Resilience and Efficiency in Cooperative Sector:

- Rehabilitation of sick cooperative units.
- Giving Cooperative spinning mills on lease or rent.
- Permitting cooperative spinning mills for sale of excess land.

Promoting Technical Textiles:

- Establishment of 6 Technical Textile
 Parks
- Eligibility: Minimum 10 textile units, minimum fixed capital investment (FCI) of INR 400 crore, No unit to have more than 25% of the total required park area, Established skill development centre with a minimum capacity of 30 individuals.
- Incentives: Capital subsidy up to a maximum of INR 250 cr up to an investment of INR 1000 crore.
 Special package of incentives for Ultra Mega Parks. Capital subsidy for green technologies - Effluent Treatment Plants (ETP), Zero Liquid Discharge (ZLD) and solar plants.

Promoting Traditional Textiles:

 Recognizing 5 traditional textiles in the State: Paithani saree and Himroo (Chhatrapati Sambhajinagar), Karvat Kathi (Vidarbha), Khana fabric (Southern Maharashtra), Ghongadi (Western Maharashtra).

Marketing Support:

 Organizing annual exhibitions in major cities to promote the sale of cotton, silk, handloom, powerloom products produced by the weavers of Maharashtra.

Promoting Friendly Technologies:

- Capital subsidy for setting up Effluent Treatment Plants (ETP), Zero Liquid Discharge (ZLD), Solar Plants, and Common Steam Generation Plants.
- Subsidy for setting up of 12 Recycling Projects.

Creating a Skilled Workforce:

- Conducting Training programs under Skill Development Program through Weaver Seva Kendra or Technical Training Institute.
- Providing assistance to upgrade

 existing skill centers and setting up new Training Centers.
- Offering short-term courses and vocational training programs.
- Signing MoUs with prominent Associations and Institutes of Excellence to nurture a skilled ecosystem.

Silk Industry Promotion:

- Increasing average cocoon production from 60kg to 70kg per batch of 100 Disease Free Laying (DFLs).
- Establishing government cocoon markets.
- Implementing Silk Samagra-2 Scheme, an integrated scheme for development of the silk industry.
- Providing subsidies for the establishment of infrastructure such as Automatic Reeling Machine Unit (ARM) and Multi-end reeling machine unit (MRM) sheds.



About Textiles Department

The Department of Textile, Government of Maharashtra comes under the aegis of Cooperation, Marketing, and Textile Department and is responsible for the development and promotion of the textile industry in the State. The Department plays a significant role in implementing schemes and programs that have helped improve the quality of textile products in Maharashtra and create employment opportunities in the industry. The Department is committed to further developing the textile industry in Maharashtra with a strong presence of both traditional and modern textile subsectors and aims to make the state a global hub for textiles.

The Department is assisted by its field offices, namely the Commissionerate of Textil es and the Directorate of Sericulture located in Nagpur. There are three Corporations namely Maharashtra State Textiles Corporation, Maharashtra State Powerloom Corporation, and Maharashtra State Handloom Corporation that play an important role in the development of the textile industry in Maharashtra. Additionally, Maharashtra State Co-operative Textile Federation Ltd was established to act as a connect between the Department and industry.

The textile industry is a major driver of economic growth in Maharashtra, and it is expected to continue to grow in the coming years. The state government is committed to support the growth of the industry and has put in place several policy initiatives to help its beneficiaries remain competitive in the global market.
