Sonipat Tops The List

(September Half Yearly Assessment)

In the half yearly assessment, 98% data has been entered at state level, however, across districts, Sirsa, Rewari and Kaithal have entered the data of almost all the schools, while Palwal and Faridabad have entered only 92% and 95% data respectively (Table 1).



Results show that Sonipat district retains its first position but Gurgaon which was in tie with Sonipat last month slips to fourth position. Mahendergarh remains successful in maintaining second position at state level. District Jhajjar grabs the third position of Rewari pushing it to fifth place. Likewise previous months, Mewat, Yamuna Nagar and Palwal are again the bottom performing districts. In the September assessment, topper districts remained successful to maintain the level of performance, which they achieved in their previous monthly assessments, but this performance has been shaken in certain districts at alarming rate. They have shown decline of more than state average decline (5%) in their results. In this trend of decline, Kururshetra is at top with 9% followed by Karnal and Kaithal with 8%. Panipat, Faridabad, Panchkula and Fatehabad have shown decline of 7%. In Sirsa, Hisar and Yamuna Nagar, 6% decline has been observed (Table 2).


While discussing the individual subjects, class wise performance at primary level, class 1st and 2nd students have performed in a better way in comparison to class 3rd, 4th and 5th. Decline in results is observed in class 3 in comparison to class 2. This may be due to shift in pedagogical practices and text books. In 4th class, further decline of 12% is observed in English. In the 5th class, more than 40% students are able to secure 50% or more marks in all subjects (Table 3 & Graph 1).


In upper primary section, decline is noticed in class 6th in comparison to class 5th. In English, Mathematics and Hindi, declined is observed by 20%, 17% and 6% respectively. This decline can be due to change in schools, different teachers for different subjects and books from NCERT instead of state specific. With each higher class, performance of students is increasing in Hindi language; it is found that in class 8th, 49% students are able to secure 50% or more marks. But in English language, Mathematics, Science and Social Science, situation is not so good and needs special attention. In English in class 6th, only 12% students are able to secure more than 50% marks. In class 7th and 8th, almost in all subjects, approximately 25% students are able to cross the benchmark of 50%. In 8th class, in Science, some sort of improvement is noticed where 42% of students are securing more than 50% marks (Table 4 & Graph 2).


Percentage of Students scoring less than 33% marks has been increased as we move from lower class to upper class. Sharp increase is observed from class 2nd to 3rd and class 5th to 6th. This share has started decreasing marginally from class 6th to class 7th and in class 8th. Similarly the percentage of students scoring more than 33% and less than 50% has increased from lower to upper classes. Again there is sharp increase from class 2nd to 3rd. This has marginally increased from class 4th to class 5th. Across subjects, it is the class 6th English, in which 44% students are scoring less than 33% marks. In class 6th, in Mathematics, Science and Social studies, approximately 35% students are scoring less than 33% marks (Graph 3 to 10).

Graph 3: Percentage of Class 1 Students in Half Yearly Assessment




Percentage of students scoring between 50% to 75% marks has decreased from class 2nd to class 3rd; however, this share has increased from class 4th to class 5th, which has again decreased form class 5th to 6th. Percentage of students scoring 75% to 90% marks is more than 15% in class 1st, which decreases to less than 15% in class 2nd and further to approximately 5% in class 3rd. This share has again increased to approximately 7 to 10% in class 5th, which again reached to around 2%, 3% and 4% in classes 6th, 7th and 8th except Hindi language. Percentage of students scoring above 90% marks is very marginal across all classes and subjects (Graph 3 to 10).


Graph 4: Percentage of Class 2 Students in Half Yearly Assessment




Graph 5: Percentage of Class 3 Students in Half Yearly Assessment




Graph 6: Percentage of Class 4 Students in Half Yearly Assessment




Graph 7: Percentage of Class 5 Students in Half Yearly Assessment




Graph 8: Percentage of Class 6 Students in Half Yearly Assessment
