Editorial

Exams, Expectations and the Meaning of Success

As Pariksha Pe Charcha 2026 approaches, the nation once again turns its attention to an issue that quietly shapes millions of young lives every year—exam-related stress. Despite repeated conversations and awareness campaigns, reports of student suicides after board exam results, or from coaching hubs like Kota and premier institutions, continue to shock society. This raises a fundamental question: why are our students under such immense pressure?

One of the core reasons is the growing obsession with early and extraordinary success. Students and parents alike are constantly exposed to news stories of exceptionally high salary packages from institutions like IITs, IIMs, Harvard, and other global universities. These stories, often highlighted without adequate context, create a powerful illusion—that success must come early, be grand, and be measurable only in monetary terms. Young students in Classes X and XII are lured into this narrative at an age when they are still discovering their interests, strengths and limitations.

Parents, driven by genuine concern for their children's future, sometimes unknowingly add to this pressure. Comparisons with peers, societal expectations and fear of falling behind push them to demand outcomes without fully understanding the child's capacity, temperament or long-term happiness. Rarely do we pause to reflect on the actual lives of those who achieve such early success. Are they truly content? Are they emotionally fulfilled? Social media, with its curated images of foreign vacations and luxury lifestyles, is a poor measure of inner peace or family harmony.

This brings us to a deeper and more uncomfortable question: what is real success? In today's times, success is often defined as a high-paying job or business, a strong bank balance, a luxurious home, expensive cars and frequent foreign trips. While these are not inherently wrong, reducing success to only these markers is deeply problematic.

History offers us alternative and more meaningful definitions. Take the example of Swami Vivekananda. By modern standards, he had no conventional job, no wealth, no family life and no material possessions. Yet, society unanimously recognises him as one of the most successful and influential figures in Indian history. His success lay in his ideas, character, purpose and contribution to humanity. This contrast forces us to rethink our benchmarks.

It is precisely here that Pariksha Pe Charcha, initiated and led by Hon'ble Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi, plays a transformative role. Over the past nine years, this unique annual interaction has brought students, teachers and parents onto a common platform



to openly discuss exam stress, fear of failure and societal pressure. What appears to be a simple conversation is, in reality, a powerful intervention into the national mindset.

The Prime Minister's consistent engagement signals that examinations are important, but life is larger than marksheets. Gradually, positive changes are becoming visible—greater openness about mental health, a shift towards holistic education and growing acceptance that every child's journey is unique.

As we look ahead to Pariksha Pe Charcha 2026, the message is clear: exams should test knowledge, not break confidence; success should be meaningful, not merely material; and education must prepare students for life, not just for competition.

For Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan, education has always been about more than completing a syllabus. We believe that some lessons cannot be taught through textbooks or examinations. The PRERANA Programme of the Ministry of Education brings this idea to life across Kendriya Vidyalayas.

PRERANA, School of Experiential Learning, offers selected students of Classes IX to XII a week-long residential learning experience at Vadnagar, Gujarat, inspired by the vision of NEP 2020. Over 110 students from Kendriya Vidyalayas have already participated, supported by trained KV mentors and guardian teachers who guide students through dialogue, cultural immersion, and reflective practices.

The impact of PRERANA does not remain limited to Vadnagar. Kendriya Vidyalayas have carried their spirit back into their schools.



KVS has organized District-Level PRERANA Utsavs in several regions, including large-scale implementation across Tamil Nadu, ensuring that its values reach many more learners. Transformation Stories of KVs in Gurugram Region

Education, which shapes the future of the nation, flourishes best when society comes forward as an active stakeholder in its growth. The collective support of institutions and communities strengthens schools and enriches learning environments. In this context, Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) serves as a meaningful bridge through which societal resources and expertise are channelised for public good—going beyond compliance to create sustainable improvements in access, quality, and equity in education.



Infrastructure Reforms at PM SHRI Kendriya Vidyalaya Matanhel

With proactive efforts by PM SHRI KV Matanhel, District Jhajjar, Haryana, the vidyalaya witnessed a significant infrastructure upgradation under Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) initiatives during 2025. Jhajjar Power Limited (JPL), Village Khanpur, undertook comprehensive development works amounting to approximately ₹25 lakh, substantially strengthening student welfare and campus sustainability. Key interventions included the installation of a commercial RO water purification plant with a capacity of 1,000 litres per hour, a 2,000-litre water storage tank, four large water coolers, a 7.5 HP submersible pump, and a 1,600-foot-long water pipeline system. The initiative also focused on environmental enhancement through extensive landscaping, including the plantation of 250 saplings, grass carpeting across 91,000 square feet, and hedge plantation extending over 2,200 feet.

In a further major support, the Hon'ble Chief Minister of Haryana, Shri Nayab Singh Saini, gifted the vidyalaya a dedicated three-kilometre clean drinking water pipeline, completed free of cost in a record time of just 10 days—significantly strengthening the school's capacity to meet its clean drinking water requirements in a sustainable manner.



Sustainable Energy and Student-Centric Development at PM SHRI KV Rewari

With the proactive efforts of PM SHRI Kendriya Vidyalaya Rewari, the school infrastructure has been significantly upgraded under CSR initiatives. The project, undertaken by POSCO India Pvt. Ltd., Bawal, in collaboration with Toyota Boshoku, involved a total investment of approximately ₹53.50 lakh. Major interventions included the installation of 10 kW off-grid and 15 kW on-grid solar power systems, a 10 kVA inverter, and 15 solar streetlights, promoting clean energy use and reducing electricity costs. These initiatives not only enhance the reliability of the school's power supply but also align with national goals of renewable energy adoption and environmental sustainability.

Additional infrastructure upgrades included the installation of a stainless steel visitor shed at the main gate, covering of the open space in front of the office, renovation of the assembly stage and ground, upgradation of toilets, and installation of lighting on the basketball court. Complementing physical infrastructure, free JEE coaching classes are being conducted for students who are unable to afford private coaching, reinforcing the vidyalaya's commitment to equity, sustainability, and academic excellence.

'Kahani Se Kalam Tak': From Story to Script

In many classrooms, children speak fluently but hesitate when handed a pencil. Their thoughts are vivid, their stories animated, yet the page often remains blank. It is this quiet gap between voice and writing that 'Kahani Se Kalam Tak' seeks to address.

Introduced as an innovative pilot initiative by Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan, Ranchi Region, the programme focuses on strengthening foundational literacy among Class II learners. Rooted in the vision of NEP 2020 and the NIPUN Bharat Mission, and aligned with the NCF-FS 2022, it places the child and the learning process at the centre.

The approach is simple and deeply engaging. Children are being introduced to familiar stories from Panchatantra and Jataka traditions, which naturally draw them into listening and speaking. Storytelling and art integration are being used as key pedagogical tools, helping learners express ideas through discussion, drawing, and role play before moving towards reading and writing. Gradually,

students are transitioning from scribbling to writing four or five meaningful sentences with growing confidence.

The month-long programme, started from 16 January to 16



February 2026, currently engages 3,102 Class II students across 79 sections in 42 KVs of the Ranchi Region. Four stories, two in Hindi and two in English, are being explored over four weeks, with

structured classroom interactions spread across eight periods each week. The use of the mother tongue alongside Hindi and English ensures inclusive and confident participation.

Assessment in 'Kahani Se Kalam Tak' remains continuous and formative. Each child is developing a 'story portfolio' that captures progress from listening to independent writing. Parents are active partners, supporting storytelling at home and valuing early writing attempts. As the programme continues, it is steadily nurturing attentive listening, meaningful expression, and joyful engagement with language.

When Classrooms Met Code, and Curiosity Found a New Language

The room filled with the power of technology and curious minds; teenagers from 913 PM SHRI KVs, their eyes bright, handed tools that matched their ambitions and told to solve problems they cared about.

AI VidyaSetu 1.0, organised by IHFC (Technology Innovation Hub, IIT Delhi) in collaboration with KVS under the PM SHRI Scheme, aligned with NEP 2020 and the vision of Digital India and Viksit Bharat @2047. AI VidyaSetu opened doors for students of Classes VIII to XII to step into the world of Artificial Intelligence, Machine Learning, and App Development, not as spectators, but as creators.

AI VidyaSetu 1.0 was not just a hackathon. It was KVS asking its students a simple, brave question: *Can you use technology to change what needs changing?* And the students answered. **Loudly. Creatively. Fearlessly.**

The Numbers That Tell a Deeper Story
More than 17000 students formed 3652 teams. They weren't competing for medals. They were learning to think like builders, of apps, of solutions, of systems that might one day shape how India works. And behind every team stood a teacher, 1700 of them, guiding, mentoring, believing. Junior and Senior groups worked side by side, learning computational thinking, problem-solving, and teamwork,



discovering that technology is not only about machines, but about mindset.

From Bootcamps to Breakthroughs
The hackathon was conducted in both online and offline phases.

Online Phase
Bootcamps, assessments, advanced learning, and regional rounds shaped skills slowly and steadily.

National-level KVS Hackathon (Offline Phase)
As part of this initiative, a National-level KVS Hackathon was organised on 8th and 9th January 2026 at PM SHRI

Kendriya Vidyalaya No. 1, Delhi Cantt., New Delhi. 290 finalists from five zones stood not just with projects but with confidence on stage that tested their skill, imagination, collaboration, and teamwork.

Activities included:

- 8-hour coding challenge
- Team presentations before an expert jury
- Knowledge sessions by IIT professors and jury members
- Final presentations by winning teams
