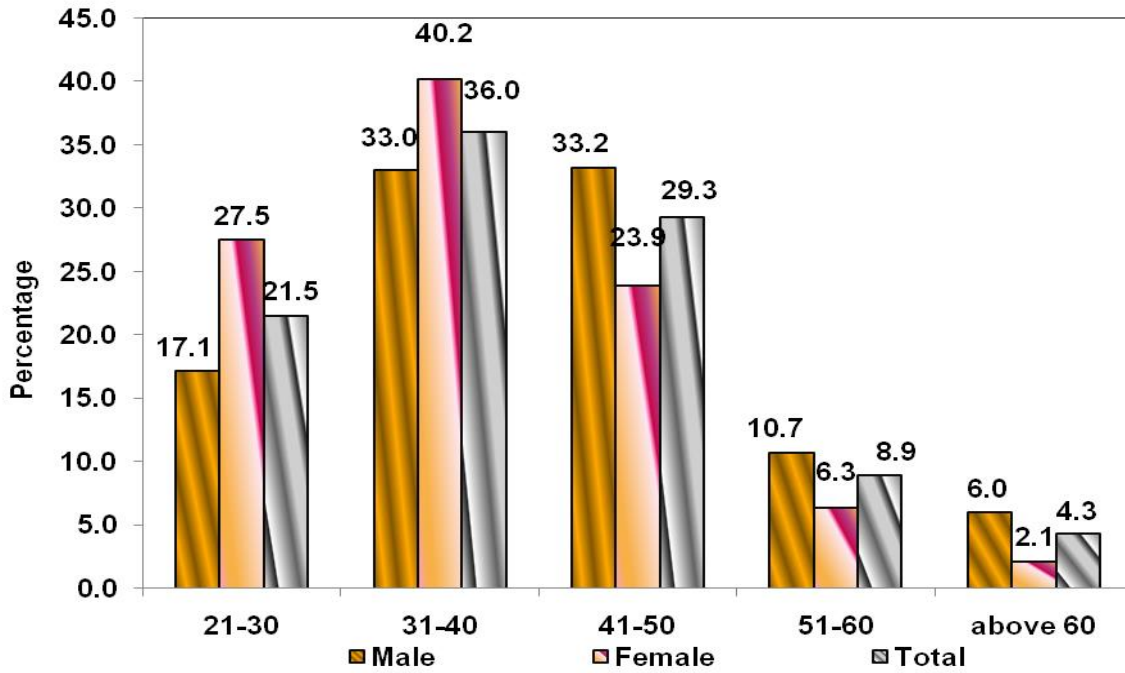
**Graph 2**  
**Percentage of Number of Contesting Candidates and Elected Members by Sex in Municipal Corporations**



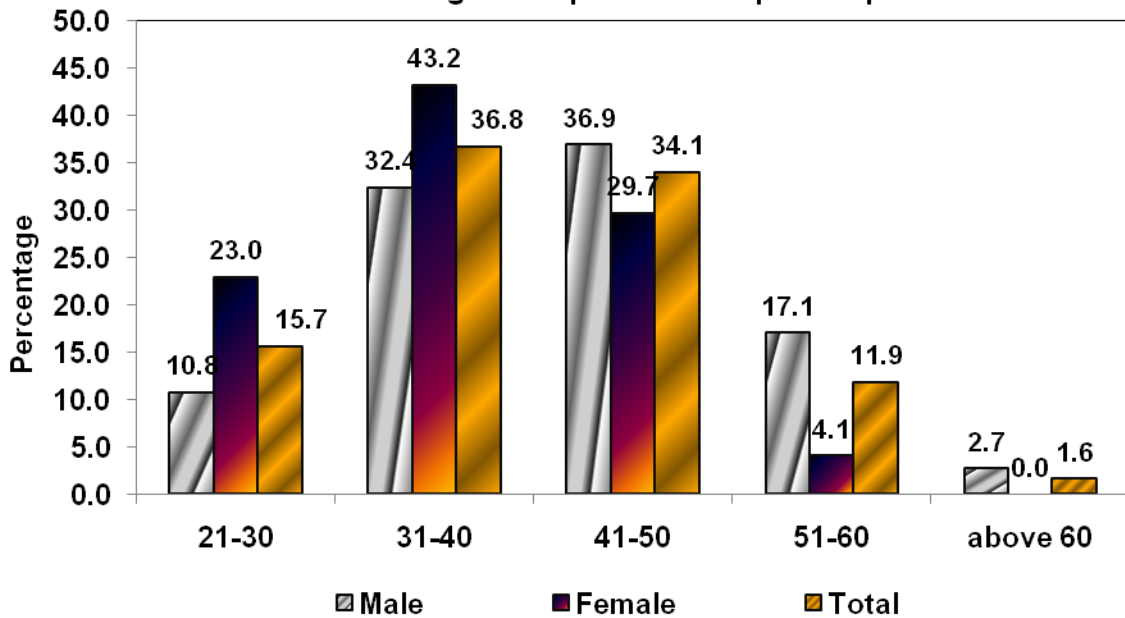
**Graph 3**  
**Percentage of Contesting Candidates and Elected Members in Different Age Groups in Municipal Corporations**



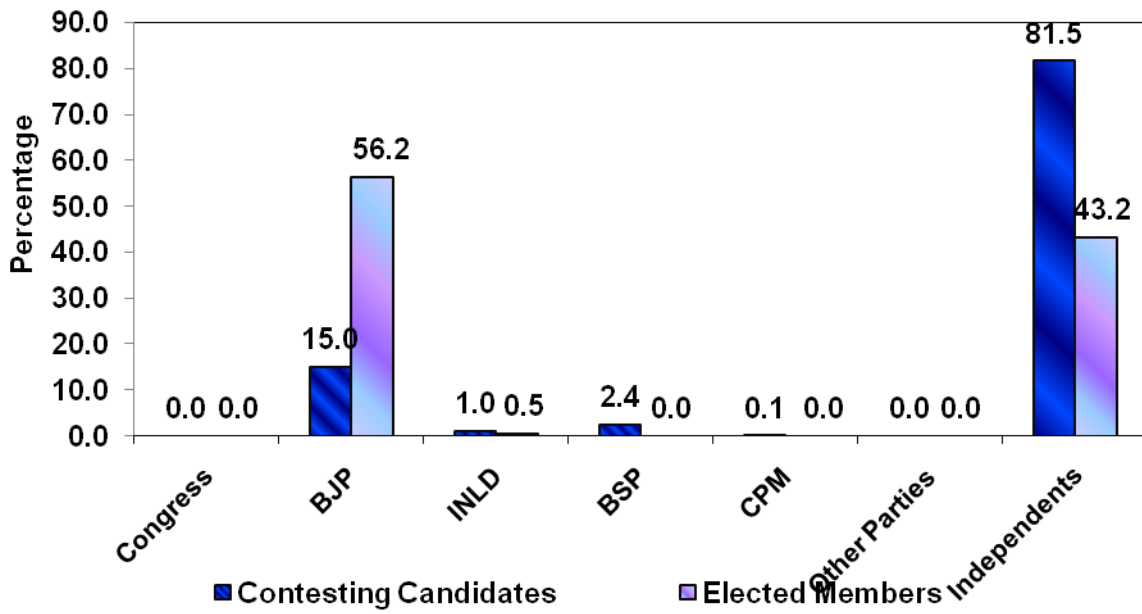
**Graph 4**  
**Percentage of Number of Contesting Candidates According to Sex in different Age Groups in Municipal Corporations**



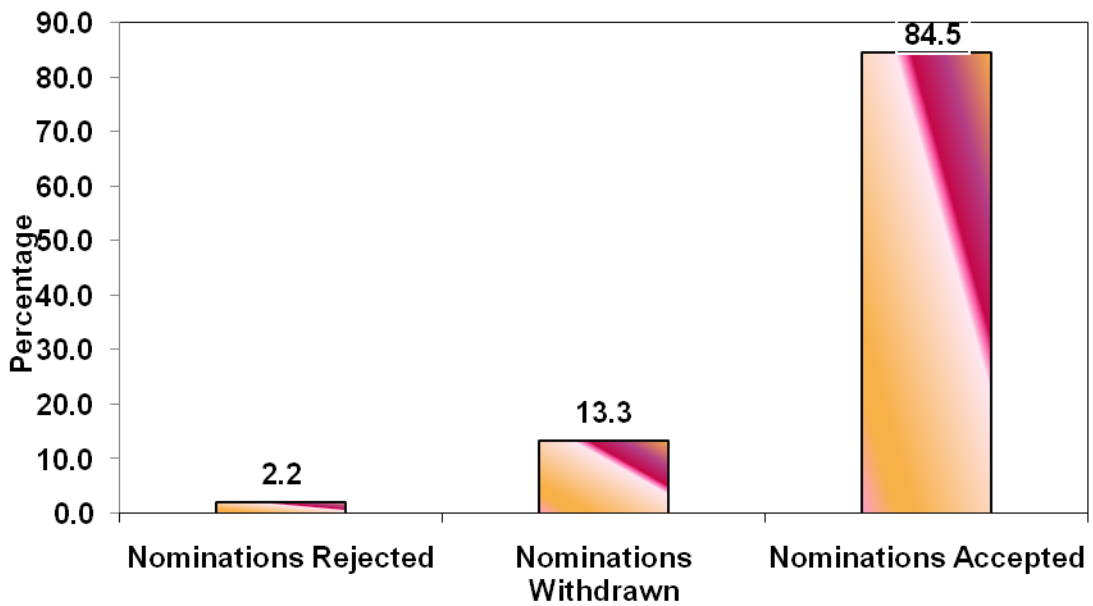
**Graph 5**  
**Percentage of Number of Elected Members According to Sex in different Age Groups in Municipal Corporations**



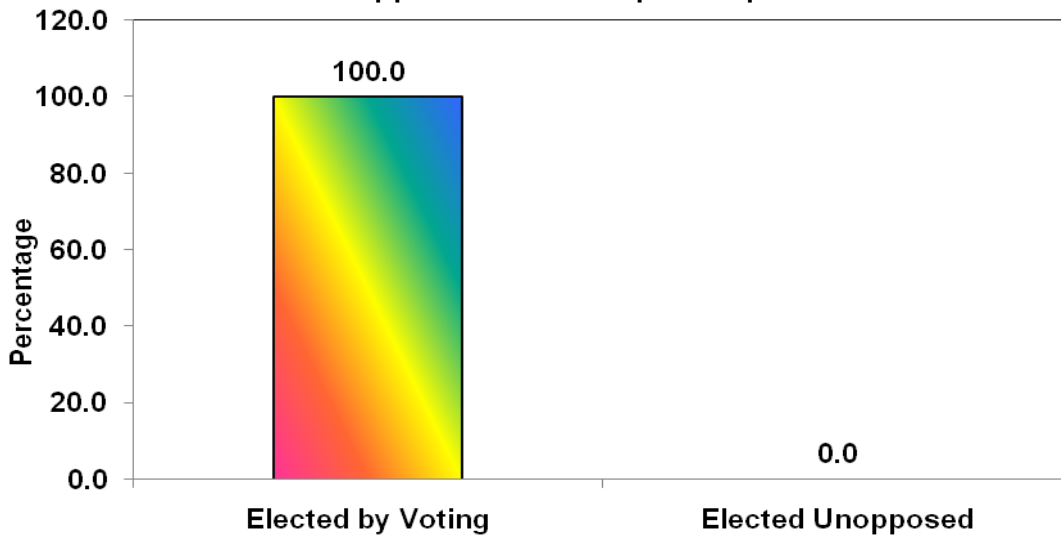
**Graph 6**  
**Percentage of Number of Contesting Candidates and Elected Members According to Party Affiliation in Municipal Corporations**



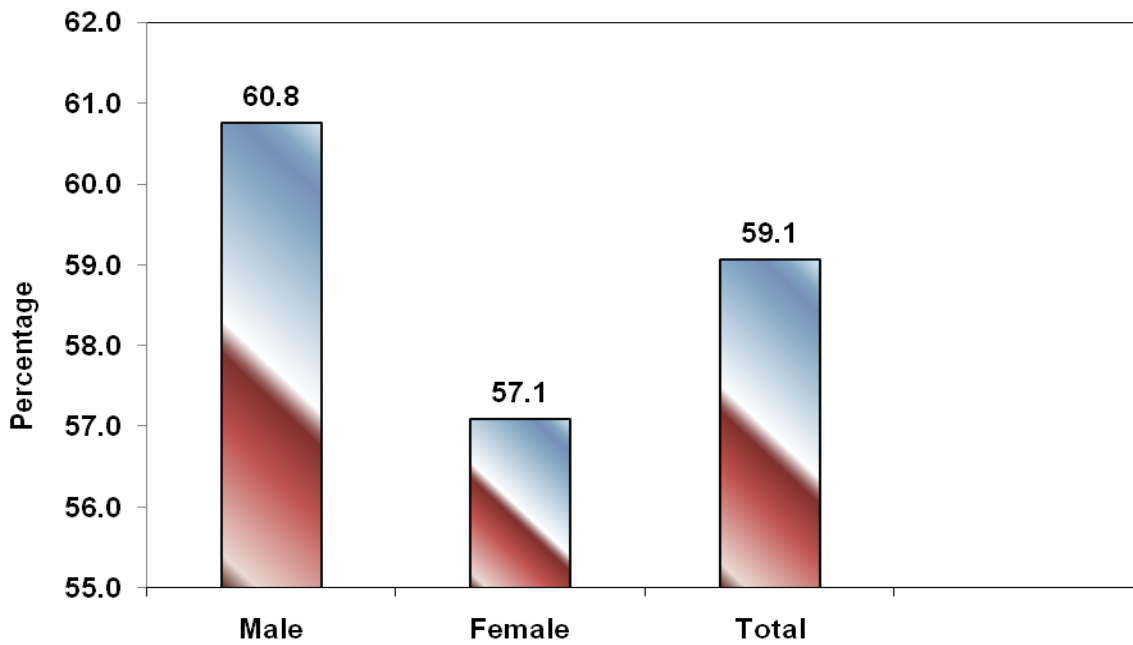
**Graph 7**  
**Percentage of Nominations Rejected, Withdrawn and Accepted in Municipal Corporations**



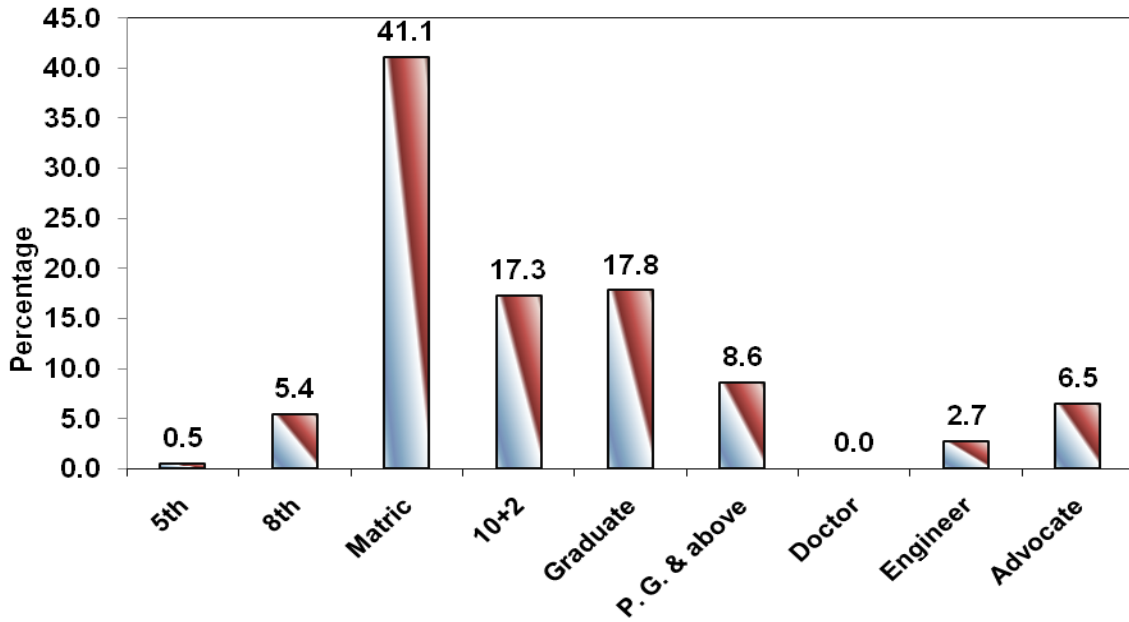
**Graph 8**  
**Percentage of Number of Members Elected by Voting and Unopposed in Municipal Corporations**



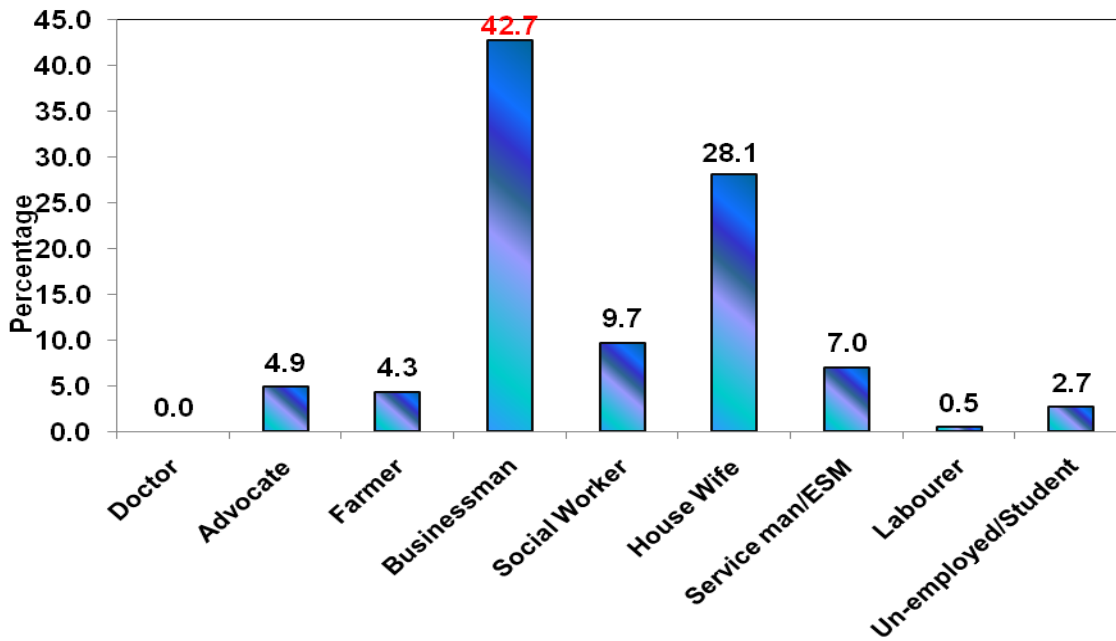
**Graph 9**

**Percentage of Number of Elected Members According to Educational Qualification in Municipal Corporations**

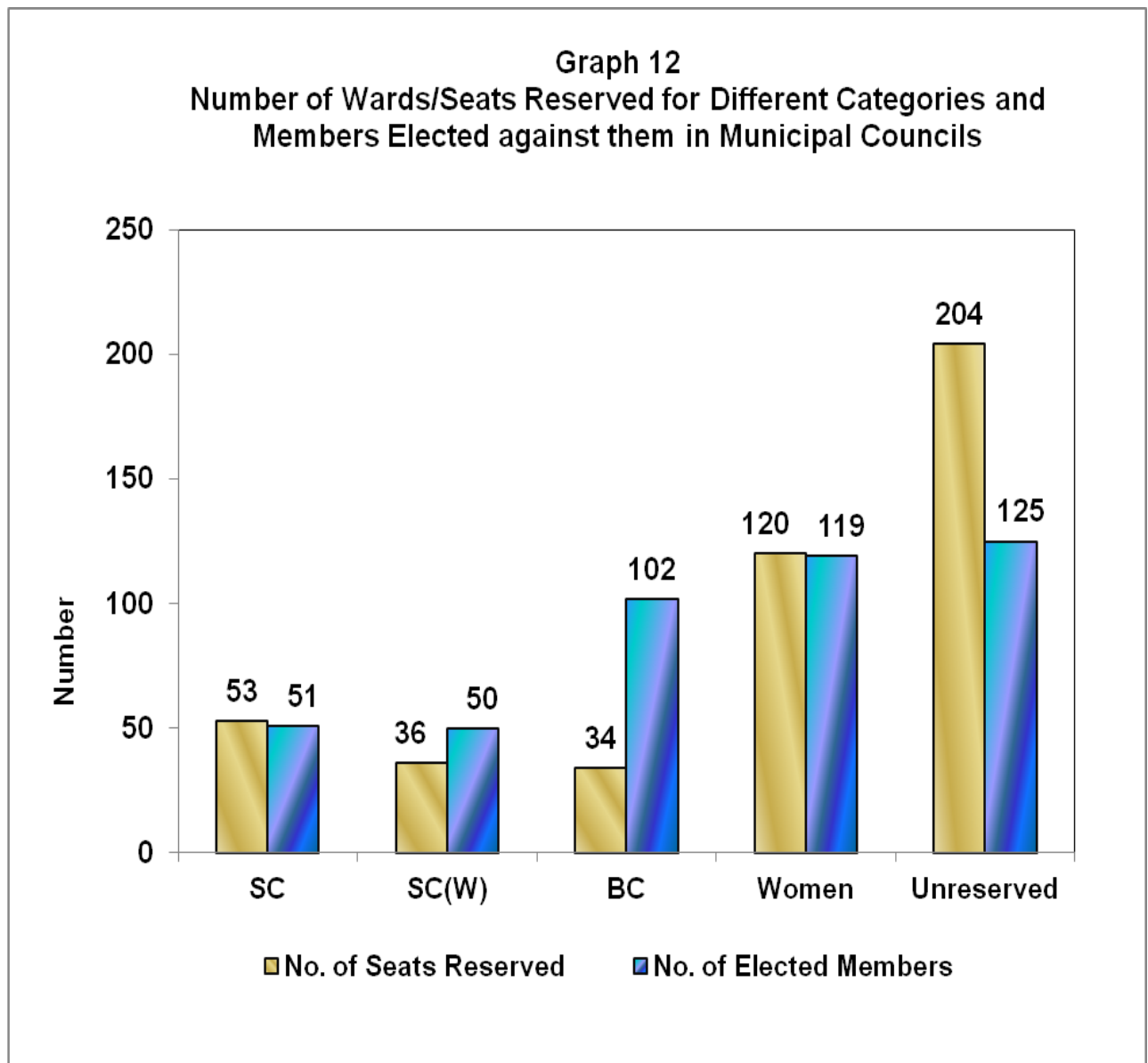


**Graph 11**  
**Percentage of Number of Elected Members According to Occupation in Municipal Corporations**

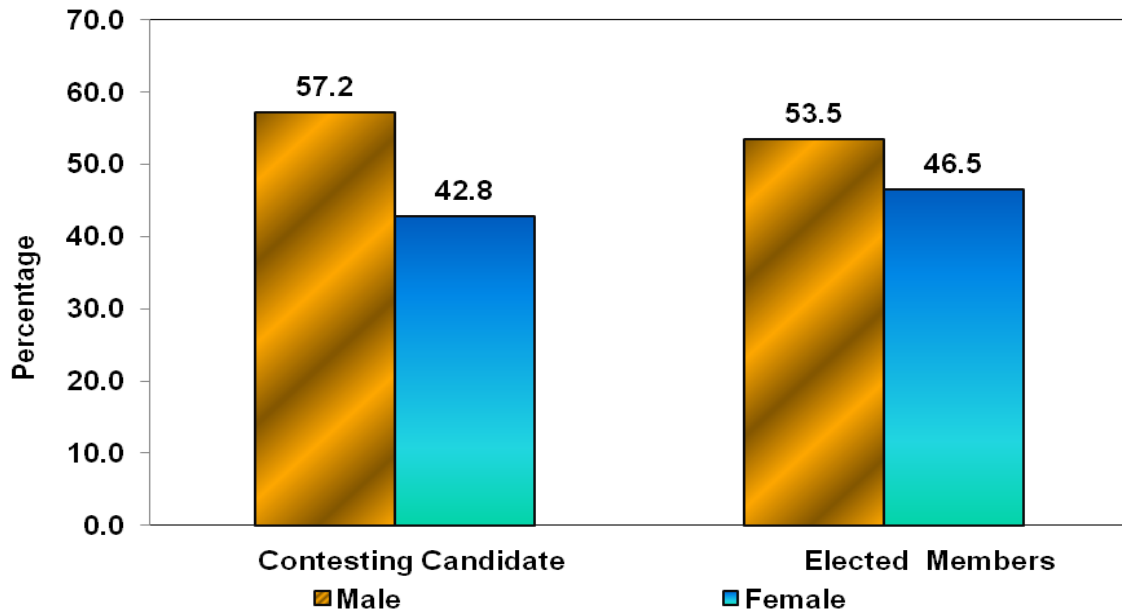




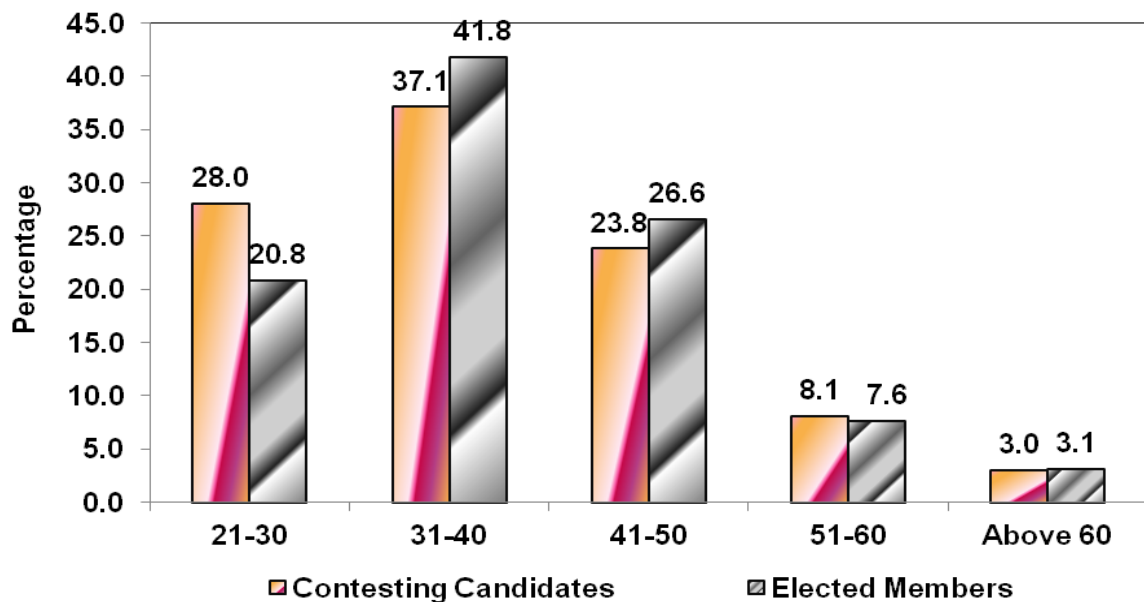

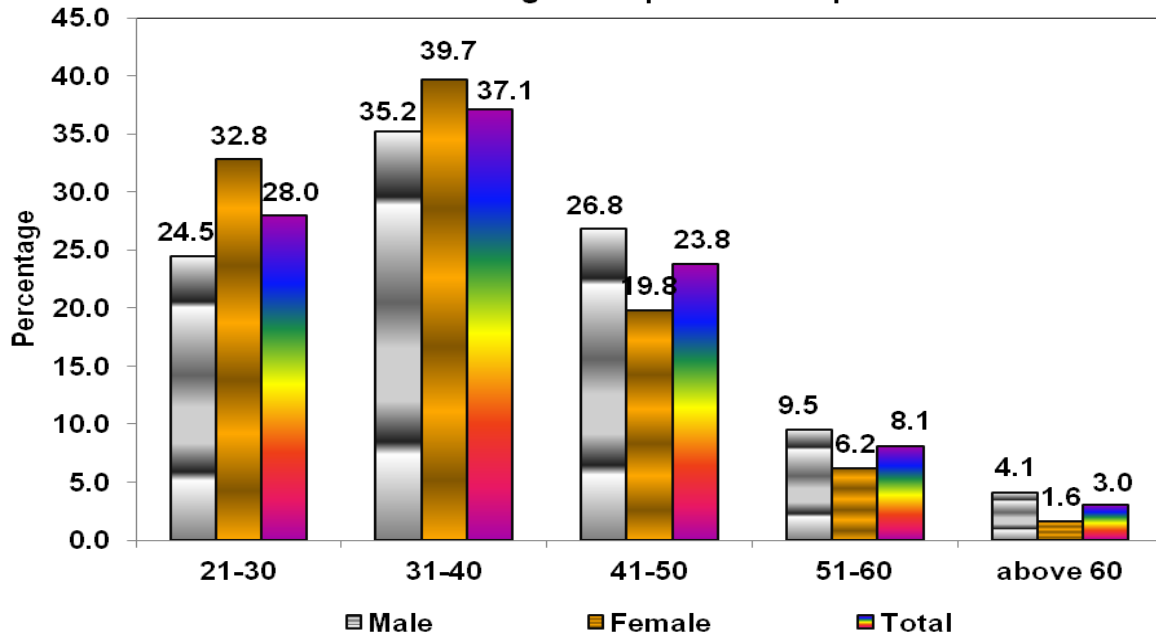
**Graph 13**  
**Percentage of Number of Contesting Candidates and Elected Members by Sex in Municipal Councils**



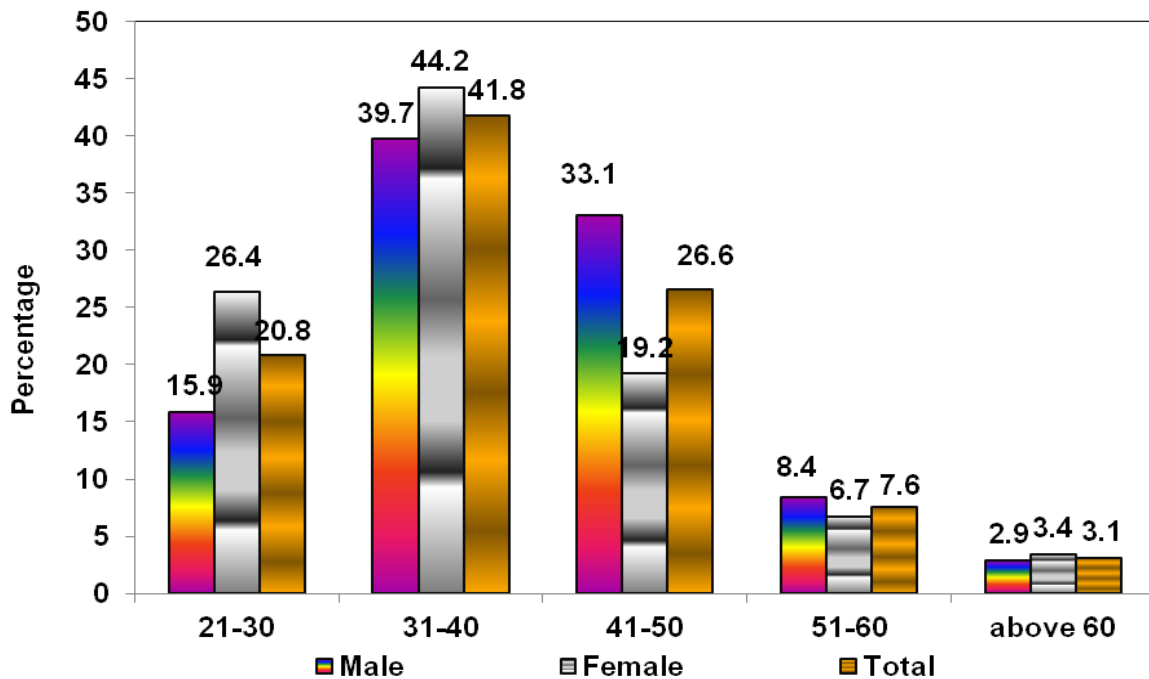

**Percentage of Contesting Candidates and Elected Members in Different Age Groups in Municipal Councils**



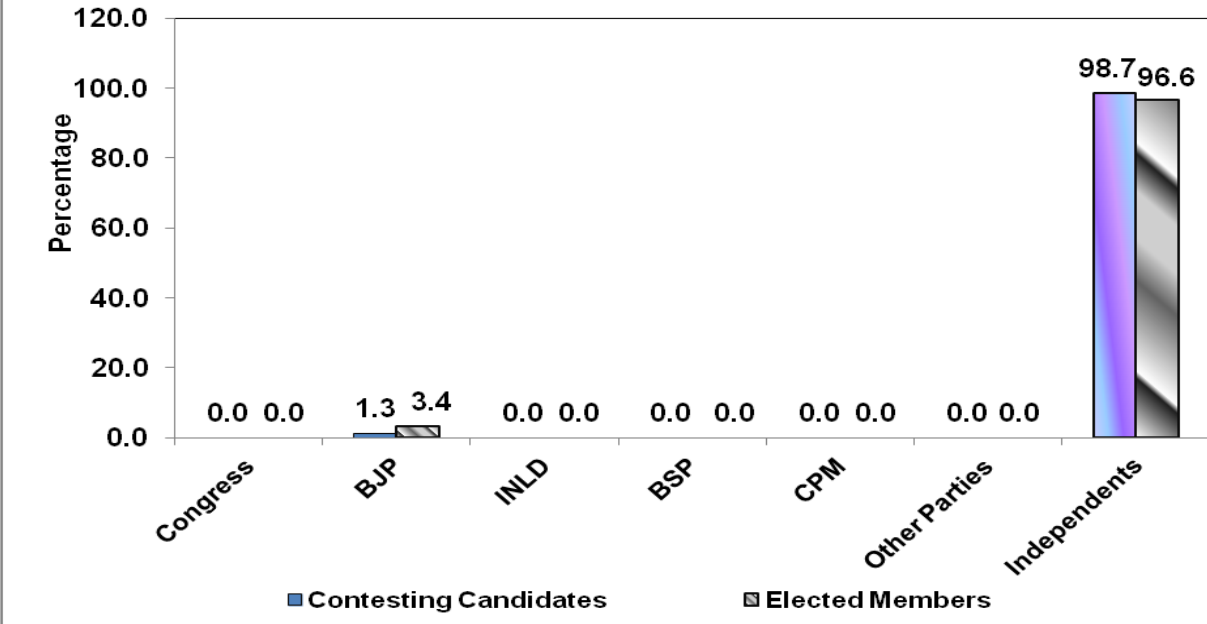

**Percentage of Number of Contesting Candidates According to Sex in different Age Groups in Municipal Councils**



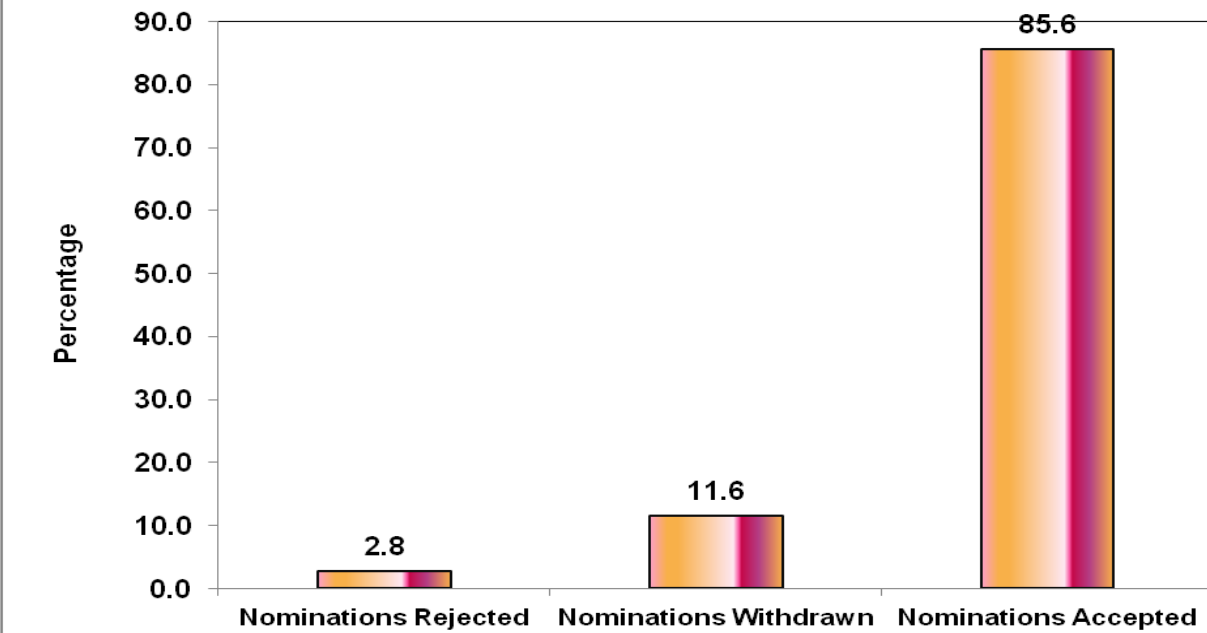

**Percentage of Number of Elected Members According to Sex in different Age Groups in Municipal Councils**



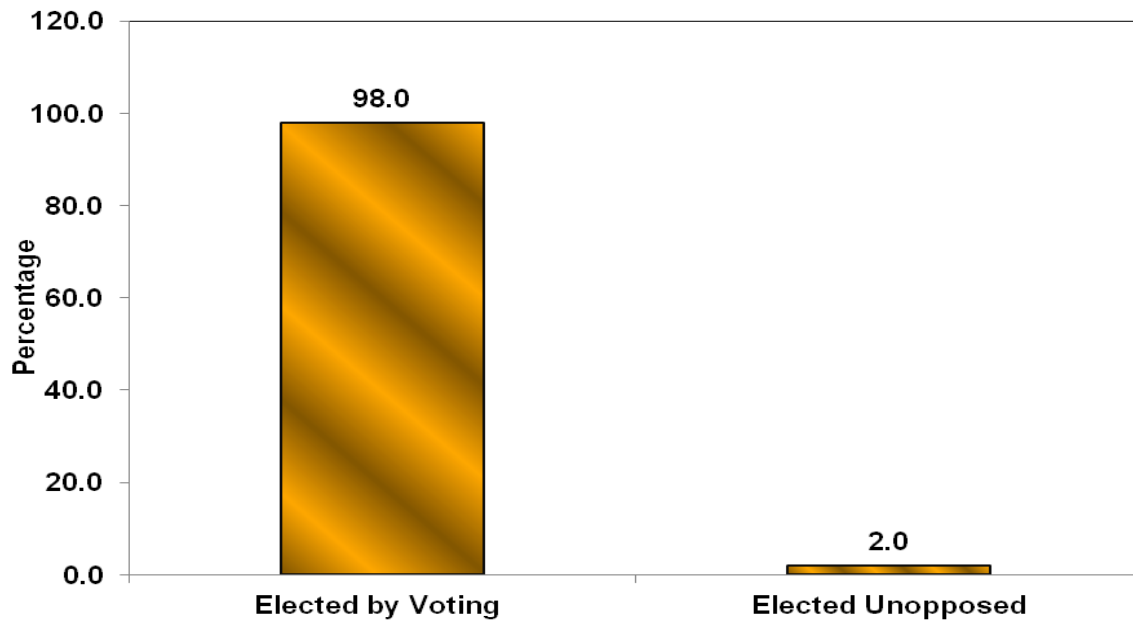

**Percentage of Number of Contesting candidates and Elected Members According to Party Affiliation in Municipal Councils**



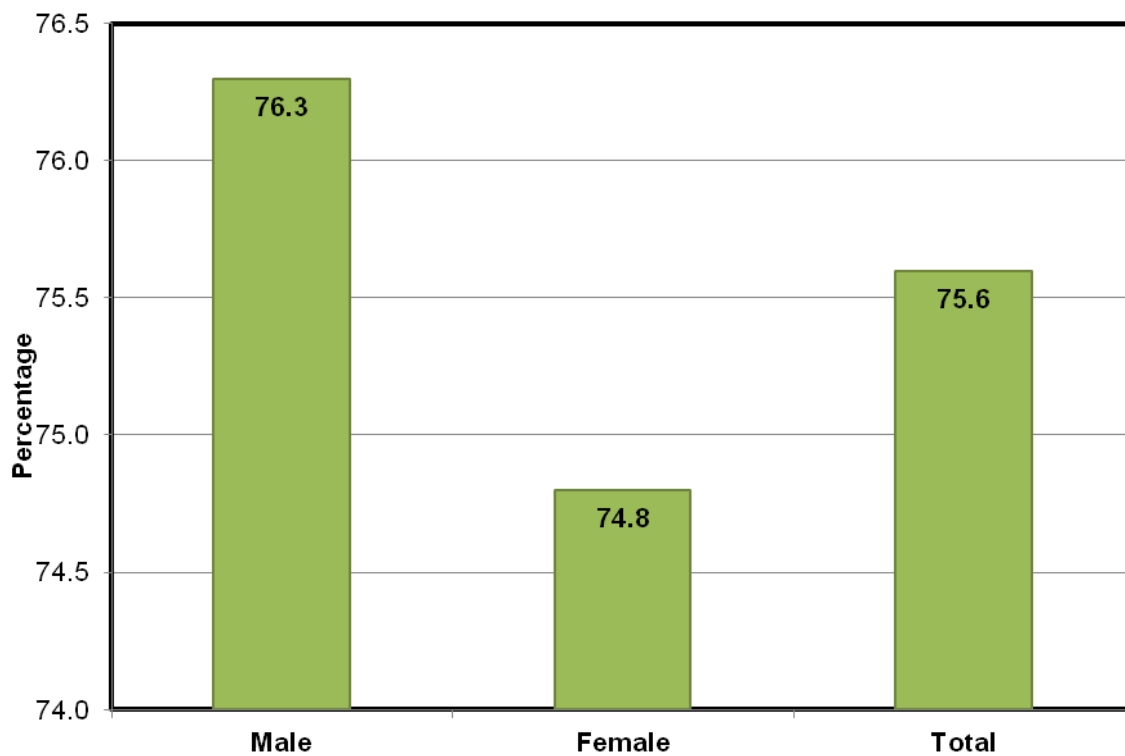

**Percentage of Nominations Rejected, Withdrawn and Accepted in Municipal Councils**



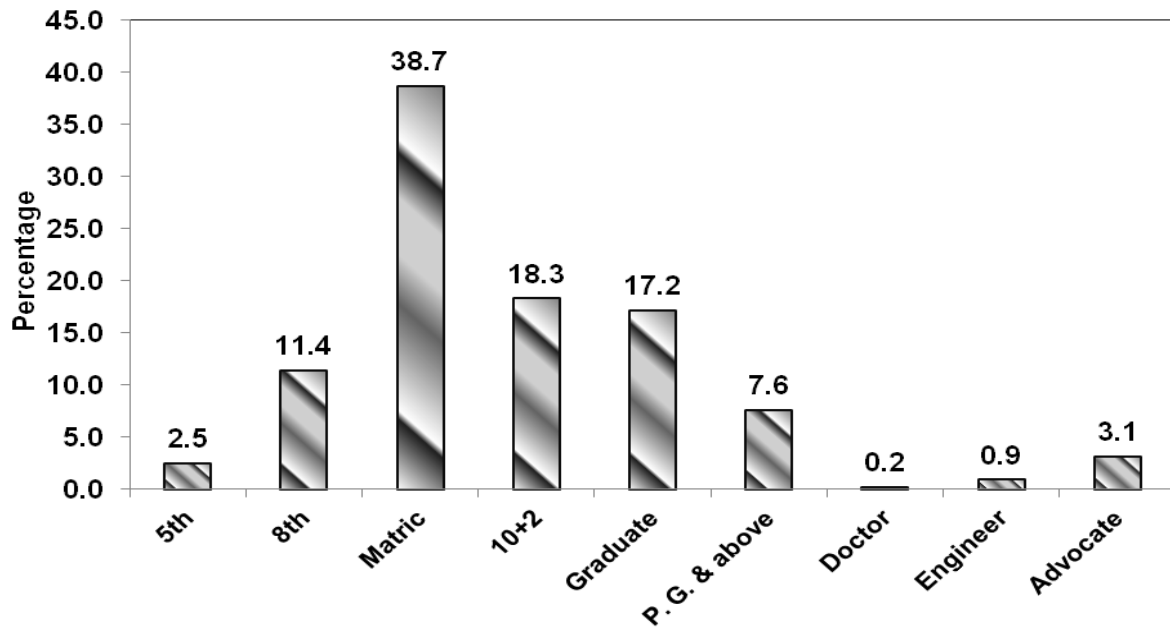

**Percentage of Number of Members Elected by Voting and Unopposed in Municipal Councils**



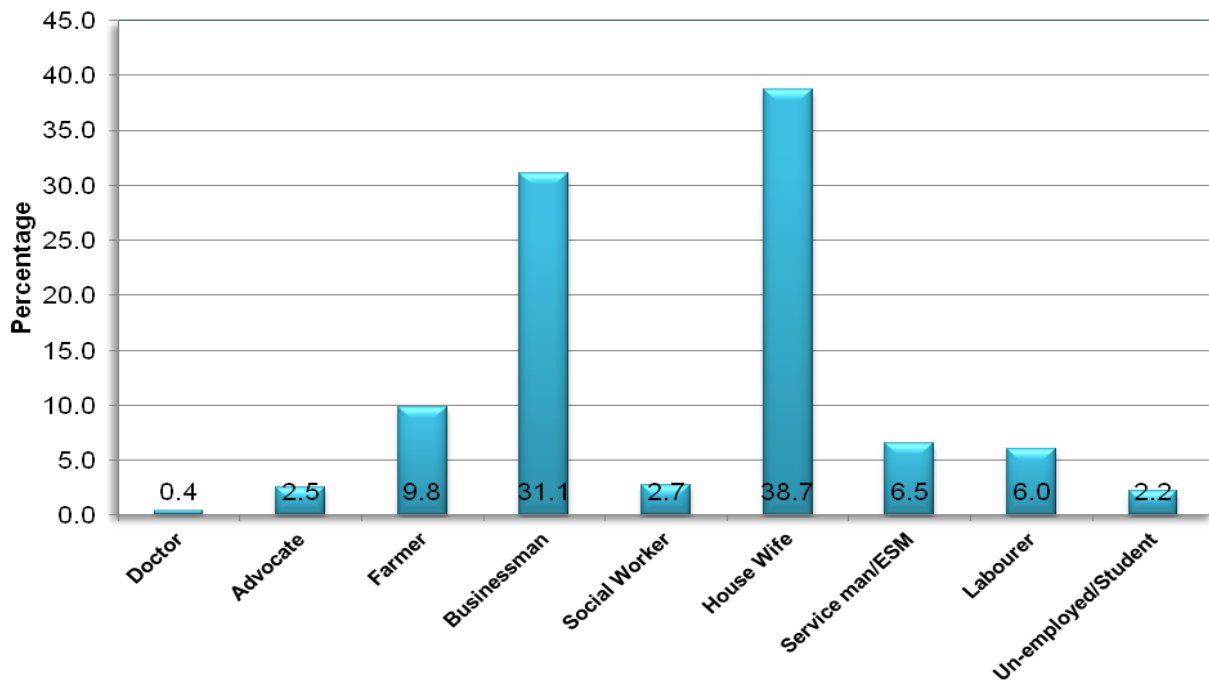

**Percentage of Number of Votes Polled to total Number of Votes in Municipal Councils**



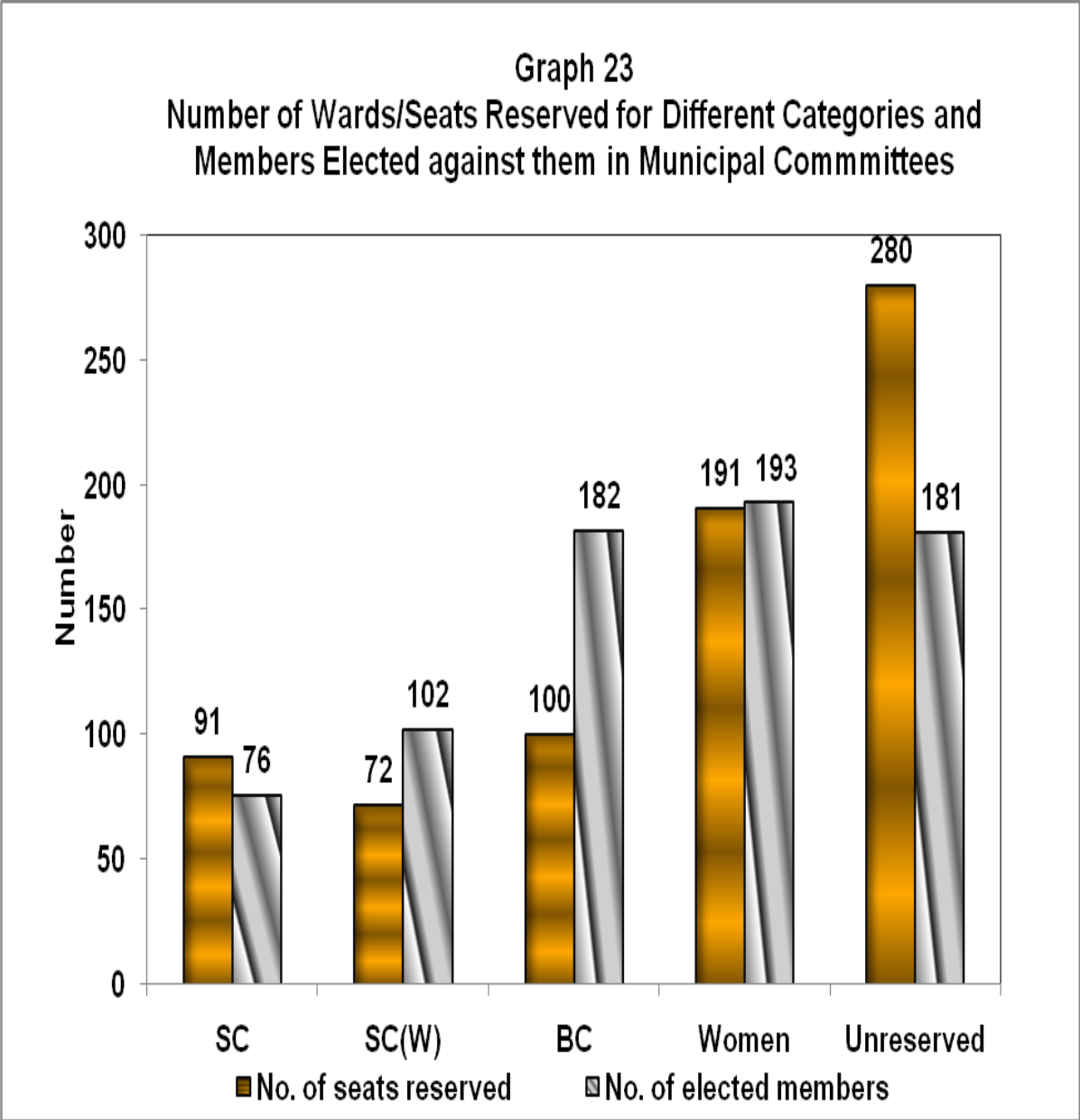

**Percentage of Number of Elected Members According to Educational Qualification in Municipal Councils**



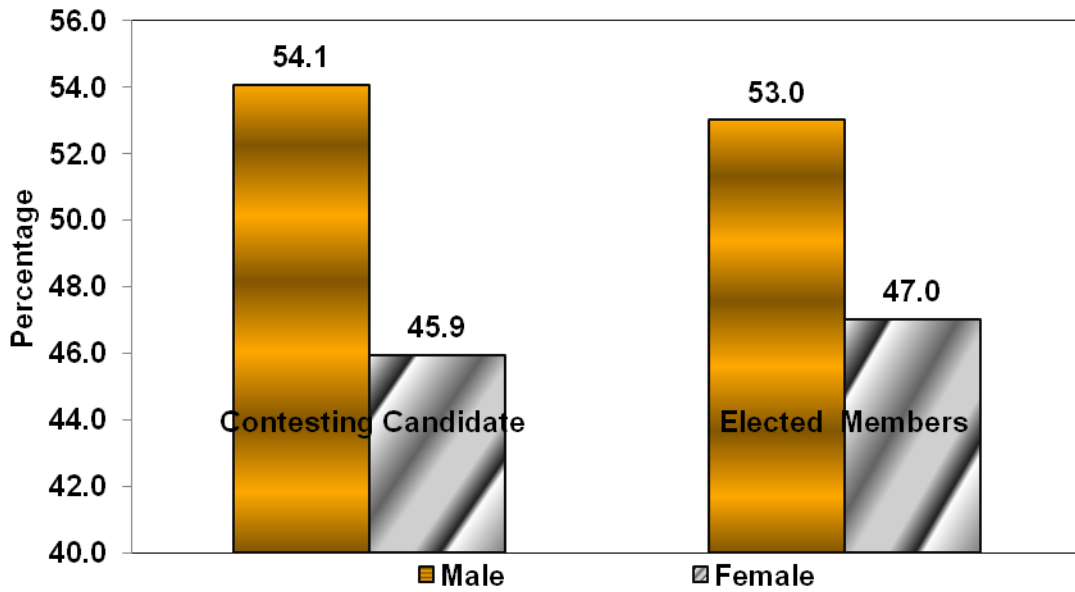

**Percentage of Number of elected members According to Occupation in the Municipal Councils**



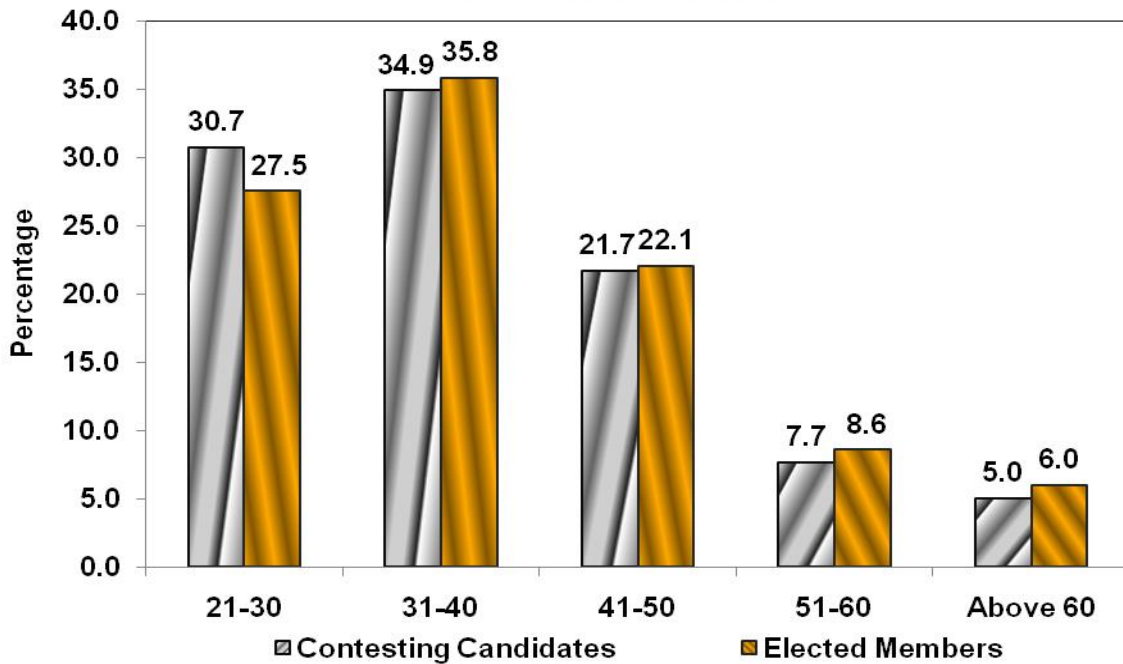

**Percentage of Number of Contesting Candidates and Elected Members by Sex in Municipal Committees**

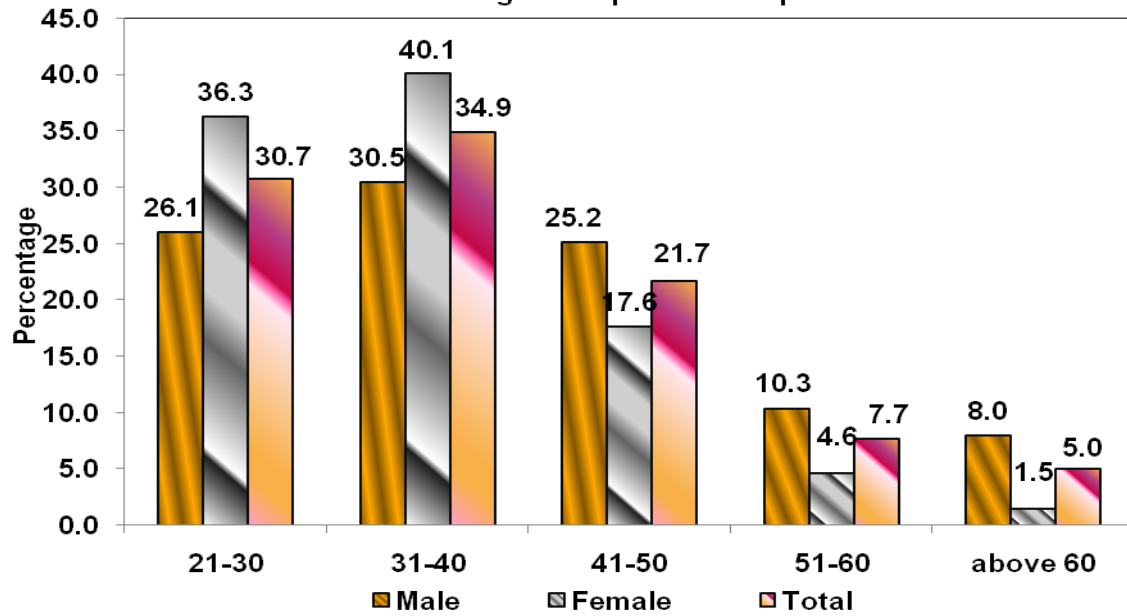

**Percentage of Contesting Candidates and Elected Members in Different Age Groups in Municipal Committees**

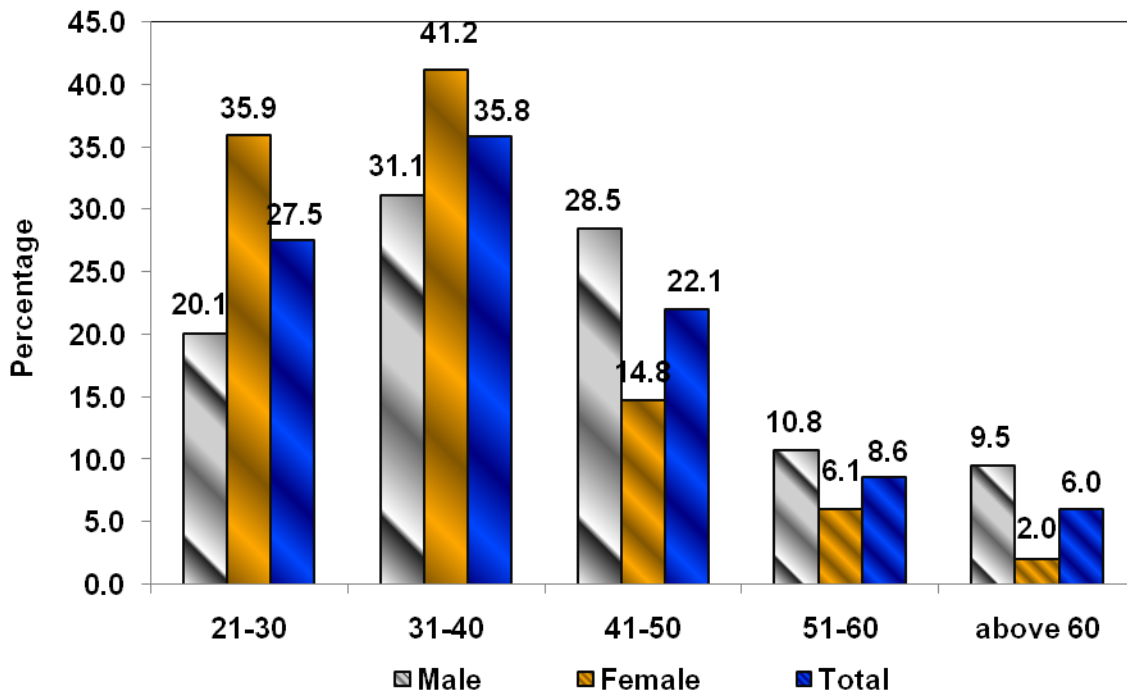




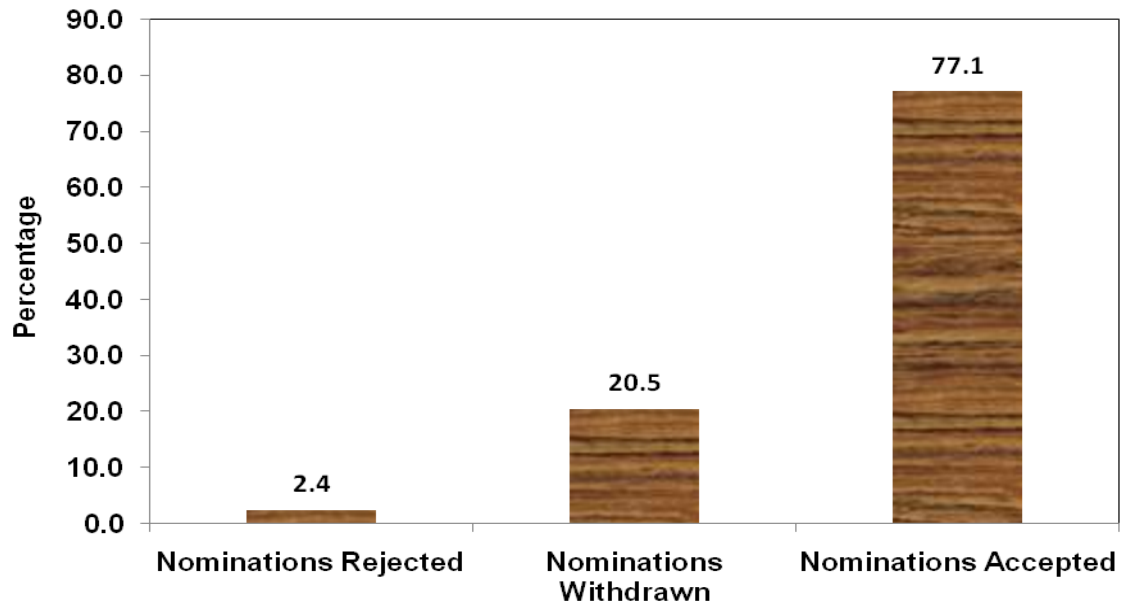

**Percentage of Number of Contesting Candidates According to Sex in different Age Groups in Municipal Committees**



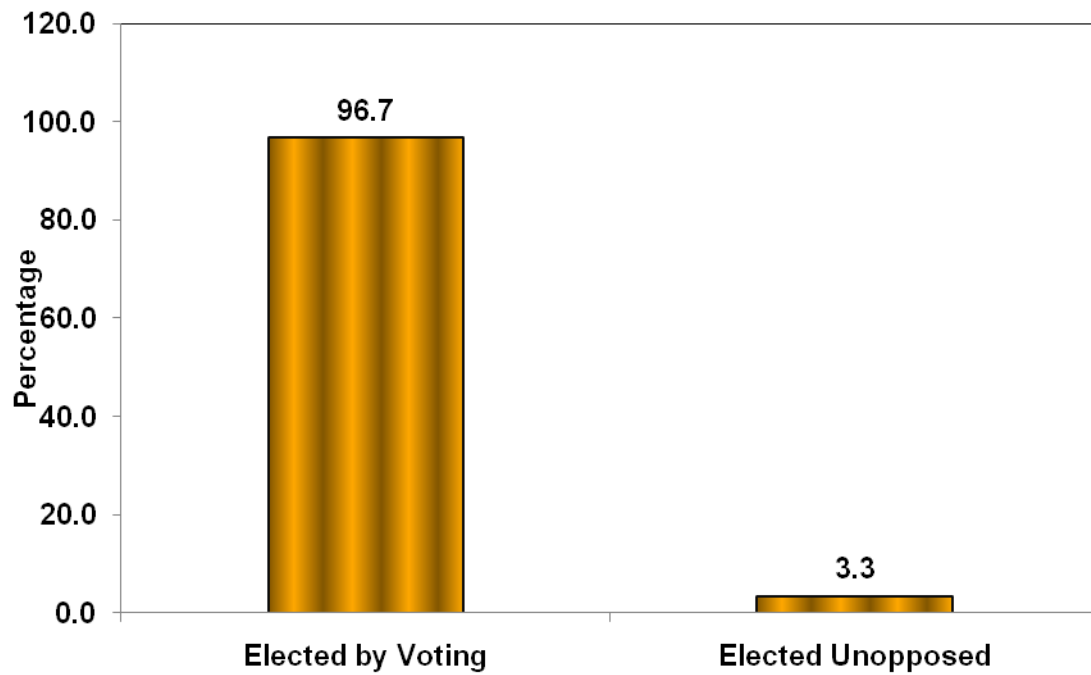

**Percentage of Number of Elected Members According to Sex in different Age Groups in Municipal Committees**



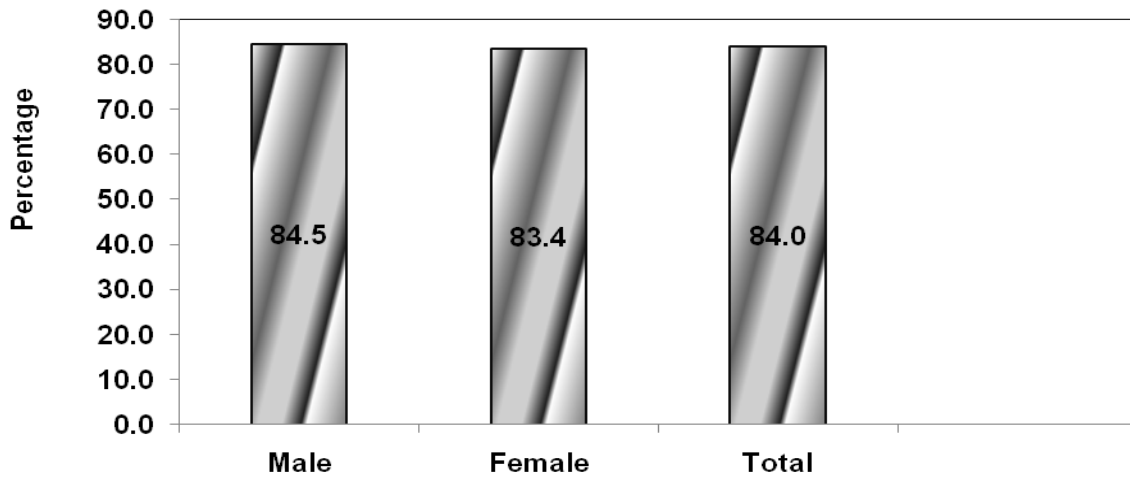

**Percentage of Nominations Rejected, Withdrawn and Accepted in Municipal Committees**



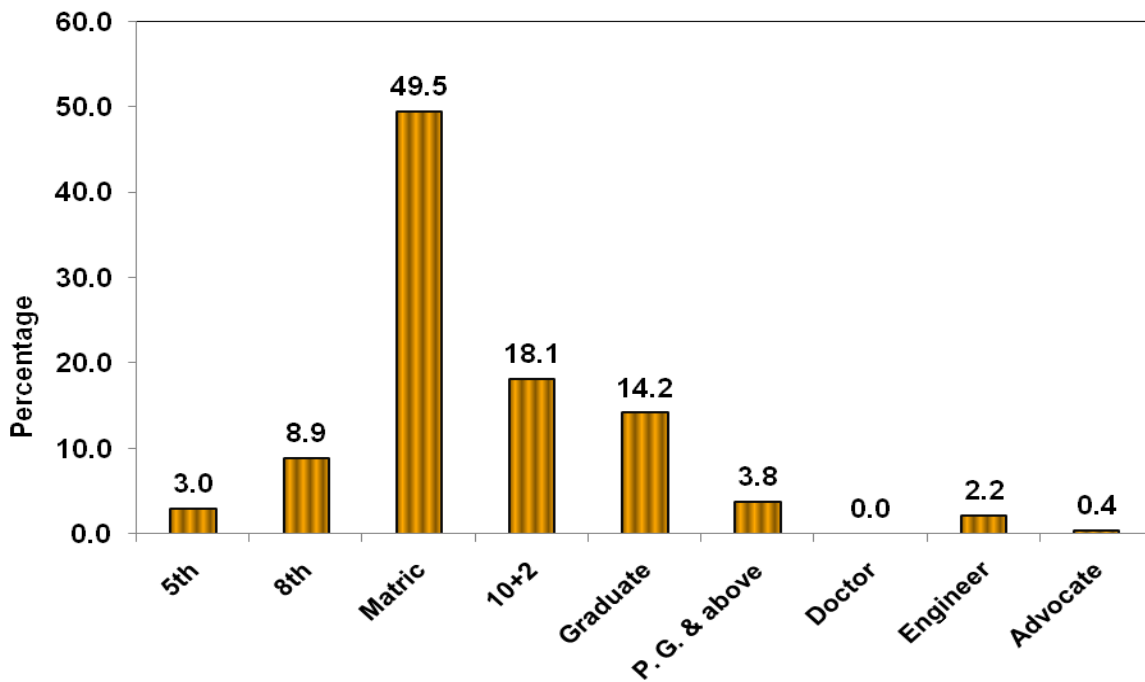

**Percentage of Number of Members Elected by Voting and Unopposed in Municipal Committees**



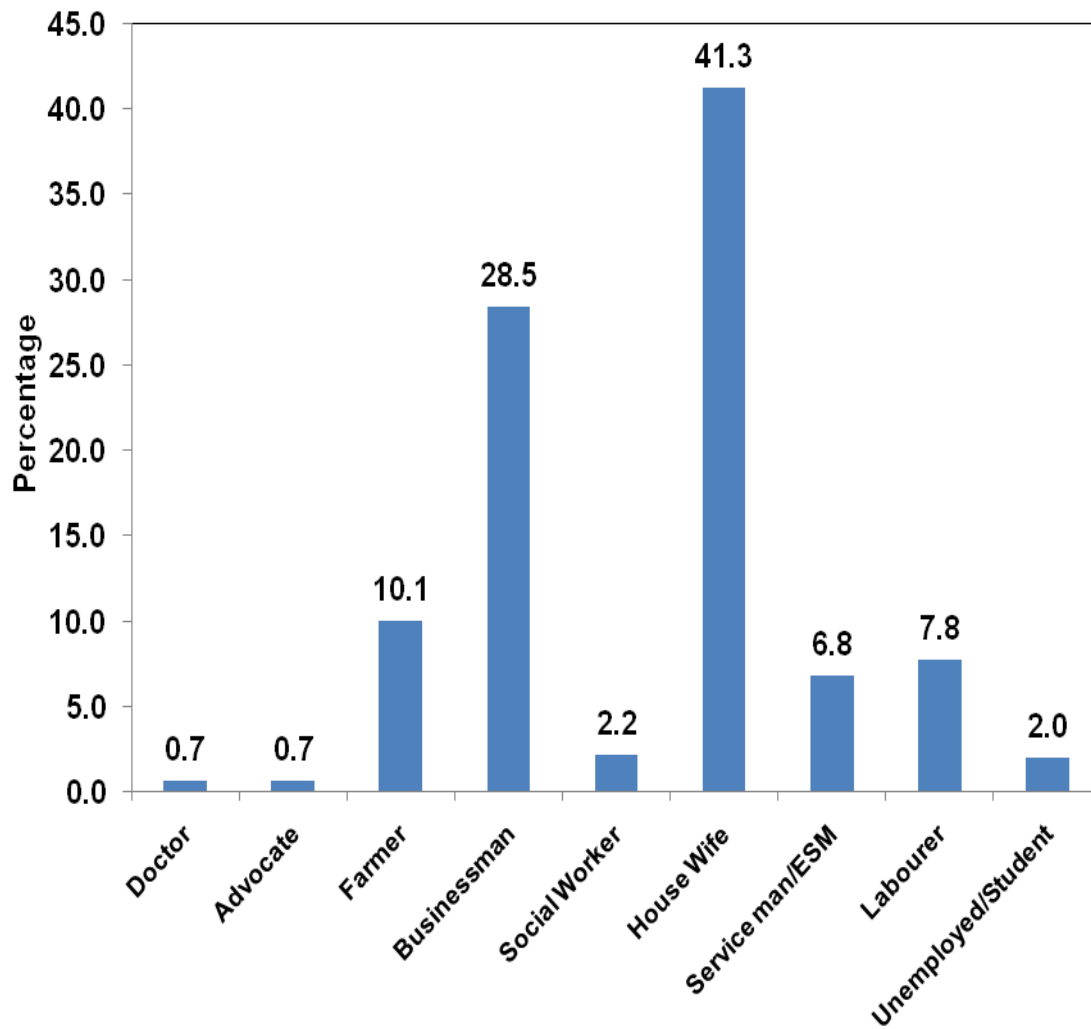
