HON'BLE PRIME MINISTER SHRI NARENDRA MODI DEDICATES TO THE NATION THE SUCCESSFUL IMPLEMENTATION OF THREE NEW CRIMINAL LAWS(DEVELOPED AND IMPLEMENTED BY NIC) AT UT CHANDIGARH ON 03/12/2024



Hon'ble Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi dedicated to the nation the successful implementation of three transformative new criminal laws—Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita, Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita and Bharatiya Sakshya Adhiniyam today at Chandigarh.
