## **January MAT Report**

Percentage of schools that have entered data in January is 95.3%. It has decreased by 2.7% in comparison to previous month. Across districts, it has increased by more than 2% in Sonipat. This has decreased by more than 2% in most of the districts (Table 1).

In the month of January, Haryana Student attendance has remained same in November and January month. Across districts, attendance has increased by 1% or remains unchanged in most of the districts except Mewat, where it has decreased by 2% (Table 2).

Sonipat and Gurgaon districts retain their first and second position and Mahendergarh is again in tie with Gurgaon like in October month. Jhajjar is at third position. Likewise, in previous months, Palwal, Yamuna Nagar and Mewat are again the bottom performing districts (Table 3).


Performance level of Haryana in January MAT has increased by 1% in comparison to November. In other words, percentage of students scoring more than 50% marks has increased from 51% in November MAT to 52% in January MAT, which is same as in October MAT. Performance has increased in most of the districts, except Rohtak, where it has decreased by 1%. In Jhajjar, Ambala and Palwal, performance level has remained same (Table 3).

While discussing the class wise individual subjects at primary level across months, it has been found that performance of class 1<sup>st</sup> students in Hindi has decreased in comparison to November month. In class 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup>, performance of students in Hindi has increased in comparison of November. In class 5<sup>th</sup>, it has decreased marginally from 59% in November to 58% in January. In English, performance of students has decreased in all primary classes except in 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> class, where it has increased. In Mathematics, it has increased in class 2<sup>nd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup> and 5th, however in class 1<sup>st</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup>; it has decreased (Table 4).

Across classes in Hindi, performance of students has increased in class 2<sup>nd</sup> in comparison to class 1<sup>st</sup> but decreased in class 3<sup>rd</sup> in comparison of class 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup>, however in class 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> it has increased again. In English, it decreases as we move from class 1<sup>st</sup> to 3<sup>rd</sup> and in class 3<sup>rd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup>, it remains almost equal. In Mathematics, performance of students has increased from class 1<sup>st</sup> to class 2<sup>nd</sup> and after that it has decreased in class 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> and in class 5<sup>th</sup>; it has remained equal to class 4<sup>th</sup>. In EVS, performance has decreased from class 3<sup>rd</sup> to class 4<sup>th</sup> and increased in class 5<sup>th</sup> (Graph 1).



At upper Primary level, class wise performance in individual subjects across months shows that in Hindi, it has increased in class 8<sup>th</sup>, however decreased in class 6<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup>. In English, it has decreased in class 7<sup>th</sup> but increased in class 6<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup>. In Mathematics, performance has increased in class 8<sup>th</sup> but decreased in class 6<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup>. In Social Studies and Science, it has increased in class 6<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup> but decreased in class 8<sup>th</sup> (Table 5).

Across classes in Hindi, performance of students has increased as we move from class 6<sup>th</sup> to 8<sup>th</sup>. In English and Maths, it has remained almost same in class 6<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup>; however it has increased in class 8<sup>th</sup>. In Social Studies and Science, performance of students increases as we move from class 6<sup>th</sup> to 8<sup>th</sup> (Graph 2).
