## Capacity Building of Teachers and Teacher Educators for eContent Development under DIKSHA

SCERT Haryana, the nodal agency for DIKSHA and EDUSAT Haryana, is working on Teacher Professional Development in digital content development, online teaching-learning resources, and online courses. Based on CIET-NCERT's SRG orientation, team Haryana prepared a State eContent development plan for 2024-25. This program is important and intended to



prepare more than 2500 teachers and trainers in skills of e-Content Development. All these teachers will join the existing Content creator team of SCERT Haryana and contribute to the State Repository of Open Educational Resources (SROER). In continuation of this; the Educational Technology wing organized a workshop from **03-02-2025 to 07-02-2025 (Batch-3)**. A total of 24 participants attended this workshop. The following topics/sessions were covered -

- ICT integrated Pedagogy
- Script Writing and Evaluation of videos
- Video Recording
- Presentation skill
- Info graphics
- Video Editing
- Video Recording and Discussion by participants
- OER and Licenses

A total of 8 Practical Sessions, 7 hands-on sessions, Studio recordings of every participant, and District presentations were scheduled in the morning session every day. Pre-tests, assignments, learnings, post-tests, and feedback were conducted on the SCERT LMS Portal. Participation certificates were given to all 24 participants.

### Capacity Development of Teachers on Digital Literacy under DIKSHA

For spreading awareness about Tech. Initiatives of the school and department, a capacity development program of **Teachers' Training on 'Digital Literacy, '** was organized on 03rd -07th Feb 2025. The primary objectives of this training program are threefold: to enhance teachers' digital skills, to help them integrate digital tools into their teaching, and to improve student engagement through the use of technology. By achieving these objectives, the program aims to elevate the overall quality of education and ensure that students are better prepared for the digital age. Training was conducted through interactive sessions, hands-on practice, and peer learning activities. Interactive sessions introduced Digital Literacy



Concepts, while hands-on sessions allowed teachers to practice using these tools in a supportive environment.

Participants' registration was done on *Prashikshak Haryana*. To measure the effectiveness of the training program, both pre-training and post-training assessments were also conducted. Additionally, participant feedback was



collected to ensure that the training met their needs and expectations. A total of 22 participants attended this workshop.

The following topics/sessions were covered -

- Introduction to Digital Literacy
- NEP 2020
- Basic Computer Skills
- Digital Tools for Teaching - Word Processing
- Digital Tools for Teaching - Presentations
- Digital Tools for Teaching - Spreadsheets
- Interactive Whiteboards and Digital Resources
- Internet
- Communication and Collaboration Tools
- Cyber security and Privacy
- Online Assessment

A total of 9 Practical Sessions, 9 Hands-on sessions, and a District presentation were conducted in every day. 21 participants were provided participation certificates.

## 21st Century Skills MOOC- PLC-2

A Peer Learning Community (PLC) is a structured, interactive space where individuals with shared interests or challenges collaborate to explore solutions, share insights, and learn together.

Cascade Model:

Generally, PLCs for mentors are conducted at the state level ( in physical/online ) so that they can perform the same in their districts, allowing them to come together to share this interactive and learning space with shared goals of Learn-Unlearn-Relearn.

On February 4th, 2025, mentors were oriented at the state level on PLC-2. The session included states' progress sharing, celebration, and discussion of challenges that are becoming bottlenecks in the course progress. A Google form was shared with district mentors to put tentative dates of PLC-2 as they were directed to organise PLC-2 on or before 17th February.

Keeping the above into consideration, 18/22 districts have successfully conducted PLC-2 in their districts, comprising





participation of 1107 (62%) of the all enrolled officials in this course in February. Ambala, Bhiwani, Jhajjar, and Sirsa have yet to organize the same. The above districts were also given feedback through participants (637 responses so far) on various elements, such as which makes its NPS (Net Promoter Score) 52.

## 10th Prashikshak Review and DIET Presentation of best practices

Aimed at strengthening the teacher education system by empowering educators through continuous monitoring and review, SCERT has introduced the Prashikshak Haryana Portal since April 2024. Through this online utility, the undersigned will discuss each DIET's efforts, challenges, and best practices in various areas like training, research, content development, mentoring, etc. in a detailed review meeting for further improvement.

In this reference, SCERT conducted its seventh Prashikshak Haryana-DIET Review meeting of all DIETs on 18/02/2025, the meeting was conducted online.

### Meeting Agenda/Discussion Points/Data Management Insights:

- A summary of data from the past ten months was presented, and trends were discussed.
- Actions were proposed for DIET faculty members who are not updating their tasks.
- The performance rankings of DIETs were discussed, and areas for improvement were highlighted.
- A detailed discussion was held on the tasks of all the DIETs, aimed at helping each DIET better define and categorize its responsibilities.
- A detailed discussion was held on the summary of the total tasks that were submitted by each faculty member.
- Based on the highest number of task entries, top performers from each district were identified and congratulated.
- An insightful discussion on data management, highlighting the importance of the meeting in addressing four major compliance requirements outlined by NEP 2020.
- Urged everyone to update their tasks accurately on the portal to facilitate more effective review meetings.
- Attention was drawn to the need for DIETs to focus on their core tasks and prioritize all tasks as a critical aspect of strengthening the system.

Overall, 45 DIET faculties, including one DIET principal, attended the Prashiksha, streamed virtually through Zoom, from 20 Districts.

## District Level STEM Fair

The City-Level STEM Fair in Gurugram brought together bright young minds from ten schools, culminating in an exciting day of innovation and learning. Hosted at SCERT Gurugram, Haryana, the fair featured enthusiastic student participation, showcasing creativity in science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM). The fair featured 68 students showcasing their creativity in science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM).





The event, a culmination of school-level fairs held between February 10th and 17th, was inaugurated by key dignitaries, including Sh. Sunil Bajaj (Additional Director), Sh. Veerender Nara (Deputy Director), and Sh. Manoj Kaushik (Head of SCERT ET Department), who emphasized the importance of STEM education in shaping the future.



Students exhibited their projects, engaging in a hands-on learning experience that allowed them to apply theoretical knowledge to real-world problems. A major highlight of the day was the **"Transportation Innovation Challenge,"** where participants worked in teams to design futuristic transportation solutions. Guided by volunteers and mentors, students demonstrated their problem-solving and engineering skills. The judging round assessed projects based on creativity, functionality, and feasibility. Outstanding participants from various schools were recognized for their efforts, securing top positions based

on their innovative contributions.

The event concluded with an award ceremony where students were honored with prizes and certificates for their achievements. The fair successfully provided a platform for young innovators to explore STEM fields, igniting their curiosity and ambition to contribute to future technological advancements. With enthusiastic participation and inspiring projects, the Gurugram City-Level STEM Fair underscored the importance of experiential learning and innovation in education.

### 23rd Monthly review meeting of DIET ET Wings

Educational Technology (ET) Wing of SCERT organized the State-Level Monthly Meeting of ET Wings from all DIETs. These monthly meetings focus on ongoing projects and the practice of monitoring and reviewing to strengthen DIETs. For January and February 2025, the meeting was held on **14th Feb 2024**. The meeting began with an address by **Shri Manoj Kaushik, Head of the ET Wing**, highlighting the purpose of the ET Review process, which started in 2022. This was the **23rd ET Review** meeting.

#### General Points discussed:

1. Shri Manoj Kaushik, Head, ET Wing, emphasized the key role of **SCERT and DIETs in strengthening the education system**. He stressed the need for regular tracking of progress and evaluating outcomes. It was underlined that if objectives are yet to be achieved, the project should be continued and reworked, incorporating feedback and learnings for re-implementing in an updated format. On the other side, if objectives are met, the project activities can be compiled and documented, and formal completion/closure can be declared.
2. The major programs of ET Wing SCERT were discussed with all the DIETs ET Wings along with their status on all programs. 16 programs were discussed in detail, and their top performers and bottom performing districts' celebrations and challenges were discussed in the meeting along with stating clear next steps.
3. Special focus was also given to the monthly eMagazine creation by all DIETs. For January, Rewari and Fatehabad efforts were celebrated.

Sh. Kuldeep Birwal and Smt. Anita, the Subject specialist for ET Wing, explored data for discussion on all key areas and their analysis.



## Haryana secures a Spot in the Top 5 for Daily Active Users on DIKSHA

Haryana has achieved a remarkable milestone by securing the 5th position in the Top 5 states for daily active users on DIKSHA. This achievement has been officially certified in the NCERT 53rd DIKSHA Coordination Meeting, a prestigious monthly forum where all states and union territories share their DIKSHA-related progress.

Daily active users refer to the number of unique individuals accessing DIKSHA each day for their learning needs. Haryana's impressive ranking underscores its strong engagement with digital learning resources and its commitment to leveraging technology for educational advancement.

During this period, the ET Wing, SCERT Haryana, spearheaded several initiatives to enhance digital outreach, further driving the state's success in digital adoption. The continuous efforts to promote DIKSHA and ensure quality e-learning access for students and teachers have played a crucial role in achieving this milestone. This recognition at the NCERT level reaffirms Haryana's commitment to digital education and strengthens its position as a model state for innovative learning initiatives. Moving forward, we aim to sustain this momentum, explore new avenues for digital learning, and maximize the impact of e-learning resources for a brighter educational future.



## Orientation on Evaluation of Entries for Diksha Utsav – Selection of Top Entries

On February 14, 2025, an online orientation session was conducted for all block-level Sahiyogis to guide them through the evaluation process for the 57,000 entries received for DIKSHA Utsav. During the session, Sahiyogis were briefed on the selection criteria, where each block was required to finalize three entries in the categories of art, poetry, and storytelling, ensuring alignment with the theme provided by SCERT. Additionally, they were to identify three outstanding entries in the same categories that, while exceptional, did not align with the given theme. The session provided clarity on the evaluation process, enabling Sahiyogis to carry out the selection efficiently. They have now been entrusted with completing the process and submitting the final evidence by February 18, 2025.

## Successful Residential Workshop on Holistic Progress Card

The Testing and Assessment Department at SCERT successfully conducted a two-day residential workshop on the Holistic Progress Card (HPC) on February 27-28, 2025, under the guidance of Director SCERT, Sh. Samwartak Singh, Deputy Director Sh. Veerender Nara, and Assessment Wing Incharge Dr. Manoj Sharma. A total of 88 teachers and Block Resource Persons (BRPs) participated, engaging in expert sessions by NCERT resource persons Ms. Jaya and Ms. Reetu on assessment methodologies, competency-based evaluation, and holistic student





tracking. SCERT team members, including Dr. Sheetal Sheokand (Program Coordinator), Ms. Vandana Chopra, and Ms. Seema, facilitated discussions on practical implementation strategies.

Director SCERT, Sh. Samwartak Singh, emphasized the HPC's role in moving beyond traditional exams to track cognitive, social, and emotional development. He encouraged open discussions, with active contributions from educators such as Abdul Waris (Nuh Mewat), Rekha Devi Chhikara (Panipat), Mamta (Palwal), Sunita (Palwal), Swarnlata (Gurugram), Chetna (Jhajjar), and Kuldeep (Faridabad), who shared insights on training venues, TLMs, competency-based assessments, and student safety awareness.

The workshop concluded with a commitment from SCERT Haryana and NCERT to provide on-going support and mentorship for effective HPC implementation across Haryana's schools.



### Annual Assessments 2025: Date Sheet Finalized and Approved

A meticulously planned **date sheet for the Annual Assessments 2025** was developed in alignment with the assessment framework. After careful review and refinement, the finalized schedule was submitted to the **Directorate for approval**, ensuring a smooth and well-coordinated execution of the upcoming examinations. The systematic approach to scheduling aims to optimize **student preparedness and logistical efficiency** across all schools.

### Finalization of Annual Assessment Question Papers

The **Testing and Assessment Department** successfully completed the development and finalization of question papers for the **Annual Assessments 2025**, scheduled for March. Covering all subjects from **Balvatika to Grade 8**, the team ensured that the assessments were **high-quality, well-structured, and aligned with learning outcomes**. Rigorous review processes were followed to maintain **fairness, clarity, and competency-based evaluation**, reinforcing SCERT's commitment to effective student assessment.

### Strategic Planning: Annual Work Plan for 2025-26

Taking a proactive step towards **structured assessment management**, the department formulated a **comprehensive Annual Work Plan for the Assessment Wing for the academic session 2025-26**. This plan outlines **key assessment-related activities, training programs, evaluation strategies, and capacity-building initiatives** for the upcoming academic year. The structured roadmap aims to enhance **consistency, efficiency, and effectiveness** in student assessments across the state.

### Participation in Training Need Analysis Workshop at HIPA

In a bid to strengthen professional development efforts, **Ms. Seema Raheja** represented the department at an intensive **five-day Training Need Analysis (TNA) workshop** held at **HIPA from 16th February 2025 onwards**. The workshop provided **valuable insights into identifying, analyzing, and addressing training needs for educators**, ensuring **more targeted and impactful capacity-building programs** in the future. With these key initiatives, the **Testing and Assessment Department** continues to drive **meaningful improvements** in student assessment, educator training, and structured planning, and reinforcing SCERT's commitment to quality education in Haryana.

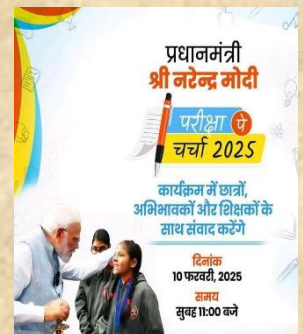
