# "एस सी ई आर टी हरियाणा और श्री विश्वकर्मा कौशल विश्वविद्यालय हरियाणा व्यावसायिक शिक्षा मैं साथ मिल कर करेंगे काम"

एनएसक्यूएफ एक राष्ट्रीय स्तर पर एकीकृत शिक्षा और योग्यता आधारित कौशल ढांचा है जो व्यावसायिक शिक्षा के भीतर सामान्य और व्यावसायिक शिक्षा के बीच एक स्तर को सीखने के बाद दूसरे उच्च स्तर से जोड़ने के लिए कई रास्ते प्रदान करेगा और शिक्षार्थियों को शिक्षा और कौशल प्रणाली में किसी भी शुरुआती बिंदु से उच्च स्तर तक प्रगति करने में सक्षम करेगा। यह शैक्षणिक धारा और व्यवहारिक शिक्षण कौशल को एकीकृत करके छात्रों के रोजगार कौशल को बढाने के लिए एक ढांचा है।यह योजना एनएसडीसी द्वारा कौशल विकास और उधामिता के माध्यम से निर्धारित राष्ट्रीय व्यावसायिक मानकों पर आधारित हैं। यह योजना एसएससी को राज्य बोर्ड के साथ संयुक्त रूप से आकलन और प्रमाणन आयोजित करने का भी आदेश देती है।हरियाणा देश का एकमात्र राज्य है जिसने 2012-13 के दौरान एमएचआरडी द्वारा आवंटित एनवीईक्यूएफ पायलट परियोजना को सफलतापूर्वक लॉन्च और कार्योन्वत किया।

राज्य ने बेरोजगार युवाओं को कौशल प्रदान करने, स्कूल न जाने वाले बच्चों, अर्ध-कुशल व्यक्तियों के रोजगार कौशल को बढ़ाने, लड़कियों और महिलाओं को सशक्त बनाने और नियमित स्कूलों में पढ़ने वाले बच्चों को भी शामिल करने के लिए स्टार योजना को लागू करना शुरू किया है, जो स्कूल के समय के बाद प्रशिक्षण लेना चुनते हैं। इस योजना को एनएसडीसी द्वारा कार्यान्वित किया जा रहा है।

दिनांक 14-5-2024 को एस. सी. ई .आर. टी .के निदेशक श्री सुनील बजाज एनएसक्यूएफ विभाग के सदस्यों के साथ श्री विश्वर्शकर्मा कौशल विश्वविद्यालय हिरयाणा का दौरा किया ओर कुलसचिव प्रोफेसर ज्योति राणा एवम विश्वविद्यालय के सभी विभागों के सीनियर लेक्चरर के साथ एक बैठक की, जिसमें एस .सी. ई आर टी हिरयाणा ओर श्री विश्वकर्मा कौशल विश्वविद्यालय हिरयाणा ने मिल कर व्यावसायिक शिक्षा मैं एक नई पहल करने का निर्णय लिया गया। दोनों मिल कर व्यावसायिक शिक्षा प्रशिक्षण,पाठ्य पुस्तक ,ई सामग्री,ई मोडयूल्स ,ई कोर्सस मैं एक साथ कम करेंगे और हिरयाणा मैं व्यावसायिक शिक्षा को एक नए आयाम पर ले जाने के लिए प्रतिबद्ध हुए |इस बैठक मैं निदेशक एस सी ई आर टी श्री सुनील बजाज ने एस सी ई आर टी पिरेसर मैं जैविक खेती ,ग्रीन हाउस ,बनाने मैं विश्वविद्यालय के कृषि से सम्बंधित छात्रों की मदद लेने की बात कही तथा एस सी ई आर टी व्यावसायिक शिक्षा मैं मिल कर कम करेगी जिससे शिक्षार्थियों को शिक्षा और कौशल प्रणाली में किसी भी शुरुआती बिंदु से उच्च स्तर तक प्रगति करने में सक्षम बनाया जा सके कुलसचिव प्रोफेसर ज्योति राणा ने उनकी इस पहल का स्वागत किया, और साथ मिलकर कम करने का आश्वासन दिया, बैठक मैं विश्वविद्यालय की सयुक्त निदेशक शिखा गुप्ता ने कहा की विचार किये गए सभी क्षेत्रों में औपचारिक रूप से काम शुरु किया

# 3 days Workshop for proof reading of worksheets for DIKSHA Portal

A workshop was conducted with the new creators who have given their choice to do worksheet creation, for Practice worksheet creation on DIKSHA on 1-3 May 2024. In this workshop, worksheet blueprint, what is a Good worksheet? What are the pedagogical requirements for creating a good worksheet? A live demo was given to log in to DIKSHA and how to use worksheet? Do's and Don'ts while creating the worksheet were also shared. In this workshop, participants also checked and finalized the worksheets of 4-8 class subjects Maths, Science, SSt and English.



## **Online Monthly Meeting of DIET ET Wings**

ET Wing SCERT conducts State level Online Monthly Meeting of ET Wings of all DIETs in Haryana. Monthly meetings are based on our ongoing practice of monitoring & reviewing aimed at the strengthening of DIETs. For the month of April 2024, it was conducted on **8th May 2024**. Worthy Director SCERT Haryana, Sh.Sunil Bajaj addressed the participants and shared the vision behind the initiatives taken by SCERT and highlighted ET Wing's efforts towards Haryana's Digital Education landscape.

#### **Key areas of discussion in the meeting:**

• **DIET Reporting through Prakshikshak**: The overall March and April data was shared with everyone. Palwal, Faridabad, Fatehabad and Gurugram task update report was low amongst all DIETs and Hisar, Rohtak and Panchkula were the top DIETs reporting more than 70+ tasks in March. In April Palwal, Faridabad, Karnal and Gurugram's task updation report was low amongst all DIETs and Hisar, Fatehabad, Rohtak and Panchkula were the top DIETs reporting more than 90+ tasks.

**Action to be taken by:** Palwal, Faridabad, Karnal and Gurugram DIETs to review/recheck number of tasks. Approval of tasks by DIET Principals must be completed by Monday 10AM.

• Techskills MIP (Micro Improvement Project on DIKSHA): Hisar becomes the top-performing DIET with achieving more than the target given and Faridabad lies at the low performing DIET.

• Total schools enrolled in the MIP till now are 1440. District wise details can be checked from the copy of PPT attached.


Action to be taken by: Since the timeline extended to 15 MAY 2024, all DIETs should ensure to enroll maximum schools and help them to complete all tasks of Activity#2 Smart Learn and upload on the DIKSHA app.

• Aao School Chalein (Micro Improvement Project on DIKSHA): Jhajjar, Bhiwani and Karnal remain the low performing DIETs here. (Major low point is less awareness about the project)

Action to be taken: Since the timeline for this is 31st July 2024, all DIETs should ensure to enroll maximum schools in this MIP and help them to complete all tasks and upload on the DIKSHA app.

• EDUSAT Haryana and NEEV project: Journey of EDUSAT from 2006 to 2024 was shared and highlighted the importance of the econtent. Further NEEV projects will take forward this in terms of having interactive videos created and shared with students. The SCERT team is currently working on creating district PMUs for the same. The process has already been done with Hisar and Fatehabad and now the plan ahead is to have it in all the districts.

Action to be taken: All DIETs should nominate(adopt) 2 schools for grade 9th and 10th only. List of Science ,Maths teachers students and prepared.Nominati on of DIET PMU faculty (two members one science and maths) should also be finalized.



• eContent Development Training for DIKSHA Follow Ups: Panipat and Mahendragarh came as the top performing DIETs in terms of completion of all blocks training on econtent development Palwal, Ambala, Charkhi Dadri, Hisar, Jhajjar and Karnal DIETs have not even started with the training at a single block yet. Kurukshetra's growth % from pre-post test is 24.35% as the highest and Fatehabad remains low at 4.2%.

**Action to be taken:** To ensure the participants register on Prashikshak portal and do all allotted tasks, daily attendance on Prashikshak portal. Prepare teachers to contribute in eContent development for EDUSAT and DIKSHA.List of potential eContent creators be prepared at district level in all subjects/grades.


• **eContent Review Parameters**: The goal and the objectives of the Content Review Team were discussed. The parameters booklet aim and online tool's (DMS) vision and importance was shared. The process of evaluation on the DMS along with District- wise reviewers team details were shared.

**Action to be taken: One POC** for each DIET will be allocated to look after the overall project's implementation in their districts. List of potential eContent reviewers be prepared at district level in all subjects/grades.

Achievements and Q/A session: Participants shared their best practices, suggestions during this session. Some DIET faculties Mr. Praveen Kumar DIET Karnal, Mr. Takdeer Singh DIET Panipat, Mr. Rashmi DIET Gurugram, Mr. Devender DIET Karnal, Mr. Jagminder DIET Jind, Mr. Dinesh DIET Hisar and others shared their efforts in convincing stakeholders in the safe and effective use of digital devices/gadgets (tabs, mobile phones due to resistance of society, budget problems) in conducting training etc.

# Online Monthly Reviews of Elementary Mentoring at the State, Block and District Levels

On 09.05.2024 Monthly Review meeting was organized of elementary monitoring for state, block and district level. This meeting was attended by DIET Faculties and Sahyogis. District wise and Block wise April month report was shared regarding targets/school visits.



#### **DIET Monthly Review meeting on Prashikshak Haryana report**

Aimed at strengthening the teacher education system by empowering educators through continuous monitoring and review, SCERT has introduced Prashikshak Haryana Portal since April 2024. Through this online utility, each DIET's efforts, challenges and best practices in various areas like training, research, content development, mentoring etc will be discussed in a detailed review meeting by the undersigned, for

further improvemnt. This meeting is now proposed to be organized on a regular basis, during the second week of the month. In this reference, SCERT conducted its first Prashikshak Haryana-DIET Review meeting of all DIETs on 20.05.2024. Overall 06 DIET Principals and 32 DIET faculties(total 38) attended the meeting.

Key Highlights of the Meeting -

- Director, SCERT highlighted the effort of ET Wing in making the work of DIET visible through the *Prashikshak Haryana* which enabled DIETs to present their achievements and success stories. He also discussed how SCERT's projects are effectively aligned with NEP 2020. The Director, SCERT, Shri Sunil Bajaj, highlighted the collaboration of SCERT with TISS in capacity building of maths and science teachers. He also highlighted the collaboration with IIT Gandhi Nagar and Skill University for further capacity building in terms of vocational studies and personality development.
- Deputy Director, Shri Virender Nara highlighted the importance of *Prashikshak Haryana*, its
  features that enable the DIETs to report and showcase their work effectively. He also elaborated on
  the quality work by DIETs which ultimately lead to improving the education system of Haryana for
  every child.
- Deputy Director, Smt. Kalpna Ranga encouraged the DIETs to self-report their work and assess the same which encouraged them to celebrate their growth. She also created a space for suggestions and improvements in the current reporting mechanism.
- Head of Educational Technology Wing, Sh Manoj Kaushik then further elaborated on SCERT's vision in making all DIETs a center of excellence.

#### **Meeting Agenda/discussion points:**

#### 1. Demo./ Orientation of Prashikshak Haryana Portal:

Subject Specialist, ET Wing, Sh Kuldeep Birwal and Lecturer, DIET Hisar, Sh Rajendar Sharma gave a live and in depth overview of *Prashikshak Haryana* and highlighted its features by hands-on demonstrating the same in two parts:

- How to report work on Prashikshak(by DIET faculty)
- How to approve the task reported by DIET faculties(by DIET Principal)

#### 2. Presentation/Discussion on DIET's work report for April:

ET Wing, Head, Sh. Manoj Kaushik while highlighting the aims and objectives of the *Prashikshak Haryana* and discussed in detail about the vision of *Prashikshak Haryana* in maintaining the

transparency and visibility of work and also as an effective communication channel between SCERT and DIETs.

- The meeting was oriented towards celebrating the achievements and successes of DIETs and addressing the challenges they face.
- He also highlighted that the portal will enable quality enhancement of documentation, a practice which will reduce reporting time and energy for DIETs.
- In depth- data analysis on task reporting, completion and task details was done to inform all the DIETs about their performance status.
- Do's and Don'ts regarding program reporting, including nature of task, number of tasks, avoiding duplicacy, meaning of 'DIET self' etc were also discussed.

#### 3. Suggestions provided by attendees:

All participants were given an online feedback form for feedback/suggestions on portal. In addition to this form, following immediate feedback was also received:

- Minimum one week may be given for approval of the tasks by DIET Principal after the end of the month.
- Task title should not be editable.
- If any task is rejected/ disapproved by DIET Principal, then it should be redirected to the faculty/available for editing by concerned faculty.
- A space for dialogue option should be inculcated if the task assigning organization is selected as "others".
- Flexibility in opening multiple pages in one click.
- Addition of an administrative column for reporting the work of DIET Incharges.

#### 4. Achievements and Challenges shared by DIET faculties

- Sh. Narendar Kumar, DIET Tejli, Yamunanagar shared that the initiative of eContent development training undertaken by the DIET in light of ET Wing SCERT's vision was appreciated by the teachers in their blocks.
- Ms. Arpana, DIET Palwal, Kurukshetra also shared that their eContent development training received great feedback from teachers. The DIET also made infrastructure progress which has made the ecosystem helpful for future training.
- Sh. Pawan Kumar, DIET Kaithal shared that one major initiative that the DIET has undertaken is the task of conducting extra classes in schools by DIET faculties.
- Ms. Rajbala, DIET Panchkula shared that their DIET has taken self initiative to monitor low enrollment schools.
- Sh. Brajpal, DIET Janauli, Palwal shared that uploading the task on a portal was a challenge.

The feedback form, rolled out to make the portal more user friendly, will remain available to collect responses from the rest of the officials(other than attendees) for a strengthened system of collaborative work. SCERT Haryana will try to accommodate the suggestive changes provided by the attendees and is open to receive more such suggestions to build a cumulative system of change with DIETs.

## Workshops for Development of the Textbooks of Mathematics for Class 1 & 2

Under the esteemed leadership of Mr. Sunil Bajaj, Director of SCERT, significant progress has been made in the development of the Class 2 Mathematics Textbook for Haryana Government schools along with finalization of Class 1 Mathematics Book in the month of May 2024. Throughout May Month, the Curriculum and Pedagogy Department organized a series of workshops spanning 12 days, dedicated to both finalizing the Class 1 book and writing the Class 2 Mathematics book.



The development process continued with a series of workshops

in May, each playing a crucial role in shaping the content of the Class 2 Mathematics book. These workshops included a three-day workshop from May 7th to 9th, followed by a four-day workshop from May 14th to 17th, a two-day session from May 20th to 21st, and concluding with another three-day workshop from May 27th to 29th, 2024.

The textbook development aims to closely align with the NEP-2020 and draws inspiration from the pedagogical framework of NCERT books. Subject experts from diverse fields are meticulously crafting content that encourages innovation and ensures clarity and effectiveness in educational delivery.

The initiative reflects a commitment to enhancing educational standards and providing quality learning materials for students in Haryana Government schools, setting a foundation for future academic success.



#### Monthly Meeting with CMDA Wing of DIETs

#### Launch of Competency-Based Question Bank for Grade 6 Mathematics

In the series of preparation of Competency Based Question Bank for classes 6<sup>th</sup> to 8<sup>th</sup> the Assessment Wing has completed Class 6<sup>th</sup> Mathematics question bank and has launched on our official website. This milestone achievement is the result of multiple workshops dedicated to creating, reviewing, and finalizing the question bank. Educators and students can now access a wide array of carefully curated questions in Mathematical/ English language aimed at enhancing understanding and competency.




## Practice Quiz Creation for Grades 10, 11, and 12 on PAL Application

To enrich the evaluation process on Personalized Adaptive Learning Application (**PAL**) for classes 10<sup>th</sup>, 11<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> The Assessment Wing has created practice quizzes in all main subjects. A total of 29 quizzes across various subjects are prepared periodically. These quizzes are made available on the PAL application by the Academic Cell Panchkula, providing students with an effective tool to prepare for their examinations. The practice quizzes are updated every 15 days using the relevant syllabus, ensuring they remain aligned with the curriculum and adapt to each student's learning needs, providing personalized and targeted practice to improve academic performance.

# Capacity Building for DIET Faculty in SAT Question Paper Creation

Haryana is a state where the evaluation at school level is unique in the sense that centralized assessments are conducted in the form of Student Assessment Tests (SAT). This initiative aims to ensure the reliability and validity of assessments, ultimately contributing to the improvement of educational standards in our state. Therefore, keeping in view of building the capacity of our DIET Faculty the Assessment Wing organized a

one-day orientation session of DIET Faculty who are responsible for creating question papers for Student Assessment Test, Half Yearly Assessment and Annual Assessment in the academic year 2024-25. A total of < 90 participants participated in the online session. The main objective of the workshop was to focus on equipping DIET faculty with the necessary expertise to create high-quality question papers for the centralized assessments.



#### Webinar Series 1.0 Episode – 1

Science Wing organized online session on Basics of Intellectual Property Rights. The speaker for the session was Dr. Rahul Taneja, Scientist from Department of Science & Technology, Haryana. The session was streamed live on 1<sup>st</sup> May through official YouTube channel of SCERT and witness large viewership. The session was moderated by Science Wing members.

**Objectives**: To promote collaboration among SCERT, SIASTE, DIETs and State Universities to strengthen research activities in the state and to improve Pre-Service Teacher Education.

#### Major points discussed included:-
