KVS has embraced digital integration, with most of the classrooms equipped with Smart classrooms, making learning more engaging and meaningful. ## Record Revolution: Learn to Read and Read to Learn through AI initiative

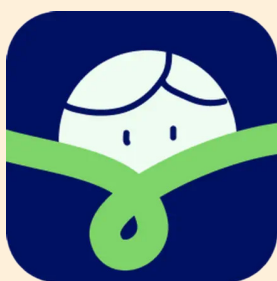
Kendriya Vidyalayas across India have achieved a record by completing Oral Proficiency Tests for 7.13 lakh students of Classes 3 to 8 between 14 February and 6 March 2025 using the TARA (Teacher's Assistant for Reading Assessment) app. The app records students' reading, analyses their pronunciation, fluency, modulation, and comprehension, and provides explicit indicators of their reading abilities.

Each student receives an individualized report card detailing metrics like WCPM (Words Correct Per Minute), errors, omissions, pauses, and suggestions for improvement, along with audio clips. Students are categorized into four proficiency levels and given QR-based practice materials for targeted learning.

Reading is a foundational skill that supports learning across subjects. While KVs have always promoted reading, assessing each student individually was challenging. To overcome this, KVS collaborated with IIT Mumbai to develop the TARA app, enabling effective reading

assessment and support at scale.

Efficient reading builds vocabulary, confidence, and comprehension—skills crucial for academic success and competency-based assessments. TARA is user-friendly, and previous implementations show teachers can easily record and upload student responses.



As the saying goes, "What is not measured cannot be managed." TARA provides detailed analysis for students, teachers, and educational administrators, helping monitor progress at all levels—class, school, region, and national. These insights inform focused interventions in language learning.

By engaging lakhs of students in guided reading improvement, TARA has become a game-changer in KVS, driving a silent revolution of confident young readers. With continued use and practice, this initiative promises lasting impact.

Transforming Education in KVS DCs' Conference

The Deputy Commissioners' Conference of Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan (KVS) is an important annual forum that fosters academic leadership, collaboration, and innovation across all Kendriya Vidyalayas. Rooted in the principles of review, analysis, implementation, and empowerment, the conference aligns academic planning with national priorities outlined in the National Education Policy (NEP) and National Curriculum Frameworks (NCFs).

The conference serves as a platform to review academic performance from the previous year, including classroom practices and student learning outcomes. It also sets the agenda for the current academic year by discussing targets, strategies, and best practices aimed at academic excellence.

This year's conference focused on academic outcomes in both Board and Non-Board classes. It reviewed findings from the Learners Achievement Tests (LAT) conducted for Grades 3, 5, and 8, and introduced a new initiative to promote reading fluency among students in Grades

3 to 8. The Oral Reading Fluency (ORF) programme, developed in collaboration with IIT Mumbai, aims to enhance reading skills in English and Hindi.

By equipping Deputy Commissioners and their academic teams with policy updates, tools, and a space for sharing innovations, the conference strengthens regional leadership in mentoring schools and supporting teachers. It promotes teacher autonomy, encourages remedial interventions, and recognizes school-level innovations to ensure inclusive and equitable education for all students.

During the conference held at IIT Mumbai, the Secretary of the Department of School Education and Literacy, Ministry of Education, interacted with the Deputy Commissioners and commended KVS for its consistent efforts in providing quality education across the country. He acknowledged the significant progress made and encouraged KVS to strive for even greater heights of academic excellence in the future.

**Fostering Teamwork and Ownership**

We began by building a culture of collaboration and shared decision-making. Regular staff meetings and open dialogue empowered every team member. The school's leadership aligned closely with NEP's vision of participative governance.

**Infrastructure Revival through NHPC Support**

With consistent help from NHPC, major upgrades were

made—classroom renovations, sanitation improvements, and campus beautification. These enhancements boosted morale and community perception, laying the foundation for growth.

**Reversing the Decline: A Remarkable Enrollment Boost**

One of our proudest achievements was reversing a worrying decline in student enrollment. Through a focused VMC meeting and continuous engagement with NHPC and local families, we rebuilt trust in the school's vision. This led to a 15%+ increase in admissions. Career counselling sessions were introduced to support holistic development as envisioned in NEP 2020.

**Inclusive Education for CwSN**

Special attention was given to Children With Special Needs (CwSN). Under the "Special Minds, Unique Paths" initiative, 28 students were tracked with tailored interventions. A Mobile Van, supported by NHPC, visits twice weekly with specialists. 25 students showed

significant improvement, highlighting the success of inclusive, structured support.

**Sports, Wellness, and Cleanliness**

We overcame geographic constraints to develop sports facilities—a cricket net, basketball, badminton courts, and indoor games. The "Dustbin-Free Classroom" campaign encouraged student-led cleanliness, promoting responsibility and environmental awareness.

**Strengthening the Foundation Years**

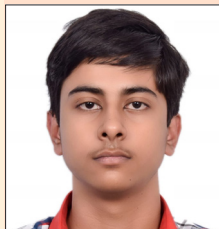
A key milestone was becoming the first project school in the KVS Gurugram Region to launch all three Balvatika classes, aligning perfectly with NEP's vision for foundational learning.

- Stick to NCERT and revise regularly
- Practice mock tests and analyse mistakes
- Stay consistent and calm
- Don't hesitate to ask doubts
- Trust your preparation and stay positive

I thank my school, teachers, Principal, and Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan for being the backbone of my success. KVS gave me the space and support to grow.

# Each One—Reach One

## Mentorship that's Changing Lives in KVs of Guwahati Region

*Over 2,000 struggling students mentored back to confidence and success  
A regional initiative that's inspiring Kendriya Vidyalayas Nationwide*

In a quiet yet transformative move, the Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan (KVS) Guwahati Region has launched a deeply human-centred initiative that is rewriting the educational journey for students who had once begun to slip through the cracks.

Titled “**Each One—Reach One**”, the programme is not a mass-scale mentoring scheme, but a focused intervention. It identifies students—right from **Balvatika to Class XII**—who are grappling with academic setbacks, emotional stress, or behavioural issues, and offers them personalised guidance by pairing them with a teacher or principal as a dedicated mentor.

### A Ray of Hope for Struggling Students

These are children who were often seen as underachievers, some had slipped into the background of busy classrooms, and others were labelled as inattentive, disruptive, or indifferent. Many were burdened by fear of failure, domestic challenges, emotional insecurity, or lack of motivation. Some feel abandoned or lonely; they suffer from anxiety or panic attacks. Recognising these invisible struggles, the Kendriya Vidyalayas of Guwahati Region undertook a soulful identification process. Children showing signs of academic decline, behavioral issues, or emotional withdrawal were brought under the nurturing scope of the Each One—Reach One initiative.

### Turning Points in Young Lives

In the academic year **2024–25**, out of **41,541** students enrolled in the Guwahati Region, **2,026** (5%) students were selected for mentorship—each receiving focused, consistent, and compassionate support from a teacher or principal committed to their holistic growth. An approach where every child feels seen, heard, valued and appreciated for what they are.

Through regular phone calls, classroom check-ins, motivational sessions, and even heartfelt home visits, mentors created a net of care and consistency. The intent was simple yet profound:

To ensure every child feels seen, supported, and capable of reclaiming their path to success and live their lives to the fullest.

### Transforming Challenges into Confidence

Common issues among the mentored students included poor academic performance, exam anxiety, low self-esteem, peer pressure, and emotional isolation. Through this



programme, they received:

- Support in closing learning gaps
- Help in developing communication and conceptual clarity
- Encouragement to set small, achievable goals
- Emotional reassurance and positive reinforcement (empowerment)
- Bond of love, light and connection

The impact has been profound. Among students from **Classes IX to XII**, the initiative has shown a **99.9% success rate**, measured through academic improvement, transformed behaviour, and enhanced classroom participation.

### Nationwide Inspiration

What began in the misty hills of the North-East Region has now caught national attention. Several other KVS Regions have initiated steps to replicate the **Each One—Reach One** model, seeing in it a scalable, sensitive way to support the students who need it most.

### Real Stories, Real Change

*“I had almost given up on myself after failing in two subjects,” said a **Class VIII** student. “But my mentor never gave up on me. I started trying again because someone believed I could.”*

*“This programme has taught me that behind every struggling child is a story—and sometimes, a simple conversation can be the start of a breakthrough,” shared a **TGT English**.*

### Mentoring the Mentors

To guide the guides, Guwahati Region has also initiated “**Mentors of Mentors**”, a support system where teachers are trained to mentor

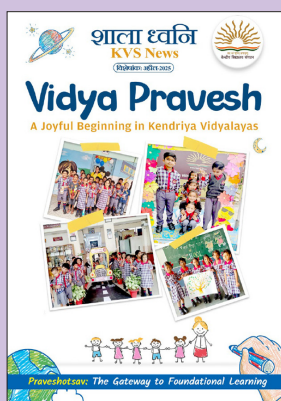
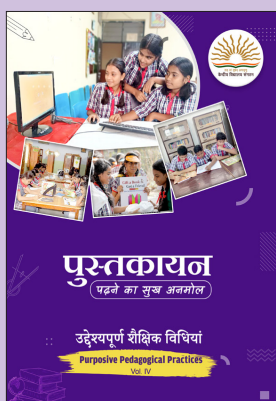
with SMART (Specific, Measurable, Achievable, Realistic, Time-bound) goals, empathy, and regular progress reviews.

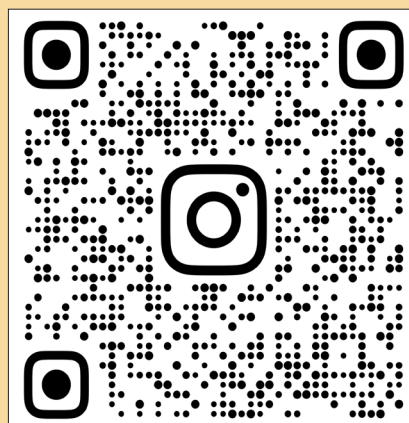

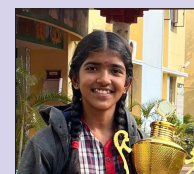
## Gold Medal in Taekwondo

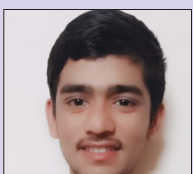
## Malaysia Calling

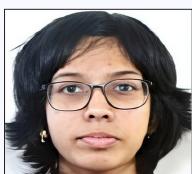
## Navani plants 257 saplings

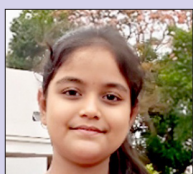
## Kripali in Japan
