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#### ORDINANCE .

# The 1 yr (Two Semester) Post Graduate Diploma in Women's Studies under SEMESTER SYSTEM

- Admission to the course shall be open to candidate who posses Honours Graduate degree in any discipline or equivalent.
- 2. Admission to the Course shall be made on the basis of marks obtained at Graduation level and interview conducted by the Department of Women's Studies under the supervision of the Department of History.
- 3. The number of seats shall be 60 only.
- 4. The Reservation of seats belonging to various categories shall be as per Patna University/Bihar Government rules.
- 5. The course is designed as no profit, no-loss basis and the proposed fee-structure for the full course is as follows.

Admission fee	-	Rs.	100 /-

Thus, total fee paid by the students of different categories shall be as follows:

For General Candidates - Rs. 8200 /For BC (I) Candidates - Rs. 7200 /for SC/ST Candidates - Rs. 5200 /-

Each candidate shall have to pay Annual Examination fee as per Patna University rules of Women's Studies under the supervision of the Department of History and classes will be held in the SAP premises of the Department.

- 6. The duration of the Course shall be of one Academic year consisting of two semesters.
- 7. In Case of NRI 3 seats may be reserved for which they shall be paying consolidated amount of Rs. 16000/- in one academic year.
- In case a student fails in more than two papers he/she will have to repeat the course. On
  payment of required fee he/ she will be allowed to clear those papers in the next
  examination.
- 9. Attendance: 75% attendance is compulsory for appearing in the examination.
- 10. The Vice-Chancellor will appoint a Board of Moderators and all the examinations conducted and the results published will be under the Examination Board, Patna University.
- 11. Wherever this regulation is silent such matter will be governed by the regulation already existing.

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## REGULATIONS FOR POST-GRADUATE DIPLOMA COURSE IN WOMEN'S STUDIES

- 1. Admission to the course shall be open to candidates who posses Honours Graduate degree in any discipline or equivalent.
- 2. Admission to the Course shall be made on the basis of marks obtained at Graduation level and an interview conducted by the History Department.
- 3. The number of seats shall be 60 only.
- 4. The Reservation of seats belonging to various categories shall be as per Patna University/Bihar Government rules.

#### 5. CREDIT

The total minimum credits, required for completing a PG program is 100. The details of credits of individual components and individual courses are given in Table 1.

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Core Course (CC): A course which should compulsory be studied by a candidate as a core requirement on the basis of subject of Post-Graduate Diploma course and is termed as a Core course.

Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC): University will run a number of Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC) which is qualifying in nature and student from all faculties have to qualify in all courses.

Dissertation/Project & Field Work/internship/industrial Training: An elective course designed to acquire special/advanced knowledge, such as supplement 'study/support study to a project work and a candidate studies such a course on his own with an advisory support by a teacher / faculty member is called dissertation/project.

The final CGPA / class will be decided on the performance of the student in the 8 Core courses.

The two AECC courses will be qualifying in nature and a student has to score at least 45% marks in these courses. Grades will be awarded separately for these courses, however, performance in these courses will not be considered for awarding the final CGPA/class.

#### 6. Evaluation of Performance Under Semester System

The performance of a student in each paper will be assessed on the basis of a Continuous Internal Assessment (CIA) of 30 marks and the End of Semester Examination (ESE) consisting of 70 marks

(c) Syllabus for each paper shall be divided into at least 5 units. Based on this, the question paper pattern for the End Semester Examination shall be divided into three parts A, B, C comprising of objective type questions with multiple choice, short answer type questions and long answer type questions respectively as mentioned below:

  - iii. Environment and Sustainability and Swachchha Bharat Abhiyan Activities shall be assessed on the basis of a continuous Internal Assessment (CIA) of 50 marks and the End Semester Examination (ESE) consisting of 50 marks.

#### 7. Examinations:

- (a) Only a student registered with Patna University after admission in this course will be eligible for appearing in the examinations.
- (b) There shall be one annual examination at the end of the academic year but two periodical tests will be conducted for proper appraisal of student's progress and marks allotted therein will be aggregated marks obtained in Annual Examination.
- (c) Periodical tests will be conducted in the shape of seminar, group discussion, assignment and presentation.
- (d) There will be eight papers altogether. The first seven papers will be theory papers and the 8<sup>th</sup> paper will consist solely of Project and Field Work.

#### 8. Distribution of Marks

- (a) The split of marks shall be as follow:80 marks each theory paper plus 20 marks for periodical Tests.
- (b) Students will have to secure atleast 45% marks to pass the examination. A candidate securing 60% and above as aggregate marks will be awarded, a first class and those securing below 60% but above 45% will be awarded second class. Anybody securing 75% and above will be declared first class with distinction.

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
