In Hindi, performance of students scoring above 50% marks has been decreased from class 1<sup>st</sup> to 3<sup>rd</sup>, but it has improved in class 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup>.


In English, performance of students scoring above 50% marks has improved marginally from class  $1^{st}$  to class  $2^{nd}$  but then it decreased continuously in class  $3^{rd}$  and class  $4^{th}$ , again it has increased in class  $5^{th}$ .

In Mathematics, performance of students has continuously decreased from class  $1^{st}$  to  $4^{th}$ . However, it improved marginally in class  $5^{th}$ .

In EVS, performance of students decreased in class 4<sup>th</sup> as compare to class 3<sup>rd</sup> but in class 5<sup>th</sup>, a marginal improvement is observed.

Performance of students scoring above 50% marks has increased from class 6<sup>th</sup> to 8<sup>th</sup> for all subjects. However, there is a sharp decline in performance level of students from class 5<sup>th</sup> to 6<sup>th</sup> in Hindi, English and Mathematics.

Performance of students in Hindi is much higher in comparison to English, Mathematics, Social studies and Science in all the classes.

There is general decline in all districts except Mewat, top performing has declined more than the bottom performing districts. In bottom performing districts, either there is no change or improvement.

While comparing July results with May, a general decline was noticed in the results.

Now coming to class wise analysis, in class 8<sup>th</sup>, result of the Hindi subject has improved in the July in all the districts. In the rest of the subjects such as English, Mathematics, Science and Social Studies, marginal decline in the performance of students is noticed.

In Class 7<sup>th</sup>, result of Hindi has also improved in all the districts. English, Mathematics have marginal changes both positive and negative sides but decline in Social Science and Science was noticed. In Science, in most of the district, decline is more than 10%.

In class 6<sup>th</sup>, a general decline was noticed in all the subjects. In Mathematics, decline of more than 10% was found in half number of districts e.g. Bhiwani, Gurgaon, Jhajjar, Kaithal, Karnal, Panchkula, Panipat, Rewari and Rohtak.

In class 5<sup>th</sup>, in Hindi with marginal changes both positive and negative sides, but a decline was noticed in English, Mathematics and EVS.

In class 4<sup>th</sup>, decline was observed in all subjects but in Mathematics, the problem is more severe, where in most of districts, decline is visible around 20%.

In class 3<sup>rd</sup>, in the languages, both in Hindi and English, marginal changes are noticed. But in EVS, results are improved in all the districts more than 15%.

In class 2<sup>nd</sup>, in English, marginal changes (both positive and negative sides) were noticed, but in Hindi and Mathematics, there are decline in the results.

In class 1<sup>st</sup>, in Hindi, results have improved while in English and Mathematics, decline in results is observed.
