

- (a) the details of sanctioned, working and vacant, teaching and non-teaching posts in Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan (KVS) as on February, 2025;
- (b) the number of contractual teachers included in the working strength of teaching staff under KVS as on February, 2025;
- (c) the details of appointments of permanent teaching and non-teaching staff under KVS from 2021-22 to February 2025 separately, year-wise; and
- (e) the details of the vacant posts for reserved categories as on date?

(a) to (e) Filling up of vacancies is a continuous process and efforts are made to fill up the vacancies as per the provisions of the relevant recruitment rules. Teachers are also engaged on contractual basis for temporary duration by Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan (KVS) to ensure that the teaching-learning process is not hampered. As per information received from KVS, the details of sanctioned, in-position and vacant posts of teaching and non-teaching staff in KVs across the country, as on 31.12.2024, are as under:

As on 31.12.2024, 6920 contractual teachers are engaged in KVs across the country.

As per information received from KVS, due to Covid-19 pandemic, no recruitment has been made in the year 2021-22 and 2022-23. Offer of appointments for 12867 posts (11733 teaching and 1134 non-teaching) were issued through Direct Recruitment during the year 2023-2024. Vacancies for teaching and non-teaching posts are reserved as per the Government of India instructions / guidelines for reservation.

(a) & (b) Opening of new Kendriya Vidyalayas (KVs) is a continuous process. KVs are opened primarily to cater to the educational needs of the wards of transferable Central Government Employees including Defence & Para-military personnel, Central Autonomous Bodies, Central Public Sector Undertakings (PSUs) and Central Institute of Higher Learning (IHL) by providing a common programme of education throughout the country. Proposals for opening of new KVs may be sponsored by Ministries or Departments of the Government of India / State Governments / Union Territories (UTs) Administrations, with commitment to provide requisite resources including land and temporary accommodation for setting up a new KV as per norms. The proposals are subject to approval of the competent authority as per extant procedures.

As per information received from Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan, no proposal for opening of a new KV at Patherkandi of Sribhumi district in Assam has been received by KVS from the concerned Ministry (Ministry of Home Affairs) / concerned State Government / district administrations. At present, 57 KVs including 01 KV at Sribhumi (erstwhile Karimganj) are functioning in the State of Assam.

(SHRI JAYANT CHAUDHARY)**

(a) to (d) Opening of new Kendriya Vidyalayas (KVs) is a continuous process. KVs are opened primarily to cater to the educational needs of the wards of transferable Central Government Employees including Defence & Para-military personnel, Central Autonomous Bodies, Central Public Sector Undertakings (PSUs) and Central Institute of Higher Learning (IHL) by providing a common programme of education throughout the country. Proposals for opening of new KVs may be sponsored by Ministries or Departments of the Government of India / State Governments / Union Territories (UTs) Administrations, with commitment to provide requisite resources including land and temporary accommodation for setting up a new KV as per norms. The proposals are subject to approval of the competent authority as per extant procedures. Presently, 67 (KVs) including 03 KVs in Mayurbhaj district are functional in the State of Odisha. As per information received from Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan (KVS), no feasible proposal, as per norms of KVS, has been received for opening of a new KV in District Mayurbhanj.

In addition, the Government of India has recently approved proposal for opening of 85 new KVs under Civil/Defence Sector across the country and expansion of 01 existing KV i.e. KV Shivamogga, District Shivamogga, Karnataka by adding 2 additional Sections in all the classes. These 85 new KVs include 08 KVs in Odisha namely Railway Tittlagarh (Bolangir), Patnagarh (Bolangir), Talcher (Angul), ITBP khurda (Khurda), Athmallik (Angul), Kuchinda (Sambalpur), Dhenkanal (Kamakhyanager) and Jeypore (Koraput).

- (b) the criteria for sanctioning new Kendriya Vidyalayas (KV) and Jawahar Navodaya Vidyalayas (JNV) for a State;
- (c) the number of newly sanctioned KVs and JNVs in the country, State-wise, during last five years;
- (d) whether it is a fact that despite being the third largest populous and most impoverished State, Bihar always gets overlooked as far as getting an adequate number of these Central Schools in the State is concerned; and
- (e) if so, the steps taken to open new KVs & JNVs in Bihar?

ANSWER

**MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF EDUCATION
(SHRI JAYANT CHAUDHARY)**

(a) & (b) Kendriya Vidyalayas (KVs) are opened primarily to cater to the educational needs of the wards of transferable Central Government Employees including Defence & Para-military personnel, Central Autonomous Bodies, Central Public Sector Undertakings (PSUs) and Central Institute of Higher Learning (IHL) by providing a common programme of education throughout the country. KVs provide quality education to the children admitted across the country including children from disadvantages groups admitted under Right to Education Act, 2005 and constitutional reservation norms.

The Navodaya Vidyalayas (NVs) provide good quality modern education including a strong component of culture, inculcation of values, awareness of the environment, adventure activities and physical education to the talented children predominantly from the rural areas without regard to their family's socio-economic condition.

The board results of the KVs and NVs have been much better than the average of Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE) affiliated schools.

Proposals for opening of new KVs may be sponsored by Ministries or Departments of the Government of India / State Governments / Union Territories (UTs) Administrations, with commitment to provide requisite resources including land and temporary accommodation for setting up a new KV as per norms. The proposals are subject to approval of the competent authority as per extant procedures. KVs are not opened on the criteria of State/UT/District/Parliamentary Constituency.

The Navodaya Vidyalaya Scheme envisages opening of one NV in each rural district of the country. Opening of new NVs is a continuous process which depends on the willingness of the concerned State Government/UT administration to make available requisite suitable land, free of cost, for construction of the permanent building and making available required temporary building, free of rent, to run the Vidyalaya till the permanent building is constructed. Sanction and opening of new NVs depends on approval by the competent authority as per extant procedures.

(c) As per information received from Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan (KVS) and Navodaya Vidyalaya Samiti (NVS), 97 new KVs (including one KV in Bihar) and expansion of one existing KV i.e. KV Shivamogga, District Shivamogga, Karnataka by adding 2 additional sections in all the classes and 28 NVs have been sanctioned/approved throughout the country during the last five academic years and current academic year. State/UT-wise details in respect of KVs and NVs are at Annexure-I and Annexure-II respectively.

(d) & (e) Kendriya Vidyalayas are opened as per norms detailed above. At present, 1253 KVs including 50 KVs in the state of Bihar, are functioning across the country. Further, in line with the Navodaya Vidyalaya Scheme, all the 38 districts of Bihar state have been covered under the Navodaya Vidyalaya Scheme and total 39 NVs have been sanctioned in the state of Bihar including one additional second NV in Gaya district (SC concentrated).

Will the Minister of *Education* be pleased to state:

- (a) the total number of teaching and non-teaching vacancies in the Central Government schools as of June 2025, State-wise;
- (b) the number of posts lying vacant for over one year;
- (c) the number of teacher recruitment drives conducted for the Central Government schools in the last three years; and
- (d) whether funds under Samagra Shiksha Abhiyaan (SSA) have been used for bridging gaps in access and infrastructure, if so, the details thereof?

**MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF EDUCATION
(SHRI JAYANT CHAUDHARY)**

(a) & (b) Central Government Schools namely Kendriya Vidyalayas (KVs) and Navodaya Vidyalayas (NVs) are under the Department of School Education and Literacy, Ministry of Education. State/UT-wise details of the total number of teaching and non-teaching vacancies in the KVs and NVs are at **Annexure-I**.

(c) Vacancies keep on arising due to opening of new KVs and NVs, retirement, resignation, promotion of employees, transfer, employees going on lien to another department and up-gradation of schools. Filling up of vacancies is a continuous process and efforts are made to fill up the vacancies as per the provisions of the relevant recruitment rules. Teachers are also engaged on contractual basis for temporary duration by Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan (KVS) and Navodaya Vidyalaya Samiti (NVS) to ensure that the teaching-learning process is not hampered.

As per information received from KVS, during the year 2022-23, KVS has conducted recruitment drive for filling up of total 17425 vacant posts (13411 posts through direct recruitment & 4014 posts through Limited Departmental Competitive Examination). Promotion was also carried out as per Recruitment Rules of KVS. Further, as per information received from NVS, during the year 2021-22, NVS conducted recruitment drive for filling up of total 2200 vacancies of teaching posts.

(d) The Department of School Education and Literacy is implementing Samagra Shiksha, an integrated scheme for school education since 2018-19 covering the entire gamut from pre-school to class XII. The scheme has been aligned with the recommendations of National Education Policy, 2020. Under the scheme, financial assistance is provided to the States/UTs for implementation of various interventions to bridge gaps in access and infrastructure in school education across the country. The details of funds approved for these interventions are at **Annexure- II**.

Proposals for opening of new KVs may be sponsored by Ministries or Departments of the Government of India / State Governments / Union Territories (UTs) Administrations, with commitment to provide requisite resources including land and temporary accommodation for setting up a new KV as per norms. The proposals are subject to approval of the competent authority as per extant procedures.

At present, 60 KVs are functional in the State of Maharashtra. These KVs are catering to the demand for affordable and quality CBSE education in the State.

Further, infrastructure development in KVs is a continuous process undertaken as per requirement and availability of resources. As per information received from KVS, at present, no significant infrastructure gaps have been reported in the KVs functioning in the State of Maharashtra.

Vacancies keep on arising due to opening of new KVs, retirement, resignation, promotion of employees, transfer, employees going on lien to another department and up-gradation of schools. Filling up of vacancies is a continuous process and efforts are made to fill up the vacancies as per the provisions of the relevant recruitment rules of KVS. Teachers are also engaged on contractual basis for temporary duration by KVS to ensure that the teaching-learning process is not hampered.

The district-wise details of existing KVs in Maharashtra, including enrolment capacity and teacher vacancies, are annexed.

Regional language in KVs in Tamil Nadu

Will the Minister of *Education* be pleased to state:

- (a) whether Government has examined concerns that many students born and raised in Tamil Nadu face academic barriers in Kendriya Vidyalayas where Tamil is not the medium of instruction;
- (b) if so, the details of consultations held by Government with parents, students and State authorities; and
- (c) the steps proposed to be taken by Government to address medium-of-instruction concerns and improve inclusivity for regional language learners in Kendriya Vidyalayas?

(SHRI JAYANT CHAUDHARY)**

(a) to (c) Kendriya Vidyalayas (KVs) are opened primarily to cater to the educational needs of the wards of transferable Central Government Employees including Defence & Para-Military personnel, Central Autonomous Bodies, Central Public Sector Undertakings (PSUs) and Central Institute of Higher Learning (IHL) by providing a common programme of education. KVs are following a common scheme of education as per its mandate, with common syllabus, text books and language so that the students are not inconvenienced when they move from one KV to the other when their parents are transferred.

As per information received from Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan, the medium of instruction in KVs is Hindi and English. Where required, KVs are instructed to engage regional language teachers to facilitate teaching-learning at the foundational stage. As per Article 112 of the Education Code of KVs, "additional arrangement for

teaching of the regional language/mother tongue shall be made, provided 15 or more students are willing to opt for the same". Temporary teachers are engaged to teach local/regional languages including Tamil, provided there is a demand and sufficient numbers of student are available. Teachers also adopt multilingual pedagogical practices to support students from diverse linguistic backgrounds.

Tamil is taught through the Tamil Virtual Academy (TVA), an autonomous organization under the Tamil Nadu State Government, in 44 out of 46 KVs of Tamil Nadu. In addition, 34 teachers have been appointed to teach Tamil across KVs in Tamil Nadu.
