No. GSR/5 (Const/Art 309/96.—In exercise of the powers conferred by the provise to article 309 of the Constitution of India, the Governor of Haryana hereby makes the following rules regulating the recruitment and conditions of Service of persons appointed to the Haryana Environment Dipartment (Group D) Service, namely :-

PART I-GENERAL

Short title and commencement:

- 1. (1) These rules may be called the Haryana Environment, Department (Group D) Service Rules, 1998.
 - They shall come into force ion the date of their publication in the

Definitions:

- 2. In these rules, unless the context otherwise requires,--
 - "direct recruitment" means promotion from within the Service or by transfer of an official already in the service of the Government of India or any State Government; an appointment made otherwise than by
- (b) "Director" means the Director, Environment Department, Haryana;
- (c) 'Drawing and disbursing officer' means the Drawing and disbursing officer working as such in the Head office or field offices, as the
- "Employment/Exchange" means the Employment Exchange situated in
- (e) "Government" means the Haryana Government in the Administrative
- (f) "institution" means,-
 - (i) any institution established by law in force in the State of Haryana; or
 - (ii) any other institution recognised by the Government for the purp ose of
- (g) "Rajya Sainik Board" means the office of the Secretary Rajya Sainik

- (h) "Service" means the Haryana Environment Department (Group D) Service;
 - (i) "Secretary" means the Secretary to Government Haryana, Environment Department.

PART II—RECRUITMENT TO SERVICE

Number and character of posts;

3. The Service shall comprise the posts shown in Appendix A to these rules :

Provided that nothing in these rules shall affect the inherent right of Government to make additions to, or reductions in, the number of such posts or to create new posts with different designations and scales of pay, either permanently or temporarily.

Nationality, domicile and character of candidates appointed to Service.

- 4. (1) No person shall be appointed to any post in the Service, unless he is,-
 - (a) a citizen of India; or
 - (b) a subject of Nepal; or
 - (c) a subject of Bhutan; or
 - (d) a Tibetan refugee who came over to India before the 1st January, 1962, with the intention of permanently settling in India; or
 - (e) a person of Indian origin who has migrated from Pakistan, Burma, Sri Lanka or any of the East African countries of Kenya, Uganda, the United Republic of Tenzania (formerly Tanganyike and Zanzibar), Zambia, Malawi, Zaire and Ethopia with the intention of permanently settling in India:

Provided that a person belonging to any of the categories (b), (c), (d) or (e) shall be a person in whose favour a certificate of eligibility has been issued by the Government.

- (2) A person in whose case a certificate of eligibility is necessary may be admitted to an examination or interview conducted by the Commission but the offer of appointment may be given only after the necessary eligibility certificate has been issued to him by the Government.
- (3) No person shall be appointed to any post in the Service by direct recruitment, unless he produces a certificate of character from the Principal Academic Officer of the University, college, school or institution last attended, if any, and similar certificate from two other responsible persons, not being his relatives, who are well acquainted with him in his private life and are unconnected with his university, college, school or institution.

Age:

5. No. person shall be appointed to the post in the Service by direct recruitment who is less than seventeen years and more than 35 years of age on or before first day of the month next preceeding the last date of submissions of applications to the Commission.

ppointing Authority.

6. Appointment to the posts in the Service shall be made by the Director.

Jualifications.

7. No person shall be appointed to any post in Service unless he is in possession of qualifications and experience specified in column 3 of Appendix B to these rules in the case of direct recruitment and those specified in column 4 of the aforesaid Appendix in the case of appointment other than by direct recruitment:

Provided that in the case of direct recruitment the qualifications regarding experience shall be relaxable to the extent of 50 % at the discretion of the Commission in case of sufficient number of candidates belonging to Scheduled Castes, Backward Classes, other Backward (Classes, Ex-servicemen and Physically Handicapped categories, possessing the requisite experience, are not available to fill up the vacancies reserved for them, after recording reason for so doing in writing.

Disqualifications.

- 8. (1) No person,-
 - (a) who has entered into or contracted a marriage with a person having a spouse living; or
 - (b) who having a spouse living, has entered into or contracted a marriage with any person, shall be eligible for appointment to any post in the sevrice:

Provided that the Government, may if satisfied, that such marriage is permissible under the personal law applicable to such person and the other party to the marriage and there are other grounds for so doing, exempt any person from the operation of this rule.

Method of recruitment.

- 9. (1) Recruitment to the Service shall be made, --
- (a) in case of Bailiff,-
 - (i) by promotion from amongst Process Server; or
 - (ii) by transfer or deputation of any official already in the Service of any State Government or Government of India;
- (b) In case of Process Server,—
 - (i) 50% by promotion from amongst Group D employees, whose scale and responsibilty are less than there of Process Server; and
 - (ii) 50% by direct recruitment; or
 - (iii) by transfer or deputation of an official already in the Service of any State Government or the Government of India;
- (c) in case of Usher,-
 - (i) by direct recruitment; or

- (ii) by transfer or deputation of an official already in the service of any State Government or Government of India.
- (d) in the case of Orderly,-
 - (i) by direct recruitment; or
 - (ii) by transfer or deputation of any official already in the service of any State.

 Government or the Government of India;
- (e) in case of A peon,-
 - (i) by direct recruitment; or
 - (ii) by transfer or deputation of any official aheady in the service of any State
 Government or Government of India;
- (f) in case of chowkidar,-
 - (i) by direct recruitment; or
 - (ii) by transfer or deputation of an official already in the service of any State Government or Government of India;
- (g) (1) in case of sweeper,-
 - (i) by direct recruitment; or
 - (ii) by trasfer or deputation of an official already in the service of any State Government or Government of India;
- (2) All promotions shall be made on the seniority-cum-fitness basis and seniority alone shall not confer any right to such promotions.
 - (3) Unless otherwise provided, when any vacancy occurse or is about to occur in the Service, the appointing authority shall determined in what manner such vacancy shall be filled in.

Probation.

10 (1) Persons appointed to any post in the Service shall remain on probation for a period of two years, if appointed by direct recruitment, and one year if

Provided that; -

- (a) any period, after such appointment, spent on deputation on a corresponding or a higher post shall count towards the period of probation;
- (b) any period of work in equivalent or higher rank prior to appointment to any post in the Service, may, in the case of appointment by transfer, at the discretion of the appointing authority, be allowed to count towards the period of probation fixed under this rule,; and
- (c) any period of officiating appointment shall be reckoned as period spent on probation, but no person who has so officiated shall, on the completion of the prescribed period of probation, be entitled to be confirmed, unless he is appointed against a permanent vacancy.

If, in the opinion of the appointing authority, the work or conduct of a person during the period of probation is not satisfactory, it may

- (a) if such person is appointed by direct recruitment, dispense with his Services; and
- (b) if such person is appointed otherwise than by direct recruitment,—
 - (i) revertishm to his former post: or
 - (ii) deal with him in such other manner as the terms and conditions of the previous appointment permit.
- On the completion of the period of probation of a person, the appointing (3) authority may,
 - if his work or conduct has, in its opinion, been satisfactory,-(a)
 - (i) confirm such person from the date of his appointment, if appointed against a permanent vacancy; or
 - (ii) confirm such person from the date from which a permanent vacancy occurs, if appointed against a termporary vacancy; or
 - (iii) declare that he has completed his probation satisfactorily, if there is no permanent vacancy; or
 - (b) if his work or conduct has, in its opinion, been not satisfactory,--
 - recruitment, (i) dispense with his Service, if appointed by appointed otherwise, revert him to his former post or deal with him direct in such other manner as the terms and conditions appointment permit; or
 - (ii) extend his period of probation and thereafter pass such order, as it could have passed on the expiry of the first period of probation: Provided that the total period of probation including extension, if any, shall not exceed three years.

11. Seniority, inter se of members of the Service shall be determined by the Seniority. length of continuous Service on any post in the Service :

Provided that where there are different cadres in the Service, the shall be determined separately for each cadre :

Provided further that in the case of a member appointed by direct recruitment, the order of merit determined by the Commission shall not be disturbed in fixing the seniority :

Provided further that in the case of two or more members appointed on the same date, their seniority shall be determined as follows:-

(a) a member appointed by direct recruitment shall be senior to a member appointed by promotion or by transfer;

- a member appointed by promotion shall be senior to a member appointed by transfer;
- in the case of member appointed by promotion or by transfer, seniority of such members in shall be determined according to the seniority the appointments from which they were promoted or transferred; and
- in the case of members appointed by transfer from different cadres, their seniority shall be determined according to pay, preference being given to a member, who was drawing a higher rate of pay in his previous appointment and if the rates of pay drawn are also the same, then by the length of their service in the appointments and if the length of such service is also the same, the elder member shall be senior to the younger member.

Liability to serve:

- 12. (1) A member of the Service shall be liable to serve at any place, whether within or outside the State of Haryana, on being ordered so to do by the appointing authority.
 - (2) A member of the Service may also be deputed to serve as under :-
 - (i) a company, an association or a body of individuals whether incorporated or not, which is wholly or substantially owned or controlled by the State Government, a Municipal Corporation or a local authority or university within the State of Haryana; or
 - (ii) the Central Government or a company, an association or a body of individuals, whether incorporated or not, which is wholly on substantially owned or controlled by the Central Government; or
 - (iii) any other State Government, an international organisation, nomous body not controlled by the Government or a private body;
 - Provided that no member of the Service shall deputed to serve the Central or any other State Government or any organisation or body referred to in clause (ii) or clause (iii) except with his consent.

Pay, Leave, pension or other matters:

13. In respect of pay, leave, pension and all other matters, not expressely provided for in these rules, the members of the Service shall be governed by such rules and regulations as may have been, or may thereafter be, adopted or made by the competent authority under the Constitution of India or under any law for the being in force made by the State Legislature.

Discipline, Penalties and Appeals:

14 (1) In the matters relating to discipline, penalities and appeals, members of the Service shall be governed by the Haryana Civil Services (Punishment and Appeal) Rules, 1987, as amended from time to time:

Provided that the nature of penalities which may be imposed, the authority em powered to impose such penalties and appellate authority shall, subject to the provisions

of any law or rules made under article 309 of the Constitution of India, be such as are specified in Appendix C to these rules.

(2) The authority competent to pass an order under clause (c) or clause(d) of sub rule (1) of rule 9 of the Haryana Civil Services (Punishment and Appeal) Rules, 1987 and the appellate authority shall be as specified in Appendix D to these rules.

Vaccination:

15. Every member of the Service shall get himself vaccinated and revaccinated as and when the Government so direct by a special or general order.

Oath or allegiance;

16. Every member of the Service, unless he has already done so, shall be required to take the oath of allegiance to India and the Constitution of India as by law established.

Power of relaxation :

17. Where the Government is of the opinion that it is necessary or expedient to do so, it may, by order, for reasons to be recorded in writing, relax any of the provisions of these rules with respect to any class or category of persons.

Special provisions:

18. Notwithstanding any thing contained in these rules, the appointing authority may impose special terms and conditions in the order of appointment if it is deemed expedient to do so.

Reservations:

19. Nothing contained in these rules shall affect reservations and other concessions required to be provided for Scheduled Castes, Backward Classes, other Backward classes Ex-servicemen and Physically Handicapped persons or any other class or category of persons in accordance with the orders issued by the State Government in his regard, from time to time;

Provided that the total percentage of reservation so made shall not exceed 50% at any time.

Repeal and savings:

Any rule applicable to the Service and corresponding to any of these rules which is in force immediately before the commencement of these rules is hereby repealed.

Provided that any order made or action taken under the rules so repealed shall be deemed to have been made or taken under the corresponding provisions of these rules.
