# Final Result( 6<sup>th</sup> to 8<sup>th</sup> )

Total Marks for:

SAT: 20 x 2 = 40 marks to be converted into 20 marks for Annual Result (Dividing factor 2).
For example, if a student scores 33 mark out of 40 in both SATs. Then 33 will be divided by 2 = 33/2 = 16.5 round off to 17 marks which will be taken in his/her final results towards SAT.

Half Yearly Assessment: 40 marks to be converted into 20 marks for Annual

Result. (Dividing factor 2)

For Example, if a student scores 38 marks out of 40 in Half Yearly Assessments. Then 38 marks will be divided by 2 = 38/2= 19 marks which will be taken in his/her final results towards Half Yearly Assessment.

Annual Assessment: 80 marks to be converted into 40 marks for Annual Result.

(Dividing factor 2)

For Example, if a student scores 76 marks out of 80 in Annual Assessment. Then 76 will be divided by 2 = 76/2= 38 marks which will be taken in his/her final results towards Annual Assessment.

Internal Assessment (IA)\*:

Internal Assessment will have total 20 marks which include following components:

SBA (4x2 Marks)	= 08 Marks
<b>Class room participation</b>	= 05 Marks
Exchange of Text Books	= 02 Marks
Attendance	= 05 Marks

For Example, if a student scores 15 marks out of 20 in all Internal Assessment Components. Then 15 marks will be taken in his/her final results towards Internal Assessment.

**Note:** Internal Assessment will be done at school level by concerned teacher and awards will be uploaded on AVSAR APP or as directed by directorate and its record will be maintained at school level.

Thus, for total 100 marks, 20 marks will come from both SATs, 20 marks will come from Half Yearly Assessment , 40 marks will come from Annual Assessment and 20 marks will come from Internal Assessment i.e. SBA, Classroom participation, Exchange of books and attendance.

### Criteria for Internal Assessment (Classes 6th to 8th) \*

**School-Based Assessments** : Subject Teachers will conduct School-Based Assessments (SBA) in the classroom which may include quizzes, surveys, projects, worksheets, assignments, portfolio and presentations etc. depending on the topic or chapter. For example, an art teacher can ask students to create a portfolio, using it as an assessment tool during SBA, while a science teacher may conduct an experiment. Similarly a language teacher may use essay writing, poetic recitation, or role-play as tools for SBA as per the context and learning objectives. The assessment data will be recorded for every SBA and aggregated over the academic session, with the marks averaged to determine the student's performance on this component. Each SBA is of 20 marks. Thus the total marks for all SBA for a particular subject is 80, which will be converted into 8 marks for the Annual Result, using a dividing factor of 10. For example, if a student scores 66 marks out of 80 in all SBAs, their score will be divided by 10 = 66/10 = 6.6 rounded off to 7 marks, which will be taken for his/her final Internal Assessment under SBA.

**Class room participation**: Teacher will observe the student that how much he/she shows enthusiasm in asking questions and is interactive with peers on the topics taught and record his/her performance. Observations will be recorded on monthly basis and then at the end of the academic session taking average of monthly performance, marks will be provided on this component. There may be five criteria to record its marks as; less than average=1 mark, average=2marks, good=3marks, very good=4 marks, excellent=5 marks will be taken.

**Attendance:** Teacher will keep record of attendance of students. To provide marks on this component, the criteria will be followed as: 1-20%=1mark, 21-40%=2marks, 41-60%=3marks, 61-80%=4marks and above 80%=5marks

**Exchange of text books**: Students who have exchanged 50% or more books will be given 2 marks and those who have exchanged less than 50% books will be given 1 mark.

# DETAIL DESIGN OF SAT, HALF YEARLY AND ANNUAL ASSESSMENTS CLASSES- IX to XII

#### Student Assessment Test and Half-Yearly Assessment:

- 1. The SAT and half-yearly assessment for classes 9 to 12 will be of 40 marks, including both theory and practical ,however , the distribution of 40 marks between theory and practical may vary from subject to subject as per board design. For subjects without practical components, the theory Paper will be of 40 marks. However, for subjects with practical components, the 40 marks will include both theory and practical. (Practical will be organized at school level).
- 2. The question paper design of the above examinations will be in accordance with the latest syllabus and design of Haryana School Education Board, Bhiwani, which is available on the website of the Board.
- 3. The type of questions in the above examinations will be taken as per the design of the board and the number of questions will be approximately half of the annual examinations.
- 4. In half yearly examination, the syllabus will be taken from April to September and in SAT examination, the syllabus of respective months will be taken, e.g. syllabus covered from April to July will be taken for July SAT and syllabus covered from October to December for December SAT.

#### Pre Board (X and XII) and Annual Assessment (IX to XII)

Annual and Pre-board examination will be conducted on the basis of design and scheme of studies 2024-25 issued by Board of school Education Haryana, Bhiwani.

#### **CRITERIA FOR CRP/SBA :**

**Class room participation:** Teacher will observe the student that how much he/she shows enthusiasm in asking questions and interactive with peers on the topic taught and record his/her performance. It will be recorded on monthly basis and then in the academic session taking average of monthly performance, marks will be provided on this component. There may be four criteria to record it as average, good, very good and excellent. For average: 0.5mark, good: 1 mark, very good: 1.5 marks, excellent : 2 marks will be taken.

**School-Based Assessments (SBA)** :Subject Teachers will conduct School-Based Assessments (SBA) in the classroom which may include quizzes, surveys, worksheets, assignments, portfolio and presentations etc. depending on the topic or chapter. For example, an art teacher can ask students to create a portfolio, using it as an assessment tool during SBA, while a science teacher may conduct an experiment, Similarly a language teacher may use essay writing, poetic recitation, or role-play as tools for SBA as per the context and learning objectives.
