Renowned landmarks such as Sheetla Mata Mandir, Sultanpur Bird Sanctuary, Pataudi Palace, Damdama Lake, and the Aravalli Biodiversity Park further enhance its historical, spiritual, and ecological significance, making Gurugram an ideal venue for academic and intellectual engagements.

- NEP-2020 strategies and best practices
- Governance and quality assurance
- Post-NEP challenges and future reforms

Track 5: Emerging and Interdisciplinary Perspectives

- Educational technology and blended learning
- Inclusive and sustainable education
- Interdisciplinary and practice-oriented research

These thematic areas are broad, though not limited to the above, and aim to foster critical inquiry, interdisciplinary dialogue, and actionable insights that contribute to policy development, institutional practices, and sustainable innovations in school and teacher education.

Paper Submission and Registration

Certificates shall be issued to all paper presenters as well as registered attendees.
