Sub : Proposal of the State Government for making amendment in the Statute approved vide letter no. BSU-16/86-1098/GS(I), dated 19.04.1986 regarding requirement of the land for governing the affiliation of Colleges of Bihar in view of the guidelines of UGC.

Ref:- Letter no. 14/M7-56/14-1036, dated 6.7.2015 of the Department of Education, Bihar, Patna and Governor's Secretariat Notification no. BSU-76/2014-1101/GS(1), dated 31.7.2015.

Sir,

With reference to the subject noted above, I am directed to say that the prevailing Statute related to affiliation of Colleges was issued vide letter no. BSU-16/86-1098/GS(I), dated 19.04.1986. In the year 2012, UGC had issued guidelines regarding affiliation.

Accordingly a Committee was formed, comprising of three Vice Chancellors' and a representative of Education Department. The Committee has suggested various changes have been proposed and included among them is scaling down of land requirement for affiliated Colleges.

Utility and feasibility of certain recommendations of the Committee need special attention of the Universities and Govt. For example, Article 2 (3,5, & 8) deal with land use certificate, permission from local government for starting the college, and money required for constructing buildings. Similarly, another important aspect which needs to be addressed is the need for a college in a particular area. Attention need to be drawn to Article 3 (a) where the number of educational institutions and students' strength etc. may be factored before fresh institutions are affiliated in that area. Adequacy of land in the new proposal also needs to be carefully examined. Requirement of land needs to be seen in relation to requirement of land for constructing academic/ administrative buildings, hostels, residences of faculty / staff / Principal as well as play grounds.

Therefore, the Hon'ble Chancellor, after due consideration of the matter and recommendations of the Committee has been pleased to order to seek the opinion of the Education Department and different Universities on the comprehensive draft of the existing Statute.

Accordingly, while enclosing herewith a copy of the report of the Committee alongwith its enclosures, you are, requested to kindly send your views on the report of the Committee at the earliest for further necessary action by this Secretariat.

This may be given priority.






A Committee was constituted for amending the Statutes approved vide letter No. (U.A)-16/86-1098/GS(I) dated 19.04.1986 regarding requirement of the land for printing affiliation of Colleges of Bihar in view of the recent guidelines of UGC. In this context earlier three meetings were held on 22.12.2015 and 08.01.2016 in the Raj Bhawan and on 07.05.2016 in the office of Liaison office, T.M. Bhagalpur University at Patna.


(2) Pursuant to the terms and reference framed by the Governor Secretariat, Bihar a meeting was held on 09.12.2016 at 10:00 am and to approve the amendments in the statutes as recommended by the Committee on 07.05.2016 as Annexure-A. On the basis of the said recommendation following amendments may be inserted in the existing Statute's article 3(f), "That the undisputed ownership and possession of land measuring not less than 2 acres if it is located in Municipal cities, and 5 acres if it is located in rural / other areas". The above recommendations for amendment in the relevant statutes which deals the requirement of land on the basis of UGC Regulation, 2009 may be placed before the Hon'ble Chancellor for kind consideration and assent.

(3) The committee after detail deliberations further suggests that a comprehensive change in the existing statutes of 1986 is needed. In this context committee prepared a detail chart mentioning provisions of existing statutes and also proposed draft statutes in 34 pages which is being enclosed herewith as Annexure-B. In the meeting the committee further resolved that Annexure-B may be sent to the Education Department and other traditional Universities of Bihar for obtaining their views for making necessary modification in the Statutes. The proposed draft may also be placed before His Excellency for obtaining approval before sending it to the Education Department and different Universities.

Penalties on the University granting affiliation to sub-standard Colleges or failure of Universities/ colleges to comply with the Regulations of UGC:</p> <p>(i) If any University grants affiliation to a College which does not fulfill the conditions/ requirements for affiliation as per the Statutes, or if the University grants affiliation in contravention of the relevant provisions of the UGC Act and Regulation, the Commission may take such action as it may deem fit, including that of withholding the grants to the University and/ or delisting the said University from the list of Universities maintained by the Commission under Section 12B of the UGC Act.</p> <p>(ii) If any College included under Section 2(f) and receiving UGC Grants under Section 12B is found guilty of violation of the UGC Regulations, the Commission may take such action as it may deem fit, including that of withholding the grants to the Colleges and/ or delisting the said College from the list of Colleges maintained by the Commission under Section 2(f) and/ or 12B the UGC Act.</p>
