- (d) whether the Government has issued any specific directives to State Governments to fill up these vacancies;
- (e) whether the Government has any mechanisms to ensure timely recruitment, Transparency and merit-based selection;
- (f) the steps being taken by the Government to fill up these vacant posts at the earliest; and
- (g) whether the Government has any timeline to fill these posts ?

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**STATEMENT REFERRED TO IN REPLY TO PARTS (a) TO (g) OF LOK SABHA STARRED QUESTION NO. 321 FOR REPLY ON 24<sup>TH</sup> MARCH, 2024 ASKED BY HON'BLE MEMBER OF PARLIAMENT SHRI NARESH GANPAT MHASKE AND SMT. SHAMBHAVI REGRADING "SHORTAGE OF TEACHERS".**

(a) to (g): Education being a subject in the Concurrent List of the Constitution, an overwhelming majority of the schools in the country comes under the administrative control of States/UTs. Therefore, the recruitment, service conditions and rational deployment of teachers come under the purview of the respective State governments/UT administrations. Further, recruitment is a continuous process and vacancies arise due to a number of factors like retirement, resignation, increased requirement of teachers because of the enhanced students' strength, etc. The data regarding the vacant posts of primary and secondary school teachers across the country, including the State of Maharashtra, are maintained by the respective States/UTs.

The Government through the Centrally Sponsored Scheme of Samagra Shiksha, provides financial assistance to the States and UTs to maintain appropriate Pupil-Teacher Ratio (PTR) for various levels of schooling, as per norms prescribed in the Right of Children to Free and Compulsory Education (RTE) Act, 2009, as amended from time to time.

Para 2.3 of the National Education Policy (NEP), 2020 has emphasized to ensure a pupil-teacher ratio (PTR) of under 30:1 in each school and a PTR of under 25:1 for areas having large numbers of socio-economically disadvantaged students. The PTR ratio of the country has improved from 27:1 as per the UDISE+ 2022-23 report to 25:1 as per the UDISE+ 2023-24 report.

The Government also requests States/UTs to fill vacant posts of teachers, from time to time, to ensure timely recruitment of teachers by adopting a transparent and merit-based process through autonomous teacher recruitment boards. In order to ensure merit/quality among teachers, the National Council for Teacher Education (NCTE) vide Gazette notification dated 23<sup>rd</sup> August, 2010, as amended from time to time, has laid down minimum qualification for a person to be eligible for appointment as a teacher.

The progress regarding filling up of teacher vacancies through a competitive selection examination conducted by States/UTs on a mission mode, with due care for consistency and sanctity and after a technology based comprehensive teacher requirement planning and forecasting exercise, is periodically reviewed through regular meetings with States/UTs as well as through advisories.

PROMOTION OF COMMERCE STREAM IN KVs

(a) to (c) Streams in class-XI/XII in the Kendriya Vidyalayas (KVs) are primarily decided by the students' choice and demand. If the enrolment of students in a particular stream is significantly low, the stream allocation in the Vidyalaya is realigned in the interest of the students and to ensure optimal utilization of resources.

As per the standing instructions in the Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan (KVS) Admission Guidelines, Class-XI KV students, who wish to pursue a particular stream, including Commerce and where the desired stream is not available, are permitted to take admission in a nearby KV offering that stream.

As per information received from KVS, Commerce stream has been opened in 33 KVs and closed in 19 KVs across the country during the last five years i.e. 2020-21 to 2024-25.

- (c) whether the Government proposes to establish any new Kendriya Vidyalaya or Navodaya Vidyalaya in the Salumbar district of Rajasthan;
- (d) if so, the details thereof and if not, the reasons therefor; and
- (e) the details of the procedure to establish new Kendriya Vidyalaya and Navodaya Vidyalaya?

- (a) At present, 78 Kendriya Vidyalayas (KVs) and 35 Navodaya Vidyalayas (NVs) are functional in the State of Rajasthan. Districts-wise details of KVs and NVs are at Annexure-I and Annexure-II respectively.
- (b) to (e) Opening of new KVs is a continuous process. KVs are opened primarily to cater to the educational needs of the wards of transferable Central Government Employees including Defence & Para-military personnel, Central Autonomous Bodies, Central Public Sector Undertakings (PSUs) and Central Institute of Higher Learning (IHL) by providing a common programme of education throughout the country. Proposals for opening of new KVs may be sponsored by Ministries or Departments of the Government of India / State Governments / Union Territories

(UTs) Administrations, with commitment to provide requisite resources including land and temporary accommodation for setting up a new KV as per norms. The proposals are subject to approval of the competent authority as per extant procedures. As per information received from Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan, no proposal has been received for opening of a new KV at Salumbar district of Rajasthan.

The Navodaya Vidyalaya Scheme envisages opening of one NV in each rural district of the country. Opening of new NVs is a continuous process, which depends on the willingness of the concerned State Government / UT administration to make available requisite suitable land, free of cost, for construction of the permanent building and making available required temporary building, free of rent, to run the Vidyalaya till the permanent building is constructed. Sanction and opening of new NVs depends on approval by the competent authority as per extant procedures.

(a) & (b) Opening of new Kendriya Vidyalayas (KVs) is a continuous process. KVs are opened primarily to cater to the educational needs of the wards of transferable Central Government Employees including Defence & Para-military personnel, Central Autonomous Bodies, Central Public Sector Undertakings (PSUs) and Central Institute of Higher Learning (IHL) by providing a common programme of education throughout the country. Proposals for opening of new KVs may be sponsored by Ministries or Departments of the Government of India / State Governments / Union Territories (UTs) Administrations, with commitment to provide requisite resources including land and temporary accommodation for setting up a new KV as per norms. The proposals are subject to approval of the competent authority as per extant procedures.

As per information received from Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan (KVS), 32 new KVs under Civil / Defence / Institute of Higher Learning / Project Sector have been opened throughout the country during the last two years and current year (i.e. 2023-24, 2024-25 and 2025-26). No new KV has been opened in the NCT of Delhi during the last two years and current year. However, at present, 46 KVs are functioning in the NCT of Delhi and one new KV (KV, Khajuri Khas) has been sanctioned in December, 2024 by the Government of India.

(a) & (b) The implementation of PM SHRI scheme started from the financial year 2023-24. The details of funds allocated and expenditure incurred under the scheme for the upgradation of the Kendriya Vidyalaya, Mau over the last two years are as follows:

As of now, no funds have been released under PM SHRI Scheme for the financial year 2025–26 for this vidyalaya.

(c) & (d) Few procedural lapses were identified during internal audit and were subsequently rectified and necessary steps were taken in accordance with the prescribed norms.

(e) As per information received from Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan (KVS), the internal audit of the funds released during the financial year 2023–24 was conducted in August, 2024.

(f) An amount of Rs. 388.10 lakh had been sanctioned for “Renovation and repair of school Building and upgradation of Residential quarters including internal electrical installation and fans etc.” from Government grant to KV, Mau.

There is no upgradation plan of this Vidyalaya under PM SHRI scheme, in the current financial year.

- (a) whether the Government has received proposals from the State Government of Maharashtra for setting up new Kendriya Vidyalayas (KVs) and Pradhan Mantri Schools for Rising India (PM SHRI) Schools and if so, the number of such proposals received, district-wise;
- (b) the present status of these proposals and timeline for their approval and implementation;
- (c) the number of Kendriya Vidyalayas and PM SHRI Schools currently operational in the State of Maharashtra;
- (d) the details of student enrolment, infrastructure availability, and faculty strength in these schools, district-wise;
- (e) whether there is a demand-supply gap in access to quality CBSE-affiliated central schools in rural and semi-urban areas of Maharashtra;
- (f) whether the Government has identified any new locations or backward districts in Maharashtra, particularly aspirational districts, for the establishment of new KVs or PM SHRI Schools; and
- (g) if so, the details thereof and the criteria used for such identification?

(a) & (b) Opening of new Kendriya Vidyalayas (KVs) is a continuous process. KVs are opened primarily to cater to the educational needs of the wards of transferable Central Government Employees including Defence & Para-military personnel, Central Autonomous Bodies, Central Public Sector Undertakings (PSUs) and Central Institute of Higher Learning (IHL) by providing a

common programme of education throughout the country. Proposals for opening of new KVs may be sponsored by Ministries or Departments of the Government of India / State Governments / Union Territories (UTs) Administrations, with commitment to provide requisite resources including land and temporary accommodation for setting up a new KV as per norms. The proposals are subject to approval of the competent authority as per extant procedures. As per information received from Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan (KVS), no feasible proposal, as per norms of KVS, for opening of new KV has been received by KVS from State Government of Maharashtra/District Administrations.

The Government of India has launched an online PM SHRI portal for Selection process of PM SHRI School through challenge mode. The portal is being opened phase wise by the Department of School Education & Literacy (DoSE&L), Ministry of Education (MoE), Government of India for those benchmark schools which can self-apply on PM SHRI Portal under the PM SHRI scheme in accordance with the prescribed guidelines. These benchmark schools from Maharashtra independently submit applications through this PM SHRI portal, in accordance with the prescribed guidelines of Government of India.

Selection of PM SHRI schools is through Challenge Mode wherein Schools compete for support to become exemplar schools. Selection is done through a three-stage process with definite time lines. The district-wise details of proposal received and schools selected under PM SHRI are at **Annexure-I**.

(c) Out of 60 KVs in the State of Maharashtra as on date, 52 KVs have been designated as PM SHRI KVs. Apart from these, 860 PM SHRI Schools have been selected from the State of Maharashtra.

(d) All KVs in the State of Maharashtra have sufficient infrastructure, basic amenities and ICT infrastructure, including smart classrooms, computer labs and internet connectivity, achieving 100% ICT saturation. District-wise details of student enrolment and teaching staff strength in KVs situated in Maharashtra (as on 31.03.2025) are at **Annexure – II** and that of other 860 PM SHRI Schools is at **Annexure – III**.

(e) to (g) Central Government Schools namely Kendriya Vidyalayas (KVs) and Navodaya Vidyalayas (NVs) are under the DoSE&L, MoE. These vidyalayas are affiliated to CBSE. In respect of KVS, KV Washim has been identified to be set up as PM SHRI KV school, which is located in Aspirational District-Washim in Maharashtra. The schools are selected through an online transparent 'Challenge Method'. KVs are not opened on the criteria of backward districts/aspirational district/State/UT etc.

As regards NVs, the Navodaya Vidyalaya Scheme envisages opening of one NV in each rural district of the country. Opening of new NVs is a continuous process, which depends on the willingness of the concerned State Government / UT administration to make available requisite suitable land, free of cost, for construction of the permanent building and making available required temporary building, free of rent, to run the vidyalaya till the permanent building is constructed. Sanction and opening of new NVs depends on approval by the competent authority as per extant procedures. As per the information received from Navodaya Vidyalaya Samiti, there are 34 functional NVs in the State of Maharashtra out of which, 05 NVs are in 04 Aspirational Districts namely Gadchiroli, Nandurbar, Osmanabad and Washim including an additional second NV in Nandurbar district (ST concentrated). All these NVs are PM SHRI schools.

All rural blocks across the state of Maharashtra have been covered under the PM SHRI scheme. Further, State has one PM SHRI school in each block of Aspirational District.

Selection of PM SHRI schools is through Challenge Mode wherein Schools compete for support to become exemplar schools. Selection is done through a three-stage process with definite time lines.

States/UTs are required to recommend the list of schools to the DoSE&L, MoE after district verification and an Expert committee headed by Secretary, DoSE&L, has been constituted to make the final school selection through Challenge method.

- (a) whether it is a fact that there are zero permanent Tamil language teachers appointed in Kendriya Vidyalayas (KVs) in Tamil Nadu;
- (b) if so, the reasons for such a glaring disparity, particularly when there are reportedly 86 permanent Hindi teachers and 65 permanent Sanskrit teachers posted in the same schools;
- (c) whether the Government considers this imbalance a violation of linguistic equality and the rights of Tamil-speaking students to receive education in their mother tongue, if so, the details thereof;
- (d) the details of steps being taken by the Government to ensure the immediate recruitment of permanent Tamil language teachers in Kendriya Vidyalayas in Tamil Nadu; and
- (e) whether the Government will formulate any policy to ensure equal representation of regional languages, especially Tamil, in central educational institutions in the country?

**ANSWER**

**MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF EDUCATION  
(SHRI JAYANT CHAUDHARY)**

(a) to (d) Kendriya Vidyalayas (KVs) primarily cater to students who are the wards of transferable Central Government employees who come from diverse linguistic backgrounds. Therefore, the medium of communication and instruction in KVs is Hindi and English. KVs being 'specified category' schools are mandated to provide uniform education to the wards of transferable Central Government employees across the country. Accordingly, the sanctioned post of language teachers in KVs are for Hindi, English, and Sanskrit languages.

However, the Article 112 of the Education Code of Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan (KVS) has provisions for teaching regional languages which provides for additional arrangement for teaching of the regional language/ mother tongue, provided 15 or more students are willing to opt for the same. For this, part-time contractual teachers are appointed.

Additionally, as approved by Board of Governors (BoG) of KVS, all KVs have been directed to engage local/regional language teachers on contractual basis on a need-based requirement to support children at the Foundational and Preparatory stages, especially when they face difficulties in understanding concepts taught in Hindi or English.

As per information received from KVS, Tamil is taught through the Tamil Virtual Academy (TVA), an autonomous organization under the Tamil Nadu State Government, in 40 out of 46 KVs of Tamil Nadu. In addition to this, contractual teachers are also engaged in 31 KVs to teach Tamil in physical mode.

(e) The National Education Policy, 2020 focuses on promotion of all Indian languages including Tamil. NEP 2020 provides, wherever possible, for medium of instruction to be in the home language/mother tongue/local language up to at least class 5 and preferably class 8. The policy also provides for making available quality text books in home language/mother tongue and encouraging teachers to use bilingual approach while teaching.

Government of India has established a separate institute namely Central Institute of Classical Tamil (CICT) at Chennai which works for the development and promotion of Classical Tamil. CICT conducts seminars, workshops, short term projects and translation of Tirukkural into Scheduled Languages and other languages for the promotion and development of Classical Tamil. CICT undertakes works for promotion of classical Tamil translation of available 41 Tamil Classical Texts into various languages. CICT has made Braille conversion of 41 classical texts enabling visually challenged to experience the ancient Tamil literature. CICT in collaboration with NCERT have launched PM e-vidya Tamil channel for the promotion of Tamil language.

KVs are opened primarily to cater to the educational needs of the wards of transferable Central Government Employees including Defence & Para-military personnel, Central Autonomous Bodies, Central Public Sector Undertakings (PSUs) and Central Institute of Higher Learning (IHL) by providing a common programme of education throughout the country. Proposals for opening of new KVs may be sponsored by Ministries or Departments of the Government of India / State Governments / Union Territories (UTs) Administrations, with commitment to provide requisite resources including land and temporary accommodation for setting up a new KV as per norms. The proposals are subject to approval of the competent authority as per extant procedures. KVs are not opened on the criteria of State/UT/District/Parliamentary Constituency/Backward area. At present, 22 KVs are functioning in Bundelkhand area.

(a) At present, 1280 Kendriya Vidyalayas (KVs) are functioning across the country including 37 KVs in the State of Andhra Pradesh, 125 KVs in the State of Uttar Pradesh, 41 KVs in the State of Jharkhand and 78 KVs in the State of Rajasthan. District-wise details of KVs in Rajasthan are at **Annexure-I**.

(b) & (c) Opening of new KVs is a continuous process. KVs are opened primarily to cater to the educational needs of the wards of transferable Central Government Employees including Defence & Para-military personnel, Central Autonomous Bodies, Central Public Sector Undertakings (PSUs) and Central Institute of Higher Learning (IHL) by providing a common programme of education throughout the country. Proposals for opening of new KVs may be sponsored by Ministries or Departments of the Government of India / State Governments / Union Territories (UTs) Administrations, with commitment to provide requisite resources including land and temporary accommodation for setting up a new KV as per norms. The proposals are subject to approval of the competent authority as per extant procedures. KVs are not opened on the criteria of State/ UT / Parliamentary Constituency/district.

The Government of India, in December 2024, has approved opening of 85 new KVs under Civil/Defence Sector across the country and expansion of one existing KV Shivamogga, Karnataka by adding 2 additional Sections in all the classes at an estimated amount of Rs. 5872.08 crore (approx.). This includes capital expenditure component of Rs. 2862.71 crore (approx.) and operational expenditure of Rs. 3009.37 crore (approx.). State/UT-wise list of these KVs is at **Annexure-II**.

Construction of permanent buildings for KVs is a continuous process, which depends upon identification of suitable land, completion of transfer / lease formalities in favour of Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan (KVS) by the sponsoring authorities, submission of drawings / estimates by construction agency, availability of funds and requisite approvals etc.

### EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

- ❖ The thrust of the question is to know that total number of Kendriya Vidyalayas (KVs) opened in the country, State-wise particularly in the States of Andhra Pradesh, Uttar Pradesh, Jharkhand and district-wise details of Rajasthan & whether the Government has any proposal to open/construct new KVs in the country, State-wise particularly in Andhra Pradesh, Godda Lok Sabha Constituency of Jharkhand, Bharatpur Lok Sabha Constituency and Sikri area of Dausa District of Rajasthan and Baghpat Lok Sabha Constituency of Uttar Pradesh, Mayiladuthurai Lok Sabha constituency of Tamil Nadu and if so, the details thereof;
- ❖ Proposals for opening of new KVs may be sponsored by Ministries or Departments of the Government of India / State Governments / Union Territories (UTs) Administrations, with commitment to provide requisite resources including land and temporary accommodation for setting up a new KV as per norms. The proposals are subject to approval of the competent authority.
- ❖ KVs are sanctioned on the basis of three mandatory criteria i.e. requisite extent of land (free of cost from the sponsoring authority), suitable rent free temporary accommodation and concentration of requisite number of Central Government Employees at the place of proposed new KV.
- ❖ After opening of new KV, it will start functioning in temporary building provided by sponsoring authorities till KVS constructs its own permanent school building on the land provided by sponsoring authorities.
- ❖ In consonance with the National Education Policy 2020, Balvatika (Pre-Primary) Classes are introduced in the existing infrastructure for children in the age groups of 3+, 4+ and 5+ respectively from the Academic Session 2022-23. Initially, one section in each Balvatika 1, 2 & 3 for the age groups 3+, 4+ and 5+ children was made functional in selected 50 KVs.
- ❖ During the Academic Session 2023-24, 450 selected KVs were approved to open Balvatika 3 for the age group 5+ years. At present, Balvatika 1, 2 & 3 are functioning in 62 KVs and Balvatika 3 in 443 KVs. Putting together, 505 KVs having Balvatika, are accommodating more than 23000 children during the academic session 2025-26. Jaadui Pitara and KVs developed TLM are being used for making learning joyful.
- ❖ At present 1283 KVs are there in the country including 03 abroad. State/UT-wise details are given at **Annexure-I**.

- ❖ In the State of Andhra Pradesh (37), Uttar Pradesh (125), Jharkhand (41) and Rajasthan (78) KVs are functioning. State-wise/District-wise details are annexed at **Annexure-II**.
- ❖ All the KVs are affiliated to the Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE).
- ❖ The norms prescribed for opening of new KVs under Civil/ Defence Sector are given at **Annexure-III**.
- ❖ KVS has 25 Regional Offices and 05 Zonal Institutes for Educational Training (ZIET) i.e. one each at Gwalior, Mumbai, Mysore, Bhubaneswar and Chandigarh.
- ❖ Out of the 13 KVs sanctioned in August, 2018, 10 KVs have been opened and made functional and remaining 03 are yet to be opened. i.e., Nawada, District Nawada, Bihar, Devkund, District-Aurangabad, Bihar and Banda, District-Banda, Uttar Pradesh as the sponsoring authority has not provided suitable land in favour of KVS. Details are given at **Annexure-IV**.
- ❖ Out of the 50 KVs sanctioned in March, 2019, 48 KVs have been opened and made functional. Remaining 02 are yet to be opened. Details are given at **Annexure-V**.
- ❖ Out of the 85 KVs sanctioned in December 2024, 23 KVs have been opened and made functional. Remaining 62 KVs are yet to be opened. Details are given at **Annexure-VI**.

### BRIEF NOTE OF KVS1

#### 1. INTRODUCTION

The Government of India approved the Scheme of KVs in November 1962 to provide educational facilities for the children of transferable Central Government/ Defence employees. Initially, 20 Regimental Schools in Defence Stations were taken over as Central Schools during the Academic Year 1963-64 and functioned as a unit (Central School Unit) of the Ministry of Education, Government of India. On 15.12.1965 it, was registered as Central Schools Organization as a Society and became an autonomous organization.

On 03.07.1967, the name of "Central School Organization" was changed to 'Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan' which took over the task of opening and managing the Central Schools, henceforth called Kendriya Vidyalayas.

As on 22.07.2025 there are 1283 KVs including three KVs functioning abroad at Kathmandu, Moscow and Tehran.

#### 2. OBJECTIVES:

The main objectives of KVs are as under:

- To cater to the educational needs of the children of transferable Central Government employees including Defence and Para-Military Personnel by providing a common programme of education
- To provide, establish, endow, maintain, control and manage schools, hereinafter called 'the Kendriya Vidyalayas' for the children of transferable employees of the Government of India, floating population and others including those living in remote and undeveloped locations of the country and to do all acts and things necessary for or conducive to the promotion of such schools.
- To pursue excellence and set pace in the field of school education;
- To initiate and promote experimentation and innovativeness in education in collaboration with other bodies like the CBSE, NCERT etc., and
- To develop the spirit of national integration and create a sense of 'Indianness' among children.

### 3. ADMINISTRATION

#### (a) Sangathan has 03 tier Management Structure:

- Headquarter, at New Delhi
- 25 Regional Offices, to manage schools put under their Administrative Control.
- Kendriya Vidyalayas, spread all over the country & abroad.

#### (b) Functioning of KVS:

KVS has its General Body called Sangathan comprising of 31 Members.  
The Board of Governors has 25 Members.

04 Standing Committees have been constituted to assist the BOG i.e. 1) Academic Advisory Committee 2) Finance Committee 3) Works Committee and 4) Establishment & Administration Committee.

The Minister of Education is ex-officio Chairman of the Sangathan. The policy and guidelines issued by the Sangathan and its Board of Governors are executed by the Commissioner who is the Executive Head of the Sangathan.

### 4. PROCESS/NORMS FOR OPENING OF KENDRIYA VIDYALAYAS UNDER CIVIL/ DEFENCE SECTOR

#### A. Sponsoring Authorities

Proposal for opening of new Kendriya Vidyalayas will be considered, if sponsored by (a) Ministries or Departments of the Govt. of India; (b) State Governments; (c) Union Territories Administration

#### B. Requirement of land

The requisite extent of land to be provided, free of cost, by the sponsoring authority is as under:-

The Sponsoring Authorities should make efforts to provide the desirable extent of land in case of land availability for creation of all sports and other infrastructural facilities and for future expansion of KV, since in the minimum extent of land norm as above, all these facilities may not be adequately created.

For KVs under Civil Sector sponsored by the State Governments, the proposals should be forwarded by the Principal Secretary / Secretary (Education) of respective State Governments **instead of the District Collectors**. Further, to support the development of students in the domain of games and sports, all sports facilities like football field, 400 meter running track etc. are required to be made available in some KVs for which State Govt. has to ensure that at least every third proposal sent by them fulfills the desirable extent of land norms in future. Water and electricity lines/ supply and approach road upto the site offered by sponsoring authority for construction of permanent school building will be provided by the sponsoring authority at their cost.

**C. Acceptance of land for Kendriya Vidyalayas on donation basis:**

KVS may accept the land on donation basis with the following provisions:

- a. The donor may donate land to the State Govt./District Administration who in turn will transfer the land to KVS on permanent grant basis.
- b. KVS shall fix one plaque inside the Kendriya Vidyalaya campus at appropriate place engraving the name of donor as a mark of memory.

**D. REQUIREMENT OF TEMPORARY ACCOMMODATION:**

The sponsoring authority is liable to provide suitable & sufficient rent-free temporary accommodation to run the classes. Preferably, the sponsoring authorities may provide **15 rooms** roughly of the size of 7m x 7m, which can accommodate at least 40 students per section. This accommodation is necessary to initially open the new Kendriya Vidyalaya and start classes I to V with **single section** each and also for the purpose of Principal room, staff room, Library room, Vidyalaya Office and accommodation for other miscellaneous activities of the Vidyalaya and for consequential growth for next 3-4 years.

The Sponsoring Authority shall also provide safety certificate of the temporary building provided by them annually.

The sponsoring authority will undertake repairs/maintenance of the temporary building at its own cost till the Kendriya Vidyalaya is shifted in the permanent school building constructed by KVS.

**E. Relaxations for LWE districts / Hill areas / NER.**

The Left Wing Extremism (LWE) affected districts, State of Jammu and Kashmir, Himachal Pradesh, Uttarakhand, North Eastern Region States including the State of Sikkim will be considered separately with relaxed norms as well as additional 10 grace points. The special provisions for these Districts /States are given hereunder:

**5. Opening of Kendriya Vidyalayas under Project Sector/ Institute of Higher Learning Sector.**

Proposals received from the Public Sector undertakings for opening Kendriya Vidyalaya in their campuses are considered on fulfillment of certain terms and conditions devised by KVS in the form of an MOU. The recurring and non-recurring expenditure including proportionate overhead charges and future development expenditure are met by the PSUs/ Institutes of Higher Learning besides providing of suitable and sufficient land, building, furniture, equipment and residential accommodation for the staff of the proposed K.V.

**6. Zonal Institute for Educational Training (ZIETs)**

KVS has 05 Zonal Institutes for Educational Training i.e. one each at Gwalior (MP), Mysore (Karnataka), Mumbai (Maharashtra) Chandigarh (UT) and Bhubaneswar, (Odisha). All these ZIETs are engaged in the conduct of In-service courses, Induction Courses and short duration workshops aimed at empowering the teaching and non-teaching staff.

**7. Admission in Kendriya Vidyalayas**

The admission in Kendriya Vidyalayas is regulated on certain guidelines duly approved by Board of Governors of KVS, according to which the following priorities shall be followed in granting admissions in KVs in the Defence/Civil Sector:-

1. Children of transferable and non-transferable central government employees and children of ex-servicemen.
2. Children of transferable and non-transferable employees of Autonomous Bodies/Public Sector Undertaking/Institute of Higher Learning of the Government of India.
3. Children of transferable and non-transferable State Government employees.
4. Children of transferable and non-transferable employees of Autonomous Bodies/ Public Sector Undertakings/Institute of Higher Learning of the State Governments.
5. Children from any other category i.e., all those not covered under any of the categories 1 to 4 listed above.

Note: Preference in Admission to wards will be granted based on the Number of transfers of the parents in the last 7 years.

No deviation from the aforesaid policy can be made in the matters of admission.

### 13. PM SHRI SCHEME:

Pradhan Mantri Schools for Rising India (PM-SHRI) Scheme is a Centrally Sponsored scheme announced in 2022 and aims to establish more than 14500 PM SHRI schools across the country with comprehensive, dedicated and inclusive interventions to promote holistic transformation at all levels, including equity, access, quality and inclusion.

913 KVs (In the first phase, a total of 730 KVs, second phase a total of 104, third phase a total of 30 KVs, fifth phase a total of 20 KVs) & in Seventh Phase, a total of 29 KVs have been declared as PM SHRI KVs working as the school of excellence as envisioned in NEP 2020. Efforts are being made to make them exemplar schools as envisioned in scheme document. The principals of these schools have been trained in developing the infrastructure and organize various training programmes for the betterment of the students.

All the 913 selected PM SHRI schools are registered on the School Innovation Council portal. The progress of monthly activities & expenditures are being monitored.

### 14. BALVATIKA:

In consonance with the National Education Policy 2020, Balvatika (Pre-Primary) Classes are introduced in the existing infrastructure for children in the age groups of 3+, 4+ and 5+ respectively from the Academic Session 2022-23. Initially, one section in each Balvatika 1, 2 & 3 for the age groups 3+, 4+ and 5+ children was made functional in selected 50 Kendriya Vidyalayas.

During the Academic Session 2023-24, 450 selected KVs were approved to open Balvatika 3 for the age group 5+ years. At present, Balvatika 1, 2 & 3 are functioning in 62 KVs and Balvatika 3 in 443 KVs. Putting together, 505 KVs having Balvatika, are accommodating more than 23000 children during the academic session 2025-26. Jaadui Pitara and KVs developed TLM are being used for making learning joyful.

As NEP-2020 recommends healthy pupil-teacher ratio at this stage, two ECCE trained teachers and one caregiver are engaged each of these classes as per recommendations of NCERT through contractual basis. Admissions in Balvatika are done as per the extant KVS Admission Guidelines with defined priority following reservations. Balvatika 3 students automatically get promoted to Class I. Duration of school timings are 4 hours per day on a five-day week basis followed in Balvatika classes. No specific uniform has been prescribed for these classes.

Further, Board of Governors of KVS has already approved opening of Balvatika in all KVs. PIB for Financial and Administrative approval for opening Balvatika in all Civil and Defence Sector KVs will be submitted to MoE after the recommendation/approval in BoG. In addition, request has been made Project sector KVs for opening of Balvatika classes.

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## PROBABLE QUESTIONS

**Q.1 What are the Mandatory provisions for opening of a new Kendriya Vidyalaya?**

**Ans.** The following are 03 mandatory provisions to examine any proposal for opening a new KV under Civil/ Defence Sector:

- I. Availability of unencumbered and suitable extent of land, free of cost, as per extant KVS norms.
- II. Availability of at least 500 employees of the transferable and non-transferable Central Government Employees including Defence and Para-Military personnel, Central autonomous Bodies/ Central PSUs/ Central Institutes of Higher Learning.
- III. Availability of rent free suitable temporary accommodation of 15 rooms as per KVS norms.

**Q.2 How many Kendriya Vidyalayas are functioning in the country?**

**Ans.** As on 21.07.2025, 1283 Kendriya Vidyalayas are functioning across the country including 03 abroad. Details are given at Annexure -I.

**Q.3 Are Kendriya Vidyalayas under Civil Sector opened /set up on the criteria of urban/semi-urban/ rural/ hilly/ metropolitan area/State-wise/District wise/tribal Area wise or Parliamentary Constituency-wise?**

**Ans.** No Sir. Kendriya Vidyalayas are not opened on the criteria of urban/semi-urban/ rural/ hilly/ metropolitan area/State-wise/District wise/Tribal Area wise or Parliamentary Constituency-wise.

**Q.4 How many Kendriya Vidyalayas are functioning in the State of Andhra Pradesh, Uttar Pradesh, Jharkhand & Rajasthan?**

**Ans.** There are 37 KVs are functioning in the state of Andhra Pradesh, 125 KVs are functioning in the State of Uttar Pradesh, 41 KVs are functioning in the State of Jharkhand & 78 Kendriya Vidyalayas functioning in the State of Rajasthan respectively. Details are given at Annexure -I.

**Q.5 How many new Kendriya Vidyalayas have lastly been sanctioned by the Govt./CCEA?**

**Ans.** 13 new KVs have been sanctioned by the Govt./CCEA in August, 2018, 50 new KVs have been sanctioned by the Govt./CCEA in March, 2019 and 85 new KVs have been sanctioned by the Govt./CCEA in December, 2024.

**Q.6 How many Kendriya Vidyalayas are functioning in permanent buildings particularly in the State of Andhra Pradesh, Uttar Pradesh, Jharkhand & Rajasthan as on date?**

**Ans.** As on 21.07.2025, 1094 Kendriya Vidyalayas (936 constructed by KVS and 158 under Project/IHL/KVs Abroad) are functioning in permanent building including 35 (32 Civil & Defence + 03 Project & IHL) Kendriya Vidyalayas in the State of Andhra Pradesh, 107 (94 Civil & Defence + 13 Project & IHL) Kendriya Vidyalayas in the State of Uttar Pradesh, 32 (27 Civil & Defence + 05 Project & IHL) Kendriya Vidyalayas in the State of Jharkhand & 72 (66 Civil & Defence + 06 Project & IHL) Kendriya Vidyalayas in the State of Rajasthan.

**Q.7 How many Kendriya Vidyalayas are functioning in temporary buildings and particularly in the State of Andhra Pradesh, Uttar Pradesh, Jharkhand & Rajasthan as on date:**

**Ans.** As on 21.07.2025, 189 Kendriya Vidyalayas are functioning in temporary building including 02 Kendriya Vidyalayas in the State of Andhra Pradesh, 18 Kendriya Vidyalayas in the State of Uttar Pradesh, 09 Kendriya Vidyalayas in the State of Jharkhand & 06 Kendriya Vidyalayas in the State of Rajasthan.

**Q.8 What is the unit cost of a school building?**

**Ans.** Current Unit Cost of School building (02 sections), 09-unit staff quarters, boundary wall, and campus development worked out to Rs. 33.43 Crore, based on CPWD Plinth Area Rates.

**Q.9 What are the conditions to be fulfilled by sponsoring authorities?**

**Ans.** It is the responsibility of sponsoring authority to transfer suitable land as per KVS norms free of cost on lease / permanent grant basis (ownership basis) for construction of school building, staff quarters Boundary wall, sports facilities etc. Till permanent school building is constructed by KVS, the sponsoring authority will have to provide structurally safe adequate rent free temporary accommodation to run the Vidyalaya.

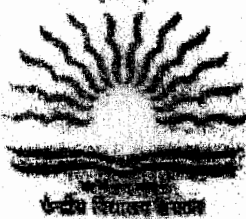

**OFFICE MEMORANDUM**

**Subject : Amendment in norms prescribed for opening of new Kendriya Vidyalayas under Civil/ Defence Sector.**

In pursuance of the decision taken by the Board of Governors (BoG) of KVS, in its 109<sup>th</sup> meeting held on 06.03.2018, the existing norms prescribed for opening of new Kendriya Vidyalaya under Civil / Defence Sector are amended to the extent as given hereunder:-

**1. Essential requirement for a new proposal for Kendriya Vidyalaya.**

The following essential requirements of KVS will have to be mandatorily fulfilled by the sponsoring authorities for establishment of new Kendriya Vidyalayas under Civil/ Defence Sector:-

(a) Availability of unencumbered and suitable extent of land, free of cost, as per the extant KVS norms.

(b) Availability of at least 500 employees of the transferable and non-transferable Central Govt. employees including Defence and Para Military Personnel, Central Autonomous Bodies/ Central PSUs / Central Institutes of Higher Learning.

(c) Availability of rent free suitable temporary accommodation as per KVS norms.

If a sponsoring authority fails to fulfil any of the three essential requirements as mentioned from (a) to (c) above, the proposal will not be processed further and will be awarded zero weightage.

**2. Relaxations for LWE districts / Hill areas / NEER**

The Left Wing Extremism (LWE) affected districts, State of Jammu and Kashmir, Himachal Pradesh, Uttarakhand, North Eastern Region States including the State of Sikkim will be considered separately with relaxed norms as well as additional 10 grace points. The special provisions for these Districts / States are given hereunder:-

**OFFICE MEMORANDUM**

**Subject: Revision of norms prescribed for opening of new Kendriya Vidyalayas under Civil/Defence Sector.**

Approval of the Board of Governors, KVS as accorded in its 106<sup>th</sup> meeting held on 15.11.2016, is hereby conveyed for modifications in the existing norms prescribed for opening of new Kendriya Vidyalayas under Civil/Defence Sector to the extent as given hereunder:-

**A. Sponsoring Authorities**

Proposal for opening of new Kendriya Vidyalayas will be considered, if sponsored by (a) Ministries or Departments of the Govt. of India; (b) State Governments; (c) Union Territories Administration

**B. Requirement of land**

The requisite extent of land to be provided, free of cost, by the sponsoring authority is as under:-

Sl. No.	Location	Minimum extent of land (Acres)	Desirable extent of land (Acres)
1	Metropolitan cities and Hyderabad & Bangalore	2.5	5
2	All other Locations.	5	10

The Sponsoring Authorities should make efforts to provide the desirable extent of land in case of land availability for creation of all sports and other infrastructural facilities and for future expansion of KV, since in the minimum extent of land norm as above, all these facilities may not be adequately created.

For State Sponsored KVs under Civil Sector, the proposals should come from State Govt. instead of from District Collectors. Also to ensure that some KVs develop all sports facilities like football field, 400 meter running track etc. the State Govt. will take care that at least every third proposal sent by them fulfils the desirable extent of land norms in future.

Water and electricity lines/ supply and approach road upto the site offered by sponsoring authority for construction of permanent school building will be provided by the sponsoring authority at their cost

C. Acceptance of land for Kendriya Vidyalayas on donation basis:-

KVS may accept the land on donation basis with the following provisions:

- a) The donor may donate land to the State Govt./District Administration who in turn will transfer the land to KVS on permanent grant basis.
- b) KVS shall fix one plaque inside the Kendriya Vidyalaya campus at appropriate place engraving the name of donor as a mark of memory.

D. REQUIREMENT OF TEMPORARY ACCOMMODATION:

The sponsoring authority is liable to provide suitable & sufficient rent free temporary accommodation to run the classes. Preferably, the sponsoring authorities may provide 15 rooms roughly of the size of 7m x 7m, which can accommodate at least 40 students per section. This accommodation is necessary to initially open the new Kendriya Vidyalaya and start classes I to V with single section each and also for the purpose of Principal room, staff room, Library room, Vidyalaya Office and accommodation for other miscellaneous activities of the Vidyalaya and for consequential growth for next 3-4 years.


The Sponsoring Authority shall also provide safety certificate of the temporary building provided by them annually.

The sponsoring authority will undertake repairs/maintenance of the temporary building at its own cost till the Kendriya Vidyalaya is shifted in the permanent school building constructed by KVS.

In all the proposals which have already become feasible and duly approved by the BOG, KVS, the land extent already offered by the concerned sponsoring authority will not be changed in view of this revision of land norms. The new proposals including the proposals which are under various stages of examination are to be examined with reference to the revised norms hereafter.

A set of revised formats (Annexure-I, II & III) after incorporating the amendments as approved by the Board of Governors, KVS, in its 105<sup>th</sup> meeting ibid, are being circulated separately.

This may be circulated by Secretary Education of States to all the District Collectors and by Deputy Commissioners, KVS Regional Offices to all Kendriya Vidyalayas functioning under their administrative jurisdiction and proposals for opening of new Kendriya Vidyalayas may be examined and submitted as per these revised norms. State Governments may submit their proposals through the concerned Regional Offices of KVS.

**ANNEXURE-I**

**NORMS FOR OPENING OF NEW KENDRIYA VIDYALAYA IN CIVIL SECTOR/DEFENCE SECTOR.**

1. (i). Proposal for opening of new Kendriya Vidyalaya is considered only if sponsored by one of the following:-
- (a) Ministries or Departments of the Govt. of India.
  - (b) State Governments.
  - (c) Union Territories Administration.
- (ii). Free of cost land defined as under:

(a) The Sponsoring Authorities should make efforts to provide the desirable extent of land in case of land availability for creation of all sports and other infrastructural facilities and for future expansion of KV, since in the minimum extent norm as above, all these facilities may not be adequately created.

For State Sponsored KVs under Civil Sector, the proposals should come from State Govt. instead of from District Collectors in future. Also to ensure that some KVs develop all sports facilities like football field, 400 meter running track etc. the State Govt. will take care that at least every third proposal sent by them fulfils the desirable extent of land norms in future.

(b) The Sponsoring Authority will be liable to identify and demarcate adequate and suitable land as per aforesaid norms. The identified and demarcated land will be required to be transferred in the name of new Kendriya Vidyalaya at the appropriate time either free of cost on permanent transfer basis or at nominal lease rent @ Rs.1/-per annum for 99 years. On receipt of approval of Govt. of India for opening of new Kendriya Vidyalayas under Civil/Defence Sector, the concerned sponsoring authority will be intimated about sanction of a new KV but necessary administrative orders for opening of the new Kendriya Vidyalaya will be issued only after the identified and demarcated land is transferred to KVS on lease or permanent transfer and its possession is also given to KVS. In case, the required extent of land is not transferred in favour of KVS within one year of intimation of sanction by KVS, then the said sanction of a new KV may be withdrawn and utilized for another suitable location. However, if the required extent of land is transferred within one year, then administrative orders for opening of the new Kendriya Vidyalaya will be issued immediately after transfer of land, and the new KV will be opened in the temporary accommodation provided by the sponsoring authority.

However, with respect to new KVs of Defence Sector, the one year norms may be relaxed on the merit of the case.

(c) Water and electricity supply upto the land offered, approach road to the land offered by sponsoring authority for construction of permanent school building will be provided by the sponsoring authority at their cost.

(iii) Acceptance of land for Kendriya Vidyalayas on donation basis:-

KVS may accept land on donation basis with the following provisions:-

- a) The donor may donate land to the State Govt./ District Administration who in turn will transfer the land to KVS on permanent transfer basis.
- b) KVS may fix one plaque inside the Kendriya Vidyalaya campus at appropriate place engraving the name of donor as a mark of memory.

(iv) (a) When there is a concentration of at least 500 employees of the Defence services including ex-servicemen or Para Military Forces or of Central Govt. or of the Govt. of India Undertakings individually or jointly at the proposed location/ station (Department / Organization wise number of such employees may be attached on a separate paper) (250 in the case of Special Focus Districts)

(b) When there is minimum potential enrolment of children of specified categories belonging to categories I to IV which may be 200 total or an average of 30 per class, whichever is more. (Para 4- Priorities for Admission- Annexure-II)

(v). When the sponsoring authority makes available, **free of rent** temporary accommodation consisting of 15 rooms of approximate 7m X 7m size to house the newly opened expanding Vidyalaya till the Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan constructs its own Vidyalaya building on the land provided by the sponsoring authority.

(vi) Provision of the residential accommodation to at least 50% of the staff should be made available by the sponsoring authority. The number of such residential units needs to be earmarked before the school is opened.

2. A new Kendriya Vidyalaya may be opened in the campus of a Govt. of India Public Sector Undertaking if it agrees to bear the recurring and non-recurring expenditure including 100% staff accommodation, land & school building and future development facilities as also the proportionate overhead charges on the proposed Vidyalaya provided the need for such a Vidyalaya is established with reference to the location and non-availability of alternate educational facilities.

3. A new Kendriya Vidyalaya may be opened in the campus of an Institution of Higher Learning of Govt. of India like IIT, CSIR Laboratories etc. on the same terms and conditions as stipulated in respect of Schools for Public Sector Undertaking.

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TERMS AND CONDITIONS FOR OPENING OF A KENDRIYA VIDYALAYA UNDER CIVIL SECTOR/DEFENCE SECTOR.

Note: Acceptance of terms and conditions by the sponsoring authority is a precondition to the opening of a new Kendriya Vidyalaya in the Civil/Defence Sector. The sponsoring authority is required to submit in quadruplicate, the acceptance and confirmation of the terms and conditions.

1. GENERAL

- a) The Sangathan does not take over an existing school.
- b) The Sangathan opens a new Kendriya Vidyalaya of its own in accordance with its own approved pattern of education.
- c) The Sangathan does not run KG classes.
- d) In no case the Sangathan will take the liability of appointing/absorbing any of an existing school staff in the service of the Sangathan. The existing staff members are, however, free to apply in response to the advertisement for various categories of posts, issued by the Sangathan from time to time and compete with outsiders.

2. (A) REQUIREMENT OF LAND :

A suitable piece of land, as prescribed under point 1(ii) of Annexure-I, will have to be provided free of cost or at nominal lease rent i.e. @ Re. 1/- per annum, for the construction of the permanent Vidyalaya building. A site plan of the land proposed to be provided should be attached. The demarcated land should be transferred to KVS prior to opening of a new Kendriya Vidyalaya as stated in Para-1(ii) to Para 1(b) of Annexure-I. This condition is mandatory before opening of a new Kendriya Vidyalaya. The sponsoring authority will also provide suitable temporary accommodation, free of rent, for running the school until the Sangathan is able to construct its own permanent Vidyalaya building on the land provided by the sponsoring authority. This period may be about 5 to 7 years after actual transfer of land to the Sangathan,

(B) REQUIREMENT OF TEMPORARY BUILDING FOR OPENING OF NEW KV:

(i) The sponsoring authority is liable to provide suitable & sufficient rent free temporary accommodation to run the classes. Preferably, the sponsoring authorities may provide 15 rooms roughly of the size of 7m x 7m, which can accommodate at least 40 students per section. This accommodation is necessary to initially open classes I to V with single section each for the purpose of Principal room, staff room, Library room, Vidyalaya Office and accommodation for other miscellaneous activities of the Vidyalaya and for consequential growth for next 3-4 years.

(iii) A sketch map of the proposed accommodation indicating the sizes of the rooms should be enclosed. Temporary accommodation once provided shall under no circumstances be withdrawn unless the Sangathan is satisfied with the alternative arrangements made in this regard by the sponsoring authority or until the Sangathan is able to construct its own building.

(iv) The Sponsoring Authority shall also provide safety certificate of the temporary building provided by them annually.

(v) The sponsoring authority will undertake repairs/maintenance of the temporary building at its own cost till the Kendriya Vidyalaya is shifted in the permanent school building constructed by KVS.

### 3. RESIDENTIAL ACCOMMODATION:

Residential accommodation to at least 50% of the staff posted in the proposed K.V. will have to be provided by the sponsoring authority on priority basis on the same terms and conditions as applicable to their own staff of corresponding status till KVS constructs its own staff quarters. The total number of such residential units will need to be earmarked before the school is opened.

### 4. PRIORITIES FOR ADMISSIONS:

The following priorities have been laid down for admission to the Kendriya Vidyalayas in the Defence/Civil Sector.

1. Children of transferable and non-transferable central government employees and children of ex- servicemen. This will also include children of foreign national officials, who come on deputation or transfer to India on invitation by Govt. of India.
2. Children of transferable and non-transferable employees of Autonomous Bodies/Public Sector Undertaking/Institute of Higher Learning of the Government of India.
3. Children of transferable and non-transferable State Government employees.
4. Children of transferable and non-transferable employees of Autonomous Bodies/ Public Sector Undertakings/Institute of Higher Learning of the State Governments.
5. Children from any other category including the children of foreign nationals who are located in India due to their work or for any personal reasons. The **Children of Foreign Nationals** would be considered only in case there are no Indian Nationals' waitlisted for admission.

Note: Preference in Admission to wards will be granted based on the number of transfers of the parents in the last 7 years.

No deviation from the aforesaid policy can be made in the matters of admission.

**NOTE:**

The Kendriya Vidyalaya will strictly follow the instructions issued from time to time by the Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan in regard to admission, fee structure, syllabus, medium of instruction, utilization of Vidyalaya Vikas Nidhi, text books, examination, promotion, norms for sanction of staff, teachers qualifications, their appointment, promotion, transfer etc.

5. **STAFF:**

The entire staff for the Vidyalaya will be appointed by the Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan in the scales of pay and on the terms and conditions prescribed by it from time to time.

6. **VIDYALAYA MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE:**

The Vidyalaya Management Committee will be constituted in accordance with the pattern prescribed by the Sangathan from time to time.

7. **AFFILIATION:**

The school will get itself affiliated to the Central Board of Secondary Education, New Delhi at the appropriate time.

8. **OTHERS:**

(A) In the event of violation of terms and conditions for running the Kendriya Vidyalaya by the sponsoring authority, the Sangathan will have the right to close down the Kendriya Vidyalaya and examine the disposal of assets and liabilities in consultation with the Government of India.

(B) Further, aforesaid terms and conditions are subject to modifications in the light of the directive of Board of Governors of KVS/ Government of India from time to time.

The terms and conditions as referred to above are accepted and confirmed.

(a) to (d) As per information received from Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan (KVS), Kendriya Vidyalaya (KV), Gopalganj was opened in the year 2004 in Civil Sector under the sponsorship of the State Government of Bihar and is running in temporary accommodation as the State Government could not provide suitable land for construction of permanent building as per KVS norms. After persistent persuasions and follow up with the State Government of Bihar at various levels by the Ministry of Education and KVS, the State Government of Bihar, vide order dated 29.07.2025, has now accorded approval for transfer of land measuring 4.63 acres in favour of KVS for construction of permanent school building of KV, Gopalganj.

Construction of permanent buildings for KVs is a continuous process, which depends upon identification of suitable land, completion of transfer / lease formalities in favour of KVS by the sponsoring authorities, submission of drawings / estimates by construction agency, availability of funds and requisite approvals etc.

Proposals for opening of new KVs may be sponsored by Ministries or Departments of the Government of India / State Governments / Union Territories (UTs) Administrations, with commitment to provide requisite resources including land and temporary accommodation for setting up a new KV as per norms. The proposals are subject to approval of the competent authority as per extant procedures. At present, 35 KVs are functional in the State of Haryana. As per information received from Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan, no proposal for establishment of a new KV at Pandupindara, District Jind, Haryana has been received from the State Government / District Administration.

Due to the closure of the NTPC, Badarpur unit in 2018, NTPC has expressed its inability to provide financial support for KV NTPC, Badarpur. The matter is sub-judice before the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi.

The vacancy positions of teaching and non-teaching staff in KVs located in the State of Bihar particularly in district Gopalganj, are as under:

(c) to (e) Filling up of vacancies is a continuous process and efforts are made to fill up the vacancies as per the provisions of the relevant recruitment rules. Vacancies keep on arising due to opening of new Kendriya Vidyalayas (KVs), retirement, resignation, promotion of employees, transfer, employees going on lien to another department and up-gradation of schools. Teachers are also engaged on contractual basis against sanctioned posts vacancies for temporary duration by KVS to ensure that the teaching-learning process is not hampered.

Recruitment for regular staff is conducted centrally by KVS, 12867 offers of appointments for various posts of teaching and non-teaching staff were issued through Direct Recruitment during mission recruitment from September, 2022 to 12.07.2025 by KVS to fill up the vacant posts across the country including in the State of Bihar. The reservation policy is implemented in KVS in accordance with the rules and guidelines of the Government of India.

(a) to (c) As per the information received from Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan (KVS), PM SHRI Kendriya Vidyalaya (KV), Ranaghat is a Civil Sector KV established in 2007 and later shifted to its permanent school building at the present location i.e. Kumarshatpur, Ranaghat, Nadia in May, 2015 with infrastructure in good condition.

KV, Ranaghat is operating classes I to XII in which 667 total students are enrolled. At present, the building of KV, Ranaghat consists of 14 classrooms accommodating the 14 functioning sections from Class-I to XII and has sufficient infrastructure to meet the current requirements of the school. As per existing norms of KVS, all KVs have approval for two sections per class. Normally, the number of sections in a KV is increased as per requirement and in phased manner.

Construction of infrastructure for KVs is a continuous process, which depends upon requirement, identification of suitable land, completion of transfer / lease formalities in favour of KVS by the sponsoring authorities, submission of drawings / estimates sponsoring agencies / State Government, submission of Drawings / Estimates by construction agency, availability of funds and requisite approvals, removal of shortcomings over land by sponsoring agency, etc.

### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

- The thrust of the question for enhancement of infrastructure and increase the number of sections/seats at PM SHRI Kendriya Vidyalaya Ranaghat, Kumarshatpur, Ranaghat, Nadia-741201 (West Bengal) in order to facilitate high enrolment position and the number of candidates seeking admission being more than the available seats.
- The proposal for opening of new section or increase of sections/seats at any Kendriya Vidyalaya is considered on the basis of assessment of: a) Demand for admission as per previous/present year waiting list for category -I/II/III & IV. b) Availability of Rooms/Infrastructure and other amenities. c) Recommendation of Chairman, Vidyalaya Management Committee, Kendriya Vidyalaya. d) Finally, recommendation of Deputy Commissioner, KVS Regional Office concerned are required.
- Over the years and at different points of time and as per the decision of the competent authority of KVS, newly sanctioned KVs were opened in single section as per enrolment at that time and accordingly, single section building (A-1 Type single section) was constructed. PM SHRI Kendriya Vidyalaya, Ranaghat is also one of such cases.
- Proposals for opening of new KVs may be sponsored by Ministries or Departments of the Government of India / State Governments / Union Territories (UTs) Administrations, with commitment to provide requisite resources including land and temporary accommodation for setting up a new KV as per norms. The proposals are subject to approval of the competent authority.
- KVs are sanctioned on the basis of three mandatory criteria i.e., requisite extent of land (free of cost from the sponsoring authority), suitable rent-free temporary accommodation and concentration of requisite number of Central Government Employees at the place of proposed new KV.
- After opening of new Kendriya Vidyalaya, it will start functioning in temporary building provided by sponsoring authorities till KVS constructs its own permanent school building on the land provided by sponsoring authorities.
- In consonance with the National Education Policy 2020, Balvatika (Pre-Primary) Classes are introduced in the existing infrastructure for children in the age groups of 3+, 4+ and 5+ respectively from the Academic Session 2022-23. Initially, one section in each Balvatika 1, 2 & 3 for the age groups 3+, 4+ and 5+ children was made functional in selected 50 Kendriya Vidyalayas.

- During the Academic Session 2023-24, 450 selected KVs were approved to open Balvatika 3 for the age group 5+ years. At present, Balvatika 1, 2 & 3 are functioning in 62 KVs and Balvatika 3 in 443 KVs. Putting together, 505 KVs having Balvatika, are accommodating more than 23000 children during the academic session 2025-26. Jaadui Pitara and KVs developed TLM are being used for making learning joyful.
- At present 1285 Kendriya Vidyalayas are there in the country including 03 abroad. State/UT-wise details are given at **Annexure-I**.
- There are 62 KVs functional in the State of West Bengal. Details are given at **Annexure-II**.
- All the KVs are affiliated to the Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE).
- 89 KVs opened & operational during last five years (i.e. 2019-20 to 2024-25) & current year (i.e. 2025-26). Details are at **Annexure- III**.
- The norms prescribed for opening of new Kendriya Vidyalayas under Civil/ Defence Sector are given at **Annexure-IV**.
- KVS has 25 Regional Offices and 05 Zonal Institutes for Educational Training (ZIET) i.e. one each at Gwalior, Mumbai, Mysore, Bhubaneswar and Chandigarh.
- Out of the 13 KVs sanctioned in August, 2018, 10 KVs have been opened and made functional and remaining 03 are yet to be opened. i.e., Nawada, District Nawada, Bihar, Devkund, District-Aurangabad, Bihar and Banda, District-Banda, Uttar Pradesh as the sponsoring authority has not provided suitable land in favour of KVS. Details given at **Annexure-V**.
- Out of the 50 KVs sanctioned in March, 2019, 48 Kendriya Vidyalayas have been opened and made functional. Remaining 02 are yet to be opened. 01 KV Anantnag, J&K was opened and made functional in 2003-04. Currently, the same is non-functional since 08.12.2020 due to unsafe temporary accommodation. Details are given at **Annexure-VI**.
- Out of the 85 KVs sanctioned in December 2024, 25 Kendriya Vidyalayas have been opened and made functional. Remaining 60 KVs are yet to be opened. Details are given at **Annexure VII**.

**BRIEF NOTE OF KVS**

**1. INTRODUCTION**

The Government of India approved the Scheme of Kendriya Vidyalayas in November 1962 to provide educational facilities for the children of transferable Central Government/Defence employees. Initially, 20 Regimental Schools in Defence Stations were taken over as Central Schools during the Academic Year 1963-64 and functioned as a unit (Central School Unit) of the Ministry of Education, Government of India. On 15.12.1965 it, was registered as Central Schools Organization as a Society and became an autonomous organization.

On 03.07.1967, the name of "Central School Organization" was changed to 'Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan' which took over the task of opening and managing the Central Schools, henceforth called Kendriya Vidyalayas.

As on **10.08.2025** there are **1285** Kendriya Vidyalayas including three Kendriya Vidyalayas functioning abroad at Kathmandu, Moscow and Tehran.

**2. OBJECTIVES:**

The main objectives of Kendriya Vidyalayas are as under:

- To cater to the educational needs of the children of transferable Central Government employees including Defence and Para-Military Personnel by providing a common programme of education
- To provide, establish, endow, maintain, control and manage schools, hereinafter called 'the Kendriya Vidyalayas' for the children of transferable employees of the Government of India, floating population and others including those living in remote and undeveloped locations of the country and to do all acts and things necessary for or conducive to the promotion of such schools.
- To pursue excellence and set pace in the field of school education;
- To initiate and promote experimentation and innovativeness in education in collaboration with other bodies like the CBSE, NCERT etc., and
- To develop the spirit of national integration and create a sense of 'Indianness' among children.

### 3. ADMINISTRATION

#### (a) Sangathan has 03 tier Management Structure:-

- Headquarter, at New Delhi
- 25 Regional Offices, to manage schools put under their Administrative Control.
- Kendriya Vidyalayas, spread all over the country & abroad.

#### (b) Functioning of KVS:-

- KVS has its General Body called Sangathan comprising of 31 Members.
- The Board of Governors has 25 Members.
- 04 Standing Committees have been constituted to assist the BOG i.e. 1) Academic Advisory Committee 2) Finance Committee 3) Works Committee and 4) Establishment & Administration Committee.

The Minister of Education is ex-officio Chairman of the Sangathan. The policy and guidelines issued by the Sangathan and its Board of Governors are executed by the Commissioner who is the Executive Head of the Sangathan.

### 4. PROCESS/NORMS FOR OPENING OF KENDRIYA VIDYALAYAS UNDER CIVIL/DEFENCE SECTOR

#### A. Sponsoring Authorities

Proposal for opening of new Kendriya Vidyalayas will be considered, if sponsored by (a) Ministries or Departments of the Govt. of India; (b) State Governments; (c) Union Territories Administration

#### B. Requirement of land

The requisite extent of land to be provided, free of cost, by the sponsoring authority is as under:-

**Construction of New Building of Kendriya Vidyalaya, Damoh**

- (a) whether the Government is aware that the construction of new building of Kendriya Vidyalaya at Hatta in Damoh Lok Sabha Constituency has been done through NPCCL;
- (b) if so, whether said construction work has been completed within the stipulated time-frame along with the details thereof;
- (c) if not, the reasons therefor;
- (d) whether the Government has fixed any accountability for the delay; and
- (e) whether the Government proposes to take an action in this regard?

(a) to (e) As per the information received from Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan (KVS), the Government construction agency NPCCL has completed the construction of the permanent school building of Kendriya Vidyalaya (KV), Hatta Nagar in Damoh Lok Sabha Constituency and accordingly KV Hatta Nagar, Damoh, which was functioning in temporary accommodation was shifted to the said newly constructed permanent building in December, 2024.

Construction of infrastructure for KVs is a continuous process, which depends upon requirement, identification of suitable land, completion of transfer / lease formalities in favour of KVS by the sponsoring authorities, submission of Drawings / Estimates by construction agency, availability of funds and requisite approvals, removal of shortcomings over land by sponsoring agency, etc.

Construction works are monitored at the Vidyalaya level by the Vidyalaya Management Committee followed by review meetings with construction agencies at the KVS Regional Office and KVS (HQ) levels along with a four-stage Third-Party Quality Assurance conducted by the Indian Institutes of Technology.

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For KVs under Civil Sector sponsored by the State Governments, the proposals should be forwarded by the Principal Secretary / Secretary (Education) of respective State Governments **instead of the District Collectors**. Further, to support the development of students in the domain of games and sports, all sports facilities like football field, 400 meter running track etc. are required to be made available in some KVs for which State Govt. has to ensure that at least every third proposal sent by them fulfills the desirable extent of land norms in future. Water and electricity lines/ supply and approach road upto the site offered by sponsoring authority for construction of permanent school building will be provided by the sponsoring authority at their cost.

**C. Acceptance of land for Kendriya Vidyalayas on donation basis:-** KVS may accept the land on donation basis with the following provisions:-

- a. The donor may donate land to the State Govt./District Administration who in turn will transfer the land to KVS on permanent grant basis.
- b. KVS shall fix one plaque inside the Kendriya Vidyalaya campus at appropriate place engraving the name of donor as a mark of memory.

**D. REQUIREMENT OF TEMPORARY ACCOMMODATION:**

The sponsoring authority is liable to provide suitable & sufficient rent-free temporary accommodation to run the classes. Preferably, the sponsoring authorities may provide **15 rooms** roughly of the size of 7m x 7m, which can accommodate at least 40 students per section. This accommodation is necessary to initially open the new Kendriya Vidyalaya and start classes I to V with **single section** each and also for the purpose of Principal room, staff room, Library room, Vidyalaya Office and accommodation for other miscellaneous activities of the Vidyalaya and for consequential growth for next 3-4 years.

The Sponsoring Authority shall also provide safety certificate of the temporary building provided by them annually.

The sponsoring authority will undertake repairs/maintenance of the temporary building at its own cost till the Kendriya Vidyalaya is shifted in the permanent school building constructed by KVS.

**E. Relaxations for LWE districts / Hill areas / NER.**

The Left Wing Extremism (LWE) affected districts, State of Jammu and Kashmir, Himachal Pradesh, Uttrakhand, North Eastern Region States including the State of Sikkim will be considered separately with relaxed norms as well as additional 10 grace points. The special provisions for these Districts /States are given hereunder:-

## 5. Opening of Kendriya Vidyalayas under Project Sector/ Institute of Higher Learning Sector.

Proposals received from the Public Sector undertakings for opening Kendriya Vidyalaya in their campuses are considered on fulfillment of certain terms and conditions devised by KVS in the form of an MOU. The recurring and non-recurring expenditure including proportionate overhead charges and future development expenditure are met by the PSUs/ Institutes of Higher Learning besides providing of suitable and sufficient land, building, furniture, equipment and residential accommodation for the staff of the proposed K.V.

## 6. Zonal Institute for Educational Training (ZIETs)

KVS has 05 Zonal Institutes for Educational Training i.e. one each at Gwalior (MP), Mysore (Karnataka), Mumbai (Maharashtra) Chandigarh (UT) and Bhubaneswar, (Odisha). All these ZIETs are engaged in the conduct of In-service courses, Induction Courses and short duration workshops aimed at empowering the teaching and non-teaching staff.

## 7. Admission in Kendriya Vidyalayas

The admission in Kendriya Vidyalayas is regulated on certain guidelines duly approved by Board of Governors of KVS, according to which the following priorities shall be followed in granting admissions in KVs in the Defence/Civil Sector:-

1. Children of transferable and non-transferable central government employees and children of ex-servicemen.
2. Children of transferable and non-transferable employees of Autonomous Bodies/Public Sector Undertaking/Institute of Higher Learning of the Government of India.
3. Children of transferable and non-transferable State Government employees.
4. Children of transferable and non-transferable employees of Autonomous Bodies/ Public Sector Undertakings/Institute of Higher Learning of the State Governments.
5. Children from any other category i.e., all those not covered under any of the categories 1 to 4 listed above.

Note: Preference in Admission to wards will be granted based on the Number of transfers of the parents in the last 7 years.

No deviation from the aforesaid policy can be made in the matters of admission.

### **13. PM SHRI SCHEME:**

Pradhan Mantri Schools for Rising India (PM-SHRI) Scheme is a Centrally Sponsored scheme announced in 2022 and aims to establish more than 14500 PM SHRI schools across the country with comprehensive, dedicated and inclusive interventions to promote holistic transformation at all levels, including equity, access, quality and inclusion.

913 KVs (In the first phase, a total of 730 KVs, second phase a total of 104, third phase a total of 30 KVs, fifth phase a total of 20 KVs) & in Seventh Phase, a total of 29 KVs have been declared as PM SHRI KVs working as the school of excellence as envisioned in NEP 2020. Efforts are being made to make them exemplar schools as envisioned in scheme document. The principals of these schools have been trained in developing the infrastructure and organize various training programmes for the betterment of the students.

All the 913 selected PM SHRI schools are registered on the School Innovation Council portal. The progress of monthly activities & expenditures are being monitored.

### **14. BALVATIKA:**

In consonance with the National Education Policy 2020, Balvatika (Pre-Primary) Classes are introduced in the existing infrastructure for children in the age groups of 3+, 4+ and 5+ respectively from the Academic Session 2022-23. Initially, one section in each Balvatika 1, 2 & 3 for the age groups 3+, 4+ and 5+ children was made functional in selected 50 Kendriya Vidyalayas .

During the Academic Session 2023-24, 450 selected KVs were approved to open Balvatika 3 for the age group 5+ years. At present, Balvatika 1, 2 & 3 are functioning in 62 KVs and Balvatika 3 in 443 KVs. Putting together, 505 KVs having Balvatika, are accommodating more than 23000 children during the academic session 2025-26. Jaadui Pitara and KVs developed TLM are being used for making learning joyful.

As NEP-2020 recommends healthy pupil-teacher ratio at this stage, two ECCE trained teachers and one caregiver are engaged each of these classes as per recommendations of NCERT through contractual basis. Admissions in Balvatika are done as per the extant KVS Admission Guidelines with defined priority following reservations. Balvatika 3 students automatically get promoted to Class I . Duration of school timings are 4 hours per day on a five-day week basis followed in Balvatika classes. No specific uniform has been prescribed for these classes.

Further, Board of Governors of KVS has already approved opening of Balvatika in all KVs. PIB for Financial and Administrative approval for opening Balvatika in all Civil and Defence Sector KVs will be submitted to MoE after the recommendation/approval in BoG. In addition, request has been made Project sector KVs for opening of Balvatika classes.

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## PROBABLE QUESTIONS

**Q.1 What steps are being taken to address the shortage of classrooms and teaching staff at PM SHRI Kendriya Vidyalaya Ranaghat?**

**Ans.** There is no shortage of classrooms and teaching staff at present in PM SHRI Kendriya Vidyalaya Ranaghat. At present, the Vidyalaya building comprises 14 classrooms, with 14 sections functioning, and has adequate infrastructure to meet the current requirements of the school.

**Ans.** Horizontal expansion of PM SHRI Kendriya Vidyalaya Ranaghat is possible to construct additional rooms to open /run additional sections (i.e. two sections per class from class 1 to class 12).

**Q.4. Is there any proposal for constructing additional buildings or classrooms at PM SHRI KV Ranaghat?**

**Ans.** At present, there is no such proposal pending in KVS (HQ) for construction of additional classrooms at PM SHRI Kendriya Vidyalaya, Ranaghat.

**Q.5. What is the Pupil-Teacher Ratio of PM SHRI KV Ranaghat, and Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan (KVS)?**

**Ans:** Pupil Teacher Ratio of PM SHRI KV Ranaghat as on 30.06.2025 is 26.64 : 1 and Pupil Teacher Ratio of KVS as on 30.06.2025 is 27 : 1.

**Q.6. Is there any plan to sanction an another Kendriya Vidyalaya in the Ranaghat area/ Nadia District?**

**Ans.** At present, there is no such proposal received from the Sponsoring Agency.

**Q.7 What are the Mandatory provisions for opening of a new Kendriya Vidyalaya?**

**Ans.** The following are 03 mandatory provisions to examine any proposal for opening a new KV under Civil/ Defence Sector:

- I. Availability of unencumbered and suitable extent of land, free of cost, as per extant KVS norms.
- II. Availability of at least 500 employees of the transferable and non-transferable Central Government Employees including Defence and Para-Military personnel, Central autonomous Bodies/ Central PSUs/ Central Institutes of Higher Learning.
- III. Availability of rent free suitable temporary accommodation of 15 rooms as per KVS norms.

**Q.8 How many Kendriya Vidyalayas are functioning in the country?**

**Ans.** As on 10.08.2025, 1285 Kendriya Vidyalayas are functioning across the country including 03 abroad. Details are given at Annexure-I.

**Ans.** 13 new KVs have been sanctioned by the Govt./CCEA in August, 2018. 50 new KVs have been sanctioned by the Govt./CCEA in March, 2019 and 85 new KVs have been sanctioned by the Govt./CCEA in December, 2024.

**Q.12 What is the unit cost of a school building?**

**Ans.** Current Unit Cost of School building (02 sections), 09-unit staff quarters, boundary wall, and campus development estimated at Rs. 38.48 Crore (based on CPWD Plinth Area Rates 2023).

**Q.13 What are the conditions to be fulfilled by sponsoring authorities?**

**Ans.** It is the responsibility of sponsoring authority to transfer suitable land as per KVS norms free of cost on lease / permanent grant basis (ownership basis) for construction of school building, staff quarters Boundary wall, sports facilities etc. Till permanent school building is constructed by KVS, the sponsoring authority will have to provide structurally safe adequate rent free temporary accommodation to run the Vidyalaya.

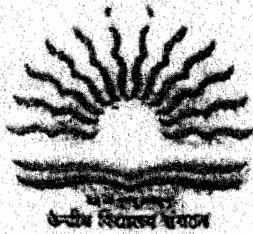

**OFFICE MEMORANDUM**

**Subject : Amendment in norms prescribed for opening of new Kendriya Vidyalayas under Civil/ Defence Sector.**

In pursuance of the decision taken by the Board of Governors (BoG) of KVS, in its 109<sup>th</sup> meeting held on 06.03.2018, the existing norms prescribed for opening of new Kendriya Vidyalaya under Civil / Defence Sector are amended to the extent as given hereunder:-

**1. Essential requirement for a new proposal for Kendriya Vidyalaya.**

The following essential requirements of KVS will have to be mandatorily fulfilled by the sponsoring authorities for establishment of new Kendriya Vidyalayas under Civil/ Defence Sector:-

(a) Availability of unencumbered and suitable extent of land, free of cost, as per the extant KVS norms.

(b) Availability of at least 500 employees of the transferable and non-transferable Central Govt. employees including Defence and Para Military Personnel, Central Autonomous Bodies/ Central PSUs / Central Institutes of Higher Learning.

(c) Availability of rent free suitable temporary accommodation as per KVS norms.

If a sponsoring authority fails to fulfil any of the three essential requirements as mentioned from (a) to (c) above, the proposal will not be processed further and will be awarded zero weightage.



**OFFICE MEMORANDUM**

**Subject: Revision of norms prescribed for opening of new Kendriya Vidyalayas under Civil/Defence Sector.**

Approval of the Board of Governors, KVS as accorded in its 108<sup>th</sup> meeting held on 15.11.2016, is hereby conveyed for modifications in the existing norms prescribed for opening of new Kendriya Vidyalayas under Civil/Defence Sector to the extent as given hereunder:-

**A. Sponsoring Authorities**

Proposal for opening of new Kendriya Vidyalayas will be considered, if sponsored by (a) Ministries or Departments of the Govt. of India; (b) State Governments; (c) Union Territories Administration

**B. Requirement of land**

The requisite extent of land to be provided, free of cost, by the sponsoring authority is as under:-

Sl. No.	Location	Minimum extent of land (Acres)	Desirable extent of land (Acres)
1	Metropolitan cities and Hyderabad & Bangalore	2.5	6
2	All other Locations.	6	10

The Sponsoring Authorities should make efforts to provide the desirable extent of land in case of land availability for creation of all sports and other infrastructural facilities and for future expansion of KV, since in the minimum extent of land norm as above, all these facilities may not be adequately created.

For State Sponsored KVs under Civil Sector, the proposals should come from the Govt. instead of from District Collectors. Also to ensure that some KVs develop all sports facilities like football field, 400 meter running track etc. the State Govt. will take care that at least every third proposal sent by them fulfils the desirable extent of land norms in future.

Water and electricity lines/ supply and approach road upto the site offered by sponsoring authority for construction of permanent school building will be provided by the sponsoring authority at their cost.

C. Acceptance of land for Kendriya Vidyalayas on donation basis.

KVS may accept the land on donation basis with the following provisions:

- a) The donor may donate land to the State Govt./District Administration who in turn will transfer the land to KVS on permanent grant basis.
- b) KVS shall fix one plaque inside the Kendriya Vidyalaya campus at appropriate place engraving the name of donor as a mark of memory.

D. REQUIREMENT OF TEMPORARY ACCOMMODATION:

The sponsoring authority is liable to provide suitable & sufficient rent free temporary accommodation to run the classes. Preferably, the sponsoring authorities may provide 16 rooms roughly of the size of 7m x 7m, which can accommodate at least 40 students per section. This accommodation is necessary to initially open the new Kendriya Vidyalaya and start classes I to V with single section each and also for the purpose of Principal room, staff room, Library room, Vidyalaya Office and accommodation for other miscellaneous activities of the Vidyalaya and for consequential growth for next 3-4 years.

The Sponsoring Authority shall also provide safety certificate of the temporary building provided by them annually.

The sponsoring authority will undertake repairs/maintenance of the temporary building at its own cost till the Kendriya Vidyalaya is shifted in the permanent school building constructed by KVS.

In all the proposals which have already become feasible and duly approved by the BOG, KVS, the land extent already offered by the concerned sponsoring authority will not be changed in view of this revision of land norms. The new proposals including the proposals which are under various stages of examination are to be examined with reference to the revised norms hereafter.

A set of revised formats (Annexure-I, II & III) after incorporating the amendments as approved by the Board of Governors, KVS, in its 105<sup>th</sup> meeting (bid), are being circulated separately.

This may be circulated by Secretary Education of States to all the District Collectors and by Deputy Commissioners, KVS Regional Offices to all Kendriya Vidyalayas functioning under their administrative jurisdiction and proposals for opening of new Kendriya Vidyalayas may be examined and submitted as per these revised norms. State Governments may submit their proposals through the concerned Regional Offices of KVS.

### NORMS FOR OPENING OF NEW KENDRIYA VIDYALAYA IN CIVIL SECTOR/DEFENCE SECTOR.

1. (i). Proposal for opening of new Kendriya Vidyalaya is considered only if sponsored by one of the following:-
  - (a) Ministries or Departments of the Govt. of India.
  - (b) State Governments.
  - (c) Union Territories Administration.
- (ii). Free of cost land defined as under:

(a) The Sponsoring Authorities should make efforts to provide the desirable extent of land in case of land availability for creation of all sports and other infrastructural facilities and for future expansion of KV, since in the minimum extent norm as above, all these facilities may not be adequately created.

For State Sponsored KVs under Civil Sector, the proposals should come from State Govt. instead of from District Collectors in future. Also to ensure that some KVs develop all sports facilities like football field, 400 meter running track etc. the State Govt. will take care that at least every third proposal sent by them fulfils the desirable extent of land norms in future.

(b) The Sponsoring Authority will be liable to identify and demarcate adequate and suitable land as per aforesaid norms. The identified and demarcated land will be required to be transferred in the name of new Kendriya Vidyalaya at the appropriate time either free of cost on permanent transfer basis or at nominal lease rent @ Rs.1/-per annum for 99 years. On receipt of approval of Govt. of India for opening of new Kendriya Vidyalayas under Civil/Defence Sector, the concerned sponsoring authority will be intimated about sanction of a new KV but necessary administrative orders for opening of the new Kendriya Vidyalaya will be issued only after the identified and demarcated land is transferred to KVS on lease or permanent transfer and its possession is also given to KVS. In case, the required extent of land is not transferred in favour of KVS within one year of intimation of sanction by KVS, then the said sanction of a new KV may be withdrawn and utilized for another suitable location. However, if the required extent of land is transferred within one year, then administrative orders for opening of the new Kendriya Vidyalaya will be issued immediately after transfer of land, and the new KV will be opened in the temporary accommodation provided by the sponsoring authority.

However, with respect to new KVs of Defence Sector, the one year norms may be relaxed on the merit of the case.

(c) Water and electricity supply upto the land offered, approach road to the land offered by sponsoring authority for construction of permanent school building will be provided by the sponsoring authority at their cost.

(iii) Acceptance of land for Kendriya Vidyalayas on donation basis:-

KVS may accept land on donation basis with the following provisions:-

- a) The donor may donate land to the State Govt./ District Administration who in turn will transfer the land to KVS on permanent transfer basis.
- b) KVS may fix one plaque inside the Kendriya Vidyalaya campus at appropriate place engraving the name of donor as a mark of memory

(iv). (a) When there is a concentration of at least 500 employees of the Defence services including ex-servicemen or Para Military Forces or of Central Govt. or of the Govt. of India Undertakings individually or jointly at the proposed location station (Department / Organization wise number of such employees may be attached on a separate paper) (250 in the case of Special Focus Districts)

(b) When there is minimum potential enrolment of children of specified categories belonging to categories I to IV which may be 200 total or an average of 30 per class, whichever is more (Para 4- Priorities for Admission- Annexure-II)

(v). When the sponsoring authority makes available, free of rent temporary accommodation consisting of 15 rooms of approximate 7m X 7m size to house the newly opened expanding Vidyalaya till the Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan constructs its own Vidyalaya building on the land provided by the sponsoring authority.

(vi) Provision of the residential accommodation to at least 50% of the staff should be made available by the sponsoring authority. The number of such residential units needs to be earmarked before the school is opened.

2. A new Kendriya Vidyalaya may be opened in the campus of a Govt. of India Public Sector Undertaking if it agrees to bear the recurring and non-recurring expenditure including 100% staff accommodation, land & school building and future development facilities as also the proportionate overhead charges on the proposed Vidyalaya provided the need for such a Vidyalaya is established with reference to the location and non-availability of alternate educational facilities.

3. A new Kendriya Vidyalaya may be opened in the campus of an Institution of Higher Learning of Govt. of India like IIT, CSIR Laboratories etc. on the same terms and conditions as stipulated in respect of Schools for Public Sector Undertaking.

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**TERMS AND CONDITIONS FOR OPENING OF A KENDRIYA VIDYALAYA UNDER CIVIL SECTOR/DEFENCE SECTOR.**

**Note:** Acceptance of terms and conditions by the sponsoring authority is a precondition to the opening of a new Kendriya Vidyalaya in the Civil/Defence Sector. The sponsoring authority is required to submit in quadruplicate, the acceptance and confirmation of the terms and conditions.

**1. GENERAL**

- a) The Sangathan does not take over an existing school.
- b) The Sangathan opens a new Kendriya Vidyalaya of its own in accordance with its own approved pattern of education.
- c) The Sangathan does not run KG classes.
- d) In no case the Sangathan will take the liability of appointing/absorbing any of an existing school staff in the service of the Sangathan. The existing staff members are, however, free to apply in response to the advertisement for various categories of posts, issued by the Sangathan from time to time and compete with outsiders.

**2. (A) REQUIREMENT OF LAND :**

A suitable piece of land, as prescribed under point 1(ii) of Annexure-I, will have to be provided free of cost or at nominal lease rent i.e. @ Re. 1/- per annum, for the construction of the permanent Vidyalaya building. A site plan of the land proposed to be provided should be attached. The demarcated land should be transferred to KVS prior to opening of a new Kendriya Vidyalaya as stated in Para-1(ii) to Para 1(b) of Annexure-I. This condition is mandatory before opening of a new Kendriya Vidyalaya. The sponsoring authority will also provide suitable temporary accommodation, free of rent, for running the school until the Sangathan is able to construct its own permanent Vidyalaya building on the land provided by the sponsoring authority. This period may be about 5 to 7 years after actual transfer of land to the Sangathan.

**(B) REQUIREMENT OF TEMPORARY BUILDING FOR OPENING OF NEW KV:**

(i) The sponsoring authority is liable to provide suitable & sufficient rent free temporary accommodation to run the classes. Preferably, the sponsoring authorities may provide 15 rooms roughly of the size of 7m x 7m, which can accommodate at least 40 students per section. This accommodation is necessary to initially open classes I to V with single section each for the purpose of Principal room, staff room, Library room, Vidyalaya office, and accommodation for other miscellaneous activities of the Vidyalaya and for consequential growth for next 3-4 years.

(ii) A sketch map of the proposed accommodation indicating the sizes of the rooms should be enclosed. Temporary accommodation once provided shall under no circumstances be withdrawn unless the Sangathan is satisfied with the alternative arrangements made in this regard by the sponsoring authority or until the Sangathan is able to construct its own building.

(iii) The Sponsoring Authority shall also provide safety certificate of the temporary building provided by them annually.

(iv) The sponsoring authority will undertake repairs/maintenance of the temporary building at its own cost till the Kendriya Vidyalaya is shifted in the permanent school building constructed by KVS.

### **3. RESIDENTIAL ACCOMMODATION:**

Residential accommodation to at least 50% of the staff posted in the proposed K.V. will have to be provided by the sponsoring authority on priority basis on the same terms and conditions as applicable to their own staff of corresponding status till KVS constructs its own staff quarters. The total number of such residential units will need to be earmarked before the school is opened.

### **4. PRIORITIES FOR ADMISSIONS:**

The following priorities have been laid down for admission to the Kendriya Vidyalayas in the Defence/Civil Sector.

1. Children of transferable and non-transferable central government employees and children of ex- servicemen. This will also include children of foreign national officials, who come on deputation or transfer to India on invitation by Govt. of India.
2. Children of transferable and non-transferable employees of Autonomous Bodies/Public Sector Undertaking/Institute of Higher Learning of the Government of India.
3. Children of transferable and non-transferable State Government employees.
4. Children of transferable and non-transferable employees of Autonomous Bodies/ Public Sector Undertakings/Institute of Higher Learning of the State Governments.
5. Children from any other category including the children of foreign nationals who are located in India due to their work or for any personal reasons. The Children of Foreign Nationals would be considered only in case there are no Indian Nationals' waitlisted for admission.

Note: Preference in Admission to wards will be granted based on the number of transfers of the parents in the last 7 years.

No deviation from the aforesaid policy can be made in the matters of admission.

**NOTE:**

The Kendriya Vidyalaya will strictly follow the instructions issued from time to time by the Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan in regard to admission, fee structure, syllabus, medium of instruction, utilization of Vidyalaya Vikas Nidhi, text books, examination, promotion, norms for sanction of staff, teachers qualifications, their appointment, promotion, transfer etc.

**5. STAFF:**

The entire staff for the Vidyalaya will be appointed by the Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan in the scales of pay and on the terms and conditions prescribed by it from time to time

**6. VIDYALAYA MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE:**

The Vidyalaya Management Committee will be constituted in accordance with the pattern prescribed by the Sangathan from time to time.

**7. AFFILIATION:**

The school will get itself affiliated to the Central Board of Secondary Education, New Delhi at the appropriate time.

**8. OTHERS:**

(A) In the event of violation of terms and conditions for running the Kendriya Vidyalaya by the sponsoring authority, the Sangathan will have the right to close down the Kendriya Vidyalaya and examine the disposal of assets and liabilities in consultation with the Government of India.

(B) Further, aforesaid terms and conditions are subject to modifications in the light of the directive of Board of Governors of KVS/ Government of India from time to time.

The terms and conditions as referred to above are accepted and confirmed.

- (b) whether the Government has any plan to set up/open new Kendriya Vidyalayas (KVs) in the country, if so, the details therefor State/UT-wise including Bihar, districts of Tamil Nadu particularly Cuddalore district, Panki block under the Chatra Lok Sabha Parliamentary Constituency of Jharkhand and Fatehpur Assembly constituency of Jhunjhunu Lok Sabha Constituency in Rajasthan during the current and ensuing financial years;
- (c) the details of locations identified for settings up of these new KVs along with the criteria used for their selection;
- (d) the total amount of funds earmarked/allocated/sanctioned for opening the same and the expected timeline for establishing these schools during the last three years in the country, State/UT/year-wise;
- (e) whether the Government has taken any steps to address the increasing demand for KVs in the country including Bihar, if so, the details thereof, State/UT-wise including Bihar;
- (f) the details of KVs sanctioned/approved/established in the country including Bihar and Jharkhand during the last ten years and the current year, location/district-wise; and
- (g) the details of action plan and the reasons for delay in establishment of new KV in the country including Tamil Nadu along with the steps taken by the Government for early commencement of classes in these KVs?

ANSWER

MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF EDUCATION  
(SHRI JAYANT CHAUDHARY)

(a) to (g) Opening of new Kendriya Vidyalayas (KVs) is a continuous process. KVs are opened primarily to cater to the educational needs of the wards of transferable Central Government Employees including Defence & Para-Military personnel, Central Autonomous Bodies, Central Public Sector Undertakings (PSUs) and Central Institute of Higher Learning

(IHL) by providing a common programme of education throughout the country. Proposals for opening of new KVs may be sponsored by Ministries or Departments of the Government of India/State Governments/ Union Territories Administrations, with commitment to provide requisite extent of land and suitable rent-free temporary accommodation for setting up a new KV as per norms.

At present, 1289 KVs including 51 KVs in Bihar, 46 KVs in Tamil Nadu (including 01 KV in Cuddalore district), 41 KVs in Jharkhand (including 01 KV in Chatra Parliamentary Constituency) and 79 KVs in Rajasthan (including 03 KVs in Jhunjhunu Parliamentary Constituency) are functional across the country. KVs are not opened on the criteria of State/ UT / Parliamentary Constituency/district.

During the last ten years (i.e. 2015-16 to 2024-25) and current year (i.e. 2025-26), 192 KVs have been opened and made operational including 05 KVs in Bihar, 09 KVs in Jharkhand and 05 KVs in Tamil Nadu. State/UT-wise details of these KVs are at **Annexure-I**.

The Government of India has sanctioned 85 new KVs in December, 2024 and 57 new KVs in October, 2025. The State Governments/Sponsoring Authorities have been requested regularly to transfer the requisite extent of suitable land and suitable temporary accommodation in favour of KVS. KVs are made functional after receipt of requisite extent of suitable land and temporary accommodation in favour of KVS, as per KVS norms. Order for opening of new KV Krishnagiri, District Krishnagiri, Tamil Nadu (sanctioned in October, 2025) has been issued. State/UT-wise details of these 85 and 57 newly sanctioned KVs as well as status thereof is at **Annexure-II** and **Annexure-III** respectively.

As per information received from Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan (KVS), no feasible proposals for opening of new KV in Cuddalore district of Tamil Nadu, Panki block under the Chatra Lok Sabha Parliamentary Constituency of Jharkhand and Fatehpur Assembly constituency of Jhunjhunu Lok Sabha Constituency in Rajasthan have been received by KVS from the concerned State Government / district administration.

The budgetary support is provided to KVS every year as Grants-in-Aid under three distinct Heads of Account viz. Salaries, General and Creation of Capital Assets for opening and functioning of KVs. Funds are not allocated to KVS State/UT/district-wise. The funds allocated to KVS during the last three financial years are as under: -

As per the information received from Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan (KVS), PM SHRI KV, Durg, situated in Durg Parliamentary Constituency of Chhattisgarh, is functioning in the temporary building provided by the Central Industrial Security Force (CISF) and is having classes from Balvatika-III to Class –XII. The Vidyalaya is running in single shift and has sufficient infrastructure and seating capacity for students in each class as per KVS norms/requirement.

These swimming pools are constructed and are being operated and managed by external agencies under the Build, Operate, and Transfer (BOT) model for 30 years as per concession agreement. As per Agreement, "the Concessionaire shall not use the Project Site for any purpose other than for the purposes of the Project/the Project Facility and purposes incidental thereto as permitted under this Agreement."

KVS pool addresses are permitted to be used only as the address of the swimming pool. Further, private classes are not allowed during the school hours. The KV-wise details of expiry of swimming pool contract and students trained in these pools are annexed.

(e) & (f) Supervision of these pools is being done regularly by KVS. In the event of any contractual violation, KVS issues a written notice to the Concessionaire allowing a cure period of 60 days. If the default is not cured within the stipulated period, KVS is empowered to terminate the Agreement in accordance with its provisions.

Proposals for opening of new KVs may be sponsored by Ministries or Departments of the Government of India/State Governments/ Union Territories Administrations, with commitment to provide requisite extent of land, free of cost and suitable rent-free temporary accommodation for setting up a new KV, as per Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan (KVS) norms.

At present, 1289 KVs including 38 KVs in Andhra Pradesh are functional across the country. KVs are not opened on the criteria of State/UT/Parliamentary Constituency/District.

During the last five years (i.e. 2020-21 to 2024-25) and current year (i.e. 2025-26), 58 KVs have been opened and made operational including 03 KVs in Andhra Pradesh. State/UT-wise details of these KVs are at **Annexure-I**.

The Government of India has sanctioned 85 new KVs in December, 2024 including 08 KVs in the State of Andhra Pradesh and 57 new KVs in October, 2025 including 04 KVs in the State of Andhra Pradesh. Out of 08 KVs sanctioned in December, 2024, 02 KVs i.e. KV Palasamudram Village, Gorantala Mandal, District Sri Satya Sai and KV, Dhone, District Nandyal have been opened from the session 2025-26. Further, out of 04 KVs sanctioned in October, 2025, orders for opening of 02 KVs i.e. KV, Mangasamudram Village, District & Mandal Chittoor and KV, Bairaganipalle, Kuppam, District Chittoor have been issued.

The State Governments/Sponsoring Authorities have been requested regularly to transfer the requisite extent of suitable land and suitable temporary accommodation in favour of KVS. KVs are made functional after receipt of requisite extent of suitable land and temporary accommodation in favour of KVS, as per KVS norms. State/UT-wise details of these 85 and 57 newly sanctioned KVs as well as status thereof is at **Annexure-II** and **Annexure-III** respectively.

- (a) whether the Government is aware of the adverse impact of prolonged teacher and principal vacancies on student learning outcomes, attendance and overall academic performance in Central Government schools in the country, if so, the details thereof and the manner in which this crisis is being addressed indicating the timeline for filling up the vacancies;
- (b) the reasons for not conducting detailed audit of vacant teacher and principal posts in all Central Government schools in the country and the absence of accountability mechanisms for delayed appointments;
- (c) whether it is a fact that minority or underrepresented groups continue to face systemic delays in teacher promotions and principal appointments in Central institutions, if so, the reasons therefor along with the urgent steps taken by the Government to ensure fairness;
- (d) the reasons for persistence judicial and administrative bottlenecks preventing timely recruitment of teachers/principal and failure of the Government to implement remedial/interim arrangement such as acting principals/senior teachers in central schools in the country; and
- (e) whether it is a fact that the Government has not adopted fast-track recruitment or other innovative solutions including additional resources/administrative support to fill critical teacher and headmaster positions despite repeated warnings that schools cannot function effectively with such prolonged vacancies, if so, the reasons therefor?

**ANSWER**

(a) to (e) Central Government Schools namely Kendriya Vidyalayas (KVs) and Navodaya Vidyalayas (NVs) are under the Department of School Education and Literacy, Ministry of Education.

Vacancies keep on arising due to opening of new KVs and NVs, retirement, resignation, promotion of employees, transfer, employees going on lien to another

department and up-gradation of schools. Filling up of vacancies is a continuous process and efforts are made to fill up the vacancies as per the provisions of the relevant recruitment rules of Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan (KVS) and Navodaya Vidyalaya Samiti (NVS).

In case of a vacancy of Principal in KV/NV, Vice Principal of the Vidyalaya is deputed as In-charge Principal until the post is filled on a regular basis.

Teachers are also engaged on contractual basis for temporary duration by KVS and NVS to ensure that the teaching-learning process is not hampered. Efforts are made to recruit regular teachers at the earliest so that interest of students does not suffer. The consistently high percentage results achieved by KVs and NVs over the years clearly demonstrate that academic standards and students' performance are duly maintained and are not compromised.

The reservation norms as notified by the Government of India from time to time are being scrupulously adhered to by KVS and NVS in matters of recruitment and promotion.

As per information received from KVS and NVS, a total of 8714 teaching vacancies including 161 vacancies of Principals in respect of KVS and 5045 teaching vacancies including 93 vacancies of Principals in respect of NVS have been notified in the month of November, 2025 for the direct recruitment. The Tier-I examination has been conducted in January, 2026.

In addition to above, a notification has also been issued by KVS in the month of December, 2025 for filling up of 2153 teaching vacancies including 157 vacancies of Principals in KVS through Limited Departmental Examination/Limited Departmental Competitive Examination.

(a) & (b) Opening of new Kendriya Vidyalayas (KVs) is a continuous process. KVs are opened primarily to cater to the educational needs of the wards of transferable Central Government Employees including Defence & Para-Military personnel, Central Autonomous Bodies, Central Public Sector Undertakings (PSUs) and Central Institute of Higher Learning (IHL) by providing a common programme of education throughout the country. Proposals for opening of new KVs may be sponsored by Ministries or Departments of the Government of India/State Governments/ Union Territories Administrations, with commitment to provide requisite extent of land, free of cost and suitable rent-free temporary accommodation for setting up a new KV, as per Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan (KVS) norms. KVs are not opened on the criteria of State/UT/Parliamentary Constituency/district/police district.

As per information received from Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan (KVS), presently, 51 KVs including 01 KV i.e. KV Bettiah, West Champaran are functional in the State of Bihar.

The Navodaya Vidyalaya Scheme envisages for opening of one Navodaya Vidyalaya (NV) in each district of the country. Opening of new NVs is a continuous process which depends on the willingness of the concerned State Government/UT administration to make available requisite suitable land, free of cost, for construction of the permanent building and making available required temporary building, free of rent, to run the Vidyalaya till the permanent building is constructed. Sanction and opening of new NVs depends on approval by the competent authority as per extant procedures. At present, 39 NVs including 01 NV in the West Champaran district are functional in the State of Bihar.

(c) & (d) As per information received from KVS, proposal for opening of a new KV at Bagha Police district of West Champaran of Bihar has not been received from the concerned State Government / district administration.

(b) & (c) Opening of new KVs is a continuous process. KVs are opened primarily to cater to the educational needs of the wards of transferable Central Government Employees including Defence & Para-Military personnel, Central Autonomous Bodies, Central Public Sector Undertakings (PSUs) and Central Institute of Higher Learning (IHL) by providing a common programme of education throughout the country. Proposals for opening of new KVs may be sponsored by Ministries or Departments of the Government of India/State Governments/ Union Territories Administrations, with commitment to provide requisite extent of land, free of cost and suitable rent-free temporary accommodation for setting up a new KV, as per Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan (KVS) norms.

The Government of India has recently sanctioned 85 new KVs in December, 2024 and 57 new KVs in October, 2025 across the country, including 06 KVs in the State of Himachal Pradesh, namely (i) Riri Kuthera (District Kangra) (ii) Gokulnagar Uppar Bhanjal (District Una) (iii) Nandpur (District Una) (iv) Thunag (District Mandi) (v) Paonta Sahib (District Sirmour) and (vi) Kotkhai (District Shimla).

Further, a new KV Nagda, Ujjain was sanctioned by Government of India in December, 2024 but it could not be made functional due to non-transfer of suitable extent of land, free of cost and rent free temporary accommodation in favour of KVS

by the sponsoring authority i.e. State Government of Madhya Pradesh, as per KVS norms.

Construction of permanent buildings for KVs is a continuous process, which depends upon identification of suitable land, completion of transfer / lease formalities in favour of KVS by the sponsoring authorities, submission of drawings / estimates by construction agency, availability of funds and requisite approvals etc.

As per information received from KVS, land measuring 5.10 acres identified by the sponsoring authority has been accepted by KVS and the transfer of the said land in favour of KVS has not been completed by the sponsoring authority.

- (a) As per information received from Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan (KVS) and Navodaya Vidyalaya Samiti (NVS), total 8618 (as on 01.01.2026) and 5083 (as on 31.12.2025) teaching posts are lying vacant in KVS and NVS, respectively.
- (b) & (c) Vacancies keep on arising due to opening of new Kendriya Vidyalayas (KVs) and Navodaya Vidyalayas (NVs), retirement, resignation, promotion of employees, transfer, employees going on lien to another department and up-gradation of schools. Filling up of vacancies is a continuous process and efforts are made to fill up the vacancies as per the provisions of the relevant recruitment rules of KVS and NVS.

Teachers are also engaged on contractual basis for temporary duration by KVS and NVS to ensure that the teaching-learning process is not hampered. Efforts are made to recruit regular teachers at the earliest so that interest of students does not suffer. The consistently high percentage results achieved by KVs and NVs over the years clearly demonstrate that academic standards and students' performance are duly maintained and are not compromised.

As per information received from KVS and NVS, a total of 8714 and 5045 teaching vacancies have been notified by KVS and NVS, respectively, in the month of November, 2025 for the direct recruitment.

(d) The budgetary support is provided to KVS every year as Grants-in-Aid under three distinct Heads of Account viz. Salaries, General and Creation of Capital Assets for opening and functioning of KVs. Funds are not allocated to KVS State/UT/district/KV-wise. The funds allocated to KVS during the financial year 2025-26 is Rs. 9503.84 crore.

(a) Opening of new Kendriya Vidyalayas (KVs) is a continuous process. KVs are opened primarily to cater to the educational needs of the wards of transferable Central Government Employees including Defence & Para-Military personnel, Central Autonomous Bodies, Central Public Sector Undertakings (PSUs) and Central Institute of Higher Learning (IHL) by providing a common programme of education throughout the country. Proposals for opening of new KVs may be sponsored by Ministries or Departments of the Government of India/State Governments/ Union Territories Administrations, with commitment to provide requisite extent of land, free of cost and suitable rent-free temporary accommodation for setting up a new KV, as per Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan (KVS) norms. At present, 51 KVs are functioning in Bihar including one KV at NTPC Kahalgaon, Bhagalpur District.

The Government of India has recently sanctioned 57 new KVs in October, 2025 across the country, including KV, Bhagalpur Town in Bhagalpur District of Bihar.

The Navodaya Vidyalaya Scheme envisages for opening of one Navodaya Vidyalaya (NV) in each district of the country. Opening of new NVs is a continuous process which depends on the willingness of the concerned State Government/UT administration to make available requisite suitable land, free of cost, for construction of the permanent building and making available required temporary building, free of rent, to run the Vidyalaya till the permanent building is constructed. Sanction and opening of new NVs depends on approval by the competent authority as per extant procedures. At present, 39 NVs including 01 NV in the Bhagalpur district are functional in all the 38 districts of Bihar.

To address the increasing skill challenges of the Indian IT industry and growth of domestic IT market, the Ministry of Education has established five Centrally Funded Indian Institutes of Information Technology (IIIT) and twenty IIITs on a Not-for-profit Public Private Partnership (N-PPP) in India with a vision to providing world class human resources in IT, developing/strengthening the human capital available for the IT industry in the country and harnessing the multi-dimensional facets of IT in

various domains. Out of these IIITs, one IIIT under the PPP mode, namely the IIIT (PPP) Bhagalpur, was established in 2017 in Bhagalpur district of Bihar.

Further, for establishment of a new Central University at Bhagalpur, Bihar near the historical site of Vikramshila, the State Government of Bihar has been requested to complete the process of the land acquisition.

Opening of Central Educational Institutions (CEIs) is a continuous process which depends on approval by the competent authority as per extent procedure/policy. 'Education' being a concurrent subject, the State Governments are also taking various initiatives to provide greater access to School/Higher Education in their respective States.

(b) From September 2022, all Central Higher Education Institutions (CHEIs) have undertaken Mission Mode recruitment drive to fill the vacant posts. Up to 24.01.2026 (i.e. the date of last Rozgar Mela), a total number of 30720 posts have been filled up by all CHEIs. The details are annexed.

Vacancies keep on arising due to promotion, retirement, resignation, death, opening of new institutions, schemes or projects, and additional requirements on account of enhanced students' strength and expansion of capacity in existing institutions. Filling up of vacancies is a continuous process and efforts are made to fill up the vacancies as per the provisions of the relevant recruitment rules.

(c) Under the ICT and Digital Initiatives component of the Centrally Sponsored Scheme of Samagra Shiksha, financial assistance is provided for establishing ICT Lab and Smart Classrooms in schools. The budgetary provision for the year 2025-26 for establishment of ICT Lab and smart class in Bhagalpur constituency is as under:

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(d) Under the Central Sector Scheme 'National Means-cum-Merit Scholarship Scheme (NMMSS), administered by the Department of School Education and Literacy, Ministry of Education, scholarships are awarded to meritorious students of economically weaker sections to arrest their drop out at class VIII and encourage them to continue their education at secondary stage. The meritorious students are selected through selection test and eligibility criteria of the scheme. One lakh fresh scholarships @ Rs.12000/- per annum per student are awarded to selected meritorious students of class IX every year and their continuation/renewal in classes X, XI and XII for studying in a State Government, Government-aided or Local body schools. Each State/UT is allotted a fixed quota for selection of meritorious students. No specific quota is earmarked for District/Parliamentary Constituency. Under the scheme, 14,857 scholarships amounting to Rs. 17.83 Crore (approx.) were awarded to the students of State of Bihar including Bhagalpur during the financial year 2024-25.

Pradhan Mantri Uchchar Shiksha Protsahan [PM-USP] Yojana, administered by the Department of Higher Education, Ministry of Education, is a Central Sector Scheme of Scholarship for College and University Students, under which financial assistance in the form of scholarships is provided to poor and meritorious students for pursuing higher education. Students who are in top 20<sup>th</sup> percentile of successful candidates in class XII and having family income of up to ₹ 4.5 lakh per annum, are eligible to apply. In a year, 82,000 fresh scholarship slots are available. These have been divided amongst the State Education Boards based on the State's population in the age group of 18-25 years. 50% scholarship slots are earmarked for the girl students. No specific quota is earmarked for District/Parliamentary Constituency. Under the scheme, 55,255 scholarships amounting to Rs. 66.98 Crore (approx.) were awarded to the students of State of Bihar including Bhagalpur during the financial year 2024-25.

(a) to (c) As per information received from Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan (KVS), land measuring 5.00 acres was transferred by the State Government of Jharkhand to KVS for construction of a permanent school building for Kendriya Vidyalaya No. 2, Dhanbad. However, construction work could not be initiated due to encroachment and a pending court case on the said land.

(d) to (f) As per information received from KVS, an alternate land measuring 4.30 acres at Mauja-Sabalpur, District Dhanbad, identified by the State Government, was accepted in September, 2023, subject to the condition that the State Government would construct an approach road, carry out earth filling on the western side of the plot, and provide drinking water supply to the site at its own cost.

The said land measuring 4.30 acres has been transferred to KVS on a permanent basis in November, 2025 and the work has been entrusted to Central Public Works Department (CPWD) for construction of the KV No. 2, Dhanbad building.

Construction of permanent buildings for KVs is a continuous process, which depends upon identification of suitable land, completion of transfer / lease formalities in favour of KVS by the sponsoring authorities, submission of drawings / estimates by construction agency, availability of funds and requisite approvals etc.

(a) Opening of new Kendriya Vidyalayas (KVs) is a continuous process. KVs are opened primarily to cater to the educational needs of the wards of transferable Central Government Employees including Defence & Para-Military personnel, Central Autonomous Bodies, Central Public Sector Undertakings (PSUs) and Central Institute of Higher Learning (IHL) by providing a common programme of education throughout the country. Proposals for opening of new KVs may be sponsored by Ministries or Departments of the Government of India/State Governments/ Union Territories Administrations, with commitment to provide requisite extent of land, free of cost and suitable rent-free temporary accommodation for setting up a new KV, as per Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan (KVS) norms. KVs are not opened on the criteria of State/UT/Parliamentary Constituency/District.

As per information received from KVS, presently, 41 KVs are functioning in the State of Jharkhand, out of which 05 KVs are functioning in the Hazaribagh Lok Sabha Constituency namely (i) KV, BSF Hazaribagh; (ii) KV, Barkakana; (iii) KV, Patratu; (iv) KV, Ramgarh Cantt.; and (v) KV, Bhurkunda.

The Government of India has sanctioned 85 new KVs in December 2024 across the country, including 02 KVs in the State of Jharkhand, namely (i) Barwadih, District Latehar (Railway) and (ii) Dhanwar Block, District Giridih. Further, 57 new KVs were sanctioned in October 2025 across the country, including 02 KVs in Jharkhand, namely (i) 106 Battalion RAF/CRPF Complex, District East Singhbhum and (ii) Barkatha, District Hazaribagh.

As per information received from KVS, proposal for opening of a new KV at Hazaribagh Lok Sabha Constituency of Jharkhand has not been received from the concerned State Government/District Administration.

The Navodaya Vidyalaya Scheme envisages for opening of one Navodaya Vidyalaya (NV) in each district of the country. Opening of new NVs is a continuous process which depends on the willingness of the concerned State Government/UT administration to make available requisite suitable land, free of cost, for construction of the permanent building and making available required temporary building, free of rent, to run the Vidyalaya till the permanent building is constructed. Sanction and opening of new NVs depends on approval by the competent authority as per extant procedures. At present, 26 NVs are functioning in the State, including 01 NV each in Hazaribagh and Ramgarh districts under Hazaribagh Lok Sabha Constituency.

Central Universities are envisaged to function more as pace setter institutions to provide academic leadership to other institutions in the region. A Central University has been established in the State of Jharkhand i.e. Central University of Jharkhand. Besides Central University, there are several other higher educational institutions in Jharkhand such as Indian Institute of Technology (Indian School of Mines), Dhanbad; Indian Institute of Information Technology, Ranchi; Indian Institute of Management, Ranchi; National Institute of Technology, Jamshedpur and National Institute of Advanced Manufacturing Technology (NIAMT), Ranchi which also caters to the educational as well as the aspirational needs of the students.

At present, the thrust is on consolidation of the higher education system. Expansion is to be mainly done by scaling up capacity of the existing institutions in place of setting up new institutions. 'Education' being a concurrent subject, the State Governments are also taking various initiatives to provide greater access to higher education in their respective states.

As per the information received from Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship (MSDE), under the Government of India's Skill India Mission (SIM), the MSDE delivers skill, re-skill and up-skill training through an extensive network of skill development centres under various schemes, viz. Pradhan Mantri Kaushal Vikas Yojana (PMKVY), Jan Shikshan Sansthan (JSS) scheme, National Apprenticeship Promotion Scheme (NAPS) and Craftsman Training Scheme (CTS) through Industrial Training Institutes (ITIs), to all the sections of the society across the country. The SIM aims at enabling youth of India to get future ready, equipped with industry relevant skills. Further, the schemes of MSDE are demand driven and the Training Centres are set up or engaged on need basis.

The University Grant Commission (UGC) had approved 06 Higher Educational Institutions (HEIs), in the State of Jharkhand, including 01 in Hazaribagh Lok Sabha Constituency namely Annada College (Hazaribagh), to offer skill-based programmes under the National Skills Qualification Framework (NSQF) during the academic year 2020–21.

- (a) whether the Government proposes to incorporate Dogri language, Dogra culture, art and history into the curriculum of all Kendriya Vidyalayas (KVs) and Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE) affiliated schools in Jammu region; and
- (b) if so, the details thereof?

**ANSWER**

(a) & (b) Kendriya Vidyalayas (KVs) are opened primarily to cater to the educational needs of the wards of transferable Central Government Employees including Defence & Para-Military personnel, Central Autonomous Bodies, Central Public Sector Undertakings (PSUs) and Central Institute of Higher Learning (IHL) by providing a common programme of education. KVs are following a common scheme of education as per its mandate, with common syllabus, text books and language so that the students are not inconvenienced when they move from one KV to the other when their parents are transferred.

As per information received from Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan, the medium of instruction in KVs is Hindi and English. Where required, KVs are instructed to engage regional language teachers to facilitate teaching-learning at the foundational stage. As per Article 112 of the Education Code of KVs, "additional arrangement for teaching of the regional language/mother tongue shall be made, provided 15 or more students are willing to opt for the same". Temporary teachers are engaged to teach local/regional languages including Dogri, provided there is a demand and sufficient numbers of student are available. Teachers also adopt multilingual pedagogical practices to support students from diverse linguistic backgrounds. Further, KVs

promote local language, culture and heritage, including Dogra culture, through various co-curricular and cultural activities.

The Department of School Education and Literacy, Ministry of Education, through its autonomous bodies such as NCERT, has undertaken several initiatives to promote all Indian languages. The National Education Policy 2020 and the National Curriculum Framework for School Education (NCF-SE) 2023, developed after nationwide deliberations and consultations, advocate multilingualism as the overarching philosophy, policy, and pedagogy for language education in schools.

The National Education Policy 2020 and NCF-SE 2023 recommend and provide guidelines for the promotion of all Indian languages, including classical and foreign languages, in school education. Multilingualism is envisaged as the foundational principle for language learning, particularly during the Foundational Stage. The following initiatives have been undertaken to promote Indian languages, including languages such as Dogri:

**i. Bhasha Sangam under Ek Bharat Shreshtha Bharat:** The Government of India has initiated a nationwide programme, Bhasha Sangam, to promote all Indian languages. Under this initiative, school students learn 100 sentences in the 22 Scheduled Languages with audio and video support. The programme has been implemented for the past eight years, with participation from schools across the country. **ii. Bharatiya Bhasha Utsav:** The Government of India has directed all educational institutions to celebrate the birth anniversary of the great Tamil poet Subramania Bharati as Bharatiya Bhasha Utsav every year in December. Schools and educational institutions celebrate Indian languages through cultural, literary, and academic activities. December 11 marks the culmination of the Utsav, during which institutions showcase their language-related initiatives.

**iii. Primers in Indian Languages:** Primers are introductory books designed to help learners become familiar with a language through visual and textual contexts. These primers introduce alphabets, words, numbers, and simple sentences in meaningful, real-life situations. Primers have been developed in tribal and indigenous languages listed in the Census of India 2011. The Central Institute of Indian Languages and

NCERT have jointly developed primers in 104 languages/mother tongues, with a target of covering all 121 languages listed in the Census. These primers are available on the NCERT website: <https://ncert.nic.in/primers.php>

**iv. Bharatiya Bhasha Summer Camps:** The Ministry of Education has initiated Bharatiya Bhasha Summer Camps to encourage students to learn another Indian language. These camps include activities such as cultural programmes, folk music, songs, dance, and basic language learning. The initiative was launched on 19 May 2025 to promote awareness about the importance of mother tongue and India's rich linguistic heritage. The objective is to encourage learners to "learn another Indian language."

**v. Jaadui Pitara:** Jaadui Pitara has been developed as an exemplar of teaching-learning material for the Foundational Stage. It includes toys, games, puzzles, puppets, posters, flashcards, story cards, storybooks, playbooks for children, and teacher handbooks. It reflects the core principle of the National Curriculum Framework for Foundational Stage (NCF-FS) 2022—learning through play. Children learn best through activities such as talking, listening, playing, drawing, singing, and movement. **vi. Translation of NCERT Textbooks:** NCERT textbooks in subjects such as Science, Mathematics, Social Science, Art Education, Environmental Education, and Health and Well-being—developed in line with NEP 2020, NCF-FS 2022, and NCF-SE 2023—are being translated into 22 Indian languages. Currently, textbooks for Grades 1, 2, 3, and 6 (excluding language textbooks) are available in digital format in 22 Indian languages, as well as in English. As per information received from the Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE), CBSE affiliated schools are free to offer Dogri language in Classes I to VIII. Further, Dogri will be offered as a subject in Class IX from the academic session 2026–27 and will subsequently be extended progressively to Classes X, XI and XII in the successive years.

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
