

Highlights from the Parent Sessions:

During the interaction, parents of trainees enrolled in various skill training and follow-up programs shared their experiences and provided constructive feedback on the impact of DAIL's initiatives. **Mrs. S. Usha** described how higher education has benefitted her son, *Mr. S. Tejesh (B.Sc. I Year, Hindu College)*, by enhancing his self-confidence, improving his communication and social skills, and offering opportunities for meaningful exposure to academic and extracurricular activities.

Parents also raised questions on eligibility criteria, course content, and future training opportunities, which were addressed by the DAIL team. They were encouraged to actively participate, provide regular feedback, and utilize the available programs to strengthen family-centered and community-based rehabilitation.
