Mission Karmayogi, launched by the Government of India, is a visionary programme that seeks to build a professional, citizen-focused workforce by equipping employees with the right skills and mindset. Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan, with its vast network of schools and staff, has embraced this initiative with commitment and scale.

In July and August 2025, KVS conducted large-scale behavioural training programmes under Mission Karmayogi. The journey began with four Lead Trainers, who were prepared by the Capacity Building Commission (CBC). These Lead Trainers trained 210 Master Trainers across the country. Through this cascade model, nearly 20,000 KVS employees, teachers, and non-teaching staff were trained in one-day sessions.

The programme went beyond professional skills and emphasised behavioural development, which is key to a positive work culture. Sessions focused on self-awareness, emotional intelligence, effective communication, teamwork, and service orientation. The aim was to inspire employees to move beyond routine processes and approach their work with empathy, responsibility, and a sense of public service.

'Karmayogi' is rooted in India's cultural ethos, where work is seen as worship. It reminds us that fulfilment comes from meaningful service done with devotion, rather than merely seeking results. In the field of education, this principle is especially powerful. Teaching is not just a profession but a noble calling that shapes future generations. True transformation in education will come not only through skill development but also through a shift in mindset, helping educators and staff see their work as service to society and the nation.

Alongside classroom sessions, employees were encouraged to register on the iGOT Karmayogi portal and complete six mandatory courses. This ensured that capacity building continues digitally, reaching all staff in a uniform and accessible way.

and nurturing a spirit of purpose and accountability, KVS is preparing its workforce to serve students and parents more effectively and contribute meaningfully to the vision of a future-ready India.

KVS follows a multi-tier competition framework, beginning at the Vidyalaya level and progressing through Sub-Regional, Regional, and National levels. The most talented Athletes are further selected to represent KVS in the National School Games Championships organised by the School Games Federation of

Under-19. These include athletics, swimming, archery, yoga, chess, boxing, judo, taekwondo, skating, shooting, rope skipping and racket sports, alongside team games such as kabaddi, kho-kho, cricket, football, hockey, basketball, volleyball, and handball. Both boys and girls are given equal opportunities, ensuring inclusivity and gender equity in line with NEP principles.

Story of Yuvraj Singh - World Champion in Mathematics

Yuvraj Singh, a talented student of Kendriya Vidyalaya, Sector 47, Chandigarh, has brought immense pride to the nation with his extraordinary achievements in Mathematics on international platforms. His journey reflects dedication, brilliance, and the power of guidance.

In September 2025, Yuvraj created history by winning the Gold Medal, Trophy, and the title of World Champion in Mathematics at the Global League of Winners Inc., held in Malaysia, from 30th August to 2nd September 2025. Competing among the world's finest young minds, his victory placed India firmly on the map of mathematical excellence.

Two months earlier, he had represented Team India at the Singapore International Mathematics Olympiad Challenge (SIMOC-2025). Out of 2,480

contestants from 34 countries, Yuvraj secured two Bronze Medals, achieving World Rank-3 in both the Country Team Round and the Individual Master Minds Global Final Round.

Since joining Kendriya Vidyalaya in 2021, Yuvraj has displayed remarkable consistency, analytical thinking, and problem-solving skills, nurtured by his teachers, the leadership of his Principal, and the support of his parents. His family believes that the perfect balance of school mentorship and home encouragement gave him the confidence to excel on the global stage.

The 38th Moscow International Book Fair (MIBF) was held from September 3 to 7, 2025, at the historic VDNKh exhibition grounds in Moscow. This year, India was the Guest of Honour, presenting over 2,500 books in multiple Indian languages,

including English, Hindi, Bengali, and Tamil, as well as Russian translations of children's books. The fair brought together more than 300 publishers and distributors from Russia and countries such as Belarus, Iran, China, the UAE, Saudi Arabia, and North Korea. The Indian Pavilion stood out with over 50 discussions and interactive sessions on themes ranging from technology and artificial intelligence to yoga, ayurveda, art, cinema, cuisine, and tourism. A meditation hall and cultural zones offered visitors a glimpse into India's diverse heritage.

Each evening, cultural performances at the India Pavilion drew large audiences, blending classical traditions with contemporary expressions. Writers, poets, scholars, and artists from both India and

Russia enriched the dialogue, while the fair also hosted readings, autograph sessions, and award ceremonies celebrating outstanding contributions to literature.

A key highlight was the focus on literary translation, with seminars addressing the challenges of bringing Russian literature into Indian languages and vice versa. Schools and libraries played an active role, emphasising literacy and digital learning.

For the teachers and students of Embassy of India School (KV) Moscow, the fair became a memorable learning experience. Visiting in groups across all five days, they immersed themselves in book readings, poetry recitations, discussions, and cultural showcases. The opportunity to interact with authors and experience India's vibrant presentations abroad left a lasting impression.

The MIBF not only reaffirmed the power of books to connect cultures but also celebrated the enduring bond between Indian and Russian literary traditions.

A Journey through Paper and Patterns: Reflections on the A4 Sheet Geometry Workshop

Recently, I had the chance to witness the beauty of mathematics closely during a six-day workshop: "The Adventures of A4 Sheet: Middle School Geometry with Paper Folding" at the Centre for Creative Learning,

IIT Gandhinagar, from 22nd to 27th July 2025, led by Professor Manish Jain. At the sessions, I was captivated by how ancient scholars used trigonometry and similarity to calculate the radii of the Earth and Moon. The discussion on honeybees and their hexagonal hives shows the connection between mathematics and nature.

The workshop delivered new ways for teaching, including paper folding, string art, flexagons, single-cut activities, tessellation and a session of GeoGebra made abstract ideas tangible. These hands-on activities made abstract concepts concrete, embodying the idea that "I hear and I forget, I see and I remember, I do and I understand," came alive in these moments. This aligns with NEP 2020's focus on experiential learning and NCF

2023's vision of hands-on, interdisciplinary approaches.

Students embraced these lessons with enthusiasm, creating Cartesian planes and exploring Thales' theorem through interactive models. Paper folding turned into art as they made butterflies, dolls, and snowflake patterns rich with symmetry. It shows that even a plain sheet of paper or a hands-on activity can spark questions and wonder.

Each lesson has become an adventure, showing that mathematics is more than numbers; it is a language that connects us to nature and creativity. This journey of learning continues one fold and one question at a time.

KVS Brings AI & ML to Classrooms

A Leap into the Future

Across Kendriya Vidyalayas, the classrooms buzzed with excitement as students of Class VIII took their first steps into the world of Artificial Intelligence and Machine Learning (AI/ML). What was previously considered cutting-edge technology has now been integrated into their daily learning experience, thanks to a groundbreaking initiative introduced under the PM SHRI Scheme in partnership with the National Institute of Electronics and Information Technology (NIELIT).

Learning beyond Textbooks

The program wasn't about memorising definitions; it was about doing, creating, and discovering. Over 37,792 students dived into a five-day, 30-hour workshop, where they explored coding and AI fundamentals, often using Python as their tool of imagination. Laptops and projectors replaced chalkboards, and classrooms turned into vibrant labs where curiosity ruled.

The journey didn't end there. On the sixth day, students stepped out of their Vidyalayas and into NIELIT Centres. There, they built simple AI/ML models, watched technology in action, and connected their classroom lessons to real-world possibilities. For many, it was the first time they truly saw how machines 'learn' and how technology shapes the world around them.

Confidence, Curiosity, and Certificates

- The outcomes were more than just academic. Students learned:
- A strong foundation in AI/ML concepts
 - Confidence to design and test simple models
 - Broader awareness of how AI is changing industries and daily life
 - Sharper critical thinking and creative problem-solving skills

The experience sparked new dreams; students spoke of becoming data scientists and creating apps to solve community problems. Teachers noted that even the quietest students found their voices during coding activities. At the end, digital certificates from NIELIT honoured their efforts.
