A one-day workshop on "**Driving Governance with Digital Tools and Technologies**" was successfully organized by the National Informatics Centre (NIC), Uttar Pradesh State Centre, under the able guidance of Shri Ashesh Kumar Agarwal, DDG & SIO, NIC UP and the aegis of the Ministry of Electronics & Information Technology (MeitY), Government of India, on September 4th, 2025, at Hotel Hilton Garden Inn, Gomti Nagar, Lucknow.

Sh. Inder Pal Singh Sethi, Deputy Director General, NIC New Delhi, in his address, emphasized NIC's national vision for digital governance and highlighted the importance of

secure, scalable, and citizen-focused ICT platforms in driving transparent and efficient administration.

NIC's long-standing efforts were greatly appreciated in providing secure, scalable, and citizen-centric digital platforms that continue to strengthen government operations.

Participants engaged in a series of highly informative technical sessions led by senior NIC experts from New Delhi and Telangana, who shared valuable insights on secure digital platforms, transaction analytics, collaborative tools, and cloud-based solutions designed to strengthen governance processes.

Gov.in Secure Intranet (https://govintranet.gov.in/)

Dr. Om Pradyumana Gupta, Director (IT), NIC Delhi, introduced Gov.in as a secure, robust,

unified intranet platform and specifically designed for Governmentto-Employee (G2E) services. Positioned as a single gateway for government officials across ministries departments, the platform provides seamless access to a wide range of applications that support the day-to-day operations of administrators.

A key highlight is the **utility**

dashboard, which integrates advanced tools such as Bhashini (for multilingual



translation), document summarization services, and workflow enablers that simplify the information management process for officials. The platform not only ensures confidentiality and secure communication but also enhances productivity by consolidating critical tools under one roof. Importantly, it is set to host GovIn GPT — India's own large language model designed to

facilitate official communications and provide conversational AI support within a secure government ecosystem.

eTaal (Electronic Transaction Aggregation and Analysis Layer) (https://etaal.gov.in/)

Dr. Ritesh K. Dwivedi, Joint Director (IT), NIC Delhi, demonstrated how *eTaal* aggregates and analyzes electronic transaction data across e-Governance services, offering real-time statistics that help monitor performance, assess service usage, and promote transparency. Uttar Pradesh currently ranks among the **top five performing states on the eTaal portal**, reflecting the state's extensive adoption of digital platforms for citizen service delivery. The presentation also sparked a productive discussion among participants, encouraging the addition of more departmental services to further strengthen Uttar Pradesh's digital governance footprint.

GovDrive (https://drive.gov.in/)

Shri Kundan Kumar, Joint Director (IT), NIC Delhi, presented GovDrive, a collaborative and

secure storage solution tailored for government use.

The platform provides controlled document management and sharing capabilities, enabling efficient interdepartmental coordination while maintaining high standards of data protection.



CollabFiles (https://collabfiles.gov.in/)

Ms. Y. Sreevani, Director (IT), NIC Telangana, showcased **CollabFiles**, an indigenous, webbased and cloud-enabled office suite developed by NIC to enable secure creation, sharing and real-time collaboration on documents, spreadsheets and presentations for government users. The platform enforces secure access via government Single-Sign-On (Parichay/JanParichay), ensuring only authorized officials (using their government IDs) can create, edit or share files — a crucial control for G2E environments.

CollabFiles' feature set directly addresses the day-to-day needs of officials: a web-based word processor and spreadsheet (with auto-save), synchronous and asynchronous collaborative editing, detailed version history (including intermediate revisions), the ability to protect sheets or selected ranges, and import/export to industry standard formats for portability. The live demonstration and Q&A underlined how CollabFiles integrates with other government systems (Sandes, DigiLocker, e-Office, NIC email, GovDrive), making it a secure, interoperable choice for inter-departmental collaboration and record-keeping.

The sessions highlighted practical applications of these digital tools, emphasizing their role in building a digitally empowered governance framework. The event concluded with acknowledgments to speakers and participants by Mr. Ajai Gopal Bhartariya, Sr. Director (IT) and ASIO (District), NIC-UP.

The workshop not only provided valuable exposure to advanced digital solutions but also reinforced NIC UP's commitment to fostering innovation and strengthening e-Governance in alignment with the Digital India vision.
