ORDINANCE & REGULATIONS FOR THE BACHELOR OF COMPUTER APPLICATIONS

PROGRAMME UNDER CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM (C.B.C.S.)

IN THE FACULTY OF SCIENCE

ORDINANCE

- 1. The Under Graduate Degree Programme "Bachelor of Computer Applications" in the Faculty of Science shall be offered by the Patna University.
- 2. The Programme shall be of three years (Six Semesters) duration. The Bachelor of Computer Application shall be abbreviated as "BCA".
- 3. Admission to the BCA programme under the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) is open to candidates who have passed the intermediate examination of Bihar School Examination Board or equivalent examination offered by other approved Boards (CBSE/ICSE/other State Board) with at least 45% marks in aggregate at the qualifying examination with Mathematics or Statistics.
- 4. Admission to the first semester of the BCA programme shall be made on the basis of marks obtained by the candidate at the Common Admission Entrance Test (CAET) conducted by the University or marks obtained in +2 examinations as decided by the Academic Council of the University
- 5. The Admission Entrance Test Booklet will consist of 100 multiple choice type questions. The duration of the test shall be two hours. The booklet will consist of questions from General Knowledge, General Aptitude, Numerical Aptitude and Logical Reasoning.
- 6. The maximum number of seats for the Bachelor of Computer Applications shall be as follows:

Besides the above, there shall be five seats in each college under NRI Category The seats under NRI Category shall be considered as over and above the sanctioned strength.

Note: NRI/Foreign candidates shall have to submit their application form with the specific recommendation by the Ministry of External Affairs along with the copies of the document showing NRI status.

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7. Fee structure:

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Note:

- The revision of the fee structure may be made every 3rd year after seeking the approval of the statutory bodies of the University.
- 8. Reservation of seats for different categories of candidates shall be made as per rules of the Patna University applicable at the time of admission provided, they qualify for admission into Programme as required in clause-4 of this ordinance.
- 9. Seats left unfilled in any of the categories for reserved seats under clause-8 because of the fact that no eligible candidates are available shall be filled-up by following reservation procedure/rules strictly as per sections of the PU Act, 1976 (Amended up to date).
- 10. (a) No applicant shall be admitted who, in the opinion of the Vice Chancellor, should not be admitted in the best interest of the University.
 - (b) No applicant shall be admitted who has not applied for admission within the notified time, or who, on being selected for admission, does not get himself/herself enrolled within the specified time except when the delay is condoned by the Vice Chancellor.
- 11. Every candidate seeking admission to the Programme shall pay fee as prescribed from time to time by the University. The fee of the Programme shall be charged in full at the time of admission to the Programme.
- 12. The admission of any candidate admitted to Bachelor of Computer Applications (BCA) programme may be cancelled if it is found at any later point of time that any document submitted or statement made by him/her in his/her support of his/her admission to the Programme is forged (not genuine).
- 13. No candidate shall be allowed to register as a student in any other course leading to a Diploma or a Degree during the academic years of his/her study for the BCA programme.
- 14. The general superintendence and direction of the Programme shall be the responsibility of the Head of the Department.
- 15. If found guilty of gross misconduct, a student admitted to the Programme shall be expelled from Programme at any stage.
- 16. Any student who attended all courses/papers in a Semester as a regular student and sent up for the End Semester Examination (ESE) but fails to appear in the ESE shall have to appear in the subsequent forthcoming examination of a particular semester by paying the requisite examination fee.

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- 17. If a student has attendance less than 75% in any course/paper, then the candidate has to repeat the particular course/paper in the subsequent forthcoming examination by paying the proportionate fee of that semester as decided by University.
- 18. If a candidate has an attendance of 75% or more but fails in the CIA, in that case, the candidate has to appear for CIA in that particular course/paper in the subsequent forthcoming examination.
- 19. Every student should fill a registration form before the start of next semester.
- 20. Minor changes in the above ordinance may be made by the Academic Council if required in the interest of academics.
- 21. The general ordinance of Patna University shall cover any aspect not covered in the present ordinance.

22. The medium of instruction shall be English.

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REGULATIONS

1. General

1.1. This regulation shall be called the regulations for the Bachelor of Computer Applications programme of Patna University under the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) Curriculum.

2. Programme of Study

- 2.1 The Bachelor of Computer Applications (BCA) shall be a three-years full-time programme.
- 2.2 The University shall award the Bachelor Degree in the Faculty of Science as "Bachelor of Computer Applications (BCA)".
- 2.3 The Examination for the Bachelor of Computer Applications shall consist of Six Semesters.
- 2.4 The programme Bachelor of Computer Applications (BCA) shall consist of courses (papers) spread over six semesters (I, II, III, IV, V and VI) comprising CC-1 to CC-14, AECC-1, AECC-2, AEC-1/SEC-1, AEC-2/SEC-2, DSE-1 to DSE-4 or GE-1 to GE-4 (as per Table-2). The CGPA shall be awarded on the performance of the candidate on all courses/papers (CC, AECC, AEC/ SEC and DSE/ GE).
- 2.5 The syllabus of the programme may be revised as per the demand of different stakeholders by BOCS and duly approved by the Academic Council.
- 2.6 Course structure for the Bachelor of Computer Applications Programme is as per Table-2 spanning over six semesters.

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

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3. Evaluation of Performance Under C.B.C.S.

- 3.1 The performance of a student in each course /paper will be assessed on the basis of a Continuous Internal Assessment (CIA) and the End Semester Examination (ESE).
- 3.2 The University Examination of each course in all semesters shall have two components:
 - i. Continuous Internal Assessment (ClA) of CC, GE and DSE containing 30 marks
 - ii. Continuous Internal Assessment (CIA) of AECC and SEC containing 50 marks
 - iii. End Semester Examination (ESE) of CC, GE and DSE containing 70 marks.
 - iv. End Semester Examination (ESE) of AECC and SEC containing 50 marks.

- 3.2 The CIA component of the Examination shall be conducted in the Department under the concerned teacher of the course/paper and will be responsible for the submission of CIA after evaluation to the Head of the Department.
- 3.3 Only the End Semester Examination (ESE) of each semester shall be conducted by the University. The ESE of theory courses/papers shall be a written examination of 3 hours duration.
- 3.4 The fieldwork/project dissertation evaluation will be based on CIA and an end- semester examination wherever applicable.
- 3.5 All such examinations shall be as per the provisions of the Examination Board and Moderation Board of the University

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4. **Examinations**

4.1 The End-Semester Examination will be conducted by the University. The question paper of CC, GE and DSE shall consist of three parts-

Part .. A

Ten objective type Questions

10x2=20 marks

Part - B

Five Short Answer Ouestions

4x5=20 marks (Four to be answered)

Part -C

Five long answer Questions (three to be answered) 3x10=30 marks

The question paper of AECC and AEC/SEC shall consist of three parts-

Part - A

Ten objective type Questions

10x1=10 marks

Part - B

Five Short Answer Ouestions

4x4=16 marks (Four to be answered)

Part -C

Five long answer Questions (three to be answered) 3x08=24 marks

- 4.2 The examination of the I, III and V semester shall be generally held in November-December, and that of II and IV and VI Semester shall be held in May-June.
- 4.3 Paper Setting and evaluation: For ESE, the paper setting and evaluation will be done by concerned subject teachers.

5. Passing of Examinations and Promotion Rules:

- 5.1 There shall be no supplementary examination in any of the courses/papers in any semester (I, II, III, IV, V and VI).
- The candidates who have been admitted to the First Semester of a three-year 5.2 undergraduate Programme in a session can be placed in the following categories on the basis of their attendance and CIA in the Semester.
 - Those who have cleared the CIA and attended the required minimum percentage (75%) of attendance shall appear in the ESE.
 - Those who have not attended the required minimum percentage of attendance ii. (75%) and not cleared CIA shall in no case be permitted to appear in the End Semester Examination

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- 5.3 After appearing at the Semester Examination, the candidates can be placed in the following categories in the context of declaration of the results of the Semester Examination:
 - i. To be declared passed in End Semester Examination in any paper/course, a candidate must secure at least a 'P' grade as per Table-7 in each paper/course separately in CIA and ESE.
 - ii. A candidate may be promoted to next semester based on the following criteria as given in Table-6.

**Sent up for End Semester Examination here refers to those candidates who have a minimum of 75% attendance in each course/paper separately and cleared the CIA of respective course/paper conducted by the Department.

- iii. Candidates shall have to clear their backlog course/paper (s) in the subsequent end semester examination of that semester whenever it is available.
- iv. The Final result will be published only after he/she has cleared all 140 credits.
- v. The final result of the Bachelor of Computer Application shall be published on the basis of the candidate's performance in all courses spread over six semesters (Table-2).

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- vi. Since it is a continuous evaluation programme, a student shall be awarded

 Semester Grade Points (SGPA) at the and of the order of in the subsequent semesters till the fifth semester, and finally, in the sixth Semester the result will be awarded based on CGPA. No grade points will be awarded if there is any backlog present.
- A student has to score a minimum grade P in his/her CIA. Failing to secure minimum marks, he/she shall have to repeat the CIA along with the students of the same semester of the next academic session
- The promoted candidate/candidates will not be awarded any SGPA/CGPA till viii. he/she clears all the backlogs.
- ix. A promoted candidate, if he/she has passed in CIA but fails in ESE, he/she shall retain his/her CIA score and will reappear in the ESE only of the semester whenever available
- x. Students undertaking any UG course from SWAYAM as SEC or DSE shall be eligible for credit transfer if he/she gets a certificate for successful completion from SWAYAM.
- xi. The candidate must clear the programme within maximum of five years. Academic Council may give one additional year of relaxation in case of exceptional circumstances.

Note- Special Provision:

In case of serious health problems and other strictly unavoidable circumstances, relaxation in required attendance might be condoned up to a maximum 15%, and in no case, a leaning will be entitled to avail condonation beyond.

6. Improvement of Result:

If a candidate clears Semesters I, II, III, IV and V ESE, he/she may apply for the improvement of his/her result in a maximum of two courses/papers of the entire Programme. He/she can avail this facility only in theory papers. The better of the two results will be treated as the final result of candidates in those papers.

10. **Declaration of Result:**

The Teacher/Examination Department shall use the following grading system: Results in the form of grade points consequent upon evaluation will be awarded in the following two manners-

I. At the end of each semester which will be titled as Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA).

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11. At the end of the programme, which will be titled Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA). The explanations for the above manner of publishing results in the form of Grade points as per Table-7.

The grading system stated below shall be used at the time of preparation of the result of the candidates who appeared at the examination
