Further, briefed the parent that, as part of the A,B, and C curriculum, the DAIL program not only covers the core courses but also imparts various essential skills such as activities of daily living skills, social skills, communication skills, academic skills (including money and time management), domestic skills, sex education, occupational skills, self-advocacy, and co-curricular activities. Emphasized the importance of 'Independent Travel' and Parents could involve 'Basic Financial Transactions' like banks, post offices, ATMs, malls, and other everyday services."

Followingly, an inspiring session on "Roles and Responsibilities of Parents of DAIL students" was conducted by Mrs. R. Ananthanayagi, Placement Officer at DAIL. She emphasized the importance of a proper dress code and adherence to it, involving their special children in domestic chores, using gentle language at home, closely following up on lesson plans, and seeking clarification from the concerned teacher whenever doubts arise about their roles at home. She also discussed the Chai Point service and proposed that interested parents could manage the Chai Point, either individually or as a group.
