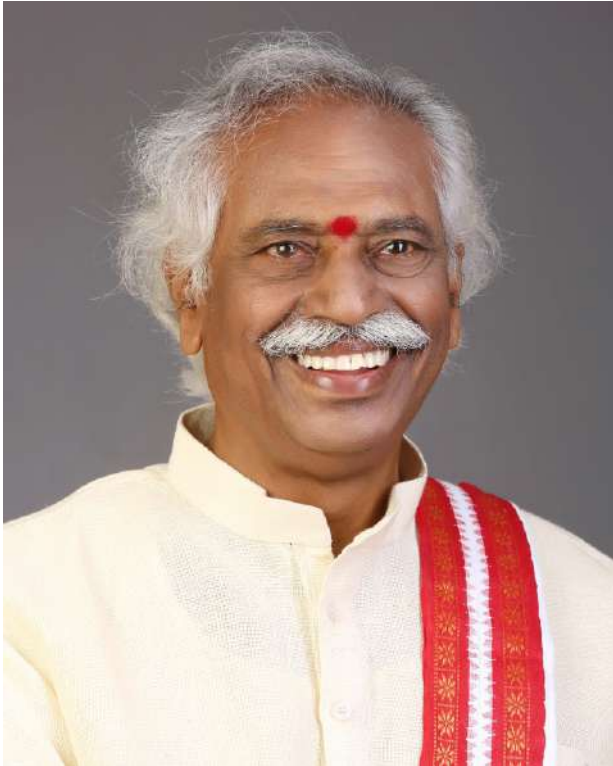

Governor's Message

It is heartening to learn that the State Election Commission (SEC) of Haryana is publishing an election report on the Municipal Elections conducted by it in June, 2022. These elections were conducted after a dark and frightening period of COVID-19.

Democracy as a concept is not new to India. Elements of democracy have found expression in India's public life since ancient times. The Rig Veda mentions the twin representative institutions, namely, Samiti and Sabha with deliberative functions. The Samiti was the national assembly of the whole people (Visah), with powers to elect and re-elect the King (Rajan).

It was thus a sovereign body, in constitutional terms. The famous Sanjnan Suktam (- HH) in the Rig Veda (10/191.1-8) refers to the Samiti. The Suktam speaks of 'common policy of State' (समाजो मंत्रः समितिः समानी) with a common mind and common aim (समानं मजः सह चित्तमेषाम्), which indicates that matters of state (mantra) were discussed in that assembly. It was incumbent upon a king to attend its sessions.

The Sabha, the second chamber, was as important as the Samiti. Its resolutions were inviolable and binding upon all. The Sabha also acted as the national judiciary. These twin assemblies appear to be more like experiments in direct democracy, which is still prevalent in some parts of the world.

Republican form of governments flourished in post-Vedic India alongside powerful monarchies like Magadha, Kashi, Kosala, etc., in 6th and 5th century BC several oligarchies or republics (Gana) dotted the political landscape of northern India. More important of them were Licchavis (Vrijis), Sakyas and Mallas. The Buddha in Maha-Parinibbana-Sutta (Book of the Great Decease) describes the close parallel between the Buddhist Council and the state council of the Licchavis. Historian KP Jayaswal refers to the system of ballot voting by means of pins (Salaka) in such councils to decide issues by majority.

Taking a cue from there and to fulfill expressions of people for self-governance the Parliament carried out 73rd and 74th amendments to the Constitution of India in 1992, which marked a water-shed in the evolution of self-government in the country. These amendments accorded a constitutional status to the Panchayats and Urban Local Bodies in India paving the way for more inclusive and participative governance. State Election Commissions were set up in each State for ensuring free and fair elections to the Panchayats and the Municipalities as a consequence of these amendments.

The State Election Commission, Haryana was constituted vide notification No. S.O.101/Const/Art. 243A/ZA/93 dated 18th November, 1993 and Shri JK Duggal, IAS (Retd) joined as the first State Election Commissioner, Haryana on 14th July, 1994. Elections to Panchayati Raj Institutions and Municipal Bodies in the State have been held under the directions and supervision of the State Election Commission since then. Conduct of General Elections of 28 Municipal Committees and 18 Municipal Councils in the State on 19th June, 2022 is a step in furtherance of that mandate.

I congratulate the State Election Commission for conducting these elections in a free, fair, transparent and peaceful manner in the true spirit of grass root democracy.

Preface

The State Election Commission, Haryana was constituted on 18th November, 1993 in compliance with the 73rd and 74th Constitutional amendments. It is responsible for the superintendence, direction and control of the preparation of electoral rolls and for conduct of all elections to the Panchayati Raj Institutions, namely Gram Panchayats, Panchayat Samitis and Zila Parishads in rural area and Municipalities (Municipal Corporations, Municipal Councils and Municipal Committees) in urban areas in the State of Haryana.

When I joined as State Election Commissioner, Haryana in April 2021, the pandemic COVID-19 was still going on. After viewing the pendency of elections of various Municipal bodies, which had become due after expiry of their five years statutory term, it was decided to hold elections of 18 Municipal Councils and 28 Municipal Committees, which had become due. After receipt of the mandatory consultation required as per the provisions contained in the Haryana Municipal Act, 1973 from the Urban Local Bodies Department, State Government, election schedule was announced. General elections to these Municipal Councils and Municipal Committees were accordingly held on 19th June, 2022 and their results were declared on 22nd June, 2022. This election report reflects the entire process right from preparation of electoral rolls till the conduct of elections and declaration of result and final publication of names of elected candidates in the official gazette of Haryana for these municipalities.

New Initiatives and Salient Features

Some of the new initiatives taken for conducting these elections are as under:-

1. **Revision of expenditure limit:-** In view of inflation, the State Election Commission, Haryana revised the limit of expenditure for the candidates contesting election for the seats of President & members of Municipalities as under:

2. Affidavit regarding criminal cases against the candidates, if any: - To bring criminal record of the contesting candidates before the public, the State Election Commission issued guidelines about the "Publication of Criminal Antecedents". Some of the major guidelines are as under:-
 - (a) Candidates who have criminal cases against them- either pending or in which the candidate has been convicted, shall publish a declaration about such cases, for wide publicity, in two newspapers (at least one Hindi and one English) having wide circulation in the concerned municipal area.
 - (b) Candidates with criminal cases are also required to publish the above declaration on local TV channels or cable networks (if locally available) on three different dates during the above mentioned period and upto 48 hours ending with the hour fixed for conclusion of poll.
 - (c) The Returning Officer shall give a written reminder for publishing declaration about the criminal cases in newspapers and local TV channels or cable networks (if locally available) for wide publicity to all candidates who have criminal cases as per the declaration in items (5) and (6) of Form 1C.
 - (d) In the case of candidates with criminal cases set up by political parties, whether recognized parties or registered un-recognized parties, such candidates are required to declare before the Returning Officer concerned that they have informed their political party about the criminal cases against them.
 - (e) Recognized political parties and registered un-recognized parties, which set up candidates with criminal cases, either pending or of past conviction, are required to publish declaration in prescribed Format C-3.
 - (f) Recognized political parties and registered un-recognized parties, which set up candidates with criminal cases shall have to submit a report in this regard to the Deputy Commissioner concerned.
3. Direct elections for the post of President: - Seats of Presidents in Municipalities have been filled up through direct elections from the territorial constituencies of the Municipalities concerned. However, the seats of Vice-Presidents of the Municipalities have been filled up as per earlier practice i.e. through indirect election from amongst the elected members of the Municipalities concerned.
4. Manpower: - More than 10,000 polling personnel including ROs, AROs, supervisory staff, Presiding Officers, Polling Officers and other staff were deployed for smooth conduct of these elections.

5. Extra Police Deployment in Sensitive & Hyper Sensitive booths: - Elaborate arrangements were made for conduct of elections in a free, fair, transparent and peaceful manner. Adequate police force was deployed to maintain law and order at the polling stations and extra police force was provided in sensitive and hypersensitive polling stations.
6. EVMs: - 4000 EVMs (M-2 Type) were used during these elections. Separate EVMs were used for the posts of President and Member.
7. NOTA (None of the above) :- NOTA option was used in these elections so that voters who come to the polling stations and decide not to vote for any candidate in fray, may be able to exercise their right of not to vote while maintaining their right of secrecy.
8. Inclusion of name in the electoral rolls till the last date of filing of nomination:- For strengthening of democratic rights of the general public, the State Election Commission, Haryana had issued the directions that if any person whose name is not included in the ward wise electoral rolls of the Municipality concerned, but his/her name exists in the relevant part of the electoral roll of the State Legislative Assembly constituency, he/she may apply in Form "A" to the Returning Officer for inclusion of his/her name in the electoral rolls of municipality till the last date of filing of nomination. Returning Officer was made the competent authority for inclusion of name(s) in the electoral roll from the date of issuance of election programme till the last date of filing of nomination.
9. Appointment of Election Observers (General, Police and Expenditure):- For conduct of elections in a free, fair, transparent and peaceful manner, the State Election Commission had appointed senior IAS officers as Election Observers (General), senior IPS officers as Election Observers (Police) for the maintenance of law and order. Officers from Excise and Taxation Department of the rank of DETC were Election Observers (Expenditure) in the Municipalities concerned.
10. Voters Awareness Programme: - To make voters aware, the State Election Commission had hosted video clips on the website of the State Election Commission. The Commission had also released advertisements in the local newspapers and electronic media i.e. radio and T.V. channels, from time to time.
11. Provision of Ex-gratia Compensation:- The Government of Haryana vide circular No. 20/04/2016/2Pol dated 08th June, 2017 has framed ex-gratia policy for grant of lump-sum compensation to such polling personnel/families of the deceased polling personnel who die or sustain injuries during the course of discharge of election duty for Panchayati Raj Institutions and Urban Local Bodies elections. The details are as under:-
 - (i) In case of death of polling personnel during the course of performance of Panchayat and Municipal election duties, his family may be allowed an ex-gratia compensation of Rs. 10.00 Lakh;
 - (ii) In case of death unfortunately caused due to any violent acts of extremists or anti-social elements like road mine, bomb blasts, armed attacks, etc. the amount of compensation may be Rs. 20.00 lakh;
 - (iii) In the case of permanent incapacitation, due to an injury sustained during the course of Panchayat and Municipal election duty, an ex-gratia compensation of Rs. 5.00 lakh may be allowed to the injured personnel;
 - (iv) In case of permanent incapacitation caused due to any violent acts of extremists or unsocial elements like road mines, bomb blasts, armed attacks, etc. the amount of compensation may be Rs. 10.00 lakh;

- (v) If the family of the polling personnel is getting an additional amount of lump sum ex-gratia compensation, including from sundry government sources, such as the Prime Minister's Relief Fund, Chief Minister's Relief fund etc., then there will be no ceiling for grant of ex-gratia lump sum compensation. Similarly, for persons deployed for election duty i.e. security personnel, private persons like drivers, cleaners, contractual or outsourced staff shall also be covered under this policy.
12. COVID-19 Pandemic Protocols: - The State Election Commission had issued guidelines/directions to the district administration to meticulously follow COVID-19 related protocol during elections.
13. Arrangements were made to provide clean drinking water to the voters on each polling station because it was peak of summer.
14. Arrangements were also made to provide umbrella and helpers to the old age voters and wheel chairs to the physically handicapped and disabled voters on each polling booth.
15. Information technology tools were used extensively with a view to ensure transparency and fairness in the conduct of elections.
16. The use of e-Dashboard played a vital role in fast pacing dissemination of information and completing the process in record time.

It was due to all these steps and new initiatives taken by the State Election Commission that overall voting percentage during these elections was 71.9%.

I hope that the present report would prove to be a valuable asset for the field officers especially the Deputy Commissioners and Municipal administration. The report will also be of immense interest and use for the scholars of universities, colleges and research institutions who may be interested in the study of this unique and grass-root level democratic process of election in urban areas.

For the benefit of general public, the report has also been hosted on the Commission's website, www.secharyana.gov.in.

The State Election Commission would welcome feedback from readers and users of this report for making improvements while bringing out similar reports in future.

01 | Constitution of The State Election Commission - History

Elections play an important role in a democratic set up and are its lifeline. It is only through the elections that the true wishes and will of the people, in the matter of choosing their representatives is reflected and the objectives of democracy are realized. Conduct of elections in a free, fair, transparent, peaceful and impartial manner is, therefore, imperative and assumes significance especially in the context of proper functioning of grass root local bodies.

With a view to remove several shortcomings in the legal framework, for providing the constitutional safeguards and guarantees in the functioning of Municipalities, Seventy Fourth Constitutional Amendment was carried out by the Parliament in the year 1992. After ratification by the requisite number of State Legislatures, it came into force with effect from June 1, 1993.

The State Election Commission, Haryana was constituted on November 18, 1993 vide Notification No.SO.101/Const/Art.243A/ 243ZA/93, dated 18.11.1993 of the State Government.

Provisions relating to the status and powers of the State Election Commission in the Articles 243K and 243ZA are analogous to that of the Election Commission of India provided under Article 324 (1) of the Constitution of India. In pursuance of the provisions of Article 243ZA of the Constitution of India, the Legislature of the State of Haryana has made provisions in Section 3A of the Haryana Municipal Act, 1973 and Section 9 of the Haryana Municipal Corporation Act, 1994, for the conduct of elections to Municipalities in the state.

In pursuance of the provisions of Article 243ZA of the Constitution of India, superintendence, direction and control of preparation of electoral rolls for, and conduct of elections to municipalities in the state has been vested in the State Election Commission, Haryana. Holding of regular elections to the urban local bodies at an interval of every five years without break is also one of the important features of the Seventy Fourth Constitutional Amendment. Another important feature of the said amendment is “reservation of seats and offices” including those of Presidents of such bodies for the weaker sections such as Scheduled Castes and Women. After the Seventy Fourth Constitutional Amendment Act, 1992, the State Governments can not decrease or increase the term of elected bodies beyond the period of five years in any manner or to postpone their elections. Since then, the State Election Commission, Haryana has conducted general municipal elections in the years 1994, 2000, 2005, 2010, 2016 – 2018 (in parts) and 2022. This report is on the sixth general elections held during the year 2022.

Reservation of Seats: - For carrying out the constitutional obligation under Article 243T of the Constitution of India and Section 10 of the Haryana Municipal Act, 1973, provisions for reservation of seats made for Scheduled Castes in the state are as under:-

- (1) Seats shall be reserved for the Scheduled Castes in every municipality and the number of seats so reserved shall bear, as nearly as may be, the same proportion to the total number of seats to be filled by direct election in a municipality as the population of the Scheduled Castes in the municipal area bears to the total population of that area and such seats may

be allotted to such wards having maximum population of persons belonging to Scheduled Castes.

- (2) Not less than one-third of the total number of seats reserved under sub-section (1) shall be reserved for women belonging to the Scheduled Castes and such seats may be allotted by rotation and by lots amongst the wards reserved under sub-section (1).
- (3) Not less than one-third (including the number of seats reserved for women belonging to the Scheduled Castes) of the total number of seats to be filled by direct election in every municipality, shall be reserved for women and such seats may be allotted by rotation and by lots to different constituencies in the municipality except those falling under sub-sections (1), (2) and (4).
- (4) {Two seats in every committee} shall be reserved for the persons belonging to Backward Classes which shall be allotted in such territorial constituencies as having maximum population of persons belonging to Backward Classes.
- (5) The offices of presidents in the municipalities shall be filled up from amongst the members belonging to the general category, Scheduled Castes, Backward Classes and women by rotation and by lots in the manner prescribed.}
- (6) The reservation of seats under sub-sections (1) and (2) and the reservation of office of the president other than the reservation for women under sub-section (4), shall cease to have effect on the expiration of the period specified under article 334 of the Constitution of India.
- (7) The reservation of seats under sub-sections (1), (2), (4) and (5) shall be reviewed after every decennial census.
- (8) The reservation as enumerated in this section shall be given effect to through notification issued at the time of each election.]”

Accordingly notifications for composition of municipalities and reservation of seats as per Section 9 and 10 of the Haryana Municipal Act, 1973 and Rule 7 of the Haryana Municipal Delimitation of ward Rules, 1977 were issued by the State Government (Urban Local Bodies Department) for 46 municipalities for conducting general election 2022.

However, the Hon’ble Supreme Court of India in Civil Original jurisdiction Writ petition (Civil) No. 278 of 2022 titled as Suresh Mahajan Vs State of Madhya Pradesh & Another passed an order on 10.05.2022 to the effect that “until the triple test formality is completed in all respects by the state Government, no reservation for other Backward Classes can be provisioned; and if that exercise cannot be completed before the issue of election programme by the State Election Commission, the seats (except reserved for the Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes which is a constitutional requirement), the rest of the seats must be notified as for the General category.”

In compliance of the above order of the Hon’ble Supreme Court of India, the Government of Haryana, Urban Local Bodies Department, issued notification dated 20.05.2022 in partial modification of its earlier notifications. Reservation status, after modified notification, is given as under:-

Electoral Roll: - Electoral roll is the very basis of entitlement for voting in a municipal election. Rules 3 to 17 of the Haryana Municipal Election Rules, 1978 lay down the procedure for preparation/revision, correction, custody and preservation of the electoral rolls of municipalities.

As per the provisions in the above-referred rules, only the electors existing in the respective area of the Legislative Assembly constituency shall be distributed in the wards of the municipalities. For registering as an elector in the Municipal electoral roll, one has to be registered as an elector in the electoral roll of the concerned Legislative Assembly Constituency.

The State Election Commission got prepared ward-wise and booth-wise electoral rolls of all wards of the 18 Municipal Councils and 28 Municipal Committees with respect to January 1st, 2022 as the qualifying date on the basis of concerned Legislative Assembly electoral rolls and finally published the same as per following notifications:-

For making process of preparation of electoral rolls more efficient, transparent and people-friendly, the following directions were issued to the Revising authorities on the basis of past experience.

- (i) The Deputy Commissioner concerned shall give wide publicity to the above programme. He/She shall issue press notes and also paid advertisements in two local newspapers. He/She shall also make publicity through local cable network.
- (ii) The Deputy Commissioner concerned shall publish, on the date prescribed in sub-para (ii) of para 2 above, the draft of the supplementary list of electoral rolls along with a notice including the dates by and the places where the claims and objections with reference to the draft rolls may be presented to the Revising authority/authorities.
- (iii) One copy of the draft list of electoral roll published for inviting claims and objections, shall be kept for inspection of the public free of cost at the following places:-
 - a. Office of the Deputy Commissioner concerned.
 - b. Office of the E.O./Secretary of the Municipal Council/Committee concerned.
 - c. Office of Sub-Divisional Officer (Civil) concerned.
 - d. Tehsil Office concerned.
 - e. Office of Revising Authority/Authorities and
 - f. Voter Information and Collection Centers (V ICCs)
- (iv) After draft publication of ward-wise electoral rolls, the same should also be hosted on the website of the District Administration concerned, with search facility.
- (v) A copy of draft electoral rolls and final electoral rolls along with database in compact disc duly signed by the Revising Authority/Authorities shall be kept in a sealed cover in the Treasury concerned within 24 hours from the date of the publication of draft and final electoral rolls, respectively.
- (vi) In order to facilitate electors and public to obtain information regarding electoral rolls and to file claims and objections, the Deputy Commissioner concerned shall set-up sufficient number of Voters Information and Collection Centers (V ICC) within the territorial limits of the Municipal Council/ Committee. These Centers shall be fully equipped with computers and broadband internet connection. The Centers will be set up with the help of the National Informatics Center.
- (vii) Every claim and objection regarding distribution of electors ward wise shall be addressed and presented to the Revising Authority in the prescribed Form A and B, claims and objections can also be sent to the Revising Authority through registered post.
- (viii) Claim in Form-A shall be filed by those applicants, who intend to include their names, make correction in their entries or transposing of their names in another ward in the electoral roll.

- (ix) Objections in Form-B shall be filed by those applicants who intend to object inclusion of names or seek deletion of names from the electoral roll.
- (x) Only those persons can file their claims for inclusion of their names in the electoral rolls of a Municipal Council/Committee concerned, whose name appear in the respective electoral rolls of legislative assembly constituency concerned, but do not appear in the draft electoral rolls published under rule 4 (3) of the Haryana Municipal Election Rules, 1978.
- (xi) The VICC will make available the prescribed forms, on demand free of cost, for filing claims and objections and receive the same for the consideration of and decision by the concerned Revising Authority or the officers authorized for this purpose. The forms shall also be hosted on the website of the District Administration for downloading and filing claims and objections.
- (xii) As and when any person files claim and objection, he/she shall be given a receipt in the prescribed format given in the form. An entry shall also be made in internet based monitoring system and manual registers.
- (xiii) The Deputy Commissioner concerned shall appoint one Authorized Officer not below the rank of Group-B for maximum up to three wards and sufficient number of supporting staff and other officials of the Municipal Council/Committee, to assist the Revising Authority/Authorities to discharge his/her/their duty.
- (xiv) The Revising Authority/Authorities shall, after holding such enquiry into the claims or objections as he/she/they think(s) fit, record his/her/their decision in writing and shall make available forthwith a copy of such decision to the objector or claimant free of charge. Decision of the Revising Authorities shall also be hosted on the website for information of the public. Number of claims/objections accepted and rejected shall also be hosted on the website of the District Administration.
- (xv) The Revising Authority/Authorities after disposal of all the claims and objections in terms of under Rule 4 (4) (vii) of the Haryana Municipal Election Rules, 1978 shall forward a list of such claims and objections along with his/her/their orders thereon to the Deputy Commissioner concerned. Any person aggrieved of any such order of the Revising Authority/Authorities may, within prescribed period, file an appeal to the concerned Deputy Commissioner in prescribed format annexed as Annexure-E. The concerned Deputy Commissioner shall within the specified time decide the appeal. Decision of the Deputy Commissioner on appeal shall be final. The rolls so amended shall be final and two copies thereof duly signed by the Deputy Commissioner and Revising Authority shall be kept in their offices together with list of additions and corrections.

03 | Meeting Regarding Preparation of General Elections

The State Election Commission, Haryana organized a meeting under the chairmanship of the Hon'ble State Election Commissioner, Haryana in the Committee Room of Haryana Civil Secretariat on 23.05.2022 to discuss arrangements relating to preparation of general municipal elections, 2022. The meeting was attended by the Chief Secretary, Additional Chief Secretaries/Principal Secretaries and Heads of Departments of various Departments such as, Revenue and Disaster Managements, Home, Health and Family welfare, Power, Higher Education, School Education, Excise & Taxation, Information and Public Relation, Urban Local Bodies and Public Health Engineering and the Director General of Police.



- (1) Hon'ble State Election Commissioner, Haryana, Shri Dhanpat Singh, IAS (Retd.) with Shri Sanjeev Kaushal, IAS, the then Chief Secretary to Govt. of Haryana in the meeting for the preparation of general elections of municipal bodies.
- (2) Shri Dhanpat Singh, IAS (Retd.) The Hon'ble SEC Haryana, with the Chief Secretary, Home Secretary, Director General of Police and other Administrative Secretaries/Heads of Departments, giving directions for preparation for general elections-2022 of municipal bodies.

Points discussed/decided in the meeting:**1. Enforcement of Model Code of Conduct**

It was informed that Model Code of Conduct shall come into force from the date of issuance of notification of general election in the area of Municipal Bodies where the election is to be held and shall remain in force till the declaration of election results. The State Election Commission had already issued a booklet of instructions for observance of Model Code of Conduct by the State Govt. political parties and contesting candidates etc. The Chief Secretary to Government of Haryana issued necessary instructions/guidelines to all concerned in this regard. Copies of booklet containing instructions relating to model code of conduct were provided to all political parties and contesting candidates for strict observance.

2. Ban on Postings/Transfers of officers/officials Who are Engaged in Conduct of General Election

It was made clear that all the officers/officials engaged for election duty would be deemed to be on deputation with the State Election Commission for the period commencing on and from the date of notification of such election and ending with the date of declaration of result of election as per provisions of section 13D of the Haryana Municipal Act, 1973 read with section 28A of the Representation of People Act, 1951. The Chief Secretary issued instructions to all concerned Department/Organisations that no employee connected with the election and working in these municipalities shall be transferred during this period except with the prior approval of State Election Commission in case of any expediency.

3. Law and order and other Connected Matters

To ensure conduct of elections in a transparent, free, fair and peaceful manner, Home Department issued directions to ensure maintenance of law and order and general peace. Necessary instructions/directions in this respect were issued by the office of Additional Chief Secretary to Government of Haryana, Home Department, Haryana and Director General of Police, Haryana on the following points:-

- i. Safety and security of contesting candidates.
- ii. Identification of sensitive and hyper-sensitive areas and polling stations.
- iii. Special arrangements to prevent incidents of communal clashes.
- iv. Protection of weaker sections such as members of Scheduled Caste and women.
- v. Deployment of Haryana Armed Police, IRB and Patrolling/Supervisory teams.
- vi. Security for polling parties and other polling personnel.
- vii. Security arrangements for printing press (where the ballot papers are to be printed) and places where the ballot boxes and EVMs are to be kept or to be transported for polling booths, strong rooms and counting centers.
- viii. Special drive to check illicit distillation and illegal transportation/sale of liquor.
- ix. Special drive to effect service of all pending warrants and challans.
- x. Prohibitory orders under Section 144 of the Criminal Procedure Code, 1973 to ban carrying of arms as soon as the elections are announced and till the declaration of results.
- xi. Prohibition on issuance of new licenses for arms during the period commencing from date of announcement of elections and till the completion of elections.
- xii. Special drive to unearth and seize unlicensed arms and ammunition.

- xiii. District Magistrates (immediately after the announcement of elections), shall make a detailed and individual review and assessment of all the arms license holders and impound such licenses wherever they consider it essential for maintenance of law and order.
- xiv. Strict vigil, thorough checking of all vehicles three days before the date of poll to ensure that no undesirable elements or arms and ammunition are transported into the wards from outside.
- xv. Directions to the Deputy Commissioners/ District Magistrates and the Superintendents of Police concerned to initiate all preventive measures on the poll and result day to ensure that voters are not intimidated/obstructed from exercising their votes in a free manner.
- xvi. A special drive to compile list of such persons as are reported to have indulged in past in offences under the Scheduled Castes and the Scheduled Tribes (Prevention of Atrocities) Act, 1989 during the election period.

4. **Power Supply**

Electricity department was directed to ensure uninterrupted power supply at least one day before the poll, day of poll and during counting of votes in the area of respective Municipal Bodies. Necessary instructions/directions in this respect were issued by the office of the Additional Chief Secretary to Govt. of Haryana, Power and Renewable Energy Department, Haryana.

5. **Water Supply and Sanitation**

Proper arrangement of drinking water to be made at all the polling stations one day before the poll, day of poll and during counting in area of respective Municipal Bodies. Necessary instructions/directions in this respect were to be issued by the office of the Additional Chief Secretary to Govt. of Haryana, Public Health Engineering Department, Chandigarh.

- 6. **Health Services:** - Necessary directions regarding observance of Covid protocol during election were issued by the Health and Family Welfare Department keeping in view the situation prevalent at that time. All Civil Surgeons were directed to make arrangements of first aid at the Election Material Distribution and Collection centres. They were also requested to arrange wheel chairs with the help of District Red Cross Societies at the polling stations on demand.

- 7. **Excise and Taxation:** - Necessary instructions/directions were to be issued by the Additional Chief Secretary to Government of Haryana, Excise and Taxation Department on the following points:-

- i Declaration of 'dry days' i.e one day before the day of poll, actual day of polling and counting day.
- ii No liquor shops, hotels, restaurants, clubs and other establishments' selling/serving liquor shall be permitted to sell/serve liquor to any person, whosoever may be, during 'dry days'.
- iii Proprietary clubs, star hotels, restaurants etc. and hotels run by anyone, even if they have been issued different categories of licenses for possession and supply of liquor, should not be permitted to serve liquor during these days.
- iv The storage of liquor by individuals shall be curtailed during the above period and the restrictions provided in the Excise laws on the storage in unlicensed premises shall be strictly enforced.
- v Steps shall also be taken to prohibit sale of liquor in adjoining areas of the Municipal Bodies where the elections are to be held, so that there are no chances of clandestine movement of liquor from those areas, where the restriction has not been in operation.
- vi Excise and Taxation Department was also requested to depute DETCs as per names finalized by the State Election Commission for election duty as Expenditure Observer.

- 8. National Informatics Centre:** - National Informatics Centre created a public friendly e-Dashboard (web portal populated with SMS) on the pattern of e-Dashboard created at the time of the general elections of Municipal Corporations held in December 2018 and December 2020.
- 9. Printing of Ballot Papers of the Municipal Bodies going to the polls**
Printing & Stationery Department, Haryana made all necessary arrangements for timely printing of ballot papers and other election materials as required by State Election Commission.
- 10. Information & Public Relations**
The Information & Public Relations Department, Haryana designated an officer from the I&PR department who prepared press notes and remained present during all press conferences held by the State Election Commissioner, Haryana for coordinating with the print and electronics media.
- 11. Enforcement of the Haryana Prevention of Defacement of Property Act 1989**
Concerned Deputy Commissioner in close coordination with the Urban Local Bodies Department, Haryana ensured strict compliance of the Haryana Prevention of Defacement of Property Act 1989 in the concerned municipalities.
- 12. Repair/maintenance of colleges/schools buildings in which polling booths/counting centers shall be set up and also the roads/street leading to**
Departments of Higher Education, School Education, Technical Education and Industrial Training issued necessary directions to all concerned for proper maintenance/repair of the buildings in Colleges, Polytechnics/ITIs/Schools and other educational institutions in which polling booths/counting centers were to be set up.
They were also asked to ensure that proper drinking water was available in the building and the toilets were in functional condition. The roads/streets leading to polling booths were also got repaired in good condition to allow unhindered movement. Provision of ramp was also made in all the booths for Physically Challenged Voters.

04 | Press Conference for Announcement of General Election of Municipal Bodies



Shri Dhanpat Singh, IAS (Retd.) the Hon'ble State Election Commissioner, Haryana briefing the media persons during Press Conference at the time of announcing election programme for 18 Municipal Councils and 28 Municipal Committees on 23.05.2022.

The Hon'ble State Election Commissioner, Haryana held a press conference in Haryana Niwas, Chandigarh on 23.05.2022 to announce the election programme of 46 municipalities (28 Municipal Committees and 18 Municipal Councils), that was attended by more than 60 correspondents/reporters of print and electronics Media. The State Election Commissioner, Haryana, after announcing the election schedule, briefed about the following points:

1. Model Code of Conduct

It was informed that Model Code of Conduct shall come into force with effect from 23.05.2022 in respect of the concerned Municipal Councils/Committees. No officer/official connected with the election work and those posted in these municipal councils and municipal committees shall be transferred from his/her present place of posting until the completion of election process.

2. Educational qualification for contesting candidates-

Media persons were also apprised that all the contesting candidates are required to maintain account of election expenditure and submit the same within 30 days from the date of declaration of election result to the Deputy Commissioner or an officer authorized by the State Election Commission, failing which the defaulting candidate shall be liable to be disqualified for contesting election for a period of 5 years.

5. Affidavit regarding criminal antecedents and assets etc.

On account of obligation of declaration of criminal antecedents, assets, liabilities and arrears etc, the candidate and his/her proposer are required to submit an affidavit in the format as prescribed (Form-1C and Form1D) under rule 23A of the Haryana Municipal Election Rules, 1978.

6. **Electronic Voting Machine: -** Elections for the seats of both the President and Members would be conducted with the help of M-2 Type EVMs. Sufficient EVMs had been supplied to the concerned municipalities.
7. **Mode of election:-**
All the seats in the municipality including that of the President will be filled in by persons chosen by direct election from the territorial constituencies in the municipal area as per latest amendment made in section 9 of the Haryana Municipal Act, 1973 vide notification No. Leg.34/2019 dated 4th September, 2019.
However, election of the Vice President of the Municipal Committee/Council concerned will be conducted by elected members of the municipalities in compliance of substituted section 18 of the Haryana Municipal Act, 1973 as notified vide notification No. Leg.34/2019 dated 4th September, 2019.
8. **Manpower:**
About 10000 polling personnel including ROs, AROs, Supervisory Staff, Presiding Officers, Polling Officers, Sector Magistrates and other staff will be deployed for smooth conduct of these elections.
9. **Police deployment sensitive & hypersensitive booths:**
Elaborate arrangements had been made for conduct of elections in a free, fair, transparent and peaceful manner. Adequate police force shall be deployed to maintain law and order at the polling stations and extra police force was provided in sensitive and hyper sensitive areas.
10. **Printing of ballot papers:**
The ballot paper for President shall be of pink colour and for members it shall be of white colour. Photographs of the contesting candidates shall be got printed on the ballot papers along with other particulars to be displayed on the balloting unit of EVMs for the convenience of electors. Photograph of the candidate shall be printed in the panel and shall appear on the right side of the name in between the name and symbol of the candidate.
11. **NOTA (None of the above):**
NOTA option will be used in these elections for the voters who came to the polling stations and decide not to vote for any candidate in fray. They will be able to exercise their right of not to vote for any of the candidates while maintaining their right of secrecy. The salient features of the NOTA are given in the Notification No. SEC/1ME/2022/1481 dated: 23.05.2022 of the election programme.
12. **Electoral Roll/Voters List**
The electoral rolls, as notified on final publication in the year 2022, would be the basis for determining eligibility of elector to vote, subject to applicability of Rule 14 of Haryana Municipal Election Rules, 1978 which speaks as under:
"Any person whose name existed in the relevant part of the electoral roll of the legislative assembly constituency and could not be included in the ward-wise electoral roll of the municipality finally published, may apply to the Deputy Commissioner for inclusion of name, correction of any entry or transposing of name in another ward in Form A and for objecting the inclusion or seeking deletion of name, shall be made in Form B."
13. **Appointment of election Observers (General, Expenditure and Police)**
For conduct of elections in a free, fair, transparent and peaceful manner, the State Election Commission appointed senior IAS officers as Election Observers, senior IPS officers as Police

Observers for the maintenance of law and order and senior officers of Excise and Taxation Department as Expenditure Observers in the Municipal Committees/Councils concerned. These Observers were directed to submit reports regarding progress of election in their respective area of assigned duty to the State Election Commission from time to time. During the election period, they will be on deputation with the State Election Commission. They were given clear instructions not to proceed on leave without prior written permission of the State Election Commission before completion of the election process/declaration of result.

14. To ensure maximum participation of electors in polls:

Various voters' awareness programmes such as posting of video clips on the website of the State Election Commission, release of advertisements in the widely circulated newspapers both in Hindi as well as English and electronics media i.e. radio and T.V. channels, will be carried out from time to time.

15. COVID -19 Pandemic Protocol:

The State Election Commission shall issue guidelines/directions to the district administration to meticulously follow COVID-19 related protocol during elections with the assistance from the Civil Surgeon concerned.

16. Appeal:

At the end of the Press conference, an appeal was made to the voters of the concerned Municipal Councils/Committees to participate in these elections in a big way to elect their representatives without any bias of caste/religion and without any fear or favour for strengthening democracy at the grass root level.

ELECTION PROGRAMME

Schedule of general elections, 2022 for 18 Municipal Councils and 28 Municipal Committees was issued in strict compliance of following provisions as contained in Haryana Municipal Election Rules, 1978.

Rule 19:- Election programme and appointment of Returning Officers.—(1) The [State Election Commissioner, Haryana] shall frame a programme for elections hereinafter referred to as the "election programme" of a committee.

[(2) The election programme shall be published at least 5 clear days before the first day fixed for making nominations and shall specify the date or dates, on, by or within which, -

- (i) the nomination papers shall be presented:

Provided that a period of not less than five days shall be prescribed for presentation of nomination papers;

- (ii) the list of nomination papers shall be posted;
- (iii) the nomination papers shall be scrutinized;

{-----}

- (vi) a candidate may withdraw his candidature;
- (vii) the list of contesting candidates shall be posted;
- (viii) the list of polling stations shall be posted;
- (ix) the poll shall be held;

Provided that the date of poll shall not be earlier than the {seventh} day after the last date fixed for the withdrawal of candidatures;

- (x) the ballot-papers shall be counted (here-time and place fixed for the purpose shall also be specified) and
- (xi) the result of election shall be declared.]

The election schedule for the Sixth Municipal General Elections of 18 Municipal Councils and 28 Municipal Committees issued under clause (1) of the Article 243ZA of the Constitution of India, Section 3A of the Haryana Municipal Act, 1973 and Rule 19(1) of the Haryana Municipal Election Rules, 1978 by the State Election Commission, Haryana vide Notification No. SEC/1ME/2022/1481 Dated: 23.05.2022, which is reproducing as under:-

Notification: In exercise of the powers vested under clause (1) of the article 243 ZA of the Constitution of India, section 3A of the Haryana Municipal Act, 1973 and rule 19 (1) the Haryana Municipal Elections Rules, 1978 and all other powers enabling me in this behalf, I, Dhanpat Singh, State Election Commissioner, Haryana, hereby prescribe the following election programme for conduct of general elections for the seats of Presidents and Members of all the wards of 28 Municipal Committees and 18 Municipal Councils.

2. I, Dhanpat Singh, State Election Commissioner, Haryana in exercise of powers vested in me under Rule 19 (3) & (4) of the Haryana Municipal Election Rules, 1978, authorize the Deputy Commissioners concerned to designate Returning Officers and Assistant Returning Officers who shall be the officers of the Government for conduct of general elections for the seats of Presidents and Members of all the wards of Municipal Committees/Municipal Councils in their respective districts.
3. The Returning Officer shall publish a notice of the above election programme on 24.05.2022 at his/her office, office of the Deputy Commissioner and Municipal Committee/Municipal Council concerned and at such other conspicuous places in the area of Municipal Committee/Council concerned in which the elections are to be held, as determined by him/her in this behalf under Rule 20 of the Haryana Municipal Election Rules, 1978. No nomination shall be filed on 02.06.2022 being a holiday. During the period of nomination information about the nomination papers must be hosted on the website of the District Administration and Municipal Committee/Municipal Council concerned at least by 4.00 P.M. every day.
4. I further direct that after withdrawal of candidature(s), a list of validly nominated candidates shall be prepared by the Returning Officer under rule 28 of the Haryana Municipal Elections Rules, 1978, in Hindi and English. A list of nominations received, nominations rejected, nominations withdrawn and contesting candidates etc. with every detail shall be published at every stage and the same must be posted at some conspicuous places and in the office of the concerned Returning Officer or in the office of Municipal Committee/Municipal Council concerned.

5. Under section 275 (1A) of the Haryana Municipal Act, 1973 read with rule 49 of the Haryana Municipal Election Rules, 1978, I hereby specify that the votes shall be cast by and recording of votes by Electronic Voting Machines (EVMs) in general elections of the Municipal Committee/Council concerned.
6. It is further directed that the option "None of the above (NOTA)" on EVMs/Ballot papers" shall be implemented in these elections. The directions in this respect given in the State Election Commission's order issued under Endst. No. SEC/1ME/2016/3653-3659 dated 14th December, 2016 and further modification No.SEC/1ME/2018/5833-5880 dated 22.11.2018 must be followed meticulously. However, the salient features of the NOTA are as under:
 - (i) NOTA shall be treated as a 'Fictional Electoral Candidate' while declaring the election results.
In case, a contesting candidate and the "Fictional Electoral Candidate' i.e. NOTA securing highest and equal number of valid votes; then the contesting candidate (not NOTA) shall be declared as elected.
 - (ii) If in any election, all the contesting candidates individually receive lesser votes than the 'Fictional Electoral Candidate' i.e. NOTA, then none of the contesting candidates will be declared as elected.
 - (iii) In case of a situation arising as described in sub-section (iii) above, fresh election shall be held for that seat. Further all such contesting candidates who secured less votes than NOTA shall not be eligible to re-file the nomination/contest the re-election.
 - (iv) However, if in re-election, NOTA again gets highest number of votes, then re-election will not be taken for second time and the contesting candidate securing the highest number of votes (excluding NOTA) shall be declared as elected.

The following procedure shall be followed in such circumstances,

- i) If a Returning Officer, upon completion of counting of votes but before declaration of result, finds that NOTA has received higher valid votes than all other contesting candidates individually; then he (i.e. Returning Officer) shall not declare the result for that particular seat/s and shall immediately send a report to the State Election Commission to this effect.
 - ii) Upon receipt of such report, the State Election Commission shall after satisfaction, declare fresh election programme for the said seat/s.
7. The Commission further directs to print photographs of the contesting candidates on the ballot papers along with other particulars to be displayed on the balloting unit of EVMs and in the tender ballot papers in addition to the existing particulars. Photograph of the candidate shall be printed in the panel for name of the candidate and appear on right side of the name in between the name and symbol of the candidate. The size of the photograph to be printed on the ballot paper shall be 2 cm in breadth and 2.5 cm in height. The ballot paper for the post of President of the Municipal Council/Committee shall be of pink colour and for Members it shall be of white colour.
8. It is further directed that all voters of the respective area who have been issued the Electoral Photo Identity Cards for the State Legislative Assembly and Lok Sabha Elections and whose Electoral Photo Identity Card numbers have been mentioned in the Municipal Voters list also, shall have to produce these cards to exercise their franchise when coming to the polling stations for voting, the polling for which is scheduled to take place on 19.06.2022. In case of EPIC of a voter is not available then he/she may also be allowed to cast his/her vote on production of any of the following photo identity papers:-

i)	Driving License,
ii)	Income Tax PAN Card,
iii)	Service Identity Card issued to employees by Central/State Government Offices, Public Sector Undertakings, Local Bodies or other public Limited Company,
iv)	Pass Book of an account, having photograph, opened in a scheduled Bank or post office,
v)	Freed om Fighter Identity Card having photograph,
vi)	SC/ST/OBC certificate having photograph, issued by competent authority,
vii)	Certificate of Physical Handicap having photograph issued by the Competent Authority,
viii)	Arms License having photograph,
ix)	Job Cards with photograph issued under the National Rural Employment Guarantee Scheme,
x)	Property documents with photographs such as Pattas, Registered Deeds etc.,
xi)	Pension Documents such as Ex -Servicemen Pension Book/Pension Payment Order, Ex -Servicemen's Widow/Dependent Certificate, Old Age Pension Order, Widow Pension Order, with photograph,
xii)	Health Insurance Scheme Smart Cards with Photograph,
xiii)	Ration Cards or any other similar documents establishing the identity of the electors to the satisfaction of the Presiding Officer, having photograph.
xiv)	Aadhar Card issued by UIDAI
xv)	Passport

In case of an odd elector, who does not possess any of the above photo identity cards, he/she would be allowed to vote, if he/she is able to establish his/her identity to the satisfaction of the Presiding Officer and such other Polling Officer authorized by the Presiding Officer in this behalf.

9. It is further directed to make the following security arrangements for conduct of free, fair and peaceful election:-
 - i. Adequate police personnel shall be deployed at the polling stations, counting centres for security and maintenance of law and order to ensure free, fair and peaceful election.
 - ii. Daily law and order report shall be sent to the State Election Commission till the election process is complete.
 - iii. A copy of the plan for deployment of Executive Magistrates, Sector Magistrate and police personnel must also be sent to the Commission well in time.
 - iv. Provide security to the contesting candidates, if they so desire.
 - v. It shall be ensured that no untoward incident takes place during elections.
10. In order to curb undesirable and illegal activities, the Commission hereby imposes restrictions to hire or procure not more than 05 vehicles by a candidate contesting for the post of President and 02 vehicles by the contesting candidate for the seat of Member of a Municipal Committee/Municipal Council, whether on payment or otherwise, for use by a contesting candidate himself/herself or his/her agents or his/her supporters on the day of poll during the election. It is also stated that :-

- i. The expression "Vehicle" means any vehicle used or capable of being used for the purpose of road transport whether propelled by mechanical/electrical power or otherwise, and whether used for drawing other vehicle or otherwise.
- ii. The contesting candidates shall be issued permits as per Proforma prescribed by the Commission appended herewith. The permits shall be issued to the contesting candidates at least 2 days before the day of poll.
- iii. The District Administration shall keep a close watch on the vehicles used by persons accompanying the contesting candidates and their supporters to prevent any likely mischief, including criminal activities such as carrying of illegal arms and weapons. If any of these vehicles, either of a contesting candidate or a private owner, is found to be involved in any such act or for carting anti-social elements with the intention to intimidate or create terror in the minds of voters, it shall be the duty of local administration to impound such vehicles and not to release them till the process of elections is completed. In addition, appropriate legal action against the owner and or occupant/occupants of such vehicle(s) and the candidate who is/are involved in such illegal activities shall also be taken as per law.
- iv. The District Administration shall launch a drive for checking of vehicles immediately upon announcement of the elections and shall continue the drive till completion of the election process.
- v. All recognized National/State Political Parties in the state of Haryana and all contesting candidates or their agents authorized by them must be made aware of these guidelines/instructions.
- vi. Permit for use of vehicles by contesting candidates during election shall be issued in the following proforma :-

11. As per amendment carried out by the State Government vide notification dated 08.06.2021 in the Haryana Municipal Election Rules, 1978; new rule 14A has been inserted. Now after issuance of programme for election of the municipalities (Committees/Councils), if any person whose name is not included in the ward wise electoral roll of concerned municipality finally published, but his/her name exists in the relevant part of the electoral roll of the Legislative Assembly constituency, he/she may apply (in Form "A") to the Returning Officer for the inclusion of his/her name in the electoral rolls of municipality till the last date of filing nomination. Returning Officer shall be the competent authority for inclusion of such name(s) in the electoral roll from the issuance of election programme till the last date of filing of nomination. The decision taken by the Returning Officer on such

applications shall be final. If the name of any applicant has been included in the electoral roll of any ward of the concerned municipality and he/she intends to contest the election, he/she shall be allowed to file his/her nomination. No amendment, transposition or deletion of any entry in the electoral roll shall be made and no direction for inclusion of a name in the electoral roll of any ward shall be given, after the last date for filing of nominations for an election in that municipality.

12. The Commission further directs that the instructions issued by the Government from time to time pertaining to COVID-19 pandemic be followed meticulously and if such situation arises at any stage during elections, the Deputy Commissioner concerned may issue any instruction/guideline for the safety of general public by taking into account local conditions, wherever required.
13. The Commission further directs that the guidelines pertaining to "facilitation of voters at polling stations on polling day" issued vide No. SEC/1ME/2021/1238-1281 dated 11.06.2021 may be complied with meticulously during the General elections of the Municipal Committees/Municipal Councils.
14. Guidelines pertaining to "Publication of criminal antecedents" issued vide No. SEC/1ME/2021/3057-3088 dated 17.08.2021 must also be complied with meticulously during general elections of the Municipal Committees/Municipal Councils. Some of the major guidelines to be followed at the time of general elections are reproduced as under:-
 - (a) Candidates who have criminal cases against them- either pending or in which the candidate has been convicted, shall publish a declaration about such cases, for wide publicity, in two newspapers (at least one Hindi and one English) having wide circulation in the concerned municipal area. The declaration is required to be published (in prescribed Format C-1) at least on three different dates from the day following the last date for withdrawal of candidatures and up to two days before the date of poll.
 - (b) Candidates with criminal cases are also required to publish the above declaration on local TV channels or cable networks (If locally available) on three different dates during the above mentioned period and up to 48 hours ending with the hour fixed for conclusion of poll.
 - (c) The Returning Officer shall give a written reminder (in prescribed Format C-2) about the directions given herein for publishing declaration about the criminal cases in newspapers and local TV channels or cable networks (if locally available) for wide publicity to all candidates who have criminal cases as per the declaration in items (5) and (6) of Form 1C. The candidates shall submit copies of the newspapers in which their declaration in this regard was published to the Deputy Commissioner or an officer authorized by the State Election Commission, along with their account of election expenses.
 - (d) In the case of candidates with criminal cases set up by political parties, whether recognized parties or registered un-recognized parties, such candidates are required to declare before the Returning Officer concerned that they have informed their political party about the criminal cases against them.
 - (e) Recognized Political parties and registered un-recognized parties, which set up candidates with criminal cases, either pending or of past conviction, are required to publish declaration (in prescribed Format C-3) giving details in this regard on their website as well as in local TV channels or cable networks (if locally available) and at least two newspapers (one Hindi and one English) having wide circulation in the municipal area concerned.
 - (f) Recognized Political parties and registered un-recognized parties, which set up candidates with criminal cases shall have to submit a report to the Deputy Commissioner concerned stating that they have fulfilled the requirements of the directions, and shall enclose paper cutting containing declaration published by the party in this respect. This shall be done within 30 days of completion of election.
15. Information pertaining to criminal antecedents of the contesting candidates obtained in the prescribed forms along with nomination paper must also be hosted on the official website of district

administration and the same shall remain hosted on the website till the completion of next general election of that municipal body. The directions in this respect given in the Commission's letter No. SEC/1ME/2017/1117-38 dated 2nd June, 2017 must be meticulously followed.

16. The revised expenditure limit to be incurred by the contesting candidate or his/her authorized election agent(s) for the election of President and Member of the Municipal Committee/Council

17. Re-poll, if any required, shall be held on 21.06.2022 and counting of votes shall be held on 22.06.2022 at 8.00 A.M. at the place(s) specified by the Deputy Commissioner concerned. The details (Accounts) of votes polled at each polling station shall be prepared in Part-II of Form 18 and forwarded to the Returning Officer concerned for consolidation in Form 8, mentioning therein the total number of valid votes polled in favor of each candidate on each polling station and declare the candidate, who is found to have obtained the largest number of votes, as elected President of Municipal Committee/Municipal Council concerned and Member of respective ward.
18. After declaration of result of election under Rule 62, the Returning Officer shall forthwith post a copy of return (i.e. Form 8- Consolidation of account of the counted ballot papers) at a conspicuous place in his office and send a copy thereof to the Deputy Commissioner, who shall forward the same immediately but not later than three days, names of the candidates elected to the State Election Commission, Haryana for notifying the same in the official gazette. The Deputy Commissioner shall ensure that the names and other particulars of the elected candidates should be the same as are recorded in the nomination paper.
19. All contesting candidates are required to maintain account of election expenditure and submit the same within 30 days from the date of declaration of the result of the election to the Deputy Commissioner or an officer authorized by the State Election Commission, failing which the defaulting candidate shall be liable to be disqualified under Section 13F of the Haryana Municipal Act, 1973 and Haryana Municipal Election Expenditure (Maintenance and submission of accounts) Order, 2020, for a period of five years from the date of issue of such order. The Deputy Commissioner or an officer authorized by the State Election Commission shall check account of election expenses and send a list of contesting candidates who have filed and not filed the election expenditure statement, to the Commission within a period of 7 days from the completion of prescribed time limit of 30 days.

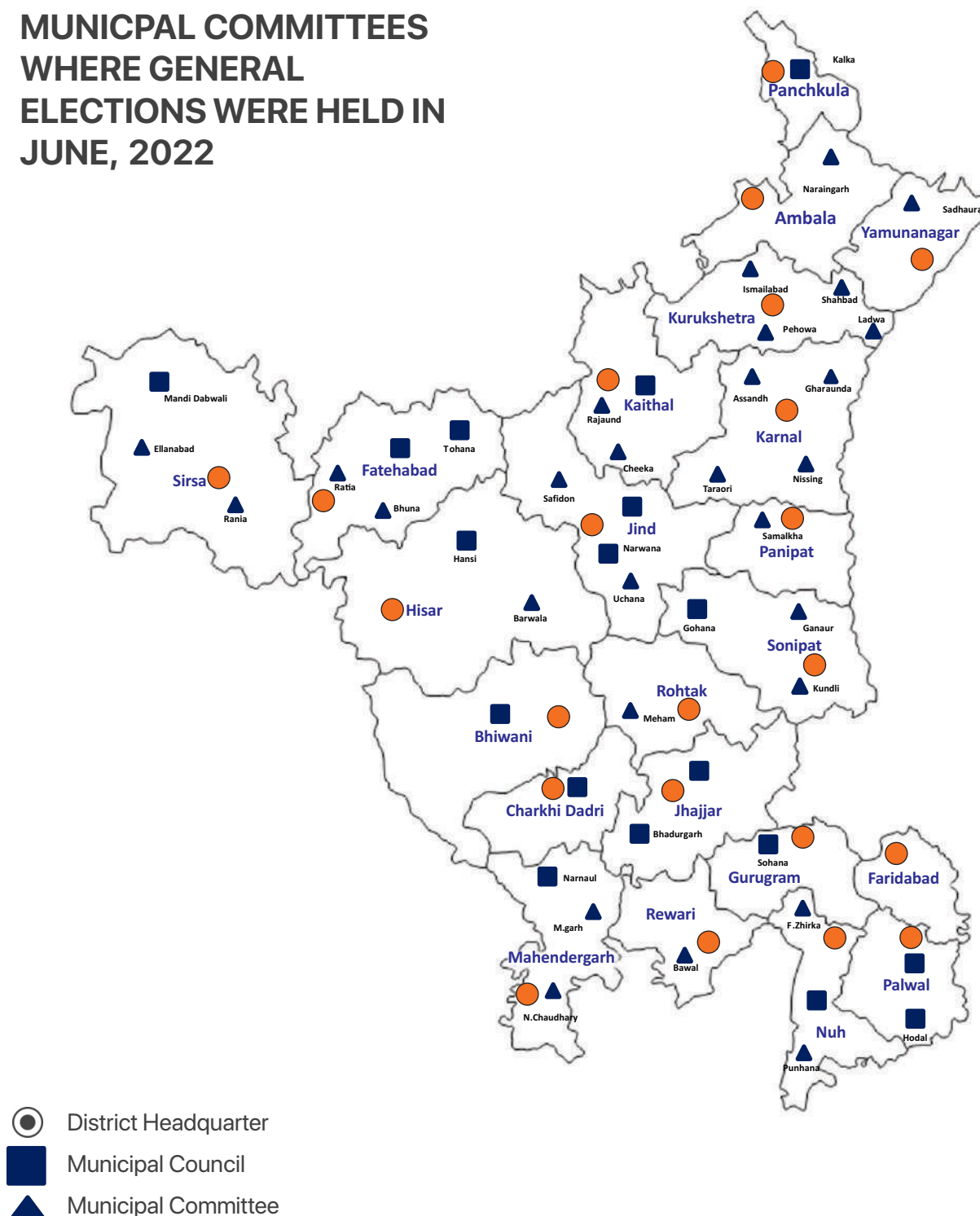

05 | Model Code of Conduct

Salient features: - In exercise of powers conferred upon it under Article 243ZA of the Constitution of India, the State Election Commission, Haryana issued the Model Code of Conduct for election to Urban Local Bodies to ensure free, fair and peaceful elections. The Model Code of Conduct is required to be observed by all the, political parties, contesting candidates, ministers, employees of the State Government and local bodies and other public servants related with the local body elections. The Mode of Conduct was enforced from the date of announcement of elections till the date of declaration of result of the local bodies concerned.

Part A:- For Candidates

I. General Conduct for Candidates

- (1) No party or candidates shall indulge in any activity, which may aggravate existing differences, create mutual hatred, or cause tension between different castes and communities, religious or linguistic.
- (2) There shall be no appeal to caste or communal feelings for securing votes.
- (3) Houses, Churches, Temples or other places of worship shall not be used as forum for election propaganda.
- (4) All parties and candidates shall refrain from criticism of all aspects of private life, not connected with the public activities of the leaders or workers of other parties. Criticism of other parties or their workers based on unverified allegations or on distortion shall be avoided.
- (5) Criticism of other political parties, when made, shall be confined to their parties and programmes, past record and work. They should not be criticised on unverified allegations.
- (6) The right of every individual for peaceful and undisturbed life shall be respected, however, much the political parties or candidates may resent his political feelings or activities. Organising demonstrations or picketing before the houses of individuals by way of protesting against their opinions shall not be resorted to under any circumstances.
- (7) Political parties and candidates should avoid such activities which are offences under the election Law for example:
 - (i) Transport and conveyance of voters to and from polling stations.
 - (ii) Holding Public Meeting during the period of 48 hours ending with the hour fixed for close of poll.
 - (iii) Canvassing within 100 meters of a polling station.
 - (iv) Bribing of voters, intimidation of voters, personation of voters.
- (8) On the day of polling or two days prior to it, the liquor shall neither be purchased nor shall it be offered to any person or distributed. Every candidate will ask his supporters also not to indulge in such activities.
- (9) No candidate shall permit his followers to make use of any individual's land building, compound wall etc. without his permission for erecting flag staffs, suspending banners, pasting notices, writing slogans etc.
- (10) No political party or candidate shall allow his supporters to remove the flags or posters pasted by other parties or candidates.

- (11) Identification slips given to the voters will be on plain paper containing the name of the candidate. It should not have name of the candidate and his election symbol. The identification/slips will contain the name of voters, his father/husband's name, ward number, polling station number and serial number in the voting list and will not contain anything else.
- (12) The candidate/political party will give full co-operations to the polling staff on duty for the peaceful conduct of the elections.

II. Meeting and Processions

- (i) The party or candidates shall inform the local police authorities of the venue and time of any proposed meeting/procession well in time so as to the police to make necessary arrangements for controlling traffic and maintaining peace and order.
- (ii) A party or candidate shall ascertain in advance if there are any restrictive or prohibitory orders in force in the place proposed for the meeting/procession. If such orders exist, they will be followed strictly. If any exemption is required from such orders, it shall be applied for and obtained well in time.
- (iii) The organisers shall take steps in advance or arrange for passage of the procession so that there is no block or hindrance to traffic. If the procession is very long, it shall be organised in suitable lengths so that at convenient intervals, especially at points where the procession has to pass road junctions, the passage of held-up traffic could be allowed by stages thus avoiding heavy traffic congestion.
- (iv) If two or more political parties or candidates propose to take processions from the same route or parts thereof at the same time, the organisers shall contact well in advance and decide upon the measures to be taken to see that the processions do not clash or cause hindrance to the traffic. Local police shall be availed of for arriving at a satisfactory arrangement. For this purpose, the parties shall contact the police at the earliest possible.
- (v) The political parties or candidates shall exercise control to the maximum extent possible in the matter of processionists carrying articles which may be put to misuse by undesirable elements, especially in moments of excitement.
- (vi) Organisers of a meeting shall invariably seek the assistance of the police on duty for dealing with persons disturbing a meeting/procession or otherwise attempting to create disorder. Organisers themselves shall not take action against such persons.
- (vii) The carrying of effigies purporting to represent members of other political parties or their leaders, burning such effigies in public and such other forms of demonstration shall not be countenanced by any political party or candidate.

III On the Polling Day

All political parties and candidates shall -

- (i) supply to their authorised workers suitable badges or identity cards;
- (ii) agree that the identity slips supplied by them to voters shall be on plain (white paper) and shall not contain any symbol, name of the candidate or the name of the party;
- (iii) refrain from serving or distributing liquor on polling day and during the twenty-four hours preceding it;
- (iv) not allow unnecessary crowds to be collected near the camps set-up by the political parties and candidates near the polling booths so as to avoid

confrontation and tension among workers and sympathisers of the parties and candidates.

- (v) Ensure that the candidate's camps shall be simple. They shall not display any posters, flags, symbols or any other propaganda material. No eatables shall be served or crowds allowed at the camps;
- (vi) co-operate with the authorities in complying with the restrictions to be imposed on the plying of vehicles on the polling day and obtain permits for them.

IV At the Polling Booth

Except the voters, no one without a valid pass from the Election Commission shall enter the polling booths.

Part-B: For Government Departments and Government Servants

1. No Government servant shall take part in, subscribe in aid of, or assist in any way, any candidate.
2. Attendance at public meetings organised by candidate would always be contrary to the Government Servants Conduct Rules unless all the following conditions are satisfied: -
 - (1)
 - (a) that the meeting is public meeting and not in any sense private or restricted meeting;
 - (b) that the meeting is not held contrary to any prohibitory order or without permission where permission is needed; and
 - (c) that the Government servant in question does not himself speak at, or take active or prominent part in organising or conducting the meeting.
 - (2) Even where the said conditions are satisfied, while occasional attendance at such meetings may not be construed as a participation, frequent or regular attendance by a Government servant at meetings of any particular candidate is bound to create the impression that he is a sympathiser of the aims and objects of that particular candidate. Conduct which give cause for such an impression may well be construed as assisting a candidate.
3. During election campaign, if any Minister visits a private house in connection with some election programme, the Government servant should not attend that function.
4. While giving permission for any meeting no candidate should be discriminated.
5. If on a particular day a number of candidates apply for holding a meeting at a particular place, the permission should be given to only that candidate who had applied first.
6. Rest Houses or Circuit Houses should be given for use to all candidates on the same and equal conditions. No candidate will be given permission to use these places or premises for election propaganda.
7.
 - (a) During the election period, if any, meeting is conducted it should be considered a meeting for political purpose and Government should not spend any amount on it; leaving aside the Govt. servants who are there for maintaining law and order, no other Government employee should attend such meetings.
 - (b) During the period of elections, if any Minister visits any Municipal Committee/ Corporation and Panchayat where the elections are due, such tour must be considered as election tour and no Government servant should accompany the Minister/those who are to be provided for security. During such tours Government vehicles should not be made available.
 - (c) From the date when the election is announced till the election is complete, the Government, Local Government, Cooperative Institutions and such other Institutions which receive aid

from the Government would not make available their vehicles to the Ministers, Members of Parliament, Member of Legislative Assembly or candidates and such vehicles will not be utilised for election purposes.

8. Ministers will not combine their official tours with the tours for the purpose of election propaganda nor will they utilise the Government servants or vehicles during the election period which can be considered as being utilised for the purpose of favouring a candidate.
9. From the date election is announced till the election is complete, Ministers will not give any grant from the discretionary fund or from the Government fund nor will they sanction any scheme. During this period no foundation stone will be laid nor will any plan be inaugurated.
10. During election period such advertisements will not be released by Government Institutions in the news-papers which will highlight the achievements of the party in power which may lead to favouring a candidate.

It is requested that this may be brought to the notice of the Hon'ble Chief Minister, all Ministers, MPs/MLAs, Chairpersons (Non Official) and other authorities of all Boards/Corporations.

I am directed to refer to the subject noted above and to say that State Election Commission, Haryana has issued notification No. SEC/IME/2022/1481, dated 23.05.2022 for the conduct of the General Elections for the seat of President and Members of all the wards of 28 Municipal Committees and 18 Municipal Councils which will be held on **19.06.2022**.

2. You are, therefore, requested that the officers/officials of the State Government deputed to conduct the above said elections should not be transferred till the declaration of election result of these Municipal Committees / Municipal Councils. However, in case, where it is considered necessary to transfer an officer/official connected with the above said Municipal Elections in large public interest due to some emergency, prior written approval of this Commission be obtained.

ELECTRONIC VOTING MACHINE (EVM) BEING DEMONSTRATED TO THE REPRESENTATIVES OF POLITICAL PARTIES.

A meeting was held with the representatives of various Political Parties in the state of Haryana on 4th June, 2022 in Haryana Niwas, Chandigarh. To remove any suspicion or doubts, a demonstration on EVM (M2 type) was given to them. All their queries were answered and all aspects related to voting were explained to them. A copy of Model Code of Conduct was handed over to each of them and were requested to extend their full cooperation in exercise to conduct the elections in free, fair, transparent and peaceful manner.

06 | Nominations

Rule 20 of the Haryana Municipal Election Rules, 1978, provides that :- The Returning Officer shall on the date specified under rule 19 by notices posted at his Office and at the Office of the committee, and at such other places as he may determine:-

- (a) invite nomination papers of candidates for election;
- (b) fix the date, time and place where and how the nomination paper shall be delivered;
- (c) specify the authority to whom nomination papers shall be delivered; and
- (d) fix the date, time and place for the scrutiny of nomination paper of candidates.

Note:- Attention is drawn towards notification No. 4/2/2014-R-11/1973 dated 25.04.2016 of the State Government.

Deposits – Rule 24 of the Haryana Municipal Election Rules, 1978, mandates for deposition of amount as tabulated below, else otherwise nomination paper is deemed to have been duly delivered.

Scrutiny of Nomination Papers – Rule 25 of the Haryana Municipal Election Rules, 1978, provides that the Returning Officer or the Assistant Returning Officer, as the case may be, is required to acknowledge the receipt of the nomination paper in the printed form as prescribed in rule 25 of Haryana Municipal Election Rules, 1978. In addition, a notice to the candidate, of the date and time for scrutiny of the nomination is also required to be given to as a token of receipt of nomination and notice of scrutiny. The Returning Officer or Assistant Returning Officer, as the case may be, shall at every stage prepare the notices of nomination containing descriptions similar to those contained in the nomination paper, both of the candidate and the proposer, and affix the same at the notice board of his office and the office of the municipality concerned.

Rule 27 of the Haryana Municipal Election Rules, 1978 - The Returning Officer shall examine the nomination papers and give the summary inquiry on the following points to decide the validity of the candidates:-

- i Eligibility
- ii Disqualification
- iii Affidavit and deposition of fee
- iv Signature and proposer of the Candidates

Disqualifications

Legal Provisions:- Section 13A of the Haryana Municipal Act, 1973 provides that (1) A person shall be disqualified for being chosen as and for being President or a member of a municipality. -

- (1)
 - (a) if he is so disqualified by or under any law for the time being in force for the purposes of election to the Legislature of the State of Haryana: Provided that no person shall be disqualified on the ground that he is less than twenty- five years of age if he had attained the age of twenty one years;
 - (b) if he is so disqualified by or under any law made by the Legislature of the State of Haryana ;
 - (c) Omitted.
 - (d) if he is convicted or has been convicted of an offence punishable under section 29, 30 and 31 of the Haryana Municipal Corporation Act, 1994 (16 of 1994), the Prevention of Corruption Act, 1988 (49 of 1988) or the Prevention of Terrorism Act, 2002 (15 of 2002)[;or]
 - (e) if he has been convicted or charges have been framed against him by a court in a criminal case for an offence, punishable with imprisonment for not less than ten years; or
 - (f) if he fails to pay an arrear of any kind due to him to any Primary Agriculture Cooperative Society, District Central Co-operative Bank and District Primary Co-operative Agriculture Rural Development Bank; or
 - (g) if he fails to pay arrears of electricity bills; or
 - (h) if he has not passed matriculation examination or its equivalent examination from any recognized institution/board:

Provided that in case of a woman candidate or a candidate belonging to Scheduled Caste, the minimum qualification shall be middle pass

Provided further that in case of a woman candidate belonging to Scheduled Caste, the minimum qualification for members excluding the President shall be 5th pass; or

- (i) if he fails to submit a self declaration to the effect that he has a functional toilet at his place of residence; or
 - (j) if he makes expenditure beyond the prescribed limit on his election or fails to submit his election expenditure statement.
- (2) If any question arises as to whether "President or" a member of a municipality has become subject to any of the disqualifications mentioned in sub-section (1), the question shall be referred for the decision of such authority and in such manner as may be prescribed by rules.
- (3) If any person furnishes a false caste certificate at the time of filing nomination, he shall be disqualified for a period of six years from contesting the election to the municipality.

If any question arises as to whether the President or a Member of municipality has become subject to any of the disqualifications mentioned in Sub-Section (1), the question shall be referred for decision of such authority and in such manner as may be prescribed by rule. As per sub-rule (4) of rule 21 of the Haryana Municipal Election Rules, 1978, the State Election Commissioner is the prescribed authority to decide the disqualification of a member and his decision shall be final.

Rule 21 of the Haryana Municipal Election Rules, 1978 also provides for disqualifications for membership of a Committee stating that no person shall be eligible for election as president or a member of a committee, who, -

- (a) is not an elector, that is a qualified voter for any constituency of that committee under these rules; and has not attained the age of twenty one years; or
- (b) in the case of a seat reserved for the Scheduled Castes and Backward Classes is not a member of any of Scheduled Castes and Backward Classes in relation to the State of Haryana; or
- (c) is under contract for work to be done for or goods to be supplied to the committee; or
- (d) hold any office of profit under the committee and the State Government;
- (e) has, within five years from the date fixed for the nomination of candidates under the provision of rule 20 been proscribed from Government employment; or
- (f) has at any time within five years from the date specified for the nomination of candidates under the provisions of rule 20 been serving a sentence of imprisonment for not less than two years; or
- (g) has at any time within five years from the date specified for the nomination of candidates under the provisions of rule 20 been convicted under the Protection of Civil Rights Act, 1955; or
- (h) is an un-discharged insolvent; or is in arrears of any kind exceeding rupees one hundred due from him (otherwise than as a trustee) to the committee when a special demand in this behalf has been served upon him by the committee; or
- (i) is a whole time salaried official in the service of any Panchayat Samiti, Gram Panchayat, Municipal Committee, Notified Area Committee or Cantonment Board, Improvement Trust or holds any office of profit under the Government of India or the Government of any State other than an office declared by the Legislature of the State of Haryana by law not to disqualify its holder for being chosen as and for being a member of the Legislative Assembly of the State; or
- (j) who is disqualified for such membership as a result of his election having been set aside under these rules; or
- (k) is disqualified for membership of any Panchayat Samiti or Gram Panchayat, Municipal Committee, Notified Area Committee or Cantonment Board, Improvement Trust as a result of his election for membership of such Samiti or Panchayat or Board or Trust or Committee having been declared void for corrupt practices; or
- (l) has at any time within five years from the date fixed for the nomination of candidates under the provisions of rule 20 been convicted of an offence under Section 171-E or 171-F of the Indian Penal Code (Act 45 of 1860), or having been disqualified from exercising any electoral right for a period of not less than five years in connection with an election of the State Legislature is, on the said date of nomination, still subject to the disqualification.
- (m) has been convicted, or charges have been framed against him by a court in a criminal case for an offence, punishable with imprisonment for not less than ten years; or
- (n) fails to pay an arrear of any kind due to him to any Primary Agriculture Co-operative Society, District Central Co-operative Bank and District Primary Co-operative Agriculture Rural Development Bank; or
- (o) fails to pay arrears of electricity bills; or
- (p) has not passed matriculation examination or its equivalent examination from any recognized institution/board:

Provided that in case of a woman candidate or a candidate belonging to Scheduled Caste, the minimum qualification shall be middle pass

Provided further that in case of a woman candidate belonging to Scheduled Caste, the minimum qualification for members excluding president shall be 5th pass; or

- (q) fails to submit a self declaration to the effect that he has a functional toilet at his place of residence.
- (2) The State Government may, for reasons to be recorded, except, any person or class of persons from the disqualifications contained in clauses (c) to (h) and clause (j).
- (3) Omitted
- (4) If any question arises as to whether the president or a member of a committee has become subject to any of the disqualifications mentioned in the Act and the rules, the question shall be referred by the Deputy Commissioner to the State Election Commissioner, Haryana whose decision shall be final.

Final List of Contesting Candidates - Rule 28 of the Haryana Municipal Election Rules, 1978 provides that any candidate may withdraw his candidature by notice in writing to the returning officer on the fix date and time.

Rule 30 of the Haryana Municipal Election Rules, 1978 contained that after the expiry of the time period within which candidatures may be withdrawn, the Returning Officer shall prepare a list of contesting candidates, that is to say, candidates who were included in the list of validly nominated candidates. The said list shall contain the names in Hindi alphabetical order and address of the contesting candidates as given in the nomination papers together with the symbols assigned to each candidate.

Analysis Relating to Nominations - A detailed analysis of the number of nominations received, rejected, withdrawn, accepted etc. in the General Elections, 2022 has been made Municipal council and Municipal Committee-wise. The salient features of the analysis are as under:-

During the Municipal General Elections, 2022, elections were held for 456 seats of 18 Municipal Councils and 432 seats of 28 Municipal Committees against which the data related of nominations received, rejected, withdrawn and accepted are given below table hereafter.

For municipality wise detailed analysis, reference is made towards Annexure 1 & 12 for Municipal Councils and Annexure 17 & 28 for Municipal Committees of this report. However overall statistics are tabulated as follows:-

07 | Election Symbols

Legal Provisions - No separate registration and recognition of the political parties is done by the State Election Commission, Haryana at its own level. Rather the registration and recognition of national parties and state level parties in Haryana State made by the Election Commission of India is adopted by the State Election Commission, Haryana for which the list is maintained and updated as and when any changes are notified by the Election Commission of India.

Rule 18 of the Haryana Municipal Election Rules, 1978 provides that the State Election Commission shall, by notification in the Official Gazette, publish list of symbols along with restrictions, if any, subject to which those may be chosen by a candidate at the election and may in the manner, add to or vary such list.

Rule 23 of the Haryana Municipal Election Rules, 1978 provides that every nomination paper on Form-1 shall contain a declaration specifying the particular symbols which the candidate has chosen as his first, second and third preferences out of the list of symbols for the time being in force.

The State Election Commission accordingly notified a list of recognized political parties and symbols reserved for them and a list of registered un-recognized political parties and also a list of free symbols and the revised list of symbols to be allotted to the contesting candidates for the election of President and Members of the Municipal Councils and Municipal Committees in the Haryana State vide notification No.SEC/3ME/2022/804, dated 12.04.2022 as under:-

08 | Printing of Ballot Papers and Setting of EVMs

Legal Provisions for use of EVMs - Sub-section 1A of Section 275 of the Act, 1973 and Section 23A of the Act, 1994 states, "Notwithstanding anything contained in this Act or the Rules made there under, the casting and recording of votes by voting machines may be adopted in such a manner as may be prescribed, in such municipality or municipalities as the State Election Commission may, having regard to the circumstances of each case, specify".

For the purpose of above section/sub-section "Voting Machine" has been defined as the machine or apparatus whether operated electronically or otherwise used for casting or recording of votes and any reference to a ballot box or ballot paper in this Act or the rules made there under shall, save as otherwise provided, be construed as including a reference to such voting machine wherever such voting machine is used at any election.

The State Election Commission decided that Electronic Voting Machines (EVMs) shall be used for all the municipal general and bye-elections in the State. Accordingly, the general elections 2022 for 18 Municipal Councils and 28 Municipal Committees had been conducted with the help of EVMs (M-2 Types) of the Commission. The State Election Commission had issued the 2950 Controlled Units and 3000 Ballot Units for the conduct of election of Members and Presidents of the Municipal Councils and 1500 Control Units and 1500 Ballot Units for the conduct of election of Members and Presidents of the Municipal Committees.

The Commission implemented for the first time the provision of 'NOTA' i.e. None of the above in order to enable a voter to press the button on EVM to show that he/she does not wish to vote to any of the above contesting candidates, vide order no. SEC/1ME/2018/5833-5880, dated 22nd November, 2018 in compliance with the order dated 27.09.2013 passed by the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India in the Writ Petition (Civil) No. 161 of 2004 in People's Union for Civil Liberties Vs Union of India. NOTA was treated as a 'Fictional Electoral Candidate' while declaring the election results.

Printing of ballot papers :- In pursuance of Rules 69F and 69L of the Haryana Municipal Elections Rules, 1978 and also as per Notification No. SEC/2ME/2020/4049, dated 11.12.2020, for the Post of President and Members of municipal councils and municipal committees, the State Election Commission, Haryana directed the Deputy Commissioners concerned that the ballot papers for election of President and Members of Municipal Councils / Municipal Committees

would be prepared and printed in devnagari script as per the design so specified for Electronic Voting Machine (EVM) from the Controller, Printing and Stationery Department, Haryana.



09 | Polling Stations and Polling Staff

Polling Stations : – According to Rule-34 of the Haryana Municipal Election Rules, 1978, the Returning Officer shall provide such number of polling stations as he may deem necessary and shall on the dates specified under Rule-19 in this behalf, post at his office and at the office of the committee, a list showing the polling stations so provided, the polling area or the group of voters for which they have respectively been provided and the hours during which they shall remain open for the poll. It also provides that the Returning Officer shall appoint a Presiding Officer for each polling station and such number of Polling Officers, as are considered necessary. In the booklet of instructions for the Returning Officers regarding conduct of elections, it has been provided that a list of proposed polling stations would be sent to the State Election Commission and after approval of the State Election Commission, the Returning Officer shall post the list at his office and at the office of the concerned municipality and such other conspicuous places as he may deem necessary. Accordingly, when the programme for election is issued, the Returning Officers are simultaneously requested to send a list of proposed polling stations. Normally one polling station is provided for about 1,000 voters.

Deployment of Polling Personnel for Election Duty – Randomization of Polling Personnel – Since the duties discharged by the polling personnel are vital in the conduct of elections, sufficient care is needed to draft and deploy such personnel in the interest of free and fair election and accordingly, the Commission issued the following directions for the formation of polling parties:-

- (i) A district database of all eligible poll personnel shall be maintained in an electronic form, which can facilitate computerized randomization. All relevant particulars like Name, Sex, Place of Residence (Municipality), Work Place, Home Municipality, Designation, Office and Department/Institution should be entered.
- (ii) Presiding Officer and Polling Officers should be classified on the basis of scale of pay/grade pay and their post and rank. As far as practicable, Gazetted Officers will be deployed as Presiding Officers and in case of shortage etc., the officials working in supervisory capacity can only be deployed as Presiding Officers. The Presiding Officer should be of higher pay scale/grade in comparison to other Polling Officers of that format.
- (iii) No person will be assigned polling duties in the ward of municipality in which he is posted or in which he resides.
- (iv) In order to avoid any allegation of collusion among the polling personnel in favour of any candidate or political party and to instill confidence in the minds of political parties and candidates about free and fair elections, proper mix of polling personnel drawn from different offices and departments at the time of formation of a polling party should be ensured. Two officials of the same serial group/category should not be put together. Further, two members of the polling party should not be from the same department. In case of school teachers, they should not be from the same school.
- (v) Polling personnel should be drawn both from the State Government departments as well as the Central Government offices. As far as practicable, Central Government employees should be drawn to the minimum extent possible and may be posted at relatively more sensitive polling stations. The Central Government employees should be mixed with State employees on 50:50 basis, if available.

- (vi) Deputy Commissioner/Returning Officer should obtain a complete database of officers eligible for constituting polling parties from respective authorities. All relevant information should be entered into an electronic database of the computerized randomization application software already available with NIC, which was used during the last general elections (2019) of Vidhan Sabha.
- (vii) From this full database of officers a list of twice the required number of polling persons should be generated (including reserve) randomly, using the software. This is the first of the three-stage randomization process. Presence of observers is not required at this stage. This is only to identify and select the officials that would be given training for poll duties as Presiding and Polling Officers in whichever municipality of that district. In no case, at this stage, the identity of the ward to which the polling personnel are likely to be deployed shall be disclosed. All that the polling personnel shall know at this stage is, whether he (or she) is a Presiding Officer or a Polling Officer and the venue and time of trainings.
- (viii) **The second stage** of randomization exercise should be done in the presence of the Observer deployed in the municipality. At this stage, actual polling parties shall be formed on random basis using the randomization software. The observer must be present at this stage. At this stage, though the actual polling station will not be known, however, the municipality may be known. The randomization may take place 4 or 5 days before the day of poll. For the purpose of serving appointment letters, the Deputy Commissioner/Returning Officer can use the services of the sponsoring departments/authority and/or organize a training programme of poll personnel on that date when final briefing can be given and appointment letters issued to them.
- (ix) The third stage of randomization exercise shall take place at the time of dispatching of polling parties when the allocation of polling stations to the polling parties will be done. This third stage randomization for final allocation of Polling Stations to each Polling Party should also be done in the presence of Observer. The actual polling station allotted to an individual polling personnel is to be disclosed just before the polling party actually leaves the Dispersal Centre.
- (x) In order to ensure that above instructions are strictly complied with, the State Election Commission directs that the Deputy Commissioner/Returning Officer shall furnish to the State Election Commission through the Observers and also directly a certificate to the following effect immediately after the polling parties have been formed for an election:-

Certified that polling parties have been formed by a proper mix of officials drawn from different offices and departments, in the presence of Observer and-----
- (I) the officers/officials have been drawn from the State Government departments as well as from the Central Government Offices, PSUs, etc. as far as practicable.
- (II) for the purpose of forming polling parties complete data base of all eligible employees in the district has been used.
- (xi) It is clarified that the entire randomization exercise except the first stage must invariably be done in the presence of the Observer sent to the municipality concerned. If, by any chance, the forming of the polling parties through randomization (second stage) has been done in the absence of the Observer, then the 2nd stage randomization exercise should be done afresh in the presence of Observer and compliance report should be submitted in this regard. The Observer should make a special reference to the randomization while submitting the report.

In the Sixth Municipal General Elections, 2022, the number of polling booths established, total number of voters and average number of voters per polling booth are given in table below:-

Poll Personnel: - Under rule 34 (3) of the Haryana Municipal Election Rules, 1978, it is the duty of the Returning Officer to appoint polling personnel namely a Presiding Officer, one or more Polling Officers for each polling station.

Generally polling personnel required for a polling station are one Presiding Officer and three Polling Officers. Their duties in brief are given below:-

- (a) 1st Polling Officer: Incharge of identification of electors and marked copy of electoral roll.
- (b) 2nd Polling Officer: Incharge of application of indelible ink, maintenance of register of voters and voter slips.
- (c) 3rd Polling Officer: Incharge of control unit of voting machine.

The number of Policemen, for each polling station were deployed for election duty in consultation with the Director General of Police.

Detailed instructions were issued by the State Election Commission to the Deputy Commissioners for timely appointment of Presiding Officers, Polling Officers, Other Polling staff and proper arrangements for transportation of polling parties, poll material etc..

While appointing Presiding Officers and Polling Officers, the Deputy Commissioners were advised to take care that the persons having political leaning towards any candidate should be avoided for appointing them as poll personnel. The instructions for the Returning Officers also provide for proper training to the poll personnel.

Engineers from Bharat Electronic Limited, Bangalore were deputed in each municipality for checking/inspection of the Electronic Voting Machines (EVMs) and technical support of polling personnel during polling and counting day.

10 | Appointment of Election Observers

The State Election Commissioner, in exercise of powers conferred on him under Article 243ZA of the Constitution of India, appointed IAS officers as Election Observers (General). Similarly, senior officers from the Police of the rank of D.I.G and above were appointed to oversee law and order situation during election as Election Observers (Police). Officers of the rank of DETC from Excise and Taxation Department were appointed as Election Observers (Expenditure).

During the Sixth Municipal General Elections, 2022 of 18 municipal councils, and 28 municipal committees, 25 IAS Officers were appointed as Election Observers (General). In addition, 17 Senior IPS Officers were appointed as Election Observers (Police) and 21 Deputy Excise and Taxation Commissioners of Excise and Taxation Department were appointed as Election Observers (Expenditure).

The Election Observers (General) were advised to perform the following duties: -

1. They were advised to go in the area two or three days before the date of poll
2. They should not hesitate to meet and listen to the complaints of the representatives of the recognized political parties, candidates and general public and bring the same to the notice of the Returning Officer, DC/SP concerned for early resolution so that the elections could be conducted in a free and fair atmosphere.
3. On receipt of any kind of complaint regarding threat to the voters or the voters having been deprived of their right to exercise their franchise by threats, observers were directed to go to the troubled spot and analyse the factual position and if they find some truth in these complaints, they should immediately contact the concerned Deputy Commissioner/ Superintendent of Police to take suitable measures.
4. Whenever directed by the State Election Commission to go to a particular area to find out genuineness of a complaint, they should immediately visit the spot and send independent report to the State Election Commission through fax or wireless.
5. As soon as the election process is finished and the votes have been counted, they are required to send a detailed report on all the points to the State Election Commission.

Election Observers (Police) – The Commission appointed 17 Election Observers (Police) during the general elections - 2022 of 18 Municipal Councils, 28 Municipal Committees held on 19.06.2022 as per details given below:-

- Coordinate with Deputy Commissioner, Police Commissioner to review election related arrangements.
- Visit all the polling stations to review adequacy of police arrangements.

Section 13E of the Haryana Municipal Act, 1973 provides:

- (i) every candidate at an election shall, either himself or by his/her election agent, keep a separate and correct account of all expenditure in connection with the election incurred or authorised by him or by his election agent from the date of filing of nomination papers to the date of declaration of the result thereof, both dates inclusive.
- (ii) the account shall contain such particulars, as may be notified by the State Election Commission in this behalf.
- (iii) the total of the said expenditure shall not exceed such amount as may be notified by the State Election Commission from time to time.

The Election Observers (Expenditure) were accordingly directed to ensure:-

1. Maintenance of day to day expenditure record supported with documents by the contesting candidates.
2. Accounting of all type of related expenditures incurred by the candidates such as petrol, postage, printing of pamphlets/ election campaigning material, advertisement in the newspapers, stationery items etc.

Section 13F of the Haryana Municipal Act, 1973 prescribes about the disqualification for failure to lodge account of election expenses as under. -

If the State Election Commission is satisfied that a person has failed to lodge an account of election expenses within the time and manner, as prescribed by the State Election Commission and has no reason or justification thereof, the State Election Commission shall, by order published in the Official Gazette, declare him to be disqualified for contesting an election for a period of five years from the date of the order under this Act.

The Commission has also issued the Haryana Municipal Election Expenditure (Maintenance and Submission of Account) Order, 2020 vide Notification No.SEC/3ME/2020/2238, dated 24.11.2020, providing that the State Election Commission shall notify from time to time the Election Expenditure limit at election to be incurred by the candidate or authorized election agent. The order also provides that every contesting candidate at election shall have to maintain the day to day election expenditure account in accordance with the procedure as laid down in the order and shall within 30 days from the date of declaration of result of the election lodged with the Deputy Commissioner or any other officer specified by the Commission in duplicate the account of election expenditure which shall be true copy of the account maintained by him or his election agent. The Deputy Commissioner is required to cause a notice to be fixed to the notice board of his office within two days from the date of which account of election expenses have been lodged.

Section 13D of the Haryana Municipal Act, 1973 also provides that the Application of certain section of Central Act 43 of 1951 – The provisions of sections 20B, 28A, 33A, 33B, 125A, 134A, 134B, 135B and 135C of the Representation of People Act, 1951 (Central Act 43 of 1951), shall mutatis mutandis apply to the provisions of the Act.

The State Election Commissioner, Haryana hereby revised the existing expenditure limit for the contesting candidates of Municipal Councils and Municipal Committees vide Notification No. SEC/3ME/2022/549, dated 21.03.2022 is given as under in below table:-

12 | Counting of Votes, Declaration of Result and its Analysis - 22nd June 2022

The counting of votes at an election where voting machines are used is regulated by the provisions of rule 69 T to 69 U of the Haryana Municipal Election Rules, 1978 which are reproduced as under :-

Rule 69 T Scrutiny and inspection of voting machines.-

- (1) The Returning Officer may have the control units of the voting machines used at more than one polling station taken up for scrutiny and inspection and votes recorded in such units counted simultaneously.
- (2) Before the votes recorded in any control unit of a voting machine are counted under sub-rule (1), the candidate or his election agent or his counting agent present on the counting table, shall be allowed to inspect the paper seal and such other vital seals as might have been affixed on the unit and to satisfy themselves that the seals are intact.
- (3) The Returning Officer shall satisfy himself that none of the voting machines has, in fact, been tampered with.
- (4) If the Returning Officer is satisfied that any voting machine has, in fact, been tampered with, he shall not count the votes recorded in that machine and shall follow the procedure laid down in rule 58, in respect of the polling station where that machine was used.

Rule 69 U Counting of votes.-

- (1) After the Returning Officer or the Presiding Officer, as the case may be, is satisfied that a voting machine has, in fact, not been tampered with, he shall have the votes recorded therein counted by

pressing the appropriate button marked "Result" provided in the control unit whereby the total votes polled and votes polled for each candidate shall be displayed in respect of each such candidate on the display panel provided for the purposes in the unit.

- (2) As the votes polled by each candidate are displayed on the control unit, the Returning Officer shall have:-
 - (a) the number of such votes recorded separately in respect of each candidate in Part-II of Form 18.
 - (b) Part-II of Form 18 completed in other respects and signed by the Presiding Officer or the counting supervisor and also by the candidates or their election agents or their counting agents present; and
 - (c) corresponding entries made in a result sheet in Form 8 and the particulars so entered in the result sheet announced.
- (3) No envelope containing the tendered ballot papers shall be opened and no such votes shall be counted.

Rule 69 V Sealing of voting machines after counting of votes.-

- (1) After the result of votes recorded in a control unit has been ascertained candidate - wise and entered in Part II of Form 18 and Form 8 under rule 69U, the Presiding Officer/Returning Officer shall reseal the unit with his seal and the seals of such of the candidates or their election agents present who may desire to affix their seals thereon so, however, that the result of votes recorded in the unit is not obliterated and the unit retains the memory of such result.
- (2) The control unit so sealed shall be kept in specially prepared boxes on which the Returning Officer shall record the following particulars, namely:-
 - (a) the name of the municipality with ward number;
 - (b) the particulars of polling station where the control unit has been used;
 - (c) serial number of the control unit
 - (d) date of poll; and
 - (e) date of counting.

Rule 69 W Counting and rejection of postal ballot paper.-

- (1) Subject to general or specific direction given in this behalf by the State Election Commission, the provisions of rule 59 shall apply in relation to rejection of postal ballot papers referred to in sub-rule (4) of rule 69N: Provided that postal ballot paper shall be rejected if recording of vote therein is not in accordance with the direction contained in Form 17.
- (2) The Returning Officer shall record the result of counting of votes received by post, if any, in the result sheet in Form 8 and announce the same.

Number of Voters and Polling Stations: - A total of 1290 and 671 polling stations were set up for polling of votes for all the 456 and 432 seats of member of 18 municipal councils and 28 Municipal Committees. Since members from 15 wards of Municipal Councils and 33 wards in Municipal Committees were elected unopposed in the polling took place at 1257 polling stations for 441 seats of municipal councils and in 625 polling stations of the Municipal Committees. Statistics relating to no. of electors and votes polled these for municipalities are tabulated below for analysis at glance.

Municipality-wise status of NOTA – The Commission had implemented the NOTA (None of the above) to enable a voter to press button on EVM against this panel to show that he/she does not wish to vote to any of the above contesting candidates since December, 2016 and has ordered that

- (i) NOTA shall be treated as a 'Fictional Electoral Candidate' while declaring the election results,
- (ii) In case, a contesting candidate and the "Fictional Electoral Candidate" i.e. NOTA receive highest equal number valid votes then the contesting candidate (not NOTA) shall be declared as elected.
- (iii) If in any election, all the contesting candidates individually receive lesser votes than the 'Fictional Electoral Candidate' i.e. NOTA then none of the contesting candidates will be declared as elected.
- (iv) In case of situation arising under sub-section (iii) above, re-election shall be held for the seat. Further all such contesting candidates who secured less votes than NOTA shall not be eligible to re-file the nomination/contest the re-election.
- (v) In re-election, if NOTA again get highest votes then further election will not be conducted and contesting candidate with highest votes (excluding NOTA) shall be declared as elected.

The following procedure shall be followed in such circumstances,

- (i) If a Returning Officer, upon completion of counting but before declaration of result, finds that NOTA has received higher valid votes than all other contesting candidates individually; then Returning Officer shall not declare the result for that particular seat/s and shall immediately send his report to State Election Commission in this regard.
- (ii) Upon receipt of such report, the State Election Commission shall after satisfaction, declare the fresh election programme for the said seat/s.

(A) Municipal Councils

- 12 members belonging to SC category (7 male and 5 female) were elected against unreserved seats.
- 32 Women members belonging to backward classes were elected against the seats reserved for Women and Unreserved seats. 62 male members belonging to backward classes were elected against unreserved category seats. Hence total 94 members belonging to backward classes during this general election in 18 Municipal Councils were elected.
- In all 90 members of SC and BC categories were elected against unreserved seats.

(B) Municipal Committees

1. 14 members belonging to SC category (8 male and 6 female) were elected against unreserved seats.

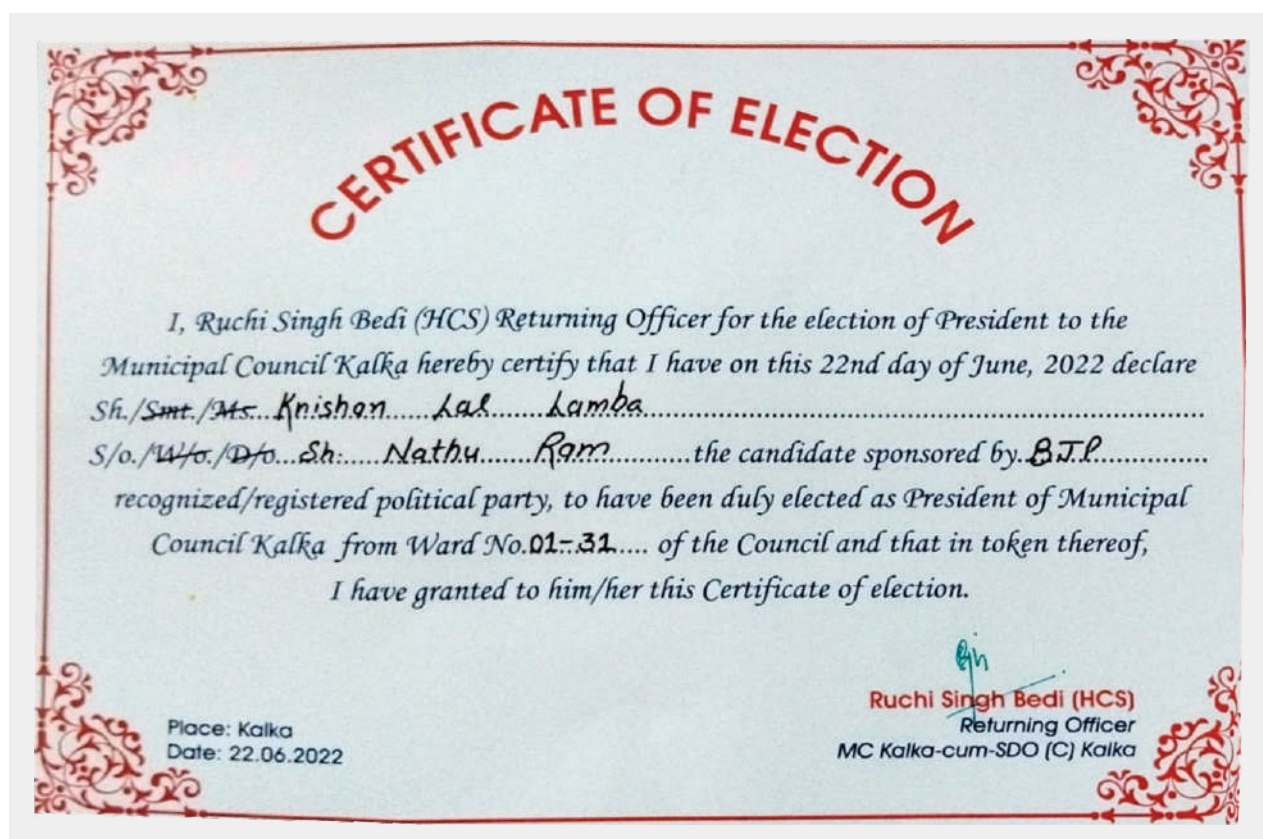

14 Socio-economic Profile of Candidates for the Post of President

The Presidents of the municipalities that went to poll during these general elections were directly elected from the territorial constituencies/wards of the municipality concerned. The eligible voters of the constituencies/wards of the municipality concerned have elected their Presidents directly through casting their votes, whereas the elections of the seats of Vice President of the municipalities was held indirectly from amongst the elected members, as per earlier practice.

Reservation of Seats of Presidents - The State Government, vide its Notifications No. 52/48/2021-2CI dated 20.05.2022 and Notification No. 52/71/2021-2C1 dated 20.05.2022 has notified the names of the municipalities in which the offices of President were reserved for the Scheduled Castes, Women belonging to the Scheduled Castes and Women. 15 | Information and Communication Technology (ICT) Support

NIC Haryana provided end-to-end ICT support to the State Election Commission, Haryana during Municipal general elections 2022 which were held on 19th June 2022 and results were declared on 22nd June 2022. A complete suite of local bodies' election related software was developed and implemented under the supervision of Sh M. P Kulshreshtha, Scientist-F/DIO (Hisar) as State Coordinator for developments and Sh Pardeep Kaushal, Scientist-F NIC-HRSC as State Coordinator for implementation of all such applications in the state during the elections. Sh. Deepak Bansal, State Informatics Officer (SIO), Haryana guided and also directed all his staff in concerned districts in the State for proper implementation and smooth functioning of portals for elections of these 18 Municipal Councils and 28 Municipal Committees. Following are the ICT applications developed and implemented by NIC Haryana:

1. **Voter list preparation software:** NIC Haryana prepared web enabled software for generating voter list for MC elections using voters data obtained from Chief Electoral officer, Haryana. The Voter database obtained from CEO office is uploaded in a central database, in which all districts create the ward masters for the Municipalities and Panchayats etc. and do the ward marking of the voters. Voter lists for local bodies elections are then generated which is linked to the web enabled Voters helpline also. Centralized web enabled software for local bodies voter lists has been developed by DIO NIC Jhajjar District and is hosted at NIC Haryana Mini Data Center, Chandigarh
2. **E-Employees:** A web enabled software to capture, update and fine-tune the data related to employees of State Government as well as center Government which is to be deputed for election duty. Using this software, the respective Government organizations could update and verify the data related to their employees through internet from their respective offices. End result of the activity was clean and verified data of all employees required to be deputed at polling stations. This Software has been developed by NIC Hisar team and is hosted at NIC Haryana Mini Data Center.
3. **Election Duty Management System (EDMS):** The EDMS is a standard web enabled centralized software developed by NIC Haryana State Center which is used for polling personnel deployment for various elections. The software has many features like import of employee's data from centralised HRMS software on single click, which is further refined through e-employees. Three level randomisation process, various user customisable reports, multiple user levels and locking mechanism at various stages of the deployment process. The software is fully web enabled and there is no need for districts to keep employees databases at district level. The software can be accessed and operated through NICNET. This software is also hosted at NIC Haryana Mini Data Centre.
4. **Nomination dashboard (Know Your Candidate):** Workflow and role based system and e-dashboard developed for capturing the data through online nominations portal during the election of MC-2022 held in the state of Haryana, The data on the nomination for e-dashboard portal were populated directly from the respective Returning Officers of MCs. The application was useful for the public to take decision before casting of votes and to know about the details of the contesting candidates and its profile. The Dashboard was capable of capturing the data of contesting candidates for MC members as well as Presidents.

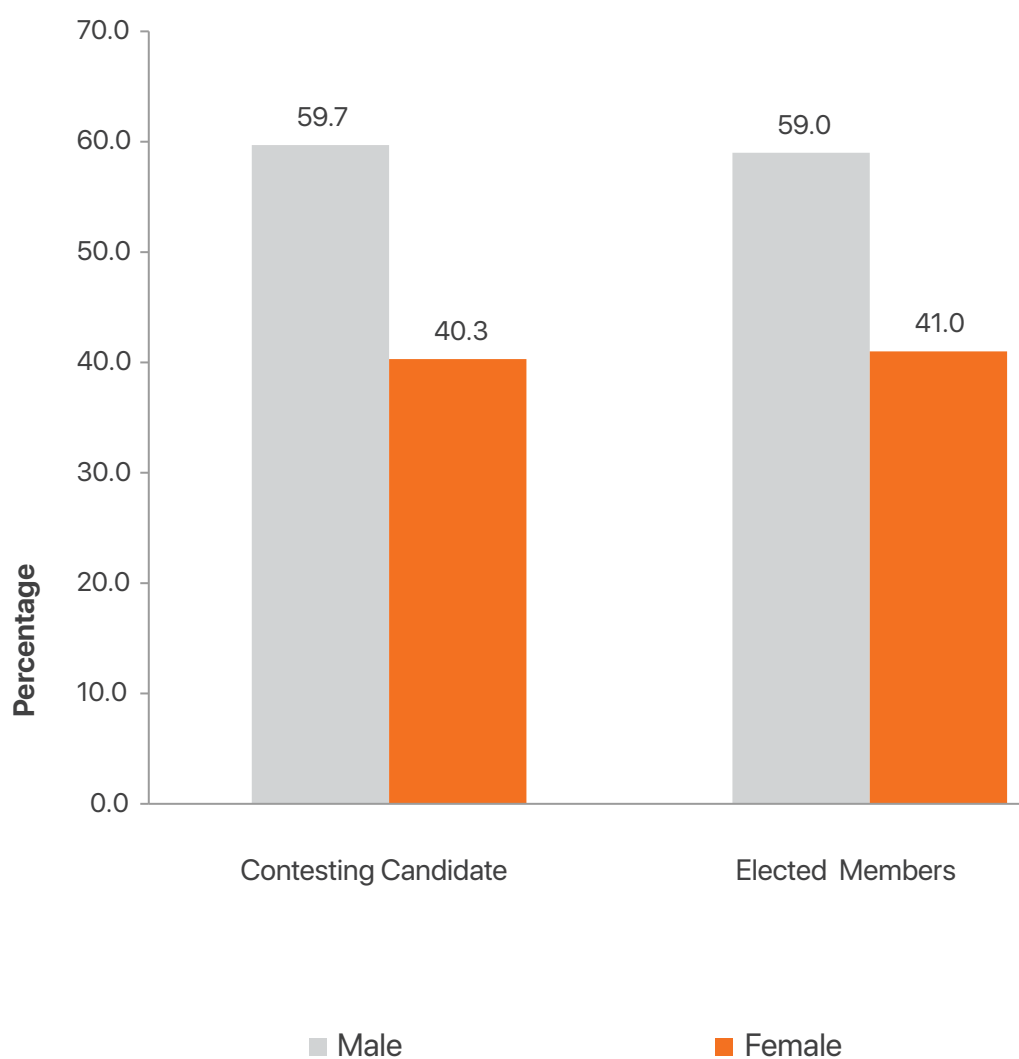

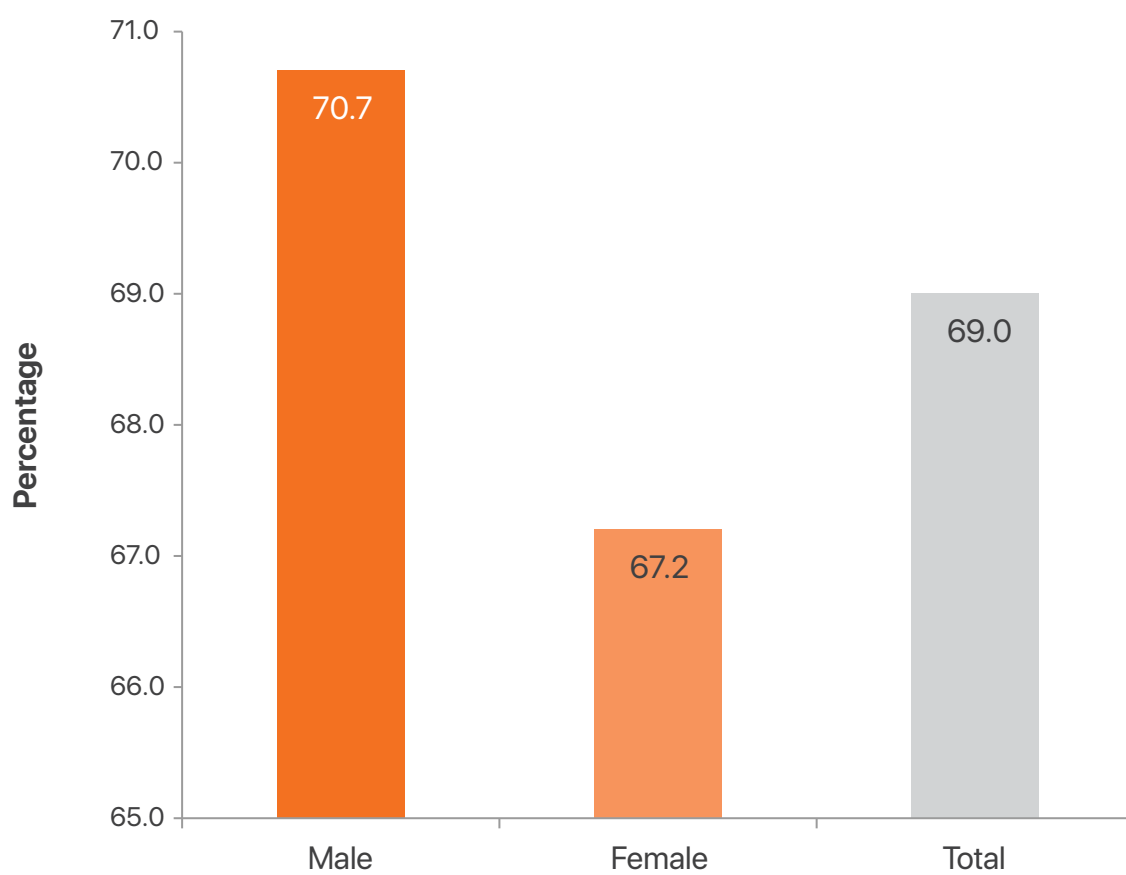

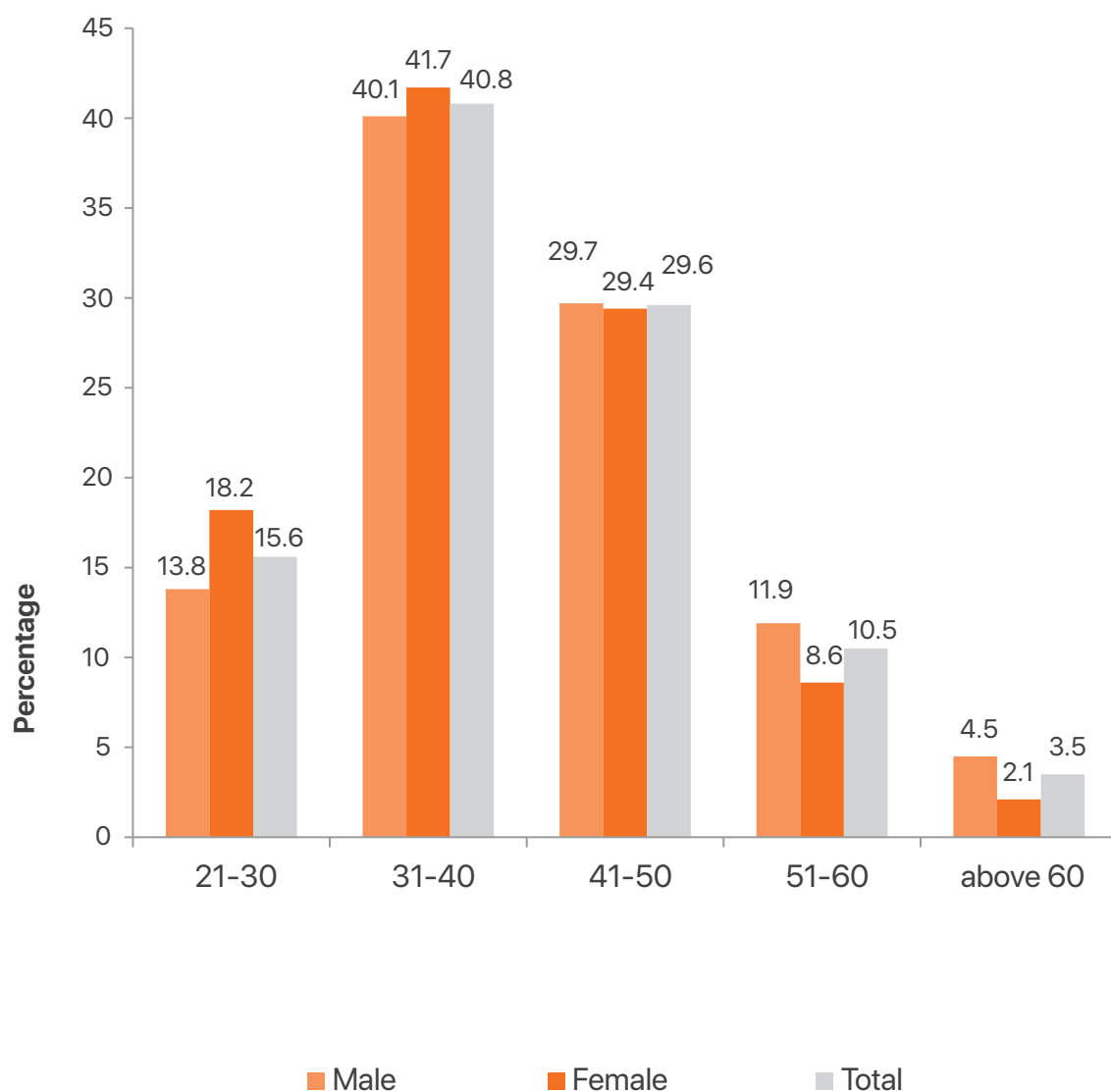

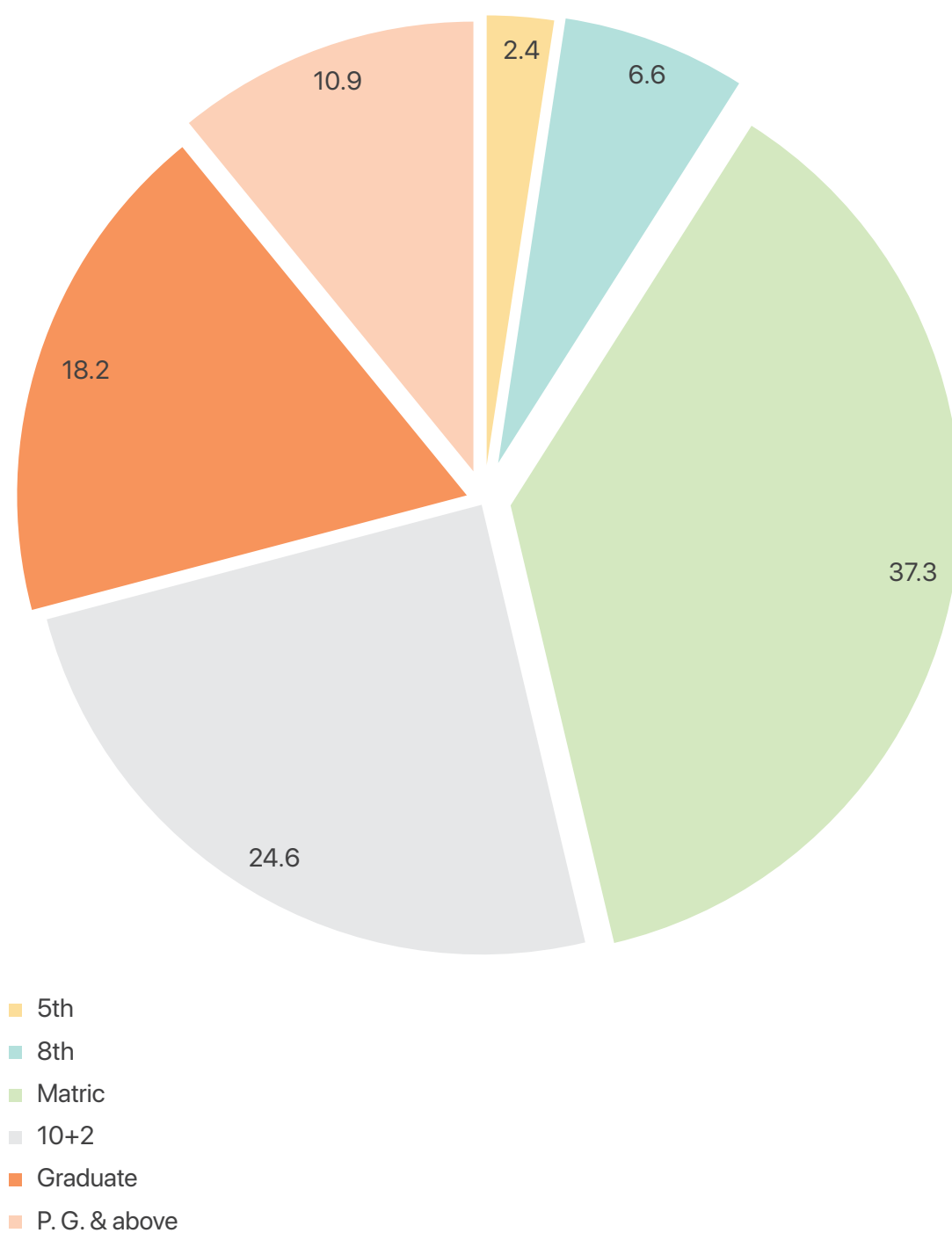
**Percentage of Number of Elected Members According to Sex

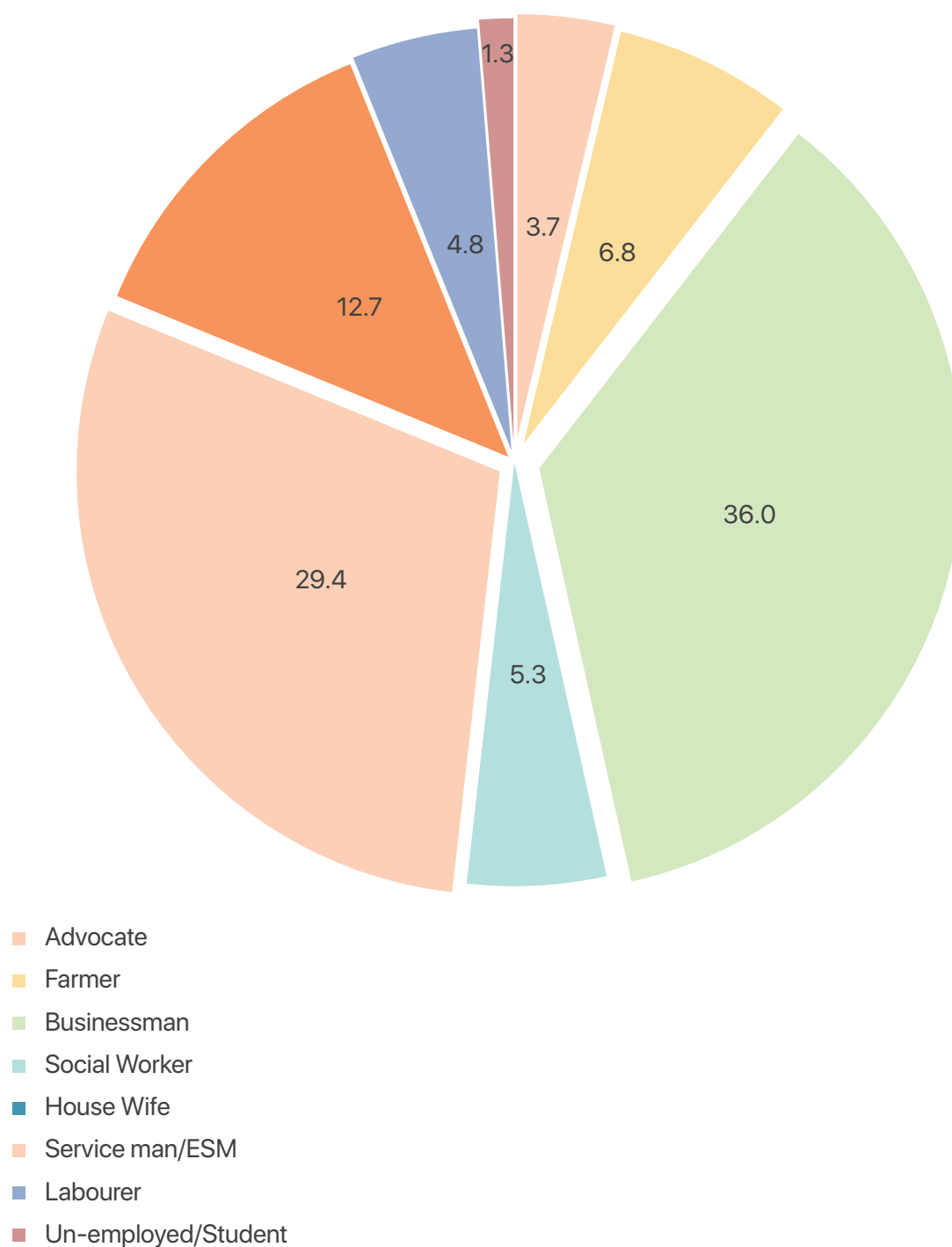
Percentage of Number of Elected Members According to Educational Qualification in the General Election of Municipal Councils

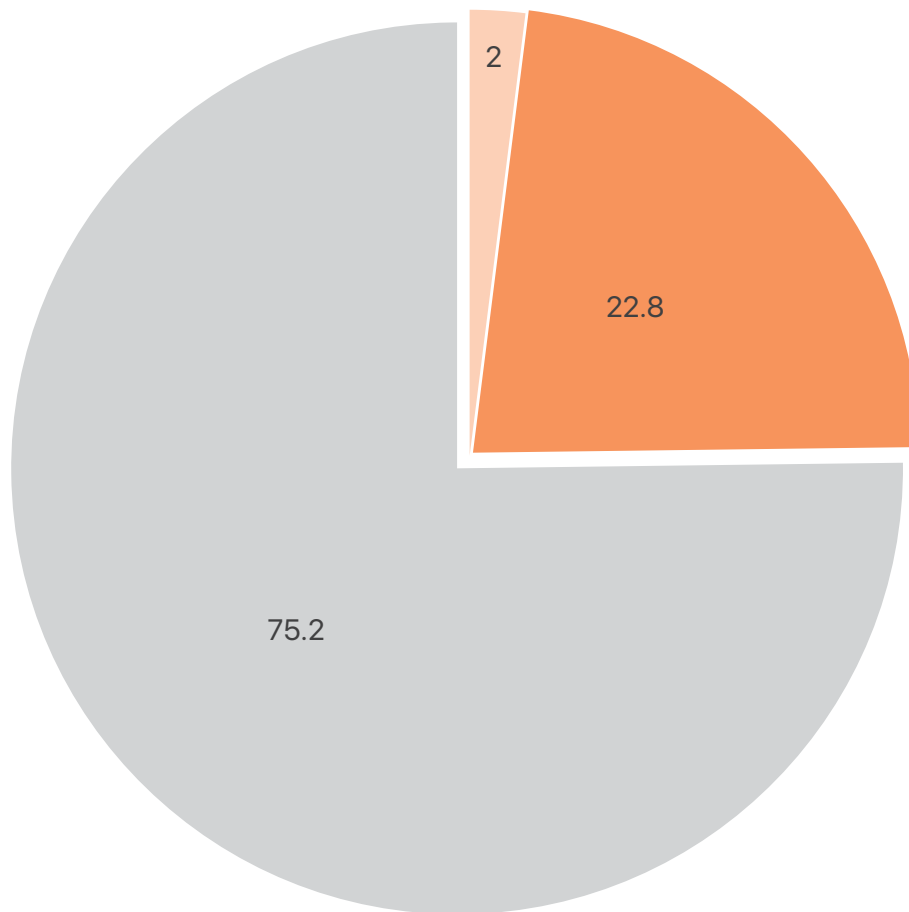

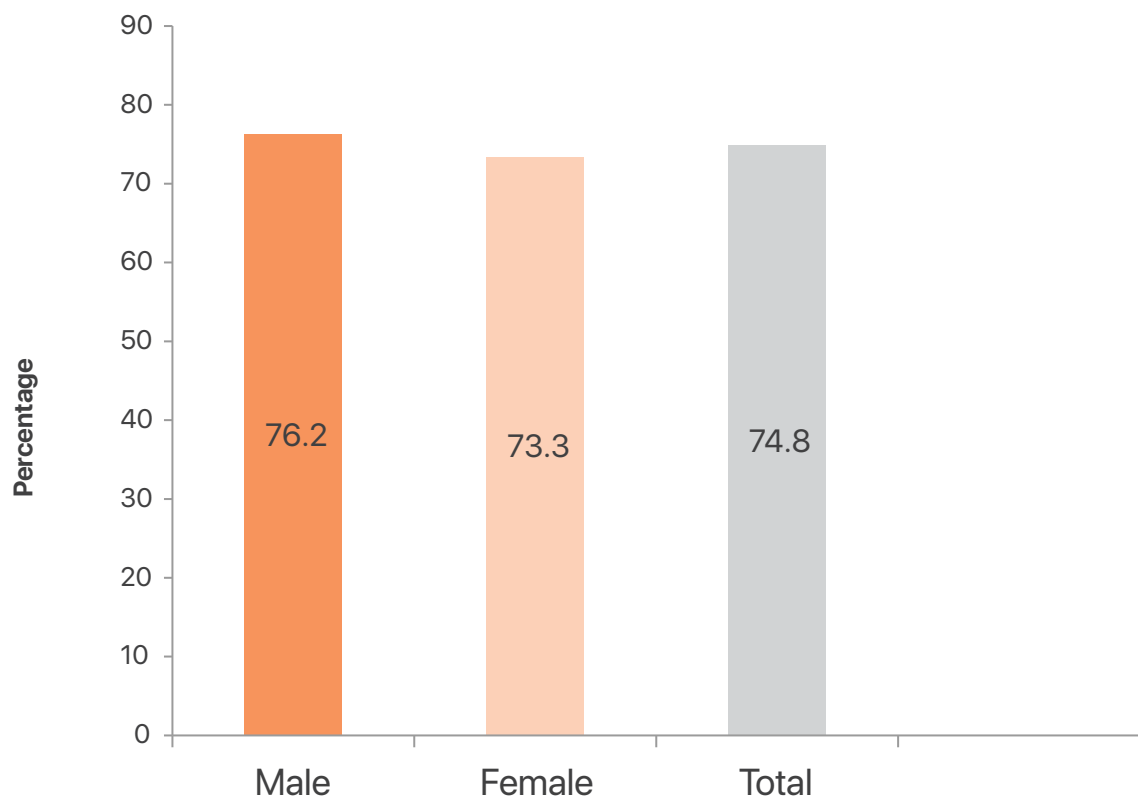

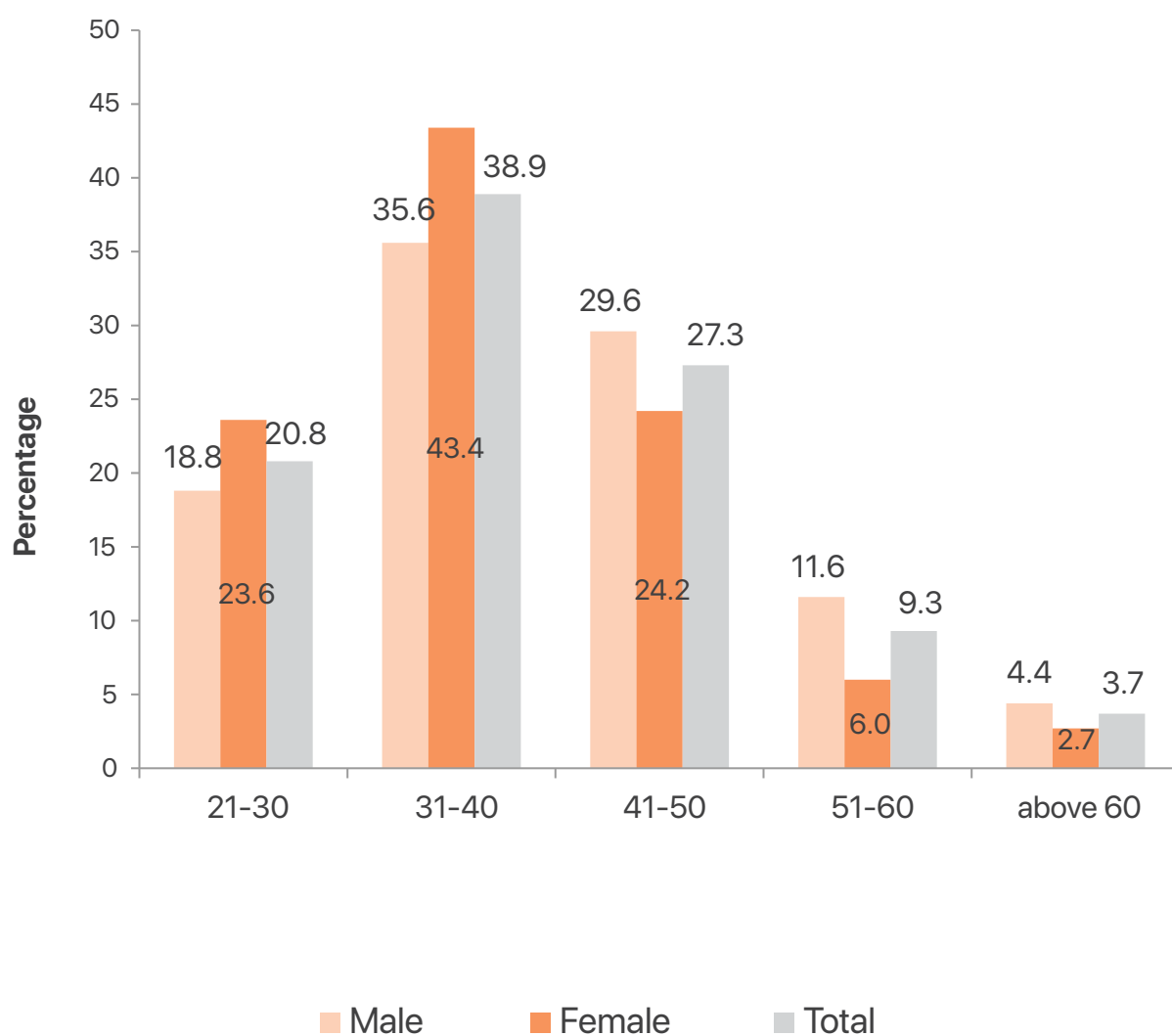

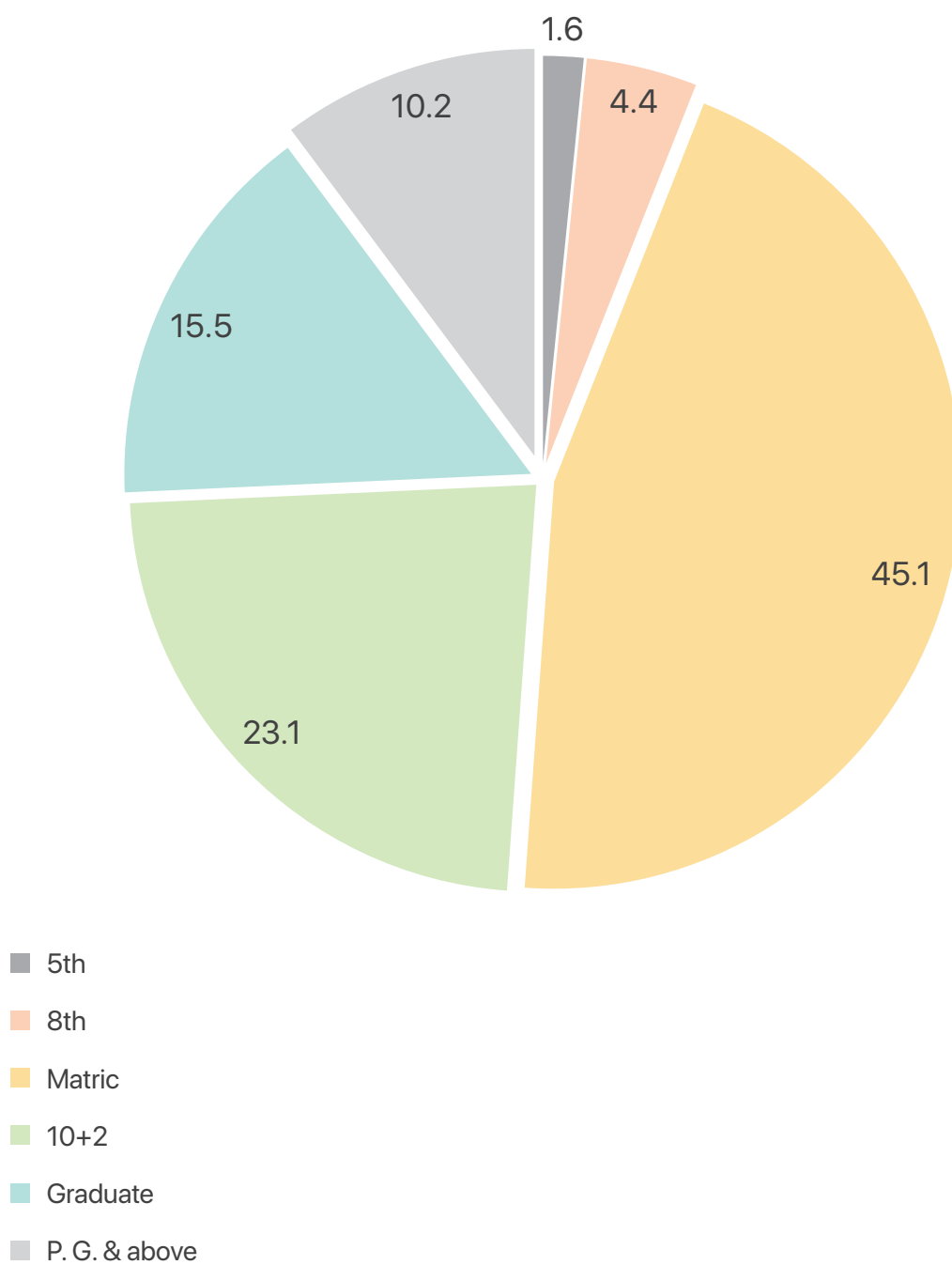
Genderwise percentage of Elected Members in different age groups in the General Election of Municipal Committees

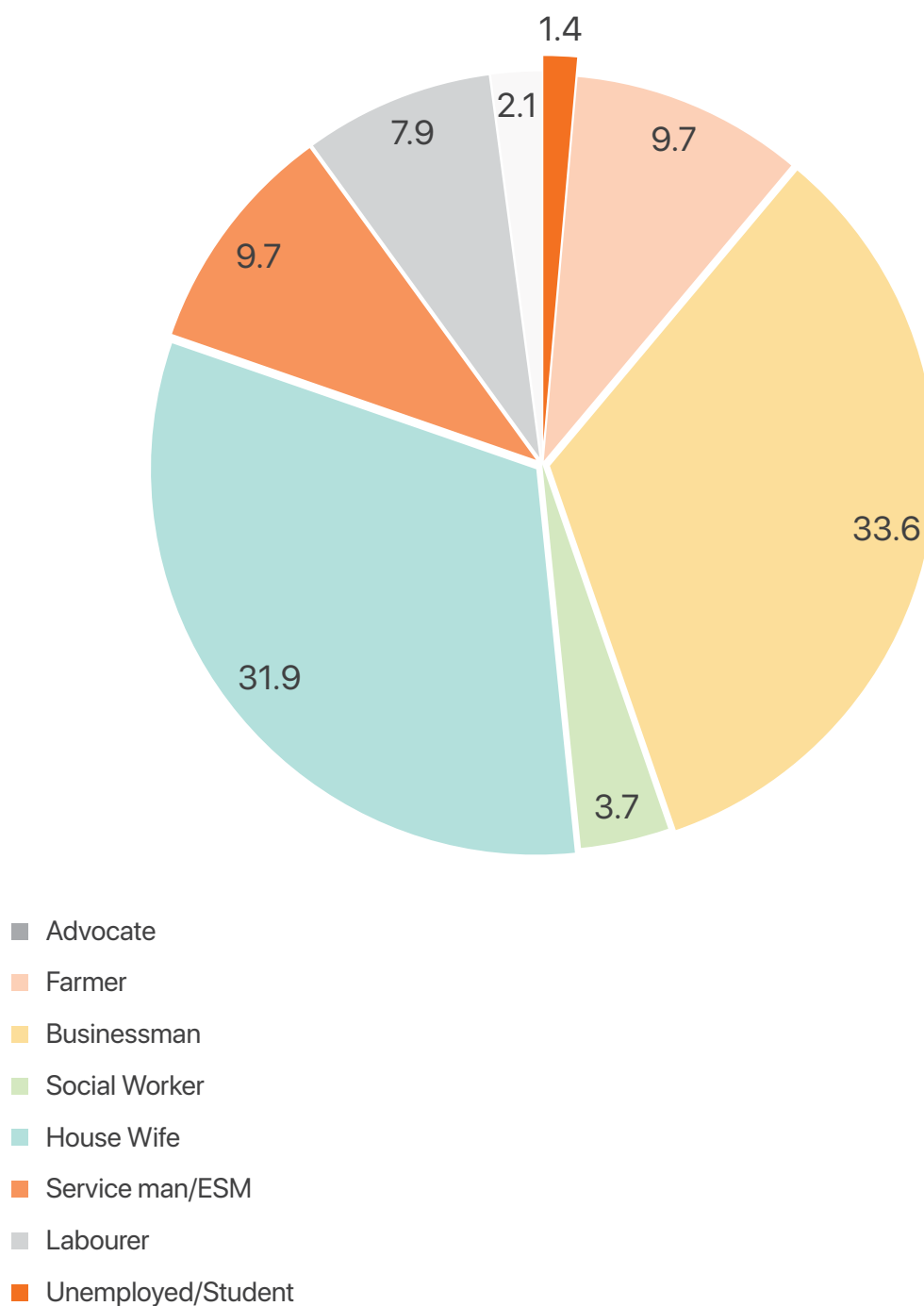
Percentage of Number of Elected Members According to Educational Qualification in the General Election of Municipal Committees
