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Chapter - 1

INTRODUCTION

Vision

A facilitative environment reflective of convergent effort fostering the highest standards in human resource development in the disability sector, for the singular and ultimate purpose of providing the best quality of education, training and composite rehabilitation services to persons with disabilities (Divyangjan), based on the paradigm of human rights and on the principles of inclusion.

Mission

- *To ensure the highest quality of emerging rehabilitation professionals through competency based curricula, which addresses the life cycle needs of persons with disabilities in contemporary India.*
- *To promote the highest attainable standards in the development of human and material resources, towards preparation and delivery of composite services in education, training, rehabilitation, skilling, research and technology.*
- *To prepare professionals who will respect the rights, dignity, autonomy, confidentiality and cultural diversity of persons with disabilities.*
- *To promote the training of rehabilitation professionals in un-served and under-served areas of the country.*
- *To ensure that the current focus is on training in cross disability, inclusion and multi-sectoral convergence, which lead persons with disabilities to live independently, confidently, and productively in their own communities.*

The Rehabilitation Council was initially set up under the Societies Registration Act XXI of 1860 vide Resolution No 22-17/83-HW.III dated 31st January, 1986 to have uniformity and to ensure minimum standards and quality of education & training in the field of special education and disability rehabilitation. It was given Statutory status by an Act of Parliament, the Rehabilitation Council of India Act, 1992 (No. 34 of 1992) dated 1st September, 1992 effective from 22nd June, 1993. The RCI Act was amended by Parliament in 2000 (No.38 of 2000) to make it more broad based.

The Act provides for constitution of the Rehabilitation Council of India for regulating and monitoring the training of rehabilitation professionals and personnel, promotion of research in disability rehabilitation and special education and maintenance of Central Rehabilitation Register (CRR) and for matters connected therewith or incidental thereto.

By signing and ratifying the United Nations Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities (UNCRPD), India has committed itself to harmonize all the domestic laws including the RCI Act. The Convention has brought the inclusion of persons with disabilities (Divyangjan) to the centre-stage need to implement the provisions of the convention in its true spirit. Accordingly, the syllabi of the various disability rehabilitation courses developed and standardized by RCI are being continuously revised so as to meet the requirements of the relevant provisions in the UNCRPD.

With the implementation of the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 by the Government of India, the categories of disabilities have been increased from 07 to 21, thus, enhancing the responsibility of the Council to make provision for human resource development for all categories of disabilities notified in the Act. The Council has initiated appropriate action to include disability specific contents in syllabi of different courses and development of need based courses.

MAJOR PROVISIONS OF THE RCI ACT, 1992

Objectives of the Council

1. To regulate and monitor the training programmes in the field of disability rehabilitation and special education.
2. To prescribe minimum standards of education and training for various categories of human resources dealing with persons with disabilities (Divyangjan).
3. To regulate these standards in all training institution to bring about uniformity throughout the country.
4. To make recommendations to the Ministry regarding recognition of qualification granted by Training Institution, Universities, etc., in India for rehabilitation professionals/personnel.
5. To make recommendations to the Ministry regarding recognition of qualification granted by institution outside India under the scheme of reciprocity.
6. To maintain Central Rehabilitation Register (CRR) of persons possessing the recognized rehabilitation qualification.
7. To encourage Continuing Rehabilitation Education programme at approved institution.
8. To promote research in disability rehabilitation and special education.

Functions of the Council

1. Qualifications granted by any University or other institution in India that are included in the Schedule shall be recognized qualifications for Rehabilitation Professionals/ personnel.
2. Any University or other Institution which grants qualification for rehabilitation professionals not included in Schedule may apply to the Central Government to have any such qualification recognized and the Central Government, after consulting the Council may, by notification amend the Schedule so as to include such qualification therein and any such notification may also direct that any entry shall be made in the last column of the Schedule against such qualification only when granted after a specified date.



3. The Council may enter into negotiations with a recognized authority in any other country for settling up of a scheme of reciprocity for the recognition of qualifications. In pursuance of any such scheme, the Central Government may by notification, amend the Schedule so as to include therein any qualification which the Council has decided should be recognized, and by such notification may also direct that an entry shall be made in the last column of the Schedule declaring that it shall be a recognized qualification only when granted after a specified date.
4. Registration of Rehabilitation Professionals/Personnel in the Central Rehabilitation Register (CRR) of persons possessing the recognized rehabilitation qualifications as per the Schedule attached to the Act.
5. To prescribe the minimum standards of education required for granting recognized rehabilitation qualification by Universities/Institutions in India.
6. To prescribe the standards of professional conduct, etiquette and code of ethics for rehabilitation professional/personnel.
7. To assess and grant approval to institution/universities for the training of professionals in the field of rehabilitation and to facilitate their recognition and its withdrawal by the Government.
8. The Council may appoint such number of visitors as it may deem requisite to inspect any University or Institution wherein education for rehabilitation professional is given or attend any examination for the purpose of granting recognized rehabilitation qualifications.

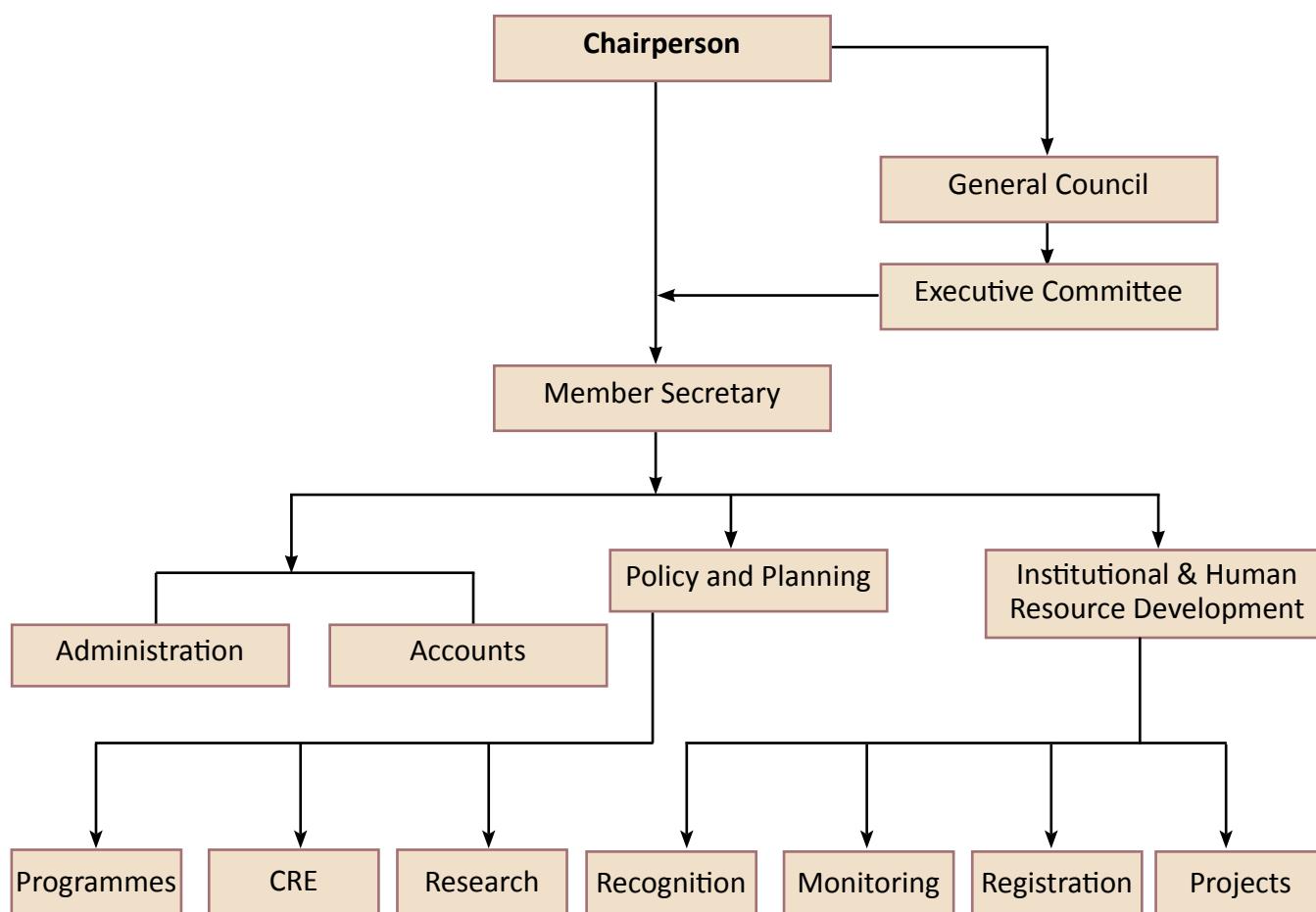

COUNCIL AND ITS MEETINGS

COUNCIL

In exercise of the powers conferred under sub-section (1) and (3) of Section 3 of the Rehabilitation Council of India Act, 1992 (34 of 1992), the Central Government appoints members of the Council consisting of a Chairperson and 28 Members representing the Ministries/Departments, rehabilitation professionals, social workers, medical practitioners and Members of Parliament.

Smt. Shankuntala D. Gamlin, IAS, Secretary, DEPwD, MoSJE, Govt. of India held the additional charge of Chairperson, Rehabilitation Council of India and Dr. Subodh Kumar as Member Secretary during the report period. The Council was reconstituted vide Gazette Notification No. S.O. 548 (E) dated 06.02.2018, S.O. 549 (E) dated 07.02.2018 and S.O. No.1682 (E) dated 18th April, 2018.

ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING OF THE COUNCIL

42nd Annual General Meeting of the Council was scheduled on 24th March, 2020. However, the same could not be conducted due to outbreak of unprecedented COVID-19 pandemic and lockdown.

EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

To carry out the purposes of the Act, the Executive Committee is constituted from amongst the members of the Council as per Section 7 (1) of the Rehabilitation Council of India Act, 1992 (as amended in 2000). The Executive Committee is responsible for the management and administration of the affairs of the Council. The Executive Committee of the Council shall meet at least once in every four months. The meeting of the Executive Committee may be convened by the Chairperson of the Executive Committee or any other member of the Executive Committee who may be authorized by him on his behalf.

80th MEETING OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

80th Meeting of the Executive Committee of Rehabilitation Council of India was held on 21st June, 2019 at Conference Room, Rehabilitation Council of India, New Delhi

At the outset, Dr. Subodh Kumar, Member Secretary, RCI extended a warm welcome to Smt. Shakuntala D. Gamlin, Chairperson, RCI and other Members of Executive Committee, RCI. In his opening remarks, the MS, RCI stated that this is the first EC meeting chaired by the Secretary, Madam and also apprised the member about various initiatives and activities taken by him including the agenda items of the meeting.

Smt. Shakuntala D. Gamlin, Secretary, DEPwD & Chairperson, RCI welcomed all the members to the 80th meeting of the Executive Committee. She stated that only 4 months ago, she has observed that the Council has taken various initiatives to strengthen its activities under the supervision of Dr. Subodh Kumar, Member Secretary, RCI. She apprised the members about Co-design of CBID Course, Regional workshop at Shillong & National Workshop at Guwahati and other activities which were carried out during the last few months. She appreciated the work done by Member Secretary, RCI and also expressed her happiness in the way the Council has moving forward to realize its functions and objectives.

She also shared her concerns regarding capacity building, standardization of Courses, and increase in the enrolment in the Central Rehabilitation Register (CRR), steps needed to revoke the practice by unqualified professionals, improvement in quality of ODL Courses, updation of content on RCI's website in respect of list of training institutions & Courses, implementation of Citizen Charter for issuance of CRR and minimizing the time frame for issuance of CRR, review of some of the RCI's under utilized courses at Diploma level in light of RPwD Act, 2016 ensuring stability while according approval to training institutes for conducting any of the course(s), exercise of statutory powers to ensure the effective implementation of various provisions of the RCI Act, 1992. She also emphasized the need of District Disability Rehabilitation Centres in each district to provide quality services to divyangjan. She suggested that RCI should look in to these matters and appropriate steps to be taken to address the said matters with immediate effect in public interest.

Chairperson, RCI requested Member Secretary, RCI to take up the Agenda.

Item No. 1: Confirmation of the Minutes of the 79th Meeting of the Executive Committee

The Minutes of the 79th Meeting of the Executive Committee held on 10.10.2018 were confirmed.

Item No. 2: Follow-up-Action on the Minutes of the 79th Meeting of the Executive Committee

Follow up action was approved with the following observations/decisions:

- (a) The matter regarding surprise inspections of RCI's approved institutions conducted by the Office of CCPD in the State of Haryana and Jharkhand were also discussed at length. The Chairperson, RCI was of the opinion that the then CCPD was holding the additional charge of Chairperson, RCI. As CCPD is a quasi judicial body and RCI is also a regulatory body, therefore, inspector and judge should not be the same. Therefore, she advised RCI to refrain from such activities in the future.

Item No. 3: Progress Report

Progress Report was perused and appreciated by the members.

Item No.4: Action Plan

The Action Plan 2019-20 of RCI was approved by the members.

Item No.5: Implementation of new program at Master Level Speech Language Pathology & Audiology from the Academic Session 2018-19

The Members approved the recommendation of the Expert committee for continuation of combined Masters Degree Programme namely MASLP (Masters in Audiology and Speech Language Pathology) course for two more academic sessions. However, the curriculum of MASLP programme needs to be re-structured and re-designed from objective based to competency-based framework in order to make it at par with International standards.

The other programmes at Masters level with specialization namely M.Sc. (Audiology) and M. Sc. (Speech Language Pathology) of two years duration to be continued also till its revision. However, those institutions who have applied for MASLP course for 2019-20 session will be eligible for consideration by the Council.

Item No.7: Enhancement in monthly consolidated remuneration of contractual staff engaged in various projects of the Council

The Executive Committee approved the proposal to enhance at the rate of 4% annual increase in the monthly consolidated remuneration every year for the project/contract staff engaged in the Council, subject to their satisfactory work performance during the year.

Item No. 8: Ratification of change of nomenclature to the posts of Assistant, UDC & LDC in RCI.

Item No. 9: Annual Accounts for the year 2018-19

The Executive Committee considered and approved the Annual Accounts consisting of Balance Sheet, Receipt & Payment Account, Income & Expenditure Account for the Year 2018-19 for further submission to the Director General of Audit, Central Expenditure on or before 30th June, 2019 for audit.

Suppl. Item No.1: To adopt the simplified format for new proposal & extension of approval to the training institution form the academic session 2020-21

After detailed deliberation, the Executive Committee approved the simplified prescribed format for new proposal and extension of approval. This new format will be implemented from the academic year 2020-21. The committee also approved the proposal for inviting applications from the prospective training institutions on the Council to develop its new Integrated Software which includes (Recognition, Examination, CRE, CRR for online proposal).

Any Other Items : During the meeting following decisions were also taken:

- (i) While discussing the status report of the AIOAT 2019-20, the EC has decided to extend the last date for admission though AIOAT 2019-20 for another two weeks.
- (ii) The training institutions situated in the NE region to be allowed for direct admission along with the AIOAT candidates for all diploma level courses to encourage and facilitate NE region students/ institutions for the development of human resources in this field.
- (iii) It was decided that the list of training institutions uploaded on the website of RCI to be modified as per the current status of academic year and the preceding years institutions to be kept in Archives.
- (iv) Time frame for issuance of registration certificates to the applicants needs to be reduced as much as possible.
- (v) It was decided that the number of RCI approved courses is to be reduced as much as possible and that quality should also be maintained.
- (vi) The existing system for granting approval for the courses for a particular duration need to be reviewed.
- (vii) The Executive Committee of the Council should be reconstituted.

81st MEETING OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

81st Meeting of the Executive Committee of Rehabilitation Council of India was held on 06th February, 2020 at 11.00 A.M. in the Conference Room of DEPwD, C.G.O. Complex,

Two members namely Dr. Pawan Sthapak and Smt. Ruma Banerjee could not attend the meeting.

At the outset, Dr. Subodh Kumar, Member Secretary, RCI extended a warm welcome to Smt. Shakuntala D. Gamlin, Chairperson, RCI and other Members of Executive Committee.

Smt. Shankuntala D. Gamlin, Chairperson, RCI welcomed all the Members to the 81st meeting of Executive Committee and requested Member Secretary, RCI to take up the Agenda items.

Item No. 1: Confirmation of the Minutes of the 80th Meeting of the Executive Committee

The Minutes of the 80th Meeting of the Executive Committee held on 21.06.2019 were confirmed.

The Chairperson, RCI suggested that a number of RCI approved Special Education Courses taking in to account the specific needs of intellectual, learning and Neuro-Developmental Disabilities need to be conformed as per the provisions of RPwD Act, 2016. She apprised the members that initiatives are being taken to amend the RCI Act, 1992 and re-structuring its courses, further, various aspects of 'inclusive education' must be incorporated in the training modules developed by RCI. The pedagogy, the assistive IT enabled tools, the Sensitization of parents, teachers and community must be given priority.

She further suggested that there is huge demand for Community based Rehabilitation personnel. RCI should ensure that quality for professionals in this area. Competency based curriculum needs to be introduced, Care Giver course must be re-structured and standardized. Wide publicity be given about



Care Giver course, emotional, intelligence, communication skills, tenacity and practical aspects which are important for Care-Giver's curriculum building.

The chairperson, RCI emphasised the need to sensitise people about the steps to be taken for protection and safety of Divyangjan during disasters. In this direction experts from National Disaster Management Authority may be invited for the Expert Committee Meeting while restructuring the courses and one small module may be incorporated in all the RCI course curriculum including CRE programmes. The first 'Right of Rescue' as a principle must be a sine quo non, in all disasters rescue protocols.

Shri K.V.S. Rao, Director, DEPwD suggested that the data about the trained Care Givers needs to be updated, on the RCI website. RCI may also prepare a booklet of state-wise categories of registered professionals and personnel and all training institutions and forward to the State Commissioners for PwD's, State Social Welfare Departments, ZCCs etc for information & reference. This will help state govts, institutions and community to access their services in a more structured manner.

Item No. 2: Follow-up-Action on the Minutes of the 80th Meeting of the Executive Committee

Follow up action on the Minutes of the 80th Meeting of EC held on 21.06.2019 was approved

Item No. 3: Progress Report

Progress Report was perused and appreciated by the members. Shri Pankaj Maru raised concerns about the inspection reports awaited for 2019-20. Member Secretary explained that these reports pertain to NIs CRCs and Govt. organizations. They have requested the Council to re-inspect their organisations for approval for the next academic session. Shri Maru suggested that RCI guidelines of inspection should be same for all organizations, i.e. private or government. The parity in inspection and standards must be maintain.

Item No.4: Approval of revised guideline and Joint Assessment Report format

The draft revised guidelines for inspections and Joint Assessment Report format were approved by the Members. However, Members suggested that more stringent guidelines for inspection and frequent monitoring are required to be prepared and implemented by the Council Smt. Tarika Roy, Joint Secretary, DEPwD suggested that RCI should incorporate a parameter on " Pass result of the examination conducted by the University or institution" in its guidelines for proper assessment of training institutions.

Item No. 5(A) : Registration of B.M.Sc. passed candidates from YMCA Institute of Education, Chennai

The item was deferred.

Item No.5 (B): Registration of M.Ed. Spl. Ed. (LD) passed candidates from Jamia Millia Islamia University, Delhi

The item was deferred.

Item No. 5(C): Registration of B.M.Sc. passed candidates from NIEPVD, Dehradun

The item was deferred.

Item No. 6: Revision of eligibility criteria for admission to Post Graduate Diploma in Early Intervention (PGDEI) course

The Executive Committee approved the proposal.

Item No. 7: Conduct of B.Ed. Spl. Ed. course through Open & Distance Learning Mode by IGNOU, New Delhi

The matter was discussed in detail and Member suggested that at present all teacher training courses are under review and need to be restructured and quality of ODL Courses is also to be ensured and monitored. Therefore, it was felt that no new MoU is required to be signed at this stage as the council has already signed MoU with 14 State Open Universities to run B.Ed.Spl.Ed. ODL Course.

Item No. 8: Hiring of Office Space for Outreach Division (ORD)

The proposal for hiring of office space for Outreach Division (ORD) was approved by the Executive Committee. However, Smt. Tarika Roy, Joint Secretary, DEPwD suggested to follow to due procedures and get the Rent Reasonableness Certificate (RRC) from CPWD.

Item No. 9: Extension of Legal Consultant

The Executive Committee members ratified the proposal for extension of Legal Consultant till 31st March, 2020. Shri K.V.S. Rao, Director, DEPwD suggested to appoint a full time Legal Consultant. He further advised to take NOC from the Ministry of Law & justice before advertisement. Member Secretary, RCI stated that there is no Legal post in RCI and the Council getting huge number of Court cases throughout the country to defend the same. Accordingly, there is a need of Legal Consultant to look into the Court cases. He further stated that in case delay occurs in following the procedures and obtaining NOC from the Ministry of Law & Justice, further, extension would be required for the existing Legal Consultant on the terms and conditions. Executive Committee approved the same.

Item No. 10: Renewal of contract to conduct of “All India Online Aptitude Test (AIOAT)” for admission to Diploma level courses for the Academic Session 2020-21

The Executive Committee approved the proposal for renewal of contract to conduct of “All India Online Aptitude Test (AIOAT)” for admission to Diploma level courses for the Academic Session 2020-21 as this will be the third and final year to conduct the test by M/s NSEIT Limited, Mumbai on the existing terms & conditions. Shri K.V.S. Rao Director, DEPwD suggested that RCI needs to initiate action to complete the formalities for awarding tender to the agency to conduct All India Online Aptitude Test (AIOAT) well in advance for the next academic year 2021-22.

Item No. 11: Approval of payment towards work contract for conduct of “All India Online Aptitude Test (AIOAT)-2019” to M/s NSEIT Limited, Mumbai

The Executive Committee approved the proposal.



Item No. 12: Renewal of Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with State Open Universities to continue B.Ed. Spl. Ed. (HI, VI, ID) course through Open & Distance Learning Mode within their territorial jurisdiction

The matter was discussed in detail and it was unanimously decided by the Members that State Open Universities should meet the requirements specified under regulations of RCI to conduct B.Ed. Spl. Ed. Courses to ensure minimum standard of education through ODL mode. Further, an independent team should visit the Universities to ensure availability of required infrastructural facilities for these courses and its feasibility to run these courses as per the regulations of RCI before going ahead with renewal of MoU in the instant case.

Item No. 13: Ratification of RE 2019-20 & BE 2020-21

The Executive Committee members ratified the proposal.

Item No. 14 : Annual Report

The Executive Committee members approved the Annual Report incorporating Annual Accounts and Separate Audit Reports for the year 2018-19 of the RCI.

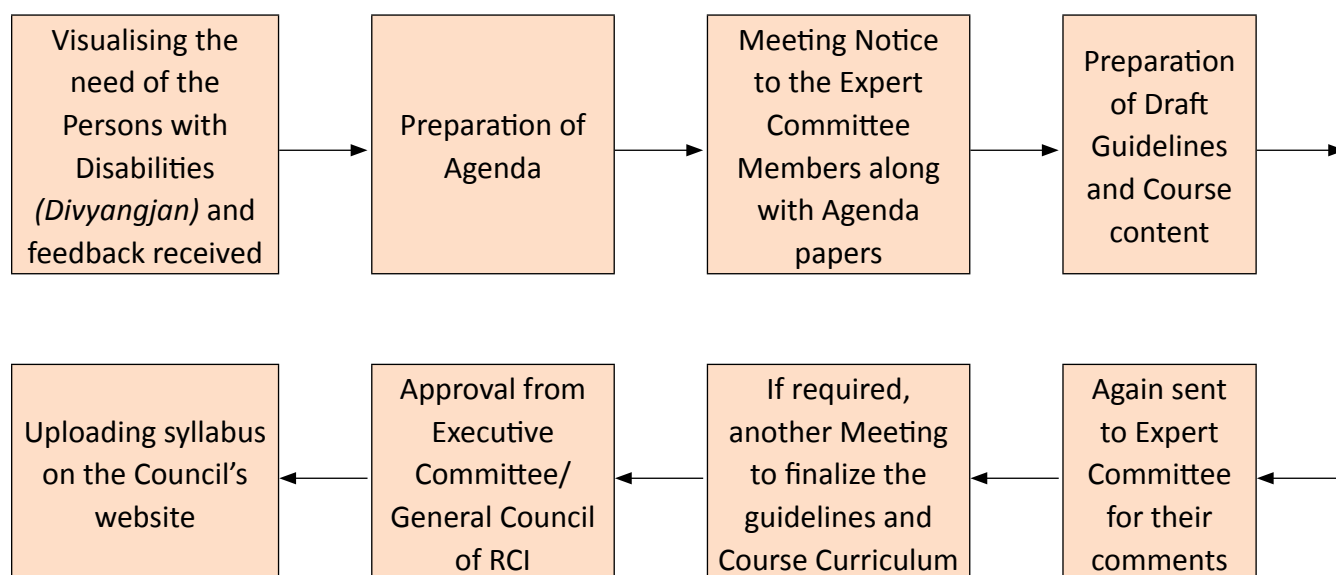

Chapter - 2

STANDARDISATION OF TRAINING PROGRAMMES AND EXPERT COMMITTEES

The Council develops and standardizes training programmes to meet the human resource requirement for various categories of Professionals/Personnel allocated to RCI. These programmes are reviewed, revised and updated from time to time. At present, 60 programmes are functional through regular mode in the area of disability rehabilitation and special education and the list of such programmes is given at **Annexure 2.1**

EXPERT COMMITTEES

To carry out the purpose of the Rehabilitation Council of India Act, 1992 (as amended in 2000), the Council has constituted various Expert Committees under Sub-Section (1) of Section 7 of the RCI Act. The list of the Expert Committees is placed at **Annexure 2.2. to 2.13**. Functions of the Expert Committees are as given below:

- (i) To recommend the courses, its duration, subject for examinations and standards of the proficiency to be obtained in any University or Institution for grant of recognized rehabilitation qualifications.
- (ii) To recommend the minimum standards of the staff, equipment, accommodation, library and other infrastructural facilities for institution and training of the rehabilitation professionals.



- (iii) Any other related matters.

The meetings of the Expert Committees organized during the period and gist of the discussions taken are as under:

MEETING OF EXPERT COMMITTEES

1. Development and Standardization of Courses:

i) Two days dual purpose expert Committee Meeting:

A 02 days dual purpose Expert Committee Meeting to (a) Consider convergence of some RCI courses, and development of new ones and (b) Develop structure, content and norms for short-term training course for Teachers, from the perspective of the RPwD Act 2016 was held under the Chairpersonship of Smt. Shakuntala. D. Gamlin, Secretary, DEPwD, MSJ&E, Govt. of India & Chairperson, RCI on 3rd & 4th July, 2019 at RCI, wherein experts from the disability sector, NIs, MHRD, NIEPA, NCTE, NCERT were present. After having an in-depth deliberations on various aspects of convergence of some of the RCI's courses and development of short term sensitization programmes for in-service teachers in the light of Section 47 of the RPwD Act, 2016, the following recommendations were made unanimously:

- a) DEPwD, M/oSJ&E may consider a plan for creation of job opportunities for various categories of rehabilitation professionals in future.
- b) RCI to develop a course which will prepare multi specialized professionals for dealing with all kinds of disabilities through one course.
- c) DEPwD to initiate appropriate steps for mapping out the requirement of professionals across the country.
- d) RCI to develop a short term programme for orientation of in-service teachers to make them more capable to address the needs of CWSN in the general classroom.
- e) Convergence of existing RCI diploma courses in special education to be developed on Competency based only.
- f) Top-up courses in regular mode were recommended for enhancing cross-disability expertise.
- g) It was recommended by representative of NIEPA that as per the philosophy of inclusion, keeping courses of HI and VI separately, is not justified. Further, as per UNESCO report special educator should be in three categories i.e Physical Disability (HI,VI), Neurological Disability (ID, SLD, ASD, CP) and Multiple Disability (Db). It was further suggested that at Diploma level there can be a single course covering all disabilities. She also affirmed the need for identification of the monitoring body for implementation of Inclusive Education.

In light of the mandate given to the Government by the two major Acts namely RPWD ACT, 2016 and RTE Act 2009 Amendment of 2012, requires all schools to become inclusive in terms of the education of children with disabilities. Various studies conducted by NIEPA, NCERT, and

National Institutes have shown that regular teachers need capacity building in teaching children with disabilities in regular classrooms. Hence, a 15 days program 'Orientation of School Teachers' was designed to facilitate the implementation of mandate of the above Acts, through in-service training program of regular teachers about educational needs of children with disabilities and strategies to meet these needs.

ii) A two days meeting was conducted on 5-6 September, 2019 at RCI under the Chairpersonship of Smt. Shakuntala. D. Gamlin, Secretary, DEPwD, MSJ&E, Govt. of India & Chairperson, RCI to develop standard format for visiting Experts and revise Model Recruitment Rules.

iii) The second meeting on Convergence of courses was held on 27-28 January 2020. The existing 17 special teacher training courses have been decided to be converged into 10 courses at Diploma and Degree level as per RPwD Act 2016. The development of common curricular framework for the converged B.Ed. course, which included nomenclature, objectives, general framework, eligibility criteria, duration, examination pattern, etc. was completed. The essential skills and competencies for all three level of courses i.e. D.Ed., B.Ed. and M.Ed. were identified and the preparation of guidelines for the development of course content was finalised. Preamble for all the three level courses were prepared.

iv) **A meeting of Task force for development of training module for in-service teachers:**

A meeting of Task Force for development of training module for in-service teachers held on 20th September, 2020 under the Chairpersonship of Mrs. Aloka Guha, Former Chairperson, National Trust. The Committee deliberated extensively on the terms of reference assigned to it and made the following recommendation:

- (a) The committee submits the draft module including Objectives, Target Group, Duration, Batch size, Eligibility of Trainers, Eligibility of trainees, recognition of course, Pre and Post test parameters, Credits and levels, training Strategies/ Modalities and Outcome Indicators.
- (b) The committee also considered highlighting the significance of making the distinction between the three different categories among students with disabilities namely: Disability (CWSN), Bench Mark Disability (CWD) and Support Need (CwD-HSN).
- (c) In view of the deadlines as per the ToR dated 30th August 2019 the Module development and the resource material development as stated above to be completed within two months; accordingly the next meeting with the resource persons/writers to be called for at an early date.
- (d) The module for Level-1- primary/elementary, level-2- secondary and Master Trainer shall be prepared in the second meeting of the committee.
- (e) Once the four modules are finalized, it is advisable to get them vetted by NCERT, SCERT, NCTE, NIEPA, KVS, NVS, and selected State Directorate, etc. through a common review meeting to be organized by DEPwD.
- (f) Allotment of writers for resource material for crash course, level-1, level-2 and Master Trainers module has to be taken up in the next meeting.



v) Second Meeting of Task Force for Development of Training module for in-service teachers:

The second meeting of Task Force for development of training module for in-service teachers held on 30th January 2020 at RCI under the chairpersonship of Mrs. Tarika Roy, Joint Secretary, DEPwD. The following points were recommended in the meeting:

- a) The lesson plan of curriculum adaptation of a science (Chemistry) lesson from class 8 was approved by chairperson of the Committee.
- b) Chairperson also mentioned about a meeting between DEPwD/RCI and NCTE, MHRD on the 7th February; and in the context she asked the committee to look at the work undertaken to date on Inclusive Education, by NCERT, NCTE, NIEPA so as to avoid duplication and create an understanding of the need of RCI's expertise as per its own mandate, and the mandate given to it by the RPwD Act 2016.
- c) The committee re-designed the content of the content of the 5 days module without changing the structure. Emphasis was given on UDL theory and practice in teaching subjects such as language, maths, Science, Social Studies/ EVS and Co-curricular such as Yoga, Physical education, Arts Craft, etc.

vi) A Meeting of Task Force to suggest in-service training module for teachers for inclusive education was held on 20th September 2019 under the Chairpersonship of Mrs. Aloka Guha as per the committee constituted by DEPwD vide letter no. 5-13/2019-DD-III dt. 30/8/2019. The minutes have been submitted to DEPwD for perusal. The next meeting of experts for development of learning materials for 5 days in-service module was held on 30th January 2020 as per the directions of DEPwD.

vii) As approved in the 80th EC of RCI, a circular has been issued on 22.07.2019 for continuation of MASLP programme for two more academic sessions 2019-20 & 2020-21 with its existing norms and regulations.

viii) **A meeting held on 7th Feb. 2020 on Convergence between NCTE RCI, at the Department of Persons with Disability, Government of India, New Delhi under the Chairpersonship of Smt. Shakuntla D. Gamlin, Chairperson of RCI & Secretary, DEPwD, and MSJE. The following points were suggested in the meeting:**

- a) NCTE is in the final stages of overhauling the teacher education programs at the B.Ed. level. She invited RCI along with its team of experts, to participate in the development of papers on IE and to give its input. She instructed Shri Vijay Kumar, Deputy Secretary from NCTE, to even hold back the paper on IE, if necessary, until this process is completed.
- b) She further invited Dr. Anupam Ahjua, to meet her soon and provide her valuable inputs in the process of compressive overhauling of the proposed B.Ed. course curriculum.
- c) She mentioned that out of the 37,000 B.Ed. colleges affiliated to the NCTE, she has a plan to make 700 of these (1 in each District) into Model Teacher training Institutes in this year. She invited RCI to become part of the join monitoring program at the field level, and documents success stories, which will inspire the next round of 700 Model Colleges next year.

- d) Finally, She mentioned that NCTE is in the process of developing a new Course on Counselling and Career Guidance, which will be launched later, and she welcomes RCI' participation in that as well.
- e) Chairperson, NCTE also informed the members that NCTE has mandate to regulate pre-service training to teachers not the in-service training programme for them.

- f) It was also decided that RCI to form a core committee comprising of members of mandate to avoid any repetition and overlapping.

ix) Expert Committee for development of training programmes for the professionals/personnel, namely, Audiologists & Speech Pathologists, Hearing Aid and Earmould Technicians:

A meeting was conducted on Doctorate of Audiology (Au.D) and Doctorate of Speech Language Pathology (D.SLP) programme proposed by Salus University, USA held on 12th March, 2020 at RCI. The following recommendations have been made unanimously:

- a) JS UGC informed that Ph.D. programme is essential for the growth of any discipline and for teaching. The Council should encourage Ph.D. programme in the field as per UGC 2016 notification.
- b) The proposed programme of AuD/SLPD is neither a medical programme nor a Ph.D. programme.
- c) It may be difficult to consider equivalence of the AuD/SLPD as per AIU standards as there are no equivalent programmes for comparison.
- d) Presently, there is no need for Doctor of Audiology (AuD) or Doctor of Special Language Pathology (SLPD) programmes, as our present curricula at master Level provides training on par with global standards.
- e) Independent programmes i.e. M.Sc. (Audiology) and M.Sc. (Speech Language Pathology) should only be continued.

- f) The committee felt that adding new clinical doctorate programmes would only add confusion in the field.
- g) J S, UGC suggested that there is no need for clinical doctorate programmes in reference to the existing notification of UGC, 2016.

- h) Council should consider developing structured and supportive programme for professionals having master degree in Audiology/Speech language pathology to meet and maintain global standard.

2. Circulars :-

Reconstitution of 12 Expert Committees for development of training programmes for training of various Rehabilitation professionals allocated to the Council

A Circular has been issued on 22.07.2019 regarding reconstitution of various Expert Committees for development of training courses for the 16 categories allocated to the Council as approved in the 80th EC meeting of RCI. The Council had invited applications from eminent rehabilitation professionals regarding reconstitution of the following Expert Committees for developing Curriculum for training of 16 categories of Rehabilitation Professionals allocated to the Council as approved in the 80th EC meeting of RCI. A circular no. 7-91(Expert Committee)/ 2019/RCI dated 22.07.2019 was uploaded on RCI website. Since number of applications from the rehabilitation professionals was found less, therefore date for submitting applications has been extended till 31st January 2020 and another circular dt. 04.01.2020 was issued.

- (i) Expert Committee for development of training programmes for 4 categories of professionals/ personnel namely Rehabilitation Administrators, Community Based Rehabilitation Professionals, Multipurpose Rehabilitation Therapists/Technicians and Rehabilitation Engineers/ Technicians
- (ii) Expert Committee for development of training programmes for the professional/ personnel category of Prosthetics & Orthotics
- (iii) Expert Committee for development of training programmes in the field of Special Education for persons with Hearing Impairment at Diploma and Degree Level.

- (iv) Expert Committee for development of training programmes for the professionals/ personnel, namely, Audiologists & Speech Pathologists, Hearing Aid and Earmould Technicians
- (v) Expert Committee for development of training programmes for the categories of Special Teachers for educating and training the persons with Mental Retardation and Rehabilitation Practitioners in Mental Retardation & Learning Disability
- (vi) Expert Committee for development of training programmes for the categories of professionals/personnel, namely, Clinical Psychologists and Rehabilitation Psychologists.
- (vii) Expert Committee for development of training programmes for 5 categories of professionals/personnel namely Rehabilitation Counsellors, Vocational Counsellors, Placement Officers, Employment Officers and Rehabilitation Social Workers.
- (viii) Expert Committee for development of training programmes for the categories of Special Teachers for educating and training the Blind & Low Vision, and Orientation & Mobility Specialists
- (ix) Expert Committee for development of training programme to promote courses in Inclusive Education teacher training
- (x) Expert Committee for development of training programmes in the field of Cerebral Palsy, Autism and Multiple Disabilities
- (xi) Expert Committee for development of training programmes for Care Givers in the field of rehabilitation
- (xii) Expert Committee for development of training programmes in Indian Sign Language in the field of rehabilitation.

A Circular was circulated on 24.07.2019 and the same was uploaded on RCI website for change of nomenclature of Mental Retardation to Intellectual Disability as per RPwD Act.

Change of term Mental Retardation to Intellectual Disability, in light of RPwD Act, 2016

The Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 has come into force w.e.f. 28th December, 2016 to give effect to the United Nations Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities and for matters connected there with or incidental thereto. The major perspective of the above said Act is now rights-based and multi-sectoral.

As per Section 2(zc), specified disability, notified in the Schedule of the RPwD Act, 2016, the term Mental Retardation has been replaced with Intellectual Disability.

Accordingly, the Council has decided that the term Mental Retardation used in the syllabus of RCI's approved diploma, degree and masters level programmes to be replaced with Intellectual Disability with immediate effect.

All the RCI's approved training institutions conducting any programme in the field of Mental Retardation have been advised to take cognizance of the above said decision of the Council and incorporate necessary changes, wherever applicable.

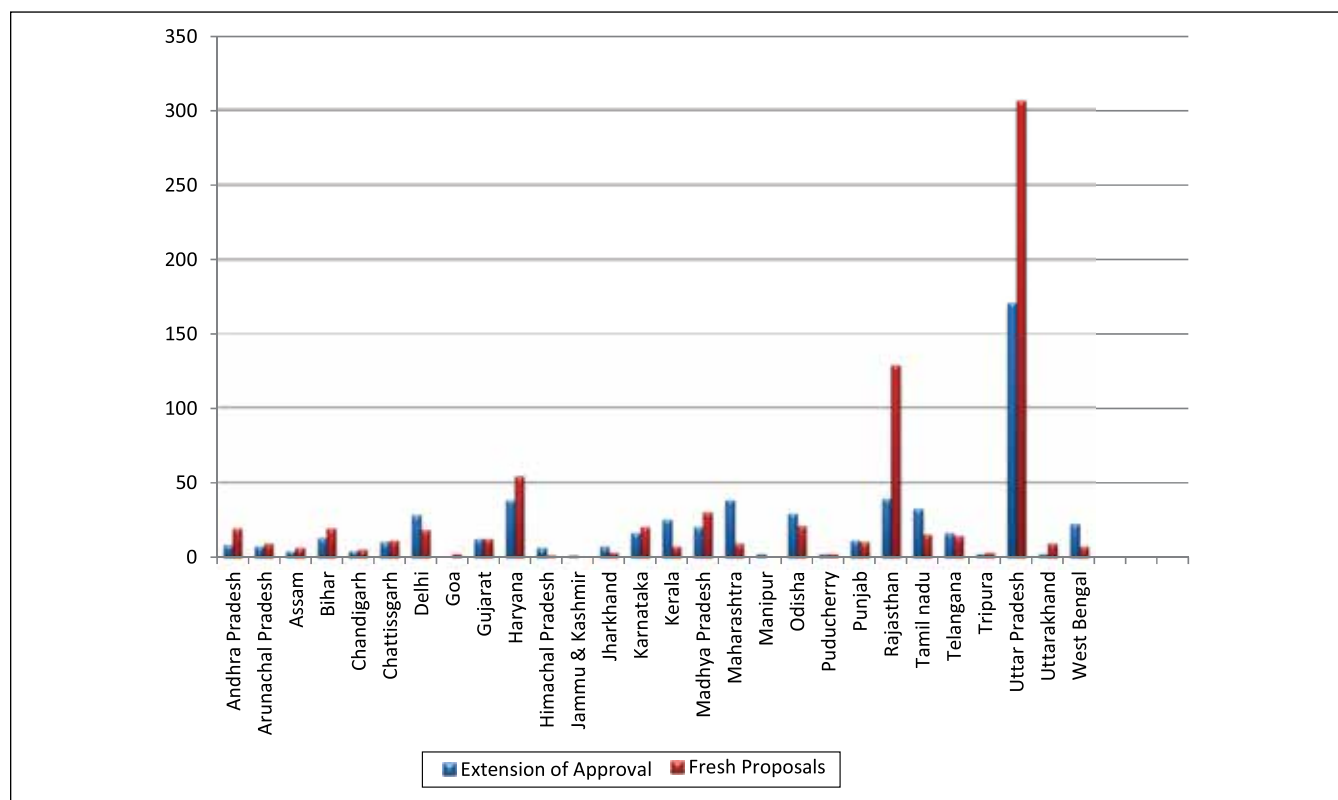
INSPECTION & RECOGNITION OF INSTITUTION

As per the provision of Section 11(2) of RCI Act, 1992 and regulation 7(3)(h) of RCI Regulations, 1997, online proposals from the prospective government organizations (GOs)/non-governmental organizations (NGOs)/ university departments to conduct RCI approved training programmes were invited by the Council in the month of August, 2019. Accordingly, inspections are carried out by teams of visiting experts for grant of approval to conduct the RCI approved programmes on fulfilment of prescribed norms in the field of special education and disability rehabilitation.

The Council has received 1269 proposals for approval to conduct RCI approved programmes for the academic session 2020-21. State wise proposals are as under:

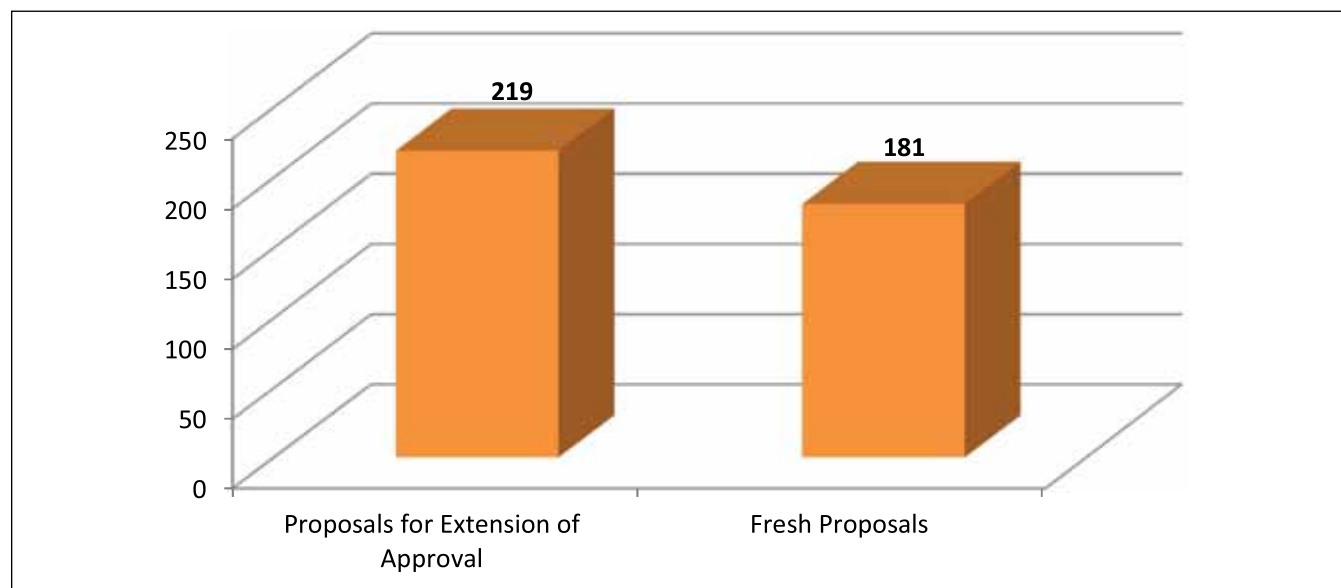


Status of eligible proposals for deputation of team for the academic session 2020-21.

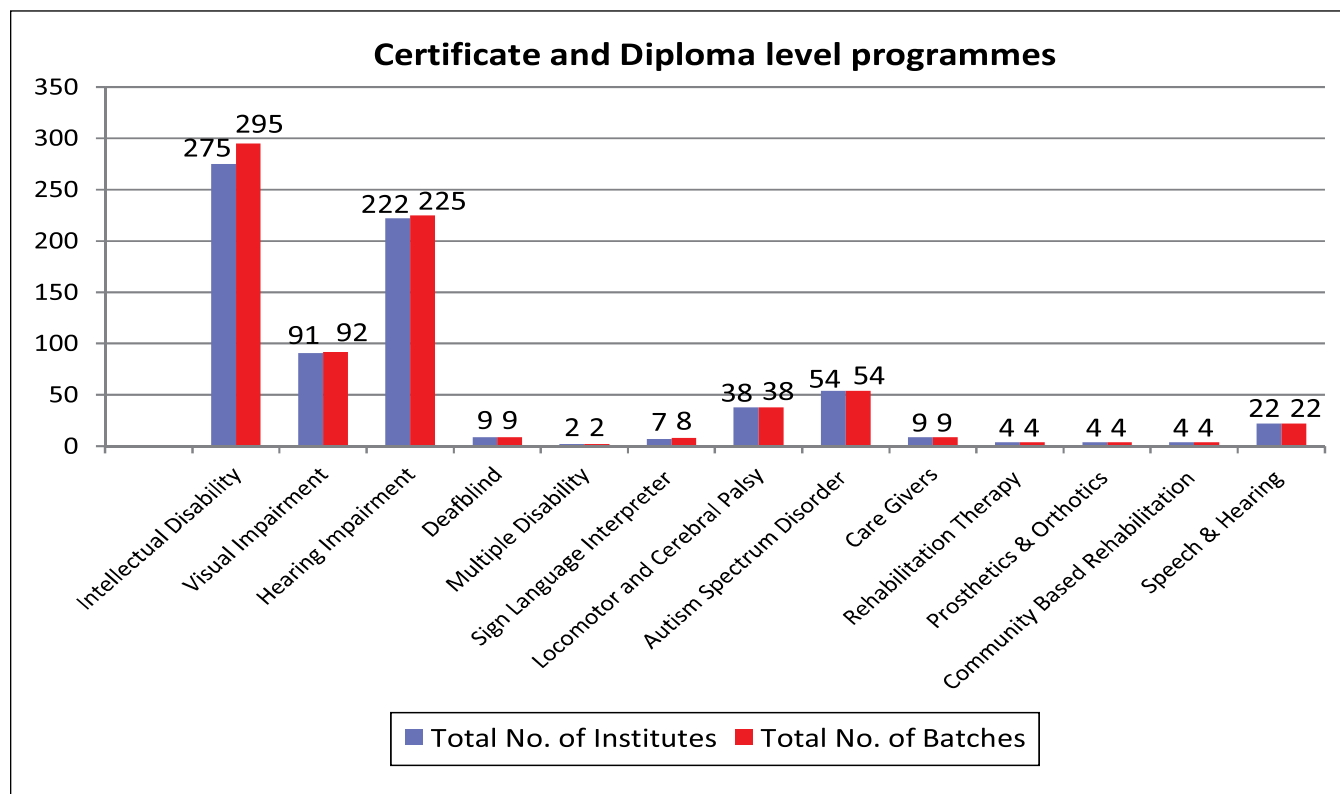

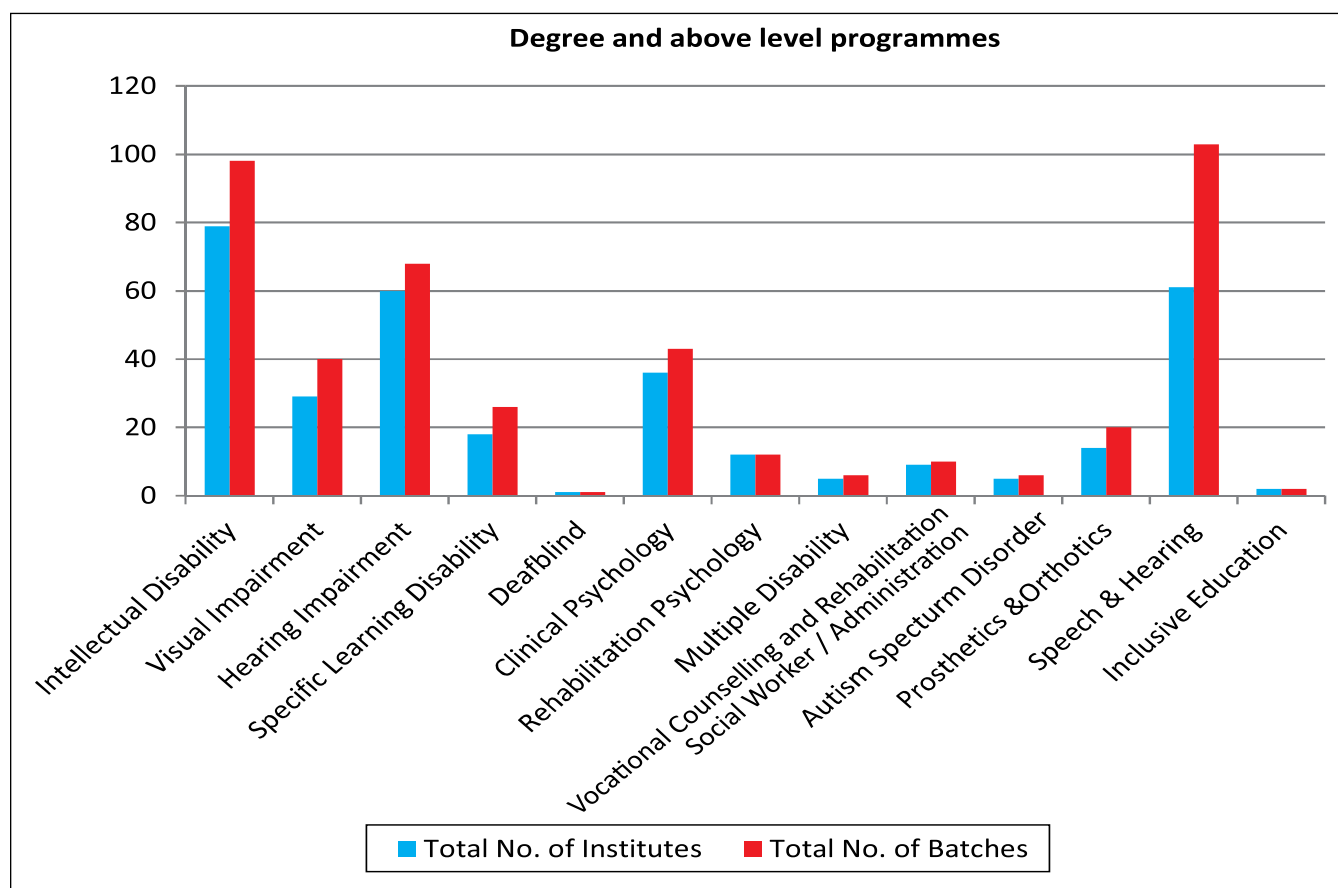

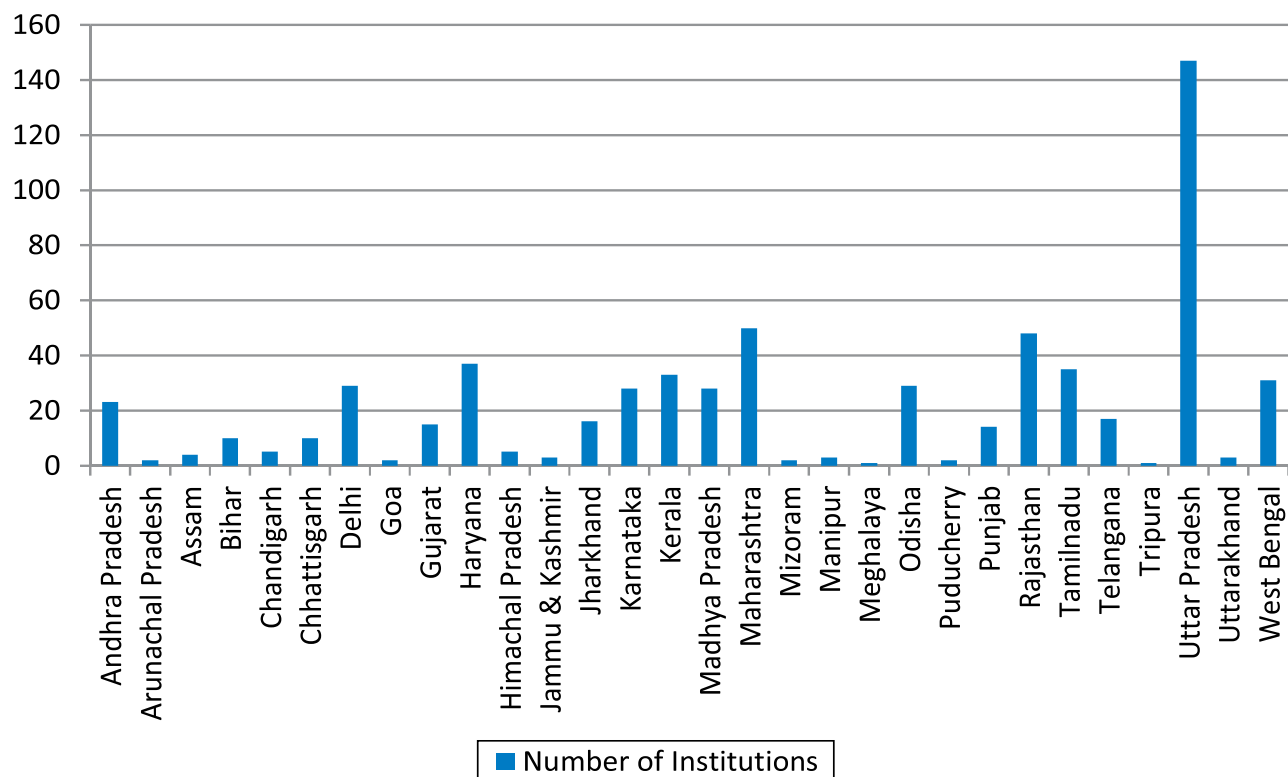

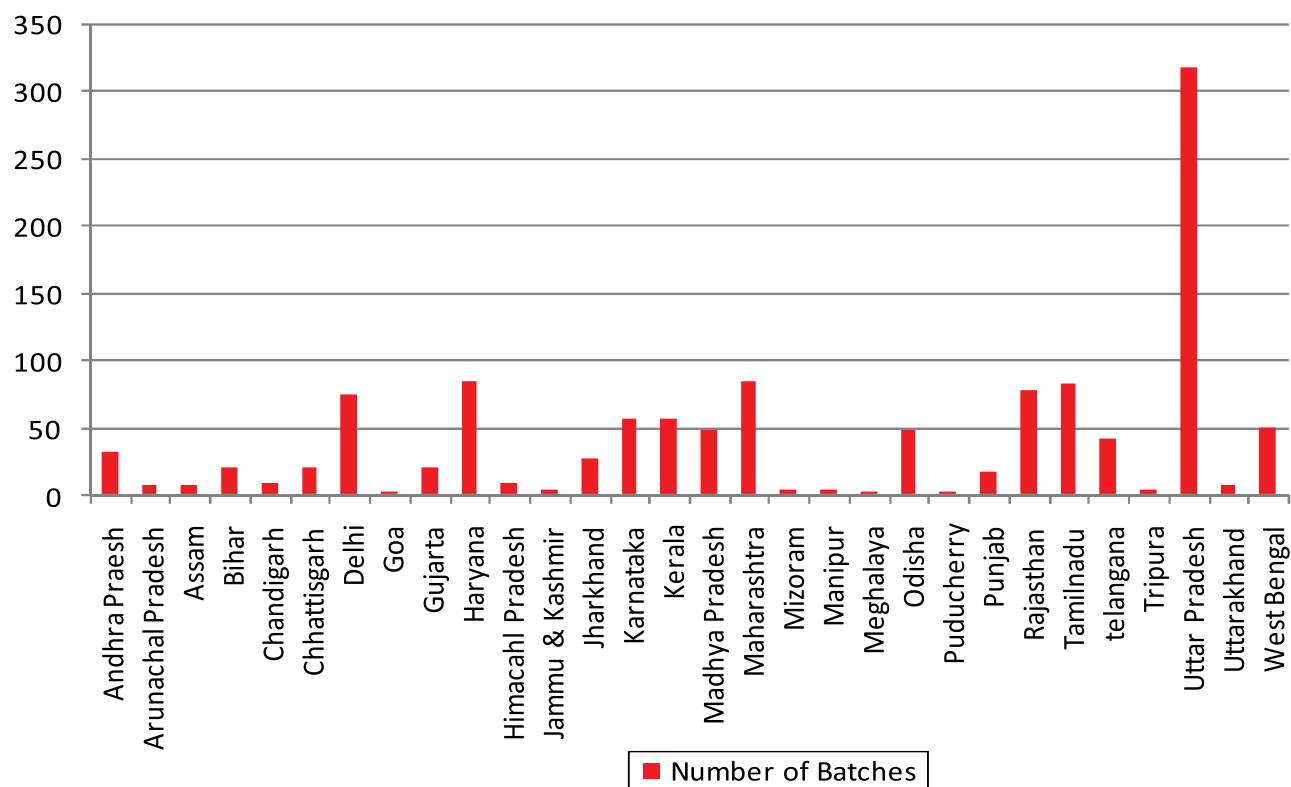

i) Meeting conducted to revise the general guidelines and simplification of procedure to grant approval of programmes:

A meeting was conducted by the Council on 10 Aug 2019 at the Conference room of RCI to revise the general guidelines, criteria and simplification of procedure to grant approval of courses under the chairpersonship of Shri K.V.S. Rao, Director, DEPwD, MoSJ&E. Member Secretary and other officers of RCI were present in the meeting. Recommendations of the committee were incorporated and accordingly the revised documents were approved by the 81st EC of RCI in its meeting held on 06 Feb 2020. The revised criteria for grant of approval are being implemented for the academic session 2020-21.

ii) Meeting conducted to review the existing norms, guidelines and assessment report format for approval of programmes:

A meeting of experts to review the existing norms, guidelines and assessment report format for approval of courses was held on 05–06 Sep 2019 at RCI under the Chairpersonship of Dr. Jayanti Narayan wherein Shri K.V.S. Rao, Director, DEPwD, Dr. Subodh Kumar, Member Secretary, RCI and other experts from the respective area of disability were present. During the meeting, the existing norms, guidelines and assessment report format were revised based on the recommendation of the experts. The Committee also suggested to develop separate inspection report format for each course.

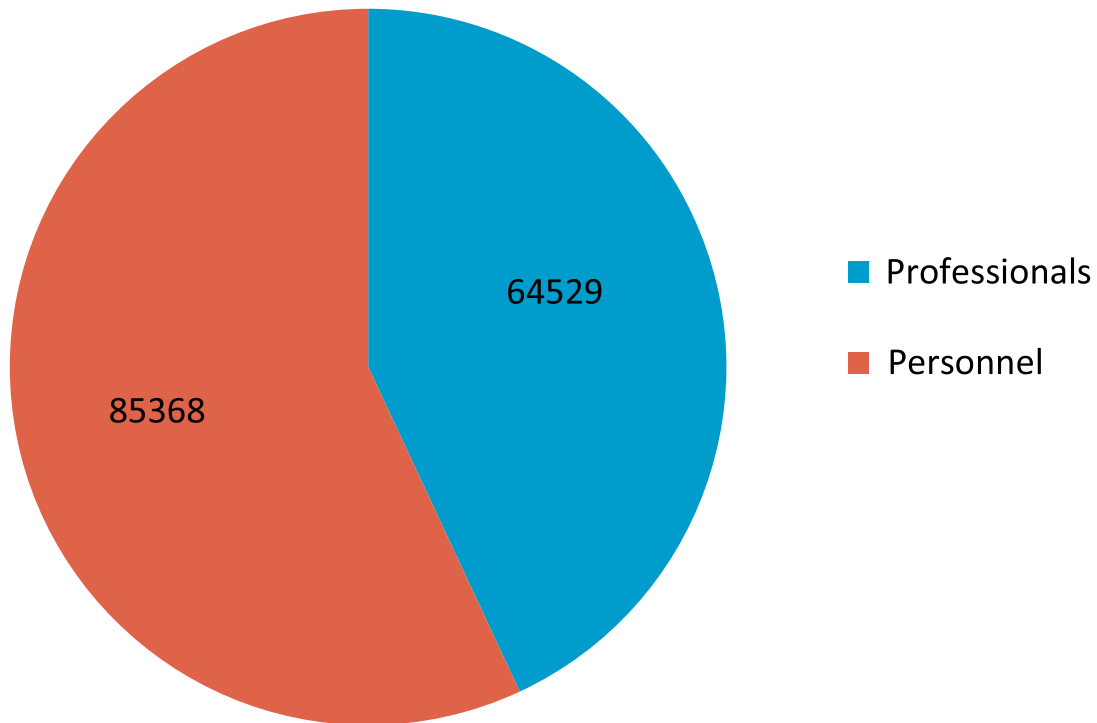
CENTRAL REHABILITATION REGISTER (CRR)

As per the provisions of Section 23 of the Rehabilitation Council of India Act, a Central Rehabilitation Register (CRR) is being maintained by the Council for registration of the Professional/ Personnel having RCI approved qualifications in disability rehabilitation and special education.

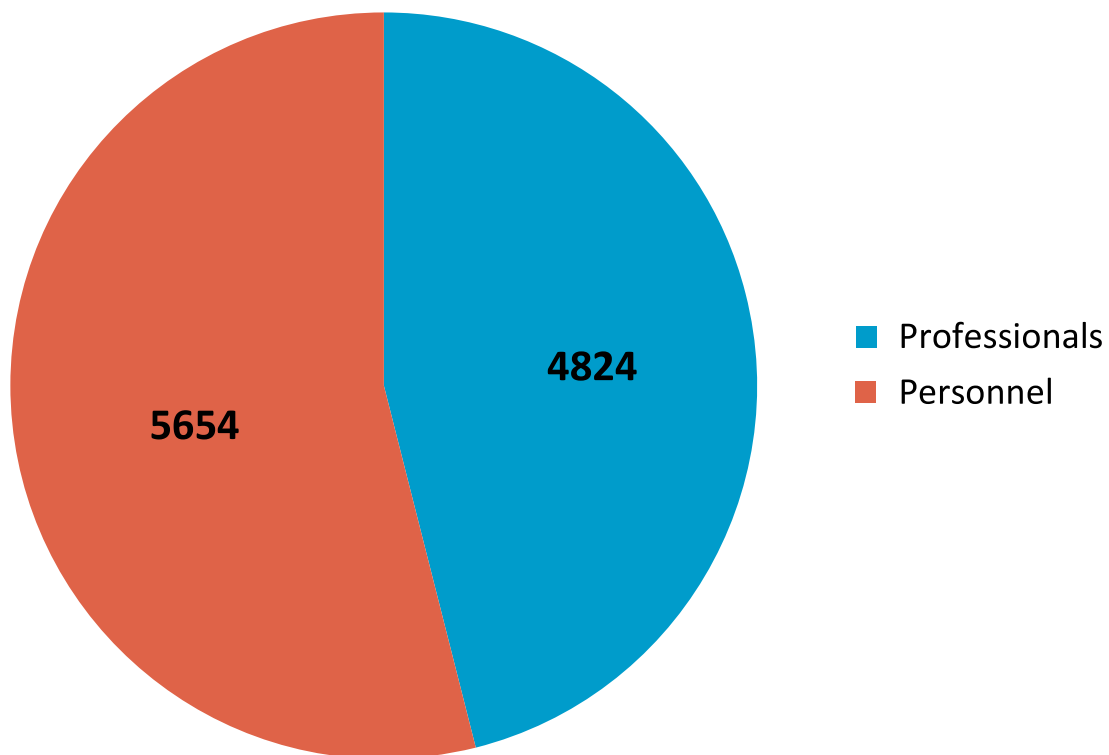
During the year, 10478 (4824 Professionals and 5654 Personnel) registrations were granted. So far, 64529 Professionals and 85368 personnel (total 149897) have been registered in the Central Rehabilitation Register as on 31st March, 2020. Status is under:

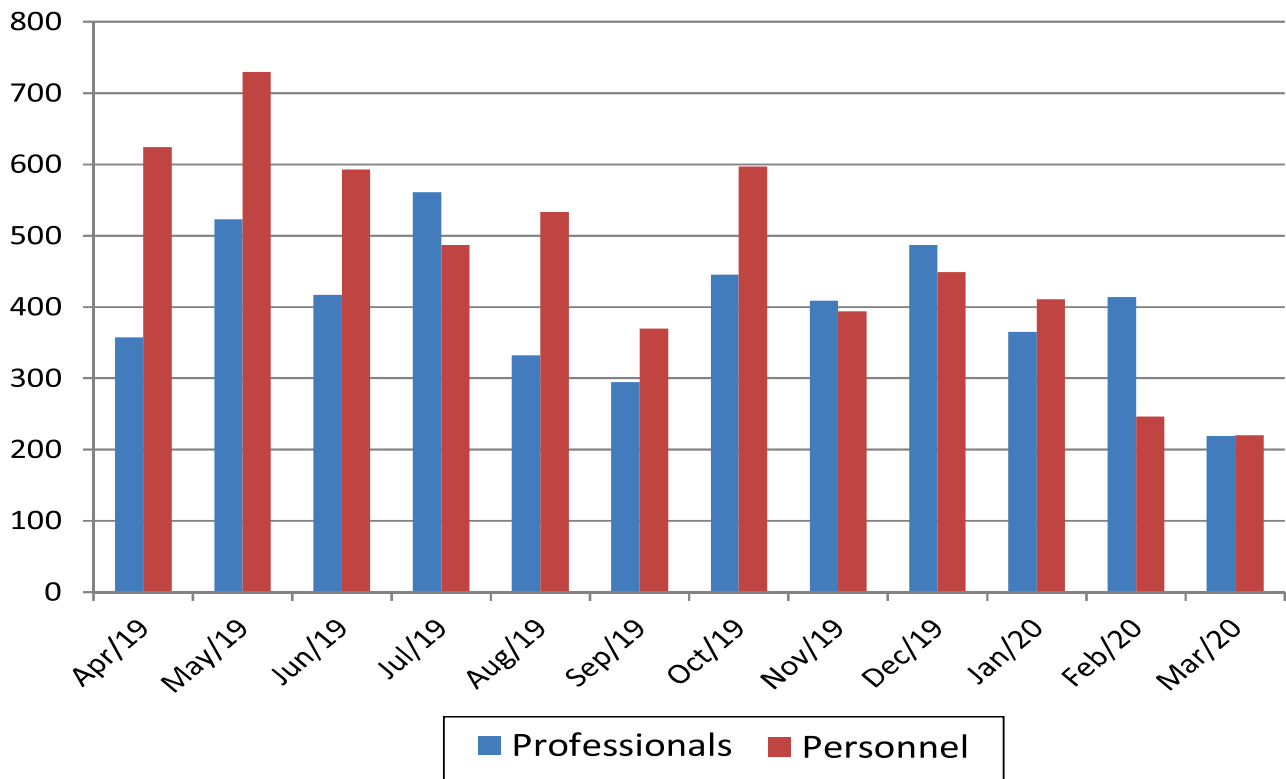
Cumulative Total of Registered Professionals & Personnel as on 31.03.2020



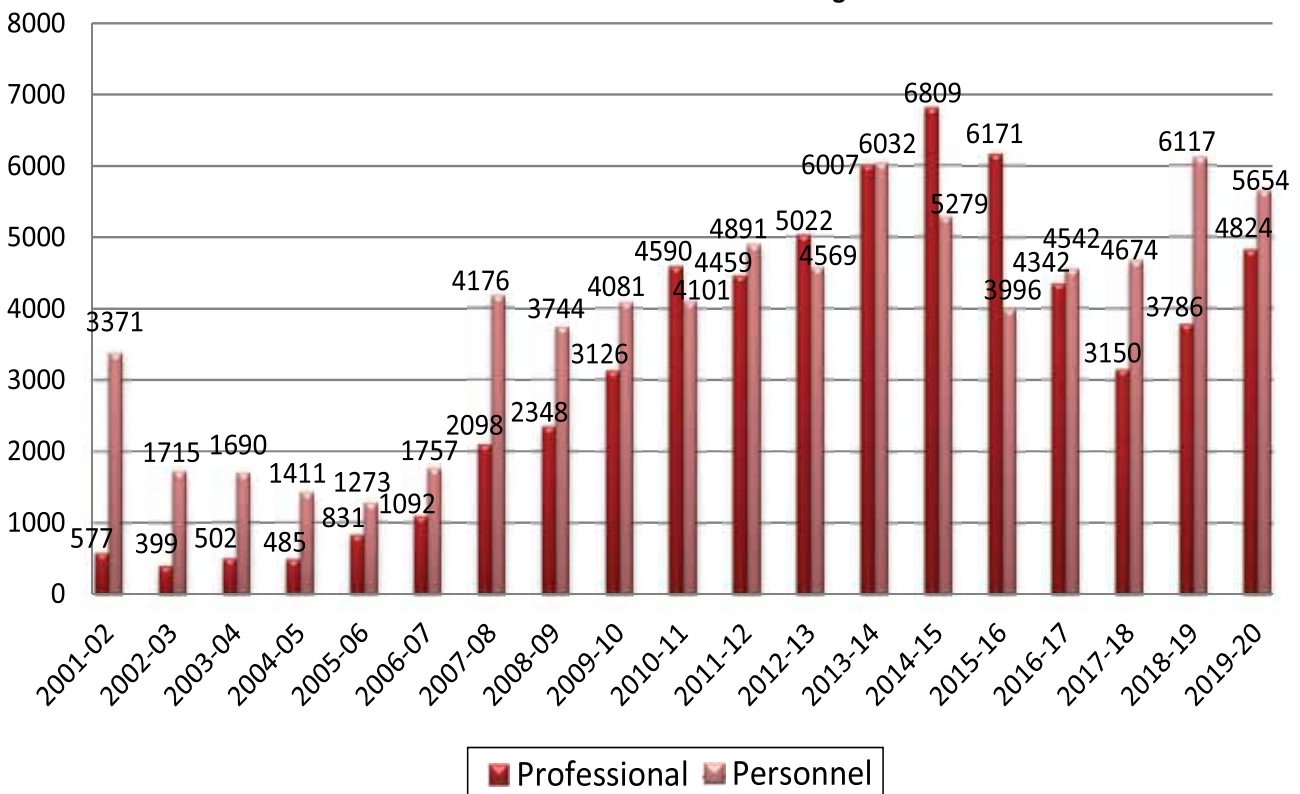
Total Registered Professionals & Personnel (2019-20)

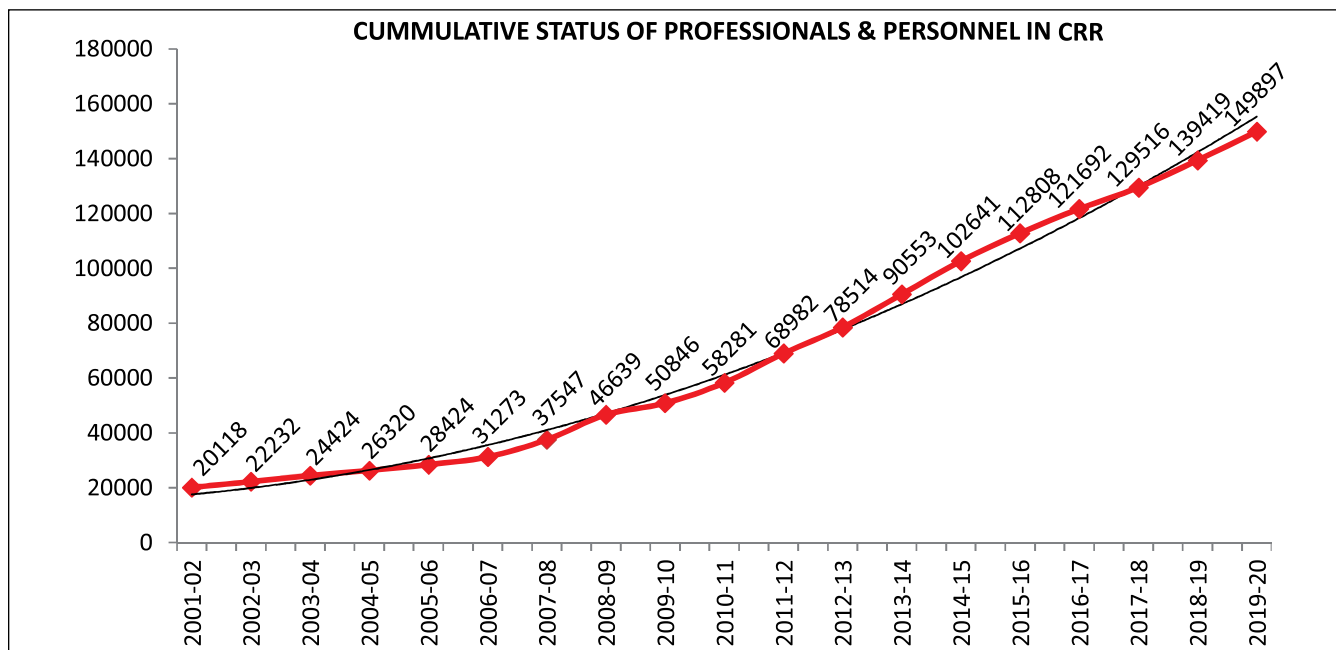


Month wise Professionals & Personnel registered in CRR



Year wise Professionals & Personnel registered in CRR

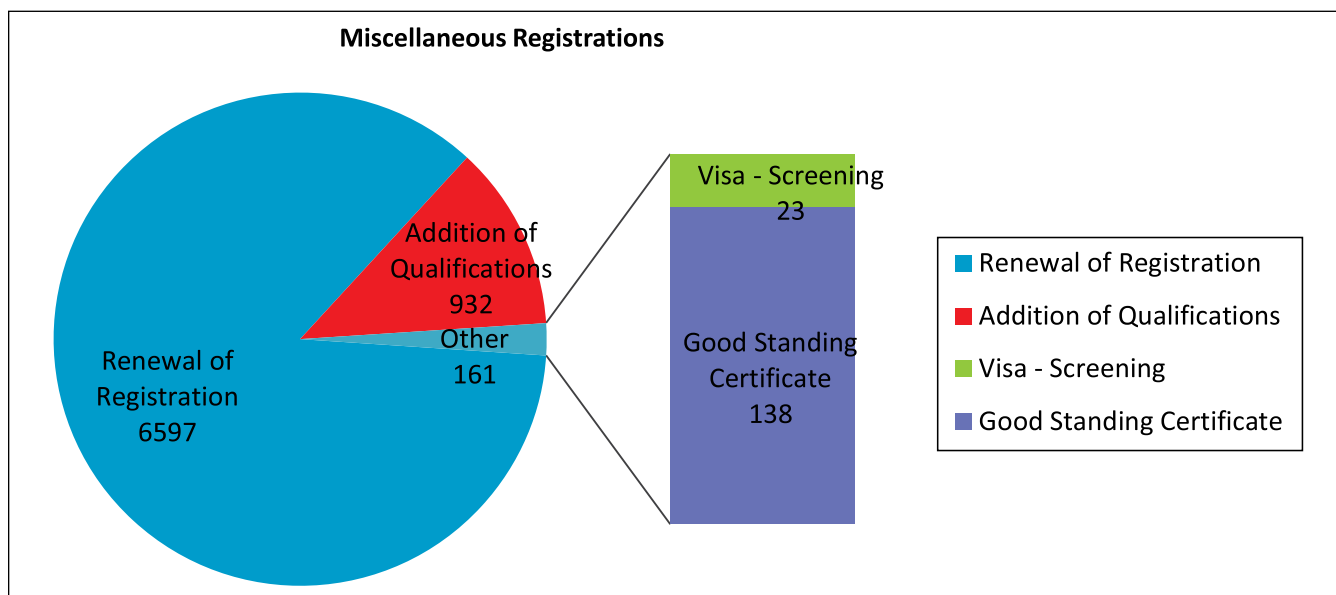

Assessment and Accreditation Committee:

Assessment and Accreditation Committee meeting was held on 25th February 2020 at RCI to decide the equivalence of foreign qualification and qualifications before enactment of the RCI Act for registration in CRR. Out of 63 applications received, 55 applications were considered and 8 were rejected.

Committee also submitted General recommendations as under:

1. Wherever registration is recommended, it has to be on the basis of payment of penalty of Rs.500/- per year from enactment of RCI Act i.e.1993 or year in which the qualifying examination was passed after 1993
2. If the recommended candidates fail to pay and register with RCI, then appropriate action to be initiated against such candidates as per section 13 of RCI Act 1992.
3. RCI shall also initiate action as per section 13 of RCI Act, 1992 on such professionals who have not registered with RCI till now.
4. In future, RCI will recognise and register candidates with a degree awarded by foreign universities only if they appear and pass an equivalency examination based on curriculum of such programmes in this country. Equivalency examination shall be conducted by RCI. However, the eligibility of the candidate to take such examination will be decided by the AAC.

Chapter - 5

CONTINUING REHABILITATION EDUCATION (CRE) PROGRAMME (WORKSHOP/SEMINAR/CONFERENCE ETC.)

The Council is responsible for the development, standardization and monitoring of training programs in the field of disability rehabilitation and special education. It has the additional responsibility to ensure that professionals in these fields update and upgrade their knowledge and skills on a continuing basis. The objectives of CRE programs, and the norms/ guidelines for conducting CRE programs are enumerated below:

Objectives

1. To upgrade the knowledge and skills of in-service and practicing rehabilitation professionals/ personnel, registered with the RCI u/s 19 of the RCI Act of 1992.
2. To update professional knowledge and skills of master trainers working in the field of disability rehabilitation and special education.

Norms and Guidelines to Conduct CRE Programmes (Workshop/ Seminar/ Conference)

1. Institutes proposing to conduct CRE programme must have 5 years of experience in offering RCI approved Courses at Certificate/ Diploma/ Bachelor/ Post Graduate level with valid RCI recognition.

However, this condition may be relaxed in the case of the State of Jammu & Kashmir and the North Eastern states (Manipur, Meghalaya, Mizoram, Sikkim, Assam, Arunachal Pradesh, Nagaland and Tripura) where institution working in the field of disability may organize CRE programs with the recommendation of National Institutes or Zonal Coordination Committee of RCI.
2. National level Professional Associations and/or any organization of national repute working for the empowerment of persons with disabilities having atleast 10 years of experience with valid society registration are considered eligible for grant of CRE status to various Seminar/ conference/ workshop and other programmes provided proposal on the prescribed format should reach the Council atleast 60 days before the proposed date of the programme.
3. RCI approved institutions are eligible for financial assistance to conduct the CRE programme as per the norms, once in 2 years subject to availability of funds.
4. RCI approved institutions may conduct maximum of 03 CRE programs within a financial year provided report of the CRE programmes are submitted to the Council before commencement of the another programme.

5. CRE programs to be planned in such manner so that regular activities of the institutions are not affected. However, maximum participation within the prescribed intake to be ensured.

General Guidelines:

1. Maximum number of participants in any CRE program shall not exceed 30. However, number of participants should not be less than 10 in any CRE program.
2. Topics on which CRE programs can be conducted are shown on the website. However, institutions are free to conduct CRE programs on topics which may not be in lists, but institutions have to fully justify the need for such a CRE program.
3. Topics on the latest development in the field of disability, various legislative provisions, like RPWD Act 2016, RCI Act, 1992, National Trust Act 1999, RTE Act, 2007, UN Conventions, various schemes and programmes of the DEPwD, Accessible India Campaign (Sugmaya Bharat Abhiyaan), SIPDA, ADIP, NHFDC etc. to be included for CRE topics. In addition to this Protection of Children from Sexual Offences Act (POCSO Act, 2012) to be included to generate awareness in this matter.
4. RCI Recognized training Institutions/University Department/National Institutes / CRCs may submit their proposal for consideration of permission to conduct CRE programme on the following format well before the 60 days of the proposed date.

CRE points can be awarded for 1 day /2 day /3 day /4 day /5 days with 6 hours of actual training each day. Faculty conducting CREs should have relevant professional qualification and experience with reference to the selected CRE topic.

6. Provision for financial assistance

The Council provides partially financial assistance to the RCI approved institutions/ University departments to conduct CRE programme (3 days and 5 days) subject to the availability of budget. The Council has prescribed a budget of Rs. 90000 for a 5 days CRE programme and Rs. 54000 for a 3 days CRE program. However, financial assistance is limited to 60% of total prescribed budget or the actuals, whichever is less.

Proposals for CRE program are processed as per the prescribed norms of the Council which are revised and uploaded on Councils website from time to time. The details of head wise budget for 3 days and 5 days CRE programme is available on the Councils website.

7. Accumulation of CRE points for renewal of registration :

- Total numbers of 100 CRE points are required to be accumulated for renewal of registration over 5 years. Actual training/hands/online on experience for 6 hours in a day at an RCI approved CRE is equivalent to 6 CRE points.
- Professionals who are qualified to register in the CRR shall register with the Council within 6 months from the date of completion of an approved course.
- All registered rehabilitation professionals shall renew their registration with the Council once in 5 years.
- Renewal of CRR is mandatory for all the professional/ personnel.
- Acquisition of a higher qualification (RCI approved) will be considered for renewal of registration.
- Professional/personnel may attend the International CRE/Conference held overseas. However, CRE credit hours may be allotted by the Council on the submission of certificate of attendance/ participation.

NATIONAL BOARD OF EXAMINATIONS IN REHABILITATION (NBER)

The National Board of Examination in Rehabilitation (NBER) has been set up as a Society registered under the Societies Registration Act, 1860 in 2006. NBER is an adjunct body of the Rehabilitation Council of India established for conducting examinations of Certificate/Diploma level courses approved by RCI. In exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (k) of section 29 of the Rehabilitation Council of India Act, 1992 (34 of 1992), regulations for Conduct of Examinations were notified by the Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities, Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment on 8th June, 2014. Governing body of NBER was also constituted vide Order No. 7-19(1)/Exam.Main (NBER)/2014/RCI/8608-28 dated 09th January, 2015.

Installation of BAS machine at RCI's approved Training Institutes:

In order to discontinue the practice of non-attendance of candidates pursuing diploma, degree and masters level programme in the field of Special Education and Disability Rehabilitation and to ensure the availability of the qualified faculty at RCI's approved Training Institutes (TIs) throughout the session, the Council has introduced the provision of installation of Bio-Metric Attendance (BAS Machine) at TIs to capture the attendance of students as well as core faculty and other administrative staff.

As on 31st March 2020, a total of 120 institutes installed the BAS machine at their institutes. Rest of the Institutes are being asked to expedite the installation of BAS machine.

Monitoring of Examination:

- NBER requested Directors of National Institutes (NIEPMD, Chennai, NIEPVD, Dehradun, AYJNIHSD, Mumbai & ISLRTC, New Delhi) to submit the proposed list of CLOs, Internal & External Examiners and list of Examination Centres etc. for perusal of the Council. Accordingly, list was submitted by them.
- Observers were also deputed by the NBER to monitor proper and fair conduct of examinations at various examination centres across the country.

Meeting of Malpractice Prevention Committee for examination:

- In order to examine the matter with regard to comments/ observations made by the paper evaluators in r/o mass copying held at Training Institution namely Gyanodaya Samekit Sansthan, Azamgarh & Surguja Gyanoday Association Surjapur, Chhattisgarh respectively, a committee was constituted to look into the matter and give necessary recommendations as per the stipulated provisions mentioned at C.14 of the Scheme of Examination, 2018 of NBER.

Committee recommended in its meeting dt. 13 December, 2019 that AYJNISHD, Mumbai may be asked to provide reports of Centre Superintendent, CLOs, observers and formats used for reporting purpose. The documents provided by AYJNISHD, Mumbai was placed before the members in the subsequent meeting held on 13 March, 2020. The committee finally recommended that the candidates may be permitted to reappear in the forthcoming examination since the two years time was already lapsed and indirect penalty has been imposed on Students.

- Another meeting on Malpractice Prevention Committee Meeting was held on **23rd January, 2020** to examine the matter of use of unfair means mass copying held during the Semester End Theory Examination of Diploma Level Course and to recommend necessary punitive action in the matter thereof. The Committee examined in-depth all the answer scripts and has not found evidence of mass copying. Hence, the committee recommended to declare the results of all the 05 centres. Further, recommended to develop the guidelines to avoid such incidences.

Meeting with Directors, National Institutes:

NBER has organized a meeting with Directors of National Institutes conducting examinations of RCI's approved Certificate and Diploma Level courses on **29 January 2020** to discuss various issues related to delay in conduct of examinations, declaration of results, release of honorarium, development of uniform academic activity calendar etc. This meeting was held under the Chairpersonship of Smt. Tarika Roy, Joint Secretary, DEPwD. During the meeting, Sh. K V S Rao, Director, DEPwD, Dr. Subodh Kumar, Member Secretary, RCI and Directors of NIEPVD, Dehradun; AYJNISHD, Mumbai, NIEPMD, Chennai and officials from RCI were also present. During the meeting the above said issues were discussed and finally recommended that the examining bodies will ensure timely conduct of examinations, declaration of result and revenue generated from examination will not accrue as their internal receipt and all NIs should open separate bank account for this purpose. Uniform academic activity calendar also required to be developed in consultation with NIs to maintain the uniformity in academic activities for all Certificate & Diploma level courses.

Incidental and Affiliation Fee:

NBER has recovered overdue amount of Rs.126 Lakhs towards incidental charges and affiliation fee from TIs conducting certificate and diploma level courses for the academic session 2018-19 & 2019-20.

Release of payment to NSEIT Ltd. for conduct of AIOAT-2019

As approved in the 81st Executive Committee meeting of RCI held on 6th February, 2020 at DEPwD, the NBER has released an amount of Rs.1,42,93,739/- to NSEIT Ltd. against total collection of Rs.2,87,82,902/- for conduct of AIOAT-2019.

Continuation of AIOAT-2020

Executive Committee of RCI in its 81st Meeting has approved continuation of AIAOT-2020 for admission to Diploma level courses by the existing agency on the previous terms & conditions.

Chapter - 7

OUTREACH DIVISION

1. Distance Education Cell

The quality of rehabilitation services received by persons with disabilities (divyangjan) is in turn dependent upon the quality of education of rehabilitation professionals. As a result, need based special education programmes through ODL mode were initiated by RCI in 2001 as a joint venture with different Open Universities with an aim to develop trained professionals in the field of Special Education and Disability Rehabilitation.

The demand for the courses through Open & Distance Learning (ODL) mode increased manifold in due course of time and RCI started receiving requests from various stakeholders such as prospective learners, NGOs, GOs and approved training colleges to launch the teacher training programmes in special education through ODL mode in order to bridge the gap between demand and supply.

Accordingly, a Distance Education Cell was set up by RCI in the year 2001 to implement and monitor the teachers' training courses through ODL mode in collaboration with State Open Universities in the country. 1st MoU was signed between RCI & Madhya Pradesh Bhoj Open University (MPBOU), Bhopal to conduct B.Ed. Spl.Ed.– ODL course(s) through ODL mode in 2001. As per the MoU, RCI started generating of separate revenues in the form of 10% of fee share from the respective Open Universities to sustain the Distance Education Cell.

3. Advanced Certificate Course in Inclusive Education (Cross Disability) - ACCIE(CD):

ACCIE(CD) course (six month duration through distance mode for 100 CRE points) was conducted on pilot basis in two batches i.e. January and February, 2018 at 78 approved institutes. Exams were conducted by NIEPMD in the month of July / August for the total 1335 students admitted in the pilot batches out of which 1331 have passed. As per the committee decision one more batch was approved in the month of September, 2018. A review meeting for Impact Study and revision of the ACCIE(CD) course was proposed by the Committee before re-starting the course.

A review meeting for Impact Study and revision of the ACCIE(CD) course (six month duration through distance mode for 100 CRE points) course as approved by 78th EC was held on 17th May 2019 based on the feedbacks received from the institutes, students and the analysis submitted by NIEPMD. It was decided that the course may be converted in e-learning format.

4. Workshops, Seminars and Meetings

4.1 National Workshop on 6-7 June 2019 at Guwahati :

A 02 days National Workshop on “Confluence of Recent Legislations; RCI’s Role in HRD Capacity Building of Senior Rehabilitation Professionals” was organized by the Council from 6-7 June, 2019 at Gauhati University, Guwahati with the following objectives:

- To build the “Vision Document-2030” of RCI.
- To delineate RCI’s Roles and Responsibilities to implement the same.
- To create a greater understanding of recent National & International Laws which impact on Disability issues
- To explore points of convergence among different instrumentalities from the perspective of HRD.
- To build the capacities of all relevant stakeholders including Govt. Functionaries to ensure inclusive development of PwDs at all levels.
- To identify and disseminate good practices in respect of effective implementation of recent legislatives measures.

Shri Jishnu Barua, Additional Chief Secretary, Social Welfare Department, Govt. of Assam was the Chief Guest of the workshop. Dr.Subodh Kumar, Member Secretary, RCI presided over the two days workshops. 6. Central sector plan scheme of “In-Service Training and Sensitization of key functionaries of central and state governments, local bodies and other service providers”

The 12th Five Year Plan of Govt. of India has recognized inadequate awareness and sensitivity amongst various stakeholders as a major challenge. It was felt that there is urgent need for in-service training amongst the various stake holders to create awareness about the rights and entitlements of PwDs, provisions in various schemes, developmental programmes, ways and means to access their specific entitlements and those that they are entitled to as equal citizens. Therefore, in order to realize the above said objectives, the Govt. of India has made a provision for training and sensitization of key functionaries of Central/ State Govt. under the 12th Five year plan through DEPwD. This is envisaged to be achieved by organizing short term training programmes through workshops at State/District/Block level on regular basis.

Development of the Scheme

Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities (DEPwD) has developed a new Central Sector Plan Scheme i.e. “In-Service Training and Sensitization of Key Functionaries of Central and State Governments, Local Bodies and Other Service Providers” w.e.f. 29th December, 2014. This scheme will be implemented for the remaining part of 12th Five Year Plan for the financial year 2018-19. The DEPwD has assigned the responsibility of Nodal Agency to Rehabilitation Council of India (RCI) to implement the said scheme at National level. The reference of the scheme is available on the Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment, Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities website i.e. www.disabilityaffairs.gov.in. This training is meant for the key functionaries dealing with disability sector viz. Social Welfare, Education, Health and allied professionals, Women and Child Development, Parliamentarians, Judiciary, Police, and officers / officials at District/Block/Panchayat. Apart from these, key functionaries, especially those who are involved in implementation of scheme and programmes and delivery of services relating to PwDs shall also be sensitized under this scheme. This will also include sensitization and awareness amongst public representatives at all levels.

Objectives of the Scheme

The prime objective of the Scheme is to focus on the need based training of key functionaries dealing with disability sector to be conducted in co- ordination with the Administrative Training Institutes as far as possible.

Specific objectives of the scheme are as follows:

- (i) To train and sensitize key functionaries of the Central/State Govt./Local Bodies and other Service Providers on regular basis on disability related matters through State/District/Block level training programmes.
- (ii) To raise the awareness among policy makers and field functionaries about rights and entitlements of persons with disabilities with a purpose of creating inclusive environment in communities / workplace.
- (iii) To create awareness about disability related legislations, development programmes, schemes and programmes for the benefits of PwDs, rehabilitation and referral services amongst the various stakeholders.

- (iv) To create awareness about the importance of prevention, early identification, intervention, rehabilitation and inclusive development of persons with disabilities (Divyangjan).
- (v) To provide in-service training on some important schemes like oralism, sign language, Braille etc.
- (vi) To obtain feedback about the quality of delivery of the schemes/programmes of Govt.
- (vii) The outcome of the scheme will be Human Resource Development through skill enhancement with a view to effect efficiency, effectiveness and economy in jobs assigned to them.
- (viii) The training programmes are meant to sensitize the officers to new and important issues facing the disability sector in the changing and economic scenario.

Fund Sanctioning Authority (FSA)

A Fund Sanctioning Authority (FSA) has been constituted to take major decisions with regard to the work related to the Central Sector Scheme launched by the DEPwD. This committee comprises of the following members:

- (i) Secretary, Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities (Divyangjan)
- (ii) Joint Secretary, Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities (Divyangjan)
- (iii) Joint Secretary & Financial Advisor, Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities (Divyangjan)
- (iv) Chairperson, Rehabilitation Council of India
- (v) Director (Concerned) - Member Secretary

The Implementing Agencies covered under the scheme:

- (a) Training Institutes of Central and State Government
- (b) National Institutes of the Department of Empowerment of PwDs, Govt. of India
- (c) RCI approved Training Institutes / University Departments

Meetings organised by the Council for revision of General Guidelines and Training Modules for In-Service Training and Sensitization Programme:

Expert Committee has been constituted to revise the training module and to revise the duration and budgetary provisions of the programmes in respect of each target group. Members suggested that the duration of the training programme to be reduced from 2 to 3 days to ½, 1, and 2 days.

The revised guidelines provides an in-depth view of scheme along with the objectives, scope of the scheme, summary statement of target groups, prescribed budget heads with the limit of expenditure and all the requisite proforma as required for submission of proposal, feedback/evaluation form, proforma for programme report submission, etc. In this connection, the Council has organised several meetings which are as under:

Tarika Roy, Joint Secretary, DEPwD, Dr.Subodh Kumar, Member Secretary, RCI, Shri KVS Rao, Director, DEPwD, other officers were present. The Chairperson advised to incorporate the necessary changes in the modules. Accordingly, all the 05 modules in English have been finalized. Content editing of each module was done by Smt. Tarika Roy, Joint Secretary, DEPwD and other officers of DEPwD. Separate cover page designing of each module has also been completed by the Council. All the 05 modules in Hindi & English version are ready for release by DEPwD.

Submission of Physical and financial performance report of In-service training programme along with details of beneficiaries for last 04 years to DEPwD

The Council has compiled detailed information of **11,567 beneficiaries from different government departments** trained under the various target groups at block, district and State level in-service training and sensitization programme conducted by implementing agencies across the country during the last 4 years (2015-16 to 2018-19). The detail information comprising of name of the in-service officials, gender, designation, department, contact details, location, target group etc. has been sent to DEPwD in the form of hard and soft copy on 18 December, 2019 for Third Party Evaluation.

7. Co-design of Community Based Inclusive Development (CBID) as per the Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) signed between the Government of India and Australia.

A Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) has been signed between Government of India and Department of Social Service, Government of Australia on 22 Nov., 2018 to incorporate the joint development of disability training programmes in India. In pursuance to the said MoU, the Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities (DEPwD), Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment (MSJ&E), Government of India has taken initiatives to develop CBID programme as per WHO-CBR Guidelines 2010 in collaboration with Nossal Institute for Global Health, University of Melbourne, Australia to develop human resource in this sector.

DEPwD, MSJ&E has entrusted the responsibility to Rehabilitation Council of India (RCI) to co-design the CBID Programme in collaboration with Nossal Institute for Global Health, University of Melbourne, Australia. Accordingly, the Council has developed a concept note based on innovative, evidence and consensus for the proposed Community Based Disability training programme to equip personnel to serve the disability at grassroot level across the country.

An Expert Committee comprising of Dr. Subodh Kumar, Member Secretary, RCI, Dr. Bhushan Punani, Executive Secretary, Blind Peoples Association, Ahmedabad, Shri Carmo Nornoha, Executive Director, Bethany Society, Shillong, Dr. Sara Varughese, CBM, India; Bangalore has been constituted by the Council to utilize their experience and expertise to co-design of CBID programme in Indian context.

Meeting of the said committee was held on 5 Feb., 2019 at DEPwD. During the meeting, various matters such as development milestone of CBR programme in India, status of RCI approved CBR programmes, comparison of components and sub components of DCBR course of RCI in light of WHO CBR Guidelines, RCI's proposal for co-design of CBID Course, Role of CBID personnel, adaptations for CBID personnel, employment opportunities, visibility of the course and role of Advisory/Reference Group have been discussed. After having in-depth deliberation, it was decided that in the 1st phase 6 months face to face programme on CBID to be co-designed by RCI in collaboration with Nossal Institute for Global Health, University of Melbourne, Australia.





The Delphi method is considered as one of the best- known methods for dealing with open-ended and creative aspects of a problem and also supports decision- making based on the consensus of experts. In the Delphi survey, a series of data collection rounds (3) to capture the knowledge and opinions of experts has been carried out. The first round of survey elicits opinions and ideas whereas subsequent rounds brings out rank opinions until consensus is reached.

Nossal Institute for Global Health, University of Melbourne adopted the said approach and developed a questionnaire for experts to participate in the Delphi survey. A group of 95 experts working in field of CBR, were recommended by the Council and 75 experts participated in all 03 rounds of Delphi Survey for development of competency based curriculum framework for the proposed CBID programme.

Based on the outcome of Delphi Survey, it was decided by Nossal Institute for Global Health, University of Melbourne to finalize the competency based curriculum framework for proposed CBID programme with the technical expertise of Indian and Australian Experts. Accordingly, 05 days workshop from 13-17 April, 2019 was organised by the University of Melbourne to develop the draft structure of CBID programme in Indian context. DEPwD, M/oSJ&E, Govt. of India vide its letter no. 13-03/2018-DD-III dated 29 March, 2019 nominated Dr. Subodh Kumar, Member Secretary, RCI led the Indian delegation comprising of non-official experts viz. Dr. Bhushan Punani ,Dr. Sara Varguese Shri Carmo Noronha and Shri Pankaj Maru to attend the said international workshop at Melbourne.

All the experts under the supervision and guidance of Prof. Lindsey Gale & Prof. Nathan Grills, deliberated upon the outcome of the Delphi Survey including the various aspects of the CBID programme in Indian context. During the workshop, the Competency Based draft curriculum framework for certificate course in CBID was developed comprising of 06 important competency parameters i.e. **Framework of Understanding, Assessment and Goal Setting, Intervention and Service Implementation, community Engagement and Networking, Attitudes and Behaviour, Reflective Practice focusing on Learning Outcome, Proficiency Indicator and quality Criteria.**





Final proceedings of the 05 days technical workshop was submitted by the University of Melbourne to DEPwD, MSJ&E. Appropriate action was initiated by the Council based on the recommendations of the workshop and as per directions of DEPwD.

Another meeting of technical group for co-design of CBID Programme was held on 14 June, 2019 under the Chairpersonship of Dr. Subodh Kumar, Member Secretary at RCI. 09 Experts from India & Australia participated in the said meeting. During the meeting competency based curriculum framework and other modalities to rollout the CBID programme was finalized.





International Level Workshop of 06 days duration was conducted from 16-21, Sept., 2019 at RCI to develop the content and resource material for CBID programme. Meeting was held under the Chairpersonship of Smt. Shakuntala. D. Gamlin, IAS, Secretary, DEPwD (Divyangjan), M/oSJ&E, Government of India & Chairperson, RCI. Smt. Tarika Roy, Joint Secretary, DEPwD (Divyangjan), Dr. Subodh Kumar, Member Secretary, RCI were also present during the workshop, 19 Experts from India & Australia participated in the workshop. During the workshop, curriculum of CBID programme and session plans for all the 03 competency based parameters i.e. Inclusive Community Development (ICD), Professional Behaviour & Reflect of Practice (PBRP), Assessment & Intervention (A&I) was finalized. Proceedings of the workshop have been prepared and approved by the Secretary, DEPwD (Divyangjan).





The fifth meeting to develop the Roadmap to rollout CBID programme was held on 17th January, 2020 at 10.30 a.m. at Conference Room, RCI under the Chairpersonship of Smt. Tariqa Roy, Joint Secretary, DEPwD, MSJ&E, Govt. of India. Shri K.V.S. Rao, Director, DEPwD, Dr. Subodh Kumar, Member Secretary,

RCI and other experts were present in the meeting to develop the Self Learning Material for all the 03 modules of CBID Programme.



Sixth meeting with the Directors, National Institutes and Experts working in CBR was conducted on 3 Feb., 2020 at RCI under the Chairpersonship of Smt. Tarika Roy, Joint Secretary, DEPwD to finalize the modalities to rollout the CBID programme. During the meeting, responsibility was assigned to content writers and developers for development of Self Learning Material (SLM). It was further decided that content writers will develop the SLM under the supervision and guidance of the Chairperson of respective CBID groups. Final draft SLM to be submitted by 31 March, 2020.



Chapter - 8

ADMINISTRATION & ACCOUNTS

Administration of the Rehabilitation Council of India involves many activities besides managing the establishment and financial aspects.

1. Use of Hindi in official work

In order to promote use of Hindi in official work, the orders/instruction/guidelines issued by the Department of Official Language from time to time are strictly followed by the Council. The employees of RCI are motivated to carry out their official work in Hindi. RCI celebrated Hindi Pakhwara between 14-28 September, 2019 wherein various programmes were conducted and prizes were awarded to employees for participating in various events to promote use of Hindi in official work. Quarterly and half yearly reports were submitted regularly to the DEPwD, Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment and Department of Official Language, Ministry of Home Affairs.

2. Reservation Policy

The procedure prescribed by the Government to implement the reservation policy in the office of the RCI is followed and due consideration is given for compliance of the orders on reservation policy issued by the Government from time to time.

3. Vigilance Awareness Week

The Council celebrated Vigilance Awareness Week from 28th October 2019 to 02nd November 2019 on the theme “Integrity – A way of life” (ईमानदारी – एक जीवन शैली) as per Central Vigilance Commission’s Circular No.05/08/19 dated 02 October, 2019. All employees of the Council took the Integrity Pledge along with e-Pledge.



4. Centralised Public Grievance Redress and Monitoring System (CPGRAM)

The Centralized Public Grievance Redress and Monitoring System (CPGRAM) is an online web-enabled system developed by National Informatics Centre (NIC) in association with the Directorate of Public Grievances (DPG) and the Department of Administrative Reforms and Public Grievances (DARPG). CPGRAM

is a platform based on web-technology which primarily aims to enable submission of grievances by the aggrieved citizens from anywhere - anytime to the concerned Ministries / Departments / Organisations who scrutinize and take action for speedy and favorable redress of these grievances. Tracking grievances is also facilitated on this portal through the system generated unique registration number.

During the period under report, total 53 applications were received pertaining to Distance Education Cell, ZCC, Registration, Recognition through CPGRAM and all were disposed off as per the stipulated provisions of the CPGRAM.

5. Implementation of RTI Act, 2005

Consequent upon the enactment of the RTI Act, 2005, RCI is following the instructions/guidelines issued by the Government from time to time. The requisite information about RCI is displayed on the website of the Council (www.rehabcouncil.nic.in) for general public. During the year, total 459 RTI applications were received and disposed off. In addition, 56 appeals were received and disposed off.

6. Library and Documentation

RCI has a good collection of books/ publications/ audio/ video/ journals/ periodicals in the area of disability rehabilitation and special education which are being used by the professionals/ personnel/ experts/ students. Library remains open on all working days.

7. Publications

RCI brings out a number of publications on regular intervals such as Journal of Rehabilitation Council of India (JRCI), Status of Disability in India, Training Manuals of Diploma Courses, Training Manuals for different functionaries etc. During the year, 32nd Annual Report for the year 2018-19 (Bi-lingual) was published.

8. Swachhata hi Seva 2019

As per directives of DEPwD, MoSJ&E, the Council celebrated Swachhata hi Seva (SHS) from 11th September, 2019 to 2nd October, 2019. All officers & employees of RCI actively participated in the Cleanliness drive under Swachhata hi Seva 2019 and undertook various activities during the period including prohibition of use of plastic bags in office & neighbourhood places, use of jute/cloth bags while shopping and other activities, use of plastic lunch box, bottles and plates strictly prohibited during office premises, meetings/ seminars, weeding out files, proper maintenance and cleanliness of the toilets and medical facilities to keep neat, clean and odour free, etc.

10. Staff Strength

Under Section 8 (1) of the RCI Act, 1992, Central Government shall appoint the Member Secretary of the Council. Under Section 8 (2) of the Act, the Council shall, with the previous sanction of the Central Government, employ such officers and other employees as it deems necessary to carry out the purpose of the Act. The present staff strength of the Council is 39 (i.e.) 4 in Group “A”, 12 in Group “B” and 23 in Group “C”). Details of sanctioned strength of staff are at **Annexure 4.1**.

11. Preventive measures taken due to outbreak of COVID-19:

- i) In order to contain the spread of Novel Corona Virus (COVID-19), Circulars were issued by the Council as precautionary measures from time to time in the public interest.
- ii) All the Officers and staff (including outsourced staff) working in RCI were directed to download ‘Aarogyasetu’ App on their mobile phones. They were asked to review their status on ‘Aarogyasetu’ regularly and to commute only when the app shows ‘safe’ or ‘low risk’ status. Infection status of employee shown in Arogyasetu app is being monitored during working days while reporting to the office.
- iii) Only essential visits of visitors were being entertained in RCI building.
- iv) Masks, Gloves, Soaps & Sanitizers distributed to all the officers & employees of RCI.
- v) The premises of RCI building was sanitised regularly using Sodium Hypochloride as per the directions of Health Ministry.

12. Annual Accounts and Audit Report

The accounts of the Rehabilitation Council of India are audited under Section 19 (2) of the Comptroller and Auditor General’s (Duties, Powers & Conditions & Service) Act, 1971 read with Section 21 (3) of RCI Regulations, 1997 notified under Section 29 of Rehabilitation Council of India Act, 1992 (34 of 1992). SCHEDULE – 19: SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES, CONTINGENT LIABILITIES AND NOTES ON ACCOUNTS

1. Contingent Liabilities – NIL (Previous Year – NIL)
2. The Rehabilitation Council of India, New Delhi is a Statutory Body set up under the Rehabilitation Council of India Act, 1992. (No. 34 of 1992). The Council is financed by the Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment, Government of India Grants-in-Aid.
3. The Council, as desired, based on the observations of DGACE, New Delhi in the audit report 2003-04 prepared Annual accounts in the common/revised format approved by the Govt. of India in consultation with the Comptroller & Auditor General of India (CAG). As per these formats, the Council has to prepare following statements:
 - a) Balance Sheet
 - b) Income & Expenditure Account
 - c) Receipts & Paymet Account
4. Traditionally the system of accounts being maintained in the Council are similar to the one being maintained by various Government departments on accrual system of accounting, accrued interest on investment, prepaid expenses, etc are also included in the accounts accordingly.
5. The depreciation has been provided on fixed assets since inception on w.d.v. method
6. Physical verification of fixed assets for 2019-20 in carried out as continuous/prepetual basis every year and no deficiencies are noticed.
7. Physical verification of inventory, stationary & other consumables is carried out and no deficiencies are noticed.
8. Value of inventory/books received as gifts has been added in the schedule of assets.
9. Previous year figures have been re-grouped/rearranges wherever necessary as per requirement of the Council.
10. Schedule of investment has been prepared in common format.
11. As separate bank accounts are maintained for RCI G.P. Fund, RCI Pension Fund, RCI Main Account, RCI Project Account, RCI NBER Account and In-service Training Programme, therefore, separate receipt & payment accounts have been prepared for each account.
12. The M/o Social Justice & Empowerment sanctioned to create a Pension Fund only to discharge pension liability. Accordingly, actuarial valuation of pension fund was got made from actuaries. The Council has a strength of 39 only. One or two officials retire in a span of 2/3 years. Therefore, necessity was not felt to make provision for gratuity and leave encashment and the same is charged from the allocated budget in the relevant year in which the official is due to retire.
13. The Council has sent a proposal to the administrative Ministry to amend the RCI Act, 1992 with a provision to insert a clause regarding Income Tax Exemption in the Amendment Act.

We have audited the attached Balance-Sheet of Rehabilitation Council of India as at 31 March 2020, Income & Expenditure Account and Receipts & Payment Account for the year ended on that date under Section 19 (2) of the Comptroller & Auditor General's (Duties, Powers & Conditions of Service) Act, 1971 read with Section 21 (3) of the Rehabilitation Council of India, Regulations 1997. These financial statements are the responsibility of the Council's management. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit.

2. This Separate Audit Report contains the comments of the Comptroller and Auditor General of India (C&AG) on the accounting treatment only with regard to classification, conformity with the best accounting practice, accounting standards and disclosure norms, etc. Audit observations on financial transactions with regard to compliance with the Law, Rules & Regulations (Propriety and Regularity) and efficiency-cum-performance aspects, etc., if any, are reported through Inspection Report/ C&AG's Audit Reports separately.

3. We have conducted the audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in India. These standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatements. An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidences supporting the amounts and disclosure in the financial statements. An audit also includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of financial statements. We believe that our audit provides a reasonable basis for our opinion.

4. Based on our audit, we report that:

- i) We have obtained all the information and explanations, which to the best of our knowledge and belief were necessary for the purpose of our audit;
- ii) The Balance-Sheet, Income & Expenditure Account and Receipt & Payment Account dealt with by this report have been drawn up in the common format approved by the Ministry of Finance.
- iii) In our opinion, proper books of accounts and other relevant records have been maintained by the Rehabilitation Council of India as required under Section 21 (2) of Rehabilitation Council of India Regulations, 1997 in so far it appears from our examination of such books.
- iv) We further report that:

A. Balance Sheet**A.1 Assets****A.1.1 Current Assets, Loans and Advances-Rs. 535.30 lakh (Schedule 9)**

Advance of Rs. 11.53 lakh given for organization of Seminar/Workshop has been taken as final expenditure under "Other Administrative Expense"(Schedule-16)

whereas the same should have been shown as advance. This has resulted in overstatement of expenditure by Rs. 11.53 lakh and understatement of current assets by the same amount.

B. General

- B.1** Fixed Assets included an amount of Rs.7.71 lakh as “Capital works in progress”. The amount was unadjusted advance with CPWD due to arbitration, in respect of construction of building which was put to use since 2004. This amount needsto be recovered/ adjusted. The matter was also pointed out in previous year’s report but corrective action has not been taken.
- B.2** Interest earned on accounts in respect of GPF, Pension and National Board of Examination for Rehabilitation (NBER) accounts, In-Service Training Programme, RCI Main Account, RCI Project and investment except for RCI Main Account and RCI Project Account is being accounted by the Council on cash basis instead of accrual basis. This was in contravention of Uniform Format of Accounts and also Accounting Policy (4) of the Council.
- B.3** The Council has not made provision for gratuity & leave encashment on actuarial valuation in contravention of the Uniform Format of Accounts.
- B.4** It was seen that balances were lying in following accounts without any utilization or refund to grantee agency. This resulted in unsettled liabilities of the Council amounting to Rs.15.77 Lakh.

No efforts are being made by the Council for settlement of above liabilities. The issue was also pointed out in previous year’s report. Steps may be taken for early settlement of above amounts.

- B.5** An amount of Rs. 20.37 lakh and Rs.1.52 lakh relating to “Advance to NIC” and “Project Advance” respectively in schedule-9 “Currents Assets, Loans and Advances” were pending for settlement since last five years i.e, 2014-15, 2015-16, 2016-17, 2017-18 and 2018-19. Further, an amount of Rs. 38,905 is receivable by the Council in respect of IEDC impact



assessment project since 2005-06. Council may make efforts for early settlement of these advances. This was also pointed out in previous years report but no action has been taken by the Council.

C. Grants-in-Aid

The Council received a grant of Rs. 500.00 lakh during 2019-20 from Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment. Out of this, grant amounting to Rs. 20.00 lakh was received in March 2020. It had unspent balance of Grants in aid of previous year amounting to Rs. 17.70 lakh. Out of the total funds available, the Council utilized a sum of Rs. 500.00 lakh leaving an unspent grant of Rs. 17.70 lakh.

v) Subject to our observations in the preceding paragraphs, we report that the Balance Sheet, Income & Expenditure Account and Receipt & payment Account dealt with by this report are in agreement with the book of accounts.

vi) In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanation given to us the said financial statements read together with the Accounting Policies and Notes on Accounts and subject to the significant matters stated above and other matters mentioned in Annexure to this Audit Report give a true and fair view in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in India:

- (a) In so far as it relates to the Balance Sheet of the state of affairs of the Rehabilitation Council of India (RCI) as at 31 march, 2020 and
- (b) In so far as, it relates to Income and Expenditure Account of the surplus for the year ended on that date.

1. Adequacy of Internal audit system

The Internal Audit Cell/Department has not been set up in the Council. Internal Audit was also not conducted by Pr. A.O. of the Ministry. Internal audit is being conducted by Chartered Accountant who has conducted audit up to 2019-20.

2. Adequacy of internal control system

The internal control system of the Council was not adequate as accrual system was not adopted even though the Council stated that it was being adopted. There is no Internal Audit wing in the Council. Further, advances were lying unadjusted for long periods.

3. System of physical verification of fixed assets

The physical verification of fixed assets was conducted up to 2019-20.

4. System of physical verification of inventory

The physical verification of inventory like books and publication, stationery and other consumable items have been conducted up to 2019-20.

5. Regularity in payment of dues

As per annual accounts, no payments over six month in respect of statutory dues are outstanding.
