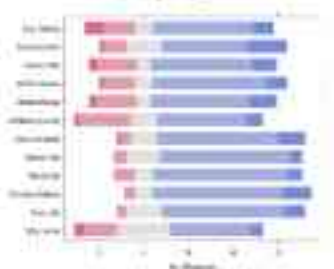

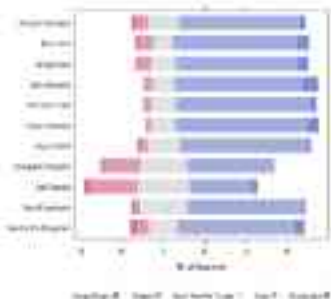


Figure 3. Percentage of respondents for wellbeing factors across the groups.

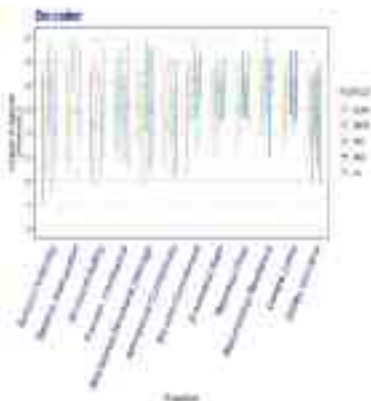


Fig 1. Number of patients with a diagnosis of depression referred to a support group.

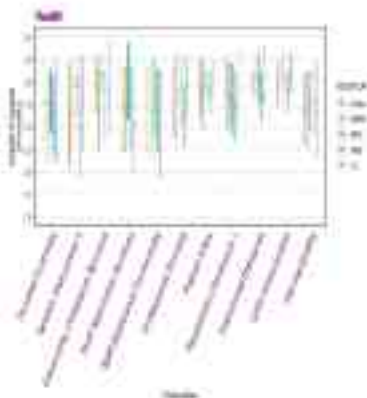


FIGURE 11 | Results of a small network model (1000 neurons) using the model.

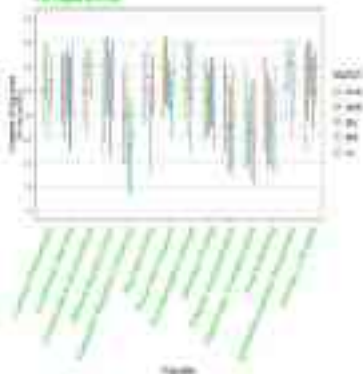


FIGURE 1 | Study area. The map shows the location of the study area in the FENG et al. (2021) study area.

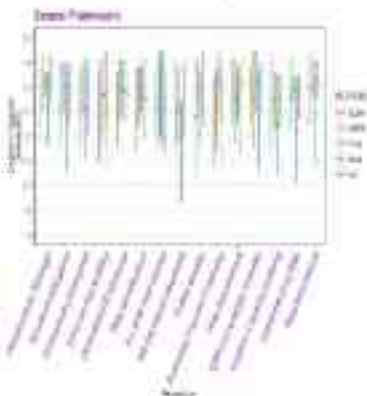


FIGURE 1 | Bar chart of $TRAPVAR$ values of genes of *Salmonella* across 16 files.
